AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 14th day of February, 1974, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.C.B. 377/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas The National Bank of Australasia Limited, of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has, duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The National Bank of Australasia Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1973, for a period terminating on the 31st day of December, 1975.

Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 13 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961-1967, that for the purposes of the Act, explosives are divided into the several classes and divisions specified in the Second Schedule to the Act and that a reference in the Act to any specified class, or any specified division of a class, of explosive shall be deemed to be a reference to that class or that division of a class according to the classification in that schedule; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (2) of that section that the Governor may from time to time by order made by him, amend the Second Schedule to the Act by deletion, addition or other alteration; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (3) of that section that notice of every order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and that the order shall take effect on the day specified for that purpose in the notice, or if no day be specified, on the seventh day following the day of publication, and whereupon the Second Schedule, as so amended shall have full force and effect as if the amendment effected by the order had been enacted by the Act: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby—

(1) alter the Second Schedule to the Act in the following manner—

(a) as to Class 6—

- (i) by deleting the passage "0.5 grain" in line two of the term "percussion cap" and substituting the passage "thirty-three milligrams"; and
- (ii) by deleting the passage "0.6 of a grain" in line eight of the term "percussion cap" and substituting the passage "thirty-nine milligrams"; and

(b) as to Class 7—

- (i) by deleting the words "one pound" in line ten of the term "manufactured firework" and substituting the passage "450 grams";
- (ii) by deleting the passage "600 grains" in line one of paragraph (a) of Division 2 and substituting the passage "forty grams"; and
- (iii) by deleting the passage "600 grains" in line one of paragraph (a) of Division 3 and substituting the passage "forty grams"; and

(2) specify that this order shall take effect on the date of the publication of the notice thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 42 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961-1967, that for the purposes of the Act dangerous goods are thereby divided into the several classes set out in the Third Schedule to the Act, and that references in the Act to any specified class of dangerous goods shall be deemed to be references to that class of dangerous goods according to the classification in the schedule; and whereas, it is enacted by subsection (2) of that

section that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, notice of which shall be published in the *Government Gazette* amend the Third Schedule to the Act by deletion, addition or other alteration and that every such order shall take effect on the day specified for that purpose in the notice, or if no day be specified three months after the date of publication, whereupon the Third Schedule, as so amended, shall have full force and effect as if the amendment effected by the order had been enacted in the Act: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby—

(1) amend the Third Schedule to the Act in the following manner—

(a) as to Class 1—

- (i) by deleting the expression "73° F." where occurring in lines one, four and six, and substituting the expression "23° Celsius" in each case; and
- (ii) by deleting the words "one gallon" in line seven and substituting the words "four litres";

(b) as to Class 2—

- (i) by deleting the expression "150° F." where occurring in lines one, five and seven and substituting the passage "61° Celsius" in each case;
- (ii) by deleting the expression "73° F." where occurring in lines two, five and seven, and substituting the passage "23° Celsius" in each case; and
- (iii) by deleting the words "one gallon" in line nine, and substituting the words "four litres"; and

(c) as to Class 3—

- (i) by deleting the expression "150° F." where occurring in lines two and four and substituting the passage "61° Celsius" in both cases;
- (ii) by deleting the expression "300° F." in line four and substituting the passage "150° Celsius"; and
- (iii) by deleting the words "four gallons" in line six and substituting the words "sixteen litres"; and

(2) specify that this order shall take effect on the date of the publication of notice thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Application for Transfer of a License.

To the Court of Petty Sessions at Perth:



## AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS ACT, 1929-1968.

I, THE UNDERSIGNED MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE, being the Minister charged with the administration of the Agricultural Products Act,

A person shall not sell except for the purpose of export from the State, any kind of citrus fruit of which the sale is, pursuant to section 3D of the Act, prohibited, and any person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

