WHEREAS it is provided by section 26 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1970, that where in the opinion of the Minister it is desirable that any plant or the refuse of a plant should be burnt during prohibited burning times in order to prevent or eradicate disease arising or likely to arise from the plant or refuse, the Governor, may, on the recommendation of the Minister, by proclamation authorise the burning of the plant or refuse of the plant during prohibited burning times or during any period of prohibited burning times and declare that such proclamation shall take effect either generally or in the particular district specified in the proclamation; and whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable that the plants or refuse thereof specified hereunder should be burnt during prohibited burning times in order to prevent or eradicate disease in the particular districts specified hereunder: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby authorise the burning, subject to the Regulations, of the undermentioned plants or refuse of the plants during the periods and in the particular districts set out in the Schedule hereto.

Metropolitan Main Drainage.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 487891/74.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1972, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act,

the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Fitzgerald Street Branch Drain, Perth.

Work comprises:—

- (1) The construction of a 900 millimetre diameter reinforced concrete piped drain.

Work to be complete with all apparatus and appurtenances connected therewith. The drain will be constructed across the Railway Reserve from Roe Street (near Fitzgerald Street) to join an existing drain in Wellington Street near Elder Street.

- (2) The takeover, by constituting as a Metropolitan Main Drain, that portion of the existing drain mentioned above, downstream of the new work proposed.

Total length of drain to be constructed and taken over is approximately 370 metres and is shown on Plan M.W.B. 12934.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 31st day of January, 1975.

(a) On the resolution of the Council to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954 and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these By-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by the resolution of the Council forming the Brigade shall be made to the Bush Fires Board for its registration accordingly.

(b) A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the Town or for any specified area thereof.

## Appointment of Officers.

2. The Council shall appoint a Captain, a First Lieutenant, a Second Lieutenant and such additional Lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as Officers of the Brigade and who, in the Council's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The Town Clerk or such other person as the Council may appoint, shall be the Secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Council may appoint an Equipment Officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the Brigade. Such Officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the Captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Council shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such Officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than Officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the Mayor and Town Clerk of the Council conjointly.

## Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all Officers appointed under these By-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954 and each Officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The Captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the Captain, the First Lieutenant; and in the absence of the First, the Second Lieutenant or Senior Officer of the Brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the powers and duties of the Captain.

## Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—

- (a) subscribing members;
- (b) fire fighting members; and
- (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

- (a) owner or occupier of land within the Brigade area—minimum subscription of \$1.00
- (b) other persons—minimum subscription of 50c.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied members of either sex over 15 years who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these By-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these By-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Council.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

## Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council, but the Town Clerk shall keep record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

## Meeting of Brigades.

9. Meetings will be held as necessary.

These By-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1954 were passed by a resolution of the Kalgoorlie Town Council (A Local Authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Kalgoorlie on the 18th day of November, 1974.

Ski Championships, and orders that bathing shall be prohibited.

Murray River: That portion of the Murray River commencing at a point 500 metres upstream of the Ravenswood Bridge and extending upstream to a point 300 metres downstream of Murray Bend. The extremities of the area will be marked by yellow buoys.

(2) Revokes sub paragraph 4 (p) (i) of the notice published in the *Government Gazette* pursuant to the powers conferred by the Navigable Waters Regulations on the 27th July, 1973 relating to speed limit areas and substitutes the following:—

All the waters of the Murray River with the exception of that portion commencing at a point 500 metres upstream of the Ravenswood Bridge and extending upstream to a point 300 metres downstream of Murray Bend. Provided that the revocation in respect of this portion of the Murray River shall apply only between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on Sunday 2nd February, 1975 and between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on Monday 3rd February, 1975. The 8 knot speed limit will apply to all waters of the Murray River at all other times.





By-laws relating to the Koorda Swimming Pool.

