ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by section 64 of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1973, the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, and the Barristers' Board constituted under that Act, have made the general order set out hereunder.

GENERAL ORDER.

Solicitors Remuneration Order, 1976.

Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Solicitors Remuneration Order, 1976.

Commence-
ment and
savings. 2. (1) This Order takes effect upon the expiration of one calendar month from the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) This Order applies—

(a) in relation to remuneration for instructions, where the initiating instructions are received on or after the day that this Order takes effect;

(b) in relation to remuneration for items other than instructions, where the services are performed on or after the day that this Order takes effect, and whether or not the initiating instructions in respect of those services are received on or after that day,

but does not affect the rights of a practitioner or client in relation to remuneration for instructions received or services performed, before this Order takes effect.

Application. 3. This Order applies to and in relation to the maximum remuneration of practitioners in respect of any business connected with sales, purchases, leases, mortgages, settlements, and other matters of conveyancing and other business not being business in any action, suit or proceeding or transacted in any court and not being otherwise contentious business.

Interpre-
tation.

4. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears—
- “clause” means a clause in this Order;
- “instruction fee” means the fee prescribed under the column headed “Instruction Fee” in the Schedule in relation to a matter specified in the Schedule;
- “instructions” in relation to items 1 to 7 (both inclusive) includes the initial attendance when instructions are taken and all subsequent attendances at which instructions are taken which ought properly to have been taken at the initial attendance;
- “item” means an item specified in the Schedule;
- “mortgagee” includes the grantee of a security, and in relation to a hire-purchase agreement means the owner;
- “mortgagor” includes the grantor of a security, and in relation to a hire-purchase agreement means the hirer;
- “reference” means a reference number under the column headed “Ref.” in the Schedule in relation to a matter specified in the Schedule;
- “Schedule” means the Schedule to this Order;
- “security” includes a mortgage, hire-purchase agreement, debenture or charge or a bill of sale or assignment by way of security.

5. Subject to clauses 6 and 7, where a practitioner properly acts for both parties to a transaction he is entitled to charge each party the instruction fee prescribed in relation to that party under the item relevant to that transaction.

6. (1) Subject to this clause, where a practitioner acts for either a purchaser-mortgagor or for a vendor-mortgagee, the practitioner is entitled to charge either the instruction fee prescribed in relation to the sale or the instruction fee prescribed in relation to the security, but not both.

(2) Where a practitioner acts for a vendor in circumstances to which item 8 applies and the consideration or part thereof is secured by a security prepared by the same practitioner and executed by the purchaser in favour of the vendor, the practitioner shall be entitled to charge in respect of the sale the fee prescribed by item 8 reduced by one-fifth, and for instructions in respect of the security the instruction fee calculated in accordance with item 4 on the basis of the sum secured.

(3) Where in respect of one and the same transaction a practitioner acts for both a purchaser-mortgagor and a vendor-mortgagee—

- (a) if all the costs are to be paid by only one of the parties, the practitioner is entitled to charge the instruction fee prescribed in relation to the sale on the basis that he was acting for the purchaser but is not entitled to charge the instruction fee prescribed in relation to the security;
- (b) if each party is to pay his own instruction fee, the practitioner is entitled to charge each party such an amount so that the aggregate of the amounts payable by each is no greater than the instruction fee prescribed in relation to the sale on the basis that he was acting for the purchaser.

(4) Where in one and the same transaction a practitioner acts for both the vendor and the purchaser or for both the mortgagor and the mortgagee, the practitioner is not entitled to charge in respect of the instructions any amount which is greater in the aggregate than the instruction fee prescribed in relation to the sale or the security on the basis that he was acting for the purchaser or the mortgagor, as the case may be.

(5) Where a practitioner acts for the mortgagee on instructions to extend the term of the security, he is entitled to charge for instructions an amount not exceeding two-fifths of the instruction fee that would be payable in relation to an original security for the same amount as that secured by the security as extended.

Instruction

7. (1) Where a practitioner properly acts for both the lessor and the lessee in respect of a lease or an extension of lease the practitioner is entitled to charge for instructions only the instruction fee prescribed under item 5 in relation to a lessor.

