WHEREAS—

- (a) it is enacted by section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1970, that the Governor, on the recommendation of the Poisons Advisory Committee, may at any time and from time to time by proclamation prohibit the sale, supply or use of any poison or substance, whether specified in a schedule to that Act or not, either absolutely or except upon and subject to such conditions as the Governor may think fit;
- (b) it is further enacted by section 22 of that Act that a proclamation made under that section may be from time to time varied by a subsequent proclamation;

- (c) a proclamation made under that section was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th November, 1971 and was varied by a proclamation so published on the 15th September, 1972; and

- (d) the Poisons Advisory Committee has recommended to the Governor that the abovementioned proclamation be further varied by adding the passage "OXYPHENISATIN and its acetyl derivatives" to Part B of the schedule to that proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964-1970, and on the recommendation of the Poisons Advisory Committee, do hereby vary the proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th November, 1971 and subsequently varied by a proclamation so published on the 15th September, 1972 by adding to PART B of the schedule thereto the passage—

"OXYPHENISATIN and its acetyl derivatives".

Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972, that where the Trustees of the Western Australian Museum recommend that any Aboriginal site is of outstanding importance the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare that site to be a protected area; and whereas pursuant to subsection (1) of section 13 of the Act the Trustees, with the consent in writing of the Minister for Community Welfare, by resolution, have delegated to the Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee, the power to make recommendations to the Governor for the purposes of section 19 of the Act; and whereas the Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee recommend to the Governor that ochre mines at Wilgie Mia and Wilgie Hills and a secret/sacred site complex at Mt. Gerrard and a painting site at Bates Cave are Aboriginal sites of outstanding importance: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972, hereby declares that the areas specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are protected areas for the purposes of the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972, in relation to the Aboriginal sites respectively specified in the second column.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1969, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

(a) The Government shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.

(b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament, his proposal dated the Sixth day of November, 1973, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Land as State Forest No. 30 described in the Schedule hereto.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973 that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that Section; and whereas the Bank of New South Wales of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the Section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25 000) given by the Bank charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Bank of New South Wales of St. George's Terrace, Perth from the operation of Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973, for a period expiring on the 31st day of March, 1976.

Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961-1967.

Division 2" in the Schedule to that Order, the item Union Detonating Fuse (ZZ) and declare this item to be an authorised explosive for the purposes of the said Act, with effect from and including the day of the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*.

Division 1", in the Schedule to that Order, the item Asahi CCR Electric Igniters (X) and by adding under the heading "Class 6—AMMUNITION. Division 2", in the Schedule to that Order, the item Asahi CCR Explosive Charges (Y) and declare these items to be an authorised explosive for the purposes of the said Act, with effect from and including the day of the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*.

- (e) the whole of each of them with the exception of By-laws 2829 to 2938, inclusive, Division 11—Outbuildings which shall not apply to those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Denmark that are zoned for rural purposes by Zoning By-laws or a Town Planning Scheme, applies to the whole of the district of the Shire of Denmark.

- (d) The rate shall be the same for old lines picked up provided they are accurately ranged and chained.
- (e) Provided the nature and extent of such variations are clearly shown in the field notes lodged a loading on the base rate in respect to slope and vegetation variation will be paid in accordance with the following tables.

2. Urban Surveys:

- (a) Subject to this regulation, for each survey effected under a separate instruction, a basic fee of \$65.00 will be paid.
- (b) Only one basic fee will apply when two or more surveys are effected at the same time and are connected by surveyed lines.

(c) Additional fees will be paid in accordance with the following table:—

- (b) For observations of latitude and longitude, fees shall be paid on an Hourly Rate basis or at a rate determined after reference to the Surveyor General.
- (c) For obliteration of marked boundaries—Hourly Rate.
- (d) For each tree marked and connected to a traverse—\$5.00.
- (e) For observations to Trigonometrical Stations—Hourly Rate.
- (f) For involved surveys not payable at standard rates, or other types of survey for which no rates are specified—Hourly Rate.
- (g) For office work in connection with the normal type of survey—Nil.
- (h) For office work associated with the more involved or complex survey Hourly Rates may be charged subject to approval being obtained from the Surveyor General or other duly authorised officer.
- (i) For loss of time attributable to the Department—Hourly Rate.
5. Levels:
Level work will be paid for on an Hourly Rate Basis.
6. Vehicle Operation and Travelling:
- (a) Vehicle operation will be paid for at the following rates:—
- (i) Conventional 2-wheel drive, light duty vehicle of less than 2.04 tonne capacity, per kilometre—11c.
- (ii) 4-wheel drive and/or heavy duty vehicle of 2.04 tonne capacity, or over, per kilometre—17.5c.
- (b) For time spent in travelling either—
- (i) the rate as in paragraph (a), plus Hourly Rate; or
- (ii) For distance from point to point, according to the strength of the party, the rate as in paragraph (a) plus:—
Surveyor with one employee, per kilometre—25c.
Surveyor with two employees, per kilometre—30c.
Surveyor with three employees, per kilometre—35c.

