AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 22nd day of September, 1976, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:

Local Government Act, 1960-1976.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1976, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

(iii) Except as provided in subparagraph (vii) and (viii) of this paragraph, where an officer simultaneously holds more than one position under the Act in respect of each of which fees by way of remuneration are prescribed, he shall be entitled only to the fee for that position for which the highest fee is prescribed, where the duties of all the positions can be performed simultaneously.

(iv) The fees prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Doorkeepers shall cover all services performed between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m. on polling day.

(v) Except as otherwise provided in these regulations, the fees prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for Returning Officers and Deputy Returning Officers shall cover all services required by the Act or by regulation, to be performed by the officer in connection with an election and for an Assistant Returning Officer all services required on polling day.

(vi) Where an officer does not reside in the district for which he has been appointed as Returning Officer, Deputy Returning Officer or Assistant Returning Officer, if he is required to travel to the district to which he has been appointed prior to the day of the election for the purpose of performing his duties, he shall be paid a travelling allowance in accordance with regulation 64 for the whole period of his absence from his residence in connection with those duties.

(vii) When an election for the Legislative Council is held on the same day as an election for the Legislative Assembly and the Returning Officer for the Legislative Assembly District is also Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for the Legislative Council Province for the purposes of those elections, and he carries out duties in relation to both elections, the following provisions apply—

(a) If both elections are contested or uncontested he is entitled to be paid the appropriate higher fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for a Returning Officer for the Legislative Assembly or Returning Officer

or Deputy Returning Officer for the Legislative Council and 5 per cent. of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the other election.

- (b) If one of the elections is contested and the other is uncontested, he is entitled to be paid the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to the contested election and 5 per cent. of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the uncontested election.

(viii) Where a Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for a Legislative Council Province carries out duties in relation to two Legislative Council elections in the same day in respect of the same province—

- (a) If both elections are contested or uncontested he is entitled to be paid the appropriate fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to one of the elections and 5 per cent. of that fee in relation to the other election.
- (b) If one of the elections is contested and the other is uncontested, he is entitled to be paid the fee prescribed in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for his office in relation to the contested election and 5 per cent. of the appropriate fee prescribed for his office in relation to the uncontested election.

Suspension of the Prohibited Burning Times.

Bush Fires Board,
Perth, 23rd September, 1976.

IT is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act, under the authority contained in Sections 17 and 25B of the said Act hereby suspends the operation of all declarations prohibiting the setting fire to the Bush, and suspends the operation of the provisions of paragraphs (d) (1), (d) (ii) and (e) of subsection (1) of Section 25 of the said Act during the periods stated herein and to the extent necessary to allow the burning set out herein, on land within the Kalgoorlie/Boulder Urban Fire District as defined in the *Government Gazette* No. 56 of the 22nd August, 1975 subject to the condition that all burning carried out under the provision of these suspensions shall be carried out in accordance with the conditions specified hereunder.

SPECIFIED CONDITIONS.

Period, 1st October, 1976, to 31st October, 1976, Inclusive.

1. Bush (including standing grass); Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt on land of any area at any time of the day or night subject only to the condition that reasonable precautions are taken to prevent the fire escaping.

Period, 1st November, to 14th December, 1976, Inclusive.

2. Garden Refuse and Rubbish:

- (a) In an incinerator (any time—day or night). You may burn garden refuse or rubbish at any time of the day or night provided it is burnt in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material. The incinerator must be situated not less than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence. All flammable material must be cleared and kept clear for a distance of at least 1 metre (approx. three

feet) from the incinerator. (The local Council may, upon being satisfied that no fire hazard is likely to occur, give permission in writing for the incinerator to be situated at a lesser distance than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence).

- (b) On the ground (any time—day or night). You may burn garden refuse or rubbish, at any time of the day or night, upon ground from which all bush or other flammable material is thoroughly cleared within 1 metre (approx. three feet) of all points of the site of the fire, provided that at least two able bodied persons, 15 years of age or over, are present during the whole of the time the fire is burning. A hose must also be provided which has water flowing through it continuously and which is long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt. If reticulated water is not available, alternative fire-fighting equipment must be provided such as shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment sufficient to control the escape of the fire.

3. Bush (including standing grass).

- (A) On land of 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of an acre—Normal household block) or under—Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place does not exceed 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of an acre).

(a) Clearing Fires—Permit required. Fires to clear land of stumps, fallen trees, limbs of trees, branches, logs, cleared scrub and other debris resulting from clearing operations may only be lit provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from a Bush Fire Control Officer of the Local Authority. The conditions set out in the permit must be carried out.

