Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Finance Brokers Supervisory Board (Elections) Regulations, 1978.
2. In these regulations—
"member" means elective member of the Board, and "deputy member" has a corresponding meaning;
"the Act" means the Finance Brokers Control Act, 1975; and

“the Board” means the Finance Brokers Supervisory Board constituted pursuant to the Act.

Elections.

3. (1) Subject to subregulation (2) of this regulation, an election of persons to hold office as elective members, or elective deputy members, of the Board shall be held as and whenever necessary.

(2) Where more than one member or deputy member is required to be elected—

(a) one election may be held at that time for the election of persons to the respective offices; and

(b) each person elected at such an election shall be eligible for appointment to the office for which he has been elected upon that office becoming vacant.

(3) Prior to or upon a member or deputy member ceasing to hold office, the chairman of the Board shall direct the Returning Officer to issue a notice in the form of Form 1 in the Appendix to these regulations, to be published in the *Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating generally in the State, appointing a date and time for lodging nominations and a date and time for the closing of the poll to be taken at the election.

(4) The nomination day appointed by any notice published pursuant to subregulation (3) of this regulation shall not be less than 30 days after the date upon which the notice is published in the *Gazette*, and the day appointed for the holding of the election and the closing of the poll at such election shall not be less than fourteen nor more than thirty days after the nomination day.

Returning Officer.

4. The Chief Electoral Officer, or, if he is prevented from acting, his substitute appointed under the Electoral Act, 1907, shall be Returning Officer at any election held in accordance with these regulations.

Nominations.

5. (1) Nominations of candidates shall be lodged with the Returning Officer in the form of Form 2 in the Appendix to these regulations, not later than the day and the time appointed for the receipt of nominations by the notice published pursuant to regulation 3 of these regulations.

(2) Every nomination shall—

(a) name the candidate for election, and the office for which he is nominated;

(b) be signed by not less than two persons eligible to vote.

(3) If no nominations are received for all or any of the offices in respect of which there is a vacancy, the Returning Officer may extend the time for the receipt of nominations and for the holding of an election in respect of such vacancy or vacancies and, where that time is so extended, the period of time between the date for the receipt of nominations and the date of the election shall be as provided in subregulation (4) of regulation 3 of these regulations.

(4) Where a person is nominated as a candidate for election both as a member and as a deputy member at elections to be held on the same day, both nominations are invalid and shall be rejected by the Returning Officer.

The Voters List.

6. (1) The Registrar of the Board shall prepare and transmit to the Returning Officer, so as to reach him not later than noon on the day appointed for the receipt of nominations, a list of such of the persons licensed under the Act as were, fourteen days prior to that day, eligible to exercise a vote.

(2) The list prepared and transmitted pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall—

(a) set out the full names and registered address of each voter included therein, and where that voter is the representative for the purposes of these regulations of a firm or body corporate licensed under the Act, that firm or body corporate; and

(b) be certified as being true and correct by the Registrar of the Board.

(3) Any natural person licensed pursuant to section 27 of the Act is eligible to exercise a vote under these regulations, and shall be included on the list of voters.

(4) Where a firm licensed pursuant to section 28 or a body corporate licensed pursuant to section 29 of the Act is desirous of exercising a vote under these regulations that firm or body corporate shall from time to time—

(a) in the case of a firm, by writing under the hand of the natural persons and the seal of the bodies corporate together comprising a majority of the persons constituting that firm; and

(b) in the case of a body corporate, by writing under the seal of that body corporate,

appoint a representative, being a natural person licensed under the Act who is a person concerned in the management of the business of that firm or body corporate, and on the Registrar of the Board being notified accordingly and satisfied that the appointment was valid and *bona fide* the Registrar shall include the name of that representative on the list of voters as the representative for the time being of the firm or body corporate by which he is appointed and that person shall thereupon be eligible to exercise a vote under these regulations in that capacity.

(5) The exercise of a right to vote under these regulations is not compulsory.

Proceedings after Nomination.

7. (1) Where one candidate only is nominated in relation to any vacancy he shall be declared elected, but if more than one candidate is nominated for the same vacancy, the Returning Officer shall proceed to take a poll.

(2) Where more than one candidate is nominated for the same vacancy, the Returning Officer shall as soon as practicable after the date fixed for receipt of nominations, send to each person whose name appears on the list furnished to the Returning Officer in accordance with regulation 6 of these Regulations—

- (a) one ballot paper, in the form of Form 3 in the Appendix to these regulations, in respect of each election for a member and one ballot paper in respect of each election for a deputy member, initialled or signed by the Returning Officer or by a person authorised in that behalf by the Returning Officer;
- (b) one counterfoil in the form of Form 4 in the Appendix to these regulations;
- (c) one ballot paper envelope in the form approved by the Returning Officer; and
- (d) one envelope addressed to the Returning Officer.

(3) Each ballot paper, counterfoil, ballot paper envelope and addressed envelope shall be enclosed by the Returning Officer in a covering envelope, which shall be fastened and addressed and forwarded by post or otherwise to the person for whom it is intended.

8. A person who is eligible to vote as a natural person licensed under the Act may also exercise the right to vote as a duly appointed representative of a firm or body corporate where his name appears on the voters list in that capacity.

9. The person to whom the ballot paper and counterfoil is addressed, if desirous of voting, shall record his vote on the ballot paper in the manner therein set forth, shall complete and sign the counterfoil, shall obtain the signature of a witness to his own signature thereon, and shall then enclose the ballot paper alone in the ballot paper envelope and seal the envelope, and return the ballot paper envelope with the ballot paper contained therein and the counterfoil to the Returning Officer in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, so as to be received by him not later than the day and time appointed by the notice of election for the closing of the poll at such election.

10. (1) The Returning Officer shall place and keep in a locked and sealed ballot box, until the scrutiny, all envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers received by him up to the close of the poll.

(2) An envelope containing a ballot paper received after the close of the poll shall not be admitted to the scrutiny.

