Regulations.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the regulations made under the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st July, 1922 and as amended from time to time thereafter and reprinted as so amended in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th March, 1971, and as amended from time to time thereafter, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Regulation 20A added. 2. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 20 under the heading "REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS, QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANTS, AND THE GRANTING OF CERTIFICATES TO ENGINE DRIVERS, CRANE AND HOIST DRIVERS, AND BOILER ATTENDANTS." a regulation as follows:—

20A. (1) The Board may issue a First Class Engine Driver's Certificate for use by trainee unit controllers and unit controllers in respect of boilers and stationary steam engines and turbines situated on any premises of or under the control of the State Electricity Commission of Western Australia constituted under the State Electricity Commission Act, 1945.

(2) A person is not eligible to apply for a certificate referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation unless he has—

- (a) attained the age of twenty-one years; and
- (b) served an apprenticeship in an engineering trade acceptable to the Board; or
- (c) satisfied the Board that he possesses professional or technical qualifications relevant to the duties of a First Class Engine Driver.

(3) If the Board is satisfied that an applicant for a certificate referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation—

- (a) complies with the requirements of subregulation (2) of this regulation;
- (b) has a respectable character;
- (c) is able to read and write the English language and is conversant with the elementary rules of arithmetic;
- (d) has for a period of 1050 hours, at a rate of not less than 12 hours per week and not more than 40 hours per week, received tuition and experience in the operation and construction of boilers and steam engines and turbines used by the State Electricity Commission of Western Australia; and
- (e) has passed an examination set by the Board for the purposes of this certificate,

it may issue the certificate to the applicant.

(4) Under the examination referred to in paragraph (e) of subregulation (3) of this regulation, an applicant shall be required to show that he is conversant with the working parts of various stationary steam engines including turbines, condensers, pumps and boilers in general use in power stations under the control of the State Electricity Commission of Western Australia and their different parts and uses, including the feeding of boilers, running of engines and the detection of defects and the action necessary to be taken in the ordinary emergencies that may arise in the operation and management of the machines and equipment referred to in this subregulation.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1972.

Metropolitan Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 819088/74.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1972 it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the

Governor, have power to construct provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works, and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to

undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

City of Melville.

460 mm and 305 mm Distribution Mains, Rogerson Road and Coomooora Road, Booragoon.

The construction of—

- (a) A four hundred and sixty millimetre diameter water main about three hundred and forty-five metres in length.
- (b) A three hundred and five millimetre diameter water main about nine hundred and fifty metres in length.

The above works to be complete with valves and all other necessary apparatus, and shown on plan M.W.B. 12807.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 11th day of October, 1974.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1973.

Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965.

I, ATHOL LOGAN MOORE WEDD, Commissioner of Police, acting pursuant to Regulation 1101 (4) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations, 1965, do hereby rescind the order published in the *Government Gazette* of January 4th, 1974, and give the following general direction:—

Movement of Agricultural Implements.

1. The movement of overwidth agricultural implements on roads is authorised subject to their being towed by licensed vehicles and to the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) The movement may be made by virtue of this direction, alone:—
 - (i) where the combined length of the towing vehicle and the implement being towed does not exceed 16.8 metres;
 - (ii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3 metres, if a warning flag is affixed at each lateral extremity of the implement; or
 - (iii) where the width of a towed implement exceeds 3 metres, but not 4.9 metres, if a warning flag is affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement and a warning sign, indicating that the tow is overwidth, is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement.
- (b) The movement may be made by virtue of a permit which a member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector is hereby authorised to issue, where the width of a towed implement exceeds 4.9 metres but not 6.7 metres if—
 - (i) in the case of an overwidth implement warning flags are affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement;

- (ii) the movement is preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that an overwidth vehicle follows it and the movement is followed by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign indicating that such a vehicle is ahead of it, unless the issuing authority, having regard to the topography of the area and environment in which the tow is to operate or any other factors likely to affect the safe movement of the tow, dispenses with the requirement of a following pilot vehicle;

- (iii) a warning sign indicating that the tow is overwidth is affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and to the rear of the implement; and

- (iv) the permit is carried on the towing vehicle.

- (c) Overwidth signs are to be covered or removed on the completion of the movement.

