ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 3081/19.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1975, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Shire of Meekatharra has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

from or originating from the State of Victoria.



1. That paragraph (a) of By-law 2 be repealed and the following new paragraph be substituted therefor:—

(a) The Club shall consist of the following:—

- (i) Ordinary Male Members.
- (ii) Junior Male Members.
- (iii) Provisional Members.
- (iv) Lady Members.
- (v) Life Members.

2. That paragraph (b) of By-law 2 be amended by deleting the words "Non-effective Male" in line 1 and by substituting therefor the word "Provisional".

3. That paragraph (c) of By-law 2 be deleted and the following new paragraph substituted therefor:—

(c) The number of Members of the Club (exclusive of Absentee Members Junior Male Members Provisional Members Lady Members and Life Members) shall not exceed ONE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY.

4. That paragraph (a) of By-law 3 be amended:—

(i) by deleting the passage "Candidates for admission as Members of the Club shall be proposed by one" and by substituting therefor the passage "Any male person may make application in the prescribed form to become an Ordinary Male Member of the Club and shall be proposed by one Ordinary Male".

5. That paragraph (b) of By-law 3 be amended by deleting the word "Non-effective" in the last line thereof.

6. That paragraph (c) of By-law 3 be amended by deleting the word "Non-effective" in lines 2 and 8 thereof.

7. That paragraph (d) of By-law 3 be amended by deleting the word "Non-effective" in line 6 thereof.

8. That paragraph (f) of By-law 3 be amended by deleting the words "Non-effective Male" in lines 5 and 6 thereof and by substituting therefor the word "Provisional".

9. That paragraph (g) of By-law 3 be deleted and the following new paragraph substituted therefor:—

(g) The provisions of paragraph (a) preceding shall apply to the election of Junior Male Members Provisional Members and Lady Members.

10. That paragraph (h) of By-law 3 be deleted and the following new paragraph substituted therefor:—

(h) Junior Male Members and Provisional Members shall not be required to pay any entrance fee and Lady Members shall pay an entrance fee equal to one-half of the amount of the entrance fee from time to time payable by Ordinary Members.

11. That paragraph (i) of By-law 3 be amended by inserting after the word "ordinary" in line 3 the word "Male".

12. That By-law 6 be deleted and the following By-law substituted therefor:—

6. Any male person who has rendered valuable service to the Club may be admitted as a Life Member of the Club. Life Members shall be entitled to the same rights and privileges and be subject to the like obligations as other Members but shall not be liable for the payment of any entrance fee or annual subscription.

13. That By-law 9 be amended by inserting after the word "than" in line 1 the words "a Life Member or" and the word "Male" after the word "Ordinary" in line 3 and by deleting the words "or an Honorary Life Member" in line 2.

14. That paragraph (a) of By-law 12 be amended by inserting the word "Male" after the word "Ordinary" in line 1.

15. That paragraph (b) of By-law 12 be deleted and the following new paragraph inserted in lieu thereof:—

- (b) As from and including the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and seventy five the annual subscription payable by Members to the Club shall be as follows:—
- (i) Ordinary Male Members ordinarily residing within a radius of 80 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, \$85.
  - (ii) Ordinary Male Members ordinarily residing outside a radius of 80 kilometres of the General Post Office, Perth, \$75.
  - (iii) Junior Male Members, \$40.
  - (iv) Lady Members, \$40.

16. That paragraph (c) of By-law 12 be amended by deleting the word "Non-effective" in line 2.

17. That paragraph (d) of By-law 12 be amended by deleting the word "Non-effective" in lines 1 and 2.

18. That By-law 17 be deleted and the following By-law substituted therefor:—

17. Any member whose name is on the "Absent List" shall not be entitled to any of the privileges of a member and so long as his name shall be included therein he shall in lieu of the annual subscription for the time being payable under By-law 12 pay an annual subscription of \$10.00 provided always that any such member may at any time on his return to the State pay his annual subscription for the current year and resume his former membership of the Club.

19. That By-law 19 be amended by inserting in line 3 the words "Ordinary Male Members or Life" after the word "twelve".

20. That paragraph (a) of By-law 20 be deleted and the following new by-law substituted therefor:—

- (a) Unless he is a Life Member or has been an Ordinary Male Member of the Club for at least eighteen months immediately prior to the General Meeting at which the election is to take place and no person shall be eligible to nominate for election to the Committee or to hold office as a Committeeman if he be a Steward or Committeeman of any other race club, trotting club, greyhound racing club or Tattersall's Club.

21. That paragraph (a) of By-law 24 be amended by inserting after the word "every" in line 2 the words "Life Member and every Ordinary Male".

22. That paragraph (f) of By-law 34 be amended by deleting the word "Non-effective" in line 1 thereof and by substituting the word "is" for the word "becomes" in line 3.

23. That By-law 39 be deleted and by substituting therefor the following:—

39. (a) The Rules of Racing of the Club shall consist of the Australian Rules of Racing as promulgated from time to time by the Conference of Principal Clubs of Australia and of such Local Rules (including Rules of Betting) as the Committee may from time to time make or adopt.

(b) No new Local Rule and no repeal or alteration of a Local Rule shall take effect until it has been published in one issue of the Racing Calendar.

(c) The Rules of Racing shall apply to all race meetings conducted by or with the sanction of the Club and shall also apply to the working and management of any Totalisator controlled by the Club or any affiliated Club.

24. That By-law 53 be amended by inserting after the word "each" in line 3, the words "Life Member and Ordinary Male".

25. That By-law 54 be amended by inserting after the word "any" first appearing in line 1 the words "Life Member or Ordinary Male".

26. That By-law 66 be deleted and the following By-law substituted therefor:—

66. The divisions into which the racecourses for the time being belonging to the Club, with the buildings, erections, and fences thereon, are parcelled out and known, are as follows:—

- (1) The Grand Stand, the Lawn, the Members' Car Parks and approaches.
- (2) The Weighing Yard, the Committee Room, the Committee Stand, the Stewards' Room, the Stewards' Stand, the Judge's Box and approaches.
- (3) The Saddling Paddock.
- (4) The Outer Car Parks and approaches.
- (5) The Course proper.
- (6) The Training ground and approaches.
- (7) The Members' Stand.
- (8) The Male Members' Stand.
- (9) The Totalisator Building.
- (10) Jockeys' and Trainers' Stands.
- (11) The Leger.

27. That By-law 79 be amended:—

- (a) by deleting the words "for any race meeting" in line 1;
- (b) by deleting the words "said racecourse" in line 3 and substituting therefor the words "Club's Racecourses";
- (c) by inserting after the word "or" secondly appearing in line 4 the words "by the"; and
- (d) by substituting the word "racecourses" for the word "racecourse" in line 5.

28. That By-law 80 be deleted and the following By-law substituted therefor:—

80. No person shall, without permission of the Secretary remain on any racecourse belonging to the Club or on any part thereof for a longer period after the last race of the day shall have been run than the Committee shall from time to time determine.

- (d) Such Rules, Regulations and Conditions as may be adopted or promulgated from time to time by the Committee relative to the management, conduct and control of racing and race meetings (including training) and the use of Racecourses and the facilities thereof.

#### PART V.—DEFINITION.

95. Unless repugnant to the sense or context whenever in these By-laws used the Male shall include the Female and *vice versa* and the singular shall include the plural.
