- (a) that the information as to any prospective employment which might be offered to a person seeking employment and which would, but for the exemption, have had to be given in writing to that person shall be given verbally;
- (b) that upon an engagement being made as to a prospective employment in relation to the person seeking that employment, the "Notice of Employment Offered", duly signed, shall be given or forwarded to the prospective employee as required by that section; and
- (c) that an accurate office record be maintained of all information furnished to a person seeking employment, whether verbally or by a Notice, specifying the details required under the Act.

Metropolitan Sewerage.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 569795/79.

WHEREAS the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1978, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said act have been complied with and the plan in respect of the works herein-after mentioned has been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

City of Melville.

- (a) Rising Main from Cranford Avenue to Scouler Way for Victoria Park Main Pumping Station—Armagh Street.
- (b) Gravity Sewer for Reticulation area Bateman 3F.

Land adjacent to Kwinana Freeway extension in Selway Road, Noalimba Migrant Hostel, Scouler Way.

- (a) A section of a single and duplicate nine hundred and fourteen millimetre outside diameter steel rising main commencing at the corner of Cranford Avenue and Selway Road and proceeding in a general southerly and westerly direction along the eastern then southern side of Selway Road to the western side of Bateman Road; thence southerly across Leach Highway to and across Part Loc. 27 being Vacant Crown Land and continuing in a general southerly direction adjacent to Kwinana Freeway Extension boundary across Part Loc. 27 being Vacant Crown Land to a point on the eastern side of Scouler Way.

- (b) A section of two hundred and thirty millimetre gravity sewer commencing near the centre of Freeth Way opposite Lot 397 and proceeding in a westerly direction under the proposed Kwinana Freeway extension terminating on the eastern side of Selway Road opposite Location 1425 as shown on plan M.W.B. 16380.

Declaration of Area for Differential Rating.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

LG: LG-5-1.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (4) of section 548 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1978, that the Governor may at the request of a council of a municipality by order declare portion of its district to be an area within which the council may impose, in respect of the rateable property therein, a greater rate than that which it imposes elsewhere in the district; And whereas such an order was made and published in the *Government Gazette* of 10th December, 1976, in respect of the municipality of the Shire of Lake Grace; and whereas that municipality has requested that the portion of its district described in Schedules A and B hereto be declared an area within which the council may impose, in respect of the rateable property therein, a greater rate than that which it imposes elsewhere, in lieu of the existing declared area; and whereas it is provided by subsection (2) of section 691 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1978, that a power given to make Orders includes power from time to time to revoke those Orders. Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council does hereby:—

- (i) cancel the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of 10th December, 1976;
- (ii) declare that portion of the district of the municipality of the Shire of Lake Grace, described in Schedules A and B hereto, as an area within which the Lake Grace Shire Council may impose, in respect of the rateable property therein, a greater rate than that which it imposes elsewhere in the district.







By-law Relating to Prevention of Damage to Footpaths
and Road Kerbing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 22nd day of February, 1979, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:—

1. In these By-laws, unless the context requires otherwise, the term—
“Vehicles” includes any vehicle which comes within the interpretation of that expression in the Traffic Act, 1919 and includes a tractor, trailer, bulldozer or any other mobile machinery.

“Specially Constructed Crossing” means a crossing constructed to the specification fixed by resolution of the Council for the use of vehicles and animals over the footpath or unmade portion of the street or way from the paved portion of the street or way to the common boundary of a street or way and land abutting thereon.

2. No person shall drive any vehicle over or across a road kerb or footpath except at a specially constructed crossing place unless with the permission of Council and in accordance with these By-laws.

3. No person shall drive a vehicle or animal or permit a vehicle or animal to be driven over or across a road kerb or a footpath if such vehicle or animal is so heavy, or is of such nature that it causes or is likely to cause damage to the road kerb or the paving of the footpath unless with the permission of the Council and in accordance with these By-laws.

