Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by Section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas the Bank of New South Wales, of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that

it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25 000.00) given by the Bank charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Bank of New South Wales of St. George's Terrace, Perth, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975, for a period expiring on 31st day of March, 1978.

- Principal rules. 1. In these Rules the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1971 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th November, 1971, as amended from time to time are referred to as the principal rules.
- Commencement. 2. These Rules shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- Order 81C added. 3. The principal rules are amended by adding after Order 81B the following order:—

ORDER 81C.

**Applications under Sections 76 and 78 of the
Road Traffic Act, 1974.**

- Interpretation. 1. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears—
“the Act” means the Road Traffic Act, 1974;
“the Authority” means the Road Traffic Authority established under section 6 of the Act and includes an officer of that Authority acting on its behalf.
- Application by notice of motion. 2. An application under subsection (1) or (7) of section 76 of the Act or under section 78 of the Act shall be made to the Court by filing a notice of motion setting out clearly and concisely the grounds upon which the application is made.
- Return of motion and date of hearing. 3. The motion shall be made returnable in open court at such civil, criminal, or circuit sittings as the Court directs, and shall be heard on such date as is fixed in accordance with this Order and with the practice of the Court by the proper officer.
- Applications pursuant to ss. 76(1), 76(7) (a) or 78. 4. In the case of an application under subsection (1) or paragraph (a) of subsection (7) of section 76 of the Act or under section 78 of the Act—
(a) the date fixed for the hearing of the application shall not be less than twenty-one clear days after the day the notice of motion is filed unless—
(i) the Authority consents, in writing, to the hearing being held within that period and that consent is filed with the notice of motion; or
(ii) the Court orders that the hearing be held within that period;

- (b) as soon as practicable after the date for the hearing has been fixed by the proper officer the applicant shall give notice thereof to the Crown Prosecutor and the Authority;
- (c) there shall be filed with the notice of motion affidavits setting out the facts relied on to support the application, including such an affidavit by the applicant;
- (d) on the day the notice of motion is filed or on the next day thereafter the applicant shall serve a copy of the notice of motion and of each affidavit filed therewith, as required by this Rule, on the Crown Prosecutor and the Authority, each of whom—
 - (i) shall be entitled to be heard on the application and to file affidavits in answer to those so filed with the notice of motion;
 - (ii) shall, if intending to be heard on the application, file a notice to that effect on which shall be endorsed an address for service in Perth;
 - (iii) shall serve on the applicant a copy of any affidavit or notice of intention to be heard filed under this paragraph on the day it is filed or on the next day thereafter;
- (e) the applicant shall be present in the Court on the hearing of his application and if so required by the Court shall give oral evidence in support of the application and submit himself to cross-examination, unless his presence is excused by the Court.

5. In the case of an application under paragraph (b) of subsection (7) of section 76 of the Act—

- (a) the date fixed for the hearing of the application shall not be less than twenty-one clear days after the day the notice of motion is filed unless the Court orders that the hearing be held within that period;
- (b) as soon as practicable after the date for the hearing has been fixed by the proper officer the Authority shall give notice thereof to the holder of the extraordinary licence to which the application relates;
- (c) there shall be filed with the notice of motion affidavits setting out the facts relied on to support the application;
- (d) on the day the notice of motion is filed or on the next day thereafter the Authority shall serve a copy of the notice of motion and of each affidavit filed therewith, as required by this Rule, on the holder of the extraordinary licence to which the application relates, who—
 - (i) shall be entitled to be heard on the application and to file affidavits in answer to those so filed with the notice of motion;
 - (ii) shall, if he intends to be heard on the application, file a notice to that effect on which notice shall be endorsed an address for service in Perth;
 - (iii) shall serve on the Authority a copy of any affidavit or notice of intention to be heard filed under this paragraph, on the day it is so filed or on the next day thereafter.

(1) Subject to paragraph (2), where an affidavit has been filed under this Order, the party on whose behalf the affidavit was filed shall produce the deponent for cross-examination if so required by another party, and if the deponent does not attend for cross-examination the affidavit shall not be used as evidence unless by special leave of the Court.

(2) In the case of an application referred to in Rule 4, paragraph (1) does not apply to or in relation to an affidavit made by the applicant.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN TROTTING ASSOCIATION.

AT a meeting held on the 23rd day of March, 1976, the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association by an absolute majority resolved as follows:—

That there be inserted after Rule 92A the following rules for the Tierce Totalisator and the Doubles Totalisator which rules shall be numbered 92B and 92C, respectively.

