Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1978.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 211/63; Ex. Co. No. 0178.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1978, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1971, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas the Town of Albany was declared the Albany Fire District; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council does hereby adjust the boundaries of the Albany Fire District so that the boundaries are in accordance with the description set out in the Schedule to this Order.

Schedule "A".

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation easterly of the centre line of Salisbury Road with the centre line of Albany Highway and extending generally southeasterly along the last mentioned centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Rufus Street; thence easterly to and along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Havoc Road, thence northerly to and along that centre line to the centre line of Henry Street; thence easterly along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Chester Pass Road; thence generally southerly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Hudson Road; thence easterly to and along that centre line and onwards to the centre line of Range Road, thence northerly along that centre line to the centre line of Bond Road; thence easterly along that centre line and onwards to the westernmost western boundary of Plantagenet Location 43; thence southerly along that boundary to the centre line of Yakamia Creek (Diversion); thence generally northeasterly downwards along that centre line to the centre line of Lower King Road, thence generally northeasterly and generally northerly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Location 283, thence easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to the High Water Mark of Oyster Harbour; thence generally southerly along that water mark, generally southwesterly along the High Water Mark of King George Sound and generally westerly along the High Water Mark of Princess Royal Harbour

to the prolongation southeasterly of the centre line of a drain reserve passing along the southwestern boundaries of Lot 134 of Location 33 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3571; thence northwesterly to and generally northwesterly along that centre line to a southern side of Robinson Road; thence easterly along that side to the prolongation southerly of the eastern side of Hordern Street; thence northerly to and along that side and onwards to the centre line of Cuning Road; thence westerly along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Balston Road; thence northerly to and generally northerly along that centre line to the prolongation westerly of the centre line of Boundary Street; thence easterly to and along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Darebin Street; thence northerly to and along that centre line to the centre line of Flemington Street; thence easterly along that centre line to the prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of Location 80; thence northerly to and along that boundary and onwards to and along the western side of Marbelup Street to the southern side of Lancaster Road, thence westerly along that side to the prolongation southerly of the centre line of Moncrieff Road; thence northerly to and along that centre line to the centre line of Salisbury Road and thence easterly along that centre line to the starting point.

Constitution Act, 1889.

File No. 2235/78.—Reserve No. 36465 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Toodyay in trust for the purpose of "Cemetery".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the beforementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Extension to Hyden Country Water Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point situate 89 degrees 58 minutes, 10.15 metres from the westernmost southwestern corner of Roe Location 1042, a point on a present northern boundary of Hyden Country Water Area and extending generally northeasterly parallel to and 10 metres from southeastern sides of Lovering Road to the southern boundary of the southeastern severance of Location 3; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that severance and northerly along the western boundary of Location 1040 and onwards to the easternmost southeastern corner of the northwestern severance of Location 3; thence northerly, westerly and southerly along boundaries of that severance to the prolongation northeasterly of a line parallel to and 10 metres northwestward of a northwestern side of Lovering Road; thence southwesterly to and generally southwesterly parallel to and 10 metres from northwestern sides of Lovering Road to the prolongation westerly of the westernmost southern boundary of Location 1042, a point on a present northern boundary of Hyden Country Water Area and thence easterly along that boundary to the starting point, as bordered green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 51725-1-1.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1979.

Metropolitan Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 812331/79.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909-1979, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works, and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and the plan in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned has been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Shire of Rockingham.

900 mm Inlet Water Main to Tamworth Hill Reservoir—Baldvis.

The construction of a nine hundred millimetre water main below ground and approximately three thousand four hundred and ninety-six metres in length complete with valve pits and all other necessary apparatus commencing at the junction of Baldvis Road and Mundijong Road and thence proceeding in a general southerly direction along Baldvis Road to Fifty Road, thence proceeding

in a general westerly direction along Fifty Road to Eighty Road, thence proceeding in a general southwesterly direction along Eighty Road for a distance of one thousand four hundred and forty metres to a point opposite a proposed pipe reserve, thence proceeding in a general southwesterly direction along a proposed pipe reserve within Lot 322 to the Tamworth Hill Reservoir site and terminating thereat, as shown on plan M.W.B. 16345A as amended.

This Order in Council shall take effect from 1st day of February, 1980.

 - (i) after 12.30 p.m.; or
 - (ii) before 2.00 a.m. where the entertainment commenced at a time not later than 11.00 p.m. on the preceding Saturday;

- (c) the holding of sporting events, not being sporting events in relation to the outcome of which betting is lawfully conducted, between 9.00 a.m. and 10.00 p.m.;
- (d) the presentation of entertainment on premises that are licensed premises within the meaning of the Liquor Act, 1970 at such times as the licensee is authorised by his license pursuant to that Act to sell and supply liquor to a person who is not a lodger nor being supplied with a meal;
- (e) the provision of amusement by way of merry-go-rounds, ferris wheels, and other mechanical contrivances in or on which members of the public may ride between 9.00 a.m. and 10.00 p.m.;
- (f) the purposes of an agricultural show within the meaning of the Royal Agricultural Society Act, 1926, held in accordance with that Act, between 9.00 a.m. and 10.00 p.m.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Health Act, 1911, as amended, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of South Perth do hereby order that the Model Health By-laws Series "A" as adopted by the City of South Perth and as amended from time to time pursuant to said Act be now amended as follows:—

PART I—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

By-law 19 is amended by deleting Clause (6) and inserting in its place the following new sub-clause:—

19.(6) The driver of a vehicle upon entry on land set aside by the Council for the purpose of depositing refuse, garbage or rubbish shall make payment of a fee as follows:—