4. Any person who—

- (a) desires to cross a footpath or road kerb with a vehicle or animal at a place not a specially constructed crossing place; or
- (b) proposes to carry out building or other operations necessitating the crossing of, or who desired to cross a footpath or a road kerb with a vehicle or animal which is likely to cause damage to the road kerbing or the paving of a footpath whether at a specially constructed crossing place or not,

shall make application to the Council for permission so to do, specifying the place at which such crossing is to be made.

5. Accompanying each first application shall be a crossing deposit fee to cover costs of possible damage in crossing from the roadway to the lot boundary in accordance with the following schedule:—

- (a) For persons who require only one crossing permit in force at any one time, a deposit of \$100.00.
- (b) For persons who require from two to five crossing permits in force at any one time, a deposit of \$200.00.
- (c) For persons who require six or more crossing permits in force at any one time, a deposit of \$400.00.

The deposit paid is a full deposit on all activities of the applicant within this Shire and the deposit is to be retained by the Council in trust until such time as the applicant ceases operations in this Municipality.

6. These By-laws apply only to those applications received after the promulgation of these By-laws and all applications and deposits paid prior to the coming into operation of these By-laws shall be dealt with in accordance with the practice in operation at the time the application and deposit was made.

7. Temporary Crossings: A person who carries out any building or other operations or works necessitating the crossing of, or who desires to cross a footpath or road kerb with vehicles or animals which cause or are likely to cause damage to the paving of a footpath or road kerb shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) If the paved portion of the footpath shall be constructed of concrete slabs he shall carefully remove them from the footpath for a width of 4.88 m at the proposed crossing and neatly stack them on the adjoining land.
- (b) If required by Council he shall place in the position from which the slabs have been removed a temporary crossing constructed in accordance with subparagraph (d).
- (c) If the paved portion of the footpath shall be constructed in total or in part of bitumen surfaced gravel, gravel, limestone or crushed metal he shall, if required by Council, place in position where the crossing is to be made a temporary crossing constructed in accordance with subparagraph (d).
- (d) The temporary crossing mentioned in subparagraphs (b) and (c) of this By-law shall be constructed 4.88 m wide and of a length equal to the width of the paved portion of the footpath and constructed of hardwood planks of at least 200 mm by 38 mm in section, of which the ends shall be chamfered downwards, securely nailed together with hoop iron straps at 1.219 2 centres. The said planking shall be firmly bedded and laid true to the level of the original footpath.

- (e) When the necessity no longer exists for such temporary crossings or when called upon to do so by notice in writing from the Council, he shall remove the planking, replace the cement slabs in a proper workmanlike manner to original level and line and shall replace with new slabs of equal quality and size any slabs which have been lost, damaged or broken, or in the case of a crossing over a bitumen surfaced gravel, gravel, limestone or crushed metal footpath, remove the planking, clean off the footpath and restore the surface of the crossing to its original condition.
- (f) He shall, until it shall have been removed, keep the temporary crossing in good repair and in such a condition as not to create any danger or obstruction to pedestrians.
- (g) If the site chosen for the proposed temporary crossing fronts a constructed road kerb the Engineer shall have the road kerb removed at the place indicated in the application, or if he does not approve the place indicated, then at a place approved by him.
- (h) When the necessity no longer exists for the temporary crossing the Engineer shall have the road kerb replaced.
- (i) The costs of removal and replacement of the kerb shall be paid by the applicant on demand by the Council.
8. (1) Any person who desires to trench through or under a constructed footpath or a road kerb shall apply in writing to the Council for permission so to do.
- (2) No person shall trench through or under a footpath or road kerb without first obtaining the written consent of the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the written consent of the Council.
- (3) The cost of reinstatement (if any) as a result of works carried out in accordance with By-laws 8 (1) and (2) shall be paid to Council by the applicant on demand.
9. Persons applying for permission to cross a kerb and/or footpath shall make good all damage caused to the road kerbing, guttering, paved road or footpath during the whole of the time the works are in progress. If any damage shall have occurred and shall not have been made good, the Council is authorised to make good such damage and either—
- (a) deduct the cost of such reinstatement from the deposit money paid to the Council in accordance with By-law 5 (a); or
- (b) where deposits have been made in accordance with By-law 5 (b) and (c), submit an account to the applicant for the cost of reinstatement to be paid on demand and retain the original deposit intact.
10. Single Application:—
- If no damage has been caused or if the damage caused has been made good by the applicant, the Council shall on application repay to the applicant the deposit lodged in accordance with By-law 5 (a).
- If damage has been caused and the cost of reinstatement is less than the deposit lodged in accordance with By-law 5 (a), the balance of the money owing to the applicant by Council shall on application be refunded.
- If damage has been caused and the cost of reinstatement exceeds the amount of deposit lodged in accordance with By-law 5 (a), the applicant shall pay to the Council the balance outstanding, on demand.
11. Multiple Applications: When a person or persons having deposited sums in accordance with By-law 5 (b) and (c) and advised the Council that no further applications to build or develop are likely to be made, the deposit held in trust shall be refunded to the applicant.
12. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable, on conviction, to—
- (a) a maximum penalty of \$200.00.
- (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$16.00 per day.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 16th October, 1978, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

