PUBLIC SERVICE ALLOWANCE (MISCELLANEOUS) AGREEMENT, 1971.

No. 109 of 1971.

Amendment No. 8 of 1974.

THIS Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966-1970, of Western Australia, this second day of July, 1974, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia Incorporated (hereinafter referred to as the Association) of the one part and the Public Service Board (hereinafter referred to as the Board) of the other part, witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

That the Public Service Allowances (Miscellaneous) Agreement, 1971, No. 109 of 1971, be and the same is amended pursuant to the provisions of clause 16 thereof, in accordance with the following schedule and that such amendment shall take effect from 24th June, 1974, except for the following amendments which shall apply from the dates shown:—

2. Clause 3.—Scope: Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof, the following:—

3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all Government Officers employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1973, whose offices are not included in the Special Division of the Public Service.

3. Clause 4.—Definitions: Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof, the following:—

4.—Definitions.

In this Agreement, the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meaning hereby respectively applied to them, namely:—

“Metropolitan Area” means that area within a radius of fifty (50) kilometres from the Perth Central Railway Station.

Reference throughout this Agreement to an “Item” by number shall be construed as a reference to the Item bearing the corresponding number in the Schedule appearing at the end of the clause in which such reference appears.

“Public Service Holidays” means the days mentioned in section 57 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1973, and any other days which the Governor may appoint as public service holidays under the said Act.

“Married Officer” means an officer who is required to maintain a home and support dependent relatives therein.

4. Clause 5.—Meal Allowance: Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof, the following:—

5. Meal Allowance.

(a) An officer required to work before or after prescribed working hours on any week day, shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from his usual place of residence, be reimbursed for each meal purchased at the rate of \$1.20 for breakfast and \$1.80 for the evening meal: Provided that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled.

(b) An officer required to work on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from his usual place of residence, be reimbursed for each meal purchased at the rate of \$1.20 for breakfast, \$1.50 for the mid-day meal and \$1.80 for the evening meal: Provided that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled.

5. Clause 6.—Travelling Allowances: Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof, the following:—

6.—Travelling Allowances.

Intra-State.

(a) An officer who travels on official business between his headquarters and a place situated outside a radius of fifty (50) kilometres measured from his headquarters, and is necessarily absent from his headquarters overnight, shall, except where otherwise provided, be reimbursed reasonable accommodation, meal and incidental expenses on the following basis:—

(i) Where hotel or motel accommodation is utilised and the officer certifies accordingly, and the total amount claimed for the whole period of absence does not exceed the amount payable in accordance with Item 1. 2 and 9, he shall be reimbursed at the

rates prescribed by Item 1, 2 or 9, as the case may require. Where reimbursement is made for part of a day the proportions of the daily rate payable under Item 1, 2 or 9 shall be:—

Breakfast—10 per cent of the daily rate.

Lunch —15 per cent of the daily rate.

Dinner —25 per cent of the daily rate.

Bed —50 per cent of the daily rate.

- (ii) Where hotel or motel accommodation is utilised and the total amount claimed for the whole period of absence exceeds the amount payable in accordance with Item 1, 2 or 9, and it can be shown to the satisfaction of the Board by the production of receipts or other evidence that the excess expenditure was actually and necessarily incurred, he shall be paid the difference fully to reimburse him.

- (iii) Where the officer:—

- (a) is supplied with accommodation and meals free of charge;
- (b) attends a course, conference, etc. where the fee paid includes accommodation and meals;
- (c) travels by railway and is provided with a sleeping berth and meals, or
- (d) is accommodated and supplied with meals at a Government institution hostel or similar establishment.

he shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 5 or 6 as the case may require for each day of twenty-four hours or part of a day exceeding eight hours. One-half of this rate shall be allowed for any part of a day not exceeding eight hours.

- (iv) For the purpose of computing reimbursement in respect of arrival at or departure from an officer's headquarters, breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later or departure earlier than 8 a.m., lunch if arrival is later or departure earlier than 1 p.m., dinner if arrival is later or departure earlier than 6 p.m. and bed if arrival is later than 11 p.m.

(b) Where the officer has accommodation and meals other than as set out in subclause (a) of this clause, he shall be reimbursed in accordance with Item 7 or 8 as the case may require for each day of twenty-four hours or part of a day exceeding eight hours. One-half of this rate shall be allowed for any part of a day not exceeding eight hours. If reimbursement Item 7 or 8 is insufficient to meet the officer's reasonable expenses, he shall be allowed expenditure actually and necessarily incurred subject to the production of receipts or other reasonable evidence of expenditure.

(c) Where an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to fifteen per cent of the passage money calculated on the single fare or one third of the rate prescribed by Item 1, whichever is the greater.

(d) An officer, with headquarters outside the metropolitan area who travels on official business between his headquarters and a place situated outside a radius of fifty (50) kilometres measured from his headquarters and an officer stationed in the metropolitan area who travels on official business between his headquarters and a place situated outside the metropolitan area, and are not absent from their headquarters overnight, shall only be paid at the rates prescribed by Item 3 or 4

as the case may require, subject to the officer's certification that each meal claimed for was actually purchased: Provided that where an officer departs from his headquarters before 8 a.m. and does not arrive back at his headquarters until after 11 p.m. on the same day, he shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 1.

(e) An officer stationed in the metropolitan area who is relieving at or temporarily transferred to any place within that area shall not be reimbursed the cost of midday meals purchased, but an officer travelling on duty within the metropolitan area which requires his absence from his headquarters over the usual midday meal period shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 10 for each meal necessarily purchased. Provided that:—

- (i) such travelling is not within the suburb in which the officer resides: and
- (ii) an officer's total reimbursement under this subclause for any one pay period shall not exceed the amount prescribed by Item 11.

Provided further that an officer stationed in the metropolitan area who is sent to one place within that area away from his headquarters to perform duties which necessitate his attendance at that place, prior to and immediately after the usual midday meal period, shall not be reimbursed the cost of midday meals purchased unless approved by the Board.

Inter-State.