No. 2.

THE Capel Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of:—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development and extractive industries;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

Maps—The following Maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

- (1) Land Use Maps.
- (2) Scheme Maps.

ARRANGEMENT OF THE SCHEME.

The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts;

- Part 1.—Preliminary.
- Part 2.—Reserved Land.
- Part 3.—Zones.
- Part 4.—Non-Conforming Uses.
- Part 5.—General Provisions.
- Part 6.—Finance and Administration.

PART 1.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Capel Town Planning Scheme No. 2 hereinafter called "The Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's Final Approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 The Shire of Capel Town Planning Scheme No. 1 which was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of May, 1971, is hereby revoked.

1.4 The responsible Authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Capel (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

1.6 "extractive industry" includes the extraction of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone minerals or similar substance from the land, and also the manufacture of products from those materials when the manufacture is carried out on the land from which any of those materials is extracted or on land adjacent thereto.

1.7 "service station" shall have the same interpretation as given to it in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 and in addition, a cafe or unlicensed restaurant developed in conjunction with the service station shall be regarded as part of the service station.

1.8 "rural use" includes agriculture, horticulture, silviculture, and the keeping of cattle, sheep and poultry.

1.9 "second-hand buildings" means any building, structure or dwelling or part thereof which has been transported or moved to the site, and re-erected.

PART 2.—RESERVED LAND.

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purpose of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART 3.—ZONES.

3.1 The Scheme area is divided into four types of zones set out hereunder:—

- Special Rural.
- Beach Resort.
- Rural.
- Special Use.

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the four zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the lefthand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.3 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

- "P" = A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
- "AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- "IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- "X" = A use that is not permitted.

As Shown on Scheme Map

3.4 (a) Any person wishing to undertake any development for which the approval of the Council is required under this part shall apply to the Council in writing describing the site and the development proposed.

(b) In considering any application made under subclause (a) of this clause the Council may advertise its intention to consider such application in a newspaper circulating in its municipality and, not less than fourteen days after publication of such advertisement, consider any objections received before determining the application.

(c) Council may grant its approval with or without conditions or may refuse to grant its approval to the application to commence development.

(d) If the Council shall have granted its approval to commence development subject to conditions and any of the conditions shall not be fulfilled or complied with, the Council may revoke its approval.

(e) The Council may limit the time for which its approval to commence development remains valid.

3.5 Special Rural Zone:

(a) In the Special Rural Zone the Council intends to promote the orderly and economic development of land within the zone by ensuring proper provision of roads, open space, services and drainage and the preservation of, as far as may be practicable, the existing rural character of the area.

(b) In carrying out its policies for development of land within the zone, Council may implement a Town Planning (Guided Development) Scheme or such other Schemes as may, from time to time, be desirable and will seek the support of the Town Planning Board in applying a minimum permitted lot size of not less than one acre in area to subdivisions therein.

3.6 Beach Resort Zone:

(a) In the Beach Resort Zone the Council intends to promote such facilities as caravan parks, motels, boarding houses, chalet parks and residential development which will be in sympathy with the natural characteristics of the zoned area. Protection of frontal dunes, public amenities and natural features shall have priority in consideration by Council of development proposals within the Beach Resort Zone.

(b) Prior to the lodging of any application to subdivide all or part of existing land holdings in the Beach Resort Zone, an outline development plan for the whole of the zone prepared by the developer and approved by the Council must exist. Any such outline development plan submitted to Council for consideration under this clause, shall have the following items included:

- (i) An outline of the overall collector road system.
- (ii) Public Open Space provision outlined in principle.
- (iii) The location and quantity of commercial and other non-residential uses intended to be located in this zone.
- (iv) An outline of methods proposed to be used to maintain natural flora, natural features and fore dunes.
- (v) An outline of the methods proposed to maintain uninterrupted public access to foreshore reserves and amenities.

(c) Subsequent to approval by Council of the outline development plan, Council will recommend that conditions pertaining to the following be applied to the Approval to Subdivide.

- (i) Total retention and preservation of the coastal fore dunes. This condition will necessitate the fore dunes being kept free of structures, roads and other forms of physical alteration other than an approved foot-path.
- (ii) No lot being less than 1 000 square metres ($\frac{1}{4}$ acre) in area in the case where reticulated water is not being provided.
- (iii) No lot being less than 800 square metres (32 perches) in area in the case where reticulated water is being provided.
- (iv) Detailed road and pathway routes.
- (v) Preservation of existing tree, shrub and grass cover to development areas not subject to physical alteration or intended for use by structures.