- (d) A movement is not to be made during the hours of darkness and a tow is not to be parked on the made portion of a road.

- (e) Where the tow comprises an overwidth implement the movement is not to be made at a speed exceeding 20 m.p.h.

- (f) Where the tow comprises an implement exceeding 3 metres in width, the movement is not to be made within 25 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, without the approval in writing of the Commissioner of Police.

2. The movement of agricultural implements exceeding 6.7 metres in width may not be made without my specific authority.

3. A permit may be issued in respect of a single movement or in respect of a number of movements, within a period not exceeding twelve months.

4. In this Direction:—

- (a) "warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square;
- (b) "warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "Overwidth" in black lettering 200 millimetres in height on a yellow background.

5. A limitation imposed by this direction does not affect the power of a member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector to impose additional limitations relating to time, place or circumstance.



By-Laws Relating to Dogs.

L.G. 96/59.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts
and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned
Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 23rd day of April, 1974, to
make and submit for confirmation by the Governor of the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

1. In these by-laws the term 'Council' shall mean the Harvey Shire Council.
2. All previous by-laws relating to dogs are hereby revoked.

Part 1—Impounding of Dogs.

3. The Council may establish a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903 (as amended).
4. A dog seized by the Police or by an officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.
5. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Council, shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
6. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then, upon payment of the fees specified in the fourth schedule hereto together with the prescribed licence fee relating to that dog, the dog shall be released to such person.
7. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
8. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
9. If a dog should not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized, or if the dog having collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner, the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council, may sell such dog.
10. Upon the sale of a dog, the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.

11. If within the times mentioned in by-law 9 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog, the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid, and the said fees paid, and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.

12. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903, (as amended), any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Clerk of the Council if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.

13. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the fourth schedule hereto.

14. No person shall—

- (a) Unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from the pound;
- (b) Destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
- (c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

Any person who shall commit a breach of this clause, shall upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty dollars (\$40).

15. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee or the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903 (as amended) or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

16. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of these by-laws.

17. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of by-laws 3-17 (both inclusive) of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10), provided that for a breach of clause 14 the penalty shall not exceed forty dollars (\$40).

Part II—Regulation of Dog Kennels.

18. Where the owner or occupier of any premises keeps or permits or suffers to be kept, more than two dogs over age of 3 months on the premises at any one time, the Council may declare such premises to be premises to which the provision of this part of these by-laws apply and on premises so declared, dogs shall be kept in an approved kennel or kennels and registered with the Council as hereinafter provided.

19. These by-laws shall also be applicable in all situations where dogs are kept for breeding purposes and or for reward anywhere within the Shire of Harvey.

20. The occupier of any premises whereon more than two dogs are kept or permitted or suffered to remain and such premises have been declared by the Council pursuant to the preceding by-laws shall provide a kennel or kennels which shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 10 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 25 metres from any road or street to which the premises has its main frontage. In the case of a corner allotment, no part of any kennel or yard shall be at any less distance than 8 metres from the side boundary to which the premises has its secondary frontage.
- (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 10 metres from any dwelling, church, school-room, hall, factory, dairy or premises whatsoever wherein food is manufactured, packed, stored or prepared for human consumption.
- (e) The walls shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone, or timber frame lined on both sides with either asbestos or galvanised iron.
- (f) The roof shall be constructed of an approved impervious material.
- (g) All external surfaces of a kennel shall be painted with good quality paint and be repainted when directed by an officer of the Council.
- (h) The lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor.
- (i) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 2 metres in height constructed of link mesh or netting, galvanised iron or timber.
- (j) Gates shall be provided and be fitted with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (k) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 10 centimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface having a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.

- (l) At least 2.5 square metres of the floor of any yard adjacent to the kennel floor shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of the kennel.
- (m) For each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 2.5 square metres.
- (n) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.
- (o) Reticulated water must be available at the kennel via a properly supported stand pipe and hose cock, for the hosing down of the kennel and the floored yard.

21. The occupier of any premises shall maintain any area of those premises frequented or occupied by a dog or dogs in a clean condition. Refuse, dog faeces and food wastes must be disposed of daily in an approved manner. Odours, fleas, flies and other vermin must be effectively controlled.

22. The occupier of any premises which have been declared by the Council shall not allow, permit or suffer any dog to be at large or roam outside the kennel or yard.

