WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973, that where a local authority in whose district a sewerage area is situate, undertakes any works in that sewerage area and it appears after inquiry that—

- (a) the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960-1976, will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payment of the instalments of capital debt and interest on any of the works with respect to which any debt is owing; and
- (b) the local authority should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1976,

the Governor may, by proclamation, grant to the local authority such permission and may in the proclamation specify new limits of the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960-1976; and whereas the Moora Sewerage Area constituted under section 4 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973 by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on 23rd January, 1976, is within the district of the municipality of the Shire of Moora and the Shire has undertaken works within that area; and whereas it appears after inquiry that the maximum general rate that the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Moora may impose will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for

payments of the instalments of capital debt and interest on the works to which any debt is owing and that the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Moora should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1976: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred under subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973, do hereby grant to the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Moora permission to levy a general rate not exceeding forty cents (40 cents) for each dollar of the annual value of the rateable property in any year in its district that is within the Moora Sewerage Area aforesaid.

INTERPRETATION AND AMENDMENT.

THE following interpretation and amendment of the Public Service Property Allowance Award 1975, No. 16 of 1975 is published for general information.

PROPERTY ALLOWANCE AWARD, 1975.

Application for Interpretation.

THIS is an application by the Public Service Board for interpretation of Clause 5 of the Public Service Property Allowance Award 1975.

The award by its terms was designed to provide reimbursement of prescribed expenses incurred in sale and purchase of property in the circumstances there set out.

The format of the award as published followed, so far as was applicable, the claim originally lodged by the Civil Service Association Incorporated which, in its turn, had been drawn from the wording of regulations to the Public Service Act of Tasmania wherein somewhat similar provisions were contained.

For the Public Service Board it has been submitted that certain problems have arisen, that the interpretation of the clause is not free from doubt and that it is desirable that difficulties arising should be clarified for the benefit of all concerned.

In bringing down the award it was quite clearly intended that payment of an allowance in cases where a person purchased a property without a corresponding sale was subject to the discretion of the Public Service Board, if satisfied of certain conditions as set out in subsection (5) of clause 5. That this was so is evident from page 4 of the reasons for decision in support of the Award wherein the subsection is indicated to be a reasonable limitation on entitlement and passing reference is made to the very restrictive interpretation applied by the Tasmanian Public Service Board.

The interpretation of the clause in the form sought by the Board is not opposed by the Association and I rule that the true meaning of clause 5 where, in the circumstances contemplated by the Award, an officer purchases a residence, or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon for his own permanent occupation, in a new locality without a corresponding sale of a residence in the old locality the payment of a property allowance in respect of such purchase is subject to the Public Service Board being satisfied, in the exercise of its discretion, that it was necessary for the officer to purchase—

- (a) a residence; or
- (b) land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon,

in the new locality because of his transfer from the old locality.

If the clause in its present form is liable to give rise to problems of interpretation it would seem desirable that, pursuant to the power conferred by Section 24 subsection (2) of the Public Service Arbitration Act, the Award be amended to remove any doubts that may arise in the future. A draft amendment to Clause 5 has been submitted which the Association has indicated is acceptable and the award will be amended by deleting the present clause 5 and substituting therefore a new clause in the following terms.

5.—Property Allowance.

(1) When an officer is transferred from one locality to another in the public interest or in the ordinary course of promotion or transfer, or on

account of illness due to causes over which he has no control, he shall be entitled to be paid a property allowance for reimbursement of prescribed expenses incurred by him—

- (a) In the sale of a residence in his former locality, which, at the date on which he received notice of his transfer to his new locality—
 - (i) he owned and occupied; or
 - (ii) he was purchasing under a contract of sale providing for vacant possession; or
 - (iii) he was constructing for his own permanent occupation, on completion of construction; and
- (b) in the purchase of a residence or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon for his own permanent occupation in his new locality.

