WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973 that where a local authority in whose district a sewerage area is situate, undertakes any works in that sewerage area and it appears after inquiry that—

- (a) the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960-1976, will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payment of the instalments of capital debt and interest on any of the works with respect to which any debt is owing; and
- (b) the local authority should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1976,

the Governor may, by proclamation, grant to the local authority such permission and may in the proclamation specify new limits of the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960-1976; and whereas the Dalwallinu Sewerage Area constituted under section 4 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973 by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on 26th September, 1975, is within the district of the municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu and the Shire has undertaken works within that area; and whereas it appears after inquiry that the maximum general rate that the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu may impose will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payments of the instalments of capital debt and

interest on the works to which any debt is owing and that the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1976; now therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred under subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1973, do hereby grant to the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu permission to levy a general rate not exceeding forty cents (40 cents) for each dollar of the annual value of the rateable property in any year in its district that is within the Dalwallinu Sewerage Area aforesaid.



HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the powers conferred by subsection (4) of section 548 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1976 hereby declares that portion of the district of the Shire of Dalwallinu described in the Schedule hereto, as an area within which the Dalwallinu Shire Council may impose, in respect of the rateable property therein, a greater rate than that which it imposes elsewhere in the district.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Corrigin.

PURSUANT to the power contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 15th October, 1976, so far as rural land is concerned and the 30th October, 1976, so

far as Townsite land is concerned, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you, all inflammable material, or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1977.

1. Rural land, i.e. land other than that in a Townsite: You shall clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 8 feet or 2.438 metres wide, in the following positions:—

2.2 Where the area of the land exceeds 0.203 of a hectare, you shall clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 8 feet or 2.438 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land and also immediately surrounding any drum or drums situated on the land, which are normally used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material as required by notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly Authorised Officer, not later than the 1st October, 1976, so far as rural land is concerned and the 15th October, 1976, so far as Townsite lands is concerned, for permission to provide firebreaks in an alternative position on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly Authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the works directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Firebreak Requirements, 1976-1977.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Northam.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the dates referred to below to clear firebreaks on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1977.

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1976, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1976, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least two metres in width in such positions as to divide properties of more than 200 hectares into separate sections of no more than 200 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least two metres in width; and

pasture combined in such positions so as areas of standing crop or standing crop and pasture combined of more than 100 hectares are divided into separate areas of no more than 100 hectares.

- (5) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1976, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least three metres in width inside and along all property boundaries which abut a Railway Reserve on which railway traffic operates.
- (6) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1976, clear of all inflammable material (including standing and fallen trees, branches and undergrowth) firebreaks of at least three metres in width along and as close as possible to all external boundaries of each separate area of undeveloped land and in such extra positions so as areas of more than 200 hectares are divided into areas of no more than 200 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (7) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1976, completely clear of all inflammable material all separate townsite lots where the lot is 4 000 square metres or less in area.

Alternative Firebreaks: If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than the 7th October, 1976, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Penalty: The penalty for failing to comply with this order is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Three Springs.

NOTICE is hereby given that all owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Three Springs are required to prepare firebreaks and remove inflammable materials on or before the 1st day of October, 1976 and thereafter to maintain such firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials until the 15th day of April, 1977.

Agricultural Land: On or before the 1st day of October, 1976, plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable materials until the 15th day of April, 1977, firebreaks of not less than two metres in width in the following positions on the land owned by or occupied by you:

(d) Developmental Areas and Sand Plain Blocks situated to the west of the Geraldton Highway: A firebreak of not less than ten metres be installed on the boundaries of all undeveloped scrub country on or before the 1st day of October, 1976 and thereafter maintained free of all inflammable material until the 15th day of April, 1977.

Townsite Land, Three Springs and Arrino: On or before the 15th day of November, 1976:

(a) Vacant Blocks: On blocks that are less than one half of one acre in size all inflammable material to be cleared off the block and the block to be maintained in a totally cleared state until the 15th day of April, 1977.

