Local Government Act, 1960-1976.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 4347/74 (R.5250).

Work comprises:—

- so that the revocation of the regulations referred to in paragraph (a) of this notice and the regulations referred to in paragraph (b) of this notice take effect on and from the day that the Building Societies Act, 1976 comes into operation.

BUILDING SOCIETIES REGULATIONS, 1977.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Building Societies Regulations, 1977. Citation.
2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.
 "Form" means a form in the Fifth Schedule;
 "regulation" means one of these regulations;
 "Schedule" means a Schedule to these regulations;
 "the Act" means the Building Societies Act, 1976.
3. The procedure of the Advisory Committee shall be in accordance with the provisions set out in the First Schedule. Advisory Committee. (First Schedule).
4. (1) Application for the registration of a society shall be made in writing addressed to the Registrar. Manner of application.
 (2) An application referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be signed by the chairman and secretary of the formation meeting of the society.
5. (1) The rules of a society shall make provision in respect of the matters mentioned in the Second Schedule set forth in the order therein specified as nearly as may be. Rules of a society. (Second Schedule).
 (2) The fee to be paid to a society for a copy of the society's rules is one dollar.
6. (1) The prescribed number of members for the purposes of section 14 in relation to— Prescribed number of members.
 (a) a permanent society—is fifty members;
 (b) a terminating society—is ten members or such number as is approved by the Advisory Committee.
 (2) The prescribed number of members for the purposes of subsection (3) of section 71 in relation to—
 (a) a permanent society—is fifty members;
 (b) a terminating society—is ten members or such number as is approved by the Advisory Committee.
7. The following additional particulars are prescribed for the purposes of subsection (3) of section 26—
 (a) a copy of the special resolution required pursuant to subsection (2) of section 26;
 (b) a declaration by the secretary of each society applying for registration as an amalgamated society in the form of form 12 in the Fifth Schedule.
8. (1) A change of name of a permanent society shall be published in a daily newspaper circulating throughout the State. Publication of change of name.

SCHEDULE—*continued.*

(2) A change of name of a society, whether a permanent society or a terminating society, shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) The publication required by this regulation shall be effected not later than fourteen days after the issue of the certificate of incorporation in the new name.

Minutes.

9. (1) Every society shall cause—

(a) minutes of all proceedings of general meetings, whether special or ordinary, and of meetings of its directors to be entered in books kept for that purpose; and

(b) those minutes to be signed by the chairman of the next succeeding meeting.

(2) Minutes of any meeting shall be recorded in the books kept for that purpose within fourteen days after the day on which the meeting is held.

(3) The books containing the minutes of proceedings of any general meeting or of a meeting of the directors of a society shall be kept by the society at the registered office or principal place of business of the society.

(4) Books containing the proceedings of general meetings shall be open to inspection by any member without charge.

(5) Any member of a society is entitled to be furnished within seven days after he has made a request in writing in that behalf to the society with a copy of any minutes of a general meeting at a charge not exceeding 20 cents for every hundred words thereof.

(6) A copy of all minutes of a permanent society shall be sent to every director of the society within fourteen days after the date of the meeting.

(7) The minutes of all meetings of a terminating society shall be made available to all directors within fourteen days after the date of the meeting.

Returns not available for inspection.

10. Any return furnished to the Registrar pursuant to section 41 shall not be available for inspection under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 9.

Publication of accounts.

11. Subject to any exemption granted pursuant to subsection (24) of section 65 the documents referred to in subsection (11) of that section shall be published in a daily newspaper circulating throughout the State.

Security.

12. The security prescribed for the purposes of subsection (5) of section 71 and of section 80 shall be a bond—

(a) in a form;

(b) in the sum of money; and

(c) from an insurance company,

approved of by the Registrar.

Form of receipt.

13. For the purpose of section 16 the prescribed form of receipt shall be as follows—

- (b) conforms with a scheme for the winding up approved by the Registrar after having regard to the circumstances of the case.

15. (1) Subject to this regulation, the maximum amounts of fees and expenses that may be paid in any one financial year to any director of a society is as follows—

(2) Where any fees or expenses are paid in respect of the first financial year they shall be adjusted rateably in respect of each month by which the year exceeds or is less than twelve months.

(3) A reference in this section to “expenses” does not include any moneys paid by way of reimbursement of expenses properly and reasonably incurred whilst acting as a director of the society.

16. (1) The fees set forth in the Third Schedule are payable to the Registrar in respect of the several matters set out in that Schedule.

(2) Any fees not paid pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation constitute a debt payable to the Crown and are recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

17. (1) Where a provision of the Act is specified in the first column of the Fourth Schedule, the form to be used for the purposes of that provision in relation to the purpose specified in the second column of the Fourth Schedule is the form prescribed in the Fifth Schedule of which the number is specified in the third column of the Fourth Schedule opposite that provision.

(2) Where a form prescribed by these regulations requires completion by the insertion of particulars or other matters referred to in the form, those particulars or other matters are prescribed as the particulars or other matters required under the provisions of the Act for the purposes for which the form is prescribed.

(3) Where a form prescribed by these regulations contains directions as to the manner in which the form shall be completed the form shall be completed in accordance with those directions.

(4) Except where the terms of a form otherwise provide, strict compliance with the forms contained in these regulations is not necessary and substantial compliance is sufficient.

18. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with a provision of these regulations commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars.

