#### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Air Commodore Sir Hughle To Wit: H. I. EDWARDS, Governor. [L.S.] The Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of The Distinguished Service Order, Officer of The Most Excellent Order of The British Empire, Distinguished Flying Cross, Governor In and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

# Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967. Sewerage—Roebourne Reticulation Area No. 1B. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

#### PWWS, 174/74.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967, has been pleased to approve of the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage undertaking the construction of the works described in the schedule hereunder; and to exempt the works from the operation of sections 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 of the Act.

## Mining Act, 1904-1973. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 226 of the Mining Act, 1904-1973, that the Governor may by Order in Council establish warden's courts at such places as he deems necessary, and may assign to any warden's court such goldfields and mineral fields or districts as he thinks fit; and whereas it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 227 of that Act, that the Governor may in like manner order that any warden's court shall be discontinued or that any goldfield or mineral field or district shall cease to be assigned to such court and be assigned to another court and that when a warden's court is discontinued, or any goldfield or mineral field or district ceases to be assigned to such court the proceedings pending therein and the records thereof as relate to such goldfield, mineral field, or district shall be transferred to and continued in such other warden's court as the Governor may direct: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby—

- (a) discontinue the warden's court heretofore established at Ravensthorpe;
- (b) assign to the warden's court at Perth, the Phillips River Goldfield; and
- (c) direct that the proceedings pending in and the records of, the warden's court at Ravensthorpe, be transferred to and continued in the warden's court at Perth.

# Local Government Act, 1960-1973. City of Stirling.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 688 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973 that where through an impediment or accidental omission anything required to be done by or under that Act is not done or is not done within the prescribed time, manner or form, the Governor, for the purpose of giving effect to the intention and purposes of the Act, may by order take such measures as are necessary for rectifying the omission or removing the impediment, and may validate anything which has been done otherwise than in the prescribed time, manner, or form; and whereas Executive Homes were convicted on the 12th October, 1973 of an offence in contravention of subsection (5) of section 374 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973 in respect of a dwelling at Lot 513 North Beach Road, Hamersley; and whereas in purported pursuance of the provisions of section 411 of that Act the Council of the City of Stirling and the said Executive Homes have exchanged notices and correspondence which were through accidental omission otherwise than in the prescribed time, manner or form: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council in exercise of the powers conferred by section 688 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973, for the purpose of giving effect to the intention and purposes of that Act, hereby orders—

- (a) that the said Executive Homes shall be deemed lawfully to have complied with the provisions of section 411 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1973, relating to the institution of an appeal under Division 19 of Part XV of that Act against a requisition in relation to the eaves boundary clearance on the eastern side of a duplex situate at Lot 513, North Beach Road, Hamersley, which shall be deemed to have been lawfully served upon him by the Council of the City of Stirling;
- (b) that in accordance with the provisions of Division 19 of Part XV of that Act the appointment of referees be proceeded with and the appeal determined.

  - (c) All Properties exceeding 2 025 hectares: Where the total area of a property exceeds 2 025 hectares additional firebreaks of not less than 3 metres in width must be provided in such positions as to divide the property into areas not exceeding 2 025 hectares, each area being completely surrounded by a firebreak.

(d) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) you shall forthwith clear a firebreak not less than 20 metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of land on which bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.

2. Townsite Land: Clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/ or haystacks situated on the land.

3. Bulk or Drum Fuel Storage Sites: All bulk or drum Fuel Storage Sites to be totally cleared of inflammable materials for a minimum distance of 6 metres around the storage site.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be sought to construct such firebreaks in an alternative position. Approval to any such variation will only be granted where the bush fire control officer for the area has first signified his approval to the variation. If the necessary approval is refused, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

4. No firebreaks will be permitted on any road or other reserves.

A. Rural Land (i.e. all land within the Shire of Harvey other than land within the townsites of Yarloop, Harvey, Wokalup, Benger, Brunswick, Roelands, Australind, Binningup and Myalup):

- You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1974, clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide immediately inside and along the external boundaries of the land owned or occupied by you.
- (2) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1974, where more than 200 hectares of land owned or occupied by you has been cleared or part cleared for agricultural purposes clear of all inflammable material, additional firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide so as to divide the land which has been cleared or part cleared for agricultural purposes into areas of not more than 200 hectares each surrounded by a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide.

