WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act, 1893, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to revest in Her Majesty as of Her former estate all or any lands, whereof Her Majesty may become the registered proprietor, and whereas Her Majesty is now the registered proprietor of the lands described in the Schedules hereto: Now therefore, I, the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation revest in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and successors, the land described in the Schedules hereto as of Her former estate.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 17th day of July, 1974, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Mental Health Act, 1962-1973.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 19 of the Mental Health Act, 1962-1973, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time, set aside any one or more buildings or places, or part of a building or place, provided by the State or part of a public hospital, within the meaning of the Hospitals Act, 1927, for the purpose of any service mentioned in subsection (1) of that section, and may, in like manner, declare any such building or place or part of a building or place or any part of a public hospital to be an approved hospital; and may vary or cancel any order made under that subsection; and whereas by Order in Council made on the 9th August, 1972, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th August, 1972, the Governor has declared the buildings, places and hospitals set forth in that Order to be approved hospitals and has set aside the buildings and places specified in that Order for the purposes respectively set forth in that Order: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby—

- (a) cancel the Order in Council made on the 9th August, 1972, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th August, 1972;

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding immediately following regulation 23F a new subheading and regulation as follows:—

Division 4—Disposal of Patients'
Property.

23G. (1) Where, pursuant to section 57A of the Act, the Director proposes to dispose of any article or thing left, deposited or placed by any patient in the custody or control of the Director, or in any approved hospital or reception home, the Director shall, before disposing of that article or thing, publish in the *Government Gazette* a notice—

- (a) describing the article or thing; and
- (b) stating that after the expiration of three months from the date of publication of that notice the Director will cause the article or thing to be destroyed or sold if no claim has lawfully been made in respect of it.

(2) Where any article or thing is lawfully claimed prior to the expiration of the period of three months from the date of the publication of the notice the Director shall cause that article or thing to be returned or delivered to the claimant, but in any other case the Director may cause it to be destroyed or sold.

(3) For the purpose of this regulation a claim shall not be considered lawful unless it is made—

- (a) by the former patient, or a person duly authorised in writing by him, in person; or
- (b) where the former patient is dead or incapable, by a person who satisfies the Director that he is the legal personal representative or otherwise lawfully entitled to claim on behalf of that patient.

(4) Where any article or thing is sold pursuant to this regulation the net proceeds of sale shall be placed to the credit of a trust account, to be kept by the Director, and shall remain so credited until either lawfully claimed or a period of six years has expired, whichever first shall happen.

(5) Where the proceeds of any sale are not lawfully claimed within a period of six years they shall be deemed to have vested in the Crown and shall form part of the Consolidated Fund.



PART I—PRELIMINARY.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Pre-packed Articles) Regulations, 1974.
- Revocation. 2. The Weights and Measures (Pre-packed Articles) Regulations made under the Weights and Measures Act, 1915 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th September, 1968 and amended by notice so published on the 8th February, 1974, are revoked.
- Interpretation. 3. (1) In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
- “bottle” means a hollow vessel of glass, plastic, synthetic resin, or other similar material, but does not include a jar, or a container of the tumbler or drinking glass type;
 - “cocoa” includes cocoa powder and chocolate powder;
 - “coffee” includes coffee beans;
 - “compressed or liquefied gasses” does not include liquefied petroleum gas;
 - “condensed milk and evaporated milk” includes flavoured condensed milk and flavoured evaporated milk;
 - “cream” does not include clotted cream;
 - “dried or dehydrated fruit” includes currants, raisins, sultanas and other dried grape products, dates, apples, pears, peaches, apricots, prunes, and figs, glace and crystallised fruit, and fruit peel;
 - “dried or dehydrated mixed fruit” includes dried or dehydrated mixed fruit mixed with nuts;
 - “drug” means any substance used as a medicine or in the composition or preparation of a medicine, whether for internal or external use;
 - “flour” means all kinds of flour, including cornflour;
 - “fresh milk” means warm milk, pasteurized milk, flavoured milk and all substances in liquid form derived from and described (with or without qualification) for sale as milk whether or not anything has been added to or extracted from the milk from which it is derived, but does not include condensed milk or evaporated milk or aseptically packaged milk (commonly known as U.H.T. milk);
 - “imperial system” means the system of measurement in Commonwealth legal units of measurement related to the yard, the pound, or the gallon;
 - “liquid chemicals” means all liquid chemicals, including solvents, packed for sale for pharmaceutical, laboratory, or industrial use;
 - “lubricating oil” does not include any substance sold merely as an addition to a lubricating oil;
 - “metric system” means the system of measurement in Commonwealth legal units of measurement related to the metre, the kilogramme, or the cubic metre;
 - “paint” includes enamel but does not include a two-pack paint or artist’s paints;
 - “peas” includes split peas;
 - “poultry” includes pigeons and pheasants, and both cooked and uncooked poultry and poultry pieces;
 - “poultry piece” means leg, wing, breast, or other portion detached from a bird’s carcass and any fractional part of a bird’s carcass;
 - “resins” includes natural resins, synthetic resins, and polymeric materials other than paints;
 - “salt” includes flavoured salt;
 - “solid detergents, laundry bleaches and household cleansers” means any such substance in a powder, flake, granular, or other similar form;
 - “the Act” means the Weights and Measures Act, 1915;
 - “the first schedule” means the First Schedule to these regulations;
 - “the second schedule” means the Second Schedule to these regulations;

“tobacco” includes plug tobacco; and

“two-pack paint” means a paint, not being a neutral base paint, that is contained in a package that is marked with a statement that the contents of the package are to be used only in conjunction with another substance (whether that other substance is or is not a paint), and that is ordinarily only so used.