(2) An officer is not entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1) (b) unless he is entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1) (a); provided that the Public Service Board may approve the payment of a property allowance under subclause (1) (b) to an officer who is not entitled to be paid a property allowance under subclause (1) (a) if the Board is satisfied that it was necessary for the officer to purchase a residence or land for the purpose of erecting a residence thereon in this new locality because of his transfer from his former locality.

(3) For the purpose of this Award it is immaterial that the ownership, sale or purchase is—

- (a) in the case of married officer, solely or jointly or in common with—
 - (i) his spouse
 - (ii) a dependent relative or
 - (iii) his spouse and a dependent relative
- (b) in the case of any other officer, solely or jointly or in common with a dependent relative living with him.

(4) Where the officer sells or purchases a residence jointly or in common with another person—not being a person referred to in subclause (3)—he shall be paid only the proportion of the prescribed expenses for which he is responsible.

(5) An application by an officer for a property allowance shall be accompanied by evidence of the payment by the officer of the prescribed expenses, being evidence that is satisfactory to the Board.

(6) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, an officer is not entitled to the payment of a property allowance—

- (a) in respect of a sale or purchase prescribed in subclause (1) which is effected—
 - (i) more than twelve months after date on which he took up duty in his new locality; or
 - (ii) after the date on which he received notification that he was being transferred back to his former locality;

provided that the Board may, in exceptional circumstances grant an extension of time for such period as is deemed reasonable.

- (b) where the officer is transferred from one locality to another solely at his own request or on account of misconduct.

Regulations

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Food and Drug Regulations, 1961, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th January, 1962, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 3 amended. 2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the item "A.07. PESTICIDE RESIDUES ON FOOD," appearing under the heading "PART A.—GENERAL REGULATIONS:" the item "A.07. PESTICIDE RESIDUES IN FOOD."
- Reg. A.07 substituted. 3. The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation A.07 of Part A and substituting the following regulation:—

A.07. PESTICIDE RESIDUES IN FOOD

A.07.001. Interpretations

- (a) Pesticide Residue
- (i) A pesticide residue is a residue in or on a food of any pesticide or any substance that may be derived from a pesticide.
 - (ii) The amount of pesticide residue shall be expressed in milligrams of the substance or derivatives per kilogram of the food.
- (b) Maximum Residue Limit
- (i) A maximum residue limit is the maximum concentration of a pesticide residue that is permitted in or on a food.
 - (ii) The concentration of a pesticide shall be expressed in milligrams of the pesticide per kilogram of the food.

A.07.002.

Where a combination of any or all of the substances set out in one of the groups specified in Schedule 2 to this regulation is present in food, the sum of the fractions obtained by dividing the quantity of substance present by the maximum quantity of each substance permitted to be present if used alone shall not exceed unity.

A.07.003. Prohibition

A person shall not sell any food specified in column three of Schedule 1 to this regulation or any manufactured food of which a food specified in that column of that Schedule is a constituent if:—

- (a) that food, or the manufactured food of which that food is a constituent, as the case requires, contains a pesticide residue set out in the first column of that Schedule opposite the name of the food or constituent food; and
- (b) the amount of the pesticide residue in the food or manufactured food exceeds the maximum residue limit specified in column 2 of that Schedule in relation to that food.

A.07.004. Analysis

(a) For the purpose of analysis the food to be examined shall consist of the whole food.

(b) The result of such analysis shall be expressed in milligrams of the pesticide residue per kilogram of the whole food, except in the following foods:—

- (i) crown tissue and stalk shall be removed from bananas and discarded;
- (ii) shells shall be removed and discarded from nuts;
- (iii) caps (hulls) shall be removed and discarded from strawberries;
- (iv) stems shall be removed and discarded from melons;
- (v) stems and outer sheaths (or husks) shall be removed and discarded from ears of corn (*Zea mays*) and only the corn kernels shall be examined;
- (vi) where a maximum residue limit is established on a root vegetable including tops, or with tops, and the tops and the roots are marketed together they shall be analysed separately and neither the pesticide nor the agricultural chemical residues on the roots nor the pesticide or agricultural chemical residues on the tops shall exceed the maximum residue limit;
- (vii) the crowns (leaves at the top of the fruit) shall be removed and discarded from pineapples;
- (viii) skin shall be removed from passionfruit;
- (ix) shells shall be removed from eggs;
- (x) stones shall be removed from drupes.