(b) On blocks exceeding one half of one acre size, provide and maintain until the 15th day of April, 1977, a firebreak of not less than two metres in width on every boundary of the block.

(c) Block containing buildings or dwellings: Provide and maintain until the 15th day of April, 1977, an effective firebreak of not less than one metre in width around the perimeter of all buildings or groups of buildings and inside and along the boundary of the land.

(d) Variation: Where due to the location of the land it is impracticable to instal firebreaks as required an alternative position may be used provided that a Fire Control Officer appointed by the Council has inspected and approved of the alternative location.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Where there are buildings on the land, additional firebreaks three metres in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any person to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised Officer not later than the 30th day of September, 1976, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Inflammable material" does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$200 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Beverley Municipality.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 15th October, 1976, east of the Great Southern Railway or 30th October west of the

Great Southern Railway to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material, until the 15th day of April, 1977, firebreaks not less than seven (7) feet wide in the following positions on the land owned or occupied by you.

Note: No extensions of time will be granted.

1. Inside and within three (3) chains of the boundary of all cleared land. Uncleared land on boundaries shall be isolated by the provision of an internal break.

2. Where the above lands are divided by or abut trafficable public roads or railway reserves a firebreak shall be provided within three (3) chains of the boundary of the road or railway reserve.

3. Within three (3) chains of the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks on the land, to completely surround the building or group of buildings or haystacks.

4. Land, the bush on which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing or burning shall be completely surrounded by a firebreak ten (10) feet wide. (Note:—Firebreaks may be provided on adjoining land).

5. Existing gullies, salt lakes, rivers or drains shall not form portion of a firebreak required by this order unless approved by the Shire Council.

6. Rivers: On all river banks a firebreak shall be provided on cleared land as close as is practicable but not further than three (3) chains from high water mark.

7. Beverley Townsite: On or before 30th November, 1976, a firebreak seven (7) feet wide completely free of all inflammable material shall be provided inside and along all external boundaries. Additionally all lots of $\frac{1}{4}$ acre or less shall be cleared of all inflammable material.

8. Fuel Drums. All grass or other inflammable materials must be cleared from areas where fuel drums, either empty or containing fuel are stored or intended to be stored. The cleared area is to extend for a distance of ten (10) feet completely surrounding the fuel drums.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the positions required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to provide them in an alternative situation.

Firebreaks in the situation hereunder will be accepted as complying with the requirements of the notice so far as it applies to the common boundary between the land or any owner or occupier and the abutting lands referred to hereunder:—

Burning is Not Permitted on Sundays.

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required on or before the 30th day of November, 1976, and thereafter up to and including the 15th day of March, 1977, to have a firebreak, clear of all inflammable material at least 1.8 metres (6 feet) wide (or such other width as is specified hereunder) in the positions as set out hereunder.

1. Rural Land (all land other than in a Townsite):

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 or more than \$200 and the person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Lands within the Kondinin and Narembeen Districts.

(a) On or before the 1st November, 1976, to clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks not less than 3 metres wide in the following positions on all rural and townsite land owned or occupied by you and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 30th day of April, 1977:—

- (1) immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) in such other positions as is necessary to divide the land in excess of 200 hectares into areas not exceeding 200 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and

(b) On or before the 31st day of January, 1977 (or within 14 days of the date of completion of the preparation for burning should this be after the 31st day of January, 1977), to clear of all inflammable material inside the external boundaries of the land on which the bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and thereafter to maintain the firebreak clear of inflammable material up to and including the 30th day of April, 1977).

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice you may apply to the Council not later

than 14 days prior to the date by which the firebreaks are required to be provided for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. No such application will be considered unless it is made in writing adequately describes the land, and it is accompanied by written approval of the bush fire control officer for the area in which the land is situated. If permission is not granted by the Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200, a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Townsite Land.

On or before 1st November, 1976, remove all bush and inflammable material from vacant townsite land; but where buildings are erected on the land, prepare and thereafter maintain until 30th April, 1977, effective firebreaks around the perimeter of such buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land, cleared of inflammable material to a width of at least 1 metre or where the boundary is closer than 1 metre then for the lesser distance.