(2) Where in relation to any article or articles a reference is made in these regulations to weight or measure in terms of units of measurement of the imperial system and is immediately followed by an alternative reference to weight or measure in terms of units of measurement of the metric system it is to be taken that the former reference applies in relation to any article or articles packed in units of measurement of the imperial system and the alternative reference applies in relation to any article or articles packed in units of measurement of the metric system.

PART II—PACKING OF CERTAIN ARTICLES IN PRESCRIBED QUANTITIES.

Denominations in which certain articles may be packed.

4. (1) Subject to subregulation (3) of this regulation, an article of any description specified in column A of the first schedule is prescribed as an article to which section 27D of the Act applies.

(2) For the purposes of section 27D of the Act—

- (a) pre-packed sliced bread is an article to which that section applies; and
- (b) the denominations of weight specified in the second column of the following table opposite to the description of a type of bread, within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903, set out in the first column of the table are the prescribed denominations of weight in relation to pre-packed sliced bread of that type.

(3) The denominations of weight or measure specified in column D of the first schedule opposite to the description of an article set out in column A of that schedule are, for the purposes of section 27D of the Act, the prescribed denominations of weight or measure in relation to articles of that description.

(4) Section 27D of the Act does not apply to or in relation to—

- (a) an article of a description specified in column A of the first schedule that is packed in a package containing a quantity of the article less than the quantity specified in column B of the schedule, or more than the quantity specified in column C of the schedule, opposite to the description of the article specified in column A of the schedule;
- (b) coffee, or mixtures of coffee and chicory, in the form of liquid essences;
- (c) clotted cream;
- (d) ice cream in the form of cakes or puddings or in novelty shapes;
- (e) maize, peanut, olive, and other edible vegetable oils sold otherwise than by volume;
- (f) liquid household insecticides in aerosol form;
- (g) essential oils; and
- (h) a package containing a number of individual serves of any article, if each such serve is of a quantity less than the quantity specified in column B of the schedule opposite to the description of the article set out in column A of the schedule, and the package is marked with the number of individual serves of the article contained therein and with the total net weight or measure of its contents.

PART III—MARKING OF PRE-PACKED ARTICLES.

Articles to which section 27E of the Act applies.

5. Section 27E of the Act applies to pre-packed articles of every description except a pre-packed article specified under any category of goods referred to in regulation 26 of these regulations in the circumstances particularised in that regulation.

Manner, etc. of marking pre-packed articles pursuant to section 27C of the Act.

6. Any name, address, or brand, required by section 27C of the Act to be marked on a package containing an article, shall be marked clearly and legibly on the package containing the article.

Manner, etc.

7. (1) Subject to this regulation—
- (a) the marking of the net weight or measure of an article to which section 27E of the Act applies, on the package containing the article—
- (i) shall in all cases be on the main display portion of the package;
- (ii) where the package is of such a shape or design—
- (A) that one portion of the package, other than the main display portion, is likely to be displayed as an alternative to the display of the main display portion when the article is exposed for sale,
- shall be on that portion also;
- (B) that any one of several portions of the package, other than the main display portion, is likely to be displayed as an alternative to the display of the main display portion when the article is exposed for sale,
- shall be on at least one of those other portions also; or
- (C) that one or more portions of the package, other than the main display portion, is likely to be displayed when the article is exposed for sale but the package is not one to which the preceding subparagraphs (A) or (B) apply, shall be on at least one of those other portions also;
- (iii) shall show the weight or measure clearly, prominently and conspicuously so that it may be seen readily and read easily by any person when the article is exposed for sale; and
- (b) the letters or figures or letters and figures setting out the weight or measure of an article to which section 27E of the Act applies that are marked on the package containing the article—
- (i) shall be clearly stamped or printed in a colour of a distinct contrast to the colour of their background, unless they are clearly stamped or embossed and are of a height at least three times the height specified in subregulation (1) of regulation 12 of these regulations;
- (ii) shall be placed in close proximity to the brand or name of the article where that brand or name appears on the package and shall be so stamped, printed or, pursuant to subregulations (6) and (7) of this regulation, handwritten, as to be read in the same direction as the brand or name;
- (iii) shall be in the English language and, unless otherwise provided, in Commonwealth legal units of measurement of the imperial system or of the metric system;
- (iv) shall not be obscured or crowded by any other copy or any other graphic matter; and
- (v) in the case of a package that is or is substantially cylindrical, oval or conical, shall be contained wholly within that portion of the package comprised of the two parts of the main display portion (as defined in subregulation (9) of this regulation) lying either side of the line drawn from the top surface to the bottom surface of the package that bisects the main display portion each part being subtended by an angle of 60 degrees measured at the point of intersection of the axes of symmetry of the package that is in the same horizontal plane as the central horizontal of the marking of weight or measure.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, the marking of the weight or measure of an article to which section 27E of the Act applies on the package containing the article may show the weight or measure on some portion other than the main display portion of the package in the case of—
- (a) toilet preparations packed in quantities not exceeding two ounces or 75 grammes or two fluid ounces or 75 millilitres—
- (i) if the weight or measure of such an article marked on the package containing the article may be readily seen and easily read by a purchaser when the article is exposed for sale; or
- (ii) if the weight or measure so marked is associated with descriptive material or directions as to the use of the article; and
- (b) an article of any description, or any group of articles of any description contained together in an outer package, exempted by the Minister by a notice under subregulation (5) of this regulation from subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, if the weight or measure of the article marked on the package containing the article or, as the case

