Election of Senators Act, 1903.

### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Air Commodore Hughie Idwal  
To Wit: } Edwards, Victoria Cross, Companion of the Most  
H. I. EDWARDS, } Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the  
Governor. } Distinguished Service Order, Officer of the Most  
[L.S.] } Excellent Order of the British Empire, Dis-  
 } tinguished Flying Cross, Governor in and over the  
 } State of Western Australia and its Dependencies  
 } in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Election of Senators Act, 1903, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* not less than seven days before the issue of the writ for any election of Senators for the State of Western Australia, fix the places at which such election shall be held, and the dates for the nomination, the polling, and the declaration of the poll and return of the writ; and whereas Saturday, the 20th day of April, 1974, has been fixed as the date for the issue of a writ for the election of Senators aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Monday, the 29th day of April, 1974, at 12 o'clock noon, as the day and

time before which nominations for the said election are to be made, and Saturday, the 18th day of May, 1974, as the date for the polling at the said election, and on or before Saturday, the 29th day of June, 1974 as the date for the declaration of the poll and return of the writ; and do hereby fix the Office of the Australian Electoral Officer at Fifth Floor, Wapet House, 12 St. George's Terrace, Perth, as the place of nomination for the said election, and the polling places within the said State appointed under the law of the Commonwealth for the time being in force for the regulation of Parliamentary elections as the places at which such election shall be held.

NOTE: A Proclamation made under the Election of Senators Act, 1903 was published in *Gazette* No. 31 of 10th April, 1974 at p. 1273 fixing the date for the issue of a writ and the dates of nomination, polling and declaration of poll and return of the writ for an election of five Senators for the State of Western Australia. On 11th April, 1974 the Governor-General dissolved the House of Representatives and the Senate of the Parliament of the Commonwealth and accordingly a writ for the election of five Senators will not be issued, nor will an election of five Senators be conducted, on the dates severally mentioned in the Proclamation published in the *Gazette* on the 10th April, 1974.