TIERCE TOTALISATOR.

92B. (1) This rule shall apply to the Tierce Totalisator.

(2) The Association may conduct a Tierce Totalisator on such races at such meetings as it shall determine.

(3) The definitions of "dividend", "place", "pool" and "ticket" contained in sub-rule 3 of rule 92A of these rules shall apply to these sub-rules as to the Tierce Totalisator as if the same were set out herein at length save that the word "Tierce" shall be deemed inserted therein in lieu of the word "Trifecta" where the same appears therein.

(4) The investor on the Tierce Totalisator shall nominate three horses to fill the first, second and third places irrespective of the order in which those horses are placed. A horse shall be nominated by reference to its official number for the race.

(5) A winning combination shall be:

(a) In the event of there being no dead heat any combination which consists of the horses placed first, second and third irrespective of the order in which those horses are placed.

(b) If there shall be a dead heat then—

(i) In the event of there being a dead heat for first place between more than three horses every combination of three of the horses which so dead heat.

(ii) In the event of there being a dead heat for second place between two horses the combination of the horse placed first and the two horses which dead heat for second.

(iii) In the event of there being a dead heat for second between more than two horses each combination of the horse placed first and any two of the horses which so dead heat for second place.

(iv) In the event of a dead heat for third each combination of the horses placed first and second and one of the horses placed third.

(6) A ticket which nominates for any place a horse which is declared to be a non-starter shall be void and an investor who holds such a ticket shall on production of the same be entitled to a refund of the amount invested on that ticket.

(7) (a) If there is no dead heat for any of the first three placings the dividend to be declared and paid on each winning ticket shall be calculated by dividing the pool by the number of tickets taken on the winning combination.

(b) In the event of there being more than one winning combination the pool shall be divided equally into such number of sub-pools as there are winning combinations upon which one or more tickets are taken and one such sub-pool shall be allocated to each such winning combination and the dividend payable on each winning combination shall be ascertained by dividing the sub-pool so allocated to that winning combination by the number of tickets taken on that winning combination.

(8) In declaring dividends no fractional part of five cents (\$0.05) shall be declared.

(9) If—

(i) there shall be one winning combination and no ticket is taken on that winning combination, or

(ii) there is more than one winning combination and no ticket is taken on any of the winning combinations,

the pool shall at the discretion of the Committee of the Association either be carried forward and added to the Tierce Totalisator pool of a race upon which a Tierce Totalisator is to be conducted at that meeting or to the Tierce Totalisator pool of a race upon which the Tierce Totalisator is to be conducted at a later meeting or at such discretion as aforesaid shall be divided into such number of parts as the Committee of the Association shall in its sole discretion determine and each such part shall be carried forward and added to the pool of the Tierce Totalisator in respect of such race upon which the Tierce Totalisator is to be conducted by the Association as the Committee shall determine either at that meeting or at some later meeting to be conducted by the Association.

DOUBLES TOTALISATOR.

92C. (1) This rule shall apply to the Doubles Totalisator.

(2) The Association may conduct a Doubles Totalisator on a combination of any two races which are to be run at the same meeting or at different meetings.

(3) (a) In these sub-rules the words "dividend", "place", "pool" and "ticket" shall have the same meaning as in sub-rule (3) of Rule 92A save that for the purposes of this rule the definition of "pool" shall be read as if the word "Doubles" appeared therein in lieu of the word "Trifecta".

(b) In these sub-rules the combination of the two races on which the Doubles Totalisator is conducted is referred to as "the Double" and each of the races on which the Double is conducted is referred to as a race.

(4) The investor on the Doubles Totalisator shall nominate a horse to fill first place in each of the two races on which the Double is to be conducted. A horse shall be nominated by reference to its official number for the race.

(5) A winning combination shall be—

(a) in the event of there being no dead-heat for first in either race the combination of the horses placed first in each of the two races,