(h) the weight supported on any tandem axle of which one axle is fitted with dual tyres and the other with single tyres exceeds 11 200 kg; or

(i) the weight supported on any tyre exceeds either the carrying capacity of the tyre or of the rim to which that tyre is fitted, as prescribed by any regulation made under the Act,

the owner and the driver of the vehicle and any person who so uses the vehicle or permits or suffers a person to so drive or use the vehicle, each commits an offence. ;

(8) Where a goods vehicle is driven or used on a road the owner and the driver of the vehicle, and any person who so uses the vehicle or permits or suffers a person to so drive or use the vehicle, each commits an offence unless the aggregate weight of the vehicle and the tare distinguished respectively, by the letters "A" and "T", are painted, on the right hand side of the vehicle, in block letters and numerals of at least 50 millimetres in height, and are maintained, so as to be clearly legible at a distance of 5 metres. ; and



Every person contravening the provisions of this By-Law is liable to a maximum penalty of two hundred dollars and in addition a maximum daily penalty of twenty dollars for each day during which the offence continues; minimum penalty of twenty dollars and in addition a minimum daily penalty of two dollars for each day during which the offence continues.

By-Laws Relating to Dogs.

LG. GR-7-18.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th April, 1975 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

1. In these by-laws the term Council shall mean the Greenough Shire Council.
2. All previous By-laws relating to dogs are hereby repealed.

PART I.—IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

3. The Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1972.
4. A dog seized by the Police or by an officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.
5. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Council shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
6. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of the dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.
7. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such time and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
8. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
9. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner, the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council may sell such dog.
10. Upon the sale of a dog, the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and shall be paid into the ordinary revenue of the Council. The owner of a dog sold in pursuance of these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.
11. If within the time mentioned in by-law 9 thereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fee paid and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.
12. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the Dog Act 1903-1972 any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the Authority of the Shire Clerk or the Council if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.
13. If the council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the Schedule hereto.
14. No person shall—
 - (a) Unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
 - (b) Destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog proof any pound;
 - (c) Destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with any car, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.
15. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1903-1972 or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.
16. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.
17. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of by-laws 3 to 17 (both inclusive) of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars (\$20).

PART II.—REGULATION OF DOG KENNELS.

18. Where the owner or occupier of any premises keeps or permits or suffers to be kept more than two dogs on the premises at the one time the Council may declare such premises to be premises to which the provision of this part of these By-laws apply and on premises so declared dogs shall be kept in an approved kennel or kennels and registered with the Council as hereinafter provided.

19. The occupier of any premises whereon more than two dogs are kept or permitted or suffered to remain and such premises have been declared by the Council pursuant to the preceding by-law shall provide a kennel or kennels which shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 6 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 24 metres from the front road or street.
- (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 9 metres from any dwelling, house, church, schoolroom, hall or factory.
- (e) The walls shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound.
- (f) The roof shall be constructed of some impervious material.
- (g) All external surfaces of galvanised iron, wood or asbestos material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint.
- (h) The lowest internal height shall be at least 1.2 metres from the floor.
- (i) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 1.8 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting.
- (j) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (k) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface. It shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100. The entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the Health requirements of the Council.
- (l) The floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in the next proceeding paragraph.
- (m) For each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 2.3 square metres.
- (n) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an Officer of the Council.

20. Council shall not permit the establishment or maintenance of a kennel in any area if in the opinion of the Council such kennel would adversely affect the environment, be a nuisance to other residents or in any way otherwise be detrimental or prejudicial.

21. The occupier of any premises which have been declared by the Council shall not allow, permit or suffer any dog to be at large or roam outside the kennel or yard.