(2) For the purposes of calculating the instruction fees prescribed under item 5—

- (a) where the term of a lease exceeds 12 years but does not exceed 26 years—the instruction fee shall be calculated on the basis of the rent payable during the first 12 years of the lease;
- (b) where the term of the lease exceeds 26 years—the instruction fee shall be calculated on the basis of the rent payable during the first 15 years of the lease,

and for this purpose the term “rent”—

- (c) includes any moneys payable as a premium for the granting of the lease;

(d) does not include any moneys payable or reserved under or by the lease in respect of—

- (i) rates and taxes whether by way of re-imburement of the lessor or otherwise; or
- (ii) expenditure incurred by the lessor in the conduct or management of the lease and premises or of any other property of which the leased premises forms part.

(3) Where a practitioner acts on the instructions of a lessor on an extension of a lease he is entitled to charge for instructions an amount not exceeding two-fifths of the instruction fee that would be payable in relation to an original lease on the same terms as the extension.

Limitations on instruction fee in item 4.

8. In relation to the instruction fee prescribed under item 4—

- (a) any amount secured by an existing collateral security prepared by the same practitioner within one year prior to the instructions shall be deducted from the amount to be secured before calculating the instruction fee; and
- (b) where the security is for an annuity and the term during which the annuity is to be paid is a period exceeding 12 years or for life—the instruction fee shall be calculated on the basis that the amount secured is 12 times either the annual payment or the average of the first 12 payments.

Uncompleted business.

9. Where any business is not completed the instruction fee payable shall be such proportion of the relevant instruction fee payable under this Order as is reasonable in the circumstances.

Services related to item 8.

10. (1) The fee prescribed by item 8 is the remuneration payable in respect of acting on instructions for the completion by transfer of an executed contract for the sale of land registered under the Transfer of Land Act, 1893 and includes the fees for all services usually performed in respect of the transaction and in particular—

- (a) the investigation of title;
 - (b) enquiries of and advice to all rating and taxing authorities of change of ownership;
 - (c) the adjustment of rates and taxes;
 - (d) preparation, execution, stamping and the registration of the transfer; and
 - (e) the arrangements for and attendances on settlement including the discharge of encumbrances,
- but the remuneration does not include the fees for—
- (f) any service performed or rendered in respect of an amendment to the contract of sale;
 - (g) the perusal of any document other than the contract of sale;
 - (h) the preparation of any document other than the transfer;
 - (i) requisitions on title or answers thereto;
 - (j) correspondence or attendances as may be rendered necessary by the amendment to the preparation of any document other than the transfer.
 - (k) correspondence or attendances not usually involved in respect of completion of the contract of sale; or
 - (l) any costs or expenses properly incurred due to the distance of the practitioner from the place of settlement or from the Office of Titles.

(2) Where a practitioner acting on instructions to which item 8 applies is obliged to perform additional services which are not services to which item 8 applies the practitioner is entitled to charge the fees prescribed under item 9 in respect of those additional services.

Drawing, engrossing, copying, tabling, etc. (item 9).

11. The fees prescribed under item 9 are the fees payable in respect of the performance of the services specified in that item.

Unusual matters and matters not in the Schedule.

12. Where—

- (a) any matter in relation to which a fee or remuneration is prescribed under items 1 to 9 (both inclusive) is unusually complex, involves an unusually high degree of skill or urgency; or
- (b) a practitioner acts on instructions or performs a service in respect of a matter that is not referred to in items 1 to 9 (both inclusive),

the practitioner is entitled to charge such fee or charge, as the case requires, as is reasonable in the circumstances.

From the intersection of Leach Highway and North Lake Road, north along North Lake Road to Canning Highway, east and northeast along Canning Highway to Hickey Street, south along Hickey Street and its extension to Davy Street, east and southeast along Davy Street to Marmion Street, southwest along Marmion Street to Marcus Avenue, south along Marcus Avenue to Leach Highway, and west along Leach Highway to the intersection with North Lake Road.

The boundary parts of North Lake Road (east side), Canning Highway (south side), Davy Street (south side), Marmion Street (north side), Marcus Avenue (west side), and Leach Highway (north side) are included in the area for the Booragoon Primary School. Hickey Street (both sides) is included in the area for the Ardross Primary School.

