ORDER IN COUNCIL.

File No. 3474/69.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1977, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid: and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 31614 (Karratha Lot 1091) should be granted in fee simple to the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board to be held in trust for the purpose of "Fire Station Site".

REGULATIONS.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Service Regulations, 1979.
- Interpretation. 2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
“Officer in Charge” in relation to an officer means the officer responsible to the Permanent Head of a Department or if the organisation of a Department so provides, to the Head of a Sub-Department for the work performed by other officers employed in the Department or Sub-Department.
“subregulation” means a subregulation of that regulation in which the term is used;
“the Act” means the Public Service Act, 1978.
- Divisions. 3. (1) Every office created and every officer employed in a Department or Sub-Department, shall be included in one of five divisions, that is to say—
(a) the Special Division;
(b) the Administrative Division;
(c) the Professional Division;
(d) the Clerical Division;
(e) the General Division.
(2) The Special Division shall include such offices and officers as the Governor on the recommendation of the Board determines.
(3) The Administrative Division, the Professional Division, the Clerical Division and the General Division shall include such offices and officers as the Board determines.
- Reciprocal arrangements with Commonwealth for services and works. 4. The Board may arrange with the Commonwealth for the provision of services or the performance of any work—
(a) by an officer or officers of the Public Service for the Commonwealth; or
(b) by an officer or officers in the Public Service of the Commonwealth for the government of the State.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

Increases in salary.

5. (1) Before any increase in salary is paid to an officer who occupies an office which is allocated a range of salary, the Officer in Charge shall complete a report in respect of the officer's efficiency, diligence and conduct and where the Permanent Head is satisfied with the report, the increase in salary shall be paid.

(2) Where the Permanent Head considers the report of the Officer in Charge to be an adverse report the following provisions shall apply—

- (a) the report shall be brought to the notice of the officer and shall be initialled by the officer;
- (b) if the officer desires to give any explanation in respect of the report or give any reasons for disagreeing with the report, the officer shall put the explanation or reasons in writing;
- (c) the Permanent Head shall immediately consider the report and the officer's explanation or reasons and may approve the increase in salary or forthwith recommend to the Board that the increase not be paid for a specific period;
- (d) the Board shall forthwith enquire into the matter and may approve, vary or reverse the Permanent Head's recommendation and shall notify the Permanent Head and the officer of its decision within twenty-eight clear days of receipt of the Permanent Head's recommendation.

(3) Where an increase is not paid for a specific period, the Officer in Charge shall complete a further report before the expiry of that specific period and the provisions of subregulations (1) and (2) shall apply in respect of that report.

Appealable offices.

(4) The non-payment of an increase shall not change the normal anniversary date of any further increase due to the officer.

6. The following are appealable offices—

- (a) all offices in the Clerical Division and the General Division;
- (b) any office in the Professional Division within an occupational group specified in column 1 hereunder if the maximum salary of the office does not exceed the maximum salary of the level within that occupational group that is specified opposite in column 2 hereunder—

Lump sum payments.

- (c) any office in the Professional Division not within an occupational group specified in paragraph (b) of this regulation, if the maximum salary of the office does not exceed the maximum salary of Level 11 within the Professional Division Miscellaneous Officers occupational group.

7. (1) On application to the Permanent Head, a lump sum payment for the money equivalent of any—

- (a) long service leave entitlement for continuous service as prescribed by section 59 of the Act and accrued annual leave as prescribed by section 59 of the Act shall be made to an officer who resigns, retires, is retired or is dismissed or in respect of an officer who dies;
- (b) *pro rata* annual leave shall be made to an officer who resigns, retires, is retired or in respect of an officer who dies, but not to an officer who is dismissed; and

SCHEDULE—*continued*

(c) *pro rata* long service leave based on continuous service of a lesser period than that prescribed by section 59 of the Act for a long service entitlement shall be made—

- (i) to an officer who retires at or over the age of 60 years or who is retired on the grounds of ill health, if the officer has completed not less than twelve months continuous service before the date of retirement;
- (ii) to an officer who, not having resigned, is retired by the Board for any other cause, if the officer has completed not less than three years continuous service before the date of retirement; or
- (iii) in respect of an officer who dies, if the officer has completed not less than twelve months continuous service before the date of death.

(2) In the case of a deceased officer, payment shall be made to the estate of the officer unless the officer is survived by a legal dependant approved by the Treasurer, in which case payment shall be made to the legal dependant.