(f) An officer who travels on official business beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, shall be reimbursed reasonable accommodation, meal and incidental expenses on the following basis:—

- (i) where hotel or motel accommodation is utilised and the officer certifies accordingly, and the total amount claimed for the whole period of absence does not exceed the amount payable in accordance with Item 12 or 13, he shall be reimbursed at the rates prescribed by Item 12 or 13, as the case may require.
- (ii) where hotel or motel accommodation is utilised and the total amount claimed for the whole period of absence exceeds the amount payable in accordance with Item 12 or 13, and it can be shown to the satisfaction of the Board by the production of receipts or other evidence that the excess expenditure was actually and necessarily incurred, he shall be paid the difference fully to reimburse him.
- (iii) where the officer:—
 - (a) is supplied with accommodation and meals free of charge;
 - (b) attends a course, conference etc. where the fee paid includes accommodation and meals;
 - (c) travels by railway and is provided with a sleeping berth and meals, or
 - (d) is accommodated and supplied with meals at a Government institution, hostel or similar establishment;

he shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 14 to cover incidental expenses.

Where reimbursement is made for part of a day, such reimbursement shall be computed in accordance with subclause (a) of this clause.

(g) Where the officer has accommodation and meals other than as set out in subclause (f) of this clause he shall be reimbursed in accordance with Item 15, for each day of twenty-four hours or part of a day exceeding eight hours. One-half of this rate shall be

allowed for any part of a day not exceeding eight hours. If reimbursement under Item 15 is insufficient to meet the officer's reasonable expenses he shall be allowed expenditure actually and necessarily incurred, subject to the production of receipts or other reasonable evidence of expenditure.

(h) Where an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses for the time spent at sea on board vessel shall be at a rate equal to either fifteen per cent of the passage money calculated on single fare or one third of the rate prescribed by Item 1, whichever is the greater.

General.

(i) If on account of lack of suitable regular transport facilities an officer necessarily engages reasonable lodgings in Perth or other place in which his headquarters are situated, for the night prior to commencing travelling in order to travel by an early morning transport, he shall be reimbursed the cost of such lodgings in addition to such other reimbursements authorised by this clause.

(j) An officer who travels on official business shall be allowed first class fares and in addition to any reimbursement of expense at the appropriate rate prescribed by this clause, shall be reimbursed reasonable incidental expenses such as tram, bus and motor fares and reasonable laundry and dry cleaning expenses on production of receipts.

(k) Reimbursement of expenses, as prescribed by this clause, shall not be suspended should an officer become ill whilst travelling, provided leave for the period of such illness is approved in accordance with the provisions of the Public Service Regulations.

(l) Reimbursement of travelling expenses for a period exceeding fourteen days in any one month shall not be passed for payment to any officer by a certifying officer until the endorsement of the Permanent Head has been obtained on the account.

(m) In all cases where commuted amounts for reimbursement of travelling expenses and cost of conveyance are in operation at the date of the coming into force of this Agreement, such commuted amounts shall continue until reviewed as a result of negotiation between the Association and the Board.

(n) The headquarters of an officer engaged on more than one work shall be considered to be the place in which the principal work is carried out, as defined by the Permanent Head.

7.—Transfer Allowance.

Intra-State.

(a) Except as provided in sub-clause (e) a married or single officer who is transferred to a new locality—

- (i) in the public interest, or
- (ii) in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer, or

(iii) on account of illness due to causes over which the officer has no control, shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 1 or 3, as the case may require, for a period of fourteen days after arrival at his new headquarters: Provided that, if an officer is required to travel on official business during the said period of fourteen days, such period shall be extended by the time spent in travelling. Under no circumstances, however, shall the provisions of this sub-clause operate concurrently with those of clause 6 so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in respect of both travelling and transfer expenses for one and the same period.

(b) If a married officer is unable to obtain reasonable accommodation for the transfer of his home within the period of fourteen days referred to in sub-clause (a), and the permanent head is satisfied that the officer has taken all possible steps to secure reasonable accommodation, such officer shall, after the expiration of the fourteen days, be reimbursed at the rate prescribed by Item 2 or 4, as the case may require, until such time as he has secured reasonable accommodation: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this sub-clause shall not exceed seventy-seven days without the approval of the Board. A single officer

shall not be paid allowances under this sub-clause.

Inter-State.

(c) Except as provided in subclause (e) a married or single officer who is transferred to a capital city beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, shall, subject to the relevant provisions of subclause (a), be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 5 for a period of twenty one days after arrival at his new headquarters.

(d) If a married officer who is transferred to a capital city beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, is unable to obtain reasonable accommodation within the period of twenty one days referred to in sub-clause (c) and the permanent head is satisfied that the officer has taken all possible steps to secure reasonable accommodation, such officer shall, after the expiration of the twenty one days be reimbursed at the rate prescribed by Item 6, until such time as he has secured reasonable accommodation: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy days without the approval of the Board. 8.—Removal Allowance.

(a) When a married officer is transferred in the public interest or in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer or on account of illness due to causes over which the officer has no control, he shall be reimbursed—

- the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of himself and his wife and children under 16 years of age or other children wholly dependent on him; and
- Subject to the limitations defined in subclause (d) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of his furniture, including insurance of such furniture whilst in transit; and
- an allowance of \$100 for accelerated depreciation and extra wear and tear on furniture, effects and appliances: Provided that the Permanent Head is satisfied that the value of household furniture, effects and appliances moved by the officer is at least \$600.

In the case of a single officer, an application for any reimbursement under this clause shall be considered by the Board, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head.

(b) An officer who is transferred from one locality to another solely at his own request, or by exchange (except as provided for in subclause (a)), must bear the whole cost of his removal unless otherwise approved by the Board.

(c) When an officer is transferred on account of misconduct, the cost must be borne by the officer at fault, unless otherwise determined by the Board, prior to removal.

(d) The maximum reimbursement for cost of conveyance of household furniture, effects and appliances, including insurance whilst in transit, shall be \$500 unless a higher sum is approved by the Board in any special case: Provided that only necessary household furniture, effects and appliances shall be taken into consideration.

(e) An officer shall be reimbursed the full freight charges necessarily incurred in respect of the removal of his motor vehicle. If authorised by the Permanent Head to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle reimbursement shall be as follows:—

- Where the officer will be required to maintain a motor vehicle for use on official business at his new headquarters, reimbursement for the distance necessarily travelled shall be on the basis of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by Clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, No. 108 of 1971, and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.
- Where the officer will not be required to maintain a motor vehicle for use on official business at his new headquarters, reimbursement for the distance necessarily travelled shall be on the basis of one half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by Clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, No. 108 of 1971 and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.

(f) Furniture, effects and appliances where practicable shall be removed by State-owned transport.