- (a) Per vehicle load of less than 2 tonnes weight arising from premises within the City of South Perth provided that persons who are ratepayers and occupiers and not contractors produce the identification card as issued by the City of South Perth—No Charge.
- (b) Per car load of rubbish arising from premises not within the City of South Perth—\$1.00.
- (c) Per utility depositing rubbish arising from premises not within the City of South Perth or deposited by contractors—\$2.00.
- (d) Per trailer not exceeding 2.4 metres x 1.8 metres depositing rubbish arising from premises not within the City of South Perth or deposited by contractors—\$2.00.
- (e) Per trailer exceeding 2.4 metres x 1.8 metres depositing rubbish arising from premises not within the City of South Perth or deposited by contractors—\$5.00.
- (f) Per vehicle load of more than 2 tonnes and less than 4 tonnes—\$5.00.
- (g) Per vehicle load of more than 4 tonnes and less than 8 tonnes—\$10.00.
- (h) Per vehicle load of more than 8 tonnes—\$20.00.

SHIRE OF DARDANUP.

TOWN PLANNING SCHEME No. 7.

THE Dardanup Shire Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of:

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

1. Preliminary.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Dardanup Town Planning Scheme No. 7 hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the inner edge of the broken border as shown on the maps forming part of the Scheme.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Dardanup (hereinafter referred to as the Council).

1.4 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:

1. Preliminary.
2. Reserved Land.
3. Zones.
4. Non-conforming Uses.
5. General Provisions.
6. Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:

1. Land Use Map.
2. Scheme Map.

1.5 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

Light Industry (Trades) means an industry:

- (a) in which truck drivers, tradesmen, nurserymen and builders may store their materials, tools and equipment and carry out their trade;
- (b) in which a tradesman, nurseryman and builder may display, sell and/or promote their services and goods.

2. Reserved Land—Reservation of Land and Development Thereof.

2.1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

3. Zones.

3.1 The Scheme area is divided into three types of zones set out hereunder:

- (a) Residential.
- (b) Light Industrial.
- (c) Light Industry (Trades).

3.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 3.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the lefthand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table.

3.3 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:

'P' A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
'PS' A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.

'AP' Not permitted unless special approval is given by Council after advertising provided for in Clause 7.2.2 of Scheme No. 3.

'IP' A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.

Where no symbol appears in the Table the use is deemed to be not permitted.

Note: Where a special zone is restricted to one use only, it may be excluded from the columns in Table No. 1 and its use determined from the Map.

Any use not specifically listed in this Table shall be included either in the appropriate use class or special use class at the discretion of the Council.

4. Non-Conforming Use of Land.

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent:

- the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part 2 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereof or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part 3 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under the Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use:

The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under clause 4.3, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

5. General Provisions.

5.1 Within the Scheme area the following conditions shall apply:

- Minimum lot size shall be 4 000 m².
- Each lot shall be responsible for its own water supply and effluent disposal system.
- No vehicular access shall be permitted from the Scheme area onto the roads shown as major roads on the Scheme map unless it is by way of gazetted road reserves.
- No fence within the Scheme area shall be constructed of barbed wire or metal sheeting.
- The Council may site the position of cross-overs within the Scheme area at its discretion.
- On or before the 30th October each year or as directed by Council, each owner within the Scheme area shall clear and dispose of all indigenous and introduced grasses and scrub or materials which in the opinion of the Council are a fire hazard or unsightly or out of character with the environment of the Scheme area.

5.2 Within the area zoned residential within the Scheme area the following conditions shall apply:

- No dwelling house shall be constructed or occupied unless it is within an area zoned residential on the Scheme map.
- No dwelling house shall be built closer than 7.5 m to any road reserve.

- (c) The uniform building by-laws shall be applied to determine all other site restrictions for residential buildings within the Scheme Area.
- (d) All dwellings within the Scheme area shall have external walls constructed of brick unless in the opinion of the Council the design and materials of the proposed dwelling are of a sufficiently high standard to complement and blend in with the environment of the area.
- (e) All dwelling houses within the Scheme area shall prior to occupation be con-

nected to either a functioning bore or a 90 000 litre water storage tank.

5.3 Within the areas zoned Light Industrial within the Scheme area the following conditions shall apply:

- (a) Site conditions, restrictions and requirements shall be in accordance with provisions specified in Table 2 in the Scheme Text. Where a site restraint, condition or requirement is not specified in Table 2, then the provisions of Council's Town Planning Scheme No. 3 or the uniform by-laws shall apply.

- (b) No industrial building, storage yard or industrial waste disposal area shall be within 30 m of any dwelling house.
- (c) Council requires the developer of any industrial building to landscape and/or screen plant 25% of his site to its satisfaction. The Council requires the developer to enter into an agreement ensuring that he will maintain those areas to Council's satisfaction. The Council may require the developer to lodge a bond or bank guarantee to its specification to enable it to carry out any maintenance on the landscaping.

- (d) Council may require the builder to construct the street facade of any Light Industrial building or office of masonry, brick, concrete or other material specified by the Council.

5.4 Within the area zoned Light Industry (Trades) within the Scheme area the following conditions shall apply:

- (a) Site conditions, restraints and requirements shall be in accordance with the provisions specified in Table 3 in the Scheme text. Where a site restraint, condition or requirement is not specified in Table 3 then the provisions of Council's Town Planning Scheme No. 3 or the Uniform By-laws shall apply.

- (b) No industrial building, storage yard or industrial waste disposal shall be within 30 m of any dwelling house or residential zone.
- (c) The Council shall require the developer of any industrial building to landscape and/or screen plant 25% of the site to its satisfaction. Furthermore, Council shall require a 10 m screen planting strip abutting any residential zone to be carried out by the developer. Council may require the developer to enter into an agreement or lodge a bank guarantee or bond, or both, to ensure he will maintain those areas so planted to Council's satisfaction.
- (d) Council may require the builder to construct the street facade of any Trades Industrial building or office of masonry, brick, concrete or other material specified by the Council.

