Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972, that where the Trustees of The Western Australian Museum recommend that any Aboriginal site is of outstanding importance the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare that site to be a protected area; and whereas pursuant to subsection (1) of section 13 of the Act the Trustees, with the consent in writing of the Minister for Community Welfare, by resolution, have delegated to the Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee, the power to make recommendations to the Governor for the purposes of section 19 of the Act; and whereas the Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee has recommended to the Governor that the Weebo Sacred Site is an Aboriginal site of outstanding importance: Now

therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972, hereby declares the Weebo Sacred Site to be a protected area and specifies the boundaries of Reserve No. 30896 to be the boundaries of that protected area.

HEALTH (VENEREAL DISEASES) REGULATIONS, 1973.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Health (Venereal Diseases) Regulations, 1973.
2. The Health (Venereal Diseases) Regulations, 1943, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th January, 1944, are revoked.
3. The notice to be given by the Commissioner pursuant to subsection (1) of section 307 of the Act to any person believed or suspected to be suffering from venereal disease shall be according to the form numbered 1 in the appendix to these regulations.
4. Whenever by reason of the non-production of the required certificate or, if produced, of the unsatisfactory nature thereof, the Commissioner shall consider that the circumstances of the case require the issue of his warrant for the compulsory examination of such person, such warrant shall issue in the form numbered 2 in the appendix to these regulations.
5. Notice of the date, time and place of the compulsory examination referred to in the preceding regulation shall be given by post or by leaving the notice at the last known place of abode of the suspected person. If the suspected person fails to attend for examination in accordance with the requirements of the notice, the Commissioner may issue a warrant in the form numbered 3 in the appendix to these regulations for the apprehension of the suspected person for the purpose of examination aforesaid.
6. If, in the opinion of the Commissioner, a report of examination is such as, in accordance with the provisions of subsection (2) of section 307 of the Act, justifies the apprehension and detention of the person named in such report, the Commissioner may issue his warrant accordingly and the warrant shall be in the form numbered 4 in the appendix to these regulations.
7. The Commissioner may, whenever the circumstances of the case so require, issue his warrant in the form numbered 5 in the appendix to these regulations for the apprehension, if necessary, and further detention of any person suffering from venereal diseases in an infectious condition.
8. Every warrant mentioned in these regulations shall be sufficient authority for the person or persons to whom it is directed—
 - (a) to apprehend the person named therein;
 - (b) to convey the person named therein to the place of examination or detention; and
 - (c) to detain the person in the place of detention for the period specified in the warrant.
9. Every warrant issued under these regulations shall have effect according to its tenor and all officials of the Department of Public Health and all governing authorities and officers of any hospital or place in which any person is detained under these regulations shall do all things necessary to carry into effect the provisions of these regulations.

WHEREAS it is provided in the Health Act, 1911-1965, that a local authority may, of its own motion, by resolution adopt with or without modification the whole or any portion of by-laws caused to be prepared by the Governor under the provisions of section 343 (1) of the Act; and whereas model by-laws described as Series "A" prepared in accordance with those provisions and duly amended, have, pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, been reprinted with amendments to and including that published in the *Government Gazette* of 25th June, 1963, and further amended by notices published in the *Government Gazette* of 7th November, 1963, 20th March, 1964, 16th June, 1964, and 8th January, 1965; and whereas the Town of Canning resolved and determined that the said model by-laws as so reprinted and published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th July, 1963, together with the amendments thereto, should be adopted and notice thereof was published in the *Government Gazette* of 8th February, 1967, at page 419; and whereas the Town of Canning wishes to amend the said by-laws: Now, therefore, the Town of Canning doth hereby resolve and determine that the said model by-laws so amended and adopted shall be further amended in the following manner:—

PART I.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

By-law 19 is amended by substituting for sub-by-law (6) a new sub-by-law (6) to stand as follows:—

(6) The driver of a vehicle upon entry on land set aside by the Council for the purpose of depositing refuse, shall make payment of a fee as follows:—

- (a) Per car, utility or trailer arising from domestic or residential premises within the Town of Canning, provided that persons who are ratepayers and occupiers produce the identification card as issued by the Town of Canning—Nil.
- (b) Per car, utility or trailer arising from premises not within the Town of Canning—\$0.50.
- (c) Trucks up to 4 ton aggregate—\$1.00.
- (d) Single axle trucks over 4 ton aggregate—\$2.00.
- (e) Dual axle trucks—\$4.00.
- (f) Bulk bins up to 6 cubic yards—\$2.00.
- (g) Bulk bins over 6 cubic yards—\$3.00.
- (h) Compactor vehicles up to 12 cubic yards—\$6.00.
- (i) Compactor vehicles over 12 cubic yards—\$8.00.