Failure or neglect to comply with this notice will render the owner or occupier liable to a penalty of \$200.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of October, 1976, to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until February 15, 1977, firebreaks of not less than two metres in width in the following positions on the land owned or occupied by you:—

Rural Land:

- (a) Within 20 metres inside all external boundaries of the property, and where such lands are divided by or abut a trafficable road within 20 metres inside the land abutting that road.
- (b) In such positions as is necessary to divide all land under pasture in excess of 200 hectares into areas not exceeding 200 hectares each completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (c) Within 20 metres of buildings, haystacks, and fuel ramps situated on the land.

Townsite Land:

- (1) Where the area of land is 2 000 square metres or less, all inflammable materials on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land.
- (2) Where the land exceeds 2 000 square metres in area, firebreaks at least two metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

- (3) Fuel Depots: In addition to any firebreaks required in paragraphs 1 and 2 herein, you shall clear of all inflammable material the whole of any land occupied by drums used for the storage of inflammable liquid, whether the drums contain inflammable liquid or not, including any land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed, and an area outside the land so occupied to a distance of not less than three metres.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, not later than October 1, 1976, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorized officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of October, 1975, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10.00 not more than \$200.00 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

SHIRE OF EXMOUTH TOWN PLANNING
SCHEME No. 2—DISTRICT ZONING SCHEME

THE Exmouth Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers, conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Exmouth Town Planning Scheme No. 2 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land contained in the Shire of Exmouth as shown in the maps forming part of the Scheme—but excludes the land incorporated in Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

1.3 Responsible Authority: The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Shire of Exmouth (hereinafter referred to as the Shire).

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme:

The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:—

- Part I.—Preliminary.
- Part II.—Reserved Land.
- Part III.—Zones.
- Part IV.—Non-conforming Uses.
- Part V.—General Provisions.
- Part VI.—Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Land Use Plan.
- (2) Scheme Plan.

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified as follows:—

"Act"—means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended).

"Development"—means the use or development of any land and includes the erection, construction, alteration or carrying out as the case may be, of any building, excavation, fill or other works on any land.

"District"—means the district of the Shire of Exmouth.

"Holiday Camp"—means a "residential building" operating primarily for the persons who shall not be in residence for more than 3 months continuously.

"Mining"—mining is development and therefore can be controlled under the Town Planning Scheme. Mining claims, leases and quarrying are synonymous with mining, as also is extractive industry, for the purposes of this text.

"Museum"—means a place preserving and exhibiting works of nature, art, curiosities, etc. also any collection of such objects.

"Objects of Natural Beauty"—means the natural beauties of the area including lakes and other inland water, banks of rivers, foreshores of harbours, frontal dunes, and other parts of the sea, hill slopes and summits and valleys.

"Public Amusement"—means the use of land for a theatre, a cinema, a dance hall, a skating rink, swimming pool or gymnasium or for games.

"Road House"—a roadhouse is a service station with washing facilities (washrooms) and eating facilities.

"Rural Pursuit"—means and includes agriculture, horticulture, forestry, pasture and poultry farming.

"Shipwright and Service Maintenance"—means the use of land for the slipping, construction, repairs and maintenance of boats and associated equipment.

"Warehouse"—means any building or enclosed land, or part of a building or enclosed land, used for storage of goods and the carrying out of commercial transaction involving the sale of such goods by wholesale.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

2.1 Reservation of Land:

- (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purpose of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Shire.
- (c) In giving its approval the Shire shall have regard to the ultimate purposes intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.
- (d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Shire has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 Development of Land:

- (a) Where a Shire refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.
- (b) Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Shire not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Shire refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.
- (c) In lieu of paying compensation the Shire may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Shire at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

2.3 Period for Notice: Twenty-eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Shire under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 Classification: The Scheme Area is divided into the following zones and reserves:

Zones:

- (1) Rural.
- (2) Tourist "A".
- (3) Special Industry.

Reserves:

- (1) Highway.
- (2) Secondary Road (unsealed).
- (3) Public Open Space.
- (4) Special Purposes.