22. No kennel shall be erected unless, and until plans, specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.

23. Council may not approve or register a kennel until the occupier of the premises had advertised in a public newspaper his intention to establish a kennel upon the premises and Council has considered any objections raised to the maintenance of the kennel upon the premises.

Approved kennels shall be registered by the Council on receipt of the fee prescribed in the Schedule and shall be subject to annual review before renewal.

24. Any person who shall commit a breach of any By-laws 18 to 24 (both inclusive) of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars.

PART III.—GENERAL.

25. No person shall permit a dog to wander at large and shall keep such dog chained or under effective control at all times.

26. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre or picture garden.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) A shop or other public business premises.

27. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sports ground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (c) A car park.
- (d) Any land vested in or under the control of the Council (not being a road or street).
- (e) Any public swimming area or beach.

28. The occupier of any premises where a dog is kept or permitted or suffered to remain shall not allow such dog by continuous barking to be a nuisance to any inhabitant or inhabitants in the neighbourhood.

29. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of By-laws 25 to 28 (both inclusive) of these By-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Dollars.

30. Dogs used in the droving, tending or in the management of livestock under the control of the owner or employees shall not be deemed to come within the provisions of By-law 27 of this part.

Swimming Pool By-laws.

L.G. PL-7-15.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 17th day of October, 1975, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Plantagenet.

“Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk or acting Shire Clerk of the Shire of Plantagenet.

“Pool Manager” means the Manager or other person appointed for the time being by the Council to have control and management of the Pool premises and such term shall include the Assistant Manager.

“Attendant” means an employee of the Council or a person authorised by Council performing any duties on or in connection with the Pool premises.

“Spectator” means any person admitted to the Pool premises for the sole purpose of viewing the swimming or other activities conducted therein.

“Swimming Coach” means any person licensed by the Council to enter the Pool premises for the purpose of teaching swimming.

“Pool Premises” means the Mount Barker Memorial Swimming Pool and includes all buildings, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of such swimming pool or used in connection therewith.

2. The Pool premises shall be open for use of the public during such hours and periods as the Council may from time to time by resolution appoint; the Council reserving to itself the right to refuse admission to any person at any time. No person under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter or remain at the Pool premises unless that person is and continues to be under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years. No person shall leave a person under the age of six years at the Pool premises otherwise than under the care and control of a person over the age of fourteen years.

3. The Pool Manager may temporarily suspend admittance or clear the Pool premises or any part thereof of any person or persons if in his opinion such action is necessary or desirable.

4. Every person using the Pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Pool Manager with regard to such use.

5. It shall be the duty of the Pool Manager (who is hereby so empowered and directed) to refuse admission to or remove or cause to be removed from the Pool premises any person who, in the opinion of the Pool Manager, is guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws who, by his past or present conduct, is deemed undesirable and any such person shall, upon the request of the Pool Manager to withdraw from the Pool premises quietly and peaceably do so as soon as possible.

6. Any person who has been refused admission to the Pool premises or who feels aggrieved by action of the Pool Manager may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Shire Clerk against such action and the Council may give such direction in the matter as is thought fit provided that such right of appeal shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Pool Manager or Council arising out of such refusal of admission.

7. No male above the age of four years shall trespass upon any part of the Pool premises set apart for the exclusive use of females and no female shall trespass upon any part of the Pool premises set apart for the exclusive use of males.

8. The Pool Manager may prohibit any person approaching or entering or remaining in a pool who in his opinion is dirty or unfit to use such pool and the Pool Manager may require such person to thoroughly cleanse and wash himself in one of the showers.

9. (a) No person club or association or organisation shall conduct a carnival at the Pool Premises unless with the prior consent of the Council;

(b) The Council may grant such consent subject to such conditions it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent;

(c) a person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to buildings or fencing or any other portion of the Pool premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival.

(d) The person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall pay to the Council such charges as shall from time to time be determined by Council.

10. (a) No person shall for profit teach, coach, or train any other person in the pool unless with the prior written permission of the Council.

