TO THE HONOURABLE SIR JOHN EVENDEN  
VIRTUE, K.B.E.:

I, the said Lieutenant Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you THE HONOURABLE SIR JOHN EVENDEN VIRTUE, K.B.E. to be a Royal Commission—

- (1) To inquire and report on the truth or otherwise of the allegations made by Mr. B. T. Burke, M.L.A. in the Legislative Assembly on the 10th September, 1975, to the effect that—
  - (a) certain police officers committed perjury during the trial of Baymis Ugle;
  - (b) subsequent police investigations into the trial were superficial and prejudiced;
  - (c) one or more police officers lied to the officers instructed to carry out such subsequent investigations;
  - (d) such subsequent investigations or other enquiries failed to discover vital or material evidence then available; and
  - (e) the only result of the police enquiries was that Sergeant Fanderlinden was victimized.

(2) To inquire and report—

- (a) whether there was any impropriety on the part of any policemen in connection with the arrest or charging of Ugle; and
  - (b) whether the official investigations subsequently made by the Police into the arrest and charging of Ugle were properly conducted.
- (3) To inquire and report whether subsequent to the hearing of the complaint against Ugle there has been any impropriety on the part of any person in any statements made or actions taken in relation to, or arising out of the arrest and charging of Ugle, or the subsequent investigations.
  - (4) To inquire and report whether Sergeant Fanderlinden has been victimized and, if so, in what way.
  - (5) To make any recommendation arising out of the consideration of the above matters that is considered appropriate;

and I hereby declare that, by virtue of this Commission, you may in the execution hereof do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission or the Chairman or members of a Royal Commission may lawfully do and exercise, whether under or pursuant to the Royal Commissions Act, 1968, or otherwise.

Newdegate Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 1085/63.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, it is provided, *inter alia*, that all water works sewerage, drainage and irrigation works constructed by the

Government and declared by the Governor to be subject to any of the Acts mentioned in the schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, shall vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage on behalf of Her Majesty unless and until those works are vested in a board; and whereas by section 11 of the Public Works Act, 1902-1961, the Governor by Order in Council dated December 23, 1963 and published in the *Government Gazette* on January 10, 1964, authorised the Minister for Works to undertake, construct and provide catchment improvements for Newdegate Water Supply on land coloured green on plan P.W.D., W.A. 40710: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, doth hereby declare the catchment improvements for Newdegate Water Supply on the land coloured green on plan P.W.D., W.A. 40710 to be subject to the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1974 (being an Act mentioned in the schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950) and to vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage.

## SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1974.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1974, and all other powers hereunto enabling, a majority of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia hereby make the following rules.

By-laws Relating to the Control and Management of the  
Wyalkatchem Shire Hall.

## L.G. WY-7-10.

IN pursuance to the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the Shire of Wyalkatchem hereby records having resolved on the 15th May, 1975, to repeal the by-laws for the management and control of halls as published in the *Government Gazette* of 23rd November, 1934 and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

## Interpretation.

1. (1) In these by-laws—the “Shire Hall” means and includes supper room, kitchen and any room or corridor or stairway or annexe of such hall or kitchen and the furniture and equipment therein.

(b) “Shire Clerk” shall mean the person for the time being employed by the Council as Shire Clerk or his Deputy or any officer authorised by this Council.

(c) “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.

## Application for Hire.

2. Application for the hire of the hall or any portion thereof shall be made in the form prescribed in Schedule 1 of these by-laws to the Shire Clerk at the office of the Council not less than 24 hours before the hour of which the hiring is desired, and shall state the purpose for which hiring is desired.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall or any portion thereof and equipment shall be given in the application for hiring.

4. Hiring of the hall building and property including furniture and equipment shall be at the rates prescribed in Schedule 2 of these by-laws.

5. The hours for which hiring may be effected at day time rates shall be from 8 a.m.- 6 p.m. Evening hiring shall be from 6 p.m. until midnight. Council may at its discretion extend evening hiring. Hire of the building for use after midnight for public entertainment on Saturday nights shall be subject to the hirer obtaining written approval from the Department of the Chief Secretary of the Western Australian Government to continue the entertainment after midnight.

6. (a) The hirer shall prior to the term of engagement when required by the Council deposit an amount to cover the hire charge and a further amount on bond against any damage and extra cleaning required.

(b) The hall may be reserved in advance on the payment of a deposit of fifty per cent of the hire charge payable, and the balance of the hire charge must be paid fourteen prior to the date of the engagement. If such balance of hire charge and deposit which may be required for damage which may occur be not paid before fourteen days prior to the engagement as set out above, the fifty per cent hiring charge deposit shall be forfeited and the booking shall be automatically cancelled.

(c) The Council reserves the right on written application to fix or determine special concessional hire charges not appearing in the Second Schedule.

7. If, after payment of the required deposit, the hall booking is cancelled, the deposit, being fifty per cent of hire charge, will not be refunded unless the hall is re-let for the date of such cancelled booking.

8. The Council reserves the right to refuse to let the hall or any portion thereof to an applicant without assigning any reason for such refusal.

9. In the event of two or more applications being received for the hire of the same portion of the hall property at the same time and date, the Council may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hall hiring shall be granted.

10. The hirer of any portion of the hall property shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainment Tax Act and other Acts, in force for the time being, applicable to such hiring of buildings. If, in the opinion of the Council all necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the requirements of above and all other relevant Acts, the Council may prior to or during the term of engagement, forbid and prevent the use of such building.