- (j) Motor vehicle bodies from commercial or industrial premises—\$5.00.
 (k) Motor vehicle bodies from residential premises within the Town of Canning—Nil.
 (l) Motor vehicle bodies not acceptable unless cut into three or more sections of approximately equal size.

TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 4:

DALWOOD SCHEME.

THE Shire of Mundaring under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme:—

SCHEME TEXT.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Mundaring Town Planning Scheme No. 4—Dalwood Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Mundaring (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following maps are attached to this text and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.
Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

General Objects.

5. The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) To make land available for residential purposes and for the other purposes shown on the Scheme Map.
- (b) To plan within the Scheme Area suitable roads.
- (c) To plan the subdivision of land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To ensure the proper drainage of the roads and of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other such works.
- (e) To facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area.
- (f) To make provision for land to be used for Public Open Space and drainage purposes.
- (g) To make provision for the reticulation of sewerage throughout the Scheme Area.
- (h) To provide for the sharing of the costs of the works carried out among the owners of land in the Scheme Area.

Method of Carrying Out Objects.

6. As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide their land such subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area.

7. The Scheme Map forms a basis for subdivision and development of the Scheme Area but the Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit alterations or variations to the subdivision of the land shown on the Scheme Map where in its opinion circumstances justify such action provided that no such alterations or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

Subdivision.

8. An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act of Western Australia.

Survey of Scheme Area.

9. Each owner shall upon the approval of the plan of subdivision of his land arrange for the survey of his land in accordance with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such modifications permitted as aforesaid and shall pay the costs thereof. If the Council shall consider it to be necessary or desirable that an owner's land be surveyed according to the Scheme Map it may arrange for the work to be carried out. An owner shall pay to the Council the cost of the survey of his land on the subdivision of the land or at the expiration of three months notice given to him by the Council whichever shall first happen.

New Roads.

10. Subject to the following clauses all new roads and footways within the Scheme Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein and each owner shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the roads and footways and pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads and footways within the land owned by him.

11. In cases where the situation of a new road or footway within the Scheme Area is such that in the opinion of the Council it would be fair and equitable that the owners of land served or capable of being served by the road or footway should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road or footway and apportion the value of the land made available for the purpose and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them the amount (if any) payable by each such owner and any incidental matters shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

12. The Council may resume or otherwise acquire the whole or any portion or portions of the land required for new roads or footways and may construct and drain any new roads or footways within the Scheme Area. If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the land abutting such road or footway the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road or footway and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions as and when they subdivide their land or at the expiration of three months notice given by the Council whichever shall first happen.

13. If an owner shall claim compensation for the resumption from him of land to be used as a road or footway there shall be set off against the amount of compensation payable to him the amount by which the value of the remainder of his land has been or will be increased by the construction of the roads or footways within the Scheme Area and by the operation of the Scheme.

14. If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessor in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road or footway within the Scheme Area he shall before the approval of his plan of subdivision

release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessor in title as the case may be.

Public Open Space.

15. It is intended that the land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be reserved for Public Open Space and drainage purposes.

16. The Council may as and when it deems fit acquire the said lands coloured green or any parts thereof either by purchase or resumption or partly by one method and partly by the other.

17. Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land or any part thereof and subject as hereinafter provided transfer to the Council an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of that owner's land within the Scheme Area.

18. If within an owner's land in the Scheme Area less than one-tenth is required by the Council for Public Open Space and drainage purposes the owner shall transfer to the Council the land required by it and the owner shall pay to the Council an amount so that the value of the land (if any) to be transferred with the cash payment equals in value one-tenth of the owner's land in the Scheme Area.

