The construction of a five hundred millimetre nominal diameter steel water main below ground and approximately five hundred and seventy metres in length complete with valve pits and all other necessary apparatus commencing in Darlington Road and thence proceeding in a westerly direction along a proposed pipe easement across reserve  $\uparrow$  A6922 to Mount Street and thence continuing in a westerly direction along Mount Street to Waylen Road, thence proceeding in a northerly direction along Waylen Road to Camfield Road and terminating thereat, as shown on plan M.W.B. 17349.

## NOISE ABATEMENT ACT 1972.

## NOISE ABATEMENT (TREE CHIPPING) EXEMPTION ORDER 1981.

P.H.D. 87/73/V2; Ex. Co. 1868.

MADE by the Minister for Health, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Noise Abatement (Tree chipping) Exemption Order 1981.

City of South Perth tree chipping machine exempted. 2. All of the provisions of the Noise Abatement Act 1972 and regulations made under that Act are declared not to apply for a period up to and including 31 October 1981 in respect of the operation by or on behalf of the City of South Perth of a tree chipping machine.

Conditions. 3. The exemption granted in clause 2 of this Order is subject to the conditions set out in the schedule to this Order.

## Schedule.

1. At no time during the chipping process shall the level of sound emanating from the tree chipping machine exceed 90 dB (A) when measured at 7 metres from the closest part of the machine.

Schedule—*continued*.

2. The tree chipping machine shall not be operated pursuant to the exemption—

- (a) on a Saturday, a Sunday, or a day that is appointed a public holiday by or under the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1972, as amended; or
- (b) on any other day, before 8.30 a.m. or after 4.00 p.m.

3. The tree chipping machine shall not be operated in a public place pursuant to the exemption for more than 15 minutes outside the same residence.

4. The tree chipping machine shall not be continuously operated pursuant to the exemption for more than 1 hour within 800 metres of the same place.

5. The tree chipping machine shall not be operated pursuant to the exemption within 200 metres of a hospital, nursing home, or like institution.

6. Each person operating the tree chipping machine pursuant to the exemption shall, when so operating the machine, wear hearing protection rated at a minimum SLC<sub>50</sub> of 20.

7. Not less than 1 week before the tree chipping machine is operated pursuant to the exemption within 800 metres of a residence written notice shall be given at the residence of the time at which the machine will be so operated within 800 metres of the residence, with such particularity as is reasonably practicable.

8. The council of the City of South Perth shall, within 14 days of it or any of its officers receiving a complaint arising from the operation of a tree chipping machine, cause notice in writing of the complaint to be sent to the Director, Noise Abatement Section, Department of Health and Medical Services specifying the details of the complaint.

(ka) In Parking Station 23:

THE Shire of Mandurah under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

Scheme Text.

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Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Mandurah Town Planning Scheme No. 10—Goegrup Park Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Mandurah (hereinafter called "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following maps are attached to and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme applies to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map and the Scheme Map (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area").

Interpretation.

5. In the Scheme unless the context otherwise requires—

"Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended);

"clause" means a clause of the Scheme;

"Council" means the Shire of Mandurah;

"Scheme" means this Town Planning Scheme;

"Scheme Area" means the area defined in clause 4;

"Scheme Costs" means the costs described in clause 19;

"sub-clause" means a sub-clause of the clause in which the term is used.

Words and expressions used herein have the meanings respectively assigned to them by the Act or by Appendix D to the Town Planning Regulations 1967.

General Objects.

6. The general objects of the Scheme are:—

- (a) to facilitate and encourage the progressive subdivision and development of the land within the Scheme Area for residential and recreational purposes and other purposes permitted within a Special Rural Zone;
- (b) to co-ordinate and control subdivision and development in the Scheme Area;
- (c) to plan and make provision for suitable roads and access ways within the Scheme Area;
- (d) to make provision for land to be used for public open space recreation and other community uses;
- (e) to make provision for other matters which are necessary or incidental to town planning or housing;
- (f) to improve and secure the amenity health and convenience of the Scheme Area.