11. (1) As soon as practicable after the close of the poll the Returning Officer, in the presence of any scrutineer, shall—

- (a) produce and open the locked and sealed ballot box wherein the envelopes containing ballot papers and counterfoils have been placed and kept, and open each outer envelope;
- (b) compare each enclosed counterfoil with the list referred to in regulation 6 of these regulations, and if satisfied that the person named in the counterfoil is entitled to the vote and that the counterfoil has been completed, signed and witnessed as required by these regulations, strike out the name of that person on the list in the capacity in respect of which the vote was exercised;
- (c) without opening the envelope marked "ballot paper", deposit it in a locked and sealed ballot box and set aside the counterfoil for safe keeping; and
- (d) produce and open the locked and sealed ballot box referred to in paragraph (c) of this subregulation, and proceed with the count of the votes.

(2) Where the right of a person to vote is not established or the counterfoil is not signed by the voter and by the witness, the Returning Officer shall replace the counterfoil and the envelope marked "ballot paper" in the outer envelope that he has opened, endorse on that envelope the word, "rejected", and set it aside for safe keeping.

12. A ballot paper shall be informal—

- (a) if it does not bear the initials or signature of the Returning Officer or a person authorised in that behalf by the Returning Officer;
- (b) if the voter has not marked it in accordance with the directions set out therein; or
- (c) if no mark is indicated on it.

13. Each candidate may appoint one scrutineer to represent him at the scrutiny and all proceedings at the scrutiny shall be open to the inspection of the scrutineers.

14. (1) In respect of each office for which there is a poll the candidate who has received the largest number of votes shall be declared by the Returning Officer duly elected.

(2) Where two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated, the matter shall be determined by lot.

15. The provisions of the Electoral Act, 1907, and the regulations in force thereunder in relation to parliamentary elections shall apply to any election held pursuant to these regulations to the extent to which those provisions are applicable and are not inconsistent with these regulations.

16. (1) Within seven days after the conclusion of the scrutiny the Returning Officer shall by writing inform the chairman of the Board of the names of the candidates duly elected and shall notify the result of the poll in the Gazette.

(2) The publication of a notice referred to in subregulation (1) of this regulation in the Gazette is evidence that the persons named therein were duly elected as members and deputy members of the Board.

17. All costs, charges, and expenses incurred by the Returning Officer, or by officers employed by him, in connection with the conduct of any election under these regulations or in connection with any matters incidental thereto, as certified in writing by the Returning Officer under his hand and communicated by him to the Board, shall be borne or paid by the Board or reimbursed to the Returning Officer by the Board, but the Board may at its own expense have the accounts of the Returning Officer audited by the Auditor General whose decision thereon shall be final as between the parties concerned.





By-Law No. 57. Relating to Standing Orders.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 27th day of September, 1977, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law:—

Repeal.

From the date of coming into operation of this by-law, by-law No. 57, regulating the proceedings of the Council of the Municipality of Northam heretofore made by the Municipality of Northam and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 53) of the 15th June, 1951, and amendments thereto, is repealed.

Standing Orders.

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to the following regulations which shall be called the Standing Orders.

Chairman.

2. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word "Mayor" shall include the "Deputy Mayor" or any Councillor chosen to preside by the Council at any meeting of the Council.

3. The Mayor, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and, in his absence or if, after being present, he retires, the Deputy Mayor, or in his absence a Councillor chosen by the Councillors present, shall preside.

Quorum.

4. At any meeting of the Council a quorum shall consist of not less than six Councillors in addition to the Mayor. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Adjournment in Absence of Quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within a half of an hour after the time appointed for such meeting the majority of Councillors present, or any one Councillor, if only one be present, or the Town Clerk, if no Councillor be present, may adjourn such meeting to any date not later than seven (7) days from the date of such adjournment.

Count Out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a Councillor shall call the attention of the Mayor to the fact that a quorum is not present, the Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Mayor shall adjourn it to some future date.

Record of Councillors Present.

7. At all meetings at which there are not present six Councillors in addition to the Mayor or Chairman at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the Councillors then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Open Doors.

8. The business of ordinary meetings of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Council shall, by resolution otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved without notice.

Reporters.

9. At all ordinary meetings accredited newspaper reporters shall be permitted to attend in such part of the Council Chamber as may be appropriated for their accommodation, but they shall withdraw upon a vote of the Council so requiring during any portion of the whole of the meeting.

Disturbance by Visitors.

10. The admission of citizens, reporters and visitors to the Council Chamber shall be under and subject to the regulations that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation or interruption to the proceedings of the Council shall take place, and in the event of any breach of this regulation, the Mayor may at his discretion, and without a vote of the Council, require the person or persons so offending to withdraw, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the Council Chamber.

Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Council, who interrupts the orderly conduct of the business of the Council, who does not immediately upon being called upon by the Mayor so to do, withdraw from the Council Chamber, may by order of the Mayor be removed from the Council Chamber forthwith.

Business at Council Meetings.

Order of Business.

12. The order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect.

- (i) Confirmation of minutes.
- (ii) Announcements by the Mayor without discussion.
- (iii) Questions of which due notice has been given without discussion.
- (iv) Correspondence.
- (v) Petitions and memorials.
- (vi) Notice of intention to move the suspension of Standing Orders at the close of the meeting.
- (vii) Reports of Committees.
- (viii) Orders of the day, including considering and ordering upon any business left over from the previous meeting and any business the Mayor may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (ix) Motions of which previous notices have been given.
- (x) Notices of motions for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Order at Special Meetings.

13. The order of business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Minutes.

14. The reading of the minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, as provided by section 188 of the Local Government Act, may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of them at least three days before the holding of the next ordinary meeting, and such minutes not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of Council in order that they be confirmed; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the Mayor as required by section 188 (2) of the Local Government Act.

Questions.

15. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council shall give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk at least four hours before the hour fixed for the meeting.

16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Correspondence.

17. No discussion shall be permitted on any motion that any correspondence be received or not received or that any correspondence or any part thereof be referred to any special committee of the Council.

Notices of Motion.

18. (1) Any Councillor may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the Town Clerk, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than seven clear days before such last-mentioned meeting.

(2) Every notice of motion shall relate to some question affecting the constitution, administration, or condition of the Municipality.

(3) The Mayor shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with the last preceding subclause.

Motion to Lapse.

19. Every such motion shall lapse, unless the Councillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

Deputations.

Reception of Deputations.

20. Deputations wishing to be received by the Council shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the Town Clerk shall bring the memorial before the Committee concerned which shall be authorised, if it sees fit, to receive the deputation and to report to the Council. If the Committee is of the opinion that the memorial is one which should be brought before the Council the Committee shall so report; and, if the Council shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

Number of Deputation.