19. If within an owner's land in the Scheme Area more than one-tenth is required by the Council for Public Open Space or drainage purposes the owner shall transfer to the Council the land required by it for that purpose and the Council shall pay to the owner by way of compensation the value of the land exceeding the said one-tenth as shall be required by the Council. If the Council and the owner so agree the Council may transfer to the said owner other land in or near the Scheme Area either owned by the Council or acquired by it for that purpose to compensate him for the land in excess of the said one-tenth required by the Council in which case the amount payable by the Council to the owner shall be reduced accordingly.

20. If the Council shall have resumed land for Public Open Space roads or drainage purposes the amount and value of the said one-tenth of an owner's land shall be assessed on the basis that such land had not been resumed.

Drainage Sewerage and Water Supply.

21. The Scheme Area shall be progressively drained and all necessary earthworks shall be undertaken. The drainage works shall be carried out by the Council and the cost thereof shall be paid to the Council in accordance with the subsequent provisions of the Scheme.

22. Sewerage services shall be made available to the Scheme Area. Each owner shall be responsible to pay the costs of the reticulation of sewerage services throughout the land owned by him.

23. Reticulated water is available in the Scheme Area. Each owner shall be responsible to pay the costs of the reticulation of water supply services throughout the land owned by him.

Scheme Costs.

24. Realty Development Corporation Pty. Ltd. of 290 Scarborough Beach Road Osborne Park (hereinafter called "Realty Development Corporation") has expressed its willingness to meet the following costs:—

(a) All fees and costs paid or payable to the Council's Town Planners and to the Council's Solicitors in connection with the Scheme.

(b) The cost to the Council of the said drainage works.

(c) The cost payable in order to bring the sewerage head works to the corner of Myles Road and Morrison Road.

(d) Any additional costs such as pumping stations and larger mains required for the reticulation of sewerage works through the land owned by Realty Development Corporation by reason of the fact that the sewerage mains pass through its land in order to serve other lands.

(e) Any costs payable in order to bring to the Scheme Area a greater volume of water than is now available.

(f) Any additional costs such as larger mains necessary for the quantity of water required in the Scheme Area.

25. The amounts of the costs referred to in the preceding clause and any other costs paid or payable by Realty Development Corporation which are certified in writing by the Council to be costs relating to the Scheme and interest on all such amounts calculated as hereinafter appears are herein referred to as "Scheme Costs". The Scheme Costs shall be paid to the Council or direct to Realty Development Corporation by the owners of land in the Scheme Area specified hereunder in the following proportions:—

 Lots 6, 17, 9, 10 and 11; 98/418.

The proportion of the Scheme Costs to be borne by Realty Development Corporation in respect of land owned by it is as follows:—

Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 22, 21, 19, 18 and 7; 200/418.

26. The said interest shall be calculated on each on proportion at the rate of ten per centum (10%) per annum from the date of each expenditure by Realty Development Corporation until the payment thereof by the owner to the Council or to Realty Development Corporation.

27. Each owner shall pay his proportion of the Scheme Costs when he shall subdivide his land or any part thereof or at the expiration of three calendar months' notice given to him by the Council whichever shall first happen. If an owner does not make payment to the Council or to Realty Development Corporation accordingly the Council shall take proceedings against such owner for the recovery of the amount payable.

28. The Council shall subject to the following clause within fourteen (14) days of the receipt of any owner's share of the Scheme Costs pay the amount received by it to Realty Development Corporation.

29. Realty Development Corporation may retain all moneys payable by it to the Council under Clause 18 until all moneys payable to it by the other owners of land for their proportion of Scheme Costs have been paid. For the purpose of the interest calculated under Clause 26 the moneys retained by Realty Development Corporation shall be deducted from the moneys expended by it in payment of the costs of the Scheme.

30. If at the time an owner wishes to subdivide his land the Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained the Council in consultation with Realty Development Corporation may estimate the Scheme Costs and the amount payable by the owner shall be based on the estimate so made. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

31. If when the Scheme Costs shall have actually been paid or ascertained it shall be found that the amount paid by an owner based on an estimate of Scheme Costs exceeds the actual Scheme Costs the amount of the excess shall be paid by Realty Development Corporation to that owner and if it be found that the amount paid by an owner is less

than the actual Scheme Costs the amount of the difference shall be paid by that owner to the Council for payment to Realty Development Corporation.