8. A female officer who resigns from the Public Service to be married shall be entitled to a lump sum payment of the money equivalent of—

- (a) any accrued and *pro rata* annual leave;
- (b) any long service leave entitlement prescribed by section 59 of the Act namely three months or multiples thereof; and
- (c) any *pro rata* long service leave for continuous service of a lesser period than that required to qualify under section 59 of the Act for three months long service leave but no payments shall be made for *pro rata* long service leave unless the officer—
 - (i) has completed at the date of her resignation not less than three years continuous service since attaining the age of eighteen years;
 - (ii) is married within three months of the date of her resignation; and
 - (iii) produces to the Permanent Head a certificate of her marriage.

9. (1) A female officer who marries but does not resign from the Public Service may elect to receive a lump sum payment only for the money equivalent of any *pro rata* long service leave for continuous service of a lesser period than that prescribed by section 59 of the Act for an entitlement of three months long service leave if she—

- (a) makes application to the Permanent Head within a period of one month after the date of her marriage;
- (b) has at the date of her marriage completed not less than three years continuous service since attaining the age of eighteen years; and
- (c) produces to the Permanent Head a certificate of her marriage.

(2) Any lump sum payment made pursuant to subregulation (1) shall be calculated—

- (a) at the officer's salary rate as at the date of her marriage; and
- (b) for the officer's period of continuous service up to the date of her marriage.

(3) A female officer who marries but does not resign from the Public Service and has not at the date of her marriage completed three years continuous service since attaining the age of eighteen years, may elect (not later than one month after the date on which she has completed three years continuous service after attaining the age of eighteen years) to receive a lump sum payment for the money equivalent of *pro rata* long service leave calculated—

- (a) at her salary rate as at the date on which she completes three years continuous service; and
- (b) for three years continuous service only.

(4) Any lump sum payment made in accordance with this regulation shall not include the money equivalent of any long service leave entitlement attained by an officer, namely three months or multiples thereof.

(5) A female officer who marries but does not resign and does not make the election for a lump sum payment in accordance with this regulation shall not be eligible for any lump sum payment for *pro rata* long service leave under this regulation should she subsequently resign.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

(6) Where an officer has, prior to her marriage, become entitled to long service leave that officer shall, for the purposes of this regulation, be deemed to have commenced her period of continuous service for which payment may be made pursuant to this regulation immediately after the day on which she last became so entitled to long service leave.

Sick leave. 10. (1) The Permanent Head shall credit each permanent officer with the following sick leave credits, which shall be cumulative—

(3) Where a temporary officer is appointed as a permanent officer any sick leave credits held by that temporary officer immediately prior to appointment shall remain to that officer's credit on that appointment.

(4) Where an officer is absent on account of illness and that officer's entitlement to sick leave on full pay is exhausted, the officer may elect to convert any part of the entitlement to sick leave on half pay to sick leave on full pay, but so that the sick leave entitlement on half pay is reduced by two days for each day of sick leave on full pay that the officer receives by the conversion.

Short leave. 11. (1) A Permanent Head may, upon sufficient cause being shown, grant an officer short leave on full pay not exceeding two consecutive working days, but any leave granted under the provisions of this subregulation shall not exceed, in the aggregate, three working days in any one calendar year.

(2) An officer who desires short leave shall make written application in a form approved by the Board for the purpose.

(3) The provisions of this regulation also apply to any temporary officer who has completed at least twelve months of continuous service in the Public Service in a temporary capacity.

Public Service holidays. 12. Pursuant to section 59 of the Act, the following days shall be Public Service Holidays—

- (a) the first day following New Years Day except when New Years Day falls on a—
 - (i) Friday, in which case the next following Monday;
 - (ii) Saturday or Sunday, in which case the next following Tuesday; or
 - (iii) Tuesday, in which case the Monday preceding New Years Day;
- (b) Easter Eve (Easter Saturday);
- (c) Easter Tuesday;
- (d) a day determined by the Board during the holding of the Royal Agricultural Society Perth Royal Show in the case of the Perth metropolitan area, or, in lieu thereof, a day determined by the Board for areas other than the Perth metropolitan area for local agricultural shows or events;
- (e) the Monday preceding Christmas Day when Christmas Day falls on a Tuesday or the Friday following Christmas Day when Christmas Day falls on a Wednesday.

