WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act, 1893, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to revest in Her Majesty as of Her former estate all or any lands, whereof Her Majesty may become the registered proprietor; and whereas Her Majesty is now the registered proprietor of the lands described in the schedules hereto: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation revest in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the land described in the schedules hereto as of Her former estate.

WHEREAS by section 31 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, the Governor may by Proclamation and subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, classify as of Class A any lands of the Crown reserved to Her Majesty for any of the purposes specified in the said section and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 33532 for the purpose of "Anthropological and Archaeological Purposes" as described hereunder, should be classified as of Class A: Now, therefore, I the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator with the advice of Executive Council do by this my Proclamation classify as of Class A the land described hereunder.