3.2 Uses: Table No. 1 clause 3.4 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by the Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left-hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.3 Symbols: The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 have the following meanings:—

"P"—A use that is permitted under this Scheme.

"AA"—A use that is not permitted unless special approval is granted by the Shire.

"IP"—A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Shire.

"X"—A use that is not permitted.

If a particular use or purpose is not mentioned in the list of use classes or is not included in the general terms of any of the use classes such a use or purpose shall unless it is permitted by the subsequent provisions of the Scheme be deemed to be prohibited.

3.5 Application for Special Approval:

(a) Any person who desires to use land for a purpose which by the provisions of this Scheme is only permitted if special approval is given by the Shire shall make application for such approval to the Shire in writing.

(b) The application shall state the following particulars:—

- (i) The full name and address of the applicant.
- (ii) A description of the land and the particulars of the Certificate of Title.
- (iii) The names and addresses of the registered proprietors and of all other persons having an interest in the land and the nature of their interest.
- (iv) The nature of the applicant's interest in the land.
- (v) The purpose for which the applicant desires to use the land.
- (vi) The nature of the building and other improvements now on the land.
- (vii) The nature of the buildings and other improvements the applicant desires to construct on or make to the land.

(c) The Shire shall consider the application and may refuse its approval or may resolve to recommend to a subsequent meeting of the Shire that approval be granted. If the Shire resolves to recommend that approval be granted it shall refer the matter to a subsequent meeting of the Shire to be held not less than three weeks nor more than six months after the passing of the resolution recommending approval.

(d) The Shire may resolve that notice be given to ratepayers likely to be affected by the granting of the approval and in that case it shall notify the applicant of the names and addresses of all persons who according to the Rate Book are the rateable owners of land within an area to be specified by the Shire likely to be affected by the granting of the application.

(e) The Shire should require notice to be given to ratepayers if the proposed use is likely to be carried on at night or is likely to cause noise or to cause an assembly of persons or vehicles.

(f) If so directed by the Shire the applicant shall—

- (i) cause to be sent by certified post to the owners whose names and addresses have been given to him by the Shire and to all persons having an interest in the land the subject of the application a copy of his application to the Shire; and

- (ii) cause to be published in a newspaper circulating in the Scheme Area notice of his application setting out in an abbreviated form the information contained in his application and stating that objections may be made to the Council within twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice.

(g) At a subsequent meeting of the Shire held, if notices have been given after the expiration of twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice and after the expiration of twenty-eight days from the posting of the said notices to the

owners whichever is the later, the Shire shall again consider the application and decide whether to grant or withhold its approval or grant its approval upon conditions.

- (h) In making its decision on an application for its special approval the Shire shall take into consideration the following matters:
- (i) The provisions of any Town Planning Scheme including this Scheme affecting the land the subject of the application or affecting land in the vicinity.
 - (ii) The nature of the proposed development in relation to the development of any land within the vicinity of the said land.
 - (iii) The size, shape and character of the parcel of land to which the application relates and the nature and siting of the proposed building, the view from the building and the interruption of view likely to be caused by the proposed building.
 - (iv) Any representations which may be made by any statutory authority.
 - (v) The existing and likely future amenity of the neighbourhood, including (but without limiting the generality of the foregoing) the question of whether the proposed development is likely to cause injury to such amenity including injury due to the emission of noise, vibration, light, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, liquid wastes or waste products.
 - (vi) The nature of the road giving access to the said land.
 - (vii) What parking facilities are available or proposed and the likely requirements for parking.
 - (viii) Such other matters as the Shire considers relevant.
- (i) The Shire may enter into agreements with the applicant whereby the applicant covenants for himself and his transferees to carry out and observe the conditions (if any) imposed by the Shire in granting its approval as aforesaid.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 Non-conforming Use: No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 Alterations and Repairs to Non-conforming Use:

- (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Shire has been obtained in writing;
- (b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Shire has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-Laws made

under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

If any building or structure which is used for a non-conforming use, be destroyed or damaged by fire or otherwise to the extent of more than seventy-five per cent of its value it shall thereafter be repaired rebuilt or added to for the purpose of being used for a non-conforming use unless special permission to do so is granted by the Shire.