PROCEDURES APPLICABLE TO ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

1. (1) The Advisory Committee shall meet at least once in every two months.
(2) Such meetings are in these regulations called "ordinary meetings".
2. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee of his own volition may, and if requested in writing to do so at any time by any two members of the Advisory Committee shall, forthwith convene a special meeting of the Advisory Committee.
3. The Registrar shall, wherever practicable, give at least three days' notice of every meeting, whether an ordinary meeting or a special meeting, to each member of the Advisory Committee.
4. Unless the Advisory Committee otherwise resolves, the order of business at every ordinary meeting shall be as follows:—
 - (a) minutes of previous meeting;
 - (b) correspondence;
 - (c) reports;
 - (d) applications for registration;
 - (e) any other business;
 - (f) date of next meeting.
5. The decision of the Advisory Committee on a question is that of the majority of votes of the members present and voting, each member being entitled to one vote, but in the event of an equality of votes, the Chairman has a casting vote in addition to a deliberative vote.
6. The Chairman presiding at any meeting shall decide upon any point of order or procedure and his decision shall be final.
7. (1) The secretary, or in his absence any other person authorised by the Advisory Committee to do so, shall keep proper minutes of every meeting, and such minutes shall be submitted to the members of the Advisory Committee for confirmation either at the same or a subsequent meeting, and when confirmed shall be signed by the Chairman presiding at the meeting at which those minutes are confirmed.
(2) Production of the minute book purporting to have been signed by the Chairman shall be conclusive evidence of the matters recorded in the minutes.

MATTERS TO BE PROVIDED FOR IN THE RULES OF A SOCIETY.

The prescribed provisions to be contained in the rules of a society pursuant to section 17 of the Act are—

- (1) The name of the society and the location of its office.
- (2) The objects of the society.
- (3) The body in which the administration of the society is vested.
- (4) The mode and conditions of admission to membership and the share or interest to be acquired before the exercise of the rights of membership.
- (5) The circumstances under which membership shall cease.
- (6) The manner in which the funds of the society are to be raised.
- (7) The manner in which the funds of the society are to be managed, including the mode of drawing and signing cheques, drafts, bills of exchange, promissory notes and other negotiable instruments.
- (8) The denomination of shares and the maximum shareholding.
- (9) The conditions relating to deposits.
- (10) The application and investment of funds.
- (11) The conditions relating to loans and the security therefor, including the conditions upon which a borrower may redeem the amount due prior to the expiration of the period of the loan.

- (12) The manner in which any surplus arising out of the operations of the society is to be distributed.
- (13) The manner in which arrears in payments shall be treated.
- (14) The manner in which losses are to be ascertained and provided for.
- (15) The number of directors, the qualifications as to the shareholding of directors, the manner of electing, remunerating and removing directors and filling a vacancy.
- (16) The method of giving notice of any meeting of the society and the quorum for meetings.
- (17) Matters relating to voting at any meeting of the society, including the voting rights of members, the entitlement to vote by proxy and the right of the chairman to exercise a casting vote.
- (18) The powers and duties of the board of directors, the manner of calling meetings of the board of directors, the quorum for such meetings and the procedure at such meetings.
- (19) The procedure at meetings of the society and the majority necessary for carrying resolutions.
- (20) The manner of appointing proxies and their rights.
- (21) The frequency at which the accounts of the society are to be audited.
- (22) The manner of appointing, remunerating and removing auditors, the powers and duties of auditors and in particular their powers and duties with respect to the inspection of securities held by the society.
- (23) The manner of settling disputes between the society and its officers or members, or any person claiming through any member or under the rules.
- (24) The security to be given by any officer or employee of the society having the receipt of charge of any money belonging to the society.
- (25) The manner of altering, adding to or rescinding the rules.
- (26) The custody and use of the seal of the society.
- (27) The manner in which the society may be wound up, in so far as such matters are not dealt with by or under the Act.

This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme 7A, Marangaroo Scheme hereinafter called 'The Scheme' and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Hon. Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Responsible Authority.

2. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Wanneroo hereinafter referred to as 'The Council'.

Maps.

3. The following Maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

Land use Map.
Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as the Scheme Area.

General Objects.

5. The General Objects of the Scheme are:

- (a) to facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of the land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) to make provision for suitable roads within the Scheme Area.
- (c) to ensure the proper drainage of the roads and of those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other such works.
- (d) to make provision for the creation of drainage reserves and easements.
- (e) to ensure the provision of reticulated water to and throughout the Scheme Area.

- (f) to have land within the Scheme Area connected to a sewer, and to provide for sewerage works and facilities both within and outside the Scheme Area where these are necessary to the proper sewerage of the Scheme Area.
- (g) to plan and make provision for land to be used for a school.
- (h) to carry out initial development of the recreation reserves.

Scheme Works.

6. (a) The scheme area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such variations as may be approved by the Town Planning Board.

(b) Roads to Council's specification for roads in residential areas shall be constructed on the land shown as roads on the Scheme Map including any necessary drainage and earthworks. All roads in the Scheme Area constructed as at the date of coming into operation of the Scheme, within the Scheme Area shall be upgraded to the standard of construction required by Council for new roads in residential areas.

(c) The Scheme Area shall be drained and all necessary drainage works shall be carried out.

(d) All new lots within the Scheme Area shall be supplied with reticulated water.

