WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1964, that the Governor may, from time to time on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to that Act, by proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State by any person; and whereas such types of bread as are respectively specified in the Schedule to this proclamation are included in the definition of wheat products: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby fix as the respective maximum prices at which those types of bread may be sold by any person in that part of the State, excluding Rottnest Island, and that is within a radius of twenty-eight miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the maximum prices respectively set out opposite those types of bread in the Schedule to this proclamation.

450 gram (1 lb) Protein Increased Loaves unwrapped	29 cents
450 gram (1 lb) Protein Increased Loaves sliced and wrapped or wrapped	32 cents
900 gram (2 lb) Ordinary Loaves sliced and wrapped or wrapped	37 cents
450 gram (1 lb) Ordinary Loaves sliced and wrapped or wrapped	20 cents

The wrapping referred to is wrapping of polythene, cellophane or waxed paper and which is done at the point of manufacture. It is an implicit provision in the maximum price abovementioned that where two 450 gram ordinary loaves of bread are sold at the same time to the same person, the price shall not exceed the price of one 900 gram ordinary loaf.

SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1974.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1974, and all other powers hereunto enabling, a majority of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia hereby make the following rules.

AMENDMENT OF THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT, 1971.

- Principal rules. 1. In these rules the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1971, published in the *Government Gazette* on 18th November, 1971, as amended from time to time* are referred to as the principal rules.
- Commencement. 2. These rules shall come into operation on the day on which the Supreme Court Act Amendment Act, 1974, comes into operation.
- O. 6, R. 8 amended. (Where plaintiff sues in person.) 3. Order 6 Rule 8 of the principal rules is amended by substituting for the words, "two miles" in line 4, the words, "three kilometres".

(1) Where the writ is indorsed with a claim against a defendant for possession of land only, then if that defendant fails to enter an appearance within the time limited, the plaintiff may, on producing a certificate from his solicitor, or, if he sues in person an affidavit, stating that he is not claiming any relief in the action of the nature specified in Order 62A Rule 1, enter judgment for possession of the land against that defendant and the costs, and proceed in the action against the other defendants if any.

Order 22 Rule 5 of the principal rules is amended by adding after the passage, "may," in line 3, the passage, "on producing a certificate from his solicitor, or, if he sues in person an affidavit, stating that he is not claiming any relief in the action of the nature specified in Order 62A Rule 1".

3A (1) Subject to the provisions of the Act and of these rules, a judgment or order for the giving of possession of land may be enforced by one or more of the following means, that is to say—

- (a) writ of possession;
- (b) writ of sequestration;
- (c) writ of attachment or order of committal;
- (d) writ of restitution.

(2) A writ of possession to enforce a judgment or order for the giving of possession of any land shall not be issued without the leave of the Court except where the judgment or order was made or given in a mortgage action to which Order 62A applies.

(3) Leave shall not be granted under paragraph (2) unless it is shown that every person in actual possession of the whole or any part of the land has received such notice of the proceedings as appears to the Court sufficient to enable him to apply to the Court for any relief to which he may be entitled.

(4) A writ of possession may include provision for enforcing the payment of any money adjudged or ordered to be paid by the judgment or order which is to be enforced by the writ.

(5) A writ of possession and a writ of restitution may be executed in the same manner as heretofore.

Mortgage Actions.

1. (1) This Order applies to any proceedings (whether begun by writ or originating summons) by a mortgagee or mortgagor or by any person having the right to foreclose or redeem any

mortgage, being proceedings in which there is a claim for relief of any of the following kinds, namely—

- (a) payment of moneys secured by the mortgage;
- (b) sale of the mortgaged property;
- (c) foreclosure;
- (d) delivery of possession (whether before or after foreclosure or without foreclosure) to the mortgagee by the mortgagor or by any other person who is or is alleged to be in possession of the property;
- (e) redemption;
- (f) reconveyance of the property or its release from the security; or
- (g) delivery of possession by the mortgagee.

(2) In this Order “mortgage” includes a legal and an equitable mortgage and a legal and an equitable charge, and references to a mortgagor, a mortgagee and mortgaged property shall be construed accordingly.

(3) In this Order “mortgage” and “charge” also include mortgages and charges registered under the provisions of the Transfer of Land Act, 1893; but nothing in the Order extends or affects the powers of sale or foreclosure conferred by Division 3 of Part IV of that Act, and proceedings claiming possession of land pursuant to such a mortgage or charge shall be commenced by writ of summons and not otherwise.

(4) Proceedings to which this Order applies are referred to in this Order as a mortgage action.

(5) These rules apply to mortgage actions subject to the following provisions by this Order.

2. (1) Where in a mortgage action begun by originating summons, being an action in which the plaintiff is the mortgagee and claims delivery of possession or payment of moneys secured by the mortgage or both, any defendant fails to enter an appearance the following provisions of this rule shall apply, and references in those provisions to the defendant shall be construed as references to any such defendant.

