 - in the Legislative Assembly—
 - The Speaker,
 - The Chairman of Committees,
 - The Deputy Chairmen of Committees.
- (2) At any meeting of the Parliamentary Committee five members shall constitute a quorum.
5. Any reports published by the Parliamentary Commissioner under these Rules shall be included as a schedule in the Annual Report of the Parliamentary Commissioner made to Parliament pursuant to section 27 of the Act.

LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT, 1893-1971.

Rules of The Barristers' Board.

WHEREAS by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1971 (hereinafter called "the Act") The Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered from time to time to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the said Act mentioned; and whereas it is desired to amend the rules of the Board as reprinted pursuant to the provisions of the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, including amendments up to and including *Government Gazette* (No. 69) of 31st August, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 6) of 21st January 1963, and thereafter amended by amendments published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 35) of 15th May, 1963, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 45) of 27th May, 1964 and the *Government Gazette* (No. 34) of 19th April, 1967, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 44) of 21st May, 1968, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 17) of 12th March, 1971, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 85) of 1st October, 1971: Now, therefore, the Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the Act, doth hereby,

at a meeting held on the 25th day of October, 1972, make and publish the following amendments to the said rules, to take effect upon the date of the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*:—

AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES.

Rule 1 is amended by inserting after Part X—Law Library—Rules 78-89, the following viz:—

PART XI—TRUST ACCOUNT RULES—Rules 90-102.

Division 1—Application of Trust Accounts Rules—Rule 90.

Division 2—Rules relating to books of account and other accounting records required to be kept by practitioners—Rules 91-99.

Division 3—Provisions relating to the furnishing of accountants' certificates and reports to the Board. Rules 100-102.

A new part is inserted after Rule 89, to be known as Part XI—Trust Accounts Rules.

PART XI.—TRUST ACCOUNTS RULES.

Division I—Application of Trust Accounts Rules.

90. (1) In this Part "these rules" mean the rules contained in this Part.

(2) These rules apply to every practitioner who, in the course of the practice of his profession, receives, holds or pays any money for or on account of any client.

Division II—Rules Relating to Books of Account and other Accounting Records Required to be Kept by Practitioners.

91. (1) Subject to this rule, every practitioner shall, in connection with his practice—

- (a) open and retain in his place of business;
- (b) keep in accordance with this Division, and comply with the other provisions of this Division with respect to; and
- (c) at all times cause to be kept written up,

such books of account and other accounting records as are necessary to show and to distinguish between—

- (i) money received from or held on account of each client; and
- (ii) money received, or held or paid, on account of the practitioner himself.

(2) Notwithstanding sub-rule (1) of this rule—

- (a) where two or more practitioners are engaged in the practice of their profession in partnership, the books of account and other accounting records referred to in that sub-rule may be kept for or in respect of the transactions of the partnership; and
- (b) the Board may require a practitioner who carries on his practice in more than one place of business to keep in each such place and with respect to his practice in each such, a separate set of books of account and other accounting records which comply with requirements of this Division.

(3) A practitioner who is required by the Board to keep a separate set of books of account and other accounting records pursuant to sub-rule (2) of this rule shall comply with that requirement.

92. In accordance with Sub Section 1 of Section 34 of the Act every Practitioner who receives trust moneys shall unless then dealing with them as directed by the person from whom or for whose use or benefit they are received forthwith deposit them to the credit of a Trust Account whether a general trust account or an account maintained for one or other of those persons specifically and there retain them until such time as they are dealt with as so directed or until they are otherwise dealt with according to Law.

93. (1) Without limiting the generality of sub-rule (1) of rule 91, the books of account and other accounting records required to be kept by a practitioner under that sub-rule shall, subject to this rule, include—

- (a) a record of money received;
- (b) bank deposit records;
- (c) a cash book;
- (d) a trust cheque book;
- (e) a trust ledger;
- (f) a trust account bank statement;
- (g) the reconciliation accounts or statements referred to in rule .99.; and

(2) Bank deposit records shall comprise a carbon copy of every Bank deposit form.

(3) Subject to sub-rule (4) of this rule, the books of account and other accounting records may be kept on loose leaves or cards.

(4) Where a cash book is kept on loose leaves or cards pursuant to sub-rule (3) of this rule, the loose leaves or cards shall be fixed together securely and in proper sequence at intervals of not longer than twelve months.