5.5 The Council may exclude any use from the Scheme area which, in its opinion, by way of its disposal system, noise generated, smell, vibration, fumes, smoke vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, waste grit, oil or otherwise will intrude into and/or disrupt the residential environment of the Scheme area.

5.6 Subdivision:

5.6.1 The Scheme Map indicates an acceptable method of subdivision and development of the Scheme area which will enable the principles and concepts embodied in the design to be fulfilled.

The Town Planning Board, after consultation with the Council, may permit departures from the design shown on the Scheme Map if it considers the proposed development to be of a similar standard to that shown, provided that no departure from the design shown on the Scheme Map will be permitted if it will disadvantage or be detrimental to the development of the Scheme area as a whole.

5.6.2 An owner of land within the Scheme area who desires to subdivide his land, either alone or in conjunction with other owners, shall submit a plan of the proposed subdivision in the form of the Scheme Map design or in accordance with the provisions of Clause 5.6.1 to the Town Planning Board as required under the Town Planning Board Regulations, 1962.

5.6.3 Once the Scheme area has been subdivided in whole or in part in accordance with the Scheme map or Clause 5.6.1, further subdivision of the subdivided Scheme area will only be permitted if the Town Planning Board, after consultation with the Council, consider the subdivision to be of a minor nature.

6. Finance and Administration.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part 2 shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

6.5 Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council in the use of its discretionary powers under the Scheme may appeal in accordance with Part 5 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the regulations made thereunder.

6.6 Scheme Costs:

6.6.1 The following Scheme requirements are deemed to be mutually required by all persons subdividing within the Scheme area. Therefore they become a Scheme cost and are to be paid proportionally by all parties subdividing within the Scheme area.

- (a) The costs incurred in the preparation and adoption of this Scheme.

6.6.2 The Scheme costs shall be met in the first instance as follows:

- (a) By the person initiating or authorising the Scheme costs.

6.6.3 After the Scheme costs have initially been paid in accordance with Clause 6.6.2, each person applying to the Town Planning Board to subdivide all or any part of the Scheme area shall pay to the person who has paid the Scheme cost as the first instance the proportion of that cost required under Clause 6.6.1 hereof and assessed under Clause 6.6.4 and 6.6.5 hereof prior to the Town Planning Board endorsing its consent upon such plan of subdivision.

6.6.4 The method of apportioning Scheme costs shall be on the basis of the proportion that a person's total land within the Scheme area bears to the Scheme area.

6.6.5 The Scheme cost payable by the parties responsible thereto shall be that proportion of the finished contract or Scheme cost together with interest thereon at the rate of eight per centum (8%) per annum from the time of expenditure until payment.

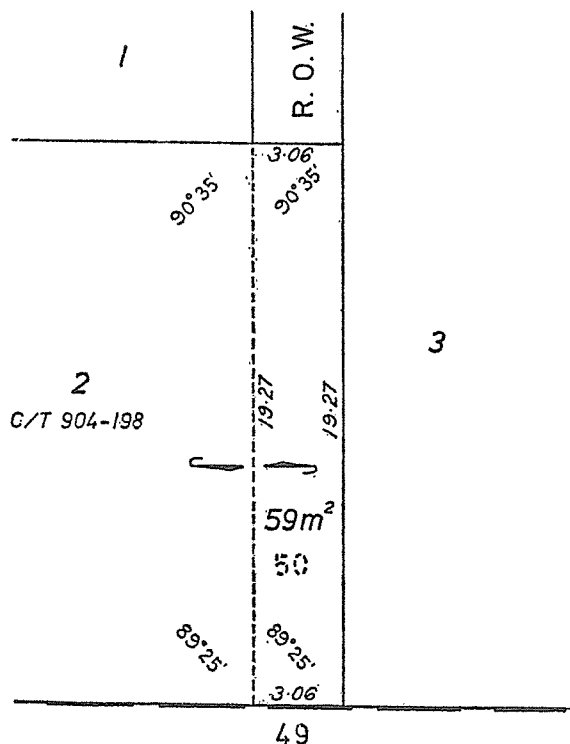

Use of costume—10c per day or admission.

Hire of Locker—20c per day.

The Municipality of the Town of Kwinana.

By-law Relating to Standing Orders.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 27th day of June, 1979 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-law:—

Repeal.

The By-laws relating to Standing Orders, as published in the *Government Gazette* No. 103 of the 10th December, 1964 and as amended in *Government Gazette* No. 72 of 30th July, 1970 are hereby repealed.

Standing Orders.

(1) The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to this By-law, the clauses of which shall be referred to as "the Standing Orders".

Interpretation.

(2) In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—"Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended). "clause" means a clause of this By-law.

Mayor to Preside.

(3) The Mayor, if present shall preside at all meetings of the Council and in his absence, or if, after being present, he retires, the Deputy Mayor shall preside, but if he is not present, or if after being present, retires, then one of the Councillors chosen by the Councillors there present shall preside.

Quorum.

(4) (1) At any meeting of the Council, a quorum shall consist of such number as conforms to the provisions of section 173 of the Act.

(2) Subject to clause 5, every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as a quorum is constituted.

Absence of Quorum.

(5) If at any meeting a quorum be not present within half an hour after the time appointed for that meeting, the Mayor or in his absence the majority of the Councillors present, or any one Councillor, if only one be present, or the Clerk if no Councillor be present, may adjourn the meeting to any date not later than seven days from the date of the adjournment.

