Local Government Act, 1960-1977.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. & S. Corres. 2528/77 (R5499).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1977, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for

a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the City of Gosnells has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street, within its municipal district be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

RURAL AND INDUSTRIES BANK ACT, 1944-1974.

Rural and Industries Bank of Western Australia,

THE Commissioners of the Rural and Industries Bank of Western Australia—

- (a) Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by section thirty-six of the Rural and Industries Bank Act, 1944-1958 and section 38 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975, have revoked the by-laws of the Rural and Industries Bank made pursuant to section thirty-six of the Rural and Industries Bank Act, 1944-1958 for Regulating the Concessional Payment of a Lump Sum in place of Long Service Leave adopted pursuant to a resolution passed at a meeting of the Commissioners of the Rural and Industries Bank of Western Australia on the 30th day of August, 1960 and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th November, 1960; and
- (b) acting pursuant to the powers conferred by section thirty-six of the Rural and Industries Bank Act, 1944-1974 and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975 have, with the approval of the Treasurer, made the by-laws set forth in the Schedule below,

so that the revocation of the by-laws referred to in paragraph (a) of this notice and the by-laws referred to in paragraph (b) of this notice take effect on and from the date on which the Rural and Industries Bank Act Amendment Act, 1974 comes into operation.

BY-LAWS.

- Short title. 1. These by-laws may be cited as the Rural and Industries Bank Officers Long Service Leave By-laws, 1977.
- Interpretation. 2. In these by-laws unless the contrary intention appears—
“by-law” means one of these by-laws;
“continuous service” in relation to an officer includes any period during which the officer has been continuously in the employ of the Commissioners but does not include—
(a) any period exceeding two weeks in each year during which the officer is on leave without pay;
(b) any period during which the officer is taking his long service leave entitlement or any portion thereof;
“qualifying period” means the relevant period of continuous service prescribed in by-law 4 to be served in respect of an entitlement to long service leave;
“the Act” means the Rural and Industries Bank Act, 1944.
- Preservation of continuous service. 3. In respect of a person who was an officer immediately before the first day on which these by-laws take effect and continues to be an officer thereafter, his service before that day shall be taken into account for the purpose of determining his entitlements under these by-laws, but only to the extent that he had not, in respect of such service, received long service leave or payment in lieu thereof by way of a concession under subsection (5) of section 36 of the Act as in force immediately before that day.
- Long service leave entitlement. 4. Subject to these by-laws, an officer is entitled to long service leave of three months on full pay in each case where—
(a) he has completed a first qualifying period of ten years;
(b) he has completed a second qualifying period of ten years subsequent to the first qualifying period referred to in paragraph (a) of this by-law; and

SCHEDULE—*continued*

- (c) he has completed a qualifying period of seven years subsequent to the second qualifying period referred to in paragraph (b) of this by-law and his employment with the Commissioners has been continuous after the expiration of the second qualifying period.
- Maximum accumulation of long service leave.
Double long service leave on half pay.
5. Subject to these by-laws, the Commissioners may permit the accumulation of periods of long service leave which may be taken on full pay but so that the accumulation shall not exceed a total of twelve months.
6. Upon application by an officer in respect of his long service leave entitlement, the Commissioners may approve the taking by an officer—
- (a) of double the period of long service leave entitlement of the officer on half pay instead of his long service leave on full pay; or
- (b) of any portion of long service leave entitlement on full pay or double the portion on half pay.
- Lump sum payment.
7. (1) Subject to these by-laws a lump sum payment for the money equivalent of any—
- (a) long service leave entitlement for continuous service and for any *pro rata* long service leave based on continuous service of a lesser period than the relevant qualifying period as prescribed in the appropriate case under by-law 4 shall be paid—
- (i) as a retiring allowance to an officer who retires after attaining the age of sixty years or who retires on the grounds of ill health, if that officer has completed not less than twelve months' service before the date of his retirement; or
- (ii) where an officer dies, to the widow of the officer or to such other person as the Commissioners think fit, if that officer shall have completed not less than twelve months' service before the date of his death; and
- (b) long service leave entitlement based on continuous service as prescribed under by-law 4 shall be paid in respect of any relevant qualifying period that had occurred prior to the date of his dismissal to an officer who is dismissed.
- (2) Subject to these by-laws, the Commissioners may pay a lump sum payment for the money equivalent of any long service leave entitlement for continuous service and for any *pro rata* long service leave based on continuous service of a lesser period than the relevant qualifying period as prescribed in the appropriate case under by-law 4 to an officer who ceases to be employed by the Commissioners in such circumstances as the Commissioners are of opinion that a payment shall be made, if that officer shall have completed not less than three years' service before the date on which he ceases to be employed by the Commissioners.
- (3) The amount of the lump sum due under this by-law shall be calculated—
- (a) having regard to the salary of the officer at the time of the occurrence of the relevant event referred to in sub-by-law (1) or (2) of this by-law; and
- (b) in terms of each completed month of continuous service as at the date of the occurrence of the relevant event referred to in sub-by-law (1) or (2) of this by-law.
- Times for long service leave.
8. The Commissioners may direct that long service leave shall be taken at such time or times as they consider convenient and may from time to time vary any direction so given.
- No extra days for public holidays.
9. A public holiday that occurs during a period in which an officer is on long service leave shall be regarded as part of that leave and no extra leave shall be taken by an officer in respect of the public holiday.