(g) Before removal is undertaken, the officer shall, where practicable, obtain quotes from at least two carriers which shall be submitted to the Permanent Head, who may authorise the acceptance of the more suitable: Provided that the maximum amount prescribed by subclause (d) is not exceeded without the written approval of the Board having first been obtained.

(h) Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid.

(i) The Permanent Head may, in lieu of cost of conveyance, authorise payment of an amount not exceeding the maximum prescribed by subclause (d) to compensate for loss in any case where an officer with prior approval of the Permanent Head, disposes of his furniture, effects and appliances instead of removing them to his new headquarters: Provided that such payment shall not exceed the sum which would have been paid if such furniture, effects and appliances had been removed by the cheapest method of transport available.

(j) Where an officer is transferred to departmental accommodation where furniture is provided and as a consequence is obliged to store his own furniture, he shall be reimbursed the actual cost of such storage up to a maximum allowance of \$150 per annum. An allowance under this subclause shall not be paid for a period in excess of one year without the approval of the Board.

8. Clause 9.—Relieving Allowance: Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof, the following:—

9.—Relieving Allowance.

(a) A married or single officer who is required to take up duty away from his usual headquarters to relieve another officer or to perform special duty, and necessarily resides temporarily away from his usual place of residence shall, except where otherwise provided, be reimbursed reasonable accommodation, meal and incidental expenses on the following basis:—

(i) Where the officer resides temporarily at a place where hotel or motel accommodation is utilised, he shall be reimbursed at the rates prescribed by Item 1 or 4, as the case may require, up to a maximum period of thirty-five days after arrival at the new locality.

(ii) If the period of relief or special duty exceeds thirty-five days, a married officer shall be reimbursed at the rates prescribed by Item 2 or 5 and a single officer shall be reimbursed at the rates prescribed by Item 3 or 6 as the case may require for the period of relief or special duty in excess of thirty-five days. Provided that the period of reimbursement under this paragraph shall not exceed fifty-six days without the approval of the Board.

(iii) Where the officer:—

- (a) is supplied with accommodation and meals free of charge, or
- (b) is accommodated and supplied with meals at a Government institution, hostel or similar establishment,

he shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 7 or 8 as the case may require, to cover incidental expenses.

(b) Where the officer has accommodation and meals other than as set out in subclause (a) of this clause, he shall be reimbursed in accordance with Item 9 or 10, as the case may require.

(c) If an officer, whose normal duties do not involve camp accommodation, is required to relieve or perform special duty resulting in a stay at a camp, he shall be paid camp allowance for the duration of the period spent in

camp, and in addition, shall be paid a lump sum of \$30 to cover incidental personal expenses: Provided that an officer shall receive no more than one lump sum grant of \$30 in any one period of three years.

(d) When an officer, who is required to relieve or perform special duties in accordance with subclause (a), is authorised by the Permanent Head to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle he shall be reimbursed for the return journey as follows:—

(i) Where the officer will be required to maintain a motor vehicle for the performance of the relieving or special duties, reimbursement shall be in accordance with the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, No. 108 of 1971, and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.

(ii) Where the officer will not be required to maintain a motor vehicle for the performance of the relieving or special duties, reimbursement shall be on the basis of one half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by Clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, No. 108 of 1971, and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreement or award made in substitution thereof.

Provided that the maximum amount of reimbursement under paragraph (ii) of this subclause shall not exceed the cost of the first class fare by public conveyance which otherwise would be utilised for such return journey.

Inter-State.

(e) A married or single officer who is required to relieve another officer or perform special duty outside the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, shall, except where otherwise provided, be reimbursed reasonable accommodation, meal and incidental expenses on the following basis:—

(i) Where the officer resides temporarily at a place where hotel or motel accommodation is utilised, he shall be reimbursed at the rates prescribed by Item 11 or 12, as the case may require, up to a maximum period of thirty-five days after arrival at the new locality.

(ii) If the period of relief or special duty exceeds thirty-five days, a married officer shall be reimbursed at the rates prescribed by Item 13 or 14 as the case may require, and a single officer shall be reimbursed at the rates prescribed by Item 15 or 16, as the case may require, for the period of relief or special duty in excess of thirty-five days. Provided that the period of reimbursement under this paragraph shall not exceed fifty-six days without the approval of the Board.

(iii) Where the officer:—

- (a) is supplied with accommodation and meals free of charge, or
- (b) is accommodated and supplied with meals at a Government institution, hostel or similar establishment,

he shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Item 17 to cover incidental expenses.

(f) Where the officer has accommodation and meals other than as set out in subclause (a) of this clause he shall be reimbursed in accordance with Item 18.

General.

(g) The rate applicable to a married officer under subclause (a) (ii) and (e) (ii) shall be paid to a single officer if the Board is satisfied that the officer has to maintain a home and support dependent relatives therein, in a locality other than that to which he has been sent. A certificate to this effect must be furnished by a single officer claiming the higher rate.

(h) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that an allowance payable under this clause would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred, an appropriate rate of reimbursement shall be determined by the Board.

(i) The provisions of clause 6 shall not operate concurrently with the provisions of this clause so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in respect of both travelling and relieving expenses for the one and the same period.

(j) An officer who is directed to relieve another officer or to perform special duty away from his usual headquarters and is not required to reside temporarily away from his usual place of residence shall, if he is not in receipt of a higher duties or special allowance for such work, be reimbursed the amount of additional fares paid by him in travelling by public transport to and from his place of temporary duty. Provided that reimbursement shall not exceed fifty cents per day without the approval of the Board.

9. Clause 10.—Allowance to Officers Paying Wages: Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof, the following:—

10.—Allowance to Officers Paying Wages.

(a) An officer away from his headquarters, other than one whose classified duties include the payment of wages, shall, when paying wages outside the metropolitan area or at construction works within the metropolitan area, or at such other works as may be approved by the Board, be paid an allowance of \$1.00 per day or part of any day whilst so engaged in recognition of the added responsibilities. Provided that—

(i) the allowance shall not exceed \$2.00 in any one week;

(ii) no allowance shall be paid to an officer when in receipt of higher duties allowance for relieving or acting in a position, the classified duties of which include the payment of wages; and

(iii) No allowance shall be paid to an officer whose gross salary exceeds the maximum prescribed for Class 3 (male officers—Clerical Division) in Schedule A of the "Public Service (Administrative and Clerical Officers) Salaries Agreement, 1971" and any amendments thereto, or by any new agreements or awards made in substitution thereof.