- (b) in the event of there being a dead heat for first place in one or both of the two races of the Double each combination consisting of a horse which is placed first or which head heats for the first place in one race of the double with each of the horse or horses which is placed first or which dead heats for first place in the other race of the double.
- (6) (a) A ticket which nominates for the first race of the double a horse which is declared to be a non-starter shall be void and the investor who holds that ticket shall on production of the same to the totalisator be entitled to a refund of the amount invested on that ticket.
- (b) A ticket which nominates for the second race on which the double is to be conducted a horse which is declared to be a non-starter shall not by reason of the horse so nominated being declared to be a non-starter be entitled to a refund but such ticket shall be deemed to have nominated such horse as shall be nominated by the Association as the substitute horse for the second race of the double. Unless the Association otherwise determines the substitute horse shall be the horse which is nominated most on tickets which have correctly nominated the horse or (in the case of a dead heat) the horses placed first in the first race of the double.
- (7) (a) If only one horse is placed first in each of the two races upon which the double is conducted the dividend to be declared and paid on each winning ticket shall be calculated by dividing the pool by the number of tickets which correctly nominates the winning combination.
- (b) In the event of there being more than one winning combination then subject to the provisions of paragraph (c) of this sub-rule the pool shall be divided equally into such number of sub-pools as there are winning combinations and one such sub-pool shall be allocated to each such winning combination and the dividend payable on each winning combination shall be ascertained by dividing the sub-pool so allocated to that winning combination by the number of tickets taken on that winning combination.
- (c) In the event of no ticket being issued on any one of the winning combinations then before calculating the dividends payable on the other winning combinations the sum allocated to the sub-pool for the winning combinations on which no tickets have been issued shall be divided equally between all of the sub-pools allocated to winning combinations on which tickets have been so issued.
- (8) (a) In the event of the abandonment of either the first race or of both races upon which the double is proposed to be conducted all investments on the double shall be refunded in full to investors upon presentation of the ticket.
- (b) In the event of the abandonment of the second race of the double after the first race shall have been run then a dividend shall be determined and declared in respect of the double by dividing the pool by the number of tickets which correctly nominate the horse which is placed first in the first race of the double PROVIDED THAT in the event of a dead heat for first place between more horses than one in such first race then the pool shall be divided into such number of sub-pools as there shall be horses which so dead heat and which are nominated to win the first race and one such sub-pool shall be allocated to each horse which so dead heats and which is no nominated and the dividend on each such horse shall be determined by dividing the sub-pool allocated to that horse by the number of tickets which nominates it as the winner of such first race.
- (9) In declaring dividends no fractional part of five cents (\$0.05) shall be declared.
- (10) If—
- (a) there shall be one winning combination and no ticket is taken on that winning combination, or
- (b) there is more than one winning combination and no ticket is taken on any of the winning combinations,
- the pool shall at the discretion of the Committee of the Association either be carried forward and added to the pool in respect of any other double which the Association may conduct under this rule or at such discretion as aforesaid shall be divided into such proportions as the Committee of the Association shall in its sole discretion determine and one such portion thereof shall be carried forward and added to the pool of the Doubles Totalisator in respect of such doubles as may be conducted under this rule as the Committee shall determine.
- (11) The Association may permit investments on any double conducted under this rule by investors both on the course and off the course.


THE Environmental Protection Authority invites submissions on areas that should be set aside for recreational purposes and as national parks and nature reserves in Western Australia's System 6.

- (6) It shall be lawful for the lessee at any time within the three calendar months immediately following the expiration of the term or earlier determination of the lease, to take down, remove, and carry away any buildings, structures, improvement and plant the property of the lessee.
- (7) The lessee shall, within twelve months from commencement of the lease, fence the external boundaries with a stock-proof fence to the satisfaction of the Minister.
- (8) On determination of the lease, the lessee shall fill in, consolidate and level off any unevenness, excavation or hole caused by him during the term of the lease or by removal of his improvements and shall leave the demised land in a clean, neat and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands and shall remove any or all waste matter as required by the Minister.
- (9) The lessee shall indemnify the Minister against all claims for damage to property or persons arising from the use of the land.
- (10) Power is reserved to the Minister for Lands to direct that the number of stock depasturing on the demised land shall be reduced if the Minister is of the opinion that the demised land is overstocked to an extent sufficient or likely to cause permanent damage to the land; failure to comply with any such direction will result in the forfeiture of the lease.

Applications accompanied by a deposit of \$14.00 must be lodged at the Lands and Surveys Department, Perth on or before Wednesday 5th May, 1976.

In the event of more applications than one being received, the application to be granted will be determined by the Land Board.

SHIRE OF PEPPERMINT GROVE TOWN
PLANNING SCHEME NO. 2.

THE Peppermint Grove Shire Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of zoning and classifying land within the Peppermint Grove District and regulating development thereon.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Peppermint Grove Town Planning Scheme No. 2 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the Shire of Peppermint Grove.

1.3 The Scheme is complementary to, and not a substitute for, the Metropolitan Region Scheme, and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time, shall continue to have effect.

1.4 The Shire of Peppermint Grove Town Planning Scheme No. 1 which was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of March, 1961, and subsequently amended from time to time, is hereby revoked.