Method of Carrying Out Objects.

7. As and when owners of land within the Scheme Area subdivide or develop their land such subdivision or development shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision for the Scheme Area.

8. The Scheme Map indicates an acceptable method of subdivision of the Scheme Area. The Council may with the consent of the Town Planning Board permit departures from the design shown on the Scheme Map if it considers the proposed subdivision to be of a similar standard to that shown but no departure from the design shown on the Scheme Map shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision or development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

Subdivision.

9. An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of the proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board in conformity with the Scheme Map with such modifications as are permitted by the Council under clause 8 hereof.

Roads and Access Ways.

10. Subject to the following clauses all new roads and access ways shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of the land in which such roads and access ways are situated and each owner shall when subdividing his land make the land available for the said roads and access way and pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads and access ways within the land owned by him.

11. In cases where the situation of a new road or of a new access way is such that in the opinion of the Council it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road or access way and apportion the value of the land made available for such roads and access ways and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

12. All new roads shall be constructed in accordance with the following specifications:—

- (a) the road reserve shall be paved with a limestone base to a width of 7 m and have sealed carriageways of 6 m in width unless otherwise agreed by the Council;
- (b) the road shall be kerbed at curves, corners and intersections and where kerbs are considered by the Council to be necessary for drainage or to control storm water but otherwise shall be unkerbed;
- (c) such other requirements as the Council may in any particular case require.

13. The Council may construct and drain any new roads and access ways and acquire the land necessary for that purpose. If the Council does so prior to the subdivision of the lands adjoining such road or access way the costs of the construction and drainage of the

said road or of the said access way and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land shall be paid to the Council by each respective owner of land in accordance with the foregoing provisions upon the final approval of the Town Planning Board to the subdivision of his land.

14. If an owner subdivides his land or if he or his predecessors in title have claimed or have been paid compensation by reason of the resumption by the Council of the land for a new road or an access way he shall before the final approval by the Town Planning Board to his plan of subdivision release the Council from the compensation claimed or repay to the Council the amount of compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be.

#### Public Open Space.

15. It is intended that the land coloured dark green on the Scheme Map shall be reserved for public open space.

16. (1) Subject to clause 17 hereof the Council may as and when it thinks fit acquire the land coloured dark green on the Scheme Map or any part or parts thereof either by purchase exchange or resumption or partly by one method and partly by another or the others.

(2) The Council may from time to time carry out or cause to be carried out the following works or any of them on the land coloured dark green on the Scheme Map or any part thereof—

- (a) the clearing of scrub and undergrowth from the land or part thereof;
- (b) the grading, levelling and stabilising of the sand quarry situated on portion of the land;
- (c) the digging of such bores and installation of such pumps as the Council considers sufficient for an adequate sprinkler system;
- (d) such other development and work as the Council from time to time determines.

17. (1) Each owner shall when subdividing his land contribute to Public Open Space in the following manner—

- (a) the owner shall transfer to the Council so much of his land as is coloured dark green on the Scheme Map;
- (b) if no part of the owner's land is coloured dark green on the Scheme Map he shall pay to the Council fifteen per centum (15%) of the value of the land the subject of the subdivision;
- (c) if the value of the land to be transferred to the Council pursuant to paragraph (a) hereof is greater or less than the fifteen per centum (15%) of the value of the land the subject of the subdivision the owner shall receive from or pay to the Council the difference in such value as the case may be;
- (d) if an owner subdividing his land is also the owner of other land within the Scheme Area not the subject of the proposed subdivision referred to in this clause and such other land or part thereof is coloured dark green on the Scheme Map the owner may if the Council so agrees transfer to the Council the land coloured dark green on the Scheme Map or an agreed part thereof (hereinafter referred to as "the second P.O.S. land") and the value of the second P.O.S. land so transferred shall be credited against the amount payable by the owner to the Council under paragraph (b) or (c) of this sub-clause and for the purposes of this paragraph—