(e) A sewerage reticulation service shall be supplied to all new lots within the Scheme Area.

(f) The land coloured green on the Scheme Map shall be set aside for public open space, drainage reserves and easements.

(g) Initial development, being the clearing, levelling, landscaping and reticulation of the recreation reserves to be carried out where it is considered by Council to be desirable or necessary.

(h) Any levelling, grading and landscaping within the Scheme Area will be carried out where it is considered necessary by Council.

(i) Where necessary existing services shall be re-located.

(j) Those outbuildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision shall be demolished and removed.

Native Trees.

7. So far as is practicable and consistent with the economic subdivisional development of land, native trees and shrubs are to be retained. The Council may mark specific trees or groups of trees and these trees are to be retained unless approval is given by Council in writing for their removal.

Road Closures.

8. Council is to initiate action upon the gazettal of final approval of this Scheme for the closure of those roads which are shown as roads on the land use map but are not shown as roads on the Scheme Map or are shown thereon as closed roads and the land shall be used for the purpose shown on the Scheme Map.

Method of Carrying out Objects.

9. The subdivision of land within the Scheme Area shall be in accordance with the pre-calculated survey plan of the overall Scheme Area.

10. The Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit alterations or variations to the Scheme Map where in its opinion circumstances justify such action provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

11. Where land has been acquired for the widening of the Wanneroo Road Reserve and compensation for the same has not been finalised the owner's interest in the Scheme will be calculated on the area of his land holding prior to the land for the Wanneroo Road widening being acquired.

Subdivision.

12. The Council shall submit an overall plan of proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning Development Act 1928 as amended. This plan shall be in the form of the previously mentioned pre-calculated survey plan of the total Scheme Area.

13. The Town Planning Board may refuse to approve a diagram/plan of survey and the Council may not undertake development in certain sections of the Scheme Area until scheme works can be carried out therein or until other sections have been subdivided and/or developed.

Value of new Lots.

14. The lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Map (hereinafter called "the new lots") shall be valued as at the date of coming into operation of the Scheme as residential land on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out.

Valuations.

15. (a) The valuations of the lots shown on the Land Use Plan, hereinafter called "old lots" shall be valued as at the 30th day of July, 1973, the date on which Wanneroo Shire Council received valuations on the "old lots" from the Chief Valuer, State Taxation Department.

(b) The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department, one of his officers or such other valuer being a member of the Australian Institute of Valuers Incorporated, (W.A. Division) as Council determines.

(c) The basis of valuation will be the unimproved value as defined by Section 533(3) of the Local Government Act 1960 as amended.

(d) If an owner shall object to the value placed on his old lot, he may give notice of such objection to the Council within thirty (30) days after having been served with notice of the said value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.

(e) If a value placed on a lot shall be changed as the result of an objection, the valuer may reconsider the value placed on the other lots and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable.

(f) Where a valuation in respect of the old lots is referred to arbitration, it shall be determined by a single arbitrator in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof at the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree on any one single arbitrator, he will be nominated by the President of the Australian Institute of Valuers Incorporated, W.A. Division. The arbitrator shall have regard to matters placed before him in respect of the value to be determined in regard to the values placed on other land in the Scheme Area as the old lot value.

Owners Value Ratio.

16. From the sum of the values of the new lots shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the Scheme and the figure is the net value for the new lots.

The owners value ratio is the relationship between the sum of values of the old lots and the net value of the new lots.

Owners Interest in Scheme.

17. Each owner of an old lot shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in the Scheme of a value equal to the value of his old lot increased or decreased as the case may be in the ratio of the owners value ratio as determined in accordance with Section 16 hereof.

Scheme Costs.

18. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are herein referred to as Scheme Costs—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision

costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the Scheme as determined by Council.

- (b) All compensation payable and all the costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (c) The acquisition of any land within or near the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (d) The cost of the construction and drainage of all roads shown on the Scheme Map to the standard specifications of construction accepted for such works within the Scheme Area.
- (e) The cost of sewerage works necessary for the connection of the lots within the Scheme Area to the main Metropolitan sewerage network.
- (f) The cost of water reticulation works necessary for the connection of the lots within the Scheme Area to the Metropolitan water main network.
- (g) The cost of drainage works necessary for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area, including all necessary drainage works reservations and easements whether inside or outside the Scheme Area.
- (h) All legal and valuation fees to be included as a Scheme cost.
- (i) Cost of the initial parkland reserve development for such land within the Scheme Area.
- (j) All other costs and expenses which the Shire shall be required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.
- (k) All interest and other charges incurred on money needed to implement the Scheme are a Scheme cost.

Estimate of Scheme Costs.

19. The Council may from time to time revise the estimate of Scheme Costs and shall advise owners accordingly.

School Site.

20. The land shown as a school site on the Scheme Map shall be offered for sale at a figure based on a broad hectare residential value, having regard to the scheme works having been carried out necessary for the development of the site as a school and shall include half the cost of boundary roads, drainage and water reticulation therein, together with engineering and surveying fees necessary for the construction and installation of these works and sewerage.

The site will be offered on the basis that the said land is to be used as a school site.

Acquisition of Land.

21. The land within the Scheme Area or as much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

Estimate of Compensation.

22. In the event of any claim for compensation not having been settled at the time when Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of this Scheme, the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be and shall form part of the receipts or expenditure of this Scheme.

Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.

23. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six months of the coming into operation of the Scheme, or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of recission under clause 31 hereof whichever is the later.

Allocation and Disposal of New Lots.

24. The new lots created by the re-survey of the area shall be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) Each owner of land within the Scheme Boundary will be offered a new lot or lots with the position and dimensions as nearly as possible as that shown on "Scheme Map" bearing the numbers shown in red assigned to his old lot on the Land Use Map (hereinafter called "replacement lots").
- (b) The Council shall set aside sufficient lots (hereinafter called "saleable lots") in order that the costs of the Scheme may be paid from the sale of them.
- (c) The remaining parts of new lots or value of part new lots shall be apportioned among the owners of the old lots as equitably as possible and offered to such owners, either upon payment of a proportionate part of the new lot valuation by the owner in order that he may obtain a further whole new lot or upon payment to the owner by the Scheme of the proportionate part of a new lot to which the owner is entitled.
- (d) The offer mentioned in sub-clause (c) hereof must be such that the total value of the replacement lots offered and the new value of any land within the Scheme Area, together with or subject to a payment in money, is equal to the owner's interest in the scheme as ascertained in accordance with clause (17) hereof.
- (e) An owner from whom land has been resumed but to whom no offer of land is made shall be offered a cash payment equal to that owner's interest in the scheme.

Nature of Offers.

25. The offers mentioned in clause 24 hereof shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot or lots the subject of the offer payment to be made or received as the case may be and an estimate of any compensation payable to the owner under the Scheme, and the old lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owner's interest in the Scheme, how the offer is calculated, the valuations placed on the said lots and payment to be made or received as the case may be.

26. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

27. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time, shall, subject to Clause 23 hereof, be deemed to have been rejected. No acceptance of the offer shall be deemed a valid acceptance unless all rates and taxes owed by the owner of land within the area specified have been paid.

28. The offer of the replacement lot or lots may be accepted and the offer of the remaining lots may be rejected.

29. If an owner does not accept an offer wholly or in part Council shall vary the offer so that it is a total cash offer equal to his interest in the Scheme and shall hold that sum in trust.

30. If the offer be wholly accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme.

Registration of Transfers.

31. The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each offer of a replacement lot which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1959, and return it to the Council for registration within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer), the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made and the land subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

Rejected Lots.

32. If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accordance with this Scheme or fails to complete a transfer of the said lot in the manner aforesaid, the Council may deal with the lots so affected as hereinafter appears.

Sale of Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots.

33. The Council may sell the saleable lots and the rejected lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia, one of his officers or a valuer being a member of the Australian Institute of Valuers Incorporated, W.A. Division, unless, after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

Valuation of Saleable Lots and Rejected Lots.

34. The Council may acquire all saleable lots, or any individual saleable lot which is not purchased during a normal sale and ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department, one of his officers or a valuer being a member of the Australian Institute of Valuers Incorporated, W.A. Division, as determined by Council and credit the Scheme with the value it so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained, sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

Income and Expenditure.

35. In the event of money received by the Council from the operation of the Scheme exceeding the total payments and liabilities in respect of the Scheme, the amount of such excess will be distributed amongst the owners from whom land was resumed according to their interest in the Scheme.

36. In the event of money received by Council from the operations of the Scheme, not exceeding the total payment and liabilities in respect of the Scheme, the amount of such deficit will be borne by the municipal fund.

37. If an owner or other person or persons entitled to an interest in the Scheme cannot be found, the Council may after the expiration of six years from the date on which an offer was made in accordance with Clause 24 hereof, expend the amount of his interest in the Scheme on the improvement of the Scheme area and thereafter such owner shall have no claim in respect of such money.

Encumbrance on Title.

38. In the event of any land in the area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser, mortgagee, chargee or lessee, the Council shall not transfer a new lot to the owner unless subject to similar encumbrances or with the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance.

Powers of Council.

39. The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the area.
- (b) To enter into agreement or arrangement with the owners of any land within the area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land within the area.
- (e) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit.
- (f) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreement relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (g) To make minor variations to the survey design where necessary or desirable as laid down in Clause 10.
- (h) To lodge Caveats pursuant to the Scheme.

Finance.

40. The Council shall do all things necessary in order to raise loans or to provide funds from other sources for the purpose of providing the finance necessary for the implementation of the Scheme. If Council shall be unable to arrange the necessary finance, it shall be under no liability to the owners of land within the Scheme Area or to any other person by reason of its failure to acquire lands or carry out works.

Arbitration.

41. Any dispute or difference between the owners as to their respective rights under the Scheme and any matter which by the terms of this Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department in Western Australia.

Change of Zoning.

42. The Council may from time to time apply for the consent of the Hon. Minister for Town Planning to the zoning or rezoning of the land included within the Scheme Area.

Every person using the Pool shall be dressed in a decent and suitable manner and any person who appears in public in a condition which, in the opinion of the manager or other person for time being in charge of the Pool is offensive, then the Manager shall direct that he or she shall resume his or her ordinary clothes forthwith.

Admission.

4. No person shall, without the express permission of the Council, or the Manager, enter the Pool save through the turnstile erected at the entrance for that purpose and upon payment of the prescribed admission charge. No child under school age will be admitted to the Pool premises unless accompanied by a person of ten (10) years of age or over.

Charges for Admission.