1.5 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Peppermint Grove (hereinafter referred to as the Council) except that where land is shown in the Scheme Map as "Regional Reservation" the responsible authority shall be deemed to be the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority, and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959, shall apply to such reservations.

1.6 Arrangement of the Scheme—

The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Reserved Land.
- Part III.—Zones.
- Part IV.—Non-Conforming Uses.
- Part V.—General Provisions.
- Part VI.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.

1.7 Interpretation:

In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

Within this Scheme "Service Station" means premises for the retail sale of liquid fuel and oil and the servicing of vehicles and the sale of other goods and services normally associated therewith, but shall not include workshops for the repair of vehicles, panel beating or spray painting.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map, and the reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme are shown in the Scheme in order to comply with the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part, a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

(e) Reservations under the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme: Any application for development on land reserved or abutting a reserve defined in the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme shall

be referred to the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for determination in accordance with section 29 of the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme.

2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal or approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Scheme, the Council may, with the consent of the Minister, or when required by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority so to do, shall require that the development of any land within the district, however zoned, shall be subject to the provisions of clauses 10, 24 and 30 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

3.2 The Scheme area is divided into 9 types of zones set out hereunder:—

- Residential.
- General Residential Class 5 (GR5).
- Group Housing.
- Civic, Cultural and Educational.
- Commercial.
- Retail Shopping.
- Car Parks.
- Special Use (Service Station).
- Special Use (Physiotherapy Clinic).

3.3 Table No. 1 appended to clause 3.4 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.4 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:

- "P" A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
- "AA" A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- "IP" A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
- "X" A use that is not permitted.

3.5 The uses of the following zones have been excluded from the Table and their use may be determined by reference to the Scheme Map and shall exclude any other use not incidental to that use.

- Service Station Zone.
- Physiotherapy Clinic Zone.

3.6 If a particular use or purpose is not mentioned in the list of use classes or is not included in the general terms of any of the use classes the Council shall on application determine the zone if any in which the use may be permitted and may impose such conditions on the use as it considers appropriate.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended) or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

Provided that where the provisions of any By-law referred to in this clause are inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme then the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than to the existing use, or is, in the opinion of the Council, closer to the intended uses of the Zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

(a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

(b) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

4.5 Destruction of Buildings: If any building or structure is at the gazetted date being lawfully used for a non-conforming use and is subsequently destroyed or damaged to an extent of more than seventy five per cent of its value no such land shall be altered except to conform to this Scheme and the building shall not be rebuilt, altered or added to for the purpose of being used for a non-conforming use or in a manner or position not permitted by this Scheme unless approval to do so is granted by the Council.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 In any new subdivision of land within the Commercial Zone a rear access way is to be provided for services and off-street loading and such rear access way shall be a minimum width of 6.10 metres with either a turning circle or return access.

5.2 The development of land for flats within the Shire shall comply with the provisions of the General Residential Zone—Class 5 (GR5) Code of the amendment to the Uniform Building By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* dated 11th March, 1966.

5.3 (a) No building or any part of a building having a greater height than 6 metres shall be erected or built in any Zone within this Scheme unless and until the Council has approved the design subject to the principles herein contained, and the following conditions have been complied with:—

- (i) The Council is satisfied that such building will not destroy local amenities.
- (ii) Such building to be designed and inspected during course of construction by a Registered Architect or qualified Engineer, or both.
- (iii) In considering the design of any such building within the General Residential Zone the Council shall take into consideration the relationship which such building or buildings proposed within the area bear to the development or public utilities, amenities and other uses planned for the area considered as a whole.
- (iv) In considering the design of any building within the Commercial, Civic, Cultural and Education, Retail Shopping and Special Uses Zones the Council shall take into consideration the provision in the zone for car parking space, vehicular access, pedestrian ways, and general layout relative to the development uses proposed for the whole zone and within this zone single lots shall be considered as part of a general design for the whole zone.

(b) The Council may appoint an advisory Committee consisting of the President or his nominee and three Architects selected by the Council and approved by the Royal Australian Institute of Architects, W.A. Chapter, to advise the Council on all questions of design and other matters falling within this clause.

(c) All buildings shall be maintained by the owner and occupier thereof so as to preserve the amenities of the locality.

5.4 If a person shall have applied for approval to commence development and the Council shall have refused such approval or granted it subject to conditions unacceptable to the applicant he may appeal either to the Minister for Town Planning or to the Town Planning Court as provided in Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act.

