Constitution Act, 1889-1970.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1970, provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may vest in heads of departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments to public offices under the Government of the State: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby—

- (a) vests in Ronald Cecil Pilgrim, Accountant, Department of Agriculture, and in any person temporarily appointed to perform the normal duties of the said Ronald Cecil Pilgrim during his absence or incapacity, the power to make appointments in respect of the department specified in Column 1 of the schedule hereto, of employees of the categories specified respectively in Column 2 of the schedule hereto in relation to those departments, on such terms and conditions as are contained from time to time in the awards and agreement specified respectively in Column 3 of the schedule hereto in relation to those categories of employees; and
- (b) revokes the power previously vested in Andrew Calcedonio Callus and in any person temporarily appointed to perform the normal duties of the said Andrew Calcedonio Callus during his absence or incapacity, to make minor appointments in respect of the department specified in Column 1 of the schedule hereto.

Child Welfare Act, 1947-1972. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1972, that the Governor may by Order in Council, (*inter alia*) appoint a Special Magistrate or Special Magistrates for any Court or Courts established under that section and may, in like manner, amend, vary or revoke any appointment made under that section; and whereas it is now expedient that those powers should be exercised in the manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth revoke the appointment of Gwynn Roy Judd Hitchin as Special Magistrate under the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1972, with effect from the 1st October, 1975.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 33601 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Western Australian Government Railways in trust for the purpose of "Railway Purposes": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Western Australian Government Railways to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1972. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres, 2540/65.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1972, it is *inter alla*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 30939 (Bunbury Lot 513) should be granted in fee simple to the Churches of Christ in Western Australia Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of "Additions to Aged Person's Homesite (Church of Christ)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the Churches of Christ in Western Australia Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of "Additions to Aged Person's Homesite (Church of Christ)" subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Rules of The Barristers' Board.

WHEREAS by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1973 (hereinafter called "the Act") The Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered from time to time to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the said Act mentioned; and whereas it is desired to amend the rules of the Board as reprinted pursuant to the provisions of the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, including amendments up to and including Government Gazette (No. 69) of 31st August, 1962, and published in the Government Gazette (No. 6) of 21st January, 1963, and thereafter amended by amendments published in the Government Gazette (No. 35) of 15th May, 1963, and the Government Gazette (No. 45) of 27th May, 1964, and the Government Gazette (No. 34) of 19th April, 1967, and the Government Gazette (No. 17) of 12th March, 1971, and the Government Gazette (No. 85) of 1st October, 1971, and the Government Gazette (No. 19) of 7th March, 1974, and the Government Gazette (No. 3) of 10th January, 1975: Now therefore the Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the Act, doth hereby, at a meeting held on the 10th day of September, 1975 make and publish the following amendments to the said forward the Government Gazette:—

Amendment to the Rules.

1. Rule 28 is amended by adding to the subjects therein collectively described as the "Practice Examination" the subject "Law Practice and Office Organisation".

2. Rule 34A is amended by deleting all words after the word "prescribed", and substituting the words-

that such clerk shall attend lectures and take examinations as shall be provided by the Board in the following subjects:-

- 3. Delete the proviso to rule 18 and substitute the following:----

4. Rule 77 is repealed, and a new rule is made, reading as follows:-

77. If the Board resolves to investigate the conduct of a practitioner although no complaint has been made against him the Board may-

- (a) by letter indicating the general subject matter of the inquiry summon the practitioner to appear before it to answer such questions and to produce such documents touching his conduct as the Board may think fit and thereupon the practitioner is bound to comply with the requirements of the Board and the inquiry may be discretioned in all more than the discretion of the Board in all more than the discretion of the Board and the inquiry may be discretioned. may in the discretion of the Board proceed in all respects as if it had been initiated by a complaint; or
- (b) direct the Secretary to lay a complaint against the practitioner in the form Z in the Schedule whereupon the matter shall pro-ceed as prescribed by the preceding rules in this Part, except that in all things relating to his position as complainant the Secretary shall act upon the directions of the Chairman or of such other member of the Board as the Board may designate.

- (iii) Not less than 1.8 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.
- (iv) On all cleared land not less than 1.8 metres in width within one chain of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

(b) All other Lots: Effective fire breaks around the perimeter of all buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land cleared of all infiammable materials to a width of at least 1 metre or where the boundary is closer than 1 metre then for that lesser distance.

(c) All townsite Lots: To be cleared of all inflammable materials and rubbish on or before the 30th day of November, 1975 and kept clear of such material until the 13th day of March, 1976.

Pine Plantations.

Not less than 10 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which pines are planted;

By-laws Relating to the Control of Dogs.

LG. WY-7-9.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 15th May, 1975 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-Laws:—

 $1. \ In these By-Laws the term "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.$

PART I.--IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

2. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act 1903 as amended.

3. A dog seized by a Police Officer or an Officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.

4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other employees authorised by the Council shall if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

5. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

6. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of **a** dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or employee may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of the dog if made in good faith.

8. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of it being impounded or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council may sell the dog or have it destroyed. Any costs incurred by the Council in seizing or disposing of the dog shall be recoverable by the Council from the owner.

9. Upon the sale of the dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-Laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.

10. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the said Dog Act 1903 as amended any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authorisation of the Shire Clerk of the Council if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from any injury disease or sickness.

11. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto.

No person shall—

- (a) unless a pound keeper or other employee of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
- (b) destroy break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
- (c) destroy break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

13. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1903 as amended or by the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions or by these By-Laws.

14. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure care detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of his liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these By-Laws.

15. Any person who shall commit a breach of these By-laws 2-14 (both inclusive) shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00).

PART II.—GENERAL.

16. No person shall permit a dog to wander at large but shall keep such dog chained or under effective control at all times.

17. Subject to the provisions of Section 21A (3) of the Dog Act 1903, the owner of a dog or person responsible for its keeping shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre, or drive-in theatre.
- (c) A house of worship,
- (d) A shop or other building used by the public.

18. Subject to the provisions of Section 21A (3) of the Dog Act 1903. The owner of a dog or persons responsible for its keeping shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sportsground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (c) A car park.
- (d) Any land vested in or under the control of the Council including a road or street.
- (e) A school.

19. The occupier of any premises where a dog is kept or permitted or suffered to remain shall not allow such dog by continuous barking or physical trespassing to be nuisance to any inhabitant or inhabitants in the neighbourhood.

20. No person shall keep a dog on any premises so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

21. Any person who shall commit a breach of any By-law 16-20 (both inclusive) shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00).

22. Any person who shall commit a breach of By-law 19 shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100 and in the case of a continuing breach not exceeding \$4 for each day that the breach is committed.

23. The following by-laws of the Wyalkatchem Road Board are hereby repealed:---

- (a) control of Dogs (By-Law) published in the Government Gazette of 21st June 1929, and.
- (b) By-law regarding Destruction of Dogs not kept chained or otherwise under effective control from sunset to sunrise published in the *Government Gazette* of 29th August, 1947.