(b) Standing Bush (see definition of "bush"): Except as in A (a) above, standing bush may be burnt without a permit provided that—

(i) a firebreak at least 1 metre (approx. three feet) wide has first been cleared immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and

(ii) at least two able bodied persons, 15 years of age or over are in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning; and

(iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided and has water flowing continuously during the whole of the time in which fire is burning; or as an alternative to (iii).

(iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative fire-fighting equipment is provided such as shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment sufficient to control the escape of the fire.

- (B) On land over 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of an acre)—Where the area of the land on which the burning is to take place is over 2 000 square metres (approx. one-half of one acre) bush of all kinds, including standing grass (see definition of "bush"), may only be burnt provided that a firebreak at least three metres (approx. ten feet) wide (or of such greater width as specified in the permit) is first cleared, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land

and a permit to burn is first obtained from a Bush Fire Control Officer of the Local Authority. The conditions set out in the permit must also be carried out.

Definition: "Bush"—For your information "bush" is defined in section 7 of the Bush Fires Act. The definition is very wide and bush includes trees, bushes, plants, stubble i.e. hay, straw, grass, herbage and all other similar vegetation, scrub and undergrowth of all kinds, whether alive or dead, standing or not standing and any part of the abovenamed whether severed from the main plant or not.

Period, 15th December, 1976, to the 14th April, 1977, Inclusive.

All burning of Bush (including standing grass) is prohibited during this period.

4. Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt as follows—

(a) in an incinerator (any time—day or night): You may burn garden refuse or rubbish at any time of the day or night provided it is burnt in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material. The incinerator must be situated not less than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence. All flammable material must be cleared and kept clear for a distance of at least 2 metres (approx. 6 feet) from the incinerator. (The local Council may, upon being satisfied that no fire hazard is likely to occur, give permission in writing for the incinerator to be situated at a lesser distance than 2 metres (approx. six feet) from any building or fence).

(b) On the ground (evenings only): You may burn garden refuse or rubbish upon ground from which all bush or other flammable material is thoroughly cleared within three metres (approx. ten feet) of all points of the site of the fire. The fire may only be lit between the hours of 6 o'clock in the evening and, 11 o'clock of the same day and must be completely extinguished not later than midnight of that day. The person who lights the fire must completely extinguish the fire before he leaves it.

Period 15th April, 1977 to the 30th April 1977, inclusive.

5. Bush (including standing grass). Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt subject to the conditions in Sections 2 and 3 (1st November to 14th December).

Period 1st May, 1977, to the 31st May, 1977, inclusive.

6. Bush (including standing grass). Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt on the same conditions as in Section 1 above (1st October to 31st October).

Minister administering the Bush Fires Act under the authority contained in section 17 of the said Act hereby suspends from the 15th September, 1976 to the 15th October, 1976 inclusive the operation of all declarations prohibiting the setting fire to the bush in the Shire of Boulder, so far as the declaration relates to land on which a bush fire warden appointed under section 12 of the said Act believes burning should be carried out for the purpose of urban protection, subject to the burning being carried out under the direct control of a bush fire warden or the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer of the Shire of Boulder.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes are hereby required on or before the 30th November, 1976, to establish firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials and thereafter maintain such firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials until the 13th day of March, 1977, in the following positions on land owned or occupied by them:—

Rural Lands.

(a) Not less than 1.8 metres in width inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoy a common boundary with a formed public road.

(b) Not less than 3 metres in width surrounding all buildings and haystacks, with a further break 1.8 metres in width within 20 metres of the perimeter of haystacks.

(c) Not less than 1.8 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.

(d) On all cleared land not less than 1.8 metres in width within 20 metres of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

Townsites.

(a) Lots used for grazing purposes or in agricultural pursuits:

(i) Not less than 1.8 metres in width inside and along those portions of the boundaries of all cleared or part cleared land which enjoy a common boundary with a formed public road.

(ii) Not less than 3 metres in width immediately surrounding all buildings and haystacks, with a further break of 1.8 metres in width within 20 metres of the perimeter of haystacks.

(iii) Not less than 1.8 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which a cereal crop is planted.

(iv) On all cleared land not less than 1.8 metres in width within one chain of and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve.

(b) All other lots: Effective firebreaks around the perimeter of all buildings and inside and along the whole of the boundary of the land cleared of all inflammable materials to a width of at least 1 metre or where the boundary is closer than 1 metre then for that lesser distance.

