WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1978, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than ten years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said

lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.



THE Dental Board of Western Australia constituted under the Dental Act, 1939-1975, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by section 15 of that Act, hereby makes the rules set out in the Schedule hereunder.

RULES.

Principal rules.

Heading to Part VI amended.

Rule 23 revoked and substituted.

1. In these rules the Dental Board Rules, 1973, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th January, 1974, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices published in the *Government Gazette* are referred to as the principal rules.

2. The heading to Part VI of the principal rules is amended by deleting the word "SPECIALITIES" and substituting the word "SPECIALTIES".

3. Rule 23 of the principal rules is revoked and the following rule is substituted—

23. (1) A dentist shall not refer to himself as an endodontist, oral surgeon, orthodontist, paedodontist, periodontist or prosthodontist unless he has applied for and obtained the permission in writing of the Board so to do.

(2) The Board shall not grant the permission referred to in subrule (1) of this rule unless the dentist applying therefor—

(a) has completed a period of not less than two years in the practice of general dentistry after having obtained his basic registrable qualification; and

(b) has completed a formal course of clinical and academic training—

(i) which continued for a period of not less than two academic years of full time study or the part time equivalent thereof in an institution recognised by the Board; and

(ii) at the conclusion of which that dentist obtained by examination a post-graduate degree or diploma awarded by the institution referred to in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph or by another authority, which degree or diploma is applicable to the specialty concerned and is recognised by the Board;

and

(c) has satisfied the Board that he has completed a period of not less than four years of clinical experience in the specialty concerned (including such time as was spent in preparation for the examination for the post-graduate degree or diploma referred to in paragraph (b) of this subrule), during which period he must have devoted, under appropriate supervision, a substantial part of his time to the practice of that specialty.

(3) Every dentist who practises a specialty with the permission of the Board shall confine his practice to the specialty and shall not practise in partnership or association with any dentist other than a dentist who is registered in the same specialty unless he has applied for and obtained the permission in writing of the Board so to do.

- (4) For the purpose of this rule, the term "specialty" means any dental work in endodontics, oral surgery, orthodontics, paedodontics, periodontics or prosthodontics.
- Rule 27 amended.
4. Rule 27 of the principal rules is amended in subrule (2)—
- (a) in line three by deleting the passage "words," and substituting the passage "words "Endodontist", " ; and
- (b) in line four by deleting the passage " "Pedodontist" " and substituting the passage " "Paedodontist" ".

- Existing Land Use Map
- Scheme Area Map
- Scheme Map, showing proposed land use.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme applies to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on each of the Maps referred to in Clause 3 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area").

Interpretation.

5. In the Scheme unless the context otherwise requires—"Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 as amended.

"Owner" means the Industrial Lands Development Authority established by the Industrial Lands Development Authority Act, 1966, and in the event of its dissolution or abolition includes its successors.

Words and expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act or in Appendix D to the Town Planning Regulations, 1967.

General Objects.

6. The general objects of the Scheme are:—
- (a) To establish the basis of subdivision and development of the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
 - (b) To plan suitable roads within the Scheme Area.
 - (c) To make provision for a railway loop line within the Scheme Area.
 - (d) To ensure the proper drainage of roads and those parts of the Scheme Area which require drainage or other works.
 - (e) To facilitate and co-ordinate the progressive subdivision and development of the land within the Scheme Area for industrial and other purposes.
 - (f) To make provision for land to be used for Public Open Space and recreation purposes.
 - (g) To make provision for other matters which are necessary or incidental to town planning.
 - (h) To improve and secure the amenity and convenience of the Scheme Area and to promote a good standard working environment therein.

Method of Carrying out Objects.

7. As and when the owner subdivides land within the Scheme Area such subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area.

8. The Scheme Map forms a basis for the subdivision of the Scheme Area showing the proposed location of roads, public open space, the railway loop line, commercial and community sites and compensating basins. The Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board and any public authority whose interests are affected permit departures from the design shown on the Scheme Map if it considers the proposed design to be of a similar standard to that shown but no departure from the design shown on the Scheme Map shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision or development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

Subdivision.

9. The owner shall when it desires to subdivide any land within the Scheme Area submit to the Town Planning Board a plan of subdivision in conformity with the Scheme Map with such modifications as are permitted by the Council under Clause 8 hereof.

10. The owner shall as a condition of approval of the subdivision of the Scheme Area at no cost to the Council:—

- (a) carry out the survey of each stage of the subdivision in accordance with the Scheme Map with such modifications as may be permitted by the Council.
- (b) Construct and drain the roads shown on the Scheme Map within the stage of subdivision the subject of application for approval.
- (c) Transfer to the Council all land shown as Public Open Space and Recreation on the Scheme Map.
- (d) Transfer to the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board such portions of the land shown on the Scheme Map as Public Purposes, Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage as are not already owned by that Board.
- (e) Transfer to or vest in the Crown the land shown as Railway on the Scheme Map.
- (f) Construct run-around loop lines if and where these are considered necessary by Westrail to ensure that no delays to road traffic occur at level crossings due to the shunting of private siding lines.