21. A deputation shall not exceed 10 in number, and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee, and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

Conduct of Debate.

Councillors to Address the Chair—Point of Order.

22. (1) Any Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor and shall not be interrupted unless upon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon, and the question of order has been disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the chair may proceed.

(2) Rising to express a difference of opinion with or to contradict a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order.

(3) The following action shall be deemed breaches of order, namely:—

(a) Discussion of a question not before the Council.

(b) The use of offensive or insulting language.

(c) The violation of any by-law or standing order of the Council.

Nature of Motion to be Stated.

23. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment, shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon, and, if so required by the Mayor, shall put the same in writing.

Motions to be Seconded—Enforcement of Standing Orders.

24. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of Titles.

25. At meetings of the Council, speakers in referring to others present thereat, shall designate them by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor as the case may be.

Priority of Speakers.

26. If two or more Councillors rise at the same time the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Mayor to Speak.

27. Whenever the Mayor rises during a debate any Councillor then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Council is to be silent so that the Mayor may be heard without interruption.

Councillor Not to Speak Twice.

Personal Explanation.

28. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover or as the mover, of an amendment last carried. And no Councillor shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply. No Councillor shall speak otherwise than upon the question before the Council except to make a personal explanation. Any Councillor making a personal explanation must confine himself to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood, and to explanation itself, and he must not advert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose, nor to endeavour to strengthen his former argument by introducing new argument or matter or by replying to other Councillors.

Calling to Order for Speaking Twice.

29. The Mayor shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any Councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover or Seconder to be Held to Have Spoken.

30. A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

No Speaking After Notice Put.

31. No Councillor may speak to any question after the same has been put from the Chair.

Time Limit.

32. No Councillor shall speak or address the Council upon any motion or amendment before the Council, or in reply, for a longer period than 10 minutes without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate.

Speaking in Reply.

33. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of Complicated Resolutions.

34. The Mayor, at his discretion, may, or the Council may by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of several resolutions.

Withdrawal of Motion.

35. A motion or amendment, may be withdrawn by the mover with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Production of Documents.

36. Any Councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

Reflection Upon Vote of Council.

37. No Councillor shall reflect upon any vote of the Council except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

All Councillors to Vote—Casting Vote.

38. At all meetings of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides, all the Councillors present shall vote, and if any Councillor fails to vote the Mayor shall call upon him to vote or to leave the Council Chamber. The Mayor shall not vote unless there is an equal division of votes, in which case he has and may exercise a casting vote. (See section 178 (8) of the Local Government Act).

Digression from Subject—Personal Reflections.

39. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion nor impute improper motives to any other Councillor, and all personal reflections upon any Councillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

Record of Words Used by a Councillor.

40. Any Councillor may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Councillor immediately upon the same being used.

Mayor's Ruling.

41. The Mayor when called upon to decide a point of order or practice shall give his decision and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particular case, unless a majority of the members of the Council then present shall, upon motion made forthwith, without discussion by the mover or seconder or other person, dissent therefrom.

Withdrawal of Offensive Expression.

42. Any Councillor who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the Mayor reflects offensively on any member of the Council, shall, when required by the Mayor, unreservedly withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the Chair, and if he decline, or neglect to do so, the Mayor may refuse to hear such Councillor further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Council, or may direct the offending Councillor to withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Disturbance—Conversing Aloud.

43. No Councillor shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud whilst any other Councillor is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

Continued Irrelevance.

44. The Mayor may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Councillor, and may direct such Councillor, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such Councillor shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

Crossing Council Chamber.

45. When the Mayor is putting any question, no Councillor shall walk out of or across the Chamber, nor shall any Councillor, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the chair.

Mayor May Call to Order.

46. The Mayor shall preserve order, and may, on his own motion call any Councillor to order whenever, in his opinion, there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

47. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the standing orders by any other Councillor.

Decision of Mayor on Point of Order—Councillor to Apologise When Called Upon.

48. Whenever it shall have been decided by the Mayor that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Council, is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as the case may require.

Councillor to Withdraw from Council Chamber.

49. Any Councillor who shall persist in any line of conduct which the Mayor shall have decided, or which by any clause of this by-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction or apology required by the Mayor as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the Mayor, withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Removal of Councillor from Council.

50. In the event of any Councillor refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the Council Chamber when requested or directed by the Mayor so to do, the Mayor may order such Councillor to be removed from the said Chamber and to be excluded therefrom during the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Disorder.

51. If disorder should arise at any meeting of the Council, the Mayor, acting in his discretion, may as a matter of right, quit the chair, and announce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of 15 minutes, when the Council shall reassemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceeded with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the Chair and decided without debate by a majority of the members present.

Order in Debate.

Motions and Amendments.

52. When a motion is under debate at any meeting of the Council, no further motion shall be received, except the following:—

- (1) That the motion be amended.
- (2) That the Council do now adjourn.
- (3) That the debate be adjourned.
- (4) That the question be now put.
- (5) That the Council do proceed with the next business.
- (6) That the Council do resolve into committee of the whole.

- (1) That the Motion be Amended.

Relevance of Amendment.

53. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.
To be Read.

54. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.

55. Only one amendment at a time shall be discussed, but as often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved before the original question is put to the vote: Provided that, when an amendment is carried, one amendment thereto and no more may be moved.

Substantive Motion.

56. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

- (2) That the Council do Now Adjourn.

Time to Move.

57. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn provided that the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally seconding, and the mover of the question (if any) under debate, on the motion for the adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for five minutes but no further debate shall be allowed. No Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council shall be permitted to move the adjournment of the Council.

No Discussion—Procedure Before Further Motion.

58. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

Question Adjourned to Next Meeting.

59. On a resolution for adjournment the question (if any) under debate when motion for adjournment was made shall stand adjourned to the next meeting.

One Motion Only.

60. At the same sitting no Councillor may move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

Speaking at Resumption of Council.

61. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject. Provided that this clause shall not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

(3) That the Debate be Adjourned.

Time to Move.

62. Any Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, move without previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same meeting or to any other meeting.

No Discussion—Definition of Adjournment.

63. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate, the Councillor moving the motion may speak for not more than five minutes in explanation of his reason for so moving; but the seconder shall not be permitted to speak beyond formally seconding it, and no argument or discussion shall be permitted thereon:

Provided that, if the original motion has been submitted by a committee, the chairman of such committee, or, in his absence, a member thereof, may speak for not exceeding five minutes in explanation of any objection he may have to the adjournment.

Any motion having for its object the deferring of a final decision on any subject to a later meeting of the Council shall be deemed to be a motion for the adjournment of the debate.

Mover to Speak First.

64. On resuming an adjourned debate, the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

One Motion Only.

65. At the same sitting no member shall move or second more than one motion for adjournment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate After Count Out.

66. If the debate on any motion, moved and seconded, be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

Speaking at Subsequent Debate.

67. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate, and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent debate on the same subject: provided that this clause shall not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

(4) That the Question be Now Put.

Time to Move—Put Without Debate.

68. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of another Councillor, move without notice and without comment that the question under consideration be now put, and upon such motion being formally seconded the same shall be immediately put without debate.

Two-thirds Majority.

69. A motion that the question under consideration be now put shall not be moved by a Councillor who has already spoken on the question, and such a motion shall not be carried without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the Councillors present.

Speaking in Reply.

70. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if the debate has ensued, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put.

Motion to be Put at Once.

71. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under debate shall be at once put.

Question Includes Amendment.

72. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the Chair shall be construed and taken to mean and include the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

(5) That the Council do Proceed to the Next Business.

Time to Move.

73. It shall be competent for any Councillor at the close of the speech or any other Councillor to move, without notice, that the Council do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be Dropped.

74. When a motion be carried that the Council do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

Further Motion.

75. During the same debate a second motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour.

(6) That the Council Resolve Into Committee.

Decision of Council.

76. The Council may determine that any question shall be considered in Committee of the whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice.

Matters to be Considered by Committee.

77. Such Committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Council.

Conduct of Committees.

78. In Committee of the whole the Standing Orders of the Council shall apply except that Councillors may speak more than once to the same question.

Adoption of Committee's Resolutions.

79. The Mayor shall report the resolutions arrived at in Committee of the whole to the Council, at its next ordinary meeting, or upon the resumption of the Council, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Council may think fit.

Confidential Business.

80. All matters dealt with or brought before the Council in Committee or before any Committee of the Council shall be treated as strictly confidential, and unless and until the Council or a Committee appointed by the Council otherwise determine, no information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be disclosed to any person outside the Council prior to the issue of the business paper containing the items to be submitted to Council for confirmation.

Motion to Increase Expenditure.

81. No motion or amendment shall be moved at any meeting of the Council otherwise than in the form of a reference to the Finance Committee for consideration and report, if it would have the effect of incurring expenditure not provided for in the estimates.

Rescission of Resolutions.

Rescission.

82. No Resolution of any meeting of Council shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered except as provided by section 177 (1) and (2) of the Local Government Act.

Repetition of Negatived Motion.

83. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained within a period of three months, unless with the consent of at least 7 members of the Council.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

How moved:

84. In cases of urgent necessity any standing order or standing orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded, provided that—

- (a) no such motion shall be made until all business appearing in the Notice Paper has been disposed of;
- (b) no such motion shall be carried unless the number of Councillors voting in the affirmative shall exceed those voting in the negative by at least four;
- (c) no such motion shall be permitted unless notice thereof in writing shall have been given at the time prescribed by Clause 12 of these Standing Orders, unless the Mayor shall be satisfied that this requirement could not reasonably have been complied with.

Objects of Suspension to be Stated.

85. Any Councillor moving the suspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

Voting.

Method of Taking Votes.

86. The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or an amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion as to which party has the majority, on the voices or by a show of hands.

Voting—Division.

87. (1) The Council shall vote on the voices, or by a show of hands, as may in each case be directed by the Mayor, but any Councillor may call for a division on any question.

(2) Upon a division being called for the division bell shall be rung, and after the lapse of one-half of a minute from the bell ceasing to ring no Councillor shall be permitted to enter or leave the Chamber until after the division has been taken.

(3) When a division is being taken and until the vote is recorded, all Councillors voting in the affirmative shall stand up and all those voting in the negative shall remain seated.

Committees.

Standing Committees.

88. In addition to such special committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be four standing committees appointed from among the Councillors, namely:—

- (1) Finance and trading concerns committee.
- (2) A works committee.
- (3) A general purposes committee.
- (4) A health, building and town planning committee.

Each of the committees shall consist of not less than four members. Each of the said committees shall be appointed each year at the first meeting of the Council which shall be held after the annual election, and shall hold office until the 31st day of May following its appointment.

Election of Committees.

89. The members of the said committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot, and in the event of an equality of votes for two or more Councillors the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

89 (a) Whenever it becomes necessary to appoint a Councillor to represent the Council on the Board of Management of a public body or State instrumentality, notice shall be given to the Councillors of the necessity to make such appointment, at the meeting of the Council immediately preceding the meeting at which such appointment is to be made.

Powers and Duties of Committees.

90. The Standing Committees of the Council shall have the oversight of the following matters:—

Finance and Trading Concerns Committee:

- (a) Finances of Council.
- (b) Items of Expenditure recommended by the Spending Committees.
- (c) Preparation of Budgets for each financial year.
- (d) Loans.
- (e) The Council's Executive Staff.
- (f) Boundaries.
- (g) Any matters not specifically the oversight responsibility of any particular one of the other Committees.

Works Committee:

- (a) Effecting of construction and maintenance of streets, ways, drains, bridges, parks and reserves, parking areas and other public places.
- (b) Sweeping and clearing of streets, trees and street lawns.
- (c) Resumption of land for new streets and widening of existing streets.
- (d) Fencing vacant lands.
- (e) Construction of crossing over footpaths and any constructional matter in connection with streets.
- (f) The Council's plant and machinery.
- (g) Oversight through the appointed officers, of Council's outside work force.
- (h) Street names, directional signs and all other signs.
- (i) Vehicular parking bays and areas.
- (j) Stands for licenced vehicles and all matters relating to the control of traffic.
- (k) Lighting of streets and lighting of reserves and public places and matters relating thereto.
- (l) Construction and maintenance and other works effected to parks, reserves, enclosed oval, children's playgrounds, baths, Council owned buildings and street trees by Council staff under direct control of Engineering Department and resulting from recommendations or resolution of General Purposes Committee.