(b) An officer employed in the metropolitan area, when paying wages outside that area, shall, in addition to any allowance payable in accordance with subclause (a) be paid an allowance of 80 cents per day or part of any day whilst so engaged in compensation for damage to clothing and disabilities encountered.

10. Protective Clothing: Insert the following new clause:—

14.—Protective Clothing.

An officer engaged on work which requires the provision of protective clothing shall be paid an allowance or be provided with such protective clothing as shall be negotiated between the Board and the Association: Provided that where there is disagreement between the Board and the Association as to the necessity for, or the amount of the allowance for protective clothing, a dispute within the meaning of section 11 (1) (f) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966-1970, shall be deemed to have arisen.

11. Weekend Absence from Residence: Insert the following new clause:—

15.—Weekend Absence from Residence.

(a) A married officer who is temporarily absent from his normal headquarters on relieving duty or travelling on official business outside a radius of three hundred and twenty (320) kilometres measured from his residence, and is necessarily absent from his residence and separated from his family, shall be granted an additional day's leave for every three consecutive weekends so absent. Provided that:

- (i) The relief duty or travelling on official business are within Australia and the officer is not directed to work on the weekend by the Permanent Head or a senior officer duly authorised by him.
- (ii) An additional day's leave shall not be allowed if the Board has approved the officer's family accompanying him during the period of relief or travelling.
- (iii) Additional leave under this subclause shall be commenced within one week of the period of relief duty or travelling being completed unless the Board approves otherwise.
- (iv) The annual leave loading provided by clause 16 of this agreement shall not apply to any leave entitlement under this clause.

(b) A married officer who is temporarily absent from his normal headquarters on relieving duty or travelling on official business within a radius of three hundred and twenty (320) kilometres measured from his residence, and such relief duty or travel would normally necessitate the officer being absent from his residence for a weekend, shall be allowed to return to his residence for the weekend: Provided that:—

- (i) All travelling to and from the officer's residence shall be undertaken outside of the hours of duty prescribed by Public Service Regulation 6 or by Administrative Instruction issued thereunder.
- (ii) When an officer is authorised by the Permanent Head to use his own motor vehicle to travel to the locality where the relief duty is being performed or on the travelling on official business, he shall be reimbursed on the basis of one half of the appropriate rate of hire as prescribed by clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances (Motor Car Hire) Agreement, 1971, No. 108 of 1971, for the journey to his residence for the weekend and the return to the place of relief duty. Provided further that the maximum amount of reimbursement shall not exceed the cost of the first class fare by public conveyance which otherwise would be utilised for such journey.
- (iii) When an officer has been authorised by the Permanent Head to use a government motor vehicle in connection with the relief duty or travelling on official business, he shall be allowed to use that vehicle for the purpose of returning to his residence for the weekend as provided by this subclause.
- (iv) An officer who does not use his own motor vehicle or a government motor vehicle as provided by paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of this subclause, shall be reimbursed the cost of the first class fare by public conveyance for the journey to and from his residence for the weekend.
- (v) An officer who does not avail himself of the provisions of this subclause shall produce evidence that hotel or

motel accommodation has been utilised for the weekend to qualify for the payment of travelling allowance at the rate prescribed by item 1 or 9 as the case may require.

- (vi) An officer who returns to his residence for the weekend in accordance with the provisions of this subclause, shall not be entitled to the reimbursement of any expenses allowed by clauses 6 and 9 of this Agreement during the period from the close of business on the Friday to the time of resuming duty after the weekend.

12. Annual Leave Loading: Insert the following new clause:—

16.—Annual Leave Loading.

Officers proceeding on annual leave of absence for recreation in accordance with the provisions of section 52 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1973, shall be paid a loading on such leave as shall be negotiated between the Board and the Association: Provided that where there is disagreement between the Board and the Association as to the amount of the loading and the conditions governing payment of it, a dispute within the meaning of section 11 (1) (f) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966-1970, shall be deemed to have arisen.

Development.

THE Shire of Swan under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of facilitating the resubdivision of land within the Scheme Area, its development and other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

Scheme Text.

Part I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Swan Town Planning Scheme No. 2A (hereinafter called “the Scheme”).

1.2 The Scheme shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette* (which date is hereinafter referred to as “the commencement date”).

1.3 The authority responsible for carrying out and enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Shire of Swan (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”).

1.4 The following maps form part of the Scheme:

- Scheme Area Map,
- Land Use Map,
- Scheme Proposals Map.

1.5 The Scheme shall apply to the area of land contained within the stippled black border on the Scheme Area Map and the land within that border is hereinafter referred to as “the Scheme Area”.

1.6 The general objects of the Scheme are:

- to improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage;
- to make provision for a new subdivision of the Scheme Area;
- to make suitable provision for the better use of land within the Scheme Area;
- to make suitable provision for roads within the Scheme Area;
- to ensure proper drainage within the Scheme Area;

- (f) to make provision for reticulated water and sewerage to all lots within the Scheme Area;
- (g) to provide land for municipal and public purposes.

1.7 The map entitled "the Land Use Map" shows the existing subdivision of the Scheme Area and the map entitled "the Scheme Proposals Map" shows the proposed subdivision of the Scheme Area, the approximate location and dimensions of the new lots proposed to be created and of the roads and pedestrian access ways proposed to be constructed and indicates the purposes for which it is proposed that the new lots within the Scheme Area may be used. It is proposed that the Shire of Swan Town Planning Scheme No. 1 will be amended in due course to enable the new lots to be used for such purposes.

1.8 The following works will be carried out within the Scheme Area:

- (a) The lots and part lots within the Scheme Area shall be resurveyed to make provision for the creation of new lots, roads and pedestrian access ways as shown on the Scheme Proposals Map with such variations and modifications as may be determined by Council or required by any statutory authority.
- (b) Such portions of the roads shown on the Land Use Map as are necessary to implement the Scheme will be closed.
- (c) The roads and pedestrian access ways shown on the Scheme Proposals Map shall be surveyed, constructed and drained.
- (d) The Scheme Area shall be drained and all works necessary or incidental thereto shall be carried out by or on behalf of the Council.
- (e) Such of the land within the Scheme Area as in the opinion of the Council requires filling, levelling or regrading shall be filled, levelled or regraded.
- (f) Outbuildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council will interfere with the implementation of the Scheme according to the new subdivision shall be demolished and removed.
- (g) All lots within the Scheme Area shall be supplied with reticulated water.
- (h) All lots within the Scheme Area shall be provided with reticulated sewerage.
- (i) Any other works necessary to complete the Scheme shall be carried out.