(6) If at any time during any meeting of the Council a quorum is not present the Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of that period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out and the Mayor shall adjourn it to some future date.

(7) At any meeting at which there is not a quorum of members present, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Open Doors—Except as Provided.

(8) (1) The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors except upon such occasions as the Council may by resolution otherwise decide.

(2) Upon the carrying of such a resolution as is mentioned in subclause (1) of this clause, the Mayor shall direct all persons other than Councillors and servants of the Council to leave the Council Chambers and every person shall forthwith comply with such direction.

(3) Any person failing to comply with a direction made pursuant to subclause (2) of this clause may, by order of the Mayor, be removed from the Council Chambers.

(4) After the carrying of a resolution made under subclause (1) of this clause the business of that meeting of the Council shall proceed behind closed doors until the Council by resolution decides to proceed with open doors.

(5) While a resolution made under subclause (1) of this clause is in force the operation of clause 26 shall be suspended unless the Council, by resolution, otherwise decides.

(6) Any resolution mentioned in this clause may be moved without notice.

Disturbance by Strangers.

(9) (1) A person, not being a Councillor, shall not at any meeting of the Council interrupt the proceedings of the Council.

(2) Any person interrupting the proceedings of the Council shall, when so directed by the Mayor, forthwith leave the Council Chambers.

(3) Any person who, being ordered to leave the Council Chambers, fails to do so may, by order of the Mayor, be removed from the Council Chambers.

Order of Business at Ordinary Meeting.

(10) The order of business at an ordinary meeting of the Council shall, unless for the greater convenience of the Council altered by resolution to that effect, be as nearly as practicable as follows, that is to say:—

(i) Declaration of Interest.

(ii) Confirmation of Minutes.

(iii) Business arising out of minutes.

(iv) Correspondence.

(v) Petitions.

(vi) Notice of Motions.

(vii) Reports—

(a) Committee.

(b) Officers.

(c) Delegates.

(viii) Questions on notice (without discussion).

(ix) Announcements by the Mayor (without discussion).

Order of Business at Special Meeting.

(11) The order of business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which that business stands in the notice of the meeting.

Confirmation of Minutes.

(12) The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether of an ordinary or a special meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as business at a meeting of the Council in order to proceed to their confirmation and discussion, other than discussion as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings shall not be permitted and when confirmed, the minutes shall thereupon be signed by the Mayor in accordance with Section 188 of the Act.

Questions.

(13) A Councillor may, with the consent of the Mayor, ask questions relating directly to a matter then under consideration. Such questions shall be concise and may only be asked by a Councillor who has not previously spoken on the subject; but questions may be submitted before a motion is moved and the questioner shall not be deemed to have spoken on the matter.

(14) Any Councillor desirous of asking a question on a matter not embraced on the Agenda Paper shall give notice in writing thereof, to the Clerk at least (10) ten ordinary office hours before the hour fixed for the commencement of the meeting. Every such question and answer shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Reception of Correspondence.

(15) Discussion shall not be permitted on any motion that any correspondence be received or not received, or that any correspondence or any part thereof be referred to any Committee of the Council.

Notices of Motion.

(16) (1) A Councillor may bring forward at a meeting such business as he considers advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice has been given in writing to the Clerk, either at the last previous meeting or at any time thereafter being not less than seven clear days before the meeting at which it is brought forward.

(2) Every notice of motion shall relate to some questions affecting the constitution, administration, or condition of the municipality or the Council.

(3) The Mayor shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with subclause (2) of this clause.

(17) Every such motion as is mentioned in clause 16 shall lapse, unless—

(a) The Councillor who gave notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, is present to move the motion when called on; or

(b) the Council on a motion agrees to defer consideration of the motion to a later stage or date.

Deputations.

(18) (1) Any person or persons wishing to be received as a deputation by the Council shall, in the first instance, send to the Clerk a memorial, setting out in concise terms the subject matter to be raised by the deputation.

(2) Where the Clerk receives a memorial in terms of this clause, he shall lay the memorial—

(a) before the Committee concerned; or

(b) where there is no Committee concerned, before the Mayor.

(3) A Committee or the Mayor receiving a memorial in terms of this clause may either receive the deputation or lay the memorial before the Council.

(4) Where a memorial is laid before the Council under subclause (3) of this clause, the Council may, if it so resolves, receive the deputation.

(19) A deputation shall not exceed five in number and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee, until the deputation has withdrawn.

Councillors to Address Mayor.

(20) (1) Any Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor.

Point of Order.

(2) A Councillor who is addressing the Mayor shall not be interrupted except upon a point of order, in which event he shall resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, whereupon the Councillor so interrupted may, if permitted, proceed.

(3) A Councillor rising to express a difference of opinion with, or to contradict, a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order.

(4) A violation of any provision of these Standing Orders is a breach of order.

Substance of Motion to be Stated.

(21) Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state its substance before he addresses the Council thereon concisely and, if so required by the Mayor shall put the motion or amendment in writing.

Motion and Amendments to be Seconded.

(22) (1) A motion or amendment shall not be discussed or put to the vote of Council unless seconded and a Councillor seconding a motion may at that time declare his intention of speaking on the motion at a later time in the debate; but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

(2) A nomination to the position of Mayor or Deputy Mayor is not required to be seconded.

Titles to be Used.

(23) A speaker, in referring to any other present, shall designate him by the title of Mayor or Councillor, as the case may be.

Priority of Speaking.

(24) Where two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide who of them is entitled to priority.

(25) Whenever the Mayor rises during a debate any Councillor then speaking or offering to speak shall sit down and the Council shall be silent so that the Mayor may be heard without interruption.

Speaking Twice.