L.G. 623/74.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 9th day of October, 1974, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively—  
 "Pool Manager" means the person for the time being employed by the Council to control and to manage the Pool Premises and includes his assistant or deputy.  
 "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Koorda.  
 "Pool Premises" means Koorda Swimming Pool and all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such centre or used in connection therewith.
2. (a) The Pool Premises shall be open for admission of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time determine.  
 (b) The Pool Premises or any part thereof, may at any time in the discretion of the Manager, endorsed by Council, be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.
3. The Council may from time to time and for such periods as it determines close the Pool Premises to the Public.
4. The Council may refuse any person admission to the Pool Premises at any time and children under the age of six (6) years shall be refused admission unless accompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years.
5. The following are the charges for admission to the Pool Premises—  
 Children under Sixteen (16) years of age—10c.  
 Persons Sixteen (16) years of age and over—25c.  
 Pensioners (on production of Pension Card)—no charge.  
 Children under four (4) years—no charge.

6. The Council may issue or authorise the issue of concessions for such period at such cost and upon such conditions as it shall from time to time determine.

7. Every person using the Pool Premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager or Attendant with regard to such use.

8. The Pool Manager or Attendant may temporarily suspend admittance to or clear the Pool Premises or any part thereof of all or any persons or person if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

9. If a person shall appear in public and in the opinion of the Pool Manager or Attendant be indecently or insufficiently clad the Pool Manager or Attendant shall direct that person forthwith to resume his or her ordinary clothing and such person shall forthwith comply with that direction.

10. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager or Attendant who is hereby so empowered and directed, to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool Premises any person who in the opinion of the Pool Manager or Attendant—

- (a) Is a child under the age of six (6) years and is unaccompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years; or
- (b) Is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these By-laws; or
- (c) Is by his past or present conduct undesirable; or
- (d) Is under or apparently under the influence of alcoholic liquor or drugs; or
- (e) Is apparently suffering from any contagious, infectious, offensive disease or skin complaint;

and any such person shall upon the request of the Pool Manager or Attendant to withdraw from the Pool Premises quietly and peaceably do so immediately.

11. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool Premises or has been requested to leave the Pool Premises and who feels aggrieved by the action of the Pool Manager or an attendant may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk against such action. The Council shall consider the objection and give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit. The right of appeal given by this By-law shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council or Pool Manager or an Attendant arising out of such refusal of admission or direction to leave the Pool Premises.

12. No person shall for profit teach, coach or train any person in the Pool Premises unless with the prior written consent of the Council.

13. The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

14. (1) No person, club, association or organisation shall conduct a carnival at the Pool Premises unless with prior consent of the Council.

(2) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

(3) A person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival at the Pool Premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool Premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

(4) The person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool Premises shall pay to the Council such charges as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

15. Every person finding within the Pool Premises any article which may have been left or lost therein shall immediately deliver it to the Pool Manager or attendant who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall be kept for that purpose and any person claiming the article who satisfies the Pool Manager or Attendant that he is the lawful owner of the article shall upon payment of a charge of ten cents (10c) and upon signing a receipt for it have the article returned to him.

16. All articles left in the Pool Premises and not claimed within a period of three (3) calendar months shall be disposed of by the Council by first offering the article to the finder and if he shall refuse it, the Council shall then dispose of the article in any manner it thinks proper.

17. (1) No person shall enter any portion of the Pool Premises set apart exclusively for the opposite sex. Nor shall any person without the consent of the occupier enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing box or other compartment which is already occupied.

(2) No person upon the Pool Premises shall in any way interfere with any other person therein or with any other person's use thereof nor throw or push or attempt to throw or push any person into the swimming pool or throw any stones, sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any person using the Pool Premises.

(3) No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of the users of the Pool Premises, provided that nothing therein contained apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports organised and conducted on the Pool Premises by any club, association or organisation or other person at such time and in such manner as shall be approved by the Council.

(4) No person being the owners of or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall cause or allow such dog or animal to enter or remain in or about the Pool Premises.