PART II.—LAND ACQUISITION.

2.1 Land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is necessary to give effect to the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

2.2 Any land which shall be vested in or owned by the Council at the commencement date shall be used by the Council for the purposes of the Scheme notwithstanding that such land may be vested in or have been acquired by the Council for other purposes and upon the commencement date such land shall be freed from any trusts, covenants or conditions attachable to it subject only to compliance with the requirements of any other law relating thereto.

PART III.—SCHEME COSTS.

3.1 The costs or estimated costs of the following items are herein referred to as "the Scheme Costs":

- (a) the Council's costs of administering the Scheme including such amount of the Council's overhead costs as the Council considers attributable to the Scheme and its administration;
- (b) the cost of all works carried out pursuant to the Scheme;
- (c) without limiting the generality of paragraph (b) of this clause, the cost of providing reticulated water and sewerage to the new lots and the costs of draining the Scheme Area including the costs of any sewerage lines and other works required

- outside the Scheme Area and the costs of connecting any drainage lines to a point of discharge outside the Scheme Area;
- (d) legal and other costs incurred by the Council with respect to the acquisition of land within the Scheme Area by resumption or otherwise;
- (e) the amount of any compensation payable with respect to improvements;
- (f) the costs of and incidental to the preparation, execution, stamping and registering of transfers, easements and other documents where the same are payable or paid by the Council;
- (g) the costs of and incidental to the preparation of the Scheme;
- (h) the amount of interest payable or paid by the Council on moneys borrowed for the purposes of implementing the Scheme.

3.2 The sum total of the Scheme Costs shall be payable by such of the owners of the old lots and part lots within the Scheme Area as participate in the Scheme in the proportions assessed pursuant to Part IV hereof.

PART IV.—VALUATIONS AND OWNERS' INTERESTS.

4.1 The old lots and part lots within the Scheme Area shall be valued as at the date of the resolution by the Council to adopt the Scheme by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department of Western Australia or by such person or persons as he shall nominate.

4.2 The new lots created by the Scheme shall be valued as at the date of the resolution by the Council to adopt the Scheme by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department of Western Australia or by such person or persons as he shall nominate. The valuation of the new lots shall be made on the basis that all works contemplated by the Scheme have been carried out.

4.3 Each owner of an old lot or part lot in the Scheme Area shall be offered an interest in the Scheme which interest shall be such proportion of the Scheme as the proportion which the value of the old lots owned by him bears to the total value of the old lots and part lots within the Scheme Area. Every such offer shall be made in accordance with the provision of Part V hereof.

4.4 Owners accepting the offer referred to in Clause 4.3 hereof shall participate in the Scheme and shall be termed "Participating Owners". The old part lot, lot or lots in respect of which such offer was made shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. If the Council elects not to resume the land of a Participating Owner it shall prepare and deliver to that owner a transfer to the Council of the old part lot, lot or lots which is or are the subject of the offer and such owner shall thereupon properly execute and return such transfer to the Council free of all encumbrances. If any such owner shall fail to so execute and return such transfer within twenty-eight (28) days of being called upon to do so the Council may rescind the agreement and the owner shall thereupon cease to be a Participating Owner.

4.5 If an owner does not accept the offer referred to in Clause 4.3 hereof in accordance with the provisions of Part V hereof or if an owner shall otherwise cease to be a Participating Owner he shall not participate in the Scheme and the Council may resume or otherwise acquire the old part lot, lot or lots owned by him. Where any such old part lot, lot or lots are so acquired by the Council the Council shall participate in the Scheme as if it were the original owner of such old part lot, lot or lots and with respect thereto the Council shall be deemed to be a Participating Owner and all references herein to the owners of old lots and part lots shall be deemed to include a reference to the Council in respect of any old part lot, lot or lots owned or acquired by it.

PART V.—ALLOCATION AND DISPOSAL OF NEW LOTS.

5.1 Every offer made pursuant to Clause 4.3 hereof shall include an offer to the owner of the old part lot, lot or lots concerned of a new single

residential lot or single residential lots as nearly may be in the same position as the old part lot, lot or lots in respect of which the offer is made.

5.2 Every such offer shall:—

- (a) be made in writing;
- (b) specify the new lot or lots which is or are being offered to the owner to whom the offer is made and the old part lot, lot or lots in respect of which the offer is so made;
- (c) contain an estimate of the share of the Scheme Costs payable by the owner if he becomes a Participating Owner and detail the calculation by which the same was arrived at;
- (d) specify the amount of rates payable by the owner pursuant to Clause 5.9 (b) hereof;
- (e) specify the values of the new lot or lots being offered as ascertained in accordance with Clause 4.2 hereof;
- (f) contain a statement of the extent of the owner's interest if he becomes a Participating Owner;
- (g) specify a date being not less than twenty-eight (28) days after the day on which the offer is posted by which the offer may be accepted.

5.3 Every offer made pursuant to this Scheme shall be made subject to:

- (a) the owner to whom a new lot or lots is offered accepting the same in full satisfaction of any claim that owner may have against the Council for compensation in respect of the transfer to or the resumption by the Council of the old part lot, lot or lots in respect of which the offer is made or otherwise in respect of the making or operation of this Scheme and in full satisfaction of all moneys which would have otherwise been payable to him in respect of such transfer or resumption;
- (b) a condition that a Participating Owner to whom a new lot or lots is offered shall pay to the Council or otherwise discharge his share of the Scheme Costs prior to the registration of the transfer of the new lot or lots to him.

5.4 Where an owner is offered more than one new lot he may elect by notice in writing to the Council to have his share of the Scheme Costs discharged by rejecting any of the new lots offered to him provided that the value thereof as assessed pursuant to Clause 4.2 hereof does not exceed the estimated amount of the owner's share of the Scheme Costs. If the value of the lot or lots which the owner rejects does not equal the amount of his share of the Scheme Costs the difference shall be paid to the Council.

5.5 Every such offer shall be made and served by registered post and it shall be addressed to the owner to whom it is made at the address for the time being recorded as his address in the Council's rate book or at the last address as that known to the Council.