3.7 Rural Zone: In giving its consideration to approval for the establishment of industries within the Rural Zone as permitted subject to approval under clause 3.4 of the Scheme, Council will have regard to:

- (a) The necessity for preserving the viability of rural uses and the rural character within the area where this would, in the opinion of Council, be seriously affected by the establishment of industrial uses.
- (b) The availability of services required to support the proposed industry, and the economic provision of extensions to those services if so required.

- (c) The adequacy of the roads existing or proposed in the area, which may be needed to support the amount of road traffic expected to be generated by the industry.
- (d) The need to enforce such conditions as Council thinks fit in order to minimise any adverse effect the proposal may have on the general environment of the area.
- (e) In the case of an extractive industry, the further provisions of Clause 5.4 to 5.8 of the Scheme shall apply.

Part 4.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent:—

- (a) The continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme, or
- (b) The carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under part 2 of the Scheme, a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extension to the buildings thereon or use thereof, shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part 3 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised, as mentioned in clause 4.1 of the Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform General Building By-Laws made under the Local Government Act, 1965 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing one, or is in the opinion of the Council, closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under clause 4.3 when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART 5.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 Building Lines: Unless otherwise stated in this Scheme the building lines and other site requirements of the Uniform General Building By-Laws, 1965 (as amended), shall be applicable to the building of the occupancy class concerned.

5.2 Highway Protection Lines: Land bounded by the Highway Protection Lines defined on the Scheme Map as being five chains distant from either side of the centre line of Bussell Highway,

or by the boundary of the Railway Reserve, where such reserve adjoins the Highway, shall be a Highway Protection Area within which special conditions shall apply to uses allowable under the Scheme Zoning provisions in order to protect the function, amenity and visual character of the Highway.

5.3 Highway Protection Area: Within the Highway Protection Area the following conditions will apply in addition to, or in limitation of any other conditions or limitations imposed under the zoning provisions of this Scheme.

- (a) No public sign, advertisement, hoarding or notice shall be erected unless written approval is granted by the Council.
- (b) The Council shall not approve the erection of any advertisement for a service or commodity, which is not produced, offered or sold on the lot on which the advertisement is erected.
- (c) The Council will not approve the erection of an advertisement for the sale of land other than on the lot which is offered for sale.
- (d) The Council may remove any public sign advertisement, hoarding or notice which has been erected contrary to sub-clause 5.3 (a) of this Part.
- (e) Subdivision of land zoned Special Rural in the Highway Protection Area shall not be approved without the responsible authority being satisfied that ribbon development control measures have been considered and that access points to the Highway are limited to those approved by Council and the Main Roads Department. Service roads may be provided in the Special Rural zoned land to connect to the approved access points on the Highway.
- (f) A building line of one and a half (1.5) chains from the edge of the Highway reserve will apply. Service roads may be constructed within this building line.
- (g) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (f) of this clause the building lines within the Special Rural Zone shall be determined by Council in accordance with its policies or any Town Planning (Guided Development) Scheme which is implemented from time to time in order to carry out those policies.
- (h) Extractive industry will not be permitted within the Highway Protection Area.

5.4 Extractive Industries:

- (a) Any person wishing to undertake an extractive industry as defined in Section 1.6 of this Scheme Text, for which the approval of Council is required under this Part, shall apply to the Council in writing.
- (b) Applications under 5.4 (a) of this Part shall include the following information:
 - (i) The proposed method of the extractive process;
 - (ii) The contours of the land, the probable depth and extent of the proposed excavation and the location of these in relation to existing developments;
 - (iii) The estimated depth and extent of the overburden to be removed;
 - (iv) Any ancillary works proposed;
 - (v) The estimated workforce of the project;
 - (vi) The applicant's intentions for the rehabilitation and restoration of the land, the arrangements made with the owner of the land or the Crown for such rehabilitation, together with an estimate of the costs of such works and appropriate plans;
 - (vii) The nature and quantities of noxious by-products.

5.5 In exercising its discretion under section 5.4 of this Part, the Council shall have regard to:—

- (i) The proposed use of the land subsequent to mining.
- (ii) The cost of restoration relative to the overall economics of the project.
- (iii) The practical aspects of restoring the land subsequent to mining.
- (iv) The need to ensure that land made unsightly and/or derelict by mining operations is restored as near to its original state as possible or a state or use acceptable to Council having regard to the amenity of the area as a whole.

5.6 (a) Council may grant its approval to an application under section 5.4 of the Part subject to conditions or may refuse to grant an approval.

(b) The Council may limit the time for which its approval to commence the extractive industry remains valid.