- (i) the second P.O.S. land shall be valued as at the date upon which the owner offered to transfer it to the Council or as at the date upon which the land adjoining it or adjoining the open space of which it forms part was first subdivided whichever produces the lower value;
- (ii) if the value of the land transferred to the Council under paragraph (a) of this sub-clause and under this present paragraph (d) is greater than fifteen per centum (15%) of the value of his

land being subdivided the owner may elect that instead of receiving a payment under paragraph (a) of this sub-clause the amount of the excess shall be credited against the amount which would be payable by him on the subsequent subdivision of any other land owned by him within the Scheme Area;

- (iii) upon the subdivision of the land of which the second P.O.S. land forms part the provisions of this clause shall be applied on the basis that the second P.O.S. land does not form part of and never formed part of the land the subject of that subdivision.

(2) It is intended that the development be so staged that moneys payable to the Council under sub-clause (1) will be available to make payment to owners under that sub-clause and if an owner desires to subdivide his land before sufficient funds are available to make payment to him the transfer or vesting of the land required for public open space and payment under sub-clause (1) shall unless the Council and the owner otherwise agree be postponed until the Council has sufficient funds to make the payment to the owner.

18. (1) In this Scheme the term "public open space trust fund" means a special public open space trust fund established solely for the purposes of the Scheme.

(2) All moneys received by the Council pursuant to clause 17 shall be paid into the public open space trust fund.

(3) The Council shall apply moneys standing to the credit of the public open space trust fund in repaying any loan moneys or finance made available by it and interest thereon expended on the acquisition of public open space.

(4) If the moneys standing to the credit of the public open space trust fund are insufficient to repay any loan moneys or finance expended on the acquisition of public open space the balance thereof shall be borne by the Scheme.

(5) If the moneys in the public open space trust fund are greater than the amount necessary to repay the loans and other moneys and interest the balance thereof shall be applied by the Council in further improvements and facilities in the Scheme Area.

#### Scheme Costs.

19. The costs or estimated costs of the following items are hereinafter referred to as the Scheme Costs:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and management costs as may be incurred in the preparation and implementation of the Scheme. The term "administration costs" includes in addition all legal costs, planning costs, payments to planning consultants and other professional consultants and valuation costs.
- (b) The cost of acquisition of the land shown as Public Open Space and Other Community Uses on the Scheme Map.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (d) All other costs and expenses which the Council is required to meet in order to implement and complete the Scheme.

20. (1) The Council may from time to time nominate any item or items of Scheme Costs which it considers relate exclusively to the land of one or more owners and do not apply to the Scheme Area generally.

(2) Where the Council nominates that an item or items of Scheme Costs relate exclusively to the land of only one owner the whole of that item or items of Scheme Costs is payable by that owner.

(3) Where the Council nominates that an item or items of Scheme Costs relate exclusively to the lands of two or more owners that item or items are payable by those owners in the proportions that the area of the land owned by them respectively bears to the aggregate area of the land owned by all of them.

Payment of Scheme Costs.

21. Each owner shall prior to the final approval by the Town Planning Board of the subdivision of his land pay to the Council—

- (a) the amount or amounts (if any) payable by the owner under the preceding clause hereof; and
- (b) an amount which bears the same proportion to the total Scheme Costs (not being in respect of items which the Council has determined relate exclusively to the land of one or more owners) as the area of the owner's land being subdivided or capable of being subdivided bears to the total land within the Scheme Area.

Estimate of Scheme Costs.

22. If any of the items of Scheme Costs have not been paid or ascertained at the time of subdivision of a parcel of land or at the time of the giving of a notice by the Council they may be estimated by the Council. An estimate may be revised from time to time.

Land Owned by the Council.