11. In the event of the use of any portion of the hall property being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire, as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Council shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

12. (1) The hirer of the hall—

(a) shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour therein;

(b) shall make good any damage to the hall building any loss or damage to the property and equipment hired therewith or situated therein caused during the term of the hiring or at the option of the Council pay to the Council the cost thereof;

- (c) shall be responsible for the carrying out of the terms of and the compliance with these by-laws;
  - (d) shall leave the hall in a clean and tidy condition after the term of the hiring;
  - (e) shall remove and place all rubbish in the places so provided in the hall premises;
  - (f) shall at the conclusion of the function turn off all electric light and power;
  - (g) shall at the conclusion of the hiring lock all doors, close all windows and return the keys of the hall to the Council office on the first day the Council office is open for business following the hire of the hall;
  - (h) report any damage or defacement to the Council.
12. (2) The provisions of this by-law shall be deemed to be a condition of the hiring.
13. No spirituous liquors, wine, beer, stout, cider, sherry or other alcoholic liquor shall be brought into or consumed in any part of the building during the term of engagement or period of hire, except when permitted by the Council in writing.
14. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or any other objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any part of the building during any picture show, concert or similar type of entertainment whether such persons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise.
15. No person whilst intoxicated shall be permitted to enter or remain upon any portion of the hall, nor be guilty of misbehaviour whatsoever, nor be permitted to use profane or improper language, nor damage, mark or deface any wall or other part of the hall or property. Any person who does, permits or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay cost of such damage in addition to any penalty imposed under these conditions.
16. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, shall not be allowed to enter any part of the hall.
17. No person shall take photographs for profit without the permission of the hirer.
18. Furniture, plant and equipment shall only be hired with the hiring of the Shire Hall or portion thereof, and shall not be removed from the premises unless by the specific authorisation of the Shire Clerk.

From the publication of this notice until further notice is published, the taking of rabbits or catching by any means except by poisoning is prohibited. Rabbits taken in breach of this prohibition are likely to endanger or be detrimental to human health or life, if consumed as food.

A person who takes or attempts to take rabbits in the Vermin Districts shown above after the publication of this notice and before publication of a further notice cancelling this prohibition commits an offence against the Vermin Act, 1918-1970.

Penalty: Maximum of \$200.

## STOCK DISEASES (REGULATIONS) ACT, 1968-1974.

Department of Agriculture,  
South Perth, 25th September, 1975.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator in Executive Council acting under the provisions of the Stock Diseases (Regulations) Act, 1968-1974 has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the Schedule below.

## Schedule.

## Regulations.

1. In these regulations the Enzootic Diseases Regulations, 1970 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th June, 1970 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published and reprinted as so amended pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th March, 1974 and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th May, 1974 are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted:—

5. A person who owns—

- (a) in any part of the State, stock that is affected by, or is suspected by him to be affected by, a disease specified in Part A of the First Schedule; or
- (b) in any part of the State outside the Kimberley Infected Area, as defined in subregulation (2) of regulation 42 of these regulations, stock that is affected by, or is suspected by him to be affected by, a disease specified in Part B of the First Schedule,

shall—

- (c) within the period of twenty-four hours from the time he first discovers the stock to be so affected or he first suspects the stock to be so affected, notify, by the quickest practicable means, the inspector who is normally located nearest to the place where the affected stock is kept, or the Chief Inspector and give to the inspector or Chief Inspector, as the case may be, a description of the stock, the number thereof and the place where the stock may be located; and
- (d) forthwith on his discovering that the stock is so affected or on his suspecting that the stock is so affected, isolate the stock that is affected or suspected to be affected and take all such steps that are necessary so as to prevent the stock from coming into contact with stock belonging to other persons.

3. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted:—

6. A person who is consulted regarding stock, or who examines any stock and from that consultation or examination believes or suspects the stock to be affected by a disease specified in Part A or Part B of the First Schedule, shall take such steps to comply with paragraph (c) of regulation 5 of these regulations as if he were the owner of that stock.

4. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by adding before subregulation (1) a subregulation to stand as subregulation (1) as follows:—

(1) Where an inspector is of opinion, whether because of his own examination or because of the report of another inspector—

- (a) that a disease specified in Part A of the First Schedule exists in stock or on any land in any Part of the State; or
- (b) that a disease specified in Part B of the First Schedule exists in any stock or on any land in any part of the State outside the Kimberley Infected Area, as defined in subregulation (2) of regulation 42 of these regulations; and
- (c) that the stock or land is not then declared to be in quarantine,

the inspector shall—

- (d) where the stock is not travelling stock, serve on the owner of the stock or on the owner of the land on which the stock is situated, a notice in the form of Form No. 1 declaring the stock and the land specified in the notice to be in quarantine; or
- (e) where the stock is travelling stock, serve on the person who appears to be in charge of the stock a notice declaring the stock to be in quarantine and directing that person either to hold the stock or move the stock directly to a place of quarantine nominated by the inspector and there to hold the stock until it is released from quarantine or until he is subsequently directed otherwise by an inspector,

and forthwith after making the declaration under paragraph (d) or paragraph (e), as the case may be, of this subregulation, notify the Chief Inspector of his so making the declaration and give to him particulars thereof. ;

(b) as to subregulation (1)—

(i) by deleting the subregulation designation "(1)" and substituting the subregulation designation "(1a)";

(ii) by adding after the word "disease" in paragraph (a) the passage "specified in Part C of the First Schedule"; and

(iii) by deleting the word "shall" in line six and substituting the word "may";

(c) as to subregulation (2), by deleting the passage "paragraph (c) or (d) of subregulation (1)", in line two, and substituting the passage "paragraph (d) or (e) of subregulation (1) of paragraph (c) or (d) of subregulation (1a), as the case requires," ; and

(d) as to subregulation (4), by adding after the passage "subregulation (1)", in line four, the passage "or subregulation (1a)".

5. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is deleted and the following Schedule substituted:—
