WHEREAS by sections 13 and 14 of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1974, it is enacted that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Commissioner, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a Main Road and may, in like manner and on the like recommendation, declare that any Main Road shall cease to be a Main Road; and whereas the Governor, by Proclamations, published in the *Government Gazettes* on the 13th day of January, 1931, 16th day of January, 1931 and 17th day of March, 1967 declared, *inter alia*, that the roads described in Schedule I hereto shall be Main Roads, and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of the said roads described in Schedule I hereto shall cease to be Main Roads and that the portions of the said roads described in Schedule II hereto shall be Main Roads. Now therefore, I the said Lieutenant Governor and Administrator being with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that the portion of the roads described in Schedule I hereto, heretofore declared to be Main Roads as aforesaid, shall cease to be Main Roads and that the portion of the roads as aforesaid and described in Schedule II hereto shall be Main Roads within the meaning of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1974, that the footpaths, if any, of such roads be excluded from the Main Roads and that the said Proclamation is hereby varied accordingly.

1. That Clause 33A be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—
 33A. No person shall stand a vehicle or permit a vehicle to stand so that any part of the vehicle is on the verge of any part of a road, that is to say, between the edge of the carriageway of that part of the road and the boundary of the road nearest to that edge:
 - (a) during any period when the standing or parking of a vehicle on the road adjacent to such verge is prohibited or is prohibited for more than a specified time;
 - (b) during any period when the standing or parking of vehicles on that verge is prohibited by a sign adjacent or referable to that verge;
 - (c) unless he is the occupier of premises adjacent to that verge or a person authorised by the occupier of those premises.
2. That Clause 45 be amended by:
 - (a) Inserting after the words "this By-law" the word "and".
 - (b) Deleting the words "a fee of one dollar per day or part of a day for every such space" and substituting therefor the words "for each space a fee of two dollars for the first four hours on any day and a further fee of four dollars for any period in excess of four hours on that day".
3. That Clause 46 be amended by deleting the words "(being a road within the area described in the Sixth Schedule hereto or one of the roads mentioned in that Schedule)".
4. That Clause 47 be amended by deleting paragraph (i) and substituting therefor the following:—
 - (i) Is the owner or occupier of a single tenement dwelling house adjacent to a part of a road whereon the standing of a vehicle is prohibited for more than a specified time and who lives in that house.
5. That the Sixth Schedule be deleted.

2. Townsite Land: Clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

3. Bulk or Drum Fuel Storage Sites: All bulk or drum Fuel Storage sites to be totally cleared of inflammable materials for a minimum distance of 6 metres around the storage site.

this Graduation Seal of the Institute having been adopted by the Council on the 16th day of April, 1975.

4. (1) The Administrative Secretary shall hold the Common Seal in safe custody and available for use as authorised by this Statute.

(2) The Assistant Director (Educational Services) shall hold the Graduation Seal in safe custody and available for use as authorised by this Statute.

5. (1) Except as provided in section 6, the Common Seal shall only be used by the authority of the Council.

(2) The Graduation Seal shall only be used by the authority of the Council.

6. Where a document required to be under the Common Seal relates to a matter or matters which the Chairman or Director considers are formal or of special urgency, the Chairman or Director may authorise the use of the Common Seal on that document. The Chairman or Director authorising the use of the Common Seal under this section shall report the circumstances to the Council at the first opportunity.

7. (1) The Administrative Secretary may affix the Common Seal to—

(a) all Statutes made by the Council; and

(b) documents or classes of documents which the Council have authorised to be sealed with the Common Seal.

(2) The Assistant Director (Educational Services) may affix the Graduation Seal to all documents or classes of documents which the Council have authorised to be sealed with the Graduation Seal.

8. (1) Every document to which the Common Seal is affixed shall be signed by the Chairman or the Director and countersigned by the Administrative Secretary or by some other person appointed by the Council for the purpose.

(2) Every certificate of an award to which the Graduation Seal is affixed shall be signed by the Director and countersigned by such person as shall be appointed by the Council for the purpose.

9. (1) Whenever the Common Seal is affixed to a document the following sealing clause shall be inserted at the end of the document—

“The Common Seal of the Western Australian Institute of Technology was hereto affixed on the day of 19 by the authority of the Council (or the Chairman or Director as the case requires)”.

(2) There shall be inserted at the end of every certificate of an award a sealing clause in the following form—

“The Graduation Seal of the Western Australian Institute of Technology was hereto affixed on the day of 19 by the authority of the Council.”

10. (1) The Administrative Secretary shall maintain a register of the use of the Common Seal in which he shall record, in respect of each document to which the Common Seal is affixed, particulars of the nature of the document, its date, the authority for it and the name and title of the persons signing and countersigning the document as required by section 8 (1).

(2) The Assistant Director (Educational Services) shall maintain a register of the use of the Graduation Seal in which he shall record, in respect of each certificate of an award to which the seal is affixed, particulars of the certificate, its date, the authority for it and the name and title of the persons signing and countersigning the document as required by section 8 (2).

11. The Council may, by resolution, from time to time determine either generally or in any particular case or cases that in relation to any certificate of an award to which the Graduation Seal is affixed, the signature of the Director or the other person appointed by the Council to countersign the affixing of the Graduation Seal or both may be affixed by some mechanical means and be a facsimile of those persons' signatures in such manner as may be specified in the Council's resolution.

12. The Council may, by resolution, from time to time, determine the functions of the Council that may be exercised without the use of the Common Seal for that purpose and except where the Act or any other Act or a Statute requires that the Common Seal be affixed to an instrument, that an instrument or class of instrument may be signed by an officer of the Institute without the use of the Common Seal.

- Principal by-laws.
1. In these by-laws the by-law published as by-law number 54 of the Railway By-laws, in the *Government Gazette* of 14th May, 1940 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices published in the *Government Gazette* is referred to as the principal by-law.

- (c) must immediately bring his locomotive to a stand if—
- (i) he loses sight of the signals being exhibited by the Guard, Shunter or other person in charge; or
- (ii) where communications are being carried out by radio, he loses radio contact with the Guard, Shunter or other person in charge.
- Rule 427 amended.
3. Rule 427 in the Schedule to the principal by-law is amended—
- (a) by deleting the word "and" after paragraph (j);
- (b) by substituting for the passage "exhibited." in line six of paragraph (k), the passage "exhibited;" ; and
- (c) by adding the following new paragraphs:—
- (l) when a person exhibiting a hand signal disappears from sight, act as if a *Stop* signal was being exhibited;
- (m) where communications are being carried out by radio, and contact is lost with the Guard, Shunter or other person in charge act as if a *Stop* signal had been exhibited;
- (n) on approaching a signal, in order to obtain a cross check, call out to each other the aspect of the signal (or in the case of a semaphore, its position) in relation to their train; and
- (o) where the aspect or position of the signal (as the case may be) is visible only to one of them, that person shall immediately advise the other of the aspect or position of the signal.