ADOPTION OF CHILDREN ACT, 1896-1976

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Adoption of Children Act, 1896-1976 the Judges of the Family Court of Western Australia hereby make the following rules to take effect on and from the first day of December, 1977.

- Principal rules. 1. In these rules the Adoption of Children Rules, 1970, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th April, 1970 and amended by a notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st June, 1972 and reprinted as so amended pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd January, 1973 are referred to as the principal rules.
- Rule 3 substituted. 2. Rule 3 of the principal rules is revoked and the following rule substituted—
3. Where no provision is made by law or these rules in relation to any matter or thing under the Act, the provisions of the rules and regulations under the Family Court Act, 1975 that are most nearly applicable in relation to the matter or thing in question apply and where there is no such provision the rules and regulations under the Family Law Act, 1975 of the Parliament of the Commonwealth that are most nearly applicable in relation to the matter or thing in question shall apply.
- Rule 5 amended. 3. Rule 5 of the principal rules is amended—
- (a) by inserting after the interpretation "consent" the following definition—
"Court" means the Family Court of Western Australia created by the Family Court Act, 1975; ;
- (b) by deleting the interpretation "file" and substituting the following interpretation—
"file" means file in the Central Registry of the Family Court of Western Australia and inflexions of the word "file" have a corresponding meaning; ; and
- (c) by deleting the interpretation "Registrar" and substituting the following interpretation—
"Registrar" means the Registrar of the Family Court of Western Australia and includes a Deputy Registrar; .
- Rule 7 amended. 4. Rule 7 of the principal rules is amended—
- (a) by adding after the rule designation "7." the subrule designation "(1)"; and
- (b) by adding the following subrule—
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in subrule (1) of this rule, an instrument of consent or any revocation thereof may not be attested by—
- (a) the solicitor for the applicant or applicants for adoption or by a partner, clerk or agent of the solicitor;
- (b) any other solicitor who has prepared either the instrument of consent or any revocation thereof or by the partner, clerk or agent of such solicitor;
- (c) where the application, instrument of consent or revocation of a consent has been prepared by or on behalf of the Community Welfare Department, any officer of that Department. .