(b) The Council may grant such permission subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such permission without being under any obligation to assign a reason for so doing and without being liable to pay compensation.

11. Any person who finds any article or money which has been left in the Pool premises and not his property shall forthwith deliver it to the Pool Manager or an Attendant.

12. Neither the Council nor the Pool Manager or Attendant or Officer or Employee of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article or money lost or stolen from any person whilst in the Pool premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the Pool premises.

13. The following are the charges for admission to the pool premises:—

Children under three years of age—Nil	\$
Children three years to sixteen years	0.10
Children attending School Swimming Classes (other than holders of season tickets)	0.05
Children attending Vacation Swimming Classes (other than holders of season tickets)	0.10
All Adults	0.25
Season Tickets for Children three to sixteen years	3.00
Family Season Ticket	20.00
Adult Season Ticket	8.00

14. Season tickets shall be offered for inspection to the attendant when used to obtain admission to the pool. Season tickets are not transferable and such ticket may be used only by the person in whose name the same is issued. The attendant shall refuse admission to a person seeking the same and using any such ticket if the attendant reasonably believes that the person so seeking admission is not the person to whom such ticket was issued.

15. No person shall:—

(a) not being an officer, attendant or employee of the Council in the course of his duties enter the Pool premises without having first paid to the Pool Manager or an Attendant the proper charge for admission;

(b) obstruct the Pool Manager or an Attendant in the carrying out of his duties;

- (c) enter or depart from any part of the Pool premises except by means of the respective entrances or exits set apart for that purpose;
- (d) enter or attempt to enter any bathroom or dressing enclosure that is already occupied without the consent of the occupier;
- (e) dress or undress or remove any part of his or her costume or bathing costume except in a dressing enclosure provided for the purpose;
- (f) appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person;
- (g) enter or be in the Pool premises whilst in an intoxicated condition;
- (h) take into the Pool premises or have in his possession therein any intoxicating liquor or drugs;
- (i) enter or remain in the Pool premises if he or she is affected by or suffering from any infectious or offensive disease or skin complaint;
- (j) deposit any filth or rubbish in any part of the Pool premises except in places set aside for that purpose;
- (k) eat in or take into any part of the Pool premises other than areas set aside for the purpose any food, drinks or confectionary of any kind whatsoever;
- (l) smoke any tobacco or other substance in any portion of the pool premises where smoking is prohibited by Notices displayed therein;
- (m) damage or disfigure or write upon any part of the Pool premises;
- (n) interfere with or improperly use any portion of the Pool premises;
- (o) break injure damage or destroy any life saving equipment or any property of Council;
- (p) behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly or riotous manner or push or throw any person into the pool or run around the concourse or surrounds of the pool;
- (q) swear or use any indecent, obscene or abusive language on any part of the Pool premises;
- (r) gamble on the Pool Premises;
- (s) climb upon any fence, wall, partition or roof of the Pool premises;
- (t) waste or wastefully use water or leave any water tap dripping or running;
- (u) expectorate or commit a nuisance in any part of the Pool premises;
- (v) annoy or interfere with any person in the Pool premises;
- (w) bring any animal into the Pool premises or being the person in control of such animal permit such animal to remain in any part of the Pool premises;
- (x) approach or enter any swimming pool until he or she has thoroughly cleansed and washed himself or herself in one of the showers provided in the Pool premises;
- (y) use any soap in any part of the Pool premises other than in the showerbaths or toilet facilities;
- (z) use any oil, detergent or any substance or preparation whereby the water in the pool may be or become discoloured contaminated or rendered turbid;
- (za) foul or pollute the water in the pool or shower;
- (zb) throw any sticks or stones or other objects in the pool or anywhere in the Pool premises;
- (zc) soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume;

16. Any person committing a breach of or an offence against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall for every such breach or offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

105. The placement of any ornaments or grave decorations on the actual lawns of the Park Sections is strictly prohibited.

106. The placement of any glass domes or permanent grave decorations, other than the memorial plaque, in any portion of the Park Sections is strictly prohibited.