5. All persons wishing to obtain season or period tickets or tokens granting admission to the Pool for any one stipulated season or period may obtain such tickets or tokens on application to the Manager upon payment of the prescribed fee. Such season or period tickets or tokens shall be offered for inspection to the attendant when used to obtain admission to the Pool. Season or period tickets or tokens are not transferable and such a ticket or token may be used only by the person in whose name the same is issued. A list of all season or period ticket or token holders shall be kept at the Pool and the attendant shall refuse admission to a person seeking the same and using any such ticket or token if the attendant reasonably believes that the person so seeking admission is not the person to whom such ticket or token was issued.

6. The charges prescribed for admissions to the Pool during daily session times and for season tickets or tokens shall be as determined by the Council from time to time within the stated definitions but shall not exceed the following maximum scale:—

Daily Sessions.

Children—for every person over one year and under the age of sixteen, 30c.

Adult—For every person sixteen years of age and over 60c.

Pensioners—On production of a pension card, 30c.

Season Tickets.

Husband and Wife, \$60.00.

Family—Husband and Wife and all children under sixteen years, \$75.00.

For every person sixteen years of age and over, \$30.00.

For every person under sixteen years of age, \$12.00.

Scholars of State and other registered primary and secondary schools, in parties of not less than 12, accompanied by a teacher; for this purpose the Pool shall be available in school hours on such days and at such fees as the Council may from time to time determine.

Seasonal and family tickets shall have effect during school concession periods.

Control of Premises.

7. Every person using the pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool with regard to such use.

No person shall obstruct, interfere with or hinder the Pool Manager or the person for the time being in charge of the Pool in the performance of any duty in the Pool premises.

Offences.

(8) (a) No person shall enter or remain in the Pool premises whilst in an intoxicated condition.

(b) No person shall bring into the Pool premises any spirits or other intoxicating liquors.

(c) No person shall use soap in any part of the Pool premises other than in the Shower baths.

(d) No person shall in any part of the Pool premises use any indecent, obscene or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

(e) No person shall climb up to or on any partition, fence or roof or any other portion of the Pool premises.

(f) No person shall smoke in any part of the Pool premises where a notice is exhibited prohibiting smoking.

(g) No person shall in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the Pool wastefully use the water or leave any taps running.

(h) No person shall spit or expectorate in the Pool or on any platform or dressing rooms or commit any nuisance on or in any part of the Pool premises.

(i) No person shall whilst in the Pool use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the Pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.

(j) No person shall wilfully foul or pollute water in any shower bath or in the Pool, or wilfully soil, defile, damage, injure or destroy any dressing room, closet box or compartment or other part of the Pool premises, or any furniture or other article therein.

(k) No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently injure or improperly use or interfere with any taps, locks, valves or other fittings or appliances in or about the Pool premises or write upon or deface the walls partitions or any part of the Pool premises or discharge litter of any description on or about the Pool premises.

(l) No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his or her control to enter or remain in or upon the Pool premises.

(m) No male person shall enter any portion of the Pool premises set apart for females and no female person shall enter upon any partition of the Pool premises set apart for males.

(n) No person upon the Pool premises shall in any way interfere with any other person therein, or throw or push or attempt to throw or push any person into the Pool, or throw any stones or sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any other person using the Pool premises.

(o) No person shall, whilst suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease, or whilst in an unclean condition, enter or use the Pool premises or any part thereof.

Lost Property.

9. (a) Every person finding in the Pool premises any article which may have been left or lost therein shall immediately deliver the same to the Pool Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool.

(b) The Council will not under any circumstances incur any liability in respect of articles lost or stolen from any person whilst on the Pool premises.

Carnivals.

10. (a) The person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and see that there is no over-crowding and that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portions of the Pool premises.

(b) At all swimming carnivals held at the Pool premises, the competitors shall wear proper and approved bathing costumes.

(c) Every person, club, association or organisation to whom the Pool premises are granted for the purpose of holding a swimming carnival shall at least one week before the date of such carnival forward to the Council a copy of the programme of events to be competed for thereat; and any item on such programme that the Council do not approve of shall be struck out or so altered as directed.

(d) The person, club, association or organisation conducting any carnival held at the Pool premises shall pay to the Council such charges as shall be agreed upon by the Council and the person, club, association or organisation concerned and approved by the Council.

Games in Pool.

11. No person or group of persons shall play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of other users of the Pool or the Pool premises as such time or times as the Pool premises shall be in general public use; provided that this clause shall not apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports specially organised and conducted on the Pool premises by any Club or person at such time or times as shall be approved by the Council.

Coaching.

12. (a) No person shall for reward or profit teach, coach or train any other person in the Pool premises except with the consent in writing of the Council first had and obtained.

(b) The Council may in its absolute discretion give such consent absolutely or subject to such conditions as it deems fit and the Council may in its absolute discretion at any time withdraw such consent.

Enforcement of By-laws.

13. (a) Any person offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50.00.

(b) Every person who shall infringe any of the provisions of these by-laws may be summarily removed from the Pool premises and from every part thereof, by the Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool, or may be arrested by such Manager or other person and given into the custody of a police constable.

(c) The Manager or other person for the time being in charge of the Pool may refuse to admit to the Pool premises any person who shall have been convicted of wilfully disobeying or infringing any of the provisions of these by-laws, until such time as the Council may decide that such person shall be re-admitted.