(2) This rule does not affect Rule 20 or Rule 28(2) of Order 58 in so far as either of those rules require any document to be served on, or notice given to, a defendant who has entered an appearance in the action.

(3) Not less than four clear days before the day fixed for the first hearing of the originating summons the plaintiff must serve on the defendant a copy of the notice of appointment for the hearing and a copy of the affidavit in support of the summons.

(4) Where the plaintiff claims delivery of possession there must be indorsed on the outside fold of the copy of the affidavit served on the defendant a notice informing the defendant that the plaintiff intends at the hearing to apply for an order to the defendant to deliver up to the plaintiff possession of the mortgaged property and for such other relief (if any) claimed by the originating summons as the plaintiff intends to apply for at the hearing.

(5) Where the hearing is adjourned, then, subject to any directions given by the Court, the plaintiff must serve notice of the appointment for the adjourned hearing, together with a copy of any further affidavit intended to be used at that hearing, on the defendant not less than two clear days before the day fixed for the hearing.

(6) A copy of any affidavit served under paragraph (5) must be indorsed in accordance with paragraph (4).

(7) Service under paragraph (3) or (5) and the manner in which it was effected, may be proved by a certificate signed by the plaintiff, if he sues in person, and otherwise by his solicitor.

(8) A certificate of the kind mentioned in paragraph (7) may be indorsed on the affidavit in support of the summons or, as the case may be, on any further affidavit intended to be used at an adjourned hearing.

(9) A copy of any exhibit to an affidavit need not accompany the copy of the affidavit served under paragraph (3) or (5).

(10) Where the plaintiff gives notice to the defendant under Order 3, Rule 7 of his intention to proceed, service of the notice, and the manner in which it was effected, may be proved by a certificate signed as mentioned in paragraphs (7) and (8).

Evidence in support of originating summons for possession or payment.

3. (1) This rule applies to a mortgage action begun by originating summons in which the plaintiff is the mortgagee and claims delivery of possession or payment of moneys secured by the mortgage or both.

(2) The affidavit in support of the originating summons by which an action to which this rule applies is begun must comply with the following provisions of this rule.

(3) The affidavit must exhibit the original mortgage or a true copy of it.

(4) Where the plaintiff claims delivery of possession the affidavit must show the circumstances under which the right to possession arises and, except where the Court in any case or class otherwise directs, the state of the account between the mortgagor and mortgagee with particulars of—

- (a) the amount of the advance;
- (b) the amount of the repayments;

(c) the amount of any interest or instalments in arrear at the date of issue of the originating summons and at the date of the affidavit, and

(d) the amount remaining due under the mortgage.

(5) Where the plaintiff claims delivery of possession, the affidavit must give particulars of every person who to the best of the plaintiff's knowledge is in possession of the mortgaged property.

(6) If the mortgage creates a tenancy other than a tenancy at will between the mortgagor and the mortgagee, the affidavit must show how and when the tenancy was determined and if by service of notice when the notice was duly served.

(7) Where the plaintiff claims payment of moneys secured by the mortgage, the affidavit must prove that the money is due and payable and give the particulars mentioned in paragraph (4).

(8) Where the plaintiff's claim includes a claim for interest to judgment, the affidavit must state the amount of a day's interest.

Action by writ: judgment in default.

4. (1) Notwithstanding anything in Order 13 or Order 22, in a mortgage action begun by writ judgment in default of appearance or in default of defence shall not be entered except with the leave of the Court.

(2) An application for the grant of leave under this rule must be made by summons and the summons must, notwithstanding anything in Order 72 Rule 8, be served on the defendant.

(3) Where a summons for leave under this rule is issued, paragraphs (3) to (10) inclusive of Rule 2 shall apply in relation to the action subject to the modification that for references therein to the originating summons, and for the reference in paragraph (3) to the notice of appointment, there shall be substituted references to the summons.

(4) Where a summons for leave under this rule is issued in an action to which Rule 3 would apply had the action been begun by originating summons, the affidavit in support of the summons must contain the information required by that rule.

SCHEDULE.

POLICE FORCE CANTEEN REGULATIONS, 1974.

