PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1962, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners, at any time and from time to time by proclamation declare that Part III of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to any river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp or marsh specified in the

proclamation to which immediately prior to the issue of the proclamation the said Part III does not apply but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of thirty days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or authorities in or through whose district or districts such river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, swamp, lake or marsh runs or is situate to the intent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by proclamation to declare that Part III of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Stoney Brook and Tributaries' Area which immediately prior to the issue of the proclamation the said Part III does not apply; and whereas after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and with the advice of the Commissioners and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1962 shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Stoney Brook and Tributaries' Area as defined in the schedule hereto.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time, on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to that Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State, by any person; and whereas such types of bread as are respectively specified in the Schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, excluding Rottnest Island, and that is within a radius of twenty-eight miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the Schedule to this proclamation.

Health Model By-laws Series "A".

P.H.D. 553/69; Ex. Co. No. 3590.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911, as amended, a local authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may alter, amend, or repeal any by-laws so adopted. Now, therefore, the Town of Albany being a local authority within the meaning of the Act, and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th July, 1963, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws be amended as follows:—

Substitute for by-law 28 a new by-law to read as follows:—

28. (1) In respect of a residential block of land having an area of half an acre or less, a person shall not keep, or permit to be kept thereon, more than either one horse, or one cow, or one sheep, or one goat, or one donkey, at any one time, without having first received the written approval of Council specifying the number of such animals that may be kept thereon, but such approval may be cancelled by the Council in any case where, having regard to the circumstances, it is the opinion that such cancellation is warranted.

(2) In respect of a residential block of land exceeding half an acre in area, a person shall not keep any horse, cow, sheep, goat or donkey in excess of the number enumerated above without having first received written approval of the Council specifying the number of such animals that may be kept thereon, but such approval may be cancelled by the Council in any case where, having regard to the circumstances, it is of the opinion that such cancellation is warranted.

(3) A person shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, goat or donkey to approach to within 50 feet of any dwelling whatsoever, or other building where food is stored or prepared, or to within 50 feet of any street adjoining such property without having first the written approval of Council specifying a lesser distance, but such approval may be cancelled by the Council in any case where, having regard to the circumstances, it is of the opinion that such cancellation is warranted.

(4) In respect of any land within the municipality where written approval has been granted by the Council for the keeping of any horse, cow, sheep, goat or donkey, the land shall be securely fenced to the satisfaction of the Council.

By-law 3. (ii) is revoked and replaced as follows:—

3. (ii) No person shall keep or house in any Stable a greater number of horses than the number for which such Stable is registered and the number of horses to be stabled will be limited as under—

Holdings less than 30 perches area—horses prohibited.

Holdings of 30 perches to 1 rood—a maximum of one horse.

Holdings of one rood to $\frac{1}{2}$ an acre—a maximum of two horses.

Holdings in excess of $\frac{1}{2}$ an acre—the number of horses to be stabled at the discretion of the Council.

A new By-law 3. (iii) to be inserted after By-law 3. (ii):—

3. (iii) Notwithstanding the provisions of By-law 3. (ii) the Council may declare certain areas as areas where stables cannot be located and registered. Such areas are defined by Schedule "A" of these By-laws.

A new By-law 3. (iv) to be inserted after By-law 3. (iii):—

3. (iv) Nothing contained in By-law 3. (ii) and 3. (iii) shall affect the rights of a person to retain a stable which contravenes those provisions, and which was previously approved and registered by the Council.

HEALTH BY-LAW STABLES.

Schedule "A".

Subject to the provisions of By-law 3. (iv) of the above By-law the following areas are areas declared by Council as areas where stables cannot be located and registered:—

Area: All that area bounded by a line commencing at a point on the northwestern boundary line of the Adeline location subdivision where a prolongation of the centreline of Maxwell Street intersects that boundary line and extending in a northerly direction along that centreline until it intersects the centreline of Lionel Street, then in a southeasterly direction along the centreline of Lionel Street until it intersects a prolongation of the centreline of Oberthur Street then in a northeasterly direction along that centreline until it intersects the centreline of Wilson Street, then in a southeasterly direction along that centreline until it intersects a prolongation of the centreline of Ware Street, then in a southwesterly direction along that centreline until it intersects the centreline of Lionel Street, then in a southeasterly direction until it intersects a prolongation of the centreline of Walter Street, then in an easterly direction along that centreline until it intersects the centreline of Brookman Street, then in a southerly direction along that centreline until it intersects the centreline of Dart Street, then in a westerly direction along that centreline until a prolongation of that centreline intersects the centreline of Wilson Street (Road No. 854) then in a southerly direction along that centreline until it intersects the centreline of North Terrace, then in a westerly direction along that centreline continuing in a prolongation of that centreline until it intersects the southeastern boundary of the Adeline location subdivision, then in a southwesterly direction along that boundary to its southwestern extremity, then in a north, northwesterly direction continuing along the boundary of the subdivision to its northwestern extremity, then in a northeasterly direction along the boundary of the subdivision until it connects with that point first-mentioned as the commencement point of this boundary line.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by virtue of section 17 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1971, I hereby revoke the conditions and directions to licensing officers relating to the taking of abalone issued by me on July 12, 1972 and which were published in the *Government Gazette* of July, 21, 1972, and substitute in their place the following conditions and directions:—