(5) Notwithstanding sub-rule (1) of this rule, where a practitioner, at the same time as he makes an entry in a trust ledger, makes as part of a continuous record of ledger entries a duplicate or true copy of that entry, the continuous record shall be deemed to be a cash-book for the purposes of that sub-rule.

(6) Where a continuous record as is referred to in sub-rule (5) of this rule is kept on loose leaves or cards, the record shall be fixed together securely and in proper sequence at intervals of not longer than twelve months.

(7) Without prejudice to any rule of Law or Equity to the contrary and for the purposes only of these Rules every trust ledger and the source documents referred to in Rule 94 (4) and cash-book shall be retained and preserved in good order and condition for at least seven years.

94. (1) A trust ledger shall be used to record—

- (a) the receipt and deposit of moneys for or on account of a practitioner's clients;
- (b) the receipt and debiting of a practitioner's charges;
- (c) the payment by a practitioner of out-of-pocket payments or disbursements on behalf of a client and the repayment thereof to the practitioner.

(2) Subject to sub-rule (3) of this rule, a practitioner may pay out of the trust account money for or on account of a client, notwithstanding that the practitioner does not hold in the trust account money, or sufficient money, for that payment if, for the whole of the period during which such a payment results in a debit balance in the client's ledger account the practitioner retains in the trust account sufficient money belonging to the practitioner—

- (a) to cover the debit balance; and
- (b) which is clearly recorded and identified in the trust account as his own money.

(3) Notwithstanding sub-rule (2) of this rule, a practitioner is not required to retain money belonging to him in his trust account to cover a debit balance in a client's ledger account, if the debit balance—

- (a) is properly shown by adjacent particulars (being particulars that are typewritten or written in ink in the trust ledger) as being covered by a credit balance in another ledger account in the practitioner's trust ledger; or
- (b) arises from the debiting of a cheque which has been properly used to obtain on behalf of a client a bank cheque, if and while that bank cheque properly remains in the possession of the practitioner pending the proper disposition thereof.

(4) Accurate details of every entry in a practitioner's trust ledger shall be set out therein against the entry or be readily available from source documents and, in particular, all charges by the practitioner which are debited in the trust ledger shall be clearly identified.

(5) A practitioner may withdraw from the trust account, and apply to his own use, all moneys in the account representing the practitioner's charges paid by clients if such a withdrawal does not result in a debit balance in a client's account in the practitioner's trust ledger which is not covered by money belonging to him and retained in the trust account in accordance with sub-rule (2) of this rule.

95. (1) A practitioner shall make a written record of all money received by him for or on account of a client.

(2) Every such record shall be recorded in his cash book and in his trust ledger.

(3) Every record of money received by a practitioner shall contain the following particulars, namely:—

- (a) The date the money is received;
- (b) The amount of money received;
- (c) The name of the client by or on whose account the money is paid; and
- (d) Other particulars sufficient to identify the transaction in respect of which the money is received.

(4) A practitioner who receives a payment by way of direct credit to the trust account shall, on becoming aware of the payment record such payment in his Cash Book or his Trust Ledger incorporating therein the particulars prescribed by sub-rule (3) of this rule.

96. (1) The practitioner's bank deposit record referred to in Rule 93 shall make provision for the entry of the following particulars, namely:—

- (a) The date of the deposit;
- (b) Whether the amount deposited consists of money or cheques or both, as the case may be;
- (c) The name of the drawer of every cheque deposited; and
- (d) The total amount of the deposit.

(2) Where a practitioner pays or deposits any money into the trust account, he shall—

- (a) before making the payment or deposit, make a carbon copy of the Bank Deposit Record.
- (b) ensure that the carbon copy of the Bank Deposit Record is stamped by the Bank with which the payment or deposit is made; and
- (c) retain the carbon copy of the Bank Deposit Record.

97. Every cheque drawn by a practitioner on the trust account shall be numbered and drawn consecutively and the number of the appropriate cheque shall be recorded in the practitioner's cash book and in his trust ledger against the entry therein relating to that cheque.