The area bounded by Marmion Street, Riseley Street, Leach Highway and Marcus Avenue is to be an optional area between Booragoon Primary School and Ardross Primary School. The boundary parts of Marmion Street (south side), Riseley Street (west side), Leach Highway (north side) and Marcus Avenue (east side) are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to seven in 1977 and living within the boundary for the Booragoon Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Booragoon Primary School, except that children living in the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the Booragoon Primary School or the Ardross Primary School.

2. Camberwarra Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

Marmion Avenue, from the northern boundary of the locality of Heathridge, south along Marmion Avenue to its junction with Albion Street, east along Albion Street, across Camberwarra Drive and east along Arawa Place and its easterly extension to Camberwarra Drive, north along Camberwarra Drive to Corima Place, and east along Corima Place and its extension to the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway.

The boundary part of Marmion Avenue (east side) is included in the area for the Camberwarra Primary School. The boundary streets of Albion Street (both sides), Arawa Place (both sides) and Corima Place (both sides), and the boundary part of Camberwarra Drive (east side) are included in the area for the Craigie Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to seven inclusive in 1977 and living within the boundary for the Camberwarra Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Camberwarra Primary School, except that children in Year seven in 1977 and currently attending Craigie Primary School may remain at their present (1976) school or may transfer to the Camberwarra Primary School at the beginning of the 1977 school year.

3. East Maddington Primary School and Gosnells Primary School:

The following has been approved as an optional area for the above-mentioned schools:—

Ellis Brook from where it is crossed by Rushton Road, along Ellis Brook in a generally southwesterly direction to the Canning River, in a generally northwesterly direction along the Canning River to the railway line, in a generally southeasterly direction along the railway line to a point due west of the bridge across the Canning River leading to the Eventide Home for Men, due east to a point due north of the north-south alignment of Canning Mills Road.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to seven inclusive and living in the optional area, as defined above, may attend either the East Maddington Primary School or the Gosnells Primary School.

Parents of children from the above-defined area who wish their children to attend the Clifton Hills Primary School must obtain written permission from the Director-General of Education to do so.

4. Hillman Primary School:

The boundary gazetted on the 28th December, 1973 (p. 4738 of *Government Gazette*, W.A.) is hereby cancelled.

5. Huntingdale Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the intersection of Gay Street and Warton Road, northeast along Warton Road to Spencer Road, east along Spencer Road to the Southern River, and along the Southern River in a generally southerly direction.

The boundary parts of Warton Road (south-east side) and Spencer Road (south side) are included within the boundary for the Huntingdale Primary School.

Children attending Government Schools and in Years one to five inclusive in 1977 and living within the boundary for the Huntingdale Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Huntingdale Primary School.

6. Kardinya Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

North Lake Road from the junction with Leach Highway, south along North Lake Road and Albert Road and its extension to the extension of Farrington Road west of North Lake Road, east and northeast along the proposed alignment of Farrington Road to Windelya Road.

The boundary parts of North Lake Road (east side), Albert Road (east side) and Farrington Road (north side) are included in the area for the Kardinya Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to four inclusive in 1977 and living within the area for the Kardinya Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Kardinya Primary School.

7. South Newman Primary School/Newman Primary School:

The boundary between the above-mentioned schools is as follows:

Newman Drive:

The boundary part of Newman Drive (south side) is included in the area for the South Newman Primary School.

The area bounded on the north by Newman Drive, on the east by Marillana Street and on the south by Fortescue Avenue is to be an optional area between Newman Primary School and South Newman Primary School for 1977 only, except that Year one pupils in 1977 from this optional area and primary school-aged children of new families moving into the optional area shall enrol at the South Newman Primary School from 1977 onwards. The boundary street of Marillana Street (both sides) and the boundary parts of Fortescue Avenue (north side) and Newman Drive (south side) are included in the optional area.