11. The land coloured green on the Scheme Map represents five per centum of the area of land within the Scheme Area capable of subdivision. This land shall be transferred to the Council as a public open space contribution as and when it forms part of a subdivision. Those areas coloured green on the Scheme Map which contain dry compensating basins are accepted by the Council as part of the public open space contribution on the understanding that they will be available and usable as dry recreation areas for not less than 345 days in each calendar year.

Closure of Roads.

12. Surveyed roads within the Scheme Area that are not shown as new roads on the Scheme Map shall be closed as the development of the land proceeds and as such roads are no longer required.

Natural Gas Pipelines.

13. A building shall not be erected within a distance of twelve metres (12m) of the natural gas pipeline.

14. Soil of a depth of at least 1.2 m shall at all times be kept over the natural gas pipeline and a person shall not by digging or excavation on any land within the Scheme Area reduce the depth of soil above the pipeline to less than 1.2 m.

Vehicular Crossings.

15. A vehicular crossing to a lot shall not be situated less than forty metres (40m) from the point at which the centre lines of two paved carriageways or the prolongations thereof would intersect.

16. Where a lot fronts or abuts both a major road shown on the Scheme Map and another road there shall be no vehicular access to or egress from such lot from or to or by means of the major road.

Special Area.

17. On each lot within the Special Area shown on the Scheme Map all buildings to be erected thereon shall be erected so that the front of the building is at right angles to one of the side boundaries of the lot and shall not be erected in any other position.

18. Unless in any particular case the Council decides otherwise the portion of a lot having an irregular shape or being one to which clause 40 of City of Canning Town Planning Scheme No. 16 Zoning Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th October, 1973, and amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the Zoning Scheme") applies to be planted with lawns or gardens pursuant to Clause 47 of the Zoning Scheme shall not be less than the portion of a

rectangular lot of the same area as such lot having the same depth from the road and having not more than two crossing places each of six metres (6m) in width so to be planted.

Scheme Costs.

19. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as "Scheme Costs":—

- (a) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (b) All other costs and expenses which the Council is required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme,

but does not include the Council's solicitors' costs relative to the preparation of this Scheme Text.

Payment of Scheme Costs.

20. The Scheme Costs shall be paid to the Council by the owner upon or before the expiration of three (3) months after notice (which may be given from time to time) by the Council as and when each item of Scheme Costs has been incurred by it.

Powers and Authorities of Council.

21. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council has the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To enter into agreements with the Crown and any department of the State with reference to the carrying out of any of the objects or works of the Scheme.
- (e) To extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.
- (f) To transfer any land owned by it or acquired by it pursuant to the Scheme as compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.

22. Twenty eight (28) days' written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

23. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.

Claims for Compensation.

24. The time within which a person may make a claim for compensation pursuant to section 11 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, is six (6) months after the date when notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in the manner prescribed by the regulations made under that Act.







1. These regulations may be cited as the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection (Spraying Restrictions) Regulations, 1979.

2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

"acid" means a chemical referred to in the Schedule and includes a salt or amine of such an acid;

"Director" means the Director of Agriculture;

"prescribed area" means an area described in regulation 3;

"regulation" means one of the regulations;

"Schedule" means the Schedule to these regulations.

3. The following areas are prescribed areas for the purposes of these regulations—

- (a) any area within 5 kilometres of a place where tomatoes or grapevines are grown for commercial purposes;
- (b) any area within 10 kilometres of a place where tomatoes or grapevines are grown for commercial purposes;
- (c) the area within an imaginary circle having a radius of 19 kilometres with the Geraldton Post Office as its centre;
- (d) the area within an imaginary circle having a radius of 50 kilometres with the Geraldton Post Office as its centre;

- (e) the area within an imaginary circle having a radius of 50 kilometres with the Geraldton Post Office as its centre but outside an imaginary circle having a radius of 19 kilometres with the Geraldton Post Office as its centre;
- (f) King locations 203, 205 to 221 (each location inclusive), 227 to 229 (each location inclusive), 231 to 247 (each location inclusive), 249, 251 to 261 (each location inclusive), 263, 264, 267 to 271 (each location inclusive), 273, 276 to 283 (each location inclusive), 288 to 291 (each location inclusive), 293 to 296 (each location inclusive), 299, 303, 304, 306, 317 to 319 (each location inclusive), and 323;
- (g) all that land bounded by lines starting from the junction of Ida Street and Anzac Terrace in the Shire of Bassendean, extending east to the southeast corner of Swan location 3218; thence north to the southeast corner of Swan location 1339; thence west to the northwest corner of Swan location 277; thence south to the starting point.
4. (1) A person shall not, within any of the prescribed areas described in paragraph (a), paragraph (c), paragraph (f) and paragraph (g) of regulation 3 spray by any means any chemical containing an acid unless he has obtained the prior written approval of the Director.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (1) of this regulation a person shall not within any of the prescribed areas described in paragraph (b), paragraph (c), paragraph (f) or paragraph (g) of regulation 3 spray by any means any ester of an acid.
- (3) A person shall not, within the prescribed area described in paragraph (e), use for any purpose any acid in the form of an ester unless the acid is of a low volatile form of ester approved by the Director.
5. (1) A person shall not within the prescribed area described in paragraph (d) of regulation 3 store any acid in the form of an ester unless—
- (a) the acid is in the form of a low volatile ester approved of by the Director; or
- (b) he has obtained the written approval of the Director.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in subregulation (1) of this regulation a person shall not within any of the prescribed area described in paragraph (c) of regulation 3 store any acid in the form of an ester, unless the acid is in the form of a low volatile ester approved of by the Director.
6. A person shall not within any of the prescribed areas described in paragraph (c), paragraph (f) and paragraph (g) of regulation 3 park, stand or store any vehicle or equipment that is carrying an opened container that—
- (a) has contained or contains an acid in the form of an ester unless the ester is a low volatile form approved by the Director; or
- (b) is contaminated by an acid in the form of an ester unless the ester is a low volatile form approved by the Director.
7. An application to the Director of Agriculture for an approval pursuant to these regulations shall be in writing and shall set out such of the following information as is relevant to the application—
- (a) the approximate area to be sprayed;
- (b) the location of the area to be sprayed;
- (c) the acid and the form of the acid to be used;
- (d) the method of spraying and the equipment to be used;
- (e) the proposed date of spraying; and
- (f) the location of the storage area and the form of ester of the acid stored.
8. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of these regulations commits an offence.