4.3 Change of Non-conforming Use: The Shire may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Shire less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Shire, closer to the intended uses of the Zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part except where a change of non-conforming use of any land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Shire may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

4.5 Notification of Non-conforming Use: Any person carrying on a non-conforming use shall within twelve calendar months of the gazettal date or within such extended time as the Shire shall allow give to the Shire in writing full information of the nature and extent of the non-conforming use.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 These provisions apply to the whole Shire, with the exception of the three United States Navy bases. These bases are expected to maintain a similar, if not better, standard of construction.

5.2 Constructional Requirements: All buildings erected subsequent to the Scheme coming to force shall comply with the relevant following requirements in addition to the requirements of the Uniform Building By-laws.

- (a) Eaves, gutters if fitted shall be securely anchored to the roof structure.
- (b) Eaves overhangs are to be well stayed and/or supported generally as prescribed in (c).
- (c) Roof strap and/or supports in timber or steel construction to be bolted or welded to primary structural support members which in turn are to be solidly fixed to the floor and/or footings.

Roof strap and/or supports in masonry construction are to be fixed to brackets tied back to floor or footings or to anchor plates set well down the cavities.

- (d) All corrugated steel sheet roofs shall be fitted with pipe or angle storm battens at the eaves. Battens shall be through bolted to rafters or beams and shall pass through the pipe or angle. All fixings to timber sub-structure shall be with galvanised cup head nails or other approved fixing at not more than 3 ft centres in line of corrugation, and not more than 12 inch centres in opposite direction. Fixing nails shall be driven at least 1 inch into roof timbers.

- (e) Patent roofing sheets must be provided with storm battens as set out in sub-clause (d) except where such roofing is fixed in accordance with the manufacturers written specification for cyclonic areas.
- (f) All wall plates and/or beams are to be tied to the structure as prescribed in clause (c). Roof beams rafters and/or purlins are to be fixed together and to wall plates and beams with galvanised straps or cleats. Roof battens may be nailed to rafters with flat head nails which shall be driven at least 1½ inch into rafters.
- (g) All glazed openings shall be provided with storm shutters. Shutters may be fixed to structure or removable, but when in position are to be secured to approved fixings tied to main structural elements.
- (h) The method of construction of all fences and garden walls shall be to the approval of the Shire.

5.3 Appearance: No person shall construct which in the opinion of the Shire is—

- (a) a building whose appearance is out of harmony with existing adjacent buildings;
- (b) a building whose appearance or design is such as to partially destroy any local amenity.

5.4 Appeals: Any person who is aggrieved by the refusal of the Shire to grant its approval to the construction of a building by reason of any discretionary power contained in clauses 5.1 and 5.2 of this text may within sixty days after the refusal is communicated to him by the Shire in writing appeal to the Minister in writing who may hear the appeal himself or appoint a person or persons to hear the appeal and report to him thereon and the Minister after considering the report if any shall make his decision thereon and communicate it to the Shire and to the appellant. The decision of the Minister shall be final.

PART 6.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Acquisition of Land: The Shire may acquire land for the purpose for which it is reserved in the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

6.2 Disposal of Land: The Shire may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit, being in accordance with the Act.

6.3 Compensation: Claims of compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

6.4 Entry to Premises: The Shire may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.





4. The number shall be fixed in such a position that they are easily legible from the footpath or front boundary of the property.
5. The number plates to be fitted in accordance with paragraph 4 of this by-law shall not be less than—
 - (a) if located within 6 m of the front boundary of the property; 75 mm in height;
 - (b) if located more than 6 m from the front boundary of the property; 230 mm in height.
6. If the owner or occupier fails to affix a number plate within one month after being served with a written notice to do so he shall be guilty of an offence.
7. No person shall remove or deface or in any way damage any number plate affixed in accordance with this by-law.
8. Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to penalty not exceeding \$40.