98. (1) Every account in a practitioner's trust ledger shall be kept:—
- (a) under the name or names of the client or clients for whom or on whose behalf the money recorded therein was received or paid away or is held; or
 - (b) under the title of the practitioner's file to which such account relates.
- (2) Where a practitioner acts and holds money for more than one party to a transaction, the practitioner—
- (a) shall keep a separate account in his trust ledger with respect to each of those parties and shall as soon as possible make all proper transfers between each of those accounts; or
 - (b) shall keep a separate account in his Trust Ledger in respect of each file which relates to any matter in which money is received by the Practitioner by or on behalf of more than one party and such account in addition to showing the title of the relevant file shall also record all moneys received or paid away or held for any person who is a party to the transaction to which that file relates.
99. (1) A practitioner shall, at least once in every month and at intervals of not longer than six weeks, cause—
- (a) the trust ledger to be balanced; and
 - (b) an account or statement to be drawn up reconciling, in accordance with sub-rule (2) of this rule, the balance of the trust ledger with the trust account bank-statement or bank-statements for the period which has elapsed since the last balance.
- (2) A reconciliation for the purposes of sub-rule (1) of this rule—
- (a) shall be made in accordance with the following provisions:—
 - (i) There shall be set out the balance in the trust ledger as at the end of the preceding period of reconciliation;
 - (ii) There shall be added to the balance referred to in paragraph (a) of this sub-rule the total of the moneys paid into the trust account during the period covered by the reconciliation and there shall be deducted from that balance the total of the moneys paid from the trust account during that period.
 - (iii) Moneys received by way of direct credit in the Bank to the trust account during the period of reconciliation and amounts debited by the Bank to the trust account and for which no cheques were drawn shall be set out in the reconciliation as distinct items;
 - (iv) Moneys received for the trust account during the period of reconciliation, but not banked therein, shall be set out in the reconciliation as a distinct item; and
 - (v) Every cheque drawn on the trust account during the period of reconciliation (being a cheque which has not been presented to, and debited by, the bank in the bank statement) shall be set out separately in the reconciliation, by cheque number and amount; or
 - (b) shall be made in accordance with a system approved by the approved accountant who examines the reconciliation for the purposes of giving a Certificate pursuant to Division III of these Rules.
- (3) For the purposes of sub-rule (2) of this Rule "approved accountant" means an accountant who is registered or approved as required by Section 42A of the Legal Practitioners Act

Division III—Provisions relating to the furnishing
of accountants' certificates and reports to the Board.

100. In this Division—

- "approved accountant" means an Accountant who is registered or approved as required by Section 42A of the Legal Practitioners Act;
- "Certificate" means a Certificate by an approved accountant with respect to a Practitioner's accounting records;
- "Practitioner's accounting records" means the books of account and other accounting records required to be kept by a Practitioner under sub-rule (1) of rule 91 hereof.

101. (1) Every Practitioner shall furnish the Board with a Certificate in accordance with the form in the Schedule to this Part on or before the thirtieth day of June 1973 in respect of the period from and including the first day of the month next following the gazettal of these Rules and the thirty first day of March 1973 and thereafter on or before the thirtieth day of June in each year in respect of the period from and including the first day of April in the year immediately preceding the thirty first day of March of the year in which the Certificate is furnished to the Board.

(2) For the purpose of furnishing the Board with a Certificate under sub-rule (1) of this rule a Practitioner shall supply an approved accountant with particulars of every bank account kept, maintained, or operated by the Practitioner in his practice at any time during the period to which the Certificate relates and all other information which the approved Accountant reasonably requires for the purpose of carrying out the prescribed examinations.

(3) For the purposes of sub-rule (2) of this rule "the prescribed examinations" are—

- (a) an examination of the book keeping system in every place of business of the Practitioner to enable the approved accountant to verify that the system appears to comply with the requirements of Division II of these Rules;