(c) All townsite lots: To be cleared of all inflammable materials and rubbish on or before the 30th day of November, 1976 and kept clear of such material until the 13th day of March, 1977.

Pine Plantations.

Not less than 10 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which pines are planted;

Not less than 10 metres in width along those portions of pine plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve; and

Not less than 6 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a pine plantation shall exceed 28 ha in area.

Provided that if, for any reason, it is impracticable to clear firebreaks in the situation required by this notice, any suitable alternative to the foregoing inside or outside the property may be nominated or approved by either the Bush Fire Control Officer or Captain of the Bush Fire Brigade in the area concerned, and notified in writing by 1st November, 1976, by the occupier to the Shire Council after being countersigned by the Fire Control Officer.

The owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects to comply with the above requirements is guilty of an offence under subsection 3 of section 33 of the Act and is liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars and not more than two hundred dollars, in addition to which the Council may have the work carried out and may recover the cost of such work from the owner and/or occupier.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Shire of Boyup Brook.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Boyup Brook are hereby required on or before 30th November, 1976, to establish firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials and thereafter maintain such firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials until the 15th day of April, 1977, in the following positions on land owned or occupied by them:—

Rural Lands.

(a) A 2 metre wide minimum firebreaks around all areas of each 200 hectares of cleared or part cleared land positioned not more than 40 metres inside a perimeter of such clearing, unless an alternative positioning is agreed to by the Control Officer. Council to be informed by the landholder before 1st October, 1976, of any alternative positioning of firebreaks.

This notification must contain the signature of the Control Officer. All variations must be applied for each year when additional clearing has been carried out by the landholder. Brigade Group variations to be notified by Brigade Area Representatives.

(b) When crops are to be harvested for grain, there are three alternatives:—

(1) A 3 metre firebreak inside the crop paddock.

(2) A 2 metre firebreak plus a 2 metre mown strip inside the crop paddock.

(3) A 2 metre firebreak in the adjoining paddock.

All persons growing crops who do not intend to harvest the same must notify the Council before the 30th November, 1976:—

(c) When any cleared, or partly cleared land abuts a railway reserve a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide shall be cleared within 3 metres and parallel to the common boundary.

(d) A firebreak 3 metres wide shall be cleared not less than 20 metres and not more than 100 metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks, homesteads and fuel storage areas by 30th November, 1976, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or haystack cleared of all inflammable material by 15th December, 1976.

(e) The Control Officer can approve a well burnt roadside as a substitute for a firebreak inside the property. No burning to be done on road verges of the Donnybrook-Kojonup Road without contacting the Shire Clerk.

Private Pine Plantations.

Any pines planted for commercial purposes constitutes a pine plantation and you are hereby required to clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks not less than 20 metres wide around the perimeter of each plantation, and any plantation exceeding 100 hectares will also require a sub-divisional firebreak of 10 metres in width for each 100 hectares.

Townsites.

On or before the 15th December, 1976, all town lots under 4 000 square metres in area and all fuel depots within the Shire are required to be cleared of all debris or inflammable material. A spade

break of not less than one metre is to be cleared around the boundaries of all occupied and unoccupied lots. Lots of 4 000 square metres and over are to have a minimum 2 metre firebreak installed around all external boundaries.

Provided that if, for any reason, it is impracticable to complete the clearing of firebreaks by the dates required by this notice, application must be made in writing to the Boyup Brook Shire Council not later than the 30th November, 1976, for permission to complete breaks by a later date. Owners or occupiers with land adjacent to Crown land or Forest land may place their firebreaks in that land provided that the Council is notified accordingly by 30th November, 1976.

Penalty not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars, in addition to which the Council may have the work carried out and recover the cost of such work from the owner and/or occupier.

Shire of Laverton.

Notice to all owners and occupiers of land in the district of the Shire of Laverton.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, you are hereby required on or before the 30th day of September, 1976, or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after the 30th day of September, 1976, to clear firebreaks and remove inflammable material from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all inflammable materials from the 30th day of April, 1977:—

1. Land Outside Townsites:

1.1 All buildings on land which is outside townsites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two metres wide cleared of all inflammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty metres from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 metres from the inner firebreak.

1.2 To remove inflammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

2. Land in Townsites:

2.1 Where the area of land is 2 000 square metres (approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ acre) or less all inflammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.