8. West Balcatta Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Delawney Street and Odin Road, southwest along Odin Road to the junction with the proposed re-alignment of North Beach Road, east along the proposed re-alignment of North Beach Road to the junction with Sandpiper Road, east along Sandpiper Road to Cedric Street,

across Cedric Street and east along Spoonbill Road to Shearwater Drive, northeast along Shearwater Drive to Harrier Place, in a generally easterly direction along Harrier Place and a Right of Way through to Jones Street, northeast along Jones Street to a Right of Way leading to Lowen Place, northwest along this Right of Way to Lowen Place, west along Lowen Place to Drew Street, north along Drew Street to Woodhall Street, east along Woodhall Street to Rance Street, north along Rance Street to Poincaire Street, west along Poincaire Street to the eastern boundary of the Balcatta Senior High School site, north along such boundary to Amelia Street, east along Amelia Street to Kexby Street, north and west along Kexby Street to Buckle Street, north along Buckle Street to Attra Street, west along Attra Street to Cadd Street, north along Cadd Street to Knowles Street, west along Knowles Street to its western extremity, thence from the junction of Knowles Street and Fontaine Street north, northeast and north along Fontaine Street to Campsbourne Street, west along Campsbourne Street to the junction with Belham Way, due north from this point through to Delawney Street, and west along Delawney Street to the junction with Odin Road.

The boundary streets of Sandpiper Road (north side), Harrier Place (north side), Lowen Place (south side), Rance Street (west side), Buckle Street (west side) and Cadd Street (west side), and the boundary parts of Odin Road (east side), proposed re-alignment of North Beach Road (north side), Spoonbill Road (north side), Jones Street (both sides), Drew Street (west side), Woodhall Street (north side), Poincaire Street (south side), Amelia Street (north side), Kexby Street (west and south sides), Attra Street (south side), Campsbourne Street (south side) and Delawney Street (south side) are included in the area for the West Balcatta Primary School. The boundary street of Fontaine Street (both sides) and the boundary parts of Shearwater Drive (both sides) and Knowles Street (both sides) are excluded from the area for the West Balcatta Primary School.

The following have been declared as optional areas:—

- (a) Between Lake Gwelup Primary School and West Balcatta Primary School:

The area bounded by Odin Road on the east, the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway on the west and the proposed extension of Delawney Street on the north from Odin Road to the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway. The boundary parts of Odin Road (west side), Mitchell Freeway (east side) and Delawney Street (south side) are included in the optional area.

- (b) Between Birralee Primary School and West Balcatta Primary School:

From the junction of North Beach Road and Jones Street, in a generally northeasterly direction along Jones Street to a Right of Way leading to Harrier Place, northwest along this Right of Way to Harrier Place, west along Harrier Place to Shearwater Drive, southwest along Shearwater Drive to Spoonbill Road, west along Spoonbill Road to Cedric Street, across Cedric Street and west along Sandpiper Road to the junction with the proposed re-alignment of North Beach Road, southeast along the proposed re-alignment of North Beach Road and then North Beach Road itself to the junction with

Jones Street. The boundary streets of Harrier Place (south side) and Sandpiper Road (south side) and the boundary parts of Jones Street (both sides), Shearwater Drive (both sides), Spoonbill Road (south side), proposed re-alignment of North Beach Road (north side) and North Beach Road (north side) are included in the optional area.

- (c) Between West Balcatta Primary School, Balcatta Primary School and Takari Primary School:

From the junction of Rance Street and Poincaire Street, south along Rance Street to Woodhall Street, west along Woodhall Street to Drew Street, south along Drew Street to Lowen Place, east along Lowen Place and southeast along a Right of Way leading to Jones Street, northeast and north along Jones Street to Poincaire Street, and west along Poincaire Street to the junction with Rance Street. The boundary streets of Rance Street (east side) and Lowen Place (north side) and the boundary parts of Woodhall Street (south side), Drew Street (east side), Jones Street (west side) and Poincaire Street (south side) are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to four inclusive in 1977 and living within the boundary for the West Balcatta Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the West Balcatta Primary School, except that children living in the optional areas, as designated above, and in Years one to four inclusive in 1977, may attend either of the schools listed in each case.