## 18. No person shall—

- (a) not being an officer or employee of the Council in the course of his duties, or a pensioner on the production of his pension card enter the Pool Premises without having first paid to the Pool Manager or Attendant the proper charge for admission;
- (b) obstruct the Pool Manager or Attendant in carrying out his duties;
- (c) enter or depart from any part of the Pool Premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose;
- (d) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume except in a dressing enclosure provided for that purpose;
- (e) appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such a nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person;
- (f) enter or be in the Pool Premises while in an intoxicated condition induced by liquor or drugs;
- (g) take into the Pool Premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor or drugs;
- (h) use any soap in any part of the Pool Premises other than in the dressing rooms or shower recess;
- (i) in any part of the Pool Premises behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous or indecent manner, swear or use any indecent, obscene, offensive or abusive language or gamble or misconduct himself or herself.
- (j) climb up or upon any roof, fence, wall or partition on the Pool Premises.
- (k) deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the Pool Premises except in places set aside for that purpose;
- (l) except in the specified areas consume any food or drink.
- (m) wastefully use the water or leave any taps dripping in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the Pool Premises.
- (n) spit or expectorate in the swimming pool or on any part of the Pool Premises or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such premises;
- (o) use any substance or preparation whereby the water of the swimming pool may become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers;
- (p) foul or pollute water in any shower, bath or in the swimming pool, or soil, damage, injure, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any dressing room, closet or compartment, or other part of the Pool Premises or any furniture or other article of equipment therein;
- (q) damage, improperly use or interfere with any tap, valve, locker or other fitting or appliance in or about the Pool Premises or discharge litter of any description on, in or about the Pool Premises or bring or deposit any filth or rubbish onto or in the Pool Premises;
- (r) smoke, unless permitted by the Pool Manager, in any buildings, dressing room or other compartment in the Pool Premises;
- (s) whilst suffering from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use or attempt to enter to use the swimming pool or the Pool Premises or any part thereof;
- (t) soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume;
- (u) enter the Swimming Pool unless wearing the approved bathing costume;

19. A person shall not pay nor shall any Pool Manager or Attendant of officer or servant of the Council receive any fee for admission to or for the use of any facility in the Pool Premises except upon such person being permitted to pass through a turnstile which automatically registers such admission or except in exchange for a printed ticket bearing the name of the Council or in exchange for a ticket issued from a cash register of the Council.

20. Every person shall when leaving the Pool Premises, if requested to do so, produce his or her bathing costume or towel for inspection by the Pool Manager or Attendant.

21. No ticket, token, license or receipt issued as provided by these by-laws shall be transferable and no person other than the person to whom it was originally issued shall enjoy and benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

22. Neither the Council nor the Pool Manager or Attendant or Officers or Employee of the Council shall in any way be responsible for any articles or money lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool Premises or for any articles damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the Pool Premises.

23. (1) A person who infringes any of the provisions of these by-laws or shall attempt any breach thereof, may be summarily removed from the Pool Premises or any part thereof by the Pool Manager or an Attendant, and if committing a breach of the Act or these by-laws may be arrested by the Pool Manager or an Attendant and given into the custody of a police officer. The Pool Manager or an Attendant may refuse to admit to the Pool premises any person who shall have been convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws until such time as the Council may decide that such person shall be admitted.

(2) The Council may issue a written direction to the Pool Manager that any person named in such direction shall not be admitted to the Pool Premises, and whilst such direction remains in force, the Pool Manager or an attendant shall not admit such person to the Pool Premises or permit him to be therein and such person shall not with the knowledge that such direction is in force, enter or attempt to enter the Pool Premises.

24. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$100.

"certification" of a teacher means his status as the holder of a Teachers' Certificate, a Teachers' Higher Certificate, or the holder of any other qualification approved by the Minister; .

## PART IX.—STUDENT TEACHERS.

## Division 1.—Teacher Education Scholarships.

194. (1) Scholarships may be awarded to students undertaking courses of teacher education at approved teacher training institutions.

(2) The number of scholarships and the value thereof to be awarded in each year shall be determined by the Minister.

195. (1) There shall be established a "Teacher Education Scholarship Board" which shall consist of—

- (a) the Director of Special Services, or his nominee;
- (b) a Superintendent of Education; and
- (c) a representative of the Union, nominated by the Union.

(2) The Board shall select students to whom scholarships are to be awarded.

(3) The Board, in selecting students for scholarships, shall take into account—

- (a) the academic achievements of the student;
- (b) the aptitude of the student for teaching; and
- (c) such information as may from time to time be considered necessary by the Director-General to be taken into account.