2.2 Where the area of the land exceeds 2 000 square metres firebreaks at least three metres in width shall be cleared of all inflammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of the land and where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three metres in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impracticable to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 30th day of September, 1976, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by the Council or its fully authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Shire of Carnarvon.

Firebreak Order.

Notice to all owners and/or occupiers of land in the Shire of Carnarvon.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the 1st day of October, 1976, to clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks of not less than ten feet in width of the following positions of the land owned or occupied by you and thereafter maintain the land free of all inflammable material until the 31st day of May, 1977:—

1. Rural Land (other than Townsite Land):

(a) Inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the property or properties owned or occupied by you.

(b) Where buildings are situated on the property, additional firebreaks not less than ten feet in width, must be provided within five chains of the perimeter of such buildings in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings.

2. Townsite Land: In respect of land owned or occupied by you in the townsite of Carnarvon, you are required on or before the 1st day of October, 1976, to remove all inflammable material from the land or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter maintain the land or firebreaks clear of inflammable material until the 31st day of May, 1977:—

(a) Where the area of the land is one half of one acre or less, remove all inflammable material on the land from the whole of the land.

(b) Where the area of the lands exceeds one half of one acre clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least six feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

3. Fuel Depots: In addition to any firebreaks required in paragraphs 1 and 2 herein, you shall clear of all inflammable material the whole of any land occupied by drums used for the storage of inflammable liquid, whether the drums contain inflammable liquid or not, including any land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed, and an area outside the land so occupied to a distance of not less than ten feet.

If for any reason, it is considered impracticable to provide firebreaks in the position required by the notice, the approval of the Shire Council must be obtained to construct such firebreaks in an alternate position. Approval to any such variations will only be granted where the Bush Fire Control Officer or the area has first signified his approval to the variation.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10, and not more than \$200, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the costs of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

4. Water Pumping Installations—Gascoyne River Area: All owners of water pumping installations for the pumping of water from the Gascoyne River or its bed, are required to clear of all inflammable material an area of land twenty feet on all sides of such pumping installation by the 1st day of October, 1976.

Pastoral and Country Areas:

Prohibited Burning Period—1/10/1976 to 30/4/1977 inclusive.

1. Land Outside Townsites:

1.1 All buildings on land which is outside townsites shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two metres wide cleared of all inflammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty metres from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 metres from the inner firebreak.

1.2 To remove inflammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph 1.1 above.

2. Land in Townsites:

2.1 Where the area of the land is 2 000 square metres (approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ acre) or less all inflammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.

2.2 Where the area of the land exceeds 2 000 square metres firebreaks at least three metres in width shall be cleared of all inflammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of the land and where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three metres in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act you are hereby required on or before the 15th day of November, 1976, to clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks not less than 3 metres wide on rural land owned or occupied by

you and not less than 2 metres wide on townsite land (i.e. land within a townsite or within any other area subdivided for residential purposes) owned or occupied by you and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 14th day of March, 1977—

- (1) immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land; and
- (3) immediately surrounding any drum or drums situated on the land, which are normally used for the storage of fuel whether they contain fuel or not.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 7th day of November, 1976, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required in this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Albany.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required to clear of all inflammable material firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide as set out hereunder.