SCHEDULE—*continued*

- Public comment. 13. An officer shall not—
- (a) publicly comment, either orally or in writing, on any administrative action, or upon the administration of any Department; or
 - (b) use for any purpose, other than for the discharge of official duties as an officer, information gained by or conveyed to that officer through employment in the Public Service.
- Further offences for the purposes of s. 52 of the Act. 14. Where an officer is convicted—
- (a) of an offence involving—
 - (i) fraud or dishonesty;
 - (ii) wilful damage to, or destruction of, the property of another; or
 - (iii) offences against the person of another;
 - (b) of an offence which on conviction is punishable by imprisonment for two years or more,
- the Board may take action against that officer under the provisions of section 52 of the Act.
- Retirement. 15. (1) Every officer who has attained the age of 60 years shall be entitled to retire from the Public Service, but may continue in the Public Service until attaining the age of 65 years.
- (2) Where the Permanent Head is of the opinion that an officer who has attained the age of 60 years is unable to discharge in an efficient manner the duties allocated to that officer, the Permanent Head shall report the matter to the Board.
- (3) An officer who continues in the Public Service after attaining the age of 60 years may at any time before attaining the age of 65 years be called upon by written notice, by the Governor on the recommendation of the Board in the case of a Permanent Head or Senior Officer, or by the Board in the case of any other officer, to retire.
- (4) Every officer called upon to retire in accordance with subregulation (3) shall retire accordingly and where the officer does not comply with such notice within seven days the officer shall be deemed to have retired from the Public Service as from the date of the Governor's notice or the Board's notice as the case requires.
- (5) Subject to subregulation (6) every officer who attains the age of 65 years shall retire immediately on attaining that age.
- (6) Where the Board certifies that in the interests of the Public Service it is desirable that an officer should continue in office in the Public Service after attaining the age of 65 years and the officer is able and willing to do so, the Governor may approve of that officer continuing in the Public Service for such time as the Governor directs and the officer may continue in office accordingly.
- Communications from organised bodies of officers. 16. (1) A petition, complaint or other communication of whatsoever kind shall not be received by the Crown or the Board on behalf of the Crown from any organised body of officers, unless it is from a relevant union.
- (2) For the purposes of subregulation (1), "relevant union" means a union that is party to an award or industrial agreement under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912 or the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1966 whereby the terms and conditions of employment appertaining to the officers who are the subject of the petition, complaint or other communication are or will be regulated.
- Public Service List. 17. (1) The Board shall keep a record of all offices and the name, date of birth, and date of appointment of each officer and the title and classification of the office held by each officer.
- (2) The Board shall, in the month of August or as soon thereafter as practicable in each year, publish a list of all officers employed on the first day of July in such year, together with the particulars so recorded in respect to them.
- (3) Copies of the list referred to in subregulation (2) shall be forwarded to the Governor and laid before Parliament within fourteen days of publication, or, if Parliament is not sitting, then within fourteen days after the commencement of the next sitting thereof.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Road Traffic (Infringements) Regulations, 1975, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th May, 1975, and subsequently amended from time to time by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