32. Each owner shall pay the cost of the connection of the buildings on his land to the sewerage mains and the water mains.

Filling.

33. If any land shall require levelling or filling before it can be subdivided or built upon the cost of such works shall be borne by the owner of the land.

Valuations.

34. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or at the option of the Council by a disinterested and competent valuer appointed by the Council. The values of land shall be based on its undivided state.

35. If an owner shall object to the value of his land determined as aforesaid he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

36. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in value.

Arbitration.

37. Any dispute or difference between the owners as to any matter which by the terms of this Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to arbitration in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

Powers and Authorities of Council.

38. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

(a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.

(b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.

(c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.

(d) If any owner of land within within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the terms of the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so will in the opinion of the Council unduly delay the completion of the Scheme the Council may resume the land of such owner or owners or any part or parts thereof and proceed with the subdivision and development of the land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.

(e) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under paragraph (d) it shall have all the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land. If the owner has not been paid compensation for the resumption of his land the Council shall before selling the land so subdivided and developed offer the new lots to the owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision or development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by the Council from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent

upon such subdivision and development and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance (if any) of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

(f) If the offer mentioned in paragraph (e) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.

(g) The Council may resume any land within the Scheme Area for roads and footways public open space or drainage sewerage or water reticulation purposes.

(h) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under paragraph (d) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.

(i) To extend the time within which payments have to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.

39. The Council shall permit owners to develop their land in stages as sewerage and water supply works proceed.

40. The Council shall if requested in writing by Realty Development Corporation so to do exercise its powers under Clause 38 (d) in respect of any land within the Scheme Area nominated by Realty Development Corporation Provided that any losses incurred by the Council under Clause 38 (e) or 38 (f) as the result of a request by Realty Development Corporation shall be paid by Realty Development Corporation and shall be certified by the Council as being costs relating to the Scheme under Clause 25.

41. Twenty-eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said Section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

42. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.

Claims for Compensation.

43. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme may be made within six months of the Scheme coming into operation.