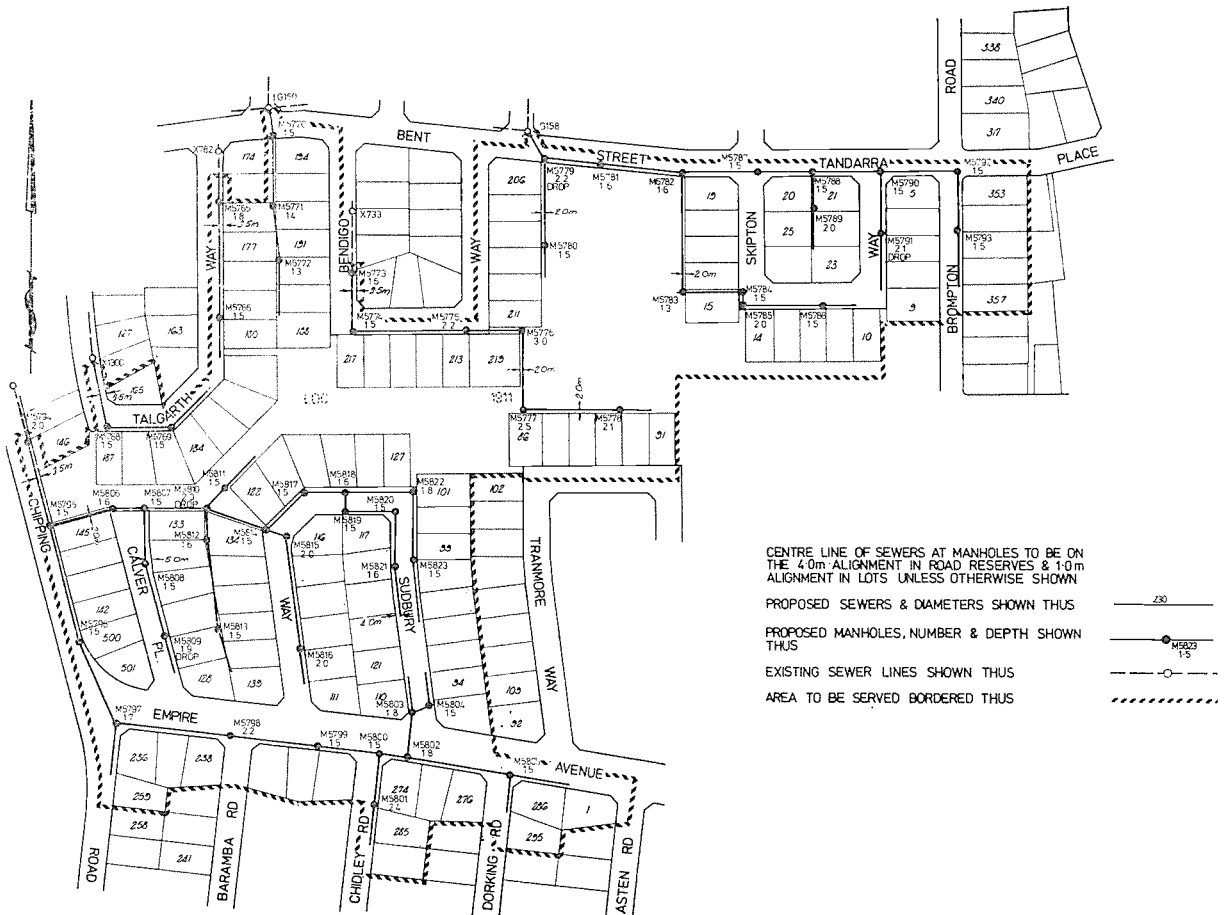

WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT, 1912-1975.

Hospital Charges.

WHEREAS under the provisions of paragraph (d) of the proviso to paragraph (c) of clause 1 of the First Schedule to the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975, it is enacted that the compensation payable to an injured worker to cover hospital charges shall not exceed that from time to time determined by the Workers' Compensation Board: Now, therefore, the Board in exercise of the power conferred by the Act, doth hereby determine that as from the 1st day of October, 1976, the hospital charges referred to in proviso (d) to paragraph

(c) of clause 1 of the First Schedule to the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1975, shall not exceed—

- (1) Fifty-six dollars (\$56.00) per day for hospitals wherever situated while the injured worker necessarily and properly remains in hospital, provided that this rate shall be regarded as a maximum rate and the rate in each case shall not exceed the general rate chargeable for treatment in cases other than workers' compensation cases in a public ward bed in a public hospital, or a ward bed in a private hospital;
- (2) for outpatient attendance fee the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) per treatment;
- (3) for operating theatre fees, such amount as would normally be payable to the hospital concerned in cases other than workers' compensation cases, or in a public hospital the sum of twelve dollars (\$12.00).

In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960, as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 85A substituted. 2. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 85A the following regulation:—
 85A. (1) A teacher on the permanent staff who marries shall within four weeks of the date of the marriage notify the Director-General in writing of the marriage in such form as the Director-General may determine and shall furnish such evidence of the marriage as the Director-General may require.
 (2) Where—
 (a) a teacher marries or the spouse of a teacher is transferred in the course of employment;
 (b) the teacher requests a transfer in order to be with the spouse; and
 (c) the Director-General is unable immediately to make the transfer requested,
 the Director-General may grant the teacher leave without pay for a period not exceeding twelve months.
 (3) Where—
 (a) a teacher has been granted leave without pay for a period of twelve months under the provisions of this regulation; and
 (b) the Director-General has been unable by the expiration of the period of leave without pay to make the transfer in respect of which the period of leave without pay was granted,
 the service of the teacher shall be deemed to be terminated on the date of the expiration of the period of leave without pay.
- Reg. 96 substituted. 3. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 96 the following regulation:—
 96. (1) A teacher appointed as a principal of a Class II primary school on or after 1st January, 1977 shall not be eligible for transfer from a Class II primary school to a Class II district high school.
 (2) A teacher who—
 (a) was transferred to the position of principal of a Class II district high school from the position of principal of a Class II primary school; or
 (b) was promoted to the position of principal of a Class II district high school from the Class II district high school promotion list and whose eligibility to be placed on that list was by virtue of service in primary schools,
 is eligible to have his name placed on the promotion list for Class I primary schools.
- Heading to Section E amended. 4. The heading to Section E of Division 6 of Part IV of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the word "Schools", the word "Colleges".
- Reg. 102E amended. 5. Regulation 102E of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the word "school"—