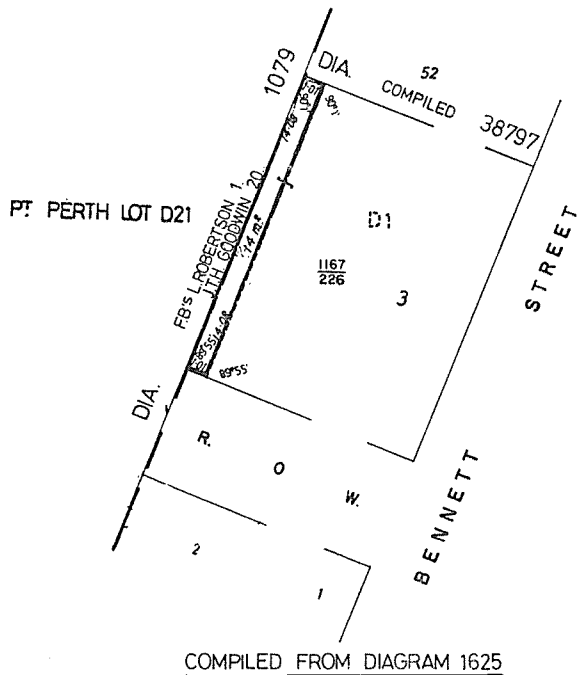

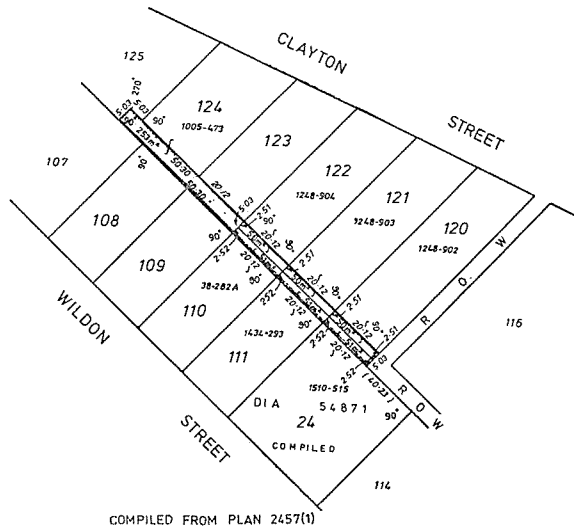

(4) If any such surf board or other device mentioned in the previous paragraph shall have been impounded and shall not have been claimed by the owner thereof within two months after the expiration of the period for which it was impounded it may be sold or disposed in such manner as the Council shall direct.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 12th September, 1978, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws and repeals all By-laws relating to Hawkers and Stallholders at present in force within the Town of Cockburn.

Definitions.

1. "Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960.
"Clerk" means the Town Clerk or person for the time being acting in that capacity.
"Council" means the Town of Cockburn.
"District" means the District of the Town of Cockburn.
"Hawker", "Stall" and "Stallholder" have the meaning assigned to them by Sections 217 and 242 of the Act.
"Licensee" means a person to whom a license is granted under these By-laws.
"License" means a license issued pursuant to these By-laws.
"Member of the Police Force" means a member of the Police Force of Western Australia.
2. Any person who desires to Hawk any goods, wares or merchandise or to be a stallholder, within the district, shall make application to the Council in writing, for a License to do so.
3. Subject to these By-laws, the Council may issue Licenses and may at its discretion, issue Licenses for less than twelve months but not less than one month.
4. (1) A license shall be in the form as set out in the First Schedule to the By-laws, and the license fees shall be the fees set out in the Second Schedule to the By-laws, and those fees shall be paid by the Licensee to the Council forthwith upon the issue to him of the license.
(2) A license is not transferable.
(3) The license granted to a Hawker is valid for the Hawking of the goods, wares or merchandise therein described only, and in the case of a license limited to a part of the District, is valid for that part of the District only.
5. (1) Every person wishing to obtain a license shall make application to the Council in writing.
(2) An application for a Hawkers License shall specify—
 - (a) The kind of goods, wares or merchandise which the applicant requires to Hawk;
 - (b) The type of vehicle, conveyance or means of carriage to be employed in hawking;
 - (c) The period for which the license is required;
 - (d) where the license is required to be limited to a part of the District, the part of the district to which it will apply.
(3) An application for a stallholders license shall specify—
 - (a) the kind of goods, wares or merchandise which the applicant desires to sell;
 - (b) the location of the stall;
 - (c) the period for which the license is required.
6. (1) The Council shall not issue a Hawkers or Stallholders license (other than a renewal) to an applicant unless he produces to the Council a Certificate signed by two Justices of the Peace certifying that he is of good character and reputation, and is a fit person to exercise the trade of a Hawker.
(2) The Council may refuse to issue a license or may cancel a license in the event that the applicant or the licensee (as the case may be)—
 - (a) is an undischarged bankrupt, or becomes bankrupt;
 - (b) has been convicted or becomes convicted of an indictable offence;
 - (c) has been twice convicted during the preceding five years, or is twice convicted in the space of five years of an offence against the By-laws of any Local Authority relating to Hawkers;
 - (d) does not conform with the requirements of the Health Act, 1911, or the Model By-laws made under that Act.
(3) Council may refuse to issue a license if in its opinion the needs of the District or the portion thereof for which the license is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licenses have been issued.
7. The Council may revoke any license issued by it, on any of the grounds set out in By-law 6 hereof, or on the grounds—
 - (a) that the licensee has committed a breach of the terms or conditions of the license;
 - (b) that the licensee is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;