23. An application for approval of the Council, to permit an occupier of any premises where more than two (2) dogs are kept or permitted or suffered to remain, shall be made in the Form No. 1, set out in the first Schedule hereto and shall be submitted with two (2) copies of plan, showing the specifications of the kennels and yards appurtenant thereto, with relationship of the kennels and yards to the boundaries of the lot or lots and all buildings on the land the subject of the application and other land contiguous thereto and other information as Council may require.

24. No kennel shall be erected for the breeding or keeping of dogs unless and until plans, specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.

25. Council may not approve or register a kennel until the occupier of the premises has advertised in a public newspaper his intention to establish a kennel upon the premises and Council has considered any objections raised to the maintenance of the kennel upon the premises.

Approved kennels shall be registered by the Council on receipt of the fee prescribed in the Fourth Schedule and shall be subject to annual review before renewal.

26. On approval of the Council to permit an occupier to keep, permit or suffer to remain more than two dogs, the approved kennel shall be registered by the Council and be subject to an annual registration fee, as set out in the fourth schedule, falling due on the first day of July in each year.

Form No. 2 of the second Schedule shall be completed and sent to the applicant. Before renewal of the registration of any dog kennel, such premises may be inspected by an officer authorised by the Council and if the premises are not kept to the standard specified the Council may not renew the registration.

27. In the event of a person not renewing the kennel registration on the date set out in by-law 26 of these by-laws, or the Council refusing to renew the registration if the kennels are not kept to the standard specified, the said kennels shall be demolished to the satisfaction of Council.

28. Subject to the Act the Council may in its absolute discretion grant or refuse a license for the erection and establishment of a dog kennel.

29. The Council may at its discretion resolve to vary the provisions of these by-laws should it consider circumstances justify a variation.

30. Any person who shall commit a breach of by-laws 18 to 29 (both inclusive) of these by-laws, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and in addition to a daily penalty of \$4.00 per day during the period for which the offence continues.

Part III—General.

31. No person shall permit a dog to wander at large and shall keep such dog chained or under effective control at all times.

32. Except for a dog used for guiding a blind person, the owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre or picture gardens.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) A shop or other public business premises.

33. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sportsground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (c) A carpark.
- (d) A school.
- (e) The Brunswick Junction shopping centre being that portion of Omania Road between Clifton Road and South-East corner of Brunswick Town, Lot 123.

- (f) The Yarloop Shopping centre being that portion of Station Street between Johnston Road and Wickham Street.
- (g) The Harvey shopping centre being—
 - (i) That portion of Uduc Road between Harper Street and Young Street.
 - (ii) That portion of Hayward Street between Gibbs Street and Uduc Road.
 - (iii) That portion of Harper Street between Harvey Street and Uduc Road.
- (h) Beaches being more specifically—
 - (i) That portion of Myalup Beach within 200 metres north and 200 metres south of Myalup road (Road No. 9768).
 - (ii) That portion of Binningup Beach within 200 metres north and 200 metres south of Coronation Drive, Binningup Townsite.
- (i) Any land vested or under the control of the Council other than a road.

34. The occupier of any premises where a dog is kept or permitted or suffered to remain, shall not allow such dog, by barking or habits, to be nuisance to any inhabitant in the neighbourhood.

35. In order to combat the threat of hydatid disease in humans, the occupier of any premises where a dog is kept or suffered to remain shall take the following precautions to break the life cycle of parasitic tapeworms liable to infect the dogs intestines:—

- (a) Regularly does each dog at approximately six weekly intervals with a recognised dewormer.
- (b) Do not feed dogs raw meat or offal that has not been previously inspected for larval tapeworm cysts by a competent person.

36. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of by-laws 31 to 36 (both inclusive) of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10).

37. Dogs used in the droving, tending or in the management of livestock under the control of the owner, or employee, shall not be deemed to come within the provisions of by-laws 33 (i) of this part or of Part 11 of these by-laws.

Where the owner or occupier does not remove the refuse, rubbish, or disused material as required by the notice given by the Council, the Council may, without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, remove it and dispose of it at the expense of, and recover in a court of competent jurisdiction the amount of the expense from, the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

4. Any person who fails to comply with any notice served under this by-law commits an offence against these by-laws and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.