may be, the weight or measure of each individual article contained in the outer package marked on the outer package is marked in accordance with the conditions and restrictions, if any, specified in the notice.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, in addition to the marking of net measure in accordance with that subregulation on a package that is a metal cylinder containing any beverage there may be made a marking of the net measure of the contents of the package along the perpendicular dropped from the top surface to the bottom surface of the package at any point on its circumference and the provisions of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation shall not apply in relation to a marking so made.

(4) Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation does not apply to or in relation to—

(a) any—

- (i) package to which subregulation (1) of regulation 18 relates;
- (ii) package containing any cake, fruit, or vegetable;
- (iii) package containing a roll of ribbon, lace, elastic, or other article of haberdashery; or
- (iv) article contained in a package and sold to a person on the premises on which it is packed, if the true weight or measure of the contents is marked in clear and legible handwriting, in letters or figures or letters and figures on the package; or

(b) an article of any description exempted by the Minister by a notice under subregulation (6) of this regulation from subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, if the weight or measure of the article marked on the package containing the article is marked in accordance with the conditions and restrictions (if any) specified in the notice.

(5) The Minister may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, and subject to such conditions and restrictions (if any) as he may determine and as are specified in the notice, exempt a pre-packed article of any description to which section 27E of the Act applies, or any group of such articles contained together in an outer package, from the provisions of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of this regulation.

(6) The Minister may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, and subject to such conditions and restrictions (if any) as he may determine and as are specified in the notice, exempt a pre-packed article of any description to which section 27E of the Act applies from the provisions of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation.

(7) Where, under subregulation (6) of this regulation, a pre-packed article is exempted from the provisions of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, the notice shall include a condition that the letters or figures or letters and figures setting out the weight or measure of the article marked on the package containing the article shall be clearly and legibly handwritten.

(8) Where there is marked on a package a statement of the weight or measure of an article contained in the package expressed in terms of the imperial system or in terms of the metric system (in this subregulation called the "original statement") the package may, in addition, be marked with a statement of the weight or measure of the article expressed—

- (a) in terms of Commonwealth legal units of measurement other than those in which the original statement is expressed;
- (b) in a language other than English; or
- (c) in terms of units of weight or measure other than Commonwealth legal units of measurement, if that additional statement sets out the equivalent of the weight or measure specified in the original statement.

(9) In this regulation the expression "main display portion" means that portion of a package on which the name or brand of the article contained therein is shown or, where the name or brand is shown on two or more portions, that portion on which it is most prominently shown or, where the name or brand is shown on two or more portions in the same prominence, any one of those portions.

Manner, etc.

8. The statement of weight or measure of an article to which section 27E of the Act applies that is marked on the package containing the article shall, in all cases excepting where the statement is in terms of length, area, number, or volume, contain, in close proximity to that statement, the word "net".

Units of measurement in terms of which statement of weight may be marked.

9. (1) Where an article to which section 27E of the Act applies is packed for sale by weight and is not of a kind that may, pursuant to these regulations, be marked in terms of the troy ounce, the pennyweight, the apothecaries ounce, the drachm, or the scruple, the statement of weight marked on the package containing the article—

- (a) where it is expressed in terms of the imperial system, shall be expressed in terms of the hundredweight, cental, pound, ounce, dram, or grain; and
- (b) where it is expressed in terms of the metric system, shall be expressed in terms of the tonne, kilogramme, gramme, or milligramme.

(2) Where the marking on a package, pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation of the weight of an article contained in the package is expressed in terms of the imperial system—

- (a) pounds may be expressed as decimal sub-multiples of a cental;
- (b) in the case of an article referred to in subregulation (1) of regulation 18 of these regulations, ounces or parts of an ounce may be expressed as decimal sub-multiples of the pound save that no such sub-multiples shall relate to a quantity less than 0.01 of a pound;
- (c) fractions of the pound or of the ounce, where permitted by these regulations to be used, may be expressed as decimal sub-multiples of the pound or of the ounce;
- (d) in the case of an article, the weight whereof is expressed in terms of the ounce and is less than two ounces, the vulgar fractions $\frac{1}{8}$, $\frac{3}{8}$, $\frac{5}{8}$ and $\frac{7}{8}$ of an ounce may be used; and
- (e) save as is provided by paragraph (d) of this subregulation or by subregulation (3) of this regulation, a vulgar fraction other than $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{3}{4}$ shall not be used where the weight of the article is expressed in terms of the hundredweight, pound, ounce, or dram.

(3) Where the marking on a package, pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation, of the weight of an article contained in the package is expressed in terms of the imperial system and also in terms of the metric system—

- (a) any fraction of a unit of weight of the imperial system may be expressed as a decimal sub-multiple of that unit; and
- (b) decimal sub-multiples of an ounce may be expressed in terms of hundredths of an ounce where the weight of the article is not greater than four ounces and in terms of tenths of an ounce where the weight of the article is greater than four ounces but less than one pound.