1. The abalone fishery will continue in 1973 to be managed as a concession or limited entry fishery and for these purposes:—
 - 1.1 A person, including a professional fisherman, shall not take abalone for sale unless he holds a professional fisherman's license which has been specifically endorsed "Abalone".
 - 1.2 A licensing officer shall not issue any person with a license endorsed to take abalone unless the Director has agreed that such an endorsed license may be issued to that person.
 - 1.3 A fishing boat shall not be used and a person shall not allow or suffer it to be used for the taking or transport of abalone unless the license for that boat has been endorsed to allow it to be so used.

1.4 For management purposes the State shall be divided into three areas:—

- (a) Area 1—from the South Australian border to Fanny Cove.
- (b) Area 2—Fanny Cove to Busselton.
- (c) Area 3—Cape Leeuwin to Wyndham.

(Note: special licenses may be issued to explore northern waters northwards of Tubridgi Point at the head of Exmouth Gulf).

1.5 Persons holding concessions in Areas 1 and 2 may take and/or sell only Green-lipped and Black-lipped Abalone and shall not take Roe's abalone.

1.6 Persons holding concessions in Area 3 may take Roe's Abalone and shall not take and/or sell either Green-lipped or Black-lipped Abalone.

3. Conditions Imposed on 1973 Licenses:
 Note: These may be renewed at District Offices on or after 1st December, 1972.
- 3.1 Divers Tenders and Shuckers: The Fisheries Act requires that anyone who catches or attempts to catch fish, or assists in catching by any means whatever shall hold a license and shall not do any of those things if he is not licensed.
- 3.2 Any abalone concession holder who has an assistant in his boat whether that assistant is called a crewman or a shucker or a diver's tender must ensure that such a person holds a professional fisherman's license which will be endorsed to prevent that person from taking abalone for sale or from taking any other fish for sale and from selling any fish. He may, however, also act as a crewman on any licensed fishing boat.
- 3.3 A diver's tender or shucker who restricts his activities to the land and does not go into the water or onto a boat does not need any license unless he (or she) dons a wetsuit. Anyone in a wetsuit shucking for, or assisting a licensed abalone diver will be deemed to be assisting a concession holder and must be licensed as in 3.2,
- 3.4 Every abalone concession holder and his crewman, tender, assistant and shucker shall comply with these directions and all the requirements of the Fisheries Act and also shall respect the protection afforded fauna and wildlife sanctuaries under the Fauna Conservation Act, in that he shall not on island or mainland sanctuaries—
 (a) light any fires.
 (b) camp or build any shelters.
 (c) destroy any plants or animals.
- (Note: Reserves south of Shark Bay of particular importance to wildlife include—

4. Cancellation and Suspension of Concessions: Any concession holder who, in the opinion of the Director, commits a breach of any condition of his license, including the employment or use of an unlicensed crewman assistant or diver's tender or who sells fish not actually taken by him will lose his concession, temporarily or permanently as the Minister directs. In this regard the attention of concession holders is directed to the conditions imposed by this direction and set out in particular in paragraphs 3 and 5.
5. Concession Holders' Fishing Restrictions in Other Fisheries:—
 5.1 The holder of an abalone concession:—
 (a) shall not take any rock lobsters of any species for sale from the controlled rock lobster fishery between the 24th and 34th parallels of south latitude, and shall not sell any rock lobsters taken in that area;
 (b) shall not anywhere take any Western Rock Lobsters (*Panulirus cygnus*) for any purpose provided that he may take not more than 2 a day for his own or his family's personal consumption;
 (c) in Area 3—shall not catch or attempt to catch or sell any fish other than the species of abalone authorised by his concession; provided that he may undertake deep sea fishing by means of hand lines or long lines but by no other means;
 (d) in Areas 1 and 2—may take Southern Rock Lobsters and other fish for commercial purposes or personal consumption but shall not take salmon by any means of capture and shall not in rivers, estuaries or on beaches net any fish whatsoever unless specifically authorized on his license.
6. Area 3—Closed reefs: Notwithstanding he has a license endorsed to allow him to take abalone in Area 3, a concession holder shall not take any abalone whatsoever from—
 6.1 any marine reserve where the taking of fish by any means of capture is prohibited.
 6.2 from reefs and waters between the southern most point of Trigg Island to North Mullaloo;
 6.3 from reefs and waters from North Mullaloo to the northernmost point of Burns Beach.

