The construction of a 1050 millimetre and a 750 millimetre diameter plastic lined reinforced concrete pipe sewer together with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith and shown on Plan No. 12781.

(a) Not less than 1.8 metres in width inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoy common boundary with a formed public road.

(b) Not less than 3 metres in width immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks, with a further break 1.8 metres in width within 20 metres of the perimeter of haystacks.

(c) Not less than 1.8 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.

(d) On all cleared land not less than 1.8 metres in width within 20 metres of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

Townsites.

(a) Lots used for grazing purposes or in agricultural pursuits:—

(i) Not less than 1.8 metres in width inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoy a common boundary with a formed public road.

(ii) Not less than 3 metres in width immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks, with a further break of 1.8 metres in width within 20 metres of the perimeter of haystacks.

(iii) Not less than 1.8 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.

(iv) On all cleared land not less than 1.8 metres in width within one chain of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

(b) All other lots. Effective fire breaks around the perimeter of all buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land cleared of all inflammable materials to a width of at least 1 metre or where the boundary is closer than 1 metre than for that lesser distance.

(c) All townsite lots. To be cleared of all inflammable materials and rubbish on or before the 30th day of November, 1974 and kept clear of such material until the 13th day of March, 1975.

(d) Pine Plantations. A fire break not less than 10 metres wide and clear of all inflammable material is to be provided around the outside boundaries of pine plantations, including directing road reserves and that no plantation be greater than 28 hectares in area without an internal fire break, cleared of inflammable material, of not less than 6 metres in width.

Provided that if, for any reason, it is impracticable to clear fire breaks in the situation required by this notice, any suitable alternative to the foregoing inside or outside the property may be nominated or approved by either the Bush Fire Control Officer or Captain of the Bush Fire Brigade in the area concerned, and notified in writing by 1st November, 1974, by the occupier to the Shire Council after being countersigned by the Fire Control Officer.



By-laws relating to Shark Bay Public Cemetery (Reserve 8886).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all of the powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the sixth day of April, 1974, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws, subject to the context—

"Act" means the Cemeteries Act, 1897, and all amendments thereto.

"Cemetery" means the Shark Bay Cemetery, Reserve 8886.

"Secretary" means the Clerk of the Council of the Shire of Shark Bay.

"Trustees" means the Shark Bay Shire Council.

2. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule "A" shall be paid at the times and in the manner therein mentioned unless otherwise ordered.

3. Subject to the directions of the Trustees, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and have been the direction of the Trustees.

4. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land compartments, sections, situation and number of graves, and a register of all Grants of Rights of Burial shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.

5. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in the Schedule "B" and upon payment of the appropriate fees, the Trustees may issue a form of Order of Burial, in accordance with Schedule "C".

6. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least twenty-four hours notice being given to the Secretary at the office prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

7. The hours for burial shall be as follows: Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, Sunday from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. and no burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees. No burial shall take place on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

8. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of \$2.00.

9. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery or stand opposite the entrance gates.

10. (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this by-law, a person shall not bring a dead body into the Cemetery unless he, or his representative has first handed to the Secretary for inspection and return a medical certificate of death or a Coroner's order for burial in respect of the body.

(ii) Where an undertaker or his representative, for a valid reason, is unable to produce a medical certificate or Coroner's order for burial, as required by paragraph (i) of this by-law and he has given to the Secretary a written guarantee to produce the certificate or order within three days, he may bring the body into the Cemetery.

(iii) A burial shall not be permitted in the Cemetery unless the provisions of one of the foregoing paragraphs of this by-law have been complied with.

(iv) Where a representative or the undertaker himself has given written guarantee as required by paragraph (ii) of this by-law and he has failed to produce the certificate or order within three days the undertaker's license may be suspended until the certificate or order is produced.

11. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application in the form of Assignment of Right of Burial, Schedule "E".