Interpretation.

1. In these by-laws the term "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Toodyay.

Part I—Impounding of Dogs.

2. The council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1976-1977 as amended.

3. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other employee authorised by the Council shall if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

4. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

6. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or employee may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of the dog if made in good faith.

7. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 72 hours of its being impounded or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration disc affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 72 hours of the service of a notice upon the owner the pound keeper or other employee authorised by the Council may sell destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog.

8. Upon the sale of a dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.

9. If within the times mentioned in by-law 7 hereof or at any time before the destruction or sale of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fees paid and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.

10. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of sub-section (12) of section 29 of the said Dog Act, 1976-1977 as amended, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the written authority of a registered veterinary surgeon, medical practitioner, or health surveyor.

11. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto.

12. No person shall—

- (a) unless a pound keeper or other employee of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
- (b) destroy, break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
- (c) destroy, break into damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog proof any dog cart vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

13. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1976-1977 as amended or by the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions or by these by-laws.

14. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of the Dog Act, 1976-1977, Dog Act regulations 1976 or these by-laws.

15. The occupier of premises shall not keep or permit or suffer to be kept more than two dogs on any premises unless such premises are licensed as an approved Kennel establishment pursuant to these by-laws.

16. Notwithstanding the provisions of By-law 15 a person wishing to keep more than two dogs but not greater than six dogs on any premises, may seek exemption for those premises under the provisions of section 26 (3) of the Dog Act, 1976-1977.

Part II—Regulations of Dog Kennels.

17. Where the owner or occupier of any premises wishes to keep more than two dogs on the premises at any one time and those premises have not been granted an exemption pursuant to section 26 (3) of the Dog Act, he shall apply to the Council for such premises to be licensed as an approved kennel establishment.

18. The Council may not approve or register a kennel until the occupier of the premises has advertised in a public newspaper his intention to establish a kennel on the premises and the Council has considered written objections to the establishment or maintenance of the kennel on the premises. Approved kennels shall be registered by the Council on receipt of the fees prescribed in the First Schedule and shall be subject to annual review before renewal.

19. The Council may grant or refuse a licence for an approved kennel establishment and if a licence be granted the Council may impose such conditions as it thinks fit. The licence shall specify the place where the dogs may be kept. The licence shall be in the form in the Third Schedule.

20. The registration of a kennel establishment shall remain valid until the 30th June next following the issue thereof, unless it shall be previously revoked, and shall be subject to annual review before renewal.

21. All applications for the renewal of the registration of dog kennels shall be made to the Council during the month of June in each year.

22. The fee payable for the registration of an approved kennel establishment is \$20 per year or part thereof.

23. A person who commits a breach of any of the terms or conditions of a licence to keep dogs commits an offence.

24. Any person being the owner or the occupier of premises which are licensed as a kennel establishment or which are proposed to be licensed shall provide a kennel or kennels which shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 5 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.

- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be any less distance than 30 metres from any road or street, except corner lots which shall be at such distance as decided by Council.
- (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 15 m from any dwelling-house, church, schoolroom, hall, shop or factory.
- (e) The walls shall be constructed of concrete brick stone or wood framing sheeted with asbestos or galvanised iron internally and externally.
- (f) The roof shall be constructed of an approved impervious material.
- (g) All external surfaces of wood, asbestos or galvanised iron shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint.
- (h) The lowest internal height shall be at least 2 m from the floor.
- (i) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 2 m in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood or galvanised link mesh.
- (j) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (k) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface, it shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid and ventilated and trapped. The floor shall have a coved upstand at the junction of the floor and the internal wall surface and in the case of a wooden framed building the bottom plate shall rest on a coved concrete upstand 75 mm above the floor level and the internal wall sheet shall finish a minimum of 25 mm below the bottom of the floor plate. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the Health requirements of the Council.
- (l) The floor of any yard which is floored shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in the next succeeding paragraph.
- (m) For each dog kept thereon every kennel shall have not less than 2 square metres of floor space and every yard shall have not less than 2.3 square metres of floor space.
- (n) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.

25. No kennel shall be erected unless and until plans specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.

Part III—Miscellaneous.

26. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre or picture garden.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) A food shop or other public business premises.

27. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sports ground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (c) A car park.
- (d) A school or in the grounds of a school, pre-school centre or kindergarten.
- (e) A Fauna Reserve.

28. The occupier of any premises other than a registered kennel where a dog is kept or permitted or suffered to remain shall not allow such dog by continuous barking to be nuisance to any inhabitants in the neighbourhood.

29. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred dollars (\$100).

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1978.

Municipality of the Shire of Toodyay.

By-laws for the Management and use of the Toodyay Memorial Hall.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved, on the 19th day of June, 1978 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws—

“building” means and includes any hall, room, corridor, stairway or annexe which is vested in or under the care, control or management of the Council.

“Clerk” means the person for the time being employed by the Council as Shire Clerk or any Acting Shire Clerk, his deputy or any officer authorised by the Council.

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Toodyay.

2. Application for the hire of the building or any portion thereof shall be made in the form prescribed in the First Schedule to these by-laws to the Clerk at the office of the Council not less than 24 hours before the time that such building is required, and shall state the purpose for which the building is required. No tentative bookings are permitted.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the building shall be given in the application for hiring.

4. Hiring of the building shall be at the rates prescribed in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

5. The hours for which the building may be hired shall be: Day: 8 a.m.-7 p.m.; Night: 7 p.m.-2 a.m. A surcharge will be charged for any use continuing after 2 a.m. Hire of the building for use for public entertainment after 2 a.m. on Saturday nights shall be subject to the hirer obtaining written approval from the Department of the Chief Secretary of the Western Australian Government to continue the entertainment after 2 a.m.

6. Any hiring for a purpose not specifically provided for in the Second Schedule to these by-laws shall be calculated on the basis of the purpose which most closely resembles that for which required.

7. If the building is hired for a night time function by one person, and another person wishes to hire the same hall for a day time function, the first mentioned person shall have the right to hire the hall in the day time also at a charge of \$5.

8. The Council may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of engagement.

9. The Council reserves the right by an absolute majority to refuse to let the building to any applicant for the hiring of the same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

10. The Council by an absolute majority may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of the building, and in such case all charges paid shall be refunded.

11. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of the building for the same date and hour the Council may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of the building shall be granted.

12. Nothing in these by-laws shall be construed to prevent the long-term leasing of the building if the Council so deems expedient on whatever terms the Council decides.