 (b) in line three of subregulation (2),
 the word "college".

- (2) Technical colleges shall be classified as follows—
 - (a) Grade 1 being technical colleges in which, in the opinion of the Director-General, there is a reasonable prospect during a school year of an average attendance of more than 12 000 student hours per week being maintained in day and evening classes combined;
 - (b) Grade 2 being technical colleges in which, in the opinion of the Director-General, there is a reasonable prospect during a school year of an average attendance of more than 6 000 but less than 12 000 student hours per week being maintained in day and evening classes combined;
 - (c) Grade 3 being technical colleges in which, in the opinion of the Director-General, there is a reasonable prospect during a school year of an average attendance of more than 3 000 but less than 6 000 student hours per week being maintained in day and evening classes combined.
- (3) (a) The Director-General shall not make a recommendation for the establishment of an evening technical school under regulation 206 of these regulations unless he is of the opinion that there is a reasonable prospect of classes being maintained according to the average weekly student hours as set out in paragraph (b) of this subregulation.
 - (b) Evening technical centres shall be classified as follows:—
 - (i) Class 1 being a centre having over 3 000 average weekly student hours of instruction after 5 p.m.; or over 1 500 average weekly student hours of instruction but including 300 student hours of instruction before 5 p.m.;
 - (ii) Class 2 being a centre having more than 1 500 but less than 3 000 average weekly student hours of instruction after 5 p.m.; or more than 750 but less than 1 500 average weekly student hours of instruction but including 200 student hours of instruction before 5 p.m.
- (4) (a) The Director-General shall not make a recommendation for the establishment of a technical centre under regulation 206 of these regulations unless he is of the opinion that there is a reasonable prospect of classes being maintained according to the average weekly student hours as set out in paragraph (b) of this subregulation.
 - (b) Technical centres shall be classified as follows—
 - (i) Class 1 being a centre having more than 750 but less than 1 500 average weekly student hours of instruction after 5 p.m.; or more than 300 but less than 750 average weekly student hours of instruction but including 100 student hours of instruction before 5 p.m.;
 - (ii) Class 2 being a centre having more than 300 but less than 750 average weekly student hours of instruction;

SCHEDULE—*continued*

(iii) Class 3 being a centre having more than 100 but less than 300 average weekly student hours of instruction;

(iv) Class 4 being a centre with less than 100 average weekly student hours of instruction.

(5) For the purpose of this regulation, the attendance for instruction at a technical college, school or centre of one student for one hour shall be regarded as representing one student hour.

(6) A technical service shall be classified as being equivalent to a technical college, school or centre as determined by the Director-General.

BY-LAWS.

Principal
by-laws.

1. In these by-laws the by-laws made under the Government Railways Act, 1904, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th October, 1920, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal by-laws.

SCHEDULE—continued

By-law 80A added. 2. The principal by-laws are amended by adding after by-law 80 a by-law as follows:—

By-law No. 80A—Westrail Centre Parking Station By-law.

Application. 1. This by-law applies to and in relation to the parking of vehicles in the land described in the First Schedule.