- (5) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1974, where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) clear of all infiammable material firebreaks not less than 20 metres wide in the following positions on the land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated—
  - (a) immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
  - (b) in such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 120 hectares each surrounded by a firebreak not less than 20 metres wide.
- (6) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining and preparing of the bush is completed after the 15th day of November, 1974, you shall, within 28 days of completing the bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush, clear of all infiammable material, firebreaks not less than 20 metres wide in the following positions on that land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated—
  - (a) immediately inside the external boundaries of the land; and
  - (b) in such positions as would divide the land into separate areas of not more than 120 hectares, each surrounded by a firebreak not less than 20 metres wide.

B. Townsite Land (i.e. all land within the Townsites of Yarloop, Harvey, Wokalup, Benger, Brunswick, Roelands, Australind, Binningup and Myalup)—

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1974, where the area of land is 0.2 hectares or less and the land is not used for agriculture or grazing purposes, remove all infiammable matter and all bush as defined in the Bush Fires Act, save standing live trees, from the whole of the land.
- (2) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1974, where the land is used for agriculture or grazing purposes or is more than 0.2 hectares in area, clear of all infiammable material, firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.
- (3) You shall on or before the 15th day of November, 1974, clear of all infiammable material firebreaks not less than 3 metres wide immediately surrounding any drums or bulk tanks situated on the land which are normally used for the storage of fuel whether they contain fuel or not.

If for any reason it is considered to be impractical to clear firebreaks or to remove the infiammable material from the land as required by this Notice, you may apply in writing to the Council or its duty authorised Officer on or before the 31st day of October, 1974, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position or to take alternative action to abate a fire hazard. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised Officer you shall comply with the requirements of this Notice.

The owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects to comply with the requirements of this Notice is guilty of an offence under subsection 3 of Section 33 of the Act and is liable for a penalty of not less than \$10 or more than \$200 and the Council may do the works and charge the owner or occupier for such works.

Where the land of the owner or occupier abuts on Crown land and the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide on the Crown Land, along the common boundary, such firebreak will be accepted as complying with the requirements of this notice only so far as those requirements relate to the construction of firebreaks 2 metres wide.

(b) On or before the 31st day of January 1975 (or within 14 days of the date of completion of the preparation for burning should this be after the 31st day of January 1975) to clear of all infiammable material firebreaks not less than one chain wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land on which the bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for burning (Whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and thereafter to maintain the firebreak clear of infiammable material up to and including the 30th day of April 1975.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council not later than 14 days prior to the date by which the firebreaks are required to be provided for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. No such application will be considered unless it is made in writing, adequately describes the land, and it is accompanied by written approval of the bush fire control officer for the area in which the land is situated. If permission is not granted by the Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200, a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

#### Townsite Land.

On or before November 1st, 1974, remove all bush and inflammable material from vacant townsite land; but where buildings are erected on the land, prepare and thereafter maintain until 30th April 1975 effective firebreaks around the perimeter of such buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land, cleared of inflammable material to a width of at least 3 feet or where the boundary is closer than 3 feet, then for the lesser distance.

# SHIRE OF MERREDIN TOWN PLANNING SCHEME NO. 4—COHN STREET SCHEME.

THE Shire of Merredin under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Twon Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

# SCHEME TEXT

#### Citation

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Merredin Town Planning Scheme No. 4— Cohn Street Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

#### Responsible Authority

2. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Merredin (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

#### Maps

3. The following Maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:-

# Land Use Map. Scheme Map Sheets 1 and 2.

# Scheme Area

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land con-tained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as the Scheme Area.