1. These regulations may be referred to as the Police Force Canteen Regulations, 1974.
2. The Police Force Canteen Regulations, 1959-1970, are hereby revoked.
3. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—
“Canteen” means the Police Force Canteen established pursuant to these regulations;
“Commissioner” means the Commissioner of Police or his authorised agent;
“Fund” means the Canteen Fund;
“Liquor” has the same meaning as it has in the Liquor Act, 1970;
“Manager” means the person or body appointed by the Commissioner to manage the affairs of the Canteen.
4. The Canteen shall be established on premises approved by the Commissioner.
5. There shall be a fund called the Canteen Fund which shall comprise the money from time to time held on behalf of the Canteen.
6. The Commissioner shall appoint the Manager on such terms and conditions as he shall think fit.
7. The Manager has the following powers—
 - (a) to manage the affairs of the Canteen generally, including the employment and dismissal of staff; and
 - (b) to control the Fund; and
 - (c) to appoint a person or persons to control the activities of the persons on the premises of the Canteen, to ensure accordance with these regulations.
8. The Manager is solely liable for the payment of all debts incurred with the authority and on behalf of the Canteen and is bound by these regulations.
9. The Manager shall cause to be kept true and regular accounts—
 - (a) of money received into the Fund; and
 - (b) of money expended from the Fund; and
 - (c) of the assets and liabilities of the Canteen.
10. The Manager shall cause the accounts to be balanced on the 31st day of March in each year.
11. The accounts shall be audited annually and a copy of the auditor's report shall be furnished to the Commissioner.
12. The profits of the Canteen shall be used for the purposes of the Western Australian Police Social Club (Inc.).
13. Liquor shall not be disposed of by the Canteen except by sale for cash.
14. Liquor sold by the Canteen shall only be sold to the persons mentioned in regulations 15 and 16.
15. The following persons are entitled to use the Canteen—
 - (a) members of the Police Force of Western Australia;
 - (b) members of other Police Forces; and
 - (c) such visitors or class of visitors as may be approved by the Commissioner from time to time.
16. The Honourable Minister for Police and members of the Police Force of Western Australia may be accompanied in the Canteen by guests, who may use the Canteen provided that the name and address of each guest has first been entered in a book maintained in the Canteen for that purpose, and that entry has been countersigned by the member with his name, rank and service number.

17. Minimum standards of dress may be notified by the Commissioner from time to time. Persons not dressed accordingly may not use the Canteen.

18. The Canteen comprises a Commissioned Officers' bar and a bar for Non-Commissioned Officers and Constables. Members of the Police Force shall only use the bar appropriate to their rank.

Provided that Commissioned Officers may visit the Non-Commissioned Officers' and Constables' bar if an invitation to do so has first been received through the Executive of the Western Australian Police Social Club (Inc.) and the visit has been approved by the Chief Superintendent of Police or, in his absence, by an officer of higher rank than the Chief Superintendent.

19. Liquor sold by the Canteen shall not—

- (a) be sold or delivered in kegs; or
- (b) be sold or delivered on Sundays; or
- (c) be sold or delivered other than during the hours during which the Canteen is open.

20. The Canteen may be open between the hours of 10.00 a.m. and 12.00 midnight, but not otherwise, and a person shall not enter or remain upon the Canteen premises at a time when the Canteen is closed except with lawful excuse.

21. The following persons shall not enter or remain upon the Canteen premises—

- (a) persons affected by liquor; and
- (b) persons under the age of 18 years (reference *Government Gazette*, page 3463/70); and
- (c) persons who have been barred from the Canteen by order of the Commissioner.

22. (1) Where the Commissioner for any reason decides that a person should be barred from the Canteen he shall notify that person of his decision in writing, stating that that person shall not enter upon the premises of the Canteen or ask for or obtain liquor therefrom.

(2) Notification of the Commissioner's decision shall be given to the Manager without delay and the Manager shall forthwith notify all persons appointed under paragraph (c) of regulation 7 of these regulations.

23. Persons on the premises of the Canteen shall not—

- (a) use any obscene, insulting or objectionable language; or
- (b) game or bet; or
- (c) behave in a disorderly, noisy or objectionable manner.

24. Every person on the premises of the Canteen is bound by these regulations.

25. (1) A person appointed under paragraph (c) of regulation 7 of these regulations is personally liable for breaches of these regulations occurring while he is in charge and control of the Canteen unless he takes reasonable measures to prevent or end the breach.

(2) The liability imposed by subregulation (1) of this regulation does not remove any liability imposed by these regulations upon the Manager.

26. Any person who commits a breach of these regulations has no right to remain on the Canteen premises and shall be asked to leave those premises by the Manager or a person appointed under paragraph (c) of regulation 7 of these regulations, and if that person, on being asked, fails or refuses to leave, the Manager or person so requesting him may have him removed from the premises.

27. A breach of these regulations by a member of the Western Australian Police Force renders the member liable to be dealt with in accordance with section twenty-three, twenty-four or twenty-five of the Police Act, 1892-1974.

(3) (a) (i) A teacher who applies for and accepts promotion or transfer to the position of headmaster of a school outside the metropolitan area is not entitled and shall not be permitted to transfer to a school of the same status, unless and until he has served for a minimum of two years in the school to which he has been promoted or transferred unless the Director-General otherwise decides.

(ii) A teacher who applies for and accepts promotion or transfer to the position of headmaster of a school outside the metropolitan area and who serves for not less than two years in that school is entitled, when applying for a transfer to a school of the same status in any area of his choice, to precedence over any person who has applied to be promoted to a school of the same status within the area chosen by that first mentioned person.