13. The Council reserves the right on written application to fix or determine special concessional hire charges not appearing in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

14. The hirer of the building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hirings and use of the building. If, in the opinion of the Council, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the above and all other relevant Acts, the Council may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building. The hirer must accept full responsibility in the event of any dispute arising in connection with the compliance of the provisions necessary under the by-law.

15. In the event of the use of the building being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Council shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

16. No spiritous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, perry, or other alcoholic liquor shall be brought into or consumed in the building except when permitted by the Council in writing, and then only in the terms of the permit. If it is intended to sell liquor, a permit to do so must be obtained.

17. No kegs or barrels of spiritous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, perry, or other alcoholic liquor shall be permitted to be placed within the building except in the foyer and on the stage.

18. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any hall during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said building, whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or private entertainments.

19. No furniture, crockery or equipment shall be removed from the building except with the permission of the Clerk and under the supervision of the caretaker or other person appointed by the Council.

20. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, shall not be allowed to enter any part of the building.

21. No person shall take photographs for profit without the permission of the hirer.

22. No person shall, in any part of the building—
- (a) remain, enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
 - (b) use profane or improper language;
 - (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
 - (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building; (Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damages in addition to any penalty imposed by these by-laws).
 - (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the entrance-halls, exits, or passageways of the building. (Any person doing so shall immediately desist, on being requested to do so by the Clerk or member of the Police Force of Western Australia.)
 - (f) interfere with any electrical or gas fittings, equipment or appliances.
23. No person shall remove the piano from the floor of the Hall to the stage, or vice versa, without the permission of the Council, and when such permission is granted a charge of \$5 shall be payable. On any occasion when the piano is removed from the stage the hirer is responsible for its replacement on the stage.
24. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot or breach of peace, shall be permitted in the building.
25. The hirer of the building shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in the building and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these by-laws, and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, or crockeryware and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Council. Any article of crockeryware not accounted for or in broken or cracked condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.
26. The setting up of tables, trestles and chairs, and the removing and storage of same, shall be the responsibility of the hirer.
27. The hirer shall be responsible for opening and securing the building. Keys may be collected from the Council office during normal office hours 24 hours prior to the function, so long as there are no other bookings, and keys must be returned on the first day the Council office is open for business following the hiring.
28. The driving of nails, tacks, screws or pins etc, into, and the use of adhesive tape or other adhesive material of any description on, any walls, woodwork, furniture, fixtures, fittings, or furnishings of the building is strictly forbidden.
29. Decorations erected for the function shall be attached to the fittings provided in such a manner that damage does not result to the building. All decorations shall be removed from the building and all rubbish or materials therein collected and carted away within 12 hours from the close of any function and the buildings and surrounds left in a clean and tidy state. Any expense incurred by the Council in this respect through neglect of the hirer to comply with the by-law shall be a direct charge against the hirer and such expense shall be paid immediately on demand.
30. All crockery, cutlery, etc. used at any function shall be washed up and the kitchen left in a clean state by the close of or immediately after any function. Any expense incurred in this connection shall be recoverable from the hirer on demand.
31. No kerosene operated appliance shall be brought into the building.
32. (1) The hirer of the building shall—
- (a) maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour therein;
 - (b) make good any damage to the hall building and any loss or damage to the property and equipment hired therewith or situated therein caused during the term of the hiring or at the option of the Council pay to the Council the cost thereof;
 - (c) be responsible for the carrying out of the terms of and the compliance with these by-laws;
 - (d) leave the building and surroundings in a clean and tidy condition after the term of the hiring;
 - (e) remove and place all rubbish in the places so provided in the building, except decoration materials which shall be carted away;
 - (f) at the conclusion of the function turn off all electric light and power and gas stove burners;
 - (g) at the conclusion of the hiring lock all doors, close all windows and return the keys to the Council office; and
 - (h) report any damage, defacement or loss to the Council.
- (2) The provisions of this by-law shall be deemed to be conditions of hiring.

33. The Clerk or police constable shall be permitted free ingress to the building or any part thereof, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these by-laws.

34. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200 for every such offence.