(26) Except where this clause is suspended under clauses 8 or 27, a Councillor shall not speak twice on the same question except—

(a) in reply, upon an original motion of which he was the mover;

(b) in reply, upon an amendment last debated of which he was the mover; or

(c) by way of personal explanation.

(27) The Council may, by resolution moved without notice, suspend the operation of clause 26 hereof and thereupon such clause shall be suspended until such time as the Council shall, by similar resolution, otherwise decide.

Personal Explanation.

(28) A Councillor making a personal explanation shall confine it to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood and to the explanation itself, and shall not advert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose nor seek to strengthen his former argument by new matter or by replying to other Councillors.

(29) The Mayor shall forthwith call to order any Councillor committing a breach of clause 26.

No Speech after Certain Events.

(30) No Councillor shall speak on any motion or amendment—

(a) after the mover has replied; or

(b) after the question has been put.

Mover or Seconder has Spoken.

(31) A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment is deemed to have spoken thereon.

Limit of Speeches.

(32) (1) A Councillor shall not speak upon any motion or amendment or make a personal explanation, or in reply for a longer period than five minutes without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate.

(2) An extension shall not be permitted under this clause beyond a total of ten minutes.

Speaking in Reply.

(33) A Councillor speaking in reply shall not introduce any new matter but shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Divisions of Motions.

(34) The Mayor may, at his discretion, or the Council may, by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of two or more motions.

Withdrawal of Motions.

(35) A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate; and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon the motion or amendment after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal unless that permission is refused.

Production of Documents.

(36) On giving to the Clerk not less than ten ordinary office hours notice, a member of the Council shall be entitled to have laid on the Council table, for the duration of a meeting, any document or record of the Council, and the Clerk, on receiving that notice, shall lay the document on the Council table at the commencement of the meeting.

No Digression.

(37) A Councillor shall not speak otherwise than upon, or digress from the question then before the Council, except to make a personal explanation.

No Adverse Reflection on Council.

(38) A Councillor shall not reflect adversely upon a resolution of the Council except on a motion that the resolution be rescinded.

No Adverse Reflection on Councillor.

(39) A Councillor shall not reflect adversely upon the character or actions of another member nor impute any motive to a member, unless the Council resolves, without debate, that the question then before the Council cannot otherwise be adequately considered.

(40) Any member may require the Clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon their being used.

Demand for Withdrawal.

(41) If any Councillor commits a breach of clause 38 or 39, the Mayor may require him unreservedly to withdraw any offending comment and to make a satisfactory apology; and, if the Councillor declines or neglects to do so, the Mayor may direct such Councillor to cease speaking and resume his seat and may call on the next speaker.

Disturbance by Councillors.

(42) A Councillor shall not make any noise or disturbance or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud, while any other person is addressing the Council.

Continued Irrelevance, etc.

(43) The Mayor may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Councillor and may direct that Councillor, if speaking to discontinue his speech and thereupon the Councillor shall cease speaking and shall resume his seat.

(44) When the Mayor is putting any question, a Councillor shall not walk out of or across the Chamber; and shall not, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the chair.

(45) The Mayor shall preserve order and may call any Councillor to order, whenever, in his opinion, there is cause for so doing.

(46) Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Councillor; or to draw the attention of the Mayor to any matter of which the latter may take notice under clause 43.

Rulings by Mayor.

(47) The Mayor, when deciding a point of order or practice, shall give his decision; argument or comment shall not be permitted thereon and his decision shall be final, in that particular case, unless a majority of the Councillors then present shall, upon motion made forthwith, without discussion, dissent therefrom.

(48) Whenever the Mayor has decided that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Council is out of order, it shall be rejected; and whenever anything said or done in the Council, by any Councillor, is similarly decided to be out of order, that Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction or apology, as the case may require.

Continued Breach of Order.

(49) Where a Councillor persists in any conduct which the Mayor decides is out of order, or refuses to make any explanation, retraction or apology required by the Mayor under clause 48, the Mayor may direct that Councillor to refrain from taking any further part in the then meeting of the Council other than by recording his vote; and the Councillor shall comply with such direction.

Serious Disorder.

(50) (1) If at a meeting of the Council the Mayor is of opinion that by reason of disorder or otherwise the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, whereafter the Council shall re-assemble and decide whether business is to be proceeded with; and that question shall be decided forthwith and without debate.

(2) Where after any proceeding under subclause (1) of this clause, the Mayor is again of opinion that the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may close the meeting.

All Councillors to Vote.

(51) (1) At every meeting of the Council, except where the Act otherwise provides, every Councillor present shall vote and if any Councillor who is entitled to vote fails to vote, the Mayor shall call upon him to vote.

(2) The Mayor, if elected by the electors, shall not vote unless there is an equal division of votes, in which case he has and may exercise a casting vote but if the Mayor is elected by the Council, he has and shall exercise a deliberative vote only.

Subject to this clause a question arising at a meeting of a Council shall be determined by a majority of the valid votes of the members of the Council present at the meeting, but where there is an equal division of votes the question shall be determined in the negative.

Permissible Motions During Debate.

(52) (1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause, when a motion is under debate, no further motion shall be moved except a motion—

- (a) that the motion be amended;
- (b) that the Council do adjourn;
- (c) that the debate be adjourned;
- (d) that the question be now put;
- (e) that the Council do proceed with the next business;
- (f) that the Council do sit behind closed doors; or
- (g) that the meeting be now closed.

(2) Where the question before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee of the Council, a Councillor may move without notice that the question be referred back to the Committee; and on any such motion, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak, other than formally to second and the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or in his absence a member thereof, may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

Amendments to Relate to Motion.

