ORDER IN COUNCIL.

leased for a term of 10 years to the Benedictine Community of New Norcia Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of "The Drysdale River Mission": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the abovementioned reserve shall be leased for a term of 10 years to the Benedictine Community of New Norcia Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of "The Drysdale River Mission", subject to the condition that should the Mission at any time cease to be a Mission the land will revert to the Crown.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT, 1893-1973.

Rules of The Barristers' Board.

WHEREAS by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1973 (hereinafter called "the Act") The Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered from time to time to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the said Act mentioned; and whereas it is desired to amend the rules of the Board as reprinted pursuant to the provisions of the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, including amendments up to and including *Government Gazette* (No. 69) of 31st August, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 6) of 21st January, 1963, and thereafter amended by amendments published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 35) of 15th May, 1963, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 45) of 27th May, 1964, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 34) of 19th April, 1967, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 44) of 21st May, 1968, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 17) of 12th March, 1971, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 85) of 1st October, 1971, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 105) of 10th November, 1972, and the *Government Gazette* (No. 26) of 30th March, 1973: Now, therefore, the Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the Act, doth hereby, at a meeting held on the 15th day of February, 1974 make and publish the following amendments to the said rules, to take effect upon the date of the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*:—

AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES.

1. Rule 3. The Interpretation of "Chairman" is amended by deleting the interpretation and inserting the words "'Chairman' shall include the Solicitor General when acting as the delegate of the Attorney General pursuant to section

13 of the Solicitor-General Act, 1969, and any member of the Board elected to preside at any meeting of the Board in the absence of the Chairman”.

2. Rule 4 is amended by deleting the word “five” in line 2 and inserting the word “seven” in place thereof.

3. Rule 8 (c) is amended by deleting the word “five” in line 2 and inserting the word “seven” in place thereof.

4. Rule 9 is amended by deleting the word “five” in line 1.

5. Rule 18 is amended—

(a) by deleting the word “fulfils” and inserting the words “has fulfilled” in place thereof, and

(b) by deleting the words “a degree in law” and inserting the words “the degree of Bachelor of Jurisprudence and the degree of Bachelor of Laws” in place thereof.

6. Rule 34A is added to Division 3 Part IV of the Rules to follow Rule 34 and reading:—

“34A. The foregoing rules in this Division have no application to an articulated clerk who fulfilled the requirements of the University of Western Australia for the taking of the degree of Bachelor of Jurisprudence and the degree of Bachelor of Laws at that University and for the purposes of section 15 subsection (2) (a) of the Act it is prescribed that such clerk shall attend lectures and take an examination in Accounts as shall be provided by the Board.”

7. Rule 50A is amended by deleting the word “or” in line 2 and adding the words “or section 58 (1)” after the figures and letter 58 (C) in line 2.

8. The following Rules are added after Rule 50A:—

50B. Whenever a supervising Solicitor is appointed under the provisions of the Act the supervising Solicitor shall as soon as practicable give written notice of his appointment as a supervising Solicitor to the clients of the practice who shall at the time of such appointment have current matters in the practice.

50C. In the case of the practice of a deceased practitioner a supervising Solicitor shall not undertake any new work without first disclosing to the client his appointment as a supervising Solicitor.

50D. In the conduct of a practice pursuant to the provisions of this Part a supervising Solicitor may do all such acts and things as are usually and reasonably done in or about the conduct of practices of a similar nature and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the supervising Solicitor may in respect of the practice:—

(a) pay all rents and other outgoings payable in respect of the premises in which the practice is conducted or in respect of any chattels utilised in the conduct of the practice.

(b) employ and dismiss all staff reasonably required for the purpose of conducting the practice and pay all salaries, long service leave, workers' compensation and all other outgoings usually paid in respect of such staff.

(c) maintain all telephone and electrical services utilised in the practice.

(d) make the employer's contribution to and continue in a Superannuation Scheme established for the benefit of the employees of the practice.

(e) make all necessary tax deductions from salaries of the employees of the practice and from such deductions to purchase such tax stamps as may be required by law.

(f) pay all insurance premiums for fire, accident or professional indemnity and all other insurances as are usual in practices of a similar nature.

(g) make such contributions as are required under the Legal Contribution Trust Act, 1967 and withdraw money from the credit of the Trust established by that Act.

(b) by deleting the passage “£4.4s” in line 4 and inserting the passage “\$12.50” in place thereof.

MARGARINE ACT REGULATIONS, 1974.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Margarine Act Regulations, 1974.
2. The Margarine Act Regulations made under the Margarine Act, 1940 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th February, 1941 and reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th January, 1969 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, incorporating all amendments up to and including the 3rd December, 1965 and amended thereafter by notice so published on the 16th December, 1971 are revoked.

Interpretation.