#### General Objects

- 5. The general objects of the Scheme are:—
  - (a) To facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area.
  - (b) To plan within the Scheme Area suitable roads.
  - (c) To ensure the proper drainage of the roads and of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other such works.
  - (d) To have the land within the Scheme Area connected to a sewer.
  - (e) To provide reticulated water throughout the Scheme Area.
  - (f) To make provision for land to be used for Public Open Space and Local Authority purposes.

#### Method of Carrying Out Objects

6. As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivided their land such subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area.

7. The Scheme Map forms a basis for subdivision and development of the Scheme Area but the Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit alterations or variations to the Scheme Map where in its opinion circumstances justify such action provided no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

#### Subdivision

8. An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act of Western Australia.

#### New Roads

9. Subject to the following clauses all new roads within the Scheme Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein and each owner shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the roads and pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the land owned by him.

10. The Council shall contribute one-third of the costs of the construction and drainage of so much of a new road as adjoins land set aside for public open space or local authority purposes.

11. Cohn Street has been designed for a dual carriage-way. If an owner when subdividing his land shall make more land available for Cohn Street than he would have been required to do if such street was only 66 feet in width he shall be compensated by the Council in respect of the value of such additional land but from each compensation shall be deducted all amounts due or to become due to the Council pursuant to the Scheme. An owner making land available for Cohn Street shall be responsible for the cost of the construction of one carriage-way only.

12. In cases where the situation of a new road within the Scheme Area is such that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road and apportion the value of the land made available for roads and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

13. The Council may construct and drain any new roads within the Scheme Area and acquire the land necessary for that purpose. If the Council shall do so prior to the subdivision of the lands adjoining such road the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions as and when they subdivide their land or after having received not less than three calendar months' notice from the Council whichever shall first happen.

14. If an owner shall claim compensation for the resumption from him of land to be used as a road there shall be set off against the amount of compensation payable to him the amount by which the value of the remainder of his land has been or will be increased by the construction of the road within the Scheme Area and by the operation of the Scheme.

15. If an owner shall subdivide his land and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road within the Scheme Area he shall before the approval of his plan of subdivision release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be.

#### Closure of Roads

16. Surveyed roads within the Scheme Area that are shown on the Scheme Map as roads to be closed shall be closed as the development of the land proceeds and as such surveyed roads are no longer required.

#### Public Open Space.

17. It is intended that the land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be reserved for Public Open Space and Local Authority purposes.

18. The Council may as and when it deems fit acquire the said lands coloured green or any parts thereof either by purchase or resumption or partly by one method and partly by the other.

19. Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall when subdividing his land and subject as hereinafter provided transfer to the Council an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided or developed by him or such other areas as the Town Planning Board shall upon approval of the Plan of Subdivision require.

20. If within a parcel of land the subject of subdivision and development it is not possible to transfer an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided the Council may make or receive a cash adjustment so that the value of land (if any) to be transferred with or subject to the cash adjustment equals one-tenth of the value of land the subject of the subdivision.

21. If within a parcel of land the subject of subdivision and development more than one-tenth is required by the Council for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes the owner shall transfer to the Council the land required by it for that purpose and the Council shall pay to the owner by way of compensation the value of the land exceeding the said one-tenth as shall be required by the Council. If the Council so agrees the Council may transfer to the said owner other land in or near the Scheme Area either owned by the Council or acquired by it for that purpose to compensate him for the land in excess of the said one-tenth required by the Council in which case the amount payable by the Council to the owner shall be reduced accordingly.

22. The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to or acquired by it for the purpose of Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes provided that all moneys received by the Council in respect of such sales and all moneys received by the Council under Clause 20 hereof shall after making all necessary payments to owners and paying the costs of land (if any) acquired for transfer to owners under Clause 21 hereof be expended by the Council in the acquisition or improvement of land for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes in or near the Scheme Area.