12. No grave shall be permitted to be re-opened for the reception of a body within three years from the preceding burial in the case of persons aged 10 years or upwards, within two years between the ages of 5 and 10 years, or within one and a half years for younger children, except by special permission of the Trustees unless provision is made in the first instance by sinking the grave 30 centimetres deeper than prescribed in by-law seventeen of these by-laws for every contemplated interment. After the lapse of the several periods specified, coffins may be lifted to enable fresh interments to take place by sinking graves to the requisite depth.

13. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug but any person desiring to construct a brick or stone grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the direction of the Secretary, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining written approval of the Trustees thereto, and on payment of the required fee.

14. Every brick or stone grave or vault constructed under the provision of by-law 13 of these by-laws shall be made and kept water-tight and every coffin deposited in such a grave or vault shall be built in and covered with a substantial slab of stone, and be made and kept air-tight and water-tight and any space surrounding such coffin shall be filled in with charcoal, dry earth, or other suitable material.

15. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves, vaults and brick graves to be re-opened as and when required.

16. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased, stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. A coffin which does not comply with this by-law shall not be admitted to or be interred in the cemetery.

17. Every grave shall be at least 1.8 metres deep at the first interment, except those used for the burial of infants which the Trustees may allow to be a lesser depth, but no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 1 metre from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.

18. The approval of the Trustees must be obtained to permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment within the cemetery. Written application setting out the reasons for the proposed removal of such corpse, verified by a statutory declaration shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased.

19. The Trustees may permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in another cemetery upon written application supported by permission of the Governor in Council. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.

20. A grant of exclusive right of burial shall cover a period of 50 years from the date of issue. Any person requiring the exclusive right of burial in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing specifying the location of the grave. If it is proposed to inter therein the remains of any already deceased person, the name of such person must be shown in the application. If approved, the Trustees, on payment of the required fee shall issue to such person so applying, a Grant of Right of Burial in the form specified in Schedule "D".

21. Every such Grant of Right of Burial shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being in force, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the grant aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened unless with the consent of the Trustees.

22. Should the grantee be unable to produce the Grant of Right of Burial through having lost same, on making application for a grave to be re-opened for the purpose of interment, the said grantee shall make a declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such Grant of Right of Burial as prescribed in Schedule "A" before the interment takes place.

23. Any person desiring to place, erect, inscribe, alter or repair any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery shall, before obtaining permission to do so, submit a detailed description of such monument, tombstone, inscription or enclosure and specify the materials of which it is to be composed to the Trustees, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

24. Every person who shall place or erect any monument, tombstone or enclosure upon any grave the exclusive right of which has not been obtained, shall keep the same in repair and, if after one month's notice in writing from the Trustees such repairs are not executed, then the Trustees may order such monument, tombstone or enclosure to be removed.

25. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in any grave shall keep such grave and any erection or construction thereon in proper repair, and if after receiving notice in writing from the Trustees requiring such repairs to be executed shall fail to do so, then after the expiration of 28 days the Trustees may cause such repairs to be executed and may recover the costs thereof from such person in accordance with the Cemeteries Act, or cause such structure to be removed.

26. A notice sent by registered post to the address of any such owner or person last known to the Secretary shall be sufficient notice under these by-laws.

27. The placing or erection of any monument, tombstone or enclosure of an estimated value of \$20.00 or over will not be permitted until a Grant or Right of Burial shall first have been had and obtained.

28. Every monument, tombstone or enclosure shall be placed upon proper and substantial foundations, and if required by the Trustees, such foundations shall extend to the bottom of the grave. All refuse, rubbish or material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once by and at the expense of the person causing the same.

29. All materials required in the making, repairing or completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken into the cemetery and shall, be subject to the approval of the Secretary. Any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor concerned.

30. Monumental masons and other tradesmen may be required before commencing any work in the cemetery to deposit with the Secretary the sum of two dollars (\$2) which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding by-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

31. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules—

- (a) That no rubbish, soil, sand, or any other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any adjoining grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after completion of the work.
- (b) That no loam, soil or sand shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave.
- (c) That monumental masons, grave dressers, or grave decorators carrying out works for hire or reward shall not be permitted to carry on work in the cemetery during other than the hours of from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on week days, Saturdays and Sundays excepted, when no work is to be done from noon Saturday till 8 a.m. on the Monday morning without written permission of the Secretary.

32. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

33. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the Trustees find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc. from the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the Trustees the charges laid down in Schedule "A".

Notwithstanding this clause, the Trustees accept no liability for any damage to edging tiles, headstones, plants, etc., arising from the re-opening of any grave.

34. Notwithstanding anything contained in the by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

35. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees:—

(a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries received on active service; or

(b) that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances.

Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of the deceased person as approved by the Trustees shall be interred in the grave.

36. No child under the age of 14 years shall be admitted, (except by special permission), into the cemetery unless accompanied by a responsible person.

37. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery nor any explosive or firearms be discharged therein except by permission of the Trustees.

38. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery and any dog found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

39. Any person violating the rules of propriety or decorum, or committing a nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, plant or flower border, grave or any erection, or in any way infringing these by-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery and shall be liable to prosecution.

40. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers) or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustees or their representatives.

41. No person shall pluck any tree, shrub, plant or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

42. No person shall remove or carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, flower or shrub without the written authority of the Trustees or their representatives.

43. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise or by any other system of advertising whatsoever without the written consent of the Trustees and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

44. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault, except by special permission of the Trustees.

45. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Secretary.

46. No unauthorised motor vehicle, motor cycle or bicycle shall be taken within the Cemetery.

47. Every driver of a hearse, mourning coach or other vehicle and every pedestrian shall keep strictly to the roads and pathways as laid out for vehicles and pedestrians respectively, and vehicles shall only be turned at points where provision for so doing is made.

48. Vehicles shall not be permitted to proceed faster than 15 kilometres per hour within the Cemetery and shall proceed by such roads as directed by the Secretary. Any driver or any person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery.

49. All rubbish shall be placed in the receptacles provided in the Cemetery for that purpose.

50. The Secretary shall have power to cause to be removed from any burial allotment any unsightly ornaments such as broken glass, bottles, jars, tins, decayed and broken wreaths and dead flowers, and to prune, cut down, dig up and remove any shrubs or plants on any burial allotment when such in his opinion shall have become unsightly or overgrown.

51. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Secretary and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give and any workmen committing any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Secretary, shall be removed from the Cemetery.

52. No person employed by the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatsoever nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

53. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees a fee as prescribed in Schedule "A" and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a permit to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July next following and unless in the possession of such permit, no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery. The license and assent to conditions shall be in the form of Schedule "F".

54. Licenses to undertakers, monumental masons, grave dressers or grave decorators and licenses for various purposes not otherwise provided for may be issued by the Trustees.

55. All fees may be recovered, and all proceedings under these by-laws be treated in accordance with the Cemeteries Act, 1897 to 1966.

56. A person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws commits an offence and shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10) and any case of continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding two dollars (\$2) for every day during which such breach occurs.

57. Any person committing a breach of any by-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty under any by-laws, be liable to be forthwith removed from the Cemetery by the Trustees, or the Secretary, or other employees of the Trustees or by any police constable. If such person resists removal from the Cemetery, or if and as often as such person so removed shall unless with the consent of the Secretary again enter the Cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10).

 - (a) sell, for delivery within the airport, or supply, any goods or services;

 - (c) erect, display or distribute, or communicate by sound, any advertisement or public notice.

By-Laws relating to Control and Management of The Shire of Roebourne Swimming Centre.

L.G. 309/74.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 20th day of May, 1974, to submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-Laws—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—"Pool premises" means the swimming pools and all associated buildings and land provided for the purpose of swimming by the public and includes the land and improvements situated at Lot 1135 being Reserve No. 32112. (Karratha Townsite)—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Roebourne.

"Shire Clerk" means the Shire Clerk or acting Shire Clerk of the Shire of Roebourne.

"Pool Manager" means the Manager or other person appointed for the time being by the Council to have the control and management of the Pool premises and such term shall include the Assistant Manager.