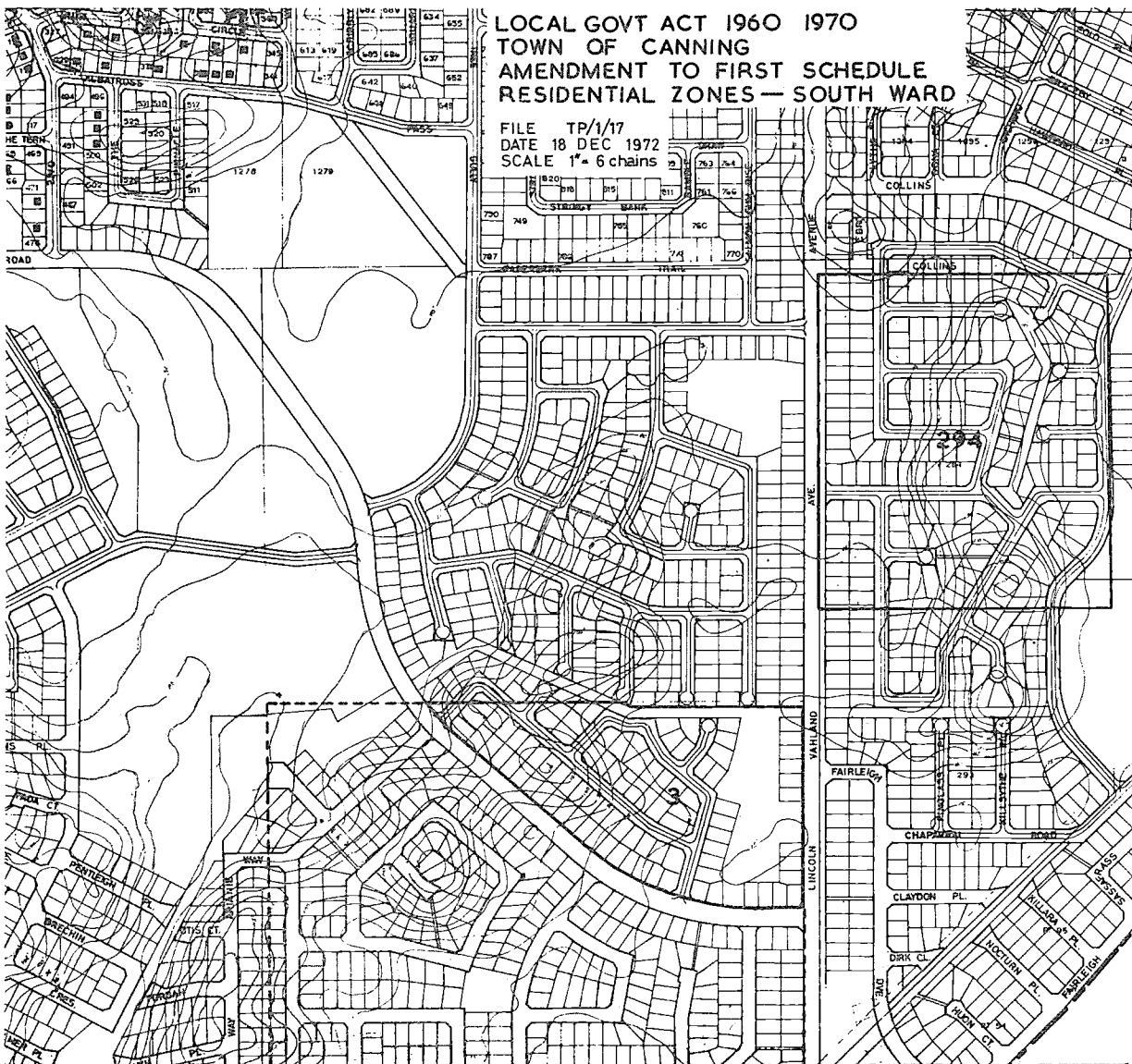

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 17th day of October, 1972, to amend its Long Service Leave By-laws, as published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 66) on the 12th July, 1957, by such amendments as hereunder set out:—

Schedule—Amendments.

1. In the interpretation of the principal by-laws, the words "Council" and "Shire Council" shall be substituted for the words "Board" and "Road Board" respectively.

Revocation.

The principal by-laws are amended by the revocation of the whole of by-law number 2 and number 3 and the insertion in lieu of the following by-laws:—

2. (a) All present and future employees of the Council shall, after each period of 10 year's continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing from the 1st day of July, 1951, be entitled to three months' long service leave, and no long service leave shall be granted to an employee without a qualifying period of 10 years being first completed.
 - (b) Provided, however, that those employees who have completed the initial qualification period of ten years under these by-laws, shall be entitled to a second or subsequent period of three months' long service leave for each completed seven year period of continuous service with the Municipality. After the completion of the first 10 years employees will be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Council before the next period of seven years is completed.
 - (c) The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be one and six sevenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave and shall be on full pay.
3. In the event of the resignation, dismissal by retrenchment, retirement, or death of an employee, the Council may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representative or if there be none, to his dependants), a sum of money equal to his salary or wages for the period of long service leave which the Council was empowered under these by-laws to grant such employee at the date of his resignation, dismissal by retrenchment, retirement, or death, or if the Council, after consideration of all circumstances, direct that the death of the employee be presumed, the Council may authorise the payment

to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of salary or wages which would under this by-law have been granted to the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Council.

By-laws Relating to Swimming Pools.

L.G. 36/73.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 28th day of November, 1972, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following By-laws:—

Swimming Pools.

1. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Pool Manager” means the person for the time being employed by the Council to control and to manage the Pool Premises and includes his assistant or deputy.

“Attendant” means an employee of the Council performing duties in connection with Pool Premises.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Rockingham.

“Pool Premises” means “the Rockingham Aquatic Centre” and all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such centre or used in connection therewith.

2. (a) The Pool Premises shall be open for admission of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time determine and until otherwise determined, the Pool Premises shall be open from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.

(b) The Pool Premises or any part thereof, may at any time in the discretion of the Manager, endorsed by Council, be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

3. The Council may from time to time and for such periods as it determines close the Pool Premises to the Public.

4. The Council may refuse any person admission to the Pool Premises at any time and children under the age of six (6) years shall be refused admission unless accompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years.