- (b) a test check of a number of postings to the trust ledger or ledgers from records of receipts and payments of clients' moneys, and a test check of the arithmetical accuracy of those accounts;
 - (c) a comparison of a sample of lodgments into, and payments from, the trust account, as shown in bank statements, with the records of receipts and payments of clients' moneys;
 - (d) an inquiry into, and a test check of, the system of recording costs and of making withdrawals in respect of costs from the trust account;
 - (e) a selection of some transactions recorded in the trust ledger or ledgers during the period covered by the Certificate in order to ascertain—
 - (i) whether the entries relating to those transactions reflect, and are in accordance with, the respective rights of the clients as those rights appear to the approved accountant from the documents held by the Practitioner, and
 - (ii) that the accounting has been carried out in accordance with Division II of these Rules;
 - (f) a test check of the extraction of a balance of the trust ledger accounts at any one date during the period covered by the report; and
 - (i) a test check of the additions of the extraction of balances;
 - (ii) a check of the reconciliation of the total of the balance with the balance or balances shown in the bank statement or bank statements;
 - (iii) a check that any amount shown in the reconciliation as being money in hand and not deposited, was promptly deposited thereafter; and
 - (iv) a confirmation directly with the Bank or Banks concerned of the accuracy of the Bank balance or Bank balances used in the reconciliation;
 - (g) a check that, as at the date chosen for the examination of the extraction of balances and the check of the reconciliation, the total of any debit balances in the trust ledger accounts was covered in compliance with sub-rule (2) of rule 94; and
 - (h) a test check of moneys taken to the credit of the office account of the Practitioner with a view to ascertaining that the credit was not of moneys which should have been credited to a client's trust account.
- (4) Subject to this rule, nothing in the foregoing provisions of this rule requires an approved accountant—
- (a) to extend his inquiries beyond the information contained in the accounting records and other relevant documents produced to him by a Practitioner, supplemented by such information and explanations as he may obtain from the Practitioner;
 - (b) to inquire into the stocks, shares, mortgages, or other securities or documents held by a Practitioner on behalf of a client;
 - (c) to consider whether a Practitioner's accounting records have been properly written up at any time other than at the time to which his examinations relates; or
 - (d) in the absence of suspicion of irregularity beyond trivial errors or mere clerical errors or mistakes to extend a test check beyond an inspection of more than a few isolated transactions.
- (5) Notwithstanding paragraphs (b) of sub-rule (4) of this rule, a Practitioner shall produce to an approved accountant who is in the course of examining the Practitioner's accounting records, any stocks, shares, mortgages, or other securities or documents held by the Practitioner on behalf of a client and called for by the approved accountant.
- (6) Notwithstanding paragraph (c) of sub-rule (4) of this rule, where an approved accountant, in the course of examining a Practitioner's accounting records forms the opinion that those records were in disorder at any time during the accounting period and that there should be a closer examination thereof, he shall so report to the Board.
- (7) If, after making, or during the making of, the prescribed examinations in accordance with this rule, it appears to an approved accountant that there is evidence of non-compliance by a Practitioner with the requirements of this Part, the accountant may make such further examination as he considers necessary in order to complete his Certificate with or without qualification.

102. Nothing in this Division deprives a Practitioner of the right, on the ground of privilege as between Practitioner and client, to decline to produce any document to an approved accountant who is engaged in an examination for the purposes of this Division and, where a Practitioner so declines, that Practitioner and the approved Accountant shall report to that effect and as to the circumstances thereof in writing to the Board.

Schedule.

HAIRDRESSING ESTABLISHMENT REGULATIONS, 1972.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hairdressing Establishment Regulations, 1972.
2. These regulations have effect in every district in the State.
3. In these regulations, unless the context requires otherwise—
 - "disinfecting appliance" means any sterilizing cabinet or similar device which has the same sterilizing effect as a five per cent. solution of carbolic acid;
 - "disinfecting solution" means any non-irritant solution which is equivalent in bactericidal strength to a five per cent. solution of carbolic acid;
 - "hairdresser" means any person who shaves, cuts, trims, dresses, waves, curls, stains or dyes, or who in any other way treats, the hair of any person for gain or reward and also includes a barber and every assistant of every such person;
 - "hairdressing establishment" means any premises or place or portion of premises or a place where any of the operations of a hairdresser are carried on;
 - "surveyor" means a health surveyor appointed under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911.
4. The proprietor of a hairdressing establishment shall cause—
 - (a) every shelf, bench and table on which instruments, tools and utensils are placed to be constructed of or finished with a durable, smooth, impervious material;
 - (b) cupboards, cabinets, shelves or similar fittings of durable smooth materials to be provided, for the storage of clean towels, neck cloths, neck protectors, throwovers and similar articles;
 - (c) a sufficient number of suitable receptacles, constructed of smooth impervious material with tight fitting lids to be kept on the premises for the reception of—
 - (i) soiled linen, soiled towels and other soiled cloths; and
 - (ii) hair, paper and other trade wastes,
 and shall cause each such receptacle to have marked thereon, in permanent and prominent letters of not less than two inches in height the words or word "soiled linen" or "waste" as the case may be;
 - (d) wash hand basins to be provided in the following ratio—
 - (i) for each completely separated customer's cubicle one wash hand basin;
 - (ii) where customers' chairs are not completely separated by a division, one wash hand basin or stainless steel trough for each two chairs, but where the facilities for washing and shampooing hair are separate from