9. Balcatta Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

From the intersection of Amelia Street and Wanneroo Road, west along Amelia Street to Main Street, south along Main Street to Alexander Street, west along Alexander Street to Canning Street, south along Canning Street to Donnington Road, west along Donnington Road to Langworth Road, south along Langworth Road to Keal Street, west along Keal Street to Jones Street, south and in a generally south-westerly direction along Jones Street to North Beach Road, southeast and east along North Beach Road to Hamilton Street, southeast and southwest along Hamilton Street to Swan Street, east along Swan Street to Wanneroo Road, and northwest along Wanneroo Road to the intersection with Amelia Street.

The boundary streets of Alexander Street (south side), Donnington Road (south side) and Keal Street (south side) and the boundary parts of Amelia Street (south side), Main Street (west side), Canning Street (east side), Langworth Road (east side), Jones Street (east side) between Keal Street and the Right of Way leading from Jones Street to Lowen Place, North Beach Road (north side) between Jones Street and King Edward Street, North Beach Road (both sides) between King Edward Street and Hamilton Street, Hamilton Street (both sides), Swan Street (north side) and Wanneroo Road (west side) are included in the area for the Balcatta Primary School. Jones Street (both sides) from North Beach Road to the Right of Way leading from Jones Street to Lowen Place is excluded from the area for the Balcatta Primary School.

The following have been declared as optional areas:—

- (a) Between Balcatta Primary School, Takari Primary School and West Balcatta Primary School:

From the junction of Rance Street and Poincaire Street, south along Rance Street to Woodhall Street, west along Woodhall Street to Drew Street, south along Drew Street to Lowen Place, east along Lowen Place and south-east along a Right of Way leading to Jones Street, northeast and north along Jones Street to Poincaire Street, and west along Poincaire Street to the junction with Rance Street. The boundary streets of Rance Street (east side) and Lowen Place (north side) and the boundary parts of Woodhall Street (south side), Drew Street (east side), Jones Street (west side) and Poincaire Street (south side) are included in the optional area.

- (b) Between Balcatta Primary School and Takari Primary School:

From the intersection of Amelia Street and Main Street, west along Amelia Street to the eastern boundary of the Balcatta Senior High School site, south along such boundary to Poincaire Street, east along Poincaire Street to Jones Street, north along Jones Street to Keal Street, east along Keal Street to Langworth Road, north along Langworth Road to Donnington Road, east along Donnington Road to Canning Street, north along Canning Street to Alexander Street, east along Alexander Street to Main Street, and north along Main Street to the intersection with Amelia Street. The boundary streets of Keal Street (north side), Donnington Road (north side) and Alexander Street (north side) and the boundary parts of Amelia Street (south side), Poincaire Street (north side), Jones Street (west side), Langworth Road (west side), Canning Street (west side) and Main Street (west side) are included in the optional area.

- (c) Between Birralee Primary School, Balcatta Primary School and Osborne Primary School:

From the intersection of Cedric Street and North Beach Road, south along Cedric Street to George Street, southwest along George Street to Hertha Road, in a generally southeasterly direction along Hertha Road to King Edward Road, northeast along King Edward Road to North Beach Road, northwest along North Beach Road to Cedric Street. The boundary parts of Cedric Street (both sides), George Street (both sides), Hertha Road (both sides), King Edward Road (both sides) and North Beach Road (south side) are included in the optional area.

10. West Greenwood Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the intersection of the proposed Hepburn Avenue and Mitchell Freeway, south and southeast along the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway to the junction with Tuart Road, east along Tuart Road to a point due south of the western extremity of Lambertia Street, due north from this point to Lambertia Street, east, north and northeast along Lambertia Street to Coolibah Drive, northwest along Coolibah

Drive to Bottlebrush Drive, in a generally northeasterly direction along Bottlebrush Drive to its northernmost junction with Melaleuca Drive, northeast along Melaleuca Drive to Blackall Drive, across Blackall Drive and northeast and north along Wirilda Crescent to the proposed alignment of Hepburn Avenue, across Hepburn Avenue and north along Barrisdale Drive to the proposed alignment of Whitfords Avenue.

The boundary parts of the Mitchell Freeway (east side), Tuart Road (north side), Lambertia Street (both sides), Coolibah Drive (south side), Bottlebrush Drive (both sides), Melaleuca Drive (both sides), Wirilda Crescent (both sides) and Barrisdale Drive (west side) are included in the area for the West Greenwood Primary School.