5.5 Building Alignments: The building line for any building, subject as hereinafter provided be as follows:—

- (a) For land in a residential zone 9.0 metres from the alignment of the street on which such land abuts, unless the Council in its discretion determines that the building line in any special case or cases may be less than 9.0 metres from such alignment.
- (b) For land in a Commercial Zone—3.0 metres from the alignment of the street on which such land abuts (in respect of those lots fronting Stirling Highway) and 6.0 metres elsewhere.
- (c) For land in the Retail Shopping Zone 3.0 metres from the alignment of the street on which the land abuts unless the Council in its discretion determines that the building line in any special case or cases shall be less than 3.0 metres from such alignment.
- (d) The building line and distances from side and rear boundaries in respect of professional chamber and office buildings in the General Residential Zone Class 5 (GR5) shall be as determined by Council in each particular case.
- (e) For all other lands 9.0 metres from the alignment of the street on which the land abuts.
- (f) Where in a residential zone or a commercial zone a parcel of land abuts on more than one street, the principal building may be erected to within 3.0 metres (but not nearer than 3.0 metres to) such of those streets as the Council may determine.
- (g) Prohibition: Subject to the aforesaid no building shall be erected nearer to the street than the building line.

5.6 No land shall be built on until it is drained and provision made for the disposal of roof water and household or trade waste as the case may be to the satisfaction of the responsible authority.

5.7 (a) No land shall be subdivided or resubdivided so that any lot to be used for residential purposes with or without a shop shall be less than 740 m².

(b) In the Civic, Cultural and Educational Zone no parcel of land shall be used for the purpose of a school unless it has an area of 4 000 m² per hundred pupils, with a minimum area of 8 000 square metres.

(c) The minimum area of land on which a shop shall be erected (inclusive of the open spaces at the front and rear thereof) shall be 186 m² with a minimum frontage of 6.0 metres.

5.8 No land shall be subdivided or resubdivided if the effect of such subdivision or resubdivision is that the use of any lot forming part of such subdivision or resubdivision is, as to area or otherwise, not then in conformity with any provision of this Scheme.

5.9 Amenity Control:

- (a) Vehicle Parking and Loading: The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of the land

so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or who substantially reconstructs alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision in accordance with the requirements of Table II for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees or other persons) to stand on, or, in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the site but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.

- (b) Size and location of Car Space: The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be 5.5 metres by 2.5 metres, excluding all access drives. When considering any development application, the Council shall have regard to and impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces. In particular the Council shall take into account, and may impose conditions concerning:
 - (i) the proportion of car spaces to be roofed or covered,
 - (ii) the proportion of car spaces to be below natural ground level,
 - (iii) the means of access to each car space and the adequacy of any vehicular manoeuvring area,
 - (iv) the location of the car spaces on the site, and their effect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect if these spaces should later be roofed or covered,
 - (v) the extent to which car spaces are located within required building set back areas,
 - (vi) the location of proposed public footpaths, vehicular crossings, or private footpaths within the lot and the effect on both pedestrians and vehicular traffic movement and safety,
 - (vii) the suitability and adequacy of proposed screening or natural planting,
 - (viii) the suitability and adequacy of elevated structural decks for suitable development and service as a proportion of the required area for natural planting and pedestrian space.

- (c) Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided: The number of spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by Council having regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volumes of goods, materials or people moving to and from the site, and where the use is stipulated, no less than the number of spaces set down in Table II hereunder.

10. Administrative, commercial and Professional offices	1 to every 37 square metres of gross floor area or 1 to every 2 employees whichever is the greater.

(d) Preservation of amenities: No building shall be so constructed or finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of adjoining property. Further, all land and buildings shall be so used and maintained as to preserve the amenities of the neighbourhood in which they are situated.

(e) Traffic Entrances: If, in the opinion of Council, separate entrances to and exits from any lot for road vehicles are desirable for the avoidance of traffic hazards on public roads adjacent thereto it may require the owner to provide such entrances and exits as it may direct.

(f) Nothing in this Clause shall preclude the Council from varying the standards laid down where, in the opinion of Council, such variation is justified in the best interest of the proper control and development of the area.

5.10 Development in Group Houses Zone: Development in the Group Houses Zone shall be subject to the following conditions:

- The maximum permissible plot ratio shall be .50.
- The maximum site coverage shall be 40 per cent.
- No building shall exceed two storeys in height.

PART VI.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

6.5 Appeal Rights: The procedure for the lodgement and determination of appeals shall be as laid down in Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act and the Regulations made under that Act.