other hairdressing facilities it shall be sufficient compliance with this paragraph of these regulations if the wash hand basins are provided in the area set aside for the washing and shampooing of hair only;

- (e) where laundering is carried out on the premises, the laundry to comply with the requirements of the local authority, but the laundry shall not consist of less than the facilities described in the definition of "laundry unit" in By-law 4A of the Model By-laws Series "A", with hot water delivered at a temperature of not less than 60°C (140°F);
- (f) where refreshments are prepared and provided for the customers on the premises, the refreshments to be prepared in a room completely separate from the hairdressing section;
- (g) the premises of the hairdressing establishment to have natural ventilation in accordance with Uniform Building By-law 1201 or mechanical ventilation in accordance with the table to By-law 1221 of the Uniform Building By-laws; and
- (h) the floor of every hairdressing establishment to have a smooth, impervious, washable surface in the working area.

5. (1) The wash hand basins required by paragraph (d) of regulation 4 of these regulations are in addition to those required by section 10 of the Shops and Warehouses (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations.

(2) Each wash hand basin shall be provided with a reticulated hot and cold water supply capable of delivering a flow of water of not less than one gallon per minute from each tap, with the hot water being delivered at a minimum temperature of 38°C (100°F), and where the water is delivered direct from the tap to the head, a groove or similar approved mixing valve shall be incorporated in the line.

6. The proprietor of a hairdressing establishment shall ensure—

- (a) that each receptacle referred to in paragraph (c) of regulation 4 of these regulations is used only for the purpose for which it is labelled;
- (b) that all hair clippings and other waste, including shaving lather and paper are cleaned up and placed in the proper receptacle as soon as practicable after each person has been attended; and
- (c) that the head rest of any chair in use on the premises is covered with a clean cloth or clean white paper before use by each customer.

7. (1) A person shall not use or suffer or permit to be used for domestic or residential purposes or as a sleeping place, any room in which hairdressing practices are conducted.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation any portion of the premises in which hairdressing practices are conducted shall be separated from the rest of the premises by a substantial wall or partition extending from the floor to the ceiling.

8. A hairdresser shall not use on any person, a towel, neckcloth, neck protector or wash cloth which has not been laundered since it was last used on a customer and a towel or neck protector made of paper or cotton wool shall be discarded immediately after use and not used in the service of a second or subsequent person.

9. A hairdresser shall use a clean towel or other protective device about the neck of a customer to prevent hair from falling inside the clothing and the outer wrapping or coverall shall be placed around the shoulders of the customer so as not to come in contact with the skin of the neck, and shall be fastened with a safety pin or other device at the back.

10. A hairdresser shall use a dry neck brush where it is necessary to remove loose hair from around the neck.

11. A hairdresser shall not use any kind of soap other than liquid soap or shaving cream or shaving powder for the purpose of producing lather for shaving customers.

12. A hairdresser shall not apply any sponge, powder puff or substance in block form to a customer's skin.

13. A hairdresser shall not arrest bleeding by any means other than by a suitable styptic in powder or liquid form on sterile cotton wool.

14. A hairdresser shall, immediately before attending to each customer and immediately after visiting a water closet or urinal, wash his hands, and for the purpose of giving effect to this regulation use a nail brush, soap and water.

15. Every hairdresser, while attending to a customer, shall wear a clean and properly fitting coat or overall of washable material, with no external pockets.

16. A hairdresser shall not smoke while attending to a customer.

17. The proprietor of a hairdressing establishment shall cause a vessel containing at least one quart of disinfectant solution to be provided for each hairdressing chair.