5.7 In applying conditions of approval under section 5.6 the Council shall have regard to the following:—

- (i) The control of dust, smoke and other pollutants;
- (ii) The protection of watercourses, drainage lines and roads;
- (iii) The prevention of toxic or discolouring materials being emitted;
- (iv) Contributions to road maintenance where roads are extraordinarily damaged by heavy traffic associated with extractive industry;
- (v) The safety of workings prior to restoration.
- (vi) The stock-piling of overburden for eventual replacement;
- (vii) Reafforestation;
- (viii) Landscaping and drainage subsequent to mining;
- (ix) Bonds or sureties or agreements and penalties thereto.

5.8 Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 5.7 where the applicant has made arrangements with the owner of the land or the Crown covering a matter contained in that clause, the Council shall not impose conditions of development relating to that matter.

5.9 Protection of Coastal Area: In order to preserve and protect against development which may

or could destroy the existing physical characteristics and flora adjacent to the coast no development except—

- (i) a public road,
- (ii) a public footpath,
- (iii) a building for the use or convenience of the general public,

and for which Council approval has been given shall be permitted within 100 metres (328 feet) of the seaward crest of a stable sand dune, which is undisturbed by wave or wind erosion. Saving that where the Minister for Town Planning determines that the public interest is better served by not requiring strict adherence to the above requirements he may on the recommendations of the Town Planning Board, in the particular case, permit a use and/or development subject to such conditions as he thinks fit.

5.10 Second Hand Buildings: The re-erection of second-hand buildings within the Shire of Capel is subject to the approval of Council. In giving its approval to the re-erection of a second-hand building, Council shall have regard to the following:—

- (a) The prevailing use and environmental amenity of locality in which the structure is to be erected.
- (b) The appearance and standard of maintenance of the structure.

Council may impose such conditions as considered necessary to bring about satisfactory building standards.

5.11 Site and Car Parking Requirements: In granting an approval to commence development of uses generally of a commercial nature, as listed in Table No. 2, Council shall impose the appropriate site and car parking requirements.

PART 6.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

6.5 Application for Approval: Application for approval for development within the Scheme Areas required under the provisions of the Scheme or by other Statutes, shall be in writing addressed to the Shire Clerk of the Capel Shire Council.

6.6 Appeals against a Council Decision: If an application for planning consent has been refused by Council or approved subject to condition, the applicant may, where the Council's decision involves the exercise of a discretion, appeal to the Minister for Town Planning or to the Court in accordance with the provisions of Part (v) of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1970 and the Town Planning and Development Act (Appeal) Regulations, 1971.

2. No person shall drive any vehicle over or across any portion of a street set aside or paved or formed as a footpath except at a specially constructed crossing place, unless with the permission of the Council first had and obtained.

3. Any person who desires to drive any vehicle over or across any footpath at a place not being a specially constructed crossing place or who proposes to carry out building or other operations or works necessitating the crossing of a footpath otherwise than at a specially constructed crossing place shall make application in writing to the Council for its permission so to do specifying the place or places at which such crossing is to be made and shall either pay to the Council a deposit of \$50.00 or deliver to the Council a signed undertaking in a form acceptable to the Council agreeing to pay to the Council any costs and expenses arising out of any damage which may be caused to the footpath following the grant of permission as aforesaid.

4. If permission is granted by the Council to a person to drive any vehicle over or across any footpath, he shall observe the following conditions:—

(a) in the case of a footpath constructed of concrete slabs, he shall carefully remove the slabs for a width not exceeding 4.6 m and neatly stack the slabs so removed on the adjoining land and so as to avoid damage to them;

(b) replace the removed slabs with a temporary crossing constructed of hardwood planks of at least 200 mm x 50 mm of which the ends shall be chamfered, those planks to be securely nailed together with hoop iron straps or other means approved by the Council and the planking shall be firmly bedded and laid true to the level of the existing footpath;

(c) upon the completion of the operations or works or at such time as the necessity no longer exists for the temporary crossing, he shall remove the temporary crossing and replace all undamaged concrete slabs in a proper and workmanlike manner. If no damage has been caused or if the damage has been made good the Council shall repay the deposit or so much thereof as remains after the costs incurred by the Council have been paid.

5. (1) A person to whom permission has been granted as aforesaid shall be responsible for any damage to the footpath caused by him or which shall occur during the whole of the time that the operations or works referred to in by-law 3 are in progress and if any damage shall occur, the Council may make good such damage and deduct the cost of the same from the amount of any deposit. If the cost exceeds the amount of the deposit, the person granted permission shall pay to the Council on demand the amount by which the cost exceeds the amount of the deposit held and shall replace with new slabs of equal quality and size any slabs which have been lost or damaged and shall remove the damaged slabs and leave the area tidy.

(2) If the Council holds an undertaking then the person who has signed the undertaking shall pay to the Council the costs and expenses payable by him in accordance with the terms thereof.