(53) Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

(54) Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.

(55) (1) Only one amendment shall be discussed at a time, but as often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote, except that where an amendment is carried, one further amendment to the original motion, as amended, and no more, may be moved.

(2) In speaking to an amendment a Councillor may give notice of his intention to move a further amendment.

(56) Where an amendment is carried, the original motion as amended shall, for all purposes of subsequent debate and subject only to clause 55, be treated as an original motion.

That Council Adjourn.

(57) (1) A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn and that motion shall state the time and date to which the adjournment is to be made.

(2) On a motion to adjourn, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and the mover of the motion (if any) which was then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

(58) Where a motion for the adjournment of the Council is negatived, no similar motion shall be moved until the question then under discussion or the next on the notice paper or any other which may be allowed precedence shall have been disposed of.

(59) (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council shall not move the adjournment of the Council.

(2) A Councillor shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

(60) On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall be continued immediately upon the Council resuming after the adjournment.

(61) On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject, but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

(62) The Mayor may at any time adjourn the Council to such time and date as the motion specifies, or where no time and date is specified to such time and date as he shall then declare.

That Debate be Adjourned.

(63) (1) A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move, without notice, that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same meeting or to a subsequent meeting of the Council.

(2) On a motion that the debate be adjourned, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and no other debate shall be allowed; but if the question then before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee, the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or, in his absence, a member thereof may speak for not more than five minutes.

(64) (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then under debate shall not move the adjournment of the debate.

(2) A Councillor shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the same debate.

(65) On resuming an adjourned debate the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

(66) On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate and they shall not be permitted to speak on any resumption of the debate on that subject, but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

(67) Where the debate on any motion, moved and seconded, is interrupted by the Council being counted out, that debate may, on motion with notice, be resumed at the next meeting, at the point where it was so interrupted.

That Question be Put.

(68) A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move, without notice and without comment that the question under consideration be now put, and upon that motion being formally seconded, the same shall immediately be put, without debate.

(69) A motion that the question under consideration be put shall not be moved by a Councillor who has already spoken on the question.

(70) When it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put, but subject thereto, the question shall at once be put.

(71) Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question be put, the question to be so put includes the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

That Council Proceed with Next Business.

(72) A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor move, without notice and without comment, that the Council do proceed with the next business and upon that motion being formally seconded, it shall be immediately put, without debate.

(73) A motion that Council proceed with the next business shall not be moved by a Councillor who has already spoken on the question under consideration.

(74) Where the Council decides to proceed with the next business, the question which was then under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

(75) During the same debate on any question, a motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be moved within one hour after a similar motion has been negatived.

That Meeting be Closed.

(76) (1) A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business move without notice, that the meeting of the Council be now closed.

(2) On a motion that the meeting of the Council be closed, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and the mover of the motion (if any) then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes; but no other debate shall be allowed.

(77) If a motion that the meeting of the Council be closed is negatived, a similar motion shall not be moved until after the question then under discussion or the next on the notice paper or any other which may be allowed precedence has been disposed of.

(78) (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council shall not move that the meeting be closed.

(2) A Councillor shall not at the same meeting of the Council, move or second more than one motion that the meeting be closed.

(79) On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall stand adjourned to its place on the notice paper for the next meeting of the Council.

(80) On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration up to the closing of the meeting and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject; but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

Confidential Business.

(81) Every matter dealt with by, or brought before the Council sitting otherwise than with open doors, or any Committee of the Council, shall be treated as strictly confidential, and shall not without the authority of the Council or of the Committee (as the case may be) be disclosed to any person other than the Mayor, Councillors or servants of the Council (and in the case of servants only so far as may be necessary for the performance of their duties) prior to the discussion of that matter at a meeting of the Council held with open doors. Provided also that the Council may at its discretion receive a deputation in confidence.

Motions Affecting Expenditure.

(82) Where a motion or amendment would have the effect of incurring expenditure not provided for in the estimates, that motion or amendment shall not be moved other than in the form of a reference of the question to the Finance and General Purposes Committee, unless the motion includes a specific compensatory adjustment to the budget.

Rescission of Resolution.

(83) A resolution of any meeting of the Council shall not be revoked, rescinded, or altered at the same time or any subsequent meeting, except in the manner provided by Section 177 of the Act.

Negatived Motions.

(84) A motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Council shall not again be entertained within a period of three months, except with the consent of an absolute majority of the Council.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

(85) In cases of urgent necessity, any Standing Order of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded, but that motion shall not be declared carried, unless an absolute majority of the Council, or a two-thirds majority of those present and voting on the question, whichever is the lesser number, have voted in favour of the motion.

(86) Any Councillor moving the suspension of a Standing Order shall state the object of the motion, but discussion shall not otherwise take place thereon.

Method of Taking Vote.

(87) The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question, first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion as to whether the affirmative or the negative has the majority on the voices or by a show of hands.

(88) (1) The result of voting openly is determined on the count of raised hands, but may be determined on the voices unless a member of the Council calls for a show of hands and upon a vote on the voices or on a show of hands being taken, a Councillor may call for a division.

(2) Where a division is taken, the procedure laid down in subsections (11) and (12) of Section 173 of the Act shall be observed.

Committees.

(89) (1) In addition to such Occasional Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be Standing Committees of the Council, namely:—

- (a) Finance and General Purposes.
- (b) Health, Buildings and Town Planning.
- (c) Works, Parks and Gardens.
- (d) Such other Standing Committees as may be appointed by the Council.

(2) Each Standing Committee shall comprise not less than three or more than four members inclusive of the Mayor where he indicates his intention of being a member of such Committee.