(4) Where the marking on a package, pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation, of the weight of an article contained in the package is expressed in terms of the metric system a fraction of a unit of weight shall be expressed as a decimal sub-multiple of that unit save as is provided by subregulation (3) of this regulation.

(5) A reference marked on a package to the weight or any part of the weight of an article contained therein, whether it consists of a reference to a whole number or to a decimal sub-multiple or to a combination of both—

- (a) in the case of a marking made by a ticket-printing price-computing weighing machine, of a weight expressed in grammes not exceeding 5 000 grammes, may express a degree of accuracy to not more than four significant figures if the certificate of approval in force in relation to the pattern with which that machine conforms pursuant to the Weights and Measures (Patterns of Instruments) Regulations of the Commonwealth or a like certificate in force in relation to that pattern pursuant to a law of any State or Territory of the Commonwealth approves the use for trade of that pattern to measure that degree of accuracy and the marking is made in accordance with the certificate;
- (b) in the case of a marking that is not made in compliance with paragraph (a) of this subregulation, shall express a degree of accuracy to not more than three significant figures.

Units of measurement in terms of which statement of volume may be marked.

10. (1) Where an article to which section 27E of the Act applies is packed for sale by volume and is not of a kind that may, pursuant to these regulations, be marked in terms of the cubic foot or cubic metre, the statement of volume marked on the package containing the article—

- (a) where it is expressed in terms of the imperial system, shall be expressed in terms of the gallon, quart, pint, fluid ounce, fluid drachm or minim;
- (b) where it is expressed in terms of the metric system, shall be expressed in terms of the litre, or millilitre.

(2) Subject to subregulation (3) of this regulation, in the marking on a package, pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation, of the volume of an article contained in the package—

- (a) in any case where the volume is expressed in terms of the gallon, no fractions other than $\frac{1}{8}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ shall be used;

- (b) in any case where the volume is expressed in terms of the pint or the fluid ounce, no fractions other than $\frac{1}{8}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{3}{8}$, $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$ and $\frac{7}{8}$ shall be used;
- (c) the fraction $\frac{1}{8}$ shall not be used with a whole number to express the volume of the article; and
- (d) where the volume of a pre-packed article marked on the package containing the article is expressed in terms of the imperial system and is also marked thereon in terms of the metric system any fractions of a unit of volume of the imperial system may be expressed as decimal sub-multiples of that unit.
- (3) In the marking on a package, pursuant to sub-regulation (1) of this regulation, of the volume of an article contained in the package—
- (a) where the marking is expressed in terms of the metric system, a fraction of a unit of volume shall be expressed as a decimal sub-multiple of that unit;
- (b) a fraction of the gallon, of the pint, or of the fluid ounce, where permitted by these regulations to be used, may be expressed as a decimal sub-multiple of the gallon, of the pint, or of the fluid ounce, as the case may be.
- (4) A reference marked on a package to the volume or any part of the volume of an article contained therein, whether it consists of a reference to a whole number or to a decimal sub-multiple or to a combination of both, shall express a degree of accuracy to not more than three significant figures.

Statement of weight to be in terms of the largest unit of weight or measurement.

11. (1) Subject to this regulation, the statement of weight or measure marked on a package containing an article to which section 27E of the Act applies shall be expressed in terms of the largest unit of weight or measurement of the article.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation—

- (a) nothing in that subregulation requires a statement of weight or measure to be expressed in terms of a unit greater than the pound or the yard, or the kilogramme, litre or metre;
- (b) in any case where it is customary to express the length or width of an article in terms of feet or inches, the length or width of the article may be so expressed;
- (c) in the case of articles of a quantity less than one gallon, the quantity may be expressed in terms of pints and fluid ounces;
- (d) in the case of articles of a quantity less than one quart, the quantity may be expressed in terms of fluid ounces, and additional statements in fluid ounces may be made for any measure; and
- (e) subject to subregulation (3) and subregulation (4) of this regulation where the weight or measure of an article is to be marked in terms of the metric system it may be expressed in terms of a unit specified in the first column of the following table if the weight or measure to be so expressed is not greater than the weight or measure specified in the second column of the table opposite that unit—

(3) A unit of measurement specified in the first column of the table set forth in paragraph (e) of subregulation (2) of this regulation may be used to express the weight or measure of an article specified in the first column of the following table if the weight or measure to be so expressed is not greater than the weight or measure specified in the second column of the following table opposite the reference to that article—

(4) The weight marked in terms of the metric system of an article may be expressed in grammes if—

- (a) the weight so expressed is not greater than 5 000 grammes; and
- (b) the marking is made by a ticket-printing price-computing weighing machine that conforms with a pattern approved, by certificate of approval in force in relation to that pattern pursuant to the Weights and Measures (Patterns of Instruments) Regulations of the Commonwealth or by a like certificate in force in relation to that pattern pursuant to a law of any State or

Territory of the Commonwealth, for use for trade to measure to a degree of accuracy to four significant figures and the marking is made in accordance with the certificate.

(5) The weight or measure of an article to which section 27E of the Act applies shall not be marked on a package containing that article by reference to a decimal sub-multiple unless a zero or other numeral precedes the decimal point that indicates the sub-multiple.

Sizes of
print.