- Rule 8 amended. 5. Rule 8 of the principal rules is amended by deleting the passage “, as soon as practicable thereafter, shall” in lines three and four and substituting the passage “shall, within seven days after the date of the execution of the consent,”.
- Rule 13A substituted. 6. Rule 13A of the principal rules is revoked and the following rule substituted—
- 13A. (1) Where, pursuant to paragraph (8c) of subsection (1) of section 5, the Director furnishes to the Judge the opinion of the Director that an applicant is not a proper person to be an adopting parent the Director shall thereupon serve a notice in writing to that effect on the applicant.
- (2) An applicant—
- (a) who has been served with a notice referred to in subrule (1) of this rule; and
- (b) who wishes to proceed with his application, shall, within 28 days of the service on him of the notice or such further time as a Judge may allow, file an affidavit sworn by himself and affidavits sworn by other persons relating to particulars of any of the matters that are referred to in paragraphs (a) to (1) of subsection (2) of section 5 that are within his or their knowledge, as the case may be.
- (3) A person filing an affidavit or affidavits in accordance with the last preceding subrule shall forthwith serve a sealed copy of any such affidavit upon the Director.
- (4) Where an affidavit or affidavits are filed by a person in accordance with the provisions of this rule, the Registrar shall refer the matter to a Judge who may give such directions as he sees fit as to the further hearing of the application.
- Rule 10 amended. 7. Rule 10 of the principal rules is amended—
- (a) by adding after the rule designation “10.” the subrule designation “(1)”; and
- (b) by adding the following subrules—
- (2) A person in relation to whose consent an application for an order pursuant to section 4G has been made who desires to oppose the making of the order shall, within 28 days of the service of the application and affidavit or affidavits on him or such further time as a Judge may allow, —file an affidavit or affidavits sworn by himself or by other persons relating to any matter set out in the application or affidavit or affidavits served on him.
- (3) A person filing an affidavit or affidavits in accordance with the last preceding subrule shall forthwith serve a sealed copy of any such affidavit upon the applicant.
- (4) Where an affidavit or affidavits are filed by a person in relation to whose consent an application for an order pursuant to section 4G has been made, the Registrar shall refer the matter to a Judge who may give such directions as he sees fit as to the further hearing of the application for an order under section 4G.
- Rules 26 to 30 added. 8. The principal rules are amended by adding after rule 25 the following rules—
- Ordinary service how effected. 26. (1) Service of any document may be effected—
- (a) by personal service upon the person intended to be served with a sealed copy of such document;
- (b) where a person has given an address for service in accordance with rule 28, by leaving a sealed copy of the document at the address for service given by the person to be served;
- (c) where a person has given an address for service in accordance with rule 28, by sending a sealed copy of the document by prepaid post addressed to the person to be served at his address for service; or
- (d) in such other manner as the Court may direct.
- (2) Where service of a document is effected in accordance with paragraph (c) of subrule (1) of this rule, service of the document shall, unless the contrary is proved, be deemed to have been effected four days after the date of posting.
- Dispensation with service. 27. (1) A Court may, if it thinks necessary or expedient to do so, order that service of any document be dispensed with.
- (2) In exercising its powers under subrule (1) of this rule, the Court shall have regard to—
- (a) whether the applicant has taken every reasonable step to discover the whereabouts of the respondent and serve him with the process that is the subject of the application;
- (b) the means of the applicant, the likely cost to the applicant and the nature of the process sought to be served;
- (c) whether by some other method the existence of the process is likely to come to the knowledge of the respondent; and

(d) such other matters as it considers relevant.

(3) An order under subrule (1) of this rule may be made subject to such conditions (if any) as the Court thinks fit.

(4) If conditions are imposed in accordance with subrule (3) of this rule, the Court shall specify in its order dispensing with service the times within which the conditions shall be complied with, and no further proceedings shall be taken in relation to that process without the leave of the Court until the applicant has furnished satisfactory evidence, by affidavit or otherwise, that the conditions have been complied with.

Address for service.

28. (1) A person is not entitled to file a document for the purposes of proceedings under the Act unless in that document he gives, or by a document previously filed by him he has given an address for service within the State of Western Australia.

(2) A person served with any document in proceedings under the Act may give an address for service by filing a notice of address for service and serving a copy of the notice on each other party to the proceedings.

(3) A person who has given an address for service may change that address for service by filing a notification of such change and serving a copy of the notice on each other party to the proceedings.

Service by post.

29. Any document sent from any office of the Court may be sent by prepaid post in which event service of the document shall, unless the contrary is proved, be deemed to have been effected upon the person to whom the document was addressed four days after the date of posting.

Affidavits of service.

30. An affidavit of service of any document must state by whom the document was served, the day of the week and date on which it was served, where it was served and if the document has been served in accordance with paragraph (a) of subrule (1) of rule 26, the means by which the person served was identified.