(3) Subject to subclause (4) of this clause, the members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed for each year, at the first meeting of the Council held after the annual election and shall hold office until the first Sunday after the fourth Saturday in May in the next succeeding year. Each Committee shall be elected separately.

(4) The Council may, by resolution carried pursuant to a notice of motion by a simple majority, or on a motion moved without notice, by an absolute majority, change the membership of any Committee.

(5) In the event of equality of votes for two or more Councillors in an election for member of a Committee, the question shall be determined in the negative.

(90) (1) Subject to any resolution of the Council passed after the coming into operation of these Standing Orders, the duties of Standing Committees shall be:—

- (a) Finance and General Purposes Committee, the oversight of—
 - (i) Finances of the Council;
 - (ii) Items of expenditure recommended by any Committee;
 - (iii) Estimates of receipts and payments for each financial year;

- (iv) Loans;
 - (v) Libraries;
 - (vi) Formulation of Council Policies;
 - (vii) Council's staff;
 - (viii) Office machines and equipment;
 - (ix) Dog Control;
 - (x) Caretaking, cleaning, maintenance and hiring where applicable, of buildings of every kind.
 - (xi) Hiring of recreation reserves.
 - (xii) Out of School Child Care other than child minding centre services and kindergartens;
 - (xiii) Community recreation programmes and events.
 - (xiv) Purchase and maintenance of recreation equipment.
 - (xv) Community Recreation Council Equipment Pool and
 - (xvi) Any matter which the Council or the Town Clerk may decide to refer.
- (b) Health Building and Town Planning Committee, the oversight of—
- (i) All matters relating to public health.
 - (ii) Pollution control and protection of the environment.
 - (iii) Construction of new municipal buildings.
 - (iv) Town Planning development and zoning
 - (v) Hawkers and stalls.
 - (vi) Sanitation services other than refuse.
 - (vii) The issues of licences to build.
 - (viii) Child minding centre administration.
 - (ix) Kindergartens.
 - (x) Tourism and
 - (xi) Any matter which the Council, or the Town Clerk may decide to refer.
- (c) Works, Parks and Gardens Committee, the oversight of—
- (i) Construction and maintenance of roads, paths, trees and street furniture.
 - (ii) Construction and development works other than buildings on recreation and other reserves.
 - (iii) Construction and maintenance of jetties.
 - (iv) Signs.
 - (v) Street lighting.
 - (vi) Purchase and maintenance of plant machinery, equipment and furnishings other than library recreation and office equipment and furnishings.
 - (vii) Pounds administration.
 - (viii) Private and school grounds works.
 - (ix) Refuse removal and disposal services.
 - (x) Quarries and excavations.
 - (xi) Bush Fire prevention and control, and
 - (xii) Any matter which the Council or the Town Clerk may decide to refer.
- (2) Any Standing Committee may make a recommendation to the Finance & General Purposes Committee concerning an appointment to the official staff or an applicant whose principal duties pertain to matters, the oversight of which has been entrusted by the Council to the former Standing Committee, and where the Finance & General Purposes Committee does not accept that recommendation, it may be made to the Council.

Occasional Committees.

- (91) (1) The Council may appoint Occasional Committees to perform any duty which may be lawfully entrusted by it to a committee.
- (2) An Occasional Committee may comprise any number of members not exceeding the largest minority of the total number of members.
- (3) A Standing Committee shall not interfere in any matter which has for the time being been entrusted to an Occasional Committee.
- (4) An Occasional Committee shall not be appointed except on a motion setting out—
- (a) the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Committee; and
 - (b) either—
 - (i) the names of the Councillors who with the Mayor are intended to constitute the Committee; or
 - (ii) the number of Councillors intended to constitute the Committee and a provision that they be elected by a separate motion.
- (5) Where the members of an Occasional Committee are elected by a motion then, in the event of an equality of votes, the question shall be determined in the negative.

Calling Committee Meetings.

(92) The Clerk shall call a meeting of any Standing Committee at least once each Calendar month and also when requested to do so by the Mayor or the Chairman or any two members of that Committee.

(93) Except in so far as they limit the number of times a member may speak or require meetings to be conducted with open doors, these Standing Orders shall be observed at meetings of committees; but the Chairman of a Committee may have and exercise both a deliberative and, in the case of equality of votes, a casting vote.

Quorum of Committees.

(94) (1) At any meeting of a Committee, a quorum shall consist of such number of members of each Committee as shall be determined by Council from time to time but a quorum shall not consist of less than half the members of a Committee.

(2) Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as a quorum is constituted; but if a quorum is lacking fifteen minutes after the appointed time of the meeting, the meeting shall lapse.

Minutes of Committees.

(95) (1) Each Standing Committee shall cause to be kept a minute book in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions.

(2) The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting of the Committee and shall be signed by the Chairman thereof.

Representation on Public Bodies.

(96) Wherever it becomes necessary to appoint a Councillor on a public body or a State instrumentality, notice of the necessity to make that appointment shall be given at the meeting of the Council immediately preceding the meeting at which it is intended to make the appointment.

Meetings of Electors.

(97) (1) The Standing Orders apply, so far as is practicable, to any meeting of electors, but where there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this by-law and the provisions of Section 171, of the Act, the latter prevails.

(2) A person who is not an elector is not entitled to vote at a meeting of electors, and he may not take any part in any discussion at that meeting, unless the meeting, by a motion requests him to do so.

Meetings of Ratepayers.

(98) (1) The Standing Orders apply, so far as is practicable to any meeting of ratepayers, but where there is inconsistency between the provisions of this by-law and the provisions of Section 171 of the Act, the latter prevails.

(2) A person who is not a ratepayer is not entitled to vote at a meeting of ratepayers, and he may not take any part in any discussion at that meeting unless the meeting, by a motion, requests him to do so.