5. The following are the charges for admission to the Pool Premises:—

Children under Sixteen (16) years of age—10c

Persons sixteen (16) years of age and over—20c

Pensioners (on production of Pension Card)—No charge

Children under four (4) years—No charge

School Students in groups under the control of a teacher or teachers entering the pool for the purpose of attending school swimming classes—5c

6. The Council may issue or authorise the issue of Season Tickets for such period at such cost and upon such conditions as it shall from time to time determine.

7. The charge for the hiring of lockers shall be 10c per day or admission.

8. Every person who hires a locker shall pay a deposit in respect of each locker key, token or tag of 10c per day or admission.

9. Every person who hires a locker shall before leaving the Pool Premises return the key or token or tag of the locker to the Pool Manager or Attendant.

10. If an article which has been hired is returned in good order and condition the deposit paid in respect thereof shall be refunded to the person returning the article. If any such article is not returned on day of hire or is returned in a damaged condition then without prejudice to any other remedies of the Council the whole or such part of the deposit as the Pool Manager or Attendant shall decide shall be forfeited to the Council.

11. Every person using the Pool Premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager with regard to such use.

12. The Pool Manager may temporarily suspend admittance to or clear the Pool Premises or any part thereof of all or any persons or person if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

13. If a person shall appear in public and in the opinion of the Pool Manager or an Attendant be indecently or insufficiently clad the Pool Manager or Attendant shall direct that person forthwith to resume his or her ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with that direction.

14. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager who is hereby so empowered and directed, to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool Premises any person who in the opinion of the Pool Manager:—

(a) Is a child under the age of six (6) years and is unaccompanied by a responsible person; or

(b) Is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these By-laws; or

(c) Is by his past or present conduct undesirable; or

(d) Is under or apparently under the influence of alcoholic liquor or drugs; or

(e) Is apparently suffering from any contagious, infectious, offensive disease or skin complaint,

and any such person shall upon the request of the Pool Manager or Attendant to withdraw from the Pool Premises quietly and peaceably do so immediately.

15. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool Premises or has been requested to leave the Pool Premises and who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager or an attendant may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk against such action. The Council shall consider the objection and give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit. The right of appeal given by this By-law shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council or Pool Manager or an Attendant arising out of such refusal of admission or direction to leave the Pool Premises.

16. No person shall for profit teach, coach or train any person in the Pool Premises unless with the prior written consent of the Council.

17. The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

18. (1) No person, club, association or organisation shall conduct a carnival at the Pool Premises unless with prior written consent of the Council.

(2) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

(3) A person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival at the Pool Premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool Premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

(4) The person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool Premises shall pay to the Council such charges as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

19. Any person may deposit with the Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool Premises, any article for safe keeping upon the payment of the sum of 10c. Depositors shall complete and sign a deposit slip giving full description and value of item deposited. The article deposited will be returned to the depositor on satisfactory proof of ownership by signature. The Council, Manager or other Officer or employee shall not in any way be held responsible for any damage to destruction or loss or theft of any article so deposited.

20. Every person finding within the Pool Premises any article which may have been left or lost therein shall immediately deliver it to the Pool Manager who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose and any person claiming the article who satisfies the Pool Manager that he is the lawful owner of the article shall upon payment of a charge of ten cents (10c) and upon signing a receipt for it have the article returned to him.

21. All articles left in the Pool Premises and not claimed within a period of three (3) calendar months shall be disposed of by the Council by first offering the article to the finder and if he shall refuse it, the Council shall then dispose of the article in any manner it thinks proper.

22. (1) No person shall enter any portion of the Pool Premises set apart exclusively for the opposite sex. Nor shall any person without the consent of the occupier enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing box or other compartment which is already occupied.

(2) No person upon the Pool Premises shall in any way interfere with any other person therein or with any other person's use thereof nor throw or push or attempt to throw or push any person into the swimming pool or throw any stones, sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any person using the Pool Premises.

(3) No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of the users of the Pool Premises, provided that nothing therein contained apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports organised and conducted on the Pool Premises by any club, association or organisation or other person at such time and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council.

(4) No person being the owners of or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall cause or allow such dog or animal to enter or remain in or about the Pool Premises.

