TO THE HONOURABLE SIR REGINALD SHOLL:
I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you SIR REGINALD SHOLL to be a Royal Commission to inquire into and report upon the following questions:—

- (1) (a) Is the volume of traffic currently available in the areas and on the routes currently served by MMA sufficient to support two airlines on an economic basis without impairing the overall standard and frequency of services?
- (b) If not, what growth in traffic would be necessary to support a competitive and profitable operation by two airlines without reducing the overall standard and frequency of services?
- (2) (a) What would be the impact on MMA operations as a whole of the entry of a second operator using DC9 aircraft, either with the standard fares applicable to F28 aircraft or with a two-level fare structure, to the aerodromes which the Commonwealth Government currently plans to upgrade to take DC9 aircraft?
- (b) Which services would be affected and how, by such DC9 operations?
- (c) Would it be reasonable to expect MMA to continue the present standard and frequencies of services to the aerodromes currently served by F28 aircraft after losing traffic and revenue to a second operator on the DC9 routes; and if so, on what basis and with what aircraft?
- (d) If it is not reasonable to expect MMA to continue such services, on what basis and by whom would those services be operated?
- (e) What alternative arrangements, including the provision of subsidies, could be made for maintaining feeder and development services, on the assumption that they will be affected by the advent of a second operator?
- (3) If a second operator used DC9 aircraft on certain routes, could MMA be reasonably expected to continue to operate F28 Fellowship jet aircraft in competition or would it be necessary, if MMA is to be competitive, to abandon F28 aircraft and themselves introduce DC9 aircraft on these routes?
- (4) If forced to introduce DC9 or other jet aircraft for certain routes, what could MMA do with its F28 jet fleet?
- (5) What timetables could be observed if DC9 aircraft were operated by one or both airlines on certain routes?
- (6) (a) What is involved in overall upgrading of W.A. aerodromes (including navigational aids) to permit more widespread use of DC9 aircraft without operating restrictions which adversely affect their economic operation?
- (b) What would be the cost of establishing controlled airspace in Western Australia for the competitive jet operations so far proposed or contemplated?
- (c) Would the failure to establish such controlled airspace mean that Western Australia would have lower safety standards than those now applying elsewhere in Australia?
- (d) How could the establishment of aerodromes and the necessary controlled airspace be financed and on what time scale?
- (7) To what extent would total industry costs in the provision of airline services in Western Australia be increased as a result of licensing a second operator, and how would these increased costs affect fares and freight charges?

- (8) (a) What aircrew, ground staff and other employees would become redundant on the introduction of a second airline operator?
- (b) How could they be absorbed into uninterrupted employment without loss of seniority or remuneration having regard for existing industrial awards and agreements?
- (9) Except as may appear from the answers given to foregoing questions, is there any way in which the introduction of a second operator would be a benefit or a disadvantage to those making use of air transport in Western Australia?

and to make recommendations in respect of the foregoing as the Commission thinks fit and I hereby declare that, by virtue of this Commission, you may in the execution hereof do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission or the Chairman or members of a Royal Commission may lawfully do and exercise, whether under or pursuant to the Royal Commissions Act, 1968, or otherwise.

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WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to that Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State by any person; and whereas such types of bread as are respectively specified in the schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, excluding Rottnest Island, and that is within a radius of twenty-eight miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the schedule to this proclamation.

The wrapping referred to is wrapping of polythene, cellophane or waxed paper and which is done at the point of manufacture. It is an implicit provision in the maximum price abovementioned that where two 450 gram ordinary loaves of bread are sold at the same time to the same person, the price shall not exceed the price of one 900 gram ordinary loaf.

Local Government Act, 1960-1973.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.



 - (a) Special Rural Zone.
 - (b) Public Open Space Reserve.
- 2.1.2 Within the Special Rural Zone, the Town Planning Board may approve applications for subdivision into sub-lots with a minimum area of 3 hectares subject to any conditions.
- 2.1.3 In giving consideration to applications for subdivision the Board may take into account—
 - (i) The number of similar lots already available for development both within and outside the scheme area.
 - (ii) The scale and rate of development of lots existing at the time of such application.

5. A plan of the cemeteries showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and numbers of graves, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial" shall be kept at the office of the Council.
6. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemeteries shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B.
7. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Council in such time as to allow at least 8 working hours' notice being given to the superintendent at the cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.
8. The Council shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
9. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. Any coffin not complying with this by-law will not be admitted to or interred in the cemetery.