Enforcement.

(99) The Mayor is authorised and required to enforce these Standing Orders, and may prosecute for any breach thereof.

DOG ACT, 1976-1977.

The Municipality of the Shire of Wanneroo.

By-laws Relating to Dog Kennels.

By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the twenty-fifth day of July, 1978, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Wanneroo by-laws relating to Dog Kennels.
2. The by-laws relating to Dogs published in the *Government Gazette* of 2nd May, 1972, and amended in the *Government Gazette* of 8th November, 1974, are further amended by revoking Part II—Regulation of Dog Kennels, by-laws 17 to 22 (inclusive).

Part I—Preliminary.

3. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires:

“Act” means the Dog Act, 1976;

“Commercial area” means any land situated within a commercial zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Wanneroo;

“Industrial area” means any land situated within an industrial zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

“Residential area” means any land situated within a residential area zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

“Rural area” means any land situated within a rural zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

“Town Planning Scheme” means Shire of Wanneroo Town Planning Scheme No. 1 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th September, 1972 and amended from time to time (including amendments made after the date of coming into operation of these by-laws) or any other town planning scheme or by-laws made by the Council for the time being in force.

Expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them by the Act.

Part II—Keeping of Dogs.

4. A person shall not keep or permit to be kept on any premises more than—
 - (a) two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated within a residential area, a commercial area or an industrial area; or
 - (b) six dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated within a rural area;unless the premises are licenced as an approved kennel establishment or have been granted exemption pursuant to section 26 (3) of the Act.
5. A person shall not erect or keep a kennel establishment—
 - (a) on any land that is not situated within the area described in the First Schedule to these by-laws; and
 - (b) unless plans and specifications of and a location plan showing the proposed location site for the kennel establishment and the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council.
6. An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall—
 - (a) be in writing;
 - (b) be in or substantially in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws; and
 - (c) be supported by evidence that due notice of the proposed use of the land has been given to owners/occupiers of properties which either adjoin and/or are within 400 metres of the boundaries of the proposed kennel establishment.
7. The fee payable for the issue of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the Third Schedule.
8. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Fourth Schedule.
9. The fee payable for the renewal of a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the Third Schedule.
10. A person who conducts an approved kennel establishment shall not keep or permit to be kept thereon more than the number of dogs specified in the licence or dogs of a breed different to the breed or breeds (if any) specified in the licence without the written consent of the Council.
11. Dogs in an approved kennel establishment shall be kept in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question, sited and maintained in accordance with the requirements of public health, sufficiently secured and having specifications of a standard not less than the following:
 - (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto.
 - (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 15 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
 - (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 24 metres from the front road or street.
 - (d) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance of not less than 10 metres from any dwelling house.
 - (e) External walls and partition walls between kennels under the same roof shall be constructed of single brick or any other material which has a sound reduction indice of not less than 30 dB(A).
 - (f) Each partition wall shall extend past the kennel opening by not less than 1.5 metres.
 - (g) The roof shall be constructed of corrugated asbestos and also lined with asbestos with a minimum airspace between of 75 mm filled with fibreglass wool, or similar sound absorbent blanket or mat. The roof and lining shall be completely sealed to external and partition walls. The Council may permit the use of other materials or methods of construction of the roof and lining if the material has a sound reduction indice of not less than 30 dB(A).
 - (h) Each enclosed sleeping kennel shall be fitted with a door with sufficient ventilation openings and the door shall be kept closed at night.
 - (i) The lowest internal height shall be at least 1.8 metres from the floor.
 - (j) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 1.8 metres in height constructed of galvanised link mesh.

- (k) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.
- (l) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100. The entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped. All floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.
- (m) The floor of any yard shall be constructed in the same manner as the floor of any kennel and as provided in the last preceding paragraph.
- (n) For each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 1.8 square metres of floor space and every yard not less than 2.5 square metres.
- (o) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleaned and disinfected when so ordered by an Officer of the Council.

Part III—Penalties.

12. (1) A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the requirements of these by-laws commits an offence against these by-laws.

(2) A person who commits an offence against these by-laws is liable to a maximum penalty of—

- (a) \$25 for a first offence;
- (b) \$50 for a second offence;
- (c) \$100 for a third and each subsequent offence.

First Schedule.

Prescribed Dog Kennel Areas.

All that portion of land bounded by the following and commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the Shire of Wanneroo at the southeast corner of Swan Location 1866, then west along its southern boundary to the eastern boundary of Swan Location 1739, then south to the southeast corner of Swan Location 2314, and west along the southern boundary, then north to the southwest corner of Swan Location 2311, and along its southern boundary, then north to the southeast corner of Swan Location 2316, and west along its southern boundary to the eastern boundary of Lot 1, then south to its southeast corner and west along the southern boundary to the road reserve alignment of Rousset Road, then south down Rousset Road to the southern boundary of Swan Location Part 3144, then west along its southern boundary to the southwest corner of Swan Location Part 3144, then northeast and north along its western boundary and east along the south side of Neaves Road road reserve on the northern boundaries of Swan Location 3144, Lot 1, Part Swan Location 5373, Part 5552, 2316, 2311, 1739, 1866 and 1584 to the northeast corner of Swan Location 1584, then south along the eastern boundary of Swan Location 1584 and 1866 to the point of commencement; and

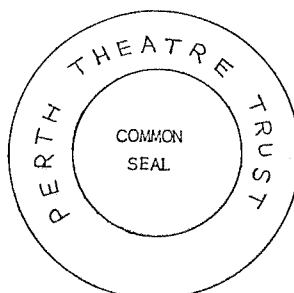