Health, Building and Town Planning Committee:

- (a) Matters affecting or relating to the health of the citizens.
- (b) House to house inspections.
- (c) Noxious trades, abattoirs, private hospitals, lodging houses, morgues, etc.
- (d) Places of public amusement and public conveniences.
- (e) Sale and distribution of food and drugs.
- (f) The garbage removal and disposal services of the Municipality.
- (g) Dogs, goats and all other animals, birds, bees, etc. (except Fauna) and matters pertaining to the operation and maintenance of Municipal pounds.
- (h) Hawkers and Itinerant Food Vendors.
- (i) Resumption of land for public open space.
- (j) Town Planning.
- (k) Industrial Development.
- (l) Control of buildings and related matter.
- (m) In conjunction with General Purposes Committee, Museums and Historic Buildings and matters relating thereto.

General Purposes Committee:

- (a) Control and oversight of parks, reserves, enclosed ovals, recreation areas and children's playground areas in respect of their use and improvements.
- (b) Swimming pools, caravan parks, town halls, office buildings, Infant Health Centres, Pre-School Centres, Senior Citizen Centres and all other Council owned buildings (other than Works Depot) in respect of their use and improvement.
- (c) Libraries.
- (d) Cemeteries.
- (e) Civic functions (with power to act).
- (f) Tourism, Avon Descent Boat Race and matters relating thereto.
- (g) In conjunction with Health, Building and Town Planning Committee, Museums and Historic Buildings and matters relating thereto.

Special Committees.

91. Special committees may consist of any number of members and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a Committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Council, a special committee ought to be appointed. No standing committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any special committee. The appointment of a special committee shall be made by resolution of the Council which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such special committee, and may either state the number of Councillors to be elected by ballot or shall name the Councillors who it is proposed shall constitute such committee. In the event of a ballot being taken and an equality of votes being recorded in favour of any two or more Councillors, the Mayor shall have the casting vote.

Convening Committee Meetings.

92. The Town Clerk shall call a meeting of any committee when requested to do so by the Mayor, the chairman, or any two members of such committee.

Standing Orders.

93. The standing orders of the Council shall be observed and apply in committees, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking, and except as to committees being conducted with open doors.

Quorum.

94. At a meeting of a committee a quorum shall consist of not less than three members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time states as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Minutes.

95. Each standing committee shall keep a book, to be called the minute-book, in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the following meeting and signed by the chairman thereof.

Penalty.

96. Any Councillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, shall be liable, on conviction before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, to a penalty not exceeding \$40.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1977.

The Municipality of the City of Nedlands By-laws Relating to Parking Facilities.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 3rd November, 1977, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:

By-laws Relating to Parking Facilities.

By-laws of the Municipality of the City of Nedlands made under section 231 and 669 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1977 and Amendment for Care, Control and Management of Parking Facilities.

PART I—DEFINITION AND OPERATION.

1. These By-laws shall be cited as The City of Nedlands Parking Facilities By-laws.
2. Interpretation—In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires—
 - “Act” means the Local Government Act, 1960-1977 as amended from time to time.
 - “Authorised Officer” means an Officer of the Council authorised by the Council to perform duties in accordance with these By-laws.
 - “Authorised Vehicle” means a vehicle authorised by the Council, Town Clerk, authorised Officer, Inspector or by any Act to stand on a road.
 - “Bus” means an omnibus within the meaning of the Road Traffic Act.
 - “Carriageway” means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, and includes the shoulders and areas, including embayments, at the side or centre of the carriageway, used for the standing or parking of vehicles; and, where a road has two or more or those portions divided by a median strip, the expression means each of these portions, separately.
 - “Commercial Vehicle” means a vehicle which comes within the description of a motor wagon in the First Schedule to the Road Traffic Act.
 - “Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Nedlands.
 - “Driver” means any person driving or in control of a vehicle.
 - “Footway” includes every footpath, lane or other place intended for the use of pedestrians only, or habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles.
 - “Inspector” means a parking inspector appointed by Council.
 - “Motor Cycle” means a motor vehicle that has two wheels or, where a sidecar is attached thereto, has three wheels.
 - “Municipality” means the Municipality of the City of Nedlands.
 - “No Parking Area” means a portion of a carriageway that lies—
 - (a) between two consecutive white signs inscribed with the words “No Parking”, in red lettering, and each with an arrow pointing generally towards the other of them; or
 - (b) between a white sign, inscribed with the words “No Parking”, in red lettering, and a dead end or an area in which standing is prohibited and that lies in the general direction indicated by an arrow inscribed on the sign.
 - “No Standing Area” means a portion of a carriageway that lies—
 - (a) between two consecutive white signs inscribed with the words, “No Standing” in red lettering, and each with an arrow pointing generally towards the other of them; or
 - (b) between a white sign inscribed with the words “No Standing”, in red lettering and a dead end or an area in which standing is prohibited and that lies in the general direction indicated by an arrow inscribed on the sign.
 - “Notice” means a notice in the form of Forms 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Second Schedule issued pursuant to By-law 28 of these by-laws.
 - “Owner” of a vehicle means the person who is the registered holder of the requisite vehicle licence under the Road Traffic Act, 1974-75 in respect of that vehicle as detailed and supplied by the Road Traffic Authority, or, if the vehicle is not licensed under that Act, the person who owns the vehicle or is entitled to its possession.
 - “Park” means to permit a vehicle, whether attended or not, to remain stationary, except for the purpose of avoiding conflict with other traffic, of complying with the provisions of any law or of immediately taking up or setting down persons or goods; and “Parking” has a correlative meaning.
 - “Parking Area” means a portion of a carriageway—
 - (a) between two consecutive white signs, inscribed with the word “Parking” in green lettering, each with an arrow pointing generally towards the other of them; or
 - (b) extending from a white sign inscribed with the word “Parking” in green lettering in the general direction indicated by an arrow inscribed on the sign, to any other sign inscribed with the words “No Parking” or “No Standing”, in red lettering, or to a dead end or an area in which the parking or standing of vehicles is prohibited and is that half of the carriageway of the road nearest to the sign.
 - “Parking Facilities” includes land, buildings, shelters, parking stalls and other facilities open to the public generally for the parking of vehicles with or without charge and signs, notices and facilities used in connection therewith.
 - “Parking Region” means that portion of the district of the Municipality that is constituted a parking region pursuant to these by-laws.
 - “Parking Stall” means a section or part of a street which is marked or defined by painted lines or by metallic studs or similar devices for the purpose of indicating where a vehicle may stand or be parked, whether on payment of a fee or charge or otherwise, but does not include a metered space.
 - “Parking Station” means any land, building or other structure provided for the purpose of accommodating vehicles with or without charge, but does not include a metered zone or metered space or private garage.