18. A hairdresser shall cause all razors, scissors, clippers, hairbrushes and combs used by him on a customer to be sterilized after use, by one of the following methods:—

- (a) by immersion for at least ten minutes in a vessel containing at least one quart of disinfectant solution;
- (b) by wiping them with a clean cloth and placing them in a disinfecting appliance for a period of at least ten minutes.

19. The proprietor of a hairdressing establishment shall cause to be provided a sufficient number of razors, scissors, clippers, brushes and combs to permit all used implements to be effectively sterilized in accordance with regulation 18 of these regulations.

20. Where a hairdresser attends a customer who is suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, or any infectious or contagious rash or eruption of the face, scalp or neck or verminous infestation he shall immediately thereafter immerse all instruments, towels and cloths used on that customer and the coat or overall worn by the hairdresser in a disinfecting solution or in boiling water for at least ten minutes.

21. A hairdresser suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or any infectious or contagious skin rash or eruption or verminous infestation shall not attend to any customer.

22. (1) A surveyor may at all reasonable times enter and inspect any premises used as a hairdressing establishment and may inspect or remove for the purpose of examination any instrument or appliance or other thing therein which may be suspected, on reasonable grounds, of being contaminated with the infection of any contagious or infectious disease, and when an article is so removed, a written receipt therefor shall be furnished to the occupier by the surveyor, and the article shall be returned within a period of three days.

(2) The surveyor shall place any appliance removed from a hairdressing establishment in pursuance of subregulation (1) of this regulation in a sterile container for transport from the premises.

23. Any person who by act or omission commits a breach of any of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars and in addition, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty of four dollars for every day that the offence continues after the offender is convicted.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1970.

Shire of Mandurah.

P.H.D. 840/63; Ex. Co. 3197.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911, as amended, a Local Authority may make or adopt By-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any By-laws so made or adopted. Now, therefore, the Shire of Mandurah, being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as published in the *Government Gazette* of 26th May, 1971, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted By-laws shall be amended as follows:—

PART I.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

Substitute for By-law 19, new By-law to read as follows:—

19. (1) (a) No person shall enter or be on any land or premises used by the Council for the purpose of depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish except between the hours of—

Monday to Friday—1 p.m.-6 p.m.

Weekends and Public Holidays—10 a.m.-12 noon.

Closed Xmas Day, Boxing Day, New Years Day and Good Friday.

(b) No person shall deposit any refuse, garbage or rubbish other than at a position on the land designated by an employee of the Council or as indicated by signs.

(c) No person shall interfere with or remove any material or thing whatsoever at any time from any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage or rubbish, except a person licensed with Council to do so.

(d) No person shall light or cause to be burnt, any refuse, garbage or rubbish on any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage and rubbish except on a specified site as designated by the Council and under such conditions as the Council may impose.

(e) No person shall deposit any car body or other material not easily compressible on any land under the control of the Local Authority except at a place which is set aside for the purpose and in accordance with such conditions as the Council may, from time to time impose.

(2) A person who deposits or disposes of any refuse, garbage, rubbish or any other unwanted material at a place other than a place set aside by the Council for the purpose, commits an offence.

- Principal regs. 1. In these regulations the Enzootic Diseases Regulations, 1970, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th June, 1970 as amended from time to time by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 2 amended. 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended—
- (a) by substituting for the item beginning with the passage "PART 6.", the item "PART 6.—CATTLE TICK—regulations 41-49." ;
- (b) by adding after the item beginning with the passage "PART 6.", the following item—PART 6A.—CONTAGIOUS BOVINE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA—regulations 50-54.
- Part 6 substituted. 3. The principal regulations are amended by revoking Part 6 and substituting the following Parts:—

PART 6.—CATTLE TICK.

41. In this Part of these regulations the terms, "free area" or "infected area" mean areas of the State which, by these regulations or by a notice published in the *Government Gazette*, are declared to be free areas or infected areas, as the case requires, in relation to cattle tick.

42. (1) For the purposes of this Part of these regulations the following area of the State is declared to be a free area:—

All that area of the State south of a line commencing at the point where the sea coast meets the 20th parallel of South latitude, proceeding thence along that parallel eastwards until it meets the 127th meridian of East longitude; thence northward along that meridian until it meets the southern boundary of the Kimberley Division as constituted under the Land Act, 1933; thence along that southern boundary eastwards until it meets the boundary of the Northern Territory.