23. No person shall—

- (a) not being an officer or employee of the Council in the course of his duties, or a pensioner on production of his pension card enter the pool premises without having first paid to the Pool Manager or an attendant the proper charge for admission;
- (b) obstruct the Pool Manager in carrying out his duties;
- (c) enter or depart from any part of the Pool Premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose;
- (d) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume except in a dressing enclosure provided for that purpose;
- (e) appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such a nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person;
- (f) enter or be in the Pool Premises while in an intoxicated condition induced by liquor or drugs;
- (g) take into the Pool Premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor or drugs;

- (h) use any soap in any part of the Pool Premises other than in the dressing rooms or shower recess;
- (i) in any part of the Pool Premises behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous or indecent manner, swear or use any indecent, obscene, offensive or abusive language or gamble or misconduct himself or herself.
- (j) climb up to or upon any roof, fence, wall or partition on the Pool Premises;
- (k) deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the Pool Premises except in places set aside for that purpose;
- (l) except in the specified areas consume any food or drink.
- (m) wastefully use the water or leave any taps dripping in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the Pool Premises;
- (n) spit in the swimming pool or on any part of the Pool Premises or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such premises;
- (o) use any substance or preparation whereby the water of the swimming pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers;
- (p) foul or pollute water in any shower, bath or in the swimming pool, or soil, damage, injure, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any dressing room, closet or compartment, or other part of the Pool Premises or any furniture or other article of equipment therein;
- (q) damage, improperly use or interfere with any tap, valve, locker or other fitting or appliance in or about the Pool Premises or discharge litter of any description on, in or about the Pool Premises or bring or deposit any filth or rubbish onto or in the Pool Premises;
- (r) smoke, unless permitted by the Pool Manager, in any buildings, dressing room or other compartment in the Pool Premises;
- (s) whilst suffering from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use or attempt to enter to use the swimming pool or the Pool Premises or any part thereof;
- (t) soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume;

24. A person shall not pay nor shall any Pool Manager or Attendant or officer or servant of the Council receive any fee for admission to or for the use of any facility in the Pool Premises except upon such person being permitted to pass through a turnstile which automatically registers such admission or except in exchange for a printed ticket bearing the name of the Council or in exchange for a ticket issued from a cash register of the Council.

25. Every person shall when leaving the Pool Premises, if requested to do so, produce his or her bathing costume or towel for inspection by the Pool Manager or attendant.

26. No ticket, token, license or receipt issued as provided by these by-laws shall be transferable and no person other than the person to whom it was originally issued shall enjoy any benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

27. Neither the Council nor the Pool Manager or Attendant or Officers or Employee of the Council shall in any way be responsible for any article or money lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool Premises or for any articles damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the Pool Premises.

28. (1) A person who infringes any of the provisions of these by-laws or shall attempt any breach thereof, may be summarily removed from the Pool Premises or any part thereof by the Pool Manager or an Attendant, and if committing a breach of the Act or these by-laws may be arrested by the Pool Manager or an Attendant and given into the custody of a police officer. The Pool Manager or an Attendant may refuse to admit to the Pool Premises any person who shall have been convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws until such time as the Council may decide that such person shall be admitted.

(2) The Council may issue a written direction to the Pool Manager that any person named in such direction shall not be admitted to the Pool Premises, and whilst such direction remains in force, the Pool Manager or an attendant shall not admit such person to the Pool Premises or permit him to be therein, and such person shall not with the knowledge that such direction is in force, enter or attempt to enter the Pool Premises.

29. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$100.

Principal regs. 1. In these regulations the Beekeepers Regulations, 1963 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th December, 1963 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 15A added. 2. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 15 the following heading and regulation—

Notices.

15A. (1) A beekeeper maintaining an apiary on land which he does not own, or on land which he does not have his usual place of residence shall erect and display in such a position as to be clearly visible to all persons approaching the apiary a notice bearing—

- (a) the name;
- (b) the telephone number;
- (c) the hive brand; and
- (d) the usual address,

of the beekeeper in letters of not less than two inches in height.

(2) Nothing in subregulation (1) of this regulation permits the nailing of notices to trees in contravention of the Forests Act, 1918.
