



(b) Building Set-backs: The depth of set-back of a wall at any point shall be measured as the horizontal distance between that point and a point on the lot boundary (or assumed boundary between buildings) for which a line drawn perpendicular to the boundary would intersect with the given point on the wall (See Diagram 2 below).

The set-back as measured shall be increased by the extent to which an eaves or roof overhang projects by more than 0.5 metres in the case of a wall less than 6 metres height, or more than 1.8 metres in the case of a wall of more than 6 metres in height, and the relationship between building height, length and set-back

shall be as illustrated in Diagram 2 except in the case of dwelling with walls containing a major opening to a living room or giving access directly from a living room to the exterior which should not be permitted closer to a side or rear boundary than 4 metres.

- (bi) The distance between buildings on the same lot but in different occupance shall be calculated on the assumption of a boundary between the buildings, less 10%.
- (bii) The perpendicular distance between facing walls in different occupancies of a single building shall be calculated as far as possible as though they were walls of separate buildings on the same lot, but in any case the window to window distance shall be not less than 9 metres in the case of windows to habitable rooms, 18 metres in the case of living room windows or balconies opening off living rooms, or 12 metres in the case of habitable room windows facing living room window or balconies opening off living rooms.