(2) For the purposes of this Part of these regulations the following area of the State is declared to be an infected area:—

Kimberley Infected Area:

All that area of the State north of the line commencing at the point where the sea coast meets the 20th parallel of South latitude, proceeding thence along that parallel eastwards until it meets the 127th meridian of East longitude; thence northward along that meridian until it meets the southern boundary of the Kimberley Division as constituted under the Land Act, 1933; thence along that southern boundary eastwards until it meets the boundary of the Northern Territory.

43. (1) The following conditions apply to the movement of cattle from the Kimberley Infected Area to the free area:—

(a) no movement is to take place until a permit in the form of Form No. 8 has been granted;

(b) a permit shall not be issued unless every animal in the proposed consignment—

(i) carries the registered brand of the property of origin;

(ii) has a negative tuberculin test within thirty days before movement off the property of origin;

(iii) is free of ticks before movement off the property of origin and immediately prior to movement out of the Kimberley Infected Area is dipped in an

approved insecticidal solution lethal to cattle tick and dipped or sprayed with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to buffalo fly, under the supervision of an inspector; or is free of ticks and has not during the period of 35 days immediately preceding movement been within an area in which cattle tick is known or suspected to exist and immediately prior to movement out of the Kimberley Infected Area is dipped in an approved insecticidal solution lethal to cattle tick and dipped or sprayed with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to buffalo fly, under the supervision of an inspector;

(c) all movement shall be by road transport or sea vessel only;

(2) Where cattle are tested under this regulation the owner shall pay the fees prescribed under the Fourth Schedule to these regulations.

44. (1) The following conditions apply to the movement of cattle from the Kimberley Infected Area to the free area where such movement is for the purposes of immediate slaughter only—

(a) no movement is to take place until a written permit has been obtained from an inspector;

(b) a permit shall not be issued unless every animal in the proposed consignment is, immediately before movement, by or under the supervision of an inspector, dipped with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to cattle tick and dipped or sprayed with an approved insecticidal solution lethal to buffalo fly;

(c) the person moving the cattle shall—

(i) remove the cattle directly to the destination specified in the permit;

(ii) remove the cattle only by means of approved transport.

(2) Where cattle have been treated in accordance with this regulation the owner shall pay to the inspector by whom or under whose supervision the treatment was carried out the charge prescribed by the Fourth Schedule.

45. Notwithstanding the provisions of regulations 43 and 44 of these regulations the Chief Inspector may, subject to any conditions which he may from time to time deem necessary to impose, grant written permission for the removal of cattle by land from the Kimberley Infected Area.

46. A person shall not move from the Kimberley Infected Area any conveyance that has, within six months prior to its movement, been used to transport cattle within the Kimberley Infected Area, unless the conveyance is first treated, to the satisfaction of an inspector, for the destruction of cattle tick and buffalo fly.

47. (1) A person shall not move any horse, mule, donkey or camel from the Kimberley Infected Area unless—

(a) the written authority of an inspector in accordance with Form No. 3 is first obtained; and

(b) the stock is, within twenty-four hours before its movement, dipped or sprayed by or under the supervision of an inspector at some place that has been approved by the Chief Inspector for the purpose.

(2) An owner of stock that is dipped or sprayed as required by this regulation shall pay to the inspector the appropriate fees prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.

48. Stock from parts of the State within the free area may not be shipped in a vessel that is also carrying cattle from the Kimberley Infected Area without the written permission of the Chief Inspector.

49. A person who by act or omission contravenes any of the provisions of the regulations in this Part of these regulations, commits an offence.

Penalty:

Minimum—One hundred dollars (\$100).

Maximum—One thousand dollars (\$1,000).

PART 6A.—CONTAGIOUS BOVINE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.

50. In this Part of these regulations the terms "free area", "protected area" or "infected area" mean areas of the State which, by these regulations or by a notice published in the *Government Gazette*, are declared to be free areas, protected areas or infected areas, as the case requires, in relation to contagious bovine pleuro-pneumonia.

51. (1) For the purposes of this Part of these regulations, the following area of the State is declared to be a free area:—

All that area of the State which is not a protected or infected area.

