ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PART I—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

After By-law 1B insert new By-law 1C as follows:—

1C. Provision of Apparatus for the Bacteriolytic Treatment of Sewage.

- (a) This by-law shall apply in the portions of the district prescribed hereafter: The Shire of Toodyay.
- (b) The owner of every house constructed and existing at the time of coming into operation of this by-law, and which house is within a portion of the district to which this by-law applies, shall provide on the premises, an apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewage, not later than 30th June, 1976.
- (c) The owner of every house erected after the coming into operation of this by-law and which house is within a portion of the district to which this by-law applies, shall provide on the premises an apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewage before the house is occupied or used.

MARKETING OF EGGS ACT, 1945-1975.

Department of Agriculture,
South Perth, 14th January, 1976.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting under the provisions of the Marketing of Eggs Act, 1945-1975 has been pleased to make the regulations set forth in the schedule below.

Regulations.

Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Marketing of Eggs Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th June, 1946, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published and reprinted as so amended pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th September, 1963 and amended by a notice so published on the 15th October, 1964 are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 34A added. 2. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 34 the following regulation and heading thereto:—

Licensing of Producers.

34A. (1) The maximum number of fowls which any person or association of persons may be licensed to keep is 21 915.

(2) For the purposes of subsection (3a) of section 32E of the Act the Board may determine that any persons together constitute an association of persons if in relation to any one of those persons some other person concerned in the keeping of the fowls in question is—

- (a) the spouse, parent or remoter lineal ancestor, son, daughter or remoter issue, brother or sister of that person;
- (b) a partner of that person;
- (c) a corporation of which that person is an officer;
- (d) where the person is a corporation—an officer of the corporation;
- (e) an officer of any corporation of which the person is an officer;
- (f) an employee or employer of the person;
- (g) an employee of a natural person of whom that person is an employee;
- (h) a corporation whose directors are accustomed or under an obligation, whether formal or informal, to act in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of that person or, where the person is a corporation, of the directors or management of that person;
- (i) a corporation in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of which, or of the directors or management of which, that person is accustomed or under an obligation, whether formal or informal, to act;
- (j) a corporation in which the person holds a substantial interest;
- (k) where that person is a corporation—a person who holds a substantial interest in the corporation; or
- (l) a person who is, by virtue of the foregoing, an associate of any other person who is an associate of that person (including a person who is an associate of that person by another application or other application of this paragraph),

but persons shall not be regarded as associates if the Board is satisfied on representations made by one or more of them and after its own enquiries (if any) that they are commercially independent in their respective enterprises.

(3) The Board shall receive and have regard to all written representations that are submitted by a person who is licensed or who seeks to be licensed under the Act as to whether or not that person is one of an association of persons.

In these regulations the regulations made under the provisions of the Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1946-1972, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th September, 1947, reprinted incorporating all amendments up to and including the 31st August, 1961 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd May, 1962, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 215 amended. 2. Subregulation (3) of regulation 215 of the principal regulations is amended—
- (a) by deleting paragraph (a) and substituting the following paragraph:—
- (a) Where disablement results from an accident, or from a disease for which compensation is received under the Workers' Compensation Act, a weekly sum of eleven dollars and twenty-five cents, or the rate of two dollars and twenty-five cents for every working day from the date of the accident. Such payment shall only be made and continued on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner that the employee is unable to work, but where the employee attains the age of retirement during continuance of the disablement, his right to be paid the allowance under this regulation shall thereupon determine and payment of the allowance shall cease. In the event of an employee being permanently disabled he shall, on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner, be granted a fixed sum not exceeding three hundred dollars in satisfaction of all claims. A person shall be deemed to be disabled when he is wholly incapacitated from attending to his ordinary occupation. The period during which an employee has been in receipt of relief prior to the coming into operation of this regulation shall not be taken into account in assessing the rate of allowance payable to him. ; and