12. (1) The—

- (a) statement of weight or measure on a package containing an article to which section 27E of the Act applies;
- (b) words "Net weight when packed", or words to like effect, marked on a package pursuant to section 27H of the Act;
- (c) words "Net weight at standard condition", or words to the like effect, marked on a package pursuant to section 27HA of the Act,

shall, according to the maximum dimension of the package, be printed or stamped thereon in print of a height not smaller than the height set out in the following table in relation to that dimension—

(2) The minimum height of print specified in this regulation applies in respect of all letters, and all figures other than fractions.

(3) The minimum height of print of the individual figures comprising a fraction shall be not less than onehalf of the minimum height specified in this regulation for the height of print to be used in respect of a package of the appropriate maximum dimension.

(4) The marking of a weight printed by a ticket-printing price-computing weighing machine shall be taken to comply sufficiently with the table set out in subregulation (1) of this regulation if the letters and figures signifying the word "net" and the weight are 3.00 mm in height irrespective of the size of the package.

(5) For the purposes of this regulation, the maximum dimension of a package is—

- (a) in the case of a rectangular package, the height, length, or breadth, whichever is the greatest; or
- (b) in the case of a cylindrical, oval, or conical package, the height or the maximum diameter, whichever is the greater.

(6) A reference in this regulation to the statement of weight or measure marked on a package does not include a statement of weight or measure expressed in a language other than English or in terms of units of weight or measure other than Commonwealth legal units of measurement and marked on a package in addition to the statement of weight or measure called in subregulation (8) of regulation 7 of these regulations the "original statement".

13. (1) Subject to this regulation, the statement of weight or measure marked on a package, containing an article to which section 27E of the Act applies shall—

- (a) if the article is an article that is commonly sold by lineal or superficial measure, be expressed in terms of such measure;
- (b) if the article is a liquid article, be expressed in terms of liquid measure (volume);
- (c) if the article (not being an article referred to in paragraph (a) of this subregulation) is a solid article, a semi-solid article, or an article that is partly solid and partly liquid, be expressed in terms of weight; or
- (d) if the article is an article that is commonly sold by number be expressed in terms of number.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation, the statement of weight or measure marked on a package containing an article referred to in the first column of the following table shall be expressed in the terms set out in the second column of that table opposite to the description of the article—

(3) In the case of—

- (a) condensed milk and evaporated milk;
- (b) linseed oil and other vegetable oils in quantities of more than one-half of a gallon or 3 litres;
- (c) liquid chemicals;
- (d) resins; and
- (e) yoghurt,

the package containing the article may be marked with a statement of the quantity of the article expressed in terms of weight and an additional statement of that quantity expressed in terms of volume but may not be marked with a statement of the quantity expressed partly in terms of weight and partly in terms of volume.

Prohibition of use of certain terms in expressing weight or measure of articles.

14. (1) Subject to this regulation, the statement of weight or measure marked on the package containing an article to which section 27E of the Act applies shall not be expressed—

- (a) in terms of two denominations of weight or measure between which the weight or measure of the article falls; or
- (b) in terms of a minimum, or approximate, or average weight or measure.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation—

- (a) a statement of the weight of dressed poultry (other than poultry pieces) may be expressed in terms of a minimum weight (being a minimum weight specified in the second column of the second schedule); and

(b) a statement of the weight of a number of eggs contained together in a package may be expressed in terms of the minimum weight of each egg contained therein or of two denominations of weight between which the weight of each such egg falls.

(3) Where a statement of the weight of dressed poultry (other than cooked poultry and poultry pieces) marked on the package containing the poultry is expressed in terms of a minimum weight, the package shall also be marked with a size number, being the number set out in the first column of the second schedule under the heading "Size number" opposite to that minimum weight in the second column of that schedule.

(4) Where a number is marked on a package pursuant to subregulation (3) of this regulation, each figure contained in that number shall be not less than ten millimetres in height.

Statement of dimensions of certain articles.

15. A statement of the dimensions of tarpaulins, bed sheets, or other sheets of hemmed fabric material marked on any such article or on a package containing any such article shall be expressed in terms of the finished size of the article.

Thickness or width to be marked on packages in certain cases.

16. Where a statement of the measure of an article marked on the package containing the article may, pursuant to these regulations, be expressed in terms of the length of the article, and the width or the thickness of the article has, or both the width and the thickness of the article have, a direct relationship to the value of the article, that width or thickness or width and thickness shall also be marked on the package.

Special provisions relating to certain articles.

17. In the case of aluminium foil, waxed paper, facial tissues, or toilet paper, the statement of quantity of the article marked on the package containing the article may be expressed in terms of the number of usable sheets of stated dimensions of the article contained in the package.

Marking of articles with statement of price per pound.

18. (1) Subject to this regulation, a package containing meat, natural cheese, dressed poultry, fish (including crustacea), bacon, ham, or smallgoods shall, before being exposed for sale, be marked with a statement of the price per pound or per kilogramme of the article or articles contained in the package.