10. Every grave shall be at least 1.8 metres deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed to any grave with a less depth than one metre from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

11. In the case for an application for interment in any private vault or grave to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

12. If an application be made for interment in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the "Grant of Right of Burial".

13. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be re-opened for the purpose of interment through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial" as prescribed in Schedule "A" before interment takes place.

14. (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this by-law, a person shall not bring a dead body into the cemetery, unless he, or his representative, has first handed to the secretary for inspection and return a medical certificate of death or a Coroner's order for burial in respect of the body.

(ii) Where an undertaker or his representative for a valid reason is unable to produce a medical certificate or Coroner's order for burial, as required by paragraph (i) of this by-law and he has given to the secretary a written guarantee to produce the certificate or order within three days, he may bring the body into the cemetery.

(iii) A burial shall not be permitted in the cemetery unless the provisions of one of the foregoing paragraphs of this by-law have been complied with.

(iv) Where an undertaker or his representative has given written guarantee as required by paragraph (ii) of this by-law and he has failed to produce the certificate or order within three days, the undertaker's licence may be suspended until the certificate or order is produced.

15. No interment shall be allowed on a Sunday, or Public Holiday, except when certified in writing by a medical officer of health, or by a Police Magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day, in which case additional fees shall be charged.

16. The hours for burial shall be as follows: Monday to Friday 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.; Saturday 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Council.

17. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of two dollars.

18. If for any reason the funeral shall, on arrival at the entrance gates of the cemetery, remain there for more than fifteen minutes prior to proceeding to the graveside the undertaker responsible shall be liable for a fine of two dollars.

19. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Vehicles shall not be allowed to proceed faster than 8 kilometres per hour within the cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the superintendent or other officer of the Council from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the cemetery.

20. If application be made to the Council to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or of his family, an order from the Governor or the warrant of a Coroner or of a Justice of the Peace issued in accordance with the law authorising the Council to permit of the exhumation must be attached to the application form.

21. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

22. Smoking shall not be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

23. No dogs shall be admitted to the cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

24. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Council for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Council or their representatives.

25. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub or flower growing in any portion of the cemetery.

26. No person shall remove or carry out or attempt to carry out of the cemetery any tree, plant, shrub or flower, earth or other material without the written authority of the Council or their representatives.

27. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertising whatsoever, without the written consent of the Council and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the cemetery.

28. Any person desiring to place, or erect, or alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Council, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Act.

29. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Council or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

30. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the superintendent or other officer appointed by the Council, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse or rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

31. If any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

32. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken into the cemetery. No sand, earth or other material shall be taken from any part of the cemetery for use in the erection in any monument or other work except with the written approval of the Council.

33. No catacomb shall be allowed.

34. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault except by special permission of the Council.

35. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the superintendent.

36. All workmen, whether employed by the Council or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said secretary, shall be removed from the cemetery.

37. Licences for grave dressing or decoration may be issued by the Council, and licences to be renewed annually in the month of July.

38. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed in any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b) No sand, soil or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Secretary.
- (c) The dressing of all graves, and wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to supervision of the Secretary.
- (d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

39. The Council may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantee to do so. If the grantees do not desire the Council to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Council for that purpose.

40. No person except the relatives of the deceased, or the Council, or those licensed by the Council, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

41. If for the purpose of re-opening the grave, the Council finds it necessary to remove the edging tiles, plants, shrubs etc. from the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the Council the charges laid down in Schedule "A".

42. Notwithstanding anything contained in these by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without the payment of any fees.

43. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Council:—

- (a) That the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries received in war; and
- (b) That the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances.

Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

44. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, grave or any erection, or in any way infringing these by-laws shall be expelled from the cemetery.

45. Any person committing any breach of by-laws or regulations or any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Dollars and in a case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding Four Dollars for every day during which such breach continues.

46. Any person committing a breach of any by-law in the cemetery, shall in addition to being liable to a penalty under any by-law, be liable to be forthwith removed from the cemetery by the Council or the superintendent or other employee of the Council, or by any Police Constable. If such person resists removal, or if and as often as any such person so removed, shall, unless with the consent of the superintendent again enter the cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Dollars.

47. Grants of Right of Burial shall be in the form of Schedule "D".