Interpretation. 2. In this by-law unless the contrary intention appears—
 “authorized person” means an officer or servant of the Commission who is authorized by the Commission to control parking in the parking station;
 “Form” means a form in the Third Schedule;
 “owner” in relation to a vehicle, means the person who is the holder of the vehicle licence issued under the Road Traffic Act, 1974 in respect of the vehicle, or, if the vehicle is not licensed under the Act, the person who is entitled to possession of the vehicle;
 “park” means to station a vehicle whether attended or not in a parking station;
 “parking stall” mean a portion of the area comprised in the parking station that is marked out or defined by painted lines or otherwise for the purpose of indicating a place where one vehicle may be stationed whether on the payment of a fee or charge or not;
 “parking station” means the area of land referred to in sub-by-law 3;
 “Schedule” means a Schedule to this by-law;
 “stand” has the same meaning as “park”;
 “sub-by-law” means one of these sub-by-laws;
 “the Act” means the Government Railways Act, 1904;
 “ticket” means a ticket issued by a ticket issuing machine;
 “ticket issuing machine” means a machine placed in the parking station by or on behalf of the Commission that, as a result of the insertion of a coin, therein, issues a ticket indicating the period of time during which it is lawful to park a vehicle in a parking stall.

Land set aside for parking station. 3. Subject to the provisions of this by-law, the area of land described in the First Schedule is set aside as a vehicle parking or standing area for use by—

- (a) officers and servants of the Department or Commission;
- (b) persons on railway business;
- (c) the public generally; and
- (d) such persons or classes of persons or class of vehicles as are referred to in this by-law.

Division of parking station. 4. The Commission may divide the parking station so as to set aside areas—

- (a) for the parking or standing of vehicles;
- (b) in which no parking or standing of vehicles is permitted;
- (c) for use by officers and servants of the Department or Commission;
- (d) for use by persons on railway business;
- (e) for use by the public generally;
- (f) for use by such persons or classes of persons or classes of vehicles as may be designated in any notice displayed in the parking station.

Parking in specified areas. 5. A person shall not park a vehicle in an area of the parking station—

- (a) set aside only for the standing of vehicles and marked “STANDING ONLY”;
- (b) marked “NO PARKING”;
- (c) set aside for use by a person or class of person or the holder of a particular office or class of office unless—
 - (i) in relation to an area set aside for use by a person or class of person, he is the person or is a person within the class of person designated in any notice displayed in that area; or
 - (ii) in relation to an area set aside for use by a person who is the holder of a particular office or a particular class of office, he is the holder of the particular office or is the holder of an office within the particular class of office designated in any notice displayed in that area; or
- (d) set aside for use by persons on railway business unless he is in fact engaged on railway business.

Schedule—*continued*.

Charges for parking.	6. (1) Subject to this sub-by law, a person other than an officer or servant of the Department or Commission shall not park a vehicle in the parking station during the hours specified in the Second Schedule unless he has paid the charge prescribed in item 1 of the Second Schedule. (2) The provisions of clause (1) of this sub-bylaw do not apply to an officer or servant of the Department or Commission who with the approval of the Commission pays the charge prescribed in item 2 of the Second Schedule by fortnightly instalments.
Driver to exhibit ticket.	7. (1) The driver of or person in charge of a vehicle other than a person referred to in clause (2) of sub-bylaw 6 of this by-law who desires to park the vehicle shall purchase a ticket or tickets from a ticket issuing machine corresponding to the period of time that he desires to park the vehicle in the parking station and place the ticket or tickets so purchased inside the vehicle in such a position so as to ensure that the period or periods of time of the ticket or tickets, as the case may be, is or are clearly visible from outside the vehicle. (2) The driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not— (a) park the vehicle or allow the vehicle to be parked in the parking station for a longer period of time than the period of time for which a ticket has been purchased; or (b) remove the vehicle from the parking station unless he has purchased a ticket or tickets in respect of the whole of the period that he has parked the vehicle in the parking station.
Insertion of coins in ticket issuing machines.	8. A person shall not insert or attempt to insert anything other than a ten cent denomination coin or a twenty cent denomination coin in a ticket issuing machine.
Manner of parking.	9. The driver of a vehicle shall not park the vehicle otherwise than by parking it wholly within a parking stall.
Parking of motor cycles.	10. The driver of a motor cycle without a side-car or side-box shall not park the motor cycle in any parking stall other than in a parking stall designated "M/C" or in an area of the parking station set aside for the purpose of the parking of motor cycles.
Commission may exclude persons or vehicles.	11. The Commission may exclude any person or vehicle from the parking station.
Removal of notices.	12. No person other than the driver of the vehicle shall remove any notice attached to a vehicle by an authorized person.
Certificate of appointment.	13. (1) The Commission shall issue to every authorized person a certificate of appointment. (2) An authorized person shall produce his certificate of appointment whenever requested to do so when exercising his powers and duties under these by-laws.
Personation of an authorized person.	14. A person shall not falsely represent himself to be, or personate, an authorized person.
Erection of signs.	15. A person shall not, without the authority of the Commission, mark, set up or exhibit any sign or notice in the parking station or on any ticket issuing machine in the parking station.
Owner to reveal identity of driver.	16. (1) The owner of a vehicle and any person to whom for the time being the possession or control of a vehicle may be entrusted shall, if required by an authorized person, inform the authorized person of the name and address of the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time when an offence is alleged to have been committed against this by-law by the driver or person in charge of the vehicle (in this sub-bylaw called "the relevant time"). (2) In any proceedings for an offence against clause (1) of this sub-bylaw it is a defence for the defendant to show that, at the relevant time— (a) the possession or control of the vehicle was entrusted to another person and that he informed the authorized person as to the identity and address of that other person; or (b) the vehicle had been stolen or unlawfully used.
Damage to parking station.	17. (1) A person shall not damage, deface or misuse the parking station or any ticket issuing machine thereon. (2) A person shall not without the authority of the Commission interfere with or remove any ticket issuing machine from the parking station.
Modified penalty for certain offences.	18. The modified penalty shall be payable for an offence against sub-bylaw 5, 6, 7, 9 or 10 of this by-law.
Penalty.	19. (1) Subject to this by-law a person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this by-law commits an offence. Penalty: Forty dollars. (2) The modified penalty shall be two dollars. (3) Subject to this by-law a person who does not contest an allegation that he committed an offence against any of the provisions of this by-law referred to in sub-bylaw 18 may pay the Commission the amount of the modified penalty prescribed in clause (2) of this sub-bylaw.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