The area bounded by Lorne Road, Doveridge Drive (south of Lorne Road), Glengarry Drive, Arnisdale Road and the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway is to be an optional area between West Greenwood Primary School, Duncraig Primary School and Davallia Primary School for Year one pupils in 1977 with older siblings at those schools; all other 1977 Year one pupils and primary school-aged children moving into the area for the 1977 school year shall attend West Greenwood Primary School. The boundary street of Lorne Road (both sides) and the boundary parts of Doveridge Drive (east side), Glengarry Drive (east side), Arnisdale Road (north side), and the Mitchell Freeway (West side) are included in the optional area.

The area bounded by Arnisdale Road, the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway, Warwick Road Deviation and Glengarry Drive is to be an optional area between West Greenwood Primary School and Davallia Primary School. The boundary parts of Arnisdale Road (south side), the Mitchell Freeway (west side), Warwick Road Deviation (north side) and Glengarry Drive (east side) are included in the optional area.

The following area is to be an optional area between West Greenwood Primary School and Duncraig Primary School: From the junction of the proposed alignment of Hepburn Avenue with Glengarry Drive, south along Glengarry Drive to Castlefern Way, southwest and south along the western portion of Castlefern Way and its extension to Portree Way, south and southeast along Portree Way to Oban Court, southwest along Oban Court, from the western extremity of Oban Court due south to Warwick Road Deviation, southeast along Warwick Road Deviation to Glengarry Drive, north along Glengarry Drive to its southernmost junction with Doveridge Drive, north along Doveridge Drive to Lorne Road, east along Lorne Road to the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway, northwest and north along the proposed alignment of the Mitchell Freeway to the intersection with the proposed Hepburn Avenue, and west and southwest along the proposed Hepburn Avenue to the junction with Glengarry Drive. The boundary street of Oban Court (both sides) is included in the optional area and the boundary street of Lorne Road (both sides) is excluded from the optional area. The boundary parts of the northern section of Glengarry Drive (east side), Castlefern Way (both sides), Portree Way (both sides), Warwick Road Deviation (north side), the southern section of Glengarry Drive (west side), Doveridge Drive (west side), Mitchell Freeway (west side) and Hepburn Avenue (south side), are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to four inclusive in 1977 and living within the boundary for the West Greenwood Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the West Greenwood Primary School, except that children living in the optional areas, as designated above, and in Years one to four inclusive in 1977, may attend either of the schools listed in each case.

11. West Lynwood Primary School:

The boundary for the above-mentioned school is as follows:—

New High Road, from its junction with Nicholson Road, northwest along New High Road to High Road, west along High Road to Riley Road and south along Riley Road to the junction with Collins Road.

The boundary parts of New High Road (south side), High Road (south side), and Riley Road (east side) are included in the area for the West Lynwood Primary School.

The area bounded by High Road, New High Road and Metcalfe Road is to be an optional area between West Lynwood Primary School and Lynwood Primary School. The boundary parts of High Road (south side), New High Road (northeast side) and Metcalfe Road (northwest side) are included in the optional area.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to seven inclusive in 1977 and living within the boundary for the West Lynwood Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the West Lynwood Primary School, except that children liv-

ing in the optional area, as designated above, may attend either the West Lynwood Primary School or the Lynwood Primary School.

12. Withers Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Hudson Road and Parade Road, west along Hudson Road and its extension to the Indian Ocean.

The boundary part of Hudson Road (south side) is included in the area for the Withers Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to six inclusive in 1977 and living south of the boundary for the Withers Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Withers Primary School.

13. Woodlupine Primary School:

The boundary for the abovementioned school is as follows:—

From the junction of Hale Road and Hardey Road, northeast and east along Hale Road to the junction with Hawtin Road, and north along Hawtin Road to its junction with Sultana Road.

The boundary parts of Hale Road (north side) and Hawtin Road (west side) are included in the area for the Woodlupine Primary School.

Children attending Government schools and in Years one to four inclusive in 1977 and living within the boundary for the Woodlupine Primary School, as provided above, shall attend the Woodlupine Primary School.
