ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 624/63; Ex. Co. 0581.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 3 of the Health Act, 1911-1976, that the term "Infectious Disease" means and includes certain specified diseases, and also any other disease which the Governor from time to time by notification in the Government Gazette declares to be an infectious disease for the purposes of the Act; and whereas it is desired to declare the diseases hereinafter mentioned to be infectious diseases for the purposes of the Act: Now, therefore, his Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the Act, doth hereby declare the diseases specified in the Schedule below to be infectious diseases for the purposes of the Act.