23. If the Council shall have resumed land for Public Open Space roads drainage or Local Authority purposes it shall be reimbursed all compensation and costs paid by it from moneys received by it from the sale of land or under the preceding clauses hereof and upon the owner from whom the land was resumed subdividing his land the value of one-tenth of his land to be made available for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes hereunder shall be assessed on the basis that such land had not been resumed.

#### Sewerage Drainage and Water Supply Works.

24. Such sewerage works drainage works and water supply works as are in the opinion of the Council necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and the connection of the land therein to a sewer and to water mains shall at the appropriate times be carried out. The Council may acquire land for all such purposes and may set aside land for drainage sumps and compensating basins and other works.

#### Progressive Development.

25. The Scheme Area may be progressively developed as the sewerage drainage and water supply works proceed.

#### Connection to the Sewer.

26. If the Council is of the opinion that the nature of the soil in any part of the Scheme Area is sufficiently absorptive to permit the efficient operation of an apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewage it may permit the development of that area and the occupation of buildings thereon before the sewer is available. Permission to develop given pursuant to this clause does not absolve an owner from his liability to pay a share of the cost or estimated cost of the sewerage works. Subject to the foregoing provisions of this clause no building shall be occupied unless the building is connected to the sewer.

#### Levelling and Filling.

27. If any land shall require levelling or filling before it can be subdivided or built upon the cost of such works shall be borne by the owner of the land.

#### Scheme Costs.

28. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as Scheme Costs:—

- (a) the administration of the Scheme.
- (b) The drainage works necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area.
- (c) The cost to the Council of the sewerage works necessary for the connection of the land in the Scheme Area to a sewer.
- (d) The cost of supplying water throughout the Scheme Area.  $% \label{eq:constraint}$
- (e) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (f) The cost of the construction and drainage of roads adjoining land set aside for public open space and local authority purposes.
- (g) All other costs and expenses which the Council shall be required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

#### Payment of Scheme Costs.

29. Each owner shall prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land or after having received not less than three calendar months' notice from the Council whichever shall first happen pay to the Council an amount which bears the same proportion of the Scheme Costs as the value of the owner's land at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme bears to the value of the whole of the land within the Scheme Area.

#### Estimate of Scheme Costs.

30. If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of subdivision of a parcel of land or at the time of the giving of a notice by the Council as aforesaid such costs may be estimated by the Council. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

#### Valuations.

31. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined by either the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department or at the option of the Council by a disinterested and competent valuer appointed by the Council.

32. If an owner shall object to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

33. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in values.

#### Land Owned or Acquired by the Council,

34. All or any of the lands now owned by or subsequently acquired by the Council within or near the Scheme Area may be used by the Council for any purposes appropriate to the Scheme. If such purpose is one for which an owner is required to make land available or for which land may be acquired by the Council pursuant to this Scheme the Council shall be compensated for the value of the land so used by the Council. If the Council shall subdivide or develop any land owned by it the provisions of this Scheme shall apply to the Council.

#### Arbitration.

35. Any dispute or differences between the owners as to their respective rights under the Scheme and any matter which by the terms of this Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department.

#### Powers and Authorities of Council.

36. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To enter into agreements with any Department of the State with reference to the carrying out of any of the objects or works of the Scheme.
- (e) If any owner of land within the Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the terms of the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area the Council may resume or purchase the land of such owner or owners or any part or parts thereof and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (f) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under Clause (e) it shall have all the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land; and if the owner shall not have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption the Council before selling the

land so subdivided and developed shall offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision or development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance if any of such money may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

- (g) If the offer mentioned in Clause (f) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (h) To resume any land within the Scheme Area for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes.
- (i) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under Clause (e) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (j) Extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.
- (k) To transfer any land owned by it or acquired by it pursuant to the Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.

37. Twenty-eight (28) days' written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to Section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such court of civil jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

38. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by Section 13 of the Act.

#### Claims for Compensation.

39. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme may be made within six months of the Scheme coming into operation.