(4) An applicant for a scholarship shall submit to the Department—

- (a) an application on the prescribed form containing the required information and particulars;
- (b) such information as may from time to time be considered necessary by the Director-General.

(5) Before the offer of a scholarship to a student is confirmed by the Board, the selected student shall—

- (a) complete the appropriate agreement form and make the necessary declaration; and
- (b) pass a medical and x-ray examination to the satisfaction of a Government Medical Officer.

(6) In this regulation the "Board" means the "Teacher Education Scholarship Board" established by this regulation.

196. (1) The Minister may approve of a living away from home allowance being paid to a student.

(2) Notwithstanding subregulation (1) of this regulation a student shall not be eligible for a living away from home allowance unless, having regard to all the circumstances, (including the availability of public transport, the distance of the home from the teacher training institution and the conditions under which the student has to study at home), the Minister is of the opinion that the student could not reasonably be expected to live at home or travel daily between the home and the teacher training institution.

197. There shall be established a "Teacher Education Scholarship Termination Board" which shall consist of—

- (a) the Director of Special Services, or his nominee, who shall be Chairman;
- (b) a Superintendent of Education; and
- (c) a Headmaster, nominated by the Director-General.

198. (1) The Board shall hear complaints with respect to the conduct of students who hold a Teacher Education Scholarship and shall make recommendations to the Director-General as to whether any scholarship should be terminated.

(2) (a) Where, a Superintendent (who shall not be a member of the Board), appointed by the Director-General to liaise with teacher training institutions, is of opinion that because—

- (i) of idleness, disobedience, irregular, unpunctual or non-attendance, unsuitability or lack of interest in his work by a student; or
- (ii) a teacher training institution has terminated the course of teacher training of a student,

the Teacher Education Scholarship of that student should be terminated, the Superintendent shall make a complaint as to the conduct of that student by notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.

(b) The Chairman shall, within twenty-one days of the receipt of a complaint convene a meeting of the Board and shall give the student and his guarantor seven days' notice in writing of the date of the meeting, together with a written statement of the grounds of the complaint and notice of liability of the termination of the student's Teacher Education Scholarship.

(c) (i) The student may attend the meeting, call witnesses and address the Board on his own behalf.

(ii) The Board may hear and determine the complaint notwithstanding the absence of the student.

(iii) A member of the Board may examine the student and cross-examine any witness called by the student.

(iv) The guarantor of the student may—

- (a) attend the meeting;
- (b) be called as a witness; and
- (c) be cross-examined by any member of the Board,

but otherwise shall take no active part in the proceedings of the meeting.

(v) The Board shall keep a true and faithful record of every meeting and the proceedings thereof which shall be signed by each member present.

(3) (a) After the hearing of a complaint, the Board—

(i) may dismiss the complaint; or

(ii) may recommend to the Director General that the Teacher Education Scholarship of the student be terminated.

(b) Notwithstanding subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this subregulation, the Board shall not make a recommendation that a scholarship be terminated unless the decision of the Board was unanimous.

(4) (a) A recommendation of the Board that a scholarship be terminated shall be forwarded immediately to the Director-General, who, if he approves of the recommendation shall submit the recommendation to the Minister for his decision.

(b) If the Director-General does not approve of the recommendation of the Board, the recommendation shall lapse and be of no effect.

(5) Where a recommendation has been submitted to the Minister for his consideration he shall notify the student and his guarantor in writing of his decision and where the decision is that the scholarship be terminated, the reasons for that termination.

(6) In this regulation the "Board" means the "Teacher Education Scholarship Termination Board" established by regulation 197 of these regulations.

#### Division 2.—Teacher Education Scholarship Agreement.

199. Before the offer of a scholarship to a student is confirmed, the student shall enter into an agreement with the Minister—

(a) that he will, on completion of his course of training, serve under that agreement in one or more schools for the period stated in the agreement; or

(b) that he will repay the amount of the assistance received in accordance with the terms and conditions specified in the agreement.