By-Laws Relating to the Management and Control of the Wyalkatchem Recreation Centre (Reserve No. 15004).

L.G. WY-7-11.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 21st day of October, 1976, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-Laws:—

1. The By-Laws for the Management and Regulation of the Wyalkatchem Recreation Ground and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of March, 1931, are hereby repealed.

2. In these By-Laws—

“Council” means the Wyalkatchem Shire Council.

“Centre” means the Wyalkatchem Recreation Centre.

“Shire Clerk” shall mean the Shire Clerk of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.

“Inspector” shall mean and include any Inspector, Health and/or Building Surveyor or any other Officer or Servant of the Council appointed to assist in maintaining a due observation of the By-Laws of the Shire of Wyalkatchem.

3. The Council may set aside for the exclusive use of any sporting club, organisation, body or individual person any part of the Centre or buildings thereon.

4. No person shall destroy, damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, flower, plant, fence, building, seat, water pipe, hose, hose fitting, reticulation spray line, soil, grass, surface, or other property, including plant and machinery, owned by or vested in the Council.

5. No person shall climb or be upon any tree shrub, wall, fence or the roof of any building.

6. No person shall deposit or leave any litter or refuse on the ground or in any building established on the Centre, except in the receptacles provided.

7. No person shall light any fire within the Centre except in an area set aside for the purpose without the written permission of the Shire Clerk and/or an Inspector.

8. No person shall write upon or deface any building or other fixtures on the Centre.

9. No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of the Shire Clerk or any Inspector, Officer or Servant of the Council.

10. No person shall expectorate on the paths, seats, walls and floors of any buildings on the Centre.

11. No person shall camp, lodge or tarry over night on the Centre or in any of the buildings without the permission of the Council.

12. No person or organised club, having obtained permission, shall practice or play at any such game, except at such times and upon such portions of the Centre and/or Oval as shall be specified in such permission.

13. It shall be lawful for any Officer, Inspector or Servant of the Council or any member of the Police Force to remove from the Centre any child under the age of 6 years who is not under the control or in the care of a parent of such child or other person over the age of 18 years.

14. No person shall suffer or allow any dog to enter or remain on any part of the Centre unless on a leash held by the owner or the custodian of the dog.

15. No person shall commit a nuisance in any building or on any part of the Centre.

16. No person shall fly any kite or model aircraft on the Oval or any other part of the Centre without the permission of the Shire Clerk.

17. It shall be lawful for any Officer, Inspector and/or Servant of the Council, or member of the Police Force, to remove any person who is not entitled to use the Centre or the buildings thereon.

18. No person shall throw stones or cause missiles to be projected on any part of the Centre and it shall be unlawful for any ball games to be played in or near any buildings on the Centre, or on any part of the Centre which has not been set aside for the playing of such ball games.

19. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance or use any foul or indecent language, or commit any act of indecency.

20. No person shall drive or ride any motor vehicle on the Oval or Trotting Track except with the approval of an Officer, Inspector and/or Servant of the Council.

21. No person shall enter any pavilion, dressing or training room or use any facility which has been set aside by the Council for the exclusive use of any sporting club, organisation or body unless authorised to do so.

22. No alcoholic or spirituous liquors shall be consumed in any building or on any part of the Centre unless written permission has first been obtained from the Council, and it shall be unlawful for any sporting club, organisation or individual person to sell alcoholic or spirituous liquors on the Centre unless a special license or function permit has been obtained from the appropriate Authority.

23. No person shall drive a motor car, truck, utility or ride a motor cycle on any part of the Recreation Centre where vehicular traffic is permitted at a speed exceeding 20 (twenty) kilometres per hour or in a manner contrary to the Traffic Act and Regulations.

24. Any sporting club, organisation, body or individual person requiring the use of any buildings and facilities on the Centre, for social purposes at a time when the buildings and facilities are not normally used, must make written application to the Council for permission to use such building and facilities.

25. The user of any building and facilities at the Centre shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such building and facilities and shall be solely and entirely responsible for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture and crockery-ware and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Council at the current replacement and/or repair rates or prices.

26. Any Officer, Inspector, member of the Police Force and/or Servant of the Council shall, if required to do so, have free ingress to any building or facility at all times during the term of engagement to ensure that good order and decent behaviour is being maintained.

27. The Council reserves the right, at any time, to cancel any agreement made for the use of the Centre and the buildings thereon.

28. Any sporting club, organisation, body or individual person having used any building and facilities at the Centre shall leave the building and facilities in a clean and tidy condition and the furniture in its normal position.

29. It shall be the responsibility of the sporting club, organisation, body or individual person using the buildings and facilities to ensure that all lights are switched off after use, and the power to electrical appliances turned off.

30. It shall also be the responsibility of the sporting club, organisation, body or individual person to ensure that all doors to the buildings and facilities are locked immediately after use.

31. No person shall wilfully damage, interfere or tamper with any electrical switchboard, electrical wiring, electrical appliance, light or fittings, hot water system, water taps, gas cylinders, cisterns, pedestals, hand basins, mirrors, paper towel and toilet roll dispensers, shower roses or any other fixtures contained in the buildings at the Recreation Centre.

32. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-Laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$200 (two hundred dollars) for every such conviction.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Council” means the Council of the Town of East Fremantle.
 “member of the Police Force” means a member of the Police Force of Western Australia.