(2) Subregulation (1) of this regulation does not require a statement of the price per pound or per kilogramme to be marked on a package containing—

- (a) frozen fish;
- (b) dressed poultry, the statement of the weight of which is expressed in accordance with regulation 14 of these regulations as a minimum weight;
- (c) natural cheese, when packed in a net weight of 4 ounces, 6 ounces, 8 ounces, 12 ounces, 1 pound, or 1½ pounds, or of a multiple of 1 pound, or in a net weight of 100 grammes, 125 grammes, 200 grammes, 250 grammes, 375 grammes, 500 grammes, or of a multiple of 500 grammes;
- (d) frankfurts, minced meat, sausage meat, sausages, saveloys, sliced cooked meat, or sliced bacon, when packed in a net weight of 2 ounces, 4 ounces, 6 ounces, 8 ounces, 12 ounces, 1 pound, or 1½ pounds, or of a multiple of 1 pound, or in a net weight of 50 grammes, 125 grammes, 175 grammes, 250 grammes, 375 grammes, 500 grammes or of a multiple of 500 grammes;
- (e) any other article, if a statement of the price per pound or per kilogramme of the article is indicated in prominent letters, or letters and figures, of a height of not less than 10 millimetres placed on or immediately adjacent to a tray or other like receptacle in or on which packages containing the article are displayed; or
- (f) any article packed to a net weight of one pound or one kilogramme or an integral multiple thereof.

Size of letters etc. used to indicate price per pound.

19. (1) Where a package is marked, pursuant to regulation 18, with a statement of the price per pound or per kilogramme of the article or articles contained in the package, the statement—

- (a) shall be marked clearly, prominently, and conspicuously on the main display portion of the package in such manner that it may be readily seen and easily read by a purchaser when the package is exposed for sale; and
- (b) according to the maximum dimension of the package, shall be in letters or letters and figures of a height not smaller than the height set out in the following table in relation to that dimension—

Maximum dimension of Package	Minimum height of letters or letters and figures Editorial
80 mm or under	2.0 mm
Over 80 mm but not over 160 mm	2.5 mm
Over 160 mm but not over 260 mm	3.3 mm
Over 260 mm	4.8 mm

(2) The marking of a price per pound or per kilogramme printed by a ticket-printing price-computing weighing machine shall be taken to comply sufficiently with the table set out in subregulation (1) of this regulation if the symbols, letters and figures signifying the price are 3.0 mm in height irrespective of the size of the package.

(3) For the purposes of paragraph (b) of subregulation (1) of this regulation, the maximum dimension of a package is—

- (a) in the case of a rectangular package, the height, length, or breadth, whichever is the greatest; or
- (b) in the case of a cylindrical, oval, or conical package, the height or the maximum diameter, whichever is the greater.

Statement of weight in terms of number of packages to ton or tonne. 20. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of these regulations, the weight of an article or articles contained in a package the number whereof to the ton or to the tonne does not exceed 45 may be marked on the package by reference to the number of packages of the article or those articles to the ton or, as the case may be, tonne.

(2) A reference so marked on a package shall be deemed to be a statement of the weight of the article or articles contained therein, such weight being calculated by dividing one ton or, as the case may require, one tonne by the number of packages specified in the reference.

Provisions applicable where article contained in an inner and outer package. 21. (1) Where a pre-packed article to which section 27E of the Act applies is contained in both an inner and an outer package and is such an article as is commonly sold in the inner package after removal from the outer package, the statement of weight or measure of the article required by these regulations to be marked on the package containing the article shall be marked on both the inner package and the outer package.

(2) Where two or more pre-packed articles to which section 27E of the Act applies are packed together for sale in an outer package, and are ordinarily so sold without removal from the outer package, it is a sufficient compliance with this Part of these regulations if each individual package is marked, in accordance with these regulations, with a statement of the weight or measure of the article contained therein, or a statement of the weight or measure of each such article is marked, in accordance with these regulations, other than with subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subregulation (1) of regulation 7 of these regulations, on the outer package.

(3) Where two or more pre-packed articles described in column A of the first schedule, each of which is of a quantity less than the quantity specified in column B of the first schedule opposite to the description of the article set out in column A of the first schedule, are contained together in an outer package, it is a sufficient compliance with this Part of these regulations if the outer package is marked in accordance with these regulations with a statement of the number of individual articles contained therein and the total net weight or measure of the articles.

(4) Nothing in this Part of these regulations shall be read or construed as requiring a statement of the weight or measure of its contents to be marked on an outer package containing two or more pre-packed articles to which section 27E of the Act applies.

Articles that may be marked "Net weight when packed". 22. The articles set out hereunder, when packed in a package other than an hermetically sealed container, are articles to which section 27H of the Act applies—

- Bar soaps
- Cotton Wool;
- Flax;
- Glauber Salts;
- Jute;
- Manilla;
- Mushrooms (fresh);
- Oven baked animal biscuits;
- Sisal;
- Soap flakes;
- Soap powders (excluding detergent powders);
- Tobacco;
- Washing Soda;
- Whole hams.

Permissible weight losses. 23. The articles set out in the first column of the following table are declared to be articles to which subsection (6) of section 27H of the Act applies; the number of parts per centum set out in the second column of that table opposite the description of each such article in the first column of that table are the number of parts per centum of the weight stated on the package containing that article prescribed for the purposes of that subsection in relation to that article; and the number of parts per centum set out in the third column of that table opposite the description of each such article in the first column of that table are the number of parts per centum of the weight stated on the package containing the article prescribed as the permissible average deficiency for the purposes of that subsection in relation to that article.

24. (1) In this regulation—

"class A fibre" means a fibre of any kind that is referred to in paragraph (a) in the first column of the table;

"class B fibre" means a fibre of any kind that is referred to in paragraph (b) in the first column of the table;

"class C fibre" means a fibre of any kind other than a class A fibre or class B fibre;

"table" means the table of permissible deficiencies that is set out at the end of subregulation (2) of this regulation.

