Movement of Towed Agricultural Implements.


I, REGINALD JAMES COURT, Chairman of the Road Traffic Authority acting pursuant to Regulation 1101(6) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1975 do hereby rescind the order published in the *Government Gazette* of 20th February, 1976, and all previous orders published under this Regulation, and direct that the movement of agricultural implements exceeding 2.5 metres in width or 16.8 metres in length, including the towing vehicle, may be made during the hours between sunrise and sunset subject to the following conditions:—

- 1.0 Main Roads and Important Secondary Roads shown in the schedule hereto—
 - 1.1 The movement of towed agricultural implements not exceeding 4.9 metres in width or 18.3 metres in length, including the towing vehicle, is authorised by virtue of this direction alone.
 - 1.2 The movement of towed agricultural implements exceeding 4.9 metres but not 8.5 metres in width is authorised by a permit issued under Regulation 1101(6) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1975 by an officer of the Authority, Traffic Inspector or Police Officer.
 - 1.3 All movements to be made in accordance with the General Conditions specified hereunder.
- 2.0 On roads other than those shown in the schedule hereto movements may be made by virtue of this direction alone, subject to the General Conditions listed hereunder.
- 3.0 General Conditions.
 - 3.1 Overwidth.
 - 3.1.1 Where the width of the towed agricultural implement exceeds 2.5 metres but not 3.0 metres, the weight of the implement is not to exceed the weight of the towing vehicle and warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement.
 - 3.1.2 Where the width of the towed agricultural implement exceeds 3 metres but not 4.9 metres, the towing vehicle is to be a tractor or wagon with a tare exceeding 2 032 kg, and warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement. Warning signs indicating that the implement is overwidth are to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement.
 - 3.1.3 Where the width of the towed agricultural implement exceeds 4.9 metres but not 8.5 metres, the towing vehicle is to be a tractor or wagon with a tare exceeding 2 032 kg, warning flags are to be affixed to each lateral extremity of the implement. Warning signs indicating that the implement is overwidth are to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement. The towing vehicle is to be preceded by a pilot vehicle bearing a sign that an overwidth tow follows.
 - 3.1.4 Agricultural implements exceeding 8.5 metres in width are not permitted to be moved on roads without the special approval of the Chief Executive Officer.
 - 3.2 Overlength.
 - 3.2.1 The movement of towed agricultural implements where the combined length of the implement and towing vehicle exceeds 18.3 metres is authorised by the issue of a permit issued under Regulation 1101 (6) of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1975 by an officer of the Authority, Traffic Inspector or a Police Officer.
 - 3.2.2 Warning signs indicating that the combined implement and towing vehicle is overlength are to be affixed to the front of the towing vehicle and the rear of the implement.
 - 3.3 "Warning flag" means a red flag of not less than 450 millimetres square.

- 3.4 "Warning sign" means a sign bearing the words "overwidth" or "overlength" or a combination of these words as may be required in black lettering 200 millimetres in height on a yellow background.
- 3.5 Warning signs are to be covered or removed on completion of the movement.
- 3.6 The implement or towing vehicle is not to be parked on the main portion of a road.
- 3.7 The movement is to be made at a speed not exceeding 35 km/h.
- 3.8 A movement of an implement exceeding 3 metres in width or of a combined implement and towing vehicle exceeding 16.8 metres is not to be made within 32 kilometres of the General Post Office Perth without the approval in writing of the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority.
- 3.9 Permits, for which no fee is payable, may be issued for a single movement or a number of movements or for a period not exceeding twelve months.
- 3.10 Additional limitations relating to time, place and circumstance may be imposed by an officer of the Authority, Traffic Inspector or a Police Officer.
- 3.11 The weight of an agricultural implement which is not overwidth or overlength may not exceed the weight of the towing vehicle.







Schedule.
Regulations.

1. In these regulations the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1927 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd June, 1927 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by adding in its appropriate numerical sequence the following passage:—

PART XB.—Metric Conversion.

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding after Part XA the following Part:—

PART XB.—METRIC CONVERSION.

1. This Part does not apply to any article packed and marked in accordance with Part IIIA of the Act and any regulations made under that Part.