Principal
regulations.

1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960, as reprinted and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th March, 1971 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 40 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted—

40. (1) A principal or teacher shall compile, furnish and maintain such returns and registers as he is required to compile, furnish or maintain according to any instructions relating to returns and registers published in the *Education Circular* from time to time.

(2) A principal or teacher shall not make a false entry in a return or register.

(3) A principal or teacher shall promptly and properly reply to any correspondence connected with his employment and functions as a teacher that is addressed to him.

3. Regulation 134 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted—

134. (1) A teacher who—

- (a) disobeys or disregards a lawful order made or given by or on behalf of the Director-General;
- (b) fails to comply with or contravenes any of the provisions of the Act or these regulations;
- (c) is absent from school without leave;
- (d) whether during his employment as a teacher or not, becomes involved in or advocates any conduct or practice which is contrary to accepted community standards of decency;
- (e) is convicted of an offence against any other Act for which a sentence of imprisonment can be imposed;
- (f) is negligent or careless in the discharge of his duties; or
- (g) is inefficient or incompetent and such inefficiency or incompetency appears to arise from causes within his own control,

is guilty of misconduct and is liable to be dismissed.

(2) where it appears to the Director-General that a teacher is guilty of misconduct the Director-General—

- (a) may instruct a Superintendent to investigate and report upon the matter; and
- (b) shall request the teacher to submit an explanation upon the matter within the time specified in the request.

(3) Where the Director-General receives an explanation given by a teacher pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation, or, where no explanation is given within the time specified in the request made pursuant to that subregulation, and the Director-General is satisfied that the teacher is guilty of misconduct but that dismissal is not an appropriate punishment for the misconduct, the Director-General may by order in writing impose on the teacher one or more of the following punishments—

- (a) a reprimand;
- (b) a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars;
- (c) transfer the teacher at his own expense;
- (d) reduce the teacher's salary grade; or
- (e) reduce the teacher from one position to another carrying a lower salary or remuneration.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in subregulations (2) or (3) of this regulation, where it appears to the Director-General that a teacher is guilty of misconduct and that the misconduct is of

such a nature that none of the punishments that may be imposed on the teacher under subregulation (3) of this regulation are appropriate the Director-General may suspend the teacher and—

(a) may instruct a Superintendent to investigate and report on the matter; and

(b) shall request the teacher to submit an explanation upon the matter within the time specified in the request.

(5) Where the Director-General receives an explanation given by a teacher pursuant to subregulation (4) of this regulation, or, where no explanation is given by a teacher in accordance with a request made to the teacher under that subregulation within the time specified in the request, and the Director-General is satisfied that the teacher is guilty of misconduct and that having regard to the nature of the misconduct none of the penalties prescribed in subregulation (3) of this regulation are appropriate the Director-General shall—

(a) make a report to the Minister on the matter together with his recommendation thereon; and

(b) attach to his report the report (if any) of the Superintendent made pursuant to subregulation (4) of this regulation and any explanation submitted by the teacher thereon.

(6) Where upon considering the report of the Director-General submitted to him pursuant to subregulation (5) of this regulation and any explanation given by a teacher on the report (if any) of the Superintendent under subregulation (4) of this regulation the Minister is satisfied that the teacher is guilty of the misconduct specified in the report the Minister may order in writing that the teacher be dismissed.

(7) An order made by the Minister under subregulation (6) of this regulation shall not have effect unless or until it is confirmed by the Governor.

(8) Subregulation (7) of this regulation does not apply where a delegation to the Minister pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 7 of the Act is in force.

(9) A fine imposed pursuant to this regulation may be recovered—

(a) by deduction from the salary of the teacher; or

(b) in like manner to a fine imposed by a justice under the Justices Act, 1902.