"Property Line" means the lateral boundary of a road.

"Reserve" means Public Reserve as defined in the Act.

"Road" means any highway, road, street, lane, thoroughfare or similar place which the public are allowed to use, and includes all of the land lying between the property lines, including the street verge and footpath, appurtenant thereto and which is within the parking region.

"Road Traffic Act" means the Road Traffic Act, 1974-75 as amended from time to time.

"Sign" means a traffic sign, mark, structure or device approved by the Council placed or erected on or near a road or within a parking station or reserve for the purpose of regulating, guiding or directing traffic.

"Stand" in relation to a vehicle, means to stop a vehicle and permit it to remain stationary, except for the purpose of avoiding conflict with other traffic or of complying with the provisions of any law; and "standing" has a correlative meaning.

"Street" has the same meaning as "Road".

"Street Verge" means that portion of a road which lies between the boundary of a carriageway and the property line adjacent thereto.

"Taxi" has the same meaning as taxi-car in the Road Traffic Act.

"Ticket issuing machine" means a parking meter that is installed by the Council and that issues, as a result of a prescribed coin or coins being inserted in the machine, a ticket showing the period during which it shall be lawful to remain parked in the metered space or parking stall to which it is appurtenant.

"Trailer" means a vehicle (not including a semi-trailer) drawn by another vehicle but not including a sidecar attachment to a motor cycle or any vehicle that comes within the description of a caravan.

"Vehicle" includes any vehicle which comes within the interpretation of that expression in the Road Traffic Act.

For the purposes of the application of the definitions "No Parking Area", "No Standing Area", and "Parking Area", an arrow inscribed on a traffic sign erected at an angle to the boundary of a carriageway is deemed to be pointing in the direction in which it would point, if the sign were turned through an angle of less than 90 degrees, until parallel to the boundary.

3. (1) These by-laws apply to the parking region, all parking stations and parking facilities in the parking region other than a parking facility or parking station that—

- (a) is not owned, controlled or occupied by the Municipality, or
- (b) is owned by the Municipality but is leased to another person.

(2) Any sign that—

- (a) was erected by the Commissioner of Main Roads prior to the coming into operation of these by-laws within the Municipality; and
- (b) relates to the parking or standing of vehicles within the parking region,

shall be deemed, for the purposes of these by-laws, to have been erected by the Council under the authority of these by-laws.

4. For the purpose of these by-laws vehicles are divided into classes as follows:

- (a) Buses.
- (b) Commercial vehicles including any other vehicle (not being a trailer or a vehicle to which a trailer is attached) constructed primarily for conveyance therein or thereon of goods.
- (c) Motor cycles and bicycles.
- (d) Taxis.
- (e) All other vehicles not otherwise classified.

5. Where under these by-laws the standing or parking of vehicles in a street is controlled by a sign such sign shall be read as applying to that part of the street which—

- (a) lies beyond the sign, and
- (b) lies between the sign and the next sign beyond that sign; and
- (c) is that side of the carriageway of the street nearest to the sign.

6. The portion of the district of the Municipality that is defined in the First Schedule is hereby constituted as a parking region to which these by-laws shall apply.

PART 2—PARKING STALLS AND PARKING STATIONS.

7. (1) Subject to subsection (3) of section 231 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1977, a discretionary authority is conferred on the Council by formal resolution to constitute, determine and vary, and also indicate by signs, from time to time—

- (a) parking stalls;
- (b) parking stations;
- (c) permitted times and conditions of parking in parking stalls and parking stations depending on and varying with locality.
- (d) permitted classes of vehicles to park in parking stalls and parking stations;
- (e) the amount (if any) payable for parking in parking stalls and parking stations depending on and varying with locality; and

(f) the manner of parking in parking stalls and parking stations, but such discretionary authority shall not be exercised in a manner inconsistent with the provisions of these By-laws.

(2) No person shall stand a vehicle in a parking stall in a street otherwise than parallel to the kerb and as close thereto as practicable and wholly within such stall and headed in the direction of the movement of traffic on the side of the street on which the stall is situated provided that where a parking stall is set out otherwise than parallel to the kerb the provisions of this by-law other than the provisions that a vehicle shall stand wholly within such space, shall not apply.

(3) (a) Unless otherwise directed by an inspector or attendant, no person shall park a vehicle in a parking station otherwise than wholly within a parking stall.

(b) No person shall stand a vehicle so as to obstruct an entrance to, an exit from, or a roadway within, a parking station or beyond the limits of any defined row within a parking station.

(c) No person shall stand a vehicle except with the permission of the Council or an inspector or an attendant on any part of a parking station, whether or not such part be marked as a parking stall, if a sign is exhibited prohibiting the standing of vehicles thereon.

(d) No person shall permit a vehicle to stand on any part of a parking station, whether or not that part is marked as a parking stall, if an inspector or attendant directs the driver of such vehicle to move the vehicle.

8. No person shall stand or attempt to stand a vehicle in a parking stall in which another vehicle is standing provided that this by-law shall not prevent the parking of a motor cycle and a bicycle together in a stall marked "M/C".

9. (1) No person shall permit a vehicle to stand in a parking stall which is at the time set aside for use by commercial vehicles unless such vehicle is a commercial vehicle and some person is actively engaged in loading or unloading goods to or from such vehicle.

(2) In this by-law "goods" means an article, or collection of articles, weighing at least 13.6 kgs of which the content is at least .17 m³.

(3) A parking stall is set aside for use by commercial vehicles if there is a sign thereon or adjacent thereto marked "Loading Zone".

10. No person shall permit a vehicle to stand in a parking stall which is set aside for use by buses except for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers to or from such vehicle.

PART 3—STANDING AND PARKING GENERALLY.