## SCHEDULE.

## ABORIGINAL HERITAGE ACT REGULATIONS, 1974.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Aboriginal Heritage Act Regulations, 1974.
2. (1) Words and expressions used in these regulations have the same meanings as are respectively assigned to them by the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972.  
(2) In these regulations—  
“the Act” means the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972;  
“warden” means a person appointed by the Trustees to be a warden for the purposes of these regulations, whether a member of the staff of the Museum or in an honorary capacity.
3. These regulations—  
(a) apply in relation to any aboriginal site or protected area or land held subject to a covenant in favour of the Trustees in relation to which the Trustees have a duty under the Act;  
(b) do not affect the rights of any person of Aboriginal descent who usually lives subject to Aboriginal customary law;  
(c) do not apply to any traditional custodian or member of the Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee, to any of the Trustees, or to the Director or any officer of the Museum, or to any person authorized in writing by the Director, whilst lawfully acting in the performance of his duties in relation to any land or buildings to which these regulations apply.
4. The Trustees—  
(a) may determine to what protected areas or portion of a protected area the public, or any person or class of persons specified by the Trustees, shall be admitted and the conditions upon which admittance shall be allowed; and  
(b) may restrict access to any protected area, or any portion thereof, either generally or in relation to a specified person or class of persons, at any time, whether otherwise open to admission or not.
5. (1) The Trustees may, by notice—  
(a) served personally;  
(b) erected or displayed in a prominent position on or near that land; or  
(c) published in the *Gazette*,  
prohibit access to any protected area, or any portion thereof, either generally or in relation to any specified person or class of persons, and any such prohibition may vary as to time, circumstance or otherwise as specified in the notice.  
(2) A person shall not, without the consent of the Director or the Registrar, enter or remain on any protected area to which the public is not admitted or contrary to the conditions upon which the public is admitted, or contrary to the provisions of a notice given under subregulation (1) of this regulation.  
Penalty: One hundred dollars.
6. Whilst on any land to which these regulations apply a person who—  
(a) fails to obey any reasonable direction of the Director, or any member of the staff of the Museum or a warden;  
(b) wilfully obstructs the Director or any member of the staff of the Museum or a warden in the execution of his duty, or fails or refuses to state his name and address when lawfully required to do so, or states a false name or address, or fails or refuses to leave that land when required to do so;  
(c) behaves in a disorderly manner, or uses violent or abusive or offensive language, or creates or takes part in any disturbance, or causes a nuisance, or wilfully disturbs or annoys any other person in the proper use of that land, or permits any animal belonging to him or under his control to enter upon or cause damage to any land; or  
(d) without the consent of the Director or the Registrar, handles, marks, defaces, moves, disturbs, uncovers, damages, destroys, or removes any specimen, relic, artifact, inscription, arrangement, or other object or exhibit in the possession or care of the Museum, or wilfully disturbs the general surrounding environment,  
commits an offence.

7. A person who, except under and in accordance with the prior approval of the Director, brings on to any land to which these regulations apply any digging equipment, lifting equipment, or explosive, commits an offence.

8. The Director, any member of the staff of the Museum, or a warden, with such assistants as he thinks necessary, may remove from any land to which these regulations apply—

- (a) any person behaving in a disorderly manner;
- (b) any person who appears to be intoxicated;
- (c) any person who appears to be using the land for any unlawful purpose or for a purpose contrary to the objects of the Act;
- (d) any person who has committed a breach of these regulations if it appears that his continued presence may lead to a further breach of the regulations.

9. A person convicted of an offence against these regulations is liable, where no penalty is expressly provided by these regulations for that offence, to the penalties provided by the Act.

10. On any land to which these regulations apply, a person shall not, without the written consent of the Director or the Registrar or a person authorized in writing by the Director or the Registrar—

- (a) alter, damage, or destroy any notice, boundary, fence, shelter, grille, cutting, drain, protective work or other thing which the Museum has, or has caused to be, erected, constructed, made or placed thereon or therein;
- (b) dig any hole or otherwise disturb the surface of the ground, or remove or disturb any stone, soil, sand, rock or gravel, or any other natural object;
- (c) cut, pick, pull, break, remove, take, injure, poison, strip or destroy any tree, shrub, herb, grass or other plant or part thereof whether living or dead;
- (d) post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, draw or otherwise affix or make any mark, symbol, lettering, notice, advertisement poster, sign or document of any description;
- (e) except in a place approved or provided for the purpose—
  - (i) drive, tow, operate or park any vehicle;
  - (ii) camp, erect tents or shelters, light fires or make fireplaces;
  - (iii) deposit or leave any refuse, rubbish or litter; or
  - (iv) take, ride or drive, graze or agist any horse, cattle, sheep, goat, camel, donkey or pig, or allow any such animal to remain;
- (f) sell any food, beverage or other article;
- (g) unlock, unfasten or leave open any gate unless duly authorized to do so; or
- (h) except with the prior written approval of the Director and in accordance with such requirements as he may impose, take any photograph or make any recording for the purpose of commercial reproduction or publication.

Penalty: Fifty dollars.

11. (1) A person appointed by the Trustees to be a warden for the purposes of these regulations may exercise such powers as the Trustees may by resolution confer upon him, either throughout the State or in a specified area or areas only, according to the terms of his appointment.

(2) A person appointed to be an honorary warden shall be furnished with a certificate in the form set out in the schedule to this regulation evidencing his appointment and shall produce such certificate whenever required to do so by any person in respect of whom he has exercised or is about to exercise any of his powers under these regulations or the Act.