(4) Where the Commission is of the opinion that an alleged offence cannot be adequately punished by the payment of the modified penalty it may refuse to accept payment of the modified penalty and may take proceedings against the alleged offender in any court of competent jurisdiction.

(5) Where an alleged offender on being served with a notice under this by-law does not pay the modified penalty in relation to the offence referred to in the notice within the time prescribed by this by-law the Commission may take proceedings against him in any court of competent jurisdiction.

20. The following provisions apply to and in relation to the recovery and payment of the modified penalty—

- (a) an authorized person may leave in or on a vehicle, the driver or person in charge of which is alleged to have committed an offence a notice in the form of Form 1;
- (b) the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time of the commission of the alleged offence specified in the notice who does not wish to contest the allegation that he has committed the offence specified in the notice shall—
 - (i) complete the notice by filling in the particulars required by the notice to be given by him and sign the notice; and
 - (ii) forward the notice together with the amount of the modified penalty to the Commission within fourteen days from the date of the notice;
- (c) production by a person of an acknowledgment by the Commission of due payment of the modified penalty is a defence to a charge of the offence in respect of which the modified penalty was paid.

21. Where an offence against this by-law, being an offence for which a modified penalty is prescribed, is alleged to have been committed by the driver or person in charge of a vehicle (in this sub-by-law called "the offender") and the modified penalty payable with respect to that offence has not been paid within the time specified in the notice notifying the offender of the commission of the offence the Commission may cause a notice in the form of Form 2 addressed to the owner of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed (in this sub-by-law called "the owner") to be served on the owner, or left in or on the vehicle, by an authorized person, and unless within fourteen days of the date on which the notice was so served or left—

- (a) the owner informs the Commission or an authorized person, in writing, as to the identity and address of the offender or furnishes information to the Commission or an authorized person that the vehicle had been stolen, or was being unlawfully used, at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed; or
 - (b) the modified penalty is paid to the Commission,
- the owner shall be deemed to be the person who committed the offence and shall be liable to pay the penalty prescribed for the offence.

22. (1) Where—

- (a) a vehicle is left in a portion of the parking station in such a manner as to obstruct the proper use of the parking station; or
- (b) a vehicle is left in the parking station for a period in excess of twenty-four hours without payment of the charge prescribed in item 1 or item 2, as the case requires, of the Second Schedule,

an authorized person may remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed to a place appointed by the Commission.

(2) Where a vehicle has been removed pursuant to clause (1) of this sub-by-law—

- (a) the vehicle may be recovered on payment of the charge prescribed in item 3 of the Second Schedule; and
- (b) the Commission may hold the vehicle until the charge prescribed in item 3 of the Second Schedule has been paid.

Service of
notices.

23. Except as provided in this by-law, any notice relating to an offence against a provision of this by-law may be served by posting it by pre-paid post addressed to the alleged offender at his usual or last known place of abode, or, if he is in business, at his usual or last known place of business.
