OR

Achievement Certificate or approved equivalent in six subjects including English, a Mathematics unit, and one subject out of Art, Technical Drawing Applied, Drafting or Technical Drawing.

Applicants over 21 years must have at least two years' drawing office experience.

(d) Must be a qualified radio or telephone mechanic and have served as an apprentice, or carried out an approved course of training in the relevant industry.

Possess an 'A' or 'B' Grade Electrical Worker's Licence as issued by the Electrical Workers' Board of Western Australia and a current Motor Vehicle Driver's Licence.

(e) Leaving Certificate preferred. Preference will be given to applicants with an engineering survey background and survey drafting experience.

(f) LOCATION: Must be prepared to reside in any part of the State as and when required by the Department.

(l) Completion or near completion of the first year of the Diploma in Engineering Surveying or approved equivalent academic qualification or six years' relevant experience.

(n) Appropriate degree from recognised University, or equivalent, and experience in a relevant field.

(o) Junior Certificate including English, Mathematics and Science subjects or approved equivalent. Preference for Leaving Certificate with science subjects or progress towards an Associateship Course in Metallurgy. Consideration given to those with laboratory experience but with lesser qualifications.

(p) Experience in the control of stores with emphasis on technical stores. Ability to supervise staff essential.