2. No person shall on any public reserve—

- (a) throw stones or other missiles;
- (b) cause a nuisance;
- (c) except in a receptacle provided for that purpose deposit any rubbish, utensils, glass or litter;
- (d) break any glass, metal, earthenware or utensil;
- (e) be in a state of intoxication or under the influence of drugs;
- (f) behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use any foul or indecent language or commit any act of indecency;
- (g) drive or ride or bring any vehicle or animal except on those parts of the reserve set aside as roads or driveways;
- (h) bet, gamble or call the odds or offer to bet or gamble;
- (i) climb over or upon any fence or grate;
- (j) unlock or unfasten any gate unless duly authorised to do so;
- (k) bring a dog or permit a dog to remain unless the dog is under proper control and does not cause a nuisance or annoyance to any person;
- (l) enter any dressing or training room or use any of the lockers unless authorised;
- (m) destroy damage injure or cause harm to any bird or animal;
- (n) damage or injure any plant, lawn, flower or tree;
- (o) cut or damage any soil or turf;
- (p) climb any tree.

3. No person without the consent of the Council shall on any public reserve—

- (a) sell or expose for sale any goods, ware, merchandise or things;
- (b) play or practise at golf or strike a golf ball unless on land (if any) set aside for that purpose;

- (c) take part in a procession or demonstration;
 - (d) organise or address a political meeting;
 - (e) use or instal a loud speaker or amplifier;
 - (f) carry a placard or notice;
 - (g) stamp stencil or affix or cause to be stamped stencilled or affixed constructed or erected any signboard, boarding, placard, handbill, notice, advertisement or any document whatsoever;
 - (h) light any fire;
 - (i) camp lodge or tarry overnight or frequent for the purpose of camping lodging and tarrying overnight.
4. No person shall ride, drive, exercise, train or race any horse or other animal on any public reserve in such manner as to create or become a nuisance.
5. Any person found in a state of intoxication or under the influence of drugs in any public reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any foul or indecent language, or committing any act of indecency therein, may be forthwith removed from such public reserve by the caretaker or by any officer of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force.
6. Any person found betting, gambling, or calling the odds, or offering to bet or gamble within any public reserve, may be forthwith removed from such public reserve by the caretaker, or by an officer of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 12th day of August, 1976, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

The by-laws of the Shire of Beverley published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st August, 1960 and subsequent amendments published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th March, 1966, 28th November, 1968, and 25th January, 1974 are further amended by deleting the charges shown in clause 1 (b) of Schedule A and inserting the following:—

 Grave for any Child Under seven years—\$10.00.
 Grave for any Stillborn Child—\$5.00.

Boulder General Cemetery—Reserve 9037.

By-laws.

L.G. 910/53.

BY virtue of all powers vested in the Council of the Shire of Boulder as Trustees of the Boulder General Cemetery, the same Trustees hereby record having resolved on the 25th day of October, 1976 to adopt and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. These By-laws shall apply to the land described as Reserve 9037 to be known as the Boulder General Cemetery and hereinafter referred to as the "Cemetery".

2. "The Secretary" as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the Secretary of the Cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and have been the direction of the Trustees.

3. The Trustees may engage other Officers and servants where their employment is necessary or expedient for carrying out the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, or these By-laws.

4. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees and any person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

5. A Plan of the Cemetery showing the sections, situation and number of every grave, and a register of all certificates of Rights of Burial shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.

6. Unless otherwise ordered the entrance to the Cemetery shall remain open daily between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m.

7. The hours of burial shall be—

9.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. (Monday to Friday).

9.30 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. (Saturday).

No burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees. No burial shall take place on Christmas Day or Good Friday.

8. Any person desiring to inter a dead body on Sunday or Public Holidays shall in addition to paying an extra fee, produce a Certificate in writing by a Medical Officer of Health or by a Police Officer, Resident or Stipendiary Magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary and advisable that the burial take place on that day.

9. (a) Any person who wishes to inter a dead body or cremated ashes in the Cemetery shall make an application as contained in Schedule 'B' and shall pay to the Trustees in advance the appropriate fees set forth in Schedule 'A'.

(b) Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial" in the form contained in the Schedule 'C'.

(c) The application referred to in paragraph (a) of this By-law shall be lodged at the Office of the Trustees in sufficient time to allow at least eight working hours notice being given to the Secretary at the office prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be payable in accordance with Schedule 'A'.

10. No catacomb, vaults or brick graves shall be allowed.

11. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug and graves to be re-opened as and when lawfully required.

12. Every grave shall be at least 2.1 metres deep at the first interment and no interment shall be permitted in any grave with a depth of less than 1 metre from top of the coffin to the natural surface of the surrounding ground.

13. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of \$6.00 and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such consent being given and the payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit" to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following and unless in the possession of such Permit no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

14. The undertaker responsible for a burial shall—

(a) cause the cortege, to arrive at the Cemetery gates punctually at the time fixed for burial. Failure to comply incurs a penalty of \$1.00.

(b) cause the cortege to proceed from the gates to the graveside not later than fifteen minutes after the time fixed for the burial. Failure to comply incurs a penalty of \$1.00.

(c) cause the hearse and mourning coaches to enter the Cemetery through the principal entrance and no other entrance.