"Attendant" means an employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connection with the Pool premises.

"Spectator" means any person admitted to the Pool premises for the sole purpose of viewing the swimming or other activities conducted therein.

"Swimming Coach" means any person licensed by the Council to enter the Pool premises for the purpose of teaching swimming.

"Kiosk Premises" means that part of the Pool premises which is the subject of a lease to the Kiosk Proprietor.

2. The Pool premises shall be open for use of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time by resolution appoint the Council reserving to itself the right to refuse admission to any person at any time. No person under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter or remain at the Pool premises unless that person is and continues to be under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years. No person shall leave a person under the age of six years at the Pool premises otherwise than under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years.

3. The Pool premises or any part thereof may at any time in the discretion of the Pool Manager be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

4. The Pool Manager may temporarily suspend admittance or clear the Pool premises or any part thereof of any person or persons if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

5. No person (save the officers or workmen or invitees of the Council) shall enter the Pool premises without having first paid the proper fee or charge hereinafter prescribed.

6. Every person using the Pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager with regard to such use.

7. No person shall in any way obstruct the Pool Manager in his control of the Pool premises and of persons therein.

8. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager (who is hereby so empowered and directed) to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager, is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-Law or who, by his past or present conduct, is deemed undesirable and any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager to withdraw from the Pool premises quietly and peaceably do so as soon as possible.

9. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool premises or who feels aggrieved by action of the Pool Manager may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk against such action and the Council may give such direction in the matter as is thought fit provided that such right of appeal shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Pool Manager or Council arising out of such refusal of admission.

10. No male above the age of four years shall trespass upon any part of the Pool premises set apart for the exclusive use of females and no female shall trespass upon any part of the Pool premises set apart for the exclusive use of males.

11. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing box that is already occupied without the consent of the occupier.

12. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume except in a dressing shed or enclosure provided for that purpose.

13. No person shall use any pool or appear in public unless properly attired in a costume so as to preserve public decency and shall so cover the body as to prevent indecent exposure of the person. Any person who in the opinion of the Pool Manager commits a breach of this clause may be required by the Pool Manager to resume ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with such requirement.

14. No person shall enter or be in the Pool premises while in an intoxicated condition.

15. No person shall take into the Pool premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor.

16. No person affected or appearing to the Pool Manager to be affected or suffering from any infectious, contagious or offensive disease or skin complaint shall enter or be in the Pool premises.

17. No person shall bring or deposit any filth or rubbish in or upon the Pool premises otherwise than in a receptacle provided for the purpose.

18. No person shall eat in or take into any part of the pools and associated buildings excepting the Kiosk premises and Club Room any food, drinks or confectionary of any kind whatsoever.

19. No person shall smoke tobacco or any other substance in or about a Pool or concourse or in any portion of the Pool premises where public notices direct that smoking is prohibited.

20. No person shall disfigure or write upon any part of the Pool premises.

21. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly or riotous manner, swear or use any indecent, obscene or abusive language or gamble in the Pool premises.

22. No person shall climb up or on any fence, wall, partition or roof of the Pool premises.

23. No person shall waste or wastefully use water in the Pool premises.

24. No person shall spit or expectorate in the Pool premises or commit any nuisance therein.

25. No person shall damage or interfere with or use improperly any part of the Pool premises or the furniture or fittings therein.

26. No person shall in any way annoy or interfere with any other person in the Pool premises.

27. Dogs shall not be allowed or permitted in or upon any part of the Pool premises and no person shall cause or permit any dog or other animal belonging to that person or under his control to enter or remain in or upon any part of the Pool premises.

28. The Pool Manager may prohibit any person approaching or entering or remaining in a pool who in his opinion is dirty or unfit to use such pool and the Pool Manager may require such person to thoroughly cleanse and wash himself in one of the showers.