#### L.G. 336/74.

IN pursuance to the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all the powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the twenty seventh day of May, 1974 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws the term "Footpath" means and includes that portion of the surveyed road which is between the kerb or edge of the portion of the road paved for the use of vehicular traffic and the boundary of the surveyed road and the term "vehicle" shall include tractor, trailer, bulldozer or any other mobile machine.

2. No person shall drive any vehicle over or across a footpath except at a specially constructed crossing place, unless with the permission of the Council and in accordance with these by-laws.

3. No person shall drive a vehicle or permit a vehicle to be driven across a footpath or across a road kerb if such vehicle is so heavy or is of such nature that it causes or is likely to cause damage to the paving of the footpath or the road kerb unless with the permission of the Council and in accordance with these by-laws.

4. No person shall engage in building or other operations or works on any land or contract or arrange with any person to carry out any works or to deliver materials on to any land if by so doing a vehicle will cross the road kerb or the paving of a footpath and it is likely that damage to the road kerb or the footpath will be caused thereby unless permission of the Council is given in accordance with these by-laws.

5. Any person who-

- (a) desires to cross a footpath with a vehicle at a place not a specially constructed crossing place, or
- (b) proposes to carry out building or other operations or works necessitating the crossing of the road kerb or a footpath with vehicles which are likely to cause damage to the road kerb or to the paving of the footpath whether at a specially constructed crossing place or not;

shall make application in writing to the Council for its permission so to do specifying the place or places at which such crossing is to be made and with his application shall pay to the Council a sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00), or such lesser sum as shall be specified by the Building Surveyor at the time of issue of a Building License, provided however that the maximum deposit payable by any one person for any number of crossovers shall not exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

6. A person who carries out any building or other operations or works necessitating the crossing of a footpath with vehicles which cause or are likely to cause damage to the paving of a footpath shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) If a paved portion of the footpath shall be constructed of concrete slabs he shall carefully remove them from the footpath for a width of 5 metres at the proposed crossing and neatly stack them on the adjoining land.
- (b) He shall place in the position from which the slabs have been removed a temporary crossing of 5 metres wide and of a length equal to the width of the paved portion of the footpath. The temporary crossing shall be constructed of hardwood planks of at least 200 mm by 50 mm in section. The planks shall be securely nailed together with hoop iron straps at 1 metre centres. The said planking shall be firmly bedded and laid true to the level of the original footpath.
- (c) When the necessity no longer exists for such temporary crossing or when called upon to do so by notice in writing from the Council, he shall remove the planking, replace the slabs in a proper workmanlike manner to original level and line and shall replace with new slabs of equal quality and size any slabs which have been lost, damaged or broken.
- (d) In the case of a footpath, constructed in total, or part of bitumen surfaced gravel, gravel, limestone or crushed metal, he shall place in position where the crossing is to be made a temporary crossing 5 metres wide and of a length equal to the width of the paved portion of the footpath. The temporary crossing shall be constructed of hardwood planks of at least 200 mm by 50 mm in section of which the ends shall be chamfered downwards to the existing footpath surface, securely nailed together with hoop iron straps at 1 metre centres. The said planking shall be firmly bedded and laid true.
- (e) When the necessity no longer exists for such temporary crossing or when called upon to do so by notice in writing from the Council he shall remove the planking and clean off the footpath immediately reparing any damage which has resulted.
- (f) He shall until it shall have been removed, keep the temporary crossing in good repair and in such a condition as not to create any danger or obstruction to pedestrians.

(1) If an application is made for permission to cross a road kerb the 7. Town Engineer shall have the road kerb removed at the place indicated in the application or if he does not approve the place indicated then at a place approved by him.

(2) Alternatively the applicant shall provide hardwood kerb jumper blocks and kerb back boards at the approved location in the following manner:-

- (a) Kerb jumper blocks shall be constructed of 150 mm by 150 mm hardwood, cut diagonally in half with 25 mm chamfer on each leading edge. These blocks are to be placed hard up against the kerb face in the road channel and be of sufficient length to provide a 5.5 metres length of temporary kerb crossing.
- (b) Kerb back boards shall be constructed of hardwood planks of at least 200 mm by 50 mm section of sufficient length to provide support behind the kerb for a length of 5.5 metres by 0.6 metres width. The said planks shall be securely nailed together with hoop iron straps at 1 metre centres.