5.6 (a) Any such offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time on or prior to the date specified in the offer as the last day on which the offer may be accepted.

(b) If any such offer is not accepted in the manner and within the time specified as the last day on which the offer may be accepted that offer shall subject to the provisions of Clause 7.1 be deemed to have been rejected.

5.7 If an owner to whom an offer of more than one new lot has been made elects to have his share of the Scheme Costs discharged by rejecting any of the other new lots offered to him he shall when accepting the offer with respect to the lot or lots he wishes to acquire give notice in writing to the Council of such election.

5.8 Notwithstanding that notice of acceptance of an offer has been given in the manner and within the time specified, such offer shall be deemed to have been rejected unless the amount of all rates taxes and other assessments or impositions, owing by the person accepting such offer,

in respect of land within the Scheme Area has been paid or such amount is paid on acceptance of the offer provided that this clause shall not apply to an offer accepted by a person who is a pensioner and in respect of whose land within the Scheme Area the payment of rates and taxes has been postponed. In respect of such pensioner the amount of rates and taxes postponed shall be added to and become part of his share of Scheme Costs.

5.9 If an offer made pursuant to this Scheme is accepted in the manner and within the time specified:—

- (a) It shall be deemed to have been accepted by the owner accepting the same in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the making and operation of this Scheme and in full satisfaction of all moneys which would otherwise have been payable to him in respect of the acquisition of the old part lot, lot or lots by the Council.
- (b) The owner accepting the same shall pay to the Council on demand the amount of all rates which would have been assessed on the old part lot, lot or lots in respect of which the offer was made but for the acquisition of those lots from him.
- (c) The Council shall in due course and subject to Clause 5.10 prepare and deliver to the owner accepting the offer a transfer to him of the new lot or lots which is or are the subject of the offer and such owner shall thereupon properly execute and return such transfer to the Council and shall forthwith pay to the Council the amount of his estimated share of the Scheme Costs. If an owner shall have made an election pursuant to Clause 5.4 hereof the amount (if any) to be paid to or by the Council under that clause shall be paid forthwith upon the return of such transfer. If any such owner shall fail to make such payment within twenty-eight (28) days of being called upon to do so by written notice served by registered post addressed to him at his address as shown in the Council's rate book or to his last address known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer) the Council may rescind the agreement and upon such rescission the owner shall cease to be a Participating Owner and the Council shall retain the new lot or lots offered to the owner and shall be liable to pay the owner's share of the Scheme Costs and the owner shall be entitled to claim compensation from the Council assessed in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act 1902 and where the old part lot, lot or lots were acquired otherwise than by resumption compensation shall be assessed as at the date of acceptance of the offer.

5.10 If the areas or boundaries of any new lot or lots or any road or pedestrian access way in the proposed subdivision have been adjusted or changed by reason of any modification of the proposed subdivision the Council shall if necessary make a re-allocation of the new lots as equitably as possible and in any event every Participating Owner shall be deemed to have accepted the offer made to him subject to any such adjustment or re-allocation becoming necessary.

5.11 On the return to the Council of a properly executed transfer pursuant to Clause 5.9 hereof and upon the Council being satisfied that all moneys payable pursuant to this Scheme by the owner to whom such transfer is to be made with respect to the new lot or lots to be transferred to him have been paid or otherwise discharged the Council shall subject to Clause 5.12 hereof cause such transfer to be registered at the Land Titles Office, Perth. All registration and other fees including stamp duty payable with respect to any such transfer shall be paid by the owner to whom such transfer is to be made.

5.12 If any land in the Scheme Area resumed by the Council pursuant to this Scheme was at the time of such resumption subject to a registered mortgage, charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of a purchaser, mortgagee, chargee or lessee, the Council shall not transfer a new lot to the former owner of such land unless such transfer is subject to a similar encumbrance or unless all the persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance so registered consent to such transfer free of encumbrance.

PART VI.—REJECTED LOTS.

6.1. Where an owner makes an election under Clause 5.4 hereof the new lot or lots not accepted by him shall be deemed to be rejected lots and the Council may deal with them in the manner herein-after provided.

6.2. The Council may sell any rejected lots, the commercial lots, the hotel lot, any lot or lots set aside for group housing, the school and church lots, either by public auction, tender, or with the consent of the Governor, private contract and if there shall be more than one such lot either as a whole or in separate lots and upon such terms and conditions as the Council thinks fit. If the Council effects the sale of any such lots by private contract the price therefor shall not be less than the amount recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or his nominee as the value thereof unless such lot shall have first been submitted for sale by public auction or tender and the Council has been unable to effect a sale at the amount so recommended.

6.3. The proceeds of the sale of all such lots after deducting therefrom the Council's costs and expenses incurred in effecting the sale, shall be credited to the Scheme and the Scheme Costs shall be reduced by such amount.

6.4. The Council may elect not to sell all or any of such lots and if it so elects or if it is unable to sell any of such lots shall ascertain the value thereof from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or his nominee and the Scheme shall thereupon be credited with the value so ascertained and the amount thereof shall be deducted from the Scheme Costs. Upon any such election being made or if the Council is unable to sell any of such lots these lots shall be the sole property of the Council which may retain, sell or otherwise deal with them as it thinks fit.

6.5. When the new lots have been transferred to participating owners, the lots referred to in Clause 6.2 hereof have been sold or their value credited to the Scheme pursuant to Clause 6.4 hereof and the amount of all costs and expenses in connection therewith have been determined the Council shall prepare an account debiting the Scheme with all Scheme Costs and other amounts required by the Scheme to be debited thereto and crediting the Scheme with all amounts required by the Scheme to be credited thereto. If the total of the credits to the Scheme shall exceed the total of the debits to the Scheme the Council shall distribute the excess to owners having an interest in the Scheme in proportion to such interests. If the total of the debits to the Scheme shall exceed the total of the credit to the Scheme the difference shall be paid to the Council by the owners having an interest in the Scheme in proportion thereto.

PART VII.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

7.1. The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose and for the purposes of the Scheme generally may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

7.2. Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six (6) months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*.

7.3. The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

7.4. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the said Act.

PART VIII.—POWERS OF COUNCIL.