(2) For the purpose of section 27HA of the Act—

(a) yarn and cotton wool are prescribed as articles to which that section applies; and

(b) subject to subregulation (3) of this regulation—

(i) the number of parts per cent specified in the second column of the table opposite any class of fibre specified in the first column thereof is prescribed, for the purposes of paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of that section as the maximum permissible deficiency of weight in relation to yarn or cotton wool that is composed of a fibre, or of fibres, of that class; and

(ii) the number of parts per cent (if any) specified in the third column of the table opposite any class of fibre specified in the first column thereof is prescribed, for the purposes of paragraph (b) of that subsection, as the permissible average deficiency (if any) of weight in relation to yarn or cotton wool that is composed of a fibre, or of fibres, of that class.

(3) Where—

- (a) any yarn or cotton wool is composed of a mixture of fibres; and
 - (b) that mixture comprises fibres of any two or more of the classes of fibre specified in the first column of the table,
- then, notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of subregulation (2) of this regulation—
- (c) the number of parts per cent obtained by adding to five parts per cent the number of parts per cent ascertained in accordance with the prescribed formula is prescribed, for the purposes of paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section 27HA of the Act, as the maximum permissible deficiency of weight in relation to that yarn or cotton wool; and
 - (d) the number of parts per cent that is ascertained in accordance with the prescribed formula is prescribed, for the purposes of paragraph (b) of that subsection, as the permissible average deficiency of weight in relation to that yarn or cotton wool.

(4) For the purposes of subregulation (3) of this regulation, the prescribed formula is—

$$A \times 6 + B \times 2$$

where—

A represents the proportion that the weight of the class A fibre (or, as the case may be, that the total weight of all the class A fibres) of which yarn or cotton wool contained in a package is composed bears to the total weight of that yarn or cotton wool; and

B represents the proportion that the weight of the class B fibre (or, as the case may be, that the total weight of all the class B fibres) of which yarn or cotton wool contained in a package is composed bears to the total weight of that yarn or cotton wool.

(5) Where a package containing an article to which section 27HA of the Act applies (being an article that is composed of a mixture of fibres) is marked with the words "Net weight at standard condition" or words to the like effect, that package shall also be marked, prominently and legibly, with a correct statement of the proportion by weight of each of the fibres of which the article is composed.

Restricted expressions.

25. Any expression (not being a prohibited expression) that is marked on a package containing a pre-packed article is a restricted expression for the purpose of section 27J of the Act if it consists of or includes any of the following words, namely—

King;
Giant
Jumbo
Queen
Longfellow;
Family;
Hi-boy;
Huge;
Gigantic;
Colossal;
Economy;
Bigger;
Extra;
Large;
Long.

Exemptions.

26. (1) Nothing in section 27C of the Act or in this Part (other than regulation 25) of these regulations applies to or in relation to any article specified under any category of goods contained in the following table, in the circumstances therein particularised—

Textile Goods.

- (a) textiles, wearing apparel, and other similar articles that are not packed for sale by weight, measure, or number and are not ordinarily so sold;
- (b) yarn packed in a quantity less than one-half of an ounce or 15 grammes net weight;
- (c) textiles that are—
 - (i) packed for sale by weight and are sold in packages each containing more than 10 pounds or four kilogrammes;
 - (ii) packed for sale by length and are sold in packages each containing more than 30 yards or 25 metres;
 - (iii) packed for sale by area and are sold in packages each containing more than 30 square yards or 25 square metres.

Food Goods.

- (a) wheat, maize, oats, chaff, potatoes, and other like agricultural produce sold by weight in sacks of more than 60 pounds or 25 kilogrammes gross weight;

- (b) confectionery, nuts, popcorn, potato crisps and savouries—
 - (i) packed on premises for sale on those premises if the package is displayed for sale on those premises in a receptacle that bears a prominent statement in letters, figures and symbols not less than 10 millimetres in height of the weight and of the price of the contents of the package and if—
 - (A) the gross weight of the package does not exceed 8 ounces or 250 grammes; or
 - (B) the sale price of the contents does not exceed 20 cents; or
 - (ii) packed in or with another article if the value of the combined articles is substantially represented by that other article;
- (c) Easter eggs, Easter caskets and confectionery in novelty shapes;
- (d) confectionery (other than chocolate moulded in slab, block or bar form (with or without added matter)), dried fruit, nuts, popcorn, potato crisps and savouries packed in a quantity less than 3 ounces or 85 grammes gross weight;
- (e) chocolate moulded in slab, block or bar form (with or without added matter) packed in a quantity less than 1 ounce or 30 grammes gross weight;
- (f) fresh fruit or vegetables packed in packages of dimensions prescribed by the laws of the State relating to the sale of fresh fruit or vegetables;
- (g) honey in the comb in original frames;
- (h) bales of hay;
- (i) ice cream, and any other frozen confection, packed in a quantity less than 10 fluid ounces or 300 millilitres;
- (j) kippers;
- (k) a pie or pasty made for use as an individual serve the weight whereof is less than 8 ounces or 250 grammes;
- (l) cakes, sponges, and puddings, packed singly in a quantity less than 4 ounces or 125 grammes gross weight;
- (m) dried vegetables and freeze-dried vegetables packed in a quantity less than one-half of an ounce or 15 grammes;
- (n) alcoholic liquors packed in a quantity less than 2 fluid ounces or 75 millilitres or more than 2 gallons or 10 litres;
- (o) wines labelled before the first day of November, 1969.