2. Subject to this Part, a person shall not offer, expose, display or advertise for sale any article except at a price per unit of measurement of the physical quantity expressed—

- (a) in terms of the system of measurement which the measuring instrument used or intended to be used to obtain that measurement records; and
- (b) so as to comply with—
 - (i) the provisions of subregulation (3) of regulation 5 of this Part if the measuring instrument used or intended to be used is calibrated in the metric system; or
 - (ii) the provisions of subregulation (5) of regulation 5 of this Part if the measuring instrument used or to be used is calibrated in the imperial system,

but nothing in this regulation prevents a person from offering, exposing, displaying or advertising an article for sale in a manner that does not conform to this regulation if any other price expressed with respect to that article is less conspicuously displayed than the price expressed in the manner prescribed by this regulation.

3. Subject to this Part, in addition to any price expressed in the manner prescribed by regulation 2 of this Part, a person may express the price of an article—

- (a) in multiples of 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 20, 50, 100, 125, 200, 250, 500 of the metric system of measurement; or
- (b) in multiples of $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10 of the imperial system of measurement,

but the price so expressed shall not in any respect be displayed more conspicuously than the price expressed in the manner prescribed by regulation 2 of this Part.

4. A person shall not sell an article at a price higher than the price arrived at by multiplying the mass, volume, length or area of the article, as the case may be, by the price per unit of measurement expressed or displayed in respect of that article.

5. (1) Notwithstanding anything in this Part, but subject to subregulation (4) of this regulation, on and after the date specified in column one of Table 1 to this Part, a person shall not in any part of the State sell any article specified in column two of that Table opposite and corresponding to that date or offer, expose, display or advertise for sale any such article except at a price per unit of measurement of a physical quantity expressed in terms of the metric system in accordance with the provisions of subregulation (3) of this regulation.

(2) Notwithstanding anything in this Part, but subject to subregulation (4) of this regulation, on and after the date specified in column one of Table 2 to this Part a person shall not in any portion of the State specified in column two of that Table opposite and corresponding to that date sell any article or offer, expose or advertise any article for sale except at a price per unit of measurement of a physical quantity expressed in terms of the metric system in accordance with the provisions of subregulation (3) of this regulation.

(3) The units of measurement of physical quantities to be expressed in terms of the metric system pursuant to the provisions of subregulation (1) and subregulation (2) of this regulation shall be as follows and not otherwise—

- (a) in respect of mass—gram, kilogram or tonne;
- (b) in respect of volume—litre or cubic metre;
- (c) in respect of length—millimetre, centimetre or metre;
- (d) in respect of area—square millimetre, square centimetre or square metre.

Schedule—*continued.*

(4) Notwithstanding anything in subregulations (1), (2) and (3) of this regulation a person, in addition to expressing the price in terms of the metric system as required by those subregulations, may express the price in terms of the imperial system in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (5) of this regulation, but any price so expressed shall not in any respect be displayed more conspicuously than the price expressed in terms of the metric system.

(5) The units of measurement of physical quantities which may be expressed in terms of the imperial system pursuant to the provisions of subregulation (4) of this regulation shall be as follows and not otherwise—

- (a) in respect of mass—ounce, pound, hundredweight or ton;
- (b) in respect of volume—fluid ounce, pint, quart, gallon or cubic yard;
- (c) in respect of length—inch, foot, or yard;
- (d) in respect of area—square inch, square foot or square yard.

6. (1) Subject to subregulation (2) of this regulation, on and after the date specified in column one of Table 2 to this Part a person shall not in any part of the State specified in column two of that Table opposite and corresponding to that date use for trade or have in possession for trade any measuring instrument that is not calibrated in terms of Commonwealth legal units of measurement of the metric system.

(2) If the Chief Inspector is satisfied that in the circumstances of a particular case it is not possible for a person to obtain a measuring instrument calibrated in terms of Commonwealth legal units of measurement of the metric system for the purposes of his trade the Chief Inspector may direct in writing that that person is not required to comply with the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation until such later date as is specified by the Chief Inspector in the direction.