200. (1) An agreement for service entered into under paragraph (a) of regulation 199 shall contain a guarantee to which the student and a person approved by the Minister are parties and shall—

(a) where the course of training commenced before the first day of January, 1971, in the case of a male student, be in the Form No. 1A in Schedule 1 to these regulations; and in the case of a female student, be in the Form No. 2A in that Schedule;

(b) where the course of training of a male student commenced on or after the first day of January, 1971, be in the Form No. 1 in that Schedule;

(c) where the course of training of a female student commenced on or after the first day of January, 1971, but before the first day of January, 1973, be in the Form No. 2 in that Schedule; or

(d) where the course of training of a female student commenced on or after the first day of January, 1973, be in the Form No. 2B in that Schedule.

(2) An agreement entered into under the provisions of paragraph (b) of regulation 199 shall, if the Minister so requires, contain a guarantee or indemnity to which the student and a person approved by the Minister are parties and shall be in the Form No. 2C in Schedule 1 to these regulations.

(3) (a) A student may, during his course of training transfer from an agreement—

(i) made pursuant to paragraph (a) of regulation 199 to an agreement made pursuant to paragraph (b) of that regulation; or

(ii) made pursuant to paragraph (b) of regulation 199 to an agreement made pursuant to paragraph (a) of that regulation,

on the condition that he enters into a further agreement with the Minister (which the Minister may require to contain a guarantee) to take effect on and from the first day of January specified therein, making provision for the repayment of assistance received and the adjustment of service, that is satisfactory to the Minister.

(b) A student who has transferred from one agreement to another agreement pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subregulation during his course of training shall not be eligible to transfer back to his original agreement.

(4) The amount of financial assistance payable to a student who enters into an agreement made pursuant to paragraph (b) of regulation 199 shall comprise—

- (a) a basic allowance on a scale determined by the Minister;
  - (b) a living away from home allowance (if applicable) on a scale determined by the Minister,
- by way of grant; and
- (c) an annual loan, variable at the election of the student in multiples of fifty dollars up to a maximum on a scale determined by the Minister,
- repayable from the day of graduation from the teacher training institution, or sooner termination of the course of training.

(5) Notwithstanding paragraph (c) of subregulation (4) of this regulation, financial assistance by annual loan shall be limited to male and female students (other than dependent wives) who—

- (a) have been resident in Western Australia for at least two years immediately prior to commencing the course;
  - (b) are not in receipt of any other scholarship; and
  - (c) are not under any obligation or contract to an employer,
- unless the Minister otherwise determines.

(6) The Minister may, in his absolute discretion mitigate the terms of any agreement entered into under this regulation.

(7) Repayment of financial assistance shall be made by equal monthly instalments over four years but shall become immediately due and payable where—

- (a) the course of training is not completed and the Minister requires repayment; or
- (b) the provisions of the agreement entered into require repayment.

(8) Interest, at a rate to be determined by the Under Treasurer shall, subject to the provisions of the agreement entered into, be payable only on the proportion of the moneys repayable for the time being in arrear.

### Division 3.—Marriage of Female Teacher Education Scholarship Holders.

201. If a female student marries during her probationary year of teacher training she may—

- (a) terminate her scholarship and repay half of the basic allowance received by her to the date of marriage; or
- (b) continue her course of training without allowances, and, in the case of subsequent default under her agreement, shall be liable to repay half of the basic allowance received by her to the date of marriage.

202. If a female student marries after her probationary year she may—

- (a) terminate her scholarship and repay half of the basic allowance received by her to the date of marriage; or
- (b) continue her course of training without allowances, and, in the case of subsequent default under her agreement, shall be liable to repay half of the basic allowance received by her to the date of marriage; or
- (c) continue her course of training with allowances, and, in the case of subsequent default under her agreement, shall be liable to repay half of the basic allowance received by her before and after the date of marriage.

203. Where a married female student becomes the mother of a child, upon production of legal evidence of the birth, no further claim shall be made for the repayment of any allowances.

204. After the birth of a child, a married female student may—

- (a) terminate her scholarship;
- (b) complete her course of study without allowances;
- (c) after making a new application for allowances and entering into a new agreement with the Minister, complete her course of study with allowances, unless she has defaulted under her agreement since her marriage.

205. The provisions of paragraph (c) of regulation 204 do not apply to a female student who marries during her probationary year of teacher training.