Medicinal and Toilet Goods.

- (a) therapeutic goods within the meaning of the Therapeutic Goods Act 1966 of the Commonwealth, being—
 - (i) goods compounded or made to the order of the purchaser, or a medical practitioner, dentist, or veterinary surgeon; or
 - (ii) goods, the sale or supply whereof to the public is prohibited by law except on the written prescription of a medical practitioner, dentist, or veterinary surgeon;
- (b) a medicinal or toilet preparation in cake or tablet form packed for sale for use for washing or as a personal deodorant;
- (c) a toilet preparation in a compact, and a refill of such a preparation;
- (d) single application hair dyes or hair bleaches, or single application home permanent hair waving kits;
- (e) a vaccine packed in a quantity less than 25 millilitres, or a single dose of any substance packed in a vial or ampoule for sale for use as an injection.

Hardware Goods.

- (a) articles of hardware that are not packed for sale by weight, measure, or number, and are not ordinarily so sold;
- (b) two or more articles of hardware packed to the order of the purchaser for use as components in building or engineering construction work and accompanied, at the time of delivery to or at the direction of the purchaser, by an invoice that specifies the number and description of each article in the package.

General Goods.

- (a) articles, ordinarily sold by number, that are packed in a quantity less than nine in a package made wholly or partly of transparent material so that when the package is exposed for sale the number of articles contained in the package is readily apparent to a purchaser;
- (b) an article the weight whereof exceeds 175 pounds or 75 kilograms or the volume whereof exceeds 40 gallons or 150 litres;

- (c) tobacco packed in a quantity less than one-half of an ounce or 15 grammes;
 - (d) an article packed in a quantity less than 1 ounce or 25 grammes or 1 fluid ounce or 25 millilitres other than drugs, pepper and other spices, herbs, instant tea, tobacco, yarn, dried vegetables and freeze-dried vegetables;
 - (e) fire extinguisher refills;
 - (f) a roll of polythene and rubber separation film that is so marked in terms of nominal weight, length and width as to comply with Australian Standard Code ASK120-1965;
 - (g) photographic film and photographic printing paper;
 - (h) a bag of clay;
 - (i) fish bait other than prawns;
 - (j) a roll of wallpaper;
 - (k) garden compost, tan bark, farmyard manure, peatmoss, or leaf mould;
 - (l) a pre-packed article that is, for the time being, the subject of a permit issued by the Minister pursuant to section 27F of the Act and that is sold in accordance with the conditions and restrictions (if any) specified in the permit.
- (2) Nothing in subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be taken to exempt, according to the terms of that subregulation, two or more articles contained in a package by reason only of the fact that each of such articles is an article that is so exempted.
- (3) An article—
- (a) shall not be taken to be excluded from the category "general goods" contained in the table set out in subregulation (1) of this regulation by reason only of the fact that it is an article that could properly be included in any other category therein contained; and
 - (b) that is of a type of goods referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation in item (a) under the category "textile goods" or in item (a) under the category "hardware goods" shall not be taken to be packed for sale by weight, measure, or number by reason only of the fact that it is contained in a package for sale as a single item, or as a set, or, being an article ordinarily described as a pair or as one of a pair, it is contained in a package for sale as a pair or as one of a pair.
- (4) Nothing in Part II of these regulations or in this Part (other than regulation 25) applies to or in relation to—
- (a) any package containing one or more articles that are ordinarily sold by number, if the number of articles in the package is marked on the package in accordance with these regulations;
 - (b) articles that are contained in a package on which is set out a direction to the effect that the whole of the contents of the package, or of each of a stated number of smaller packages contained therein, is to be diluted to a state weight or measure, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, articles of the following kinds, namely—
 - (i) jelly crystals, blancmange powders, custard powders, junket tablets, junket powders, and other food substances (excepting powdered milk and condensed milk (whether flavoured or not));
 - (ii) photographic developers, fixers, and chemicals;
 - (iii) agricultural and horticultural chemicals; and
 - (iv) legume seed inoculants;
 - (c) liquid colouring materials contained in a package on which is set out a direction that the whole of the contents of the package or a stated portion of those contents is to be mixed with a stated volume of paint of a type specified in the direction, if the measure of the contents of the package or, as the case may be, of the stated portion thereof is not more than ten parts per cent of that volume; or
 - (d) a bottle that contains alcoholic liquor, aerated water, fruit drink, cordial, or milk and that is marked in embossed or ceramic markings, being a bottle—
 - (i) manufactured before the first day of November, 1970;
 - (ii) packed before the first day of November, 1979; and
 - (iii) that, if it had been in existence and filled, could, with its contents have lawfully been sold in the State before the first day of November, 1969.
- (5) Nothing in subsection (1) of section 21 or in section 27C of the Act or in this part applies to a package of at least 480 sheets of paper in a wrapping applied to that package at the factory at which the paper was produced if—
- (a) the package weighs more than 10 pounds or 4 kilogrammes; or
 - (b) the package is marked with the number of sheets therein and with the dimension of each such sheet.

Exemption from prohibition on marking of gross weight. 27. The provisions of paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 21 of the Act do not apply in relation to an article contained in a package for the purpose of transport only or in relation to a package containing an article for that purpose only if the package is marked as set forth in the third schedule to these regulations.