- (c) that he has assigned his license or does not himself carry on the business; or
 - (d) that he is not regularly carrying on the business for which the license was granted.
8. Upon the cancellation of a license the holder thereof shall forthwith return the license to the Clerk and shall forfeit all fees paid in respect of the license.
9. (1) The Council shall issue to every licensee a badge in the form set out in the Third Schedule for which the licensee shall pay the sum of fifty cents.
- (2) A licensee shall display his badge whilst hawking or conducting a stall.
 - (3) A person shall not display a Hawkers or Stallholders badge unless he is the holder of a current license.
 - (4) Upon cancellation of a license the holder thereof shall forthwith return his badge to the Clerk and shall forfeit the fee paid in respect thereof.
10. A hawker whilst hawking or a stallholder whilst conducting a stall shall—
- (a) carry with him his license and produce same upon demand to any Officer of the Council or member of the Police Force;
 - (b) have his name legibly and conspicuously displayed upon his stall or vehicle; and
 - (c) when selling goods, wares or merchandise by weight, carry and use for that purpose, scales tested and certified in accordance with the provisions of the Weights and Measures Act, 1915.
11. A hawker or stallkeeper shall not—
- (a) hawk or conduct a stall between the hours of sunset and sunrise the next day, or on any Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday without obtaining the consent of Council;
 - (b) loiter within a distance of two hundred metres of any shop or permanent place of business that has for sale any goods, wares or merchandise of the kind being hawked or offered for sale by the stallholder;
 - (c) call his wares or cause or make any outcry noise or disturbance likely to be a nuisance or cause annoyance to any person in that vicinity;
 - (d) deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle or upon the roadway or footpath;
 - (e) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway; or
 - (f) act in an offensive manner.
12. The person to whom a stall holders license is issued shall maintain the stall in good order and condition.
13. No person shall conduct a stall on private property unless there is adequate provision on the private property adjacent to the stall for the parking of customers' vehicles.
14. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of these By-laws, the Council may grant without fee, licenses to conduct stalls in any street or way or on any land for any period specified in such a license if such stalls are conducted solely for the purpose of raising money for religious, sporting or charitable purposes or any other organisation which in the opinion of Council should benefit from this provision.
15. The person to whom a hawkers license is issued shall not remain stationary in any street or public place for any period longer than shall be necessary for the purpose of serving or treating with any customer or intending customer then offering to buy or treat.
16. Any person committing a breach of these By-laws or who is guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to—
- (a) a maximum penalty of \$200.00; and
 - (b) a maximum daily penalty of \$20.00 per day during such breach continuing; and
 - (c) a minimum penalty of one-tenth of the maximum penalty, and one-tenth of the maximum daily penalty for the breach.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 20th day of December, 1978, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor By-Laws to amend Council By-laws relating to Parking Facilities as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of December, 1973, and amended from time to time.

The By-laws are further amended as follows:—

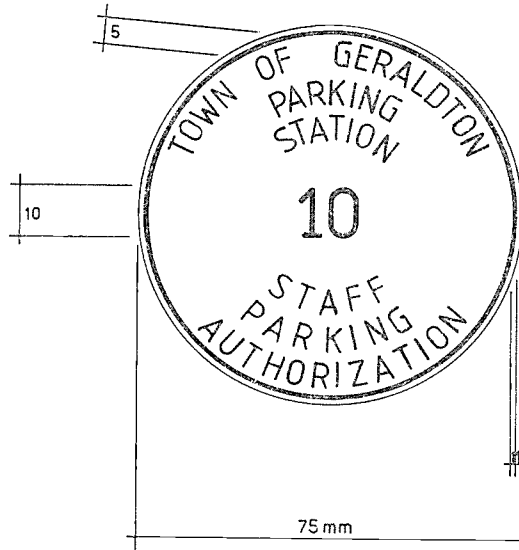
1. By including in By-law 2 the following definition:—

“Authorised Vehicle” means a vehicle authorised by Council or an Inspector, and to which is attached in a conspicuous place a sticker as shown in the sixth schedule of these By-Laws, to stand in a parking station which is designated by signs to be used for parking by “Authorised Vehicles Only”.
2. By adding a new clause to By-Law No. 36 (1) as follows:—

(L) in an area designated by signs “Authorised Vehicles Only” without the permission of the Council or an Inspector.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1978.

The Municipality of the Town of Narrogin.

By-law Relating to the Conduct of Proceedings and the Business of the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 19th day of September, 1978, to amend such By-law published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th November, 1975.

