Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1972, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1971, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, abolish a fire district and remove the name of a fire district or local authority from Part IV of the Second Schedule; and whereas the municipal district of the Shire of Ashburton is set out in Part IV of the Schedule as a fire district under the name of Onslow Fire District; and whereas it is deemed expedient to abolish that fire district and to remove its name from the said Schedule: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) abolish the Onslow Fire District and remove the name, Onslow Fire District from Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act; and
- (b) remove the name of the municipal district, Shire of Ashburton, in column two opposite the Onslow Fire District, from Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act.

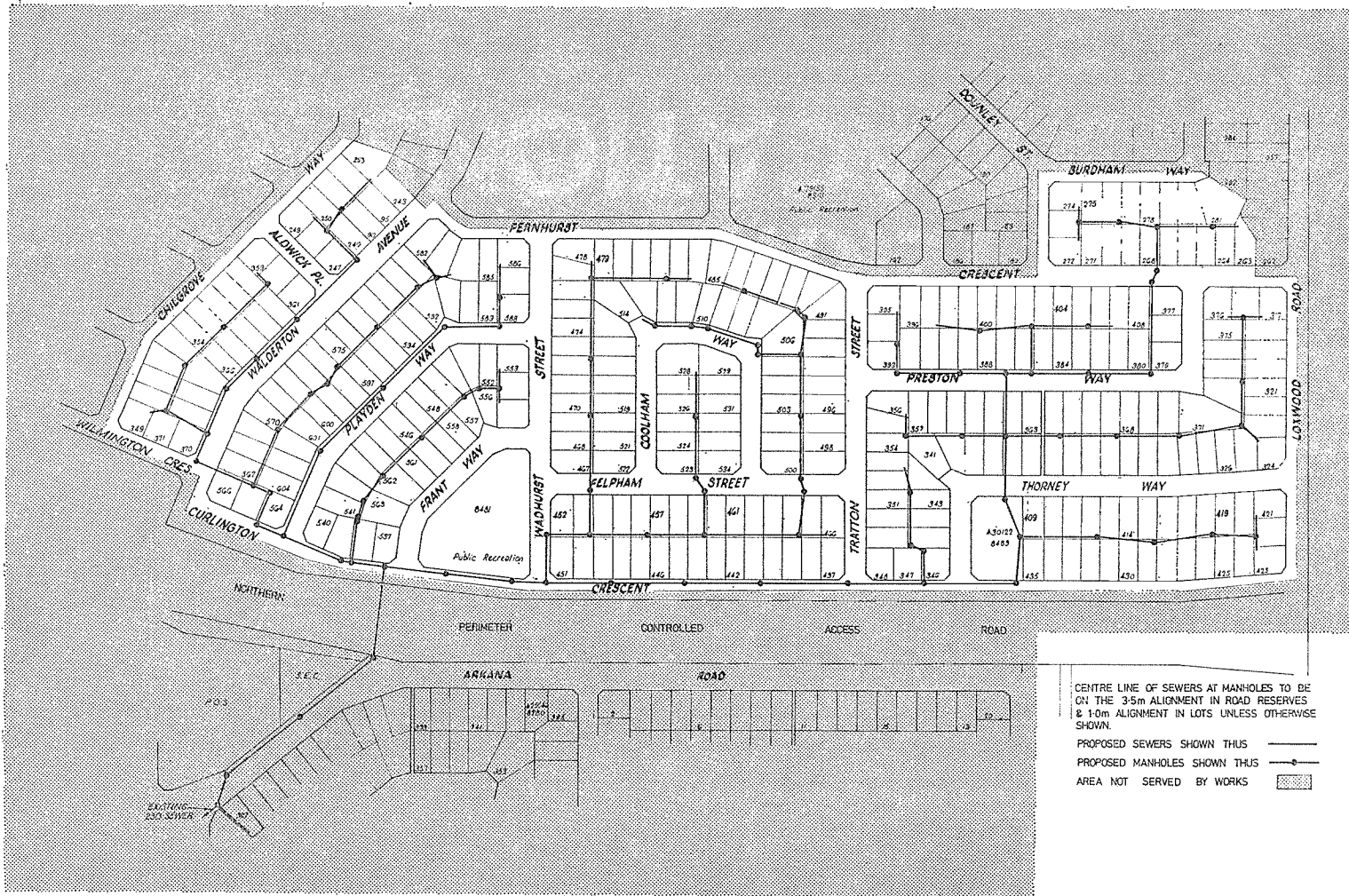