23. All or any of the land now owned or subsequently acquired by the Council within or near the Scheme Area may be used by the Council for any purpose appropriate to the Scheme (and the Council has all the powers of an owner in respect thereof) and if such purpose is one for which an owner is required to make land available or for which land may be acquired by the Council hereunder the Council shall be compensated for the value of the land so used.

Valuations.

24. Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land for the purpose of the Scheme the value shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the State Taxation Department of Western Australia or the Valuer-General or such other valuer being a member of the Australian Institute of Valuers who is approved by the Council. The valuation shall be made on the basis of the fair net expectancy inclusive of subdivider's profit from the sale of the land in its optimum subdivided form.

25. If an owner objects to the value so determined he may give written notice of such objection to the Council within twenty eight days after having been informed of the value or revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration.

26. If a valuation made by the valuer is changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in value.

27. When it becomes necessary to make a valuation by reason of an application for consent to a subdivision or development the costs of the valuation shall be paid by the person making the application.

Arbitration.

28. Any dispute or difference which by the terms of this Scheme may be determined by arbitration may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon a single arbitrator he may be nominated by the President for the time being of the Law Society of Western Australia whose nomination is final unless the dispute or difference relates to a question of valuation of land in which case the arbitrator may be nominated by the President for the time being of the Australian Institute of Valuers (Western Australia Division) whose nomination is final.

Powers and Authorities of Council.

29. In carrying out the provisions of the Scheme the Council has the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.

(d) To enter into agreements with the Crown and any department of the State with reference to the carrying out of any of the objects or works of the Scheme.

(e) If any owner of land does not proceed with the subdivision or development of his land in accordance with the Scheme or by reason of the nature of his land he is unable to subdivide or develop it and his failure to do so in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area the Council may resume or purchase the land of such owner or any part or parts thereof and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme. In so doing the Council may enter into agreements with adjoining owners as to the sharing of costs as to ownership of lots part of which are outside the land resumed by the Council.

(f) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under paragraph (e) it has all the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land; if land has been resumed and if the owner has not been paid compensation by reason of the resumption, the Council before selling the land so subdivided and developed shall offer the new lots wholly within the subdivision and the benefit of any agreement with adjoining owners to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision or development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption and development. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within twenty eight days of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the said sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance if any of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

(g) If the offer mentioned in paragraph (f) hereof is not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.

(h) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled whether under paragraph (e) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singularly or in groups and on the condition that buildings of a specified character with specified parking or other facilities shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.

(i) To extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agreed to the securing of such payments.

(j) To transfer any land owned by it or acquired by it pursuant to the Scheme as compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.

(k) To borrow money in accordance with the provisions of section 16 of the Act and the provisions of the Local Government Act 1960 for the purposes of the Scheme.

30. 32. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.

33. The time within which a person may make a claim for compensation pursuant to Section 11 of the Act is six months after the date when notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in the manner prescribed by the regulations made under the Act.





## DOG ACT 1976-1977.

The Municipality of the City of Gosnells.

## By-laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 28th day of April, 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:—

1. The By-law of the City of Gosnells relating to the establishment of a dog pound and the control of dogs, published in the *Government Gazette* of 20 August 1954, and amended in the *Government Gazette* of 10 March 1964, 25 January 1972 and 24 December 1975, is hereby revoked.
2. In these By-laws the term "Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Gosnells.

## PART I—IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

3. The Council dog pound for the time being is situated on Lot 42 Corner Maddington Road and Canning Park Avenue, Maddington.

4. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then upon payment of the fees specified in the Third Schedule hereto ("the said fees") the dog shall be released to such person.

5. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such time and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.

6. If the Council arranges destruction of a dog at the request of its owner, then whether such dog shall have been seized, or detained or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fees specified in the Third Schedule hereto.

7. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of liability to a penalty under the Dog Act 1976, Dog Act Regulations or these by-laws.