(2) For the purposes of this Part of these regulations the following area of the State is declared to be a protected area:—

All that portion of land starting from the intersection of the Western Australian-Northern Territory Border with the northern boundary of King Location 373 (Part Reserve 31165), being a southern boundary of Pastoral Lease 396/454 and extending west, north, again west, generally southwesterly, south and again west along boundaries of that lease to the easternmost northeastern corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/953; thence south, west, again south, again west, again south, again west, again south, again west, again south, again west, north, generally northeasterly, again north, east, again north and again west along boundaries of that lease to the southernmost southeastern corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/921; thence west, north, again west, again north, east, again north, again east, again north, again west and again north along boundaries of that lease to the southern boundary of Pastoral Lease 3114/962; thence west, generally southwesterly, north, again west, again north, and east along boundaries of that lease to its northeastern corner; thence easterly to and along a southern boundary of Class A Reserve 13873 and northerly along the eastern boundary of that reserve to the low water mark on the left bank of the Forrest River; thence generally southeasterly downwards along that mark to the low water mark on the left bank of the West Arm of Cambridge Gulf; thence generally northeasterly along that mark to Pender Point; thence east to the low water mark on the right bank of that arm; thence generally northerly along that mark to the low water mark on the left bank of the East Arm of Cambridge Gulf aforesaid; thence generally southeasterly along that mark and the low water mark on the left bank of the Ord River to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Reserve 1165; thence easterly along that prolongation to the low water mark on the right bank of the Ord River aforesaid; thence generally northerly along that bank and the right bank of the East Arm of Cambridge Gulf aforesaid to the low water mark of Cambridge Gulf; thence generally northeasterly along that mark to the low water mark of Joseph Bonaparte Gulf; thence generally easterly along that mark to the Western Australia-Northern Territory Border aforesaid; and thence south along that border to the starting point.

52. (1) Whenever cattle are travelling in the Protected Area a person shall not leave or permit to be left any such live cattle upon the stock route or any station property or other land between the station of origin and the point of destination.

(2) The person in charge of any travelling stock within the protected area shall not fail to destroy forthwith any animal that is unable to proceed with the mob and shall forthwith notify the district inspector, and if such destruction takes place within the boundaries of a station property, the owner or manager thereof of the destruction.

53. (1) The following conditions apply to the movement of cattle from a protected area to a free area—

- (a) no movement is to take place until a permit in the form of Form 8 has been granted;
- (b) a permit shall not be issued unless every animal in the proposed consignment—
 - (i) carries the registered brand of the property of origin and is identified by a brand approved by the Chief Inspector for the purpose.
 - (ii) passes the complement fixation test for contagious bovine pleuro-pneumonia within 14 days before movement off the property.

(2) Where cattle are tested under this regulation the owner shall pay the fees prescribed under the Fourth Schedule to these regulations.

54. The following conditions apply to the movement of cattle from an infected area to a protected area or to a free area—

- (a) no movement is to take place until a written permit has been obtained from an inspector;
- (b) a permit shall not be issued except where such movement is for the purposes of immediate slaughter at an approved abattoir;
- (c) all movement shall be by road transport or sea vessel only; and
- (d) no other cattle shall be transported in the same vehicle or vessel between the point of loading and the point of destination.

Reg 80 substituted. 4. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 80 the following regulation:—

80. (1) An owner shall not move cattle off a run for any purpose unless at the time the cattle are so moved, they are identified by a tag, bearing the number of the registered brand of the owner together with the computer check digit, attached securely around the tail of the cattle immediately above the brush.

(2) Subregulation (1) of this regulation does not apply to—

- (a) cattle derived from the Kimberley Infected Area, as defined in regulation 42 of these regulations, intended for movement only within that area;
- (b) cattle moved within 30 days after a previous movement which still wear a tag attached pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation in respect of that previous movement;
- (c) cattle which for reasons other than those set out in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subregulation, should, in the opinion of the Chief Inspector, be exempted.

Reg. 81 substituted. 5. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 81 the following regulation:—

81. A person other than an Inspector shall not within 120 days of the movement of cattle identified with a tag, remove, alter or deface the tag.

Reg. 97 substituted. 6. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 97 the following regulation:—

97. Unless otherwise authorised by the Chief Inspector, every owner of sheep located within a protected area shall, within thirty days after the completion of every shearing, dip or spray such sheep or cause them to be dipped or sprayed unless within that period the sheep are consigned direct to an abattoir for the purpose of immediate slaughter.