The kerb boards are to be firmly bedded and laid true to the line and level of the kerb top.

- (c) The kerb jumper blocks and kerb back boards shall be kept in place and maintained in good order during the entire time the temporary kerb crossing place is required, and removed only when the necessity for this temporary kerb crossing place no longer exists.
- (d) After removal of the temporary kerb crossing place, the applicant shall reinstate the verge in the area of activity by levelling and grading to tie in with the path (if any) and the top of the kerb, generally leaving the area in a neat and tidy state.

(3) At the conclusion of the said building or other operations or works the Town Engineer shall have the road kerb replaced.

(4) The costs of the removal and replacement and in the case of damage the cost of repair thereof, shall be paid from the said sum deposited and subject to by-law 10, the balance thereof shall be repaid to the person who made the payment.

8. Any person who desires to trench through or under a constructed footpath or a road kerb shall apply in writing to the Council and lodge with the Council a deposit of eighty dollars (\$80.00).

No person shall trench through or under a footpath or a road kerb without first obtaining the written consent of the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the written consent of the Council.

10. The person mentioned in by-laws 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 hereof shall make good all damage caused to the footpath and the road kerbing, guttering and paved road during the whole of the time the works are in progress. If any damage shall have occurred and shall not have been made good the Council is authorised to make good such damage and deduct the cost from the sum of money paid to the Council in accordance with these by-laws. If the costs exceed the amount paid or the balance thereof the applicant or other person aforesaid shall pay to the Council on demand the amount by which the cost exceeds the balance of the amount paid. If no damage has been caused or if the damage has been made good the Council shall repay the sum paid or the portion remaining after the costs incurred by the Council have been paid.

11. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall be liable to:---

(a) A maximum penalty of \$100.00.

(b) A maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$10.00 per day.

L.G. 169/74.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 3rd day of May, 1974, to adopt such of the Draft Model By-laws published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1962 and amended in the Government Gazette of the 8th February, 1965 as are here set out with the following alterations:—

#### Draft Model By-Laws (Extractive Industries) No. 9.

#### Alterations.

1. Delete the by-law number and phrase "3. A person shall not" in line one of by-law 3 and insert in lieu thereof "3. (1) Subject to sub-bylaw (2) of this by-law a person shall not,".

2. After the word "Council" being last word of by-law 3 insert new sub-bylaws as follows:—

(2) a licence mentioned in sub-by law (1) of this by-law is not required where the proposed creation, or enlargement, of an excavation is:—

- (a) (i) for the recovery of stone, gravel, sands, clay, limestone, loam or other material for the use on the property by the owner or occupier of the property and not for disposal or sale outside the property; and
  - (ii) not less than 50 metres distant from any boundary of the property or from any public road; or
- (b) (i) except where the operation is on a commercial basis, for the recovery of any such materials for the purpose of road construction or maintenance;
  - (ii) of a volume not greater than 3000 cubic metres inclusive of all adjacent excavations which have not been rehabilitated; and
  - (iii) not less than 50 metres distant from any boundary of the property or from any public road; or
- (c) (i) for agricultural purposes on agricultural land; and
  - (ii) not less than 50 metres distant from any boundary of the property or from any public road.

(3) Where, by paragraphs (a) and (b) of sub-bylaw (2) of this by-law a licence is not required, irrespective of the manner of its ceasing, on the cessation of any excavation work, the Council may require the owner or occupier to ensure that:—

- (a) the excavation is filled or rehabilitated to the satisfaction of the Council;
- (b) any face permitted to remain in the excavation is left safe with all loose material removed therefrom; and
- (c) the floor level is graded to an even surface and the sides sloped to an even batter sufficient to prevent subsidence of the surrounding area.