29. (i) No person, club or association or organisation shall conduct a carnival at the Pool premises unless with the prior consent of the Council;

(ii) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent;

(iii) a person, club, association or organization conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool premises and that these By-Laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

(iv) The person, club, association or organization conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall pay to the Council such charges as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

(v) No person, club, association or organization shall, within the Pool premises, sell, have for sale or make available to the public any food, drink and such like without the written consent of the Council.

30. No person shall—

- (a) use soap in any part of the Pool premises other than in the shower baths or toilet facilities;
- (b) use any detergent or any substance oil or preparation whilst he is in any pool whereby the water therein may be discoloured or contaminated or rendered turbid or, in the opinion of the Pool Manager in any way unfit.
- (c) foul or pollute the water in any shower or pool;
- (d) bring into any part of the Pool premises or place thereon any chemical substance, liquid or powder;
- (e) wilfully soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume the property of the Council;
- (f) wilfully or negligently break, injure, damage, destroy or tamper with any equipment, locker, key or any other property of the Council.

Charges and Admission.

31. The sums to be paid for admission to the Pool premises and the use of the Pool and the requisites supplied therein may from time to time be determined and/or varied by resolution of the Council. Until otherwise determined or varied the sums to be paid shall be as follows:—

Persons 16 years of age and over	20 cents
Persons under 16 years of age	10 cents

32. Except with the express approval of Council a person shall not pay nor shall any Pool attendant or other Officer or servant of the Council receive any fee for admission to the pool premises, except upon such person being permitted to pass through a turnstile which upon inserting the coin appropriate to the fee automatically registers such admission.

Coaching.

33. (i) No person shall for profit teach, coach or train any other person in any pool unless with the prior written permission of the Council.

(ii) The Council may grant such permission subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such permission without being under any obligation to assign a reason for so doing and without being liable to pay compensation.

Depositing of Articles and Lost Property.

34. Any person wishing to hire a locker shall make application to the Kiosk Attendant.

35. Any person who hires a locker shall before leaving the Pool premises return to the Kiosk Attendant the key or token or tag relating to such locker.

36. Where a safe deposit receptacle is provided any person may after having entered the Pool premises deposit with the Kiosk Attendant any article for safe keeping therein, subject to the following terms and conditions and any person making any deposit shall be deemed to agree that such conditions shall be applicable thereto:—

- (i) If any article deposited be damaged, destroyed, lost or stolen neither the Council nor any officer, employee (including the Kiosk Proprietor and Attendants) or agent of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any such damage, destruction loss or theft, howsoever occurring.
- (ii) Upon production to the Kiosk Attendant of a receipt or token given in respect of any article deposited the article may be handed to the person producing the receipt or token without proof that such person is the person to whom such receipt or token was originally issued.
- (iii) If any article deposited is not reclaimed within three months from the date of the deposit the Council or some person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of the same and shall be under no liability either to the owner or depositor thereof by reason of such sale or disposal and may apply the proceeds of sale as the Council sees fit.

37. (i) There shall be kept by the Pool Manager or by an attendant a book (hereinafter referred to as the Lost Property Register).

(ii) Any person who finds any article which has been left in the Pool premises shall forthwith deliver it to the Pool Manager or an attendant.

(iii) Upon receipt of such article the Pool Manager or attendant shall forthwith take charge thereof and enter or cause to be entered in the lost Property Register a description of the article, the time and date of its receipt and the name of the finder.

(iv) In the interpretation of this clause the word "article" shall include money.

38. The Pool Manager shall, as and when directed, report to the Shire Clerk regarding all money and articles found in the Pool premises and handed to him and whether any such have been claimed and returned to the owners thereof, at the same time he shall hand to the Shire Clerk any money or articles unclaimed.

39. Neither the Council nor any officer or employee of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in on or about the Pool premises.

40. No ticket, licence or receipt issued as provided by this By-Law shall be transferable and no person other than the person to whom it was originally issued shall enjoy any benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

41. Any person committing a breach of or an offence against any of the provisions of this By-Law shall for every such breach or offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

MOTOR VEHICLE DEALERS ACT, 1973.

(Section 34.)

NOTICE.