3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears—
“approved” means approved by an inspector;
“Food and Drug Regulations” means the Food and Drug Regulations made under the Health Act, 1911, as amended from time to time;
“margarine factory” means any building or place where margarine is manufactured or where fats (whether of animal or vegetable origin) are treated or prepared preparatory to the manufacture of margarine;
“the Act” means the Margarine Act, 1940.

Licenses.

4. (1) Every application for a license to manufacture Table Margarine or Cooking Margarine or Manufacturing Margarine (as the case may be) shall be in writing in the Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) Every application for a Margarine Dealer's License shall be in writing in the Form No. 5 in the Appendix to these regulations.

(3) Every application referred to in this regulation shall contain the particulars indicated in the respective forms, shall be signed by the applicant and shall be accompanied by the appropriate license fee.

5. Subject to the proviso to section 19 of the Act the annual license fee for a Table Margarine License shall be 500 dollars, for a Cooking Margarine License or a Manufacturing Margarine License shall be 100 dollars, and for a Margarine Dealer's License shall be 100 dollars.

6. Subject to section 17 of the Act—

- (a) a Table Margarine License shall be in the Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations;
- (b) a Cooking Margarine License shall be in the Form No. 3 in the Appendix to these regulations;
- (c) a Manufacturing Margarine License shall be in the Form No. 4 in the Appendix to these regulations; and
- (d) a Margarine Dealer's License shall be in Form No. 6 in the Appendix to these regulations.

7. A license to manufacture margarine shall be applicable to the margarine factory specified in the application for the license and shall not be applicable to any other premises.

8. (1) The Minister shall cause to be kept a register, in which particulars shall be entered of every license granted and of the cancellation or transfer of any license.

(2) The register shall be open to inspection by the public, at such times and on such days as the Minister may determine, on payment of an inspection fee of ten cents.

9. (1) A license granted under the Act shall not be cancelled under section 24 of the Act until after a report in writing has been made to the Minister by the Director of Agriculture that the license is liable to cancellation.

(2) Upon receipt of a report that a license is liable to be cancelled the Minister shall cause to be served upon the holder of the license concerned a notice in writing calling upon the holder to show cause why the license should not be cancelled, and appointing a day, time, and place on and at which the holder will be heard.

(3) The holder of a license who has received a notice in pursuance of subregulation (2) of this regulation may, before the time appointed therein, by writing under his hand sent to the Minister, show cause why his license should not be cancelled or, on the day and at the time and place appointed by the notice, may appear before the person then present, being either the Minister or some other person appointed by the Minister, for the purpose, either in person or by his solicitor or agent, and show cause as aforesaid.

(4) Where the holder of a license purports to show cause in pursuance of this regulation the Minister shall consider the representations made by the holder of the license, and thereafter shall determine whether the license shall be cancelled or not.

(5) Where the Minister decides that the license shall be cancelled a memorandum of the cancellation shall be entered in the license register, and notice of the cancellation shall be served upon the holder of the license in the Form No. 7 in the Appendix to these regulations.

Sale or Lease of Margarine Factory.

10. (1) When any margarine factory, in respect of which a current license under the Act has been issued, is transferred or leased by the holder of the license to another person, the holder of that license shall, within fourteen days after the transfer or lease, notify the Director of Agriculture of that transfer or lease, and of the name and address of the transferee or lessee, as the case may be.

(2) Before a transferee or lessee uses a margarine factory which has been transferred or leased to him as a margarine factory, he shall either obtain a transfer to himself of the current license granted in respect thereof or, otherwise, make application for and obtain a new license under the Act in respect of the margarine factory.

Permits to Export Margarine.

11. (1) A person may make application to the Minister for a special permit—

- (a) to manufacture table margarine for export, pursuant to section 27 of the Act;
- (b) to manufacture margarine containing butterfat for export, pursuant to section 28 of the Act.

(2) The application shall be in writing in the Form No. 8 in the Appendix to these regulations, shall be signed by the applicant, and be sent or delivered to the Director of Agriculture.

(3) Every special permit granted under section 27 or section 28 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 9 in the Appendix to these regulations.

12. Every person who intends to export beyond the State margarine manufactured within the State shall, at least three clear days (exclusive of Sundays and public holidays) before exporting the margarine, give to an inspector notice in writing, in the Form No. 10 in the Appendix to these regulations, of that intention.

13. A person shall not export or attempt to export from the State any margarine manufactured within the State, until an inspector has examined the margarine and has issued a certificate, in the Form No. 11 in the Appendix to these regulations, that in relation to the margarine about to be exported all the requirements of the Act and of these regulations have been complied with.

Standard for Margarine.

14. (1) Margarine shall conform to the Standard for Margarine as prescribed in the Food and Drug Regulations.

(2) The fatty portion of cooking margarine shall in addition conform with the following chemical and physical criteria, namely—

Reichert Meissl No.—Not greater than 1.0.

Polenske No.—Not greater than 2.5.

Iodine value—Not greater than 50.0.

Specific gravity—Not greater than 0.937.

Artificial butter flavour—Nil.