11. Subject to subsection 3 of section 231 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1977, a discretionary authority is conferred on the Council by formal resolution to constitute, determine and vary, and also indicate by signs, from time to time—

(a) prohibitions;

(b) regulations and restrictions of parking and standing of vehicles of a specified class or of specified classes in all streets or specified streets or in specified parts of streets or reserves at all times or specified times;

but such discretionary authority shall not be exercised in a manner inconsistent with the provisions of these by-laws.

12. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle in a street or part of a street, or part of a parking station—

(a) which is by any sign thereon or adjacent or referable thereto set apart for the standing of vehicles of a different class; or

(b) if by any such sign the standing of vehicles is prohibited or restricted during any period or periods during such period or periods; or

(c) if by any such sign the standing of vehicles is permitted for a specified time, for longer than such time.

(2) A person shall not stand a vehicle—

(a) in a no standing area;

(b) in a parking area, except in a manner indicated by the inscription on the sign or signs associated with the parking area and parking stalls except as in these by-laws provided with reference to such parking stalls;

(c) in a parking area contrary to any limitation in respect of days, periods of the day, classes of persons or classes of vehicles indicated by the inscription on the sign or signs associated with the area; or

(d) in a defined area marked "M/C", unless it is a motor cycle without a sidecar or a bicycle.

(3) A person shall not park a vehicle in a no parking area.

(4) A person shall not park a vehicle in any portion of a street—

(a) for the purposes of effecting repairs to it, other than the minimum repairs necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved to a place other than a road; or

(b) if the vehicle is exposed for sale.

(5) A person shall not stand a motor cycle without a side car or a bicycle in a parking stall unless the traffic sign "M/C" is marked on that stall.

(6) A person shall not, without the permission of the Council, Town Clerk, Authorised Officer or an Inspector, stand a vehicle in an area designated by signs "Authorised Vehicles Only".

13. Subject to the provisions of by-law 14 of these by-laws, a person standing a vehicle on a carriageway shall stand it—

- (a) on a two-way carriageway, so that it is as near as practicable to and parallel with, the left boundary of the carriageway and headed in the direction of the movement of traffic on the side of the road on which the vehicle is standing;
- (b) on a one-way carriageway, so that it is as near as practicable to, and parallel with either boundary of the carriageway and headed in the direction of the movement of traffic;
- (c) so that at least 3 metres of the width of the carriageway between the vehicle and the farther boundary of the carriageway or between it and a vehicle standing on the far side of the carriageway, is available for the passage of other vehicles;
- (d) so that it is not less than 1.2 metres from any other vehicle, except a motor cycle or a bicycle parked in accordance with these by-laws;
- (e) so that it does not cause undue obstruction on the carriageway;
- (f) so that it is entirely within the confines of any parking stall marked on the carriageway.

14. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle partly within and partly outside a parking area.

(2) Where the traffic sign or signs associated with a parking area are not inscribed with the words "Angle Parking" then—

- (a) where the parking area is adjacent to the boundary of a carriageway a person standing a vehicle in the parking area shall stand it as near as practicable to, and parallel with, that boundary; and
- (b) where the parking area is at or near the centre of the carriageway, a person standing a vehicle in that parking area shall stand it approximately at right angles to the centre of the carriageway, unless a sign associated with the parking area indicates, or marks on the carriageway indicate, that vehicles are to stand in a different position.

(3) (a) Where a traffic sign associated with a parking area is inscribed with the words, "Angle Parking" a person standing a vehicle in the parking area shall stand the vehicle at an angle of approximately 45 degrees to the centre of the carriageway unless otherwise indicated by the inscription on the parking sign or by marks on the carriageway surface.

(b) In sub-by-law (a) of this sub-by-law vehicle means; a car or motor wagon (utility type up to 3 tonne gross).

(4) Sub-by-law (3) of this by-law does not apply to a person standing a motor cycle or bicycle in a parking area.

15. (1) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is—

- (a) between any other standing vehicles and the centre of the carriageway;
- (b) adjacent to a median strip;
- (c) in front of a right-of-way, passage or private drive or carriageway or so close thereto as to deny vehicles reasonable access to or egress from the right-of-way, passage or private drive or carriageway;
- (d) in front of a footway constructed across a reserve;
- (e) alongside, or opposite, any excavation in, or obstruction on, the carriageway, if the vehicle would thereby obstruct traffic;
- (f) on, or within 9 metres of, any portion of a carriageway bounded on one or both sides by a traffic-island;
- (g) on any footway or pedestrian crossing;
- (h) upon a bridge or other elevated structure;
- (i) between the boundaries of a carriageway, and any double longitudinal line consisting of two continuous lines or between a double longitudinal line consisting of a continuous line and a broken or dotted line and the boundary of the carriageway nearer to the continuous line, unless there is a distance of at least 3 metres clear between the vehicle and the double longitudinal line;
- (j) upon an intersection, except adjacent to a carriageway boundary that is not broken by an intersecting carriageway; or
- (k) "between the edge of a carriageway and the boundary of the road nearest to that edge unless he or she is the owner or occupier of the land abutting on the boundary of the road nearest to that edge or unless he or she has the consent of such occupier."

(2) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is—

- (a) within 1 metre of a fire hydrant or fire plug, or of any sign or mark indicating the existence of a fire hydrant or fire plug; or
- (b) within 3 metres of a public letter pillar box, unless the vehicle is being used for the purpose of collecting postal articles from the pillar box.

(3) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is within 6 metres of the nearer property line of any road intersecting the road on the side on which the vehicle is standing.

(4) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is within 9 metres of the departure side of—

- (a) a sign inscribed with the words "Bus Stop", or "Hail Bus Here", unless the vehicle is an omnibus stopped to take up or set down passengers; or
- (b) a children's crossing established on a two-way carriageway.

(5) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is within 18 metres of—

- (a) the approach side of a sign inscribed with the words "Bus Stop" or "Hail Bus Here", unless the vehicle is an omnibus stopped to take up or set down passengers;
- (b) the approach side of a pedestrian crossing or children's crossing; or
- (c) the nearest rail of a railway level crossing.

16. A person shall not permit a vehicle to stand in any part of a street if any inspector or member of the Police Force directs the driver of such vehicle to move it.

17. An inspector may mark the tyres of a parked vehicle with chalk or any other non-indelible substance for any purpose connected with or arising out of his duties and powers. No person shall remove a mark made by an inspector so that the purpose of the affixing of such mark is defeated or likely to be defeated.