1. Clause 117(1) be amended by adding after the phrase (c) Health, Building and Town Hall on line six a further phrase:—
(d) Town Planning.

2. By deleting Clause 121 and inserting the following Clause.

121. Subject to any resolution of the Council passed after the coming into operation of this amendment the Standing Committees shall have the following powers and duties—

Finance and General Purposes Committee:

- (a) To oversee the management of the Council's finances, the collection of revenue, the expenditure of moneys, payment of accounts and insurance premiums, and the accounting for the Council's finances and the protection of the assets of the Council.
- (b) To recommend policies to the Council with respect to the day to day implementation of all or any of the matters of which the Committee has oversight.
- (c) To collate the yearly estimates of receipts and expenditures of the various Committees and to prepare for submission to the Council the annual budgets for the Municipal and other Funds of the Council after considering recommendations from other Standing Committees on expenditures which come under their control and to make submissions to the Council on the striking of rates and the levying of other charges.

- (d) To consider and make recommendations to the Council of proposals by the various Committees for the borrowing of funds by loan or overdraft and to prepare for submission to the Council the annual loan programme.
- (e) To oversee and make submissions to the Council with respect to the administration of personnel, rates of salaries and wages, superannuation, Awards and Agreements, the appointment of Officers, Staff training and development, disciplinary measures, general conditions of employment, provided that any other Committee may make a recommendation to the Finance and General Purposes Committee concerning an Officer whose principal duties pertain to the business of such Committee.
- (f) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the sale, lease or rental of Council property.
- (g) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to requests for donations.
- (h) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the purchase, sale, replacement and maintenance of office equipment.
- (i) To recommend to the Council the promulgation of by-laws provided that another Standing Committee may also recommend the draft of a by-law on matters the oversight of which it is responsible.
- (j) To arrange civic functions and oversee the conduct thereof.
- (k) To recommend to the Council on such other matters not under the care of other Committees.
- (l) From time to time review progress of plans, objectives and programmes and on the operation of individual services of which the Committee has the oversight.

Works, Parks and Gardens Committee:

- (a) To oversee the care, control and management of works in streets, ways and other public places and the construction and maintenance of such works including the design, alignment, levels, drainage, widening, re-location and protection thereof.
- (b) To recommend policies to the Council with respect to the day to day implementation of all or any of the matters of which the Committee has the oversight.
- (c) To oversee the control and maintenance of street verges, planting and maintenance of street trees and the cleansing of streets.
- (d) To oversee the construction and maintenance of signs in streets, ways and other public places, street shelters, street furniture, crossings over footpaths, the lighting of streets, ways, reserves and other public places.
- (e) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the purchase, sale, replacement, maintenance, operation and control of vehicles, plant and equipment and the procurement of materials required for carrying out of works.
- (f) To make recommendations to the Town Planning Committee with respect to the siting of all works depots.
- (g) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the control of quarries and the supervision of quarrying operations.
- (h) To initiate and supervise the design and construction of works depots, subject always to reference to the Health, Building and Town Hall Committee.
- (i) To supervise the engagement and dismissal of employees in respect to the performance of works.
- (j) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the control of stray dogs and cattle and the impounding thereof.
- (k) To prepare and submit to the Council by-laws relating to matters with respect to which the Committee is responsible subject in all cases with reference to the Finance Committee where fees, charges or penalties are involved.
- (l) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the provisions, establishment, design construction, maintenance and management of parks, reserves, playgrounds, recreational and civic amenities and facilities.
- (m) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the establishment, control and management of swimming pools and the letting and hiring thereof.
- (n) To make recommendations to the Council on all matters relating to Community Recreation.
- (o) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to street kerbside space for parking purposes.
- (p) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the design, construction, maintenance and control of all Council owned or operated off street car parks.
- (q) From time to time to review progress of plans, objectives and programmes and on the operation of individual services of which the Committee has the oversight.