Labelling of Table Margarine.

15. Each package containing table margarine shall be labelled as prescribed in the Food and Drug Regulations.

Labelling of Cooking Margarine.

16. (1) The words "Cooking Margarine" shall be printed in bold face *sans serif* capital letters with a type face depth of not less than 6 mm for packages of less than 6 kilograms, or 25 mm for packages of 6 kilograms or more, in letters of one colour being a colour which provides a striking contrast to the colour of the background on which the words appear, on any face on which the brand name of the margarine is printed.

(2) The expression "Beef fat and/or mutton fat form at least 90% of all fats and oils in this product" shall be printed in bold face *sans serif* capital letters with a type face depth of not less than 3 mm for packages of less than 6 kilograms, or 6 mm for packages of 6 kilograms or more, in letters of one colour being a colour which provides a striking contrast to the colour of the background on which the words appear, on any face on which the brand name of the margarine is printed.

Labelling of Manufacturing Margarine.

17. (1) The words "Manufacturing Margarine" shall be printed in bold face *sans serif* capital letters with a type face depth of not less than 25 mm in letters of one colour being a colour which provides a striking contrast to the colour of the background on which the words appear, on any face of the package on which the brand name of the margarine is printed.

(2) The expression "Beef fat and/or mutton fat form between 75 and 90 per cent of all fat and oils in this product" shall be printed in bold face *sans serif* capital letters with a type face depth of not less than 6 mm in letters of one colour being a colour which provides a striking contrast to the colour of the background on which the words appear, on any face of the package on which the brand name of the margarine is printed.

Fee for Examination of Margarine.

18. A fee shall be payable by the manufacturer for every examination by an inspector under the Act, or these regulations of margarine manufactured by such manufacturer at the rate of five dollars per tonne or any part of a tonne, of the quantity of margarine so examined.

Sale of Manufacturing Margarine.

19. Manufacturing margarine may be sold pursuant to Section 26 of the Act to persons who manufacture pastry, biscuits or confectionery for sale.

Returns by Margarine Manufacturers and Dealers.

20. (1) Every manufacturer of margarine shall send or deliver monthly to the Department of Agriculture, so as to be received by the Chief, Division of Dairying, not later than the 20th day of each and every month, a return, in the Form No. 12 in the Appendix to these regulations, in relation to the margarine manufactured by him during the month next preceding the month in which the monthly return is made.

(2) Every margarine dealer shall send or deliver monthly to the Department of Agriculture, so as to be received by the Chief, Division of Dairying, not later than the 20th day of each and every month, a return, in the Form No. 13 in the Appendix to these regulations, in relation to the margarine bought or sold by him during the month next preceding the month in which the monthly return is made.

Books to be Kept by License Holders.

21. (1) The holder of a license to manufacture margarine issued under the Act shall cause to be kept in his margarine factory or at a place or premises approved by the Minister for Agriculture, books which shall be made up monthly to record accurately—

- (a) the nature and amount of all raw materials received or purchased for the manufacture of margarine;
- (b) the amount of each type of margarine received or purchased during each month;
- (c) the amount of each of all raw materials and of margarine held in stock on the first day of each calendar month;

- (d) the amount of each of all raw materials used by such person in the manufacture of—
- (i) table margarine;
 - (ii) cooking margarine;
 - (iii) manufacturing margarine;
 - (iv) margarine manufactured under a special permit, during each calendar month;
- (e) the amount of margarine of each category manufactured by such person—
- (i) under a special permit;
 - (ii) otherwise than under a special permit, during each calendar month;
- (f) the amount of margarine of each category sold, consigned and donated each month, the person to whom that margarine was sold, consigned or donated and the amount sold, consigned or donated to each person.
- (2) The holder of a Margarine Dealer's License issued under the Act shall cause to be kept at a place or premises approved by the Minister for Agriculture, books which shall be made up monthly to record accurately—
- (a) the amount of margarine of each category held in stock on the first day of each month;
 - (b) the amount of each type of margarine purchased and received during each month;
 - (c) the amount of each type of margarine sold, consigned and donated during each month, the person to whom that margarine was sold, consigned or donated and the amount sold, consigned or donated to each person.
- (3) The holder of a license who fails to comply with the provisions of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not more than one hundred and fifty dollars.

Storage of Foreign Materials in Margarine Factories.

22. No materials or substances other than margarine or those required for use in connection with the manufacture of margarine shall be stored or kept in rooms or places used for the manufacture or storage of margarine.

Breach of Regulations.

23. Where by these regulations an act is required to be done or forbidden to be done in relation to the manufacture of margarine, the holder of the license has, unless the contrary intention appears, the duty of causing to be done the act so required to be done, or of preventing from being done the act so forbidden to be done, as the case may be.

24. Any person who is guilty of any contravention of any of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding the sum of one hundred dollars, and, in addition, if such contravention is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding ten dollars for every day or part of a day during which such contravention continues.