18. (1) A vehicle having been parked in a street or in an area where by any sign the standing of vehicles is permitted for a limited time a person shall not—

- (a) move it to any position within the same parking area;
- (b) by arrangement with any person either exchange the space used by the vehicle for space in the same or another area used by another vehicle or occupy a space in the same or another area previously occupied by another vehicle;

so that the total time of parking shall exceed the maximum time allowed for parking in the space first occupied by the vehicle.

(2) A vehicle having been parked in a street where parking is restricted as to time no person shall park such vehicle again in such street on that day unless it has first been removed from such street for at least two hours.

19. (1) A person shall not park a vehicle or any combination of vehicles that together with any projection on, or load carried by the vehicle or combination of vehicles is more than 8 metres in length, on a carriageway for any period exceeding one hour.

(2) Nothing in this by-law mitigates the limitations or conditions imposed by any other by-law or by any traffic sign relating to the parking or standing of vehicles.

20. (1) A person shall not—

- (a) park a commercial vehicle or trailer or allow a commercial vehicle or trailer to remain stationary on a street verge for more than four hours consecutively or; for more than four hours in any day unless in between each period that the commercial vehicle or trailer is parked or allowed to remain stationary in the street it has been removed from this street for at least two hours; or
- (b) on a street verge repair, service or clean a commercial vehicle.

(2) In this by-law "commercial vehicle" means a vehicle designed for or used for commercial purposes exceeding a load capacity of one tonne and a vehicle designed for or used for industrial purposes.

21. No person shall stand or permit a vehicle to stand on land which is not a street or parking facility without the consent of the owner or person in occupation of such land.

22. (1) No person except an employee of the Council in the course of his duties shall drive or park a vehicle upon or over any portion of any reserve other than a paved area specifically set aside for that purpose.

(2) No person shall park a vehicle on any part of a reserve, including any paved areas for the purposes of conducting a business.

23. The Council, Town Clerk, Authorised Officer or an Inspector may permit a person who requires a space in an area whereby any sign the standing of vehicles is permitted for a limited time, in order to carry out urgent, essential or official duties to occupy such space with a vehicle for a longer time and from time to time than the maximum period prescribed by the sign provided such permission in no way contravenes the road traffic code and may prohibit the use of such space by any other vehicle during such time.

PART 4—MISCELLANEOUS.

24. An Inspector shall be furnished with a certificate of his appointment in a form determined by the Council from time to time and the discretionary authority referred to in by-law 11 is conferred accordingly.

25. A person who is not an Inspector shall not in any way assume the duties of an Inspector.

26. No person shall in any way obstruct or hinder an Inspector in the execution of his duty.

27. (1) An Inspector or member of the Police Force who finds a person committing, or who on reasonable grounds suspects a person of having committed a breach of the provisions of these by-laws, may demand from the person, his name and place of abode.

(2) A person who refuses to state his name and place of abode, or who states a false name or place of abode, on demand being so made, commits an offence against these by-laws.

28. (1) A notice served under subsection (2) of section 669C of the Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 2.

(2) Subject to sub by-law (3) of this by-law an infringement notice served under section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 3.

(3) An infringement notice served under subsection (2) of section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 1.

(4) A notice sent under subsection (5) of section 669D of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of an offence alleged to have been committed against one of these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 4.

29. No person other than the driver of the vehicle shall remove from the vehicle any notice thereto or left therein or thereon by an Inspector or a member of the Police Force.

30. No person shall—

- (a) without the authority of the Council mark, set up or exhibit any sign purporting to be or resembling a sign marked, set up or exhibited by the Council under the authority of these by-laws;
- (b) remove, deface or misuse any sign or property or any part thereof, or attempt to do any such acts;
- (c) without the permission of the Council affix any board, sign, placard, notice or other thing to or paint or write upon any part of a sign.

31. An inscription on a sign operates and has effect according to its tenor and a person contravening the direction of a sign commits an offence under these by-laws.

32. (a) A sign marked, erected, established, or displayed on or near a road is, in the absence of evidence to the contrary presumed to be a sign marked, erected, established or displayed under the authority of these by-laws.
(b) The first three letters of any day of the week when used on a sign indicates that day of the week.

(c) Signs associated with, no parking areas, no standing area, parking areas or a sign of a kind referred to in these by-laws is limited in its operation and effect in respect of days, periods of the day, classes of persons, classes of vehicle, circumstances to the extent, if any, shown on the sign.

33. Authorised Officers or Parking Inspectors appointed by the City of Nedlands from time to time are hereby authorised by the City of Nedlands to—

- (a) carry into effect the provisions of these by-laws.
- (b) report to the Council on the working effectiveness and functioning of these by-laws;
- (c) recommend to the Council the institution of prosecutions; and
- (d) institute and conduct prosecutions as directed by the Council or the Town Clerk from time to time.

PART 5—PENALTIES.

34. Any person who commits or causes a breach of any provisions of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding eighty dollars (\$80).

35. The amount appearing in the final column of the Third Schedule directly opposite an offence described in that Schedule is the modified penalty for that offence if dealt with under section 669D of the Act.

36. A penalty for an offence against these by-laws (not being a modified penalty) may be recovered by the Council in taking proceedings against the alleged offender in a Court of Petty Sessions.

37. The Council shall cause adequate records to be kept of all infringement notices served and modified penalties received, under section 669D of the Act in respect of offences against these by-laws.

PART 6—REPEAL.

38. All previous by-laws made by the Municipality of the City of Nedlands relating to the care, control and management of Parking Facilities, are hereby repealed.

then subject to sub-clause (3) of this clause.
2. Adding a new sub-clause as follows:—
(3) If at the expiration of fifteen (15) minutes from the time fixed for the commencement of a meeting or an adjourned meeting a quorum is not present the Chairman of the Committee or in his absence the majority of the members of the Committee present or any member of the Committee present alone or in the absence of the Chairman and all the members of the Committee the Town Clerk may adjourn the meeting to another time on the same or any subsequent day.

The By-laws of the City of Stirling published in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th May, 1971 are hereby amended in the following manner:—

Add to By-law 414. A concessional reduction for pensioners of 25% of the fees charged be granted on production of a Pensioner Health Benefit Card as issued under the National Health Act.