Health, Building and Town Hall Committee:

- (a) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the protection of health and life of the community including without limiting the generality of the foregoing immunisation, social welfare and health education and the control of building operations and the construction and repair of buildings.
- (b) To recommend policies to the Council with respect to the day to day implementation of all or any of the matters of which the Committee has the oversight.
- (c) To oversee the administration of the Health Act 1911 and the by-laws and regulations made thereunder.
- (d) To oversee the sanitary provisions for the collection and disposal of sewerage, refuse and liquid wastes and the control of nuisances, offensive trades, insects and pests, the distribution and sale of food and drugs to the public.
- (e) To make recommendations to the Town Planning Committee with respect to the location of Aged Persons Centres, Rest and Welfare Centres, Child Health Centres, Child Minding Centres and similar facilities.
- (f) To oversee in conjunction with such other Committees as may be appropriate the provision, supervision and cleaning of Public Conveniences in parks, reserves, car parks and other public places.
- (g) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the control of itinerant vendors of food, hawkers, street vending and street photographers.
- (h) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the administration of Part XV of the Local Government Act 1960, the Uniform Building By-laws and any other by-laws relating to matter with respect to which the Committee has the oversight.
- (i) To make reports and recommendations to the Council with respect to dangerous, neglected and dilapidated buildings and to give effect to any orders made by the Council with respect to the demolition or repair thereof.
- (j) To oversee the control of the erection, location and upkeep of verandahs, signs, hoardings, billposting and fencing, including the fencing of vacant lands, the storage of inflammable materials and the construction, maintenance and repair of all Municipal buildings.
- (k) To oversee and make recommendations to the Council with respect to the enforcement of the provisions of any town planning scheme or by-law relating to the use of land for building.
- (l) To oversee the design of buildings on parks, reserves, playgrounds, recreational and civic amenities and facilities for leisure time opportunities for the community.
- (m) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the establishment, overseeing and management of the Town Hall and Caravan Park.
- (n) To prepare and submit to the Council by-laws relating to matters with respect to which the Committee has the oversight subject in all cases with reference to the Finance Committee where fees, charges or penalties are involved.
- (o) From time to time to review progress of plans, objectives and programmes and on the operation of individual services of which the Committee has the oversight.

Town Planning Committee:

- (a) To oversee the regulation and use of land pursuant to the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act and any such Scheme made under the Act.
- (b) To prepare Town Planning Schemes for submission to the Council and to oversee the operation of such Schemes.
- (c) To recommend policies to the Council with respect to the day to day implementation of the Council's functions as a local planning authority and with particular regard to matters affecting the environment.
- (d) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to the classification and zoning of land for use for various purposes.
- (e) To make recommendations to the Council as to height, location, design, purpose, dimensions or general character of buildings or other structures where such recommendations are necessary to enable effect to be given to any town planning scheme or policy of the Council.
- (f) To make recommendations to the Council with respect to applications for approval to commence development and any other applications with respect to the use, zoning or development of land made under the provisions of any town planning scheme or by-law.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1978.

The Municipality of the Shire of Brookton.

By-laws Relating to Depositing and Removal of Refuse, Rubbish, Litter and Disused materials.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and to all the powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Brookton hereby records having resolved on the 21st December, 1978, to submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

- (1) In these By-laws:—
 - “Council” means the Brookton Shire Council;
 - “District” means the Shire of Brookton Municipal District.
- (2) If there is:—
 - (A) On any vacant land within the district any trees, scrub, undergrowth or rubbish; or
 - (B) on any land within this district any refuse, rubbish or disused material whether of the same kind, or a different kind from that here specified which in the opinion of the Council is likely to affect adversely the value of the adjoining property or the health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants thereof,

the Council may cause a notice under the hand of the Shire Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him, within the time specified in such notice to clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth or remove such refuse, rubbish, or disused material from such land.
- (3) Every owner or occupier of land on whom a notice is served under By-law 2 of these By-laws, shall comply with such notice within the time therein specified and any owner or occupier of land who fails to comply with the terms of the Notice so served shall be guilty of an offence.
- (4) Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth or remove such refuse, rubbish or disused material as required by the notice given by the Council, the Council is authorised without payment of any compensation in respect thereof to remove it and dispose of it at the expense of and recover in a Court of competent jurisdiction the amount of expenses from the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

- (5) Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable to—
- (a) a maximum penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200); and
 - (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of twenty dollars (\$20) per day.

(6) The By-law requiring removal of refuse, etc., published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd December, 1971, is hereby repealed.

MINE WORKERS' RELIEF ACT, 1932-1977.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting under the Mine Workers' Relief Act, 1932-1977 and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1975, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the schedule hereunder, to take effect on and from the day on which the Mine Workers' Relief Act Amendment Act, 1977 comes into operation.