8.1. The Council in the conduct and management of the development of the Scheme shall have the following powers:—

- (a) to enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area;
- (b) to enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Scheme Area;
- (c) to extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted;
- (d) to acquire by purchase or otherwise any land within the Scheme Area;
- (e) to dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it thinks fit;
- (f) to transfer any land required by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation;
- (g) to enter into such agreements and arrangements with the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board as seem proper to the Council for the purpose of draining and providing sewerage to the Scheme Area;
- (h) to make minor variations to the survey design where necessary or desirable;
- (i) if an owner does not accept an offer, the Council may, but is not obligated so to do, pay by way of compensation the interest in the Scheme to which the owner would have been entitled if he had accepted the offer.

Part III—Storage Charges.

Cargo Storage and Storage Charges.

A storage charge will be levied at the rate of 13 cents per tonne for the first week, and for every subsequent week the sum of 2.5 cents per tonne additional to the amount per tonne payable for each immediately preceding week, i.e., 15.5 cents per tonne for the second week, and 18 cents per tonne for the third week, and

so on. For the purpose of this regulation a fraction of a tonne shall be deemed to be a tonne and a part of a week shall be reckoned as one week: Provided that, if the consignee or owner hands to the Port Authority and an indemnity, in the form provided and approved by the Wharf Manager, relieving the Port Authority from all liability, the storage charges on goods for which goods shed accommodation is not provided, and which are not protected from the weather, may be reduced by one-half.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Wharf Manager may remove or order the removal of all or any such goods, at any time after the time hereinbefore appointed for their removal by the consignee, and in the event of such goods being removed by or on the orders of the Wharf Manager the Port Authority shall not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury whatsoever or howsoever occasioned to the goods by reason of their being removed into the open.

Part IV—Miscellaneous Hire and Other Charges.

Crane Hire: \$15.30 per hour.

Charges for provision of lighting:—

Number 1, 2 and 3 Wharves—\$6.00 per vessel per night or part thereof.

Fresh water: Supplied to all vessels at 16c per tonne.

Ships Stores: Stores for consumption on vessels by which shipped are free of wharfage dues, but handling charges shall be payable at ordinary cargo rates, according to services rendered.

"protected waters" means the waters contained in any lake, river or estuary, or by any breakwater, but does not include the waters of Cambridge Gulf or Lake Argyle;

Reg. 10 substituted. 3. The principal regulations are amended by revoking and re-making regulation 10 as follows:—

Conduct On or Near Vessels, Public Jetties or Bridges.

10. No person shall—

- (a) while using or swimming from or near any public jetty or bridge obstruct, impede or interfere with the passage of any vessel approaching or leaving the public jetty or bridge; or
- (b) cause a nuisance to any person on, in or about a vessel, public jetty or bridge.

4. The principal regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 10 the following new regulation:—

Areas for Swimming.

10A. The department may, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*—

- (a) define and set aside any area of navigable waters as an area that shall not be used for any purpose other than swimming;
- (b) prohibit swimming from or near any public jetty or bridge specified in the notice or within any area of navigable waters defined in the notice.

Penalties.

20. Every person who by act or omission contravenes the provisions of any regulation in this Part, or the provisions of any notice published under, and by virtue of, this Part, commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty of forty dollars.

 - (b) a fee of fifty cents,
- it shall supply that person with the information requested by him.

(2) Subregulation (1) of this regulation does not apply to or in relation to—

- (a) a person under the age of 17 years but not under the age of 14 years driving or operating a speed boat when accompanied, in the boat, by a person of at least 21 years of age; or
- (b) a person driving or operating a speed boat in, or in practice for, a competitive event, if the practice or event is under the proper control or supervision of an approved speed boat club or body that is conducting that practice or event with the permission of the department on a course in an area of navigable waters defined and set aside pursuant to paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of regulation 48A of these regulations.

52BA. All life jackets and flares required to be carried on board any vessel pursuant to regulation 52A or regulation 52B shall be situated so as to be easily accessible to all persons on

board the vessel, and, if they are stored under cover, their position shall be clearly indicated by appropriate markings on the vessel.

12. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 52G a new regulation as follows:—

52H. Whenever—

- (a) any vessel (including a vessel propelled solely by sail) is involved in an accident; or

- (c) the vessel is lost or sustains damage rendering it unseaworthy or incapable of being safely navigated; or
- (d) loss of life or serious injury occurs,

the owner or person in charge of the vessel shall within seven days of the occurrence of that accident or fire notify the department by sending to the department a written report containing particulars of the accident or fire and of any loss, damage, injury or loss of life.

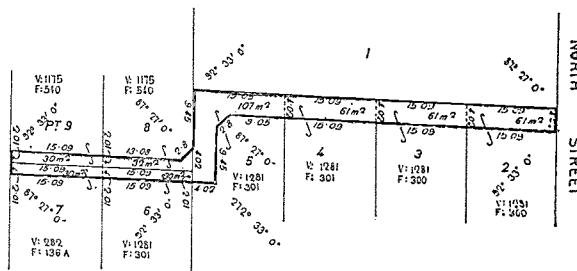

SALARIES OF TEACHING STAFF.

PART I.—GENERAL.

1. This determination will operate as from the 14th September, 1973.

2. The salary rates prescribed in this schedule shall be varied to the extent necessary to give effect to any decision of the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission in a National Wage Case, made during the currency

of this schedule and expressed to be on general economic grounds and which has general application.

PART II.—DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this schedule—

“two-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has successfully completed a minimum of two years' full-time tertiary training as a student of an approved teachers' college.

“three-year trained teacher (category 1)” means a teacher who has successfully completed a minimum of three years' full-time tertiary training at least two of which were spent as a student of an approved teachers' college.

“three-year trained teacher (category 2)” means a teacher who has completed more than three years' full-time tertiary training of which at least two years were spent as a student of an approved teachers' college but who has not the qualifications to become a four-year trained teacher.

For the purposes of this schedule only, a two-year trained teacher has the qualifications to become a three-year trained teacher when he obtains, subsequent to his initial training period, passes in three full units, other than Education, towards a Bachelor Degree of the University of Western Australia, or a diploma of the Technical Education Division, or other equivalent qualifications from time to time prescribed.