8. The owner or occupier of any premises within the district of the City of Gosnells shall not keep, permit or suffer to remain thereon more than two dogs over the age of three months unless such premises are situated within that area of the district where kennels are permitted under the City of Gosnells Town Planning Scheme No. 1 as amended and unless such premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment.

(A person wishing to keep more than two dogs but not more than six dogs on any premises, may seek, upon application to Council, exemption for those premises under the provisions of section 26 (3) of the Dog Act 1976.)

## PART II—REGULATIONS OF DOG KENNELS.

9. In this part the following interpretations shall apply:—

"Applicant" shall mean a person who makes an application for an approved kennel establishment licence

"approved kennel establishment" shall mean the kennel or kennels and yards appurtenant thereto which are the subject of an application for an approved kennel establishment licence as prescribed by By-law 10

"approved kennel establishment licence" shall mean a licence granted by the Council to an Applicant pursuant to By-law 11

"Licensee" shall mean a person who holds an approved kennel establishment licence

10. Any application for an approved kennel establishment licence shall be made in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto and shall be submitted with two (2) copies of a plan showing the specifications of the kennels and yards appurtenant thereto, with relationship of the kennels and the yards to the boundaries of the lot or lots and all buildings on the land the subject of the application and other land contiguous thereto and such other information as the Council may require.

11. Subject to the provisions of the Dog Act the Council may grant or refuse an approved kennel licence and if granting an approved kennel licence shall forthwith make available to the Applicant an approved kennel establishment licence in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

12. On the granting of the approved kennel establishment licence the approved kennel establishment shall be deemed to be licensed and the Licensee shall thereafter cause to be paid to the Council an annual licence fee in the amount prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto.

13. No person shall erect a kennel establishment until plans, specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for such a kennel establishment has been approved by the Council and is in conformity with the City of Gosnells Town Planning Scheme No. 1 as amended or any other Town Planning Scheme then in force or any by-law adopted by the Council.

14. The licensee shall ensure that the approved kennel establishment complies with the following conditions:—

- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto, which is capable of retaining the dog or dogs within its confines.
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any distance less than 10 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier.
- (c) Each kennel and each yard shall be at a distance not less than 30 metres from any road or street unless it is completely screened from view from that road or street by a fence approved by Council.
- (d) In the case of a corner allotment, no part of any kennel or yard shall be at any distance less than 10 metres from the side boundary to which the premises has its secondary frontage.
- (e) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall be at a distance not less than 10 metres from any dwelling, church, school-room, hall, factory, dairy or premises whatsoever wherein food is manufactured, prepared, packed or stored for human consumption.
- (f) The walls of each kennel shall be constructed of concrete, brick, stone or timber framing sheathed with either asbestos or galvanised iron internally and externally.
- (g) The roof of each kennel shall be constructed of impervious material.
- (h) All painted external surfaces of an approved kennel shall be kept in good condition and shall if directed by an officer of the Council be repainted with good quality paint every three years.
- (i) The lowest internal height of any kennel shall be 2 metres from the floor.
- (j) Each yard for any kennel shall be kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 2 metres in height constructed of link mesh or netting, galvanised iron or timber.
- (k) Gates for each yard shall be provided and fitted with proper catches or means of securely fastening.
- (l)
  - (i) The upper surface of the kennel floor shall be at least 10 centimetres above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a surface having a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain ("the drain") which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.
  - (ii) All floor washings shall pass through the drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council.
  - (iii) The upper surface of the kennel floor shall allow floor washings to flow to a "P" trap by either a graded floor or an open drain set in the floor.
  - (iv) The "P" trap shall be set 25 mm below the invert level of the floor or drain with a septic tank of 1.2 metres diameter with an effective depth of 1 066 mm.
  - (v) Leach drain dimensions shall be 9 metres x 600 mm v 600 mm with an effective depth of 450 mm and the height to be determined by the Health Department of the Council.
  - (vi) Where the leach drain is inverted the sand fill required shall be 3 metres around the entire drain.
- (m) Each kennel shall have a floor area of not less than 0.6 square metres for every dog kept therein over the age of three months.
- (n) The area of the yard appurtenant to any kennel or group of kennels shall not be less than three times the area of the kennel or group of kennels to which it is appurtenant.
- (o) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels shall be maintained in a clean condition and cleaned and disinfected when so ordered by an officer of the Council.
- (p) Reticulated water must be available at the kennel via a properly supported stand pipe and hose cock for the hosing down of the kennel and the floored yard.