15. (i) A person shall not—

(a) cause a vehicle other than a hearse or a mourning coach to enter the Cemetery or stand outside the entrance gates in a position obstructing the entrance;

(b) drive a mechanically propelled vehicle within the Cemetery at a speed in excess of fifteen kilometres per hour;

(c) drive a mechanically propelled vehicle within the Cemetery along any road other than a road approved for the time being for such traffic by the Secretary;

(d) ride any bicycle within the Cemetery.

(ii) A person failing to comply with the provisions of this By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

16. (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this Section a person shall not bring a dead person into the Cemetery unless he or his representative has first handed to the Secretary a Certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered or a Coroner's order for burial in respect of the body.

(ii) Where an Undertaker or his representative for a valid reason is unable to produce a Certificate or Coroner's order as required by paragraph (i) of this By-law and he has given to the Secretary a written guarantee to produce the Certificate or order within three days he may bring the dead body into the Cemetery.

(iii) A burial shall not be permitted in the Cemetery unless the provisions of one of the foregoing paragraphs of this By-law have been complied with.

(iv) Where an Undertaker or his representative has given a written guarantee as required in paragraph (ii) of this By-law and has failed to produce the Certificate or order within three days, the Undertaker's license may be suspended until the Certificate or order is produced.

The Certificate may be retained but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering same.

17. A person who inter a body in the Cemetery shall affix to the lid of the coffin an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed thereon in legible characters. A coffin not complying with this By-law shall not be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

18. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Secretary.

19. A person wishing to secure a Grant of Right of Burial in the Cemetery shall make application to the Trustees and shall pay the appropriate fees set forth in Schedule 'A'.

20. A person making application for interment of a body in a private grave to which the deceased had no claim during life shall submit to the Trustees the written and verified consent of the grantee of the grave.

21. Where a grant of Right of Burial has been lost, or for any other reason cannot be produced, a person who wishes to make an interment in the grave shall lodge together with the application referred to in By-law No. 9 a sworn declaration to that effect and shall pay the fee prescribed in Schedule 'A' for a copy of the grant.

22. A person who applies for the exhumation of a body shall produce to the Trustees the necessary warrant or order by law required, authorising the Trustees to permit the exhumation.

23. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the Trustees find it necessary to remove any monument etc. from the grave the person requesting the re-opening shall pay to the Trustees the appropriate charges set forth in Schedule 'A'.

24. A person shall not place or erect or alter or add to a monument in any part of the Cemetery unless he has first submitted plans to the Trustees and secured their approval and consent and otherwise complied with Section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897-1972.

25. A person erecting a monument shall leave the locality of the work in a clean and tidy state.

26. A person carrying out work in the Cemetery shall so far as possible, prepare the material required in the erection and completion of the work before it is taken to the Cemetery.

27. A person shall not take materials into the Cemetery except through such entrances as the Secretary directs and shall not convey any materials on a vehicle having wheels of less than 100 mm in width.

28. Any person taking part in erecting any monument or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand or other material removed in attending to a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b) No sand, soil, loam or other materials shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for use in the erection of any monument or other work except with the permission of the Secretary.
- (c) The erection of any monument or other work and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.

29. A monumental mason or other person shall not carry out any work within the Cemetery between noon on Saturday and the opening of the gates on Monday morning without the written permission of the Trustees.

30. A monumental mason or other person working in the Cemetery who at noon on a Saturday is leaving any piece of work uncompleted, shall leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the Secretary.

31. A monumental mason or other tradesman shall not commence any work within the Cemetery unless he has deposited with the Secretary the sum of \$5.00 which shall be held in trust and shall be forfeited if he fails to comply with the provisions of any one of the preceding By-laws 25 and 27.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Secretary and shall obey such lawful directions as that officer may find it necessary to give. Any workmen, permitting any breach of the regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary shall be removed from the Cemetery.

33. A child under the age of ten years shall not enter the Cemetery unless he is in the care of some adult person.

34. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

35. A person shall not bring a dog into the Cemetery or permit or suffer a dog under his control to be brought into the Cemetery. Any dog found in the Cemetery may be seized and destroyed.

36. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers) or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Trustees. A person removing withered flowers from graves shall place these in the receptacles provided for this purpose by the Trustees.

37. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

38. No person shall remove or carry away or attempt to carry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, flower, earth or other material without the written authority of the Trustees.

39. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum or committing any nuisance or trespass, behaving in an offensive or unruly manner, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, grave or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

40. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any system of advertising whatsoever without the written consent of the Trustees. Any person infringing this By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

41. A person shall not plant any shrubs, grass or flowers on any grave except with the consent of the Secretary.

42. A person may with the permission of the grantee of the right of burial of a plot, decorate the grave with natural flowers set in orthodox vases.

43. The Trustees may grant to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth without fee, a permit to erect monuments on the graves of deceased members of the Armed Forces.

44. The Trustees may grant plots in the Cemetery free of charge if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees—

- (a) that the deceased was a returned Serviceman or Servicewoman who died as a result of injuries received at war; and
- (b) that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances.

45. Any person infringing the provisions of any of these By-laws and Regulations or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.00 and in the case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding \$2.00 for every day during which the breach continues. A person committing a breach of any By-law shall be forthwith removed from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Secretary or other officer of the Trustees or by a member of the Police Force and if he resists removal or returns to the Cemetery within twenty four hours without the consent of the Secretary he shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly.

46. All previous By-laws relating to the Boulder Cemetery are hereby repealed.