Also for the purposes of this schedule only, a two-year trained teacher who has completed thirteen years' service, or who has completed eleven or twelve years' service and has one ninth of a degree course, or who has completed nine or ten years' service and has two ninths of a degree course shall be deemed to be a three-year trained teacher, provided that two-year trained teachers appointed to grades higher than Grade 4 of Table II of the Salary Scales shall be deemed to be three-year trained teachers for the purposes of this

schedule only, after a period of service in accordance with the following scale:—

“four-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has had a minimum of four years’ full-time tertiary training including at least one year spent in training at an approved teachers’ college and either—

(a) in addition, has obtained a degree of a recognized university for which the minimum requirements are three years’ full-time study or other qualification accepted by the Director-General as of equivalent standard; or

(b) concurrently, has obtained the Bachelor of Education degree of the University of Western Australia.

“five-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has had a minimum of five years’ full-time tertiary training including at least one year spent in training at an approved teachers’ college and either—

(a) in addition, obtained a degree of a recognised university for which the minimum requirements are three years’ full-time study, and at the conclusion thereof passed at least one year’s post-graduate study; or

(b) in addition, obtained a degree of a recognised university, other than a Bachelor of Education degree of the University of Western Australia, for which the minimum requirements are four years’ full-time study.

“tertiary training” means undertaking a course at an approved university, technical institution or teachers’ college for which the prerequisite is a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent.

“graduate” means a teacher who has obtained a degree of a recognised university, or who has an associateship or other qualifications approved by the Director-General for this purpose.

For the purpose of this schedule, a two or three-year trained teacher who obtains the Teachers’ Higher Certificate becomes a four-year trained teacher.

For the purpose of these definitions, the Teachers’ Certificate (Technical) shall satisfy the conditions requiring “full-time tertiary training as a student of an approved teachers’ college”.

PART III—SALARY SCALES.

1. The following salary scales shall be paid to teachers according to their qualifications, experience and position.

2. Masters, mistresses, lecturers, trade instructors, counselling assistants or other teachers who do not occupy positions for which additional remuneration is provided in this schedule shall receive a salary according to Column A (4-year trained) or Column F (other) of the Salary Scales.

4. The salaries in Table I of the Salary Scales shall apply to all four and five-year trained teachers. The salaries in Table II shall apply to all two and three-year trained teachers.

5. Except as provided for specifically in this schedule, progression along the Salary Scales shall be by annual increments and shall be dependent upon satisfactory service.

6. (a) Teachers who obtain the Teachers’ Certificate at the completion of training at a teachers’ college shall be placed on the Salary Scales as follows:—

Five-year trained—Table I, Column A, Grade 5.

Four-year trained—Table I, Column A, Grade 4.

Three-year trained (Category 1)—Table II, Column F, Grade 6.

Three-year trained (Category 2)—Table II, Column F, Grade 6 or 7 (at the discretion of the Director-General).

Two-year trained—Table II, Column F, Grade 4.

(b) Teachers who obtain the Teachers’ Certificate (Conditional) shall be placed on grades lower than those specified above at the discretion of the Director-General.

(c) On first appointment to the Department other than directly from a Teachers’ College, teachers will be placed on Table I or Table II as determined by the Director-General, taking into consideration their qualifications and experience.

(d) (i) Trade instructors with five years’ post-apprenticeship experience will be placed on Table II, Column F, Grade 9.

(ii) Trade instructors with special additional experience or with higher technical qualifications, may be placed on grades higher than Grade 9, at the discretion of the Director-General.

(iii) Trade instructors with less than five years’ post-apprenticeship experience will be placed on grades lower than Grade 9. Such placement will be determined by the number of years by which the experience is less than five years.

7. (a) A teacher, other than a Trade Instructor without the Teachers' Certificate or Teachers' Certificate (Technical) shall not proceed beyond—

(i) Grade 5 if he is on Table I; or

(ii) Grade 9 if he is on Table II; except that persons appointed to the Technical Education Division in accordance with regulation 61 may advance two increments from their grade of appointment to the Department.

(b) A two-year trained teacher may not proceed beyond Grade 13 on Table II.

(c) A three-year trained teacher may proceed to Grade 14 on Table II.

(d) Notwithstanding sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph, a teacher holding the position of a trade instructor or senior trade instructor on 31st December, 1972, and appointed as such prior to 31st December, 1967, may proceed beyond Grade 13, Table II and transfer to Table I and proceed by annual progression as shown hereunder provided he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate (Technical) and has obtained a diploma of the Technical Education Division or other equivalent qualification:—

Grade 9—Table I

Grade 10—Table I

Grade 11—Table I

8. A teacher who has not had his certificate or provisional appointment confirmed by a satisfactory report may not advance further than three annual increments from his grade of appointment.

9. (a) A teacher who obtains a promotion or appointment to a position carrying a salary entitling him to move from one column of the Salary Scales to another column shall transfer to the new column on the same grade as he would have occupied had he not received the promotion or appointment.

(b) A teacher who obtains promotion to a position carrying a higher salary range shall be placed on a salary that will give him an increase in salary as a result of his promotion.

10. Teachers who have added to their qualifications after leaving a teachers' college or after appointment to the teaching service where the appointment is not ex-College, may be given accelerated progression. Progression under this paragraph is governed by the restrictions imposed in paragraph 7 of this Part and can only be made once in respect of any particular qualification.

Special progression under this paragraph is made in addition to any annual increments to which a teacher is entitled.

Progression through qualifications is awarded as follows:—

(i) Teachers with the Teachers' Certificate (Conditional)—teachers who in their first year ex-College obtain the necessary satisfactory service to complete the requirements for the Teachers' Certificate—one increment.

Teachers other than the above who obtain the Teachers' Certificate—one increment, except that teachers who obtain the Teachers' Certificate within a period of three years after leaving a teachers' college shall receive two increments if they commenced two grades below the normal commencing grade and three increments if they commenced three grades below the normal commencing grade.

Teachers of commercial subjects (other than those appointed from a teachers' college) whose first appointments are on Grade 3, Table II, or below, on obtaining the Teachers' Certificate (Technical)—one increment.

(ii) A two-year trained teacher who obtains the qualifications of a three-year trained teacher or is deemed to be a three-year trained teacher shall advance one increment and may proceed to Grade 14, Table II.

(iii) Notwithstanding subparagraph (ii), a trade instructor, covered by paragraph 7 (d) shall advance one increment regardless of which table he is on, and he shall continue to progress to Grade 11, Table I.

(iv) A three-year trained teacher who obtains the qualifications of a four-year trained teacher may transfer to Table I as follows:—