- (1) That the period from five o'clock in the forenoon of 1st January, 1973 until seven o'clock in the afternoon of 31st December, 1973 shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the Kimberley, North-West and Eastern Divisions, as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the species of wild duck in the Second Schedule hereto are game species in all parts of the State in respect of which an open season on those species as declared by paragraph (1) of this notice.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck of a species declared to be a game species under the Second Schedule hereto unless he has been granted a license under Regulation 21 of the Fauna Conservation Regulations.
- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (6) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms and Guns Act, 1931, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch in internal diameter (ten gauge) provided that this restriction shall not prohibit a person who is an aboriginal within the meaning of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act, 1972, from using any native artifact in the taking of wild ducks.
- (7) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks from any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than ten wild ducks in any one day of the open season.

(9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cool store or any freezing chamber or other premises at any one time—

- (a) on opening day more than ten wild ducks;
- (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than twenty wild ducks.

Standard for Liquid Petroleum Gas.

1. The net heating value produced by combustion of the gas must not be below 43,989 nor above 47,655 Megajoules per kilogram weight of the gas.

2. The gas—

- (a) must be free of mechanically entrained water;
- (b) must not contain any hydrogen sulphide or methane or any substance which, if the gas is used for lighting or heating purposes, is toxic, or harmful to human health or safety;
- (c) must not have a total sulphur content exceeding 0.02 per centum by weight nor must it contain more than 0.1296 grams of mercaptan sulphur per 2.83 cubic metres at standard temperature (15.55 degrees Celsius) and standard pressure (101.6 kilopascals absolute), or more than 2 mol per cent. of C2 hydrocarbons, or more than 2 mol per cent. of C5 or higher hydrocarbons expressed as C5 hydrocarbons;
- (d) must—
 - (i) have an odour that is distinctive, unpleasant and non-persistent and which, when the gas is discharged from a cylinder, throughout its discharge, indicates the presence of gas down to 1/5 the lower explosive limit; and
 - (ii) be odourised to comply with this standard by the addition to the gas of an odouriser the nature and the rate of which shall be approved from time to time by the Commission;

Notwithstanding the requirements of this paragraph the Commission may, in a particular case, approve of gas not being odourised if the gas is used as a propellant in aerosol type containers.

(e) must not contain impurities other than those permitted under subparagraphs (c) and (d) of this paragraph.

3. (a) A gas which is sold as propane shall contain no less than 90% by volume of propane or propene, or of propane and propene and the vapour pressure of the gas shall not exceed 1447.9 kilopascals (gauge) pressure at 37.78 degrees Celsius.

(b) A gas which is sold as butane shall consist predominantly of butanes or butenes, or of butanes and butenes the vapour pressure of the gas shall not exceed 482.6 kilopascals (gauge) pressure at 37.78 degrees Celsius and the container in which the gas is sold shall be marked with the designation "Butane".

(c) A gas which is sold as a mixed liquid petroleum gas shall be a mixture of—

- (a) propane or propene, or propane and propene; and
- (b) butanes or butenes, or butanes and butenes,

The maximum vapour pressure of the mixture shall not exceed 1447.9 kilopascals (gauge) pressure at 37.78 degrees Celsius and the container in which the mixture is sold shall be marked with the designation "Mixed L.P.G." and shall also be marked with the maximum and minimum points of the vapour pressure range in kilopascals (gauge) pressure at 37.78 degrees Celsius.

4. Where the gas is evaporated at a temperature of 1.11 degrees Celsius corrected to a barometric pressure of 98.67 kilopascals (absolute), the quantity of gas so evaporated must be 95 per cent. or more by volume.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Consumer Protection Act Regulations.
- Definition. 2. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
“the Act” means the Consumer Protection Act, 1971.
- Requirements may be made orally or by notice. 3. (1) A requirement made by the Commissioner pursuant to paragraph (a) or (b) of subsection (1) of section 19 of the Act may be made orally or by notice in writing.
(2) In this regulation the expression “Commissioner” has the same meaning as it has in and for the purposes of sections 19, 20, 21 and 22 of the Act.
- Service of notices. 4. Where pursuant to the Act or these regulations a person is required by notice in writing to—
(a) give any information;
(b) answer any question; or
(c) produce any document,
that notice may be served on that person—
(d) by delivering the notice to him personally;
(e) by leaving the notice for him at his usual or last known place of abode, or at his usual or last known place of business or employment; or
(f) by posting the notice as a registered letter addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode, or at his usual or last known place of business or employment.
