ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 1214/74; M.W.S. 60891/75, Vol. 3.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1974, and by section 7 of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1972, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council constitute a Country Water Area, and from time to time alter or extend the boundaries of a Country Water Area, and of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or of any District thereof; and whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of and constitute the said areas as hereinafter described: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, doth hereby order and declare that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Areas are hereby altered by excising therefrom, and that the Carilla Country Water Area is hereby constituted by including therein, the land as defined in the schedule attached hereto and the name Carilla Country Water Area is assigned thereto.


