ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2113/72.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1971, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 32427, should vest in and be held by the City of Perth, in trust for the purpose of "Recreation and Parklands": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the City of Perth, in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Local Government Act, 1960-1973.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 736/70.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973, that the Governor may, *inter alia*, make and publish in the *Government Gazette* uniform general by-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a Council under Part IV of that Act, and by order, declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the order together with any amendments thereof whether by way of addition, substitution or cancellation shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district so specified; and whereas it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 691 of that Act that power given by that Act to make Orders in Council includes power from time to time to revoke or cancel those orders wholly or in part for the purpose of substituting other Orders in Council for those revoked or cancelled; and whereas the Governor has made and published uniform general by-laws, namely, the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965, and has from time to time made and published amendments thereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby revoke wholly every Order in Council heretofore made under section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960, as amended from time to time, and doth hereby declare that of the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965, published in the *Government Gazette* on 15th October, 1965, and all the amendments made to those by-laws after that day but not later than the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*:—

- (a) the whole of each of them with the exception of paragraph (a) of by-law 2805, applies to the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Rockingham;
- (b) the whole of each of them applies to the municipal district of the Shire of Swan with the exception of paragraph (a) of sub-by-law (1) of by-law 203 and sub-by-law (2) of by-law 2832 which apply only to those portions of the district which are not shown as for "Rural Development", on the Metropolitan Regional Plan;
- (c) the whole of each of them applies to the whole of each of the municipal districts set out in the first schedule hereto;
- (d) the whole of each of them applies to those portions specified in each of the districts set out in the second schedule; and
- (e) the whole of each of them, with the exception of by-laws 2829 to 2938, inclusive, Division 11—Outbuildings which shall not apply to those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Denmark that are

zoned for rural purposes by Zoning by-laws or a Town Planning Scheme, applies to the whole of the district of the Shire of Denmark.