15. No Licensee shall keep or permit dogs to be kept on premises on which there is an approved kennel unless he ensures that a person in charge of the dogs either resides on such premises or within such reasonably close proximity so as to enable such person to have effective control over the dogs.

16. The Licensee shall maintain any area of those premises frequented or occupied by a dog in clean condition. Refuse, dog faeces and food wastes must be disposed of daily in an approved manner. Odours, fleas, flies and other vermin must be effectively controlled.

#### PART III—GENERAL.

17. Except for a dog used in guiding a blind person, the owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre.
- (c) A house of Worship.

18. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sportsground.
- (b) A car park.

19. Any person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred dollars (\$100).

By-laws No. 46 Relating to Stalls.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 16th day of December, 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960, and includes any Act amending or re-enacting that Act for the time being in force;

“charitable organisation” means a charitable, benevolent, religious, recreational or other voluntary institution, association, society or body, whether incorporated or not, whose members are not entitled nor permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from the transactions thereof;

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Subiaco;

“district” means the district of the City of Subiaco;

“stall” means a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services;

“stallholder” means a person in charge of a stall;

words and expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them respectively in and for the purposes of the Act.

2. A person shall not set up or conduct business at a stall unless he is the holder of a licence issued to him by the Council in accordance with these by-laws.

3. The Council may:—

(a) grant a licence to the applicant; or

(b) refuse to grant a licence on any of the following grounds—

(i) that the applicant has committed a breach of any of these by-laws;

(ii) that the applicant is not of good character or has been convicted of a criminal offence;

(iii) that the needs of the district or the portion thereof for which the licence is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have already been granted;

- (iv) that the stall is untidy, in disrepair or of insufficiently sound construction for use as a stall;
  - (v) that the stall or the customers thereof will cause an obstruction to pedestrians or vehicular traffic;
  - (vi) that the stall will adversely affect the amenities of the area;
  - (vii) that inadequate parking space is available to the customers of the stall.
4. The Council may impose conditions upon which the licence is issued in respect of any one or more of the following matters—
- (a) the place at which the stall may be set up;
  - (b) the type of goods, wares, merchandise or services that are authorised to be sold at the stall;
  - (c) the days and time during which a stallholder may conduct business at the stall;
  - (d) any other matters the Council thinks fit.
5. A licence shall:—
- (a) state the type of goods, wares, merchandise or services that are authorised to be sold at the stall;
  - (b) specify the size of the stall;
  - (c) specify the place in which the stall may be set up;
  - (d) specify any conditions on which the licence is issued;
  - (e) be in or substantially in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
6. (1) Except in the case of a licence granted for a lesser period specified therein, a licence granted by the Council is valid until the 31st day of December next after the issue thereof unless previously revoked.
- (2) A licence is not transferable.
7. The fees specified in the Second Schedule to these by-laws are payable in respect of the issue of a licence and the renewal thereof.
8. A person shall not set up or conduct business at a stall:—
- (a) except at the place specified in the licence issued to him;
  - (b) in a manner that is contrary to the provisions of these by-laws or to any condition upon which the licence was issued to him;
  - (c) at a distance of less than 9 m from the intersection or junction of two or more streets;
  - (d) in a street, way, footpath or other public place so as to cause an obstruction;
  - (e) in a street, way, footpath or other public place at a distance nearer than 6 m to another stall set up in the street, way, footpath or other public place.
9. A stall holder shall not:—
- (a) conduct business at a stall except between the hours of 7.00 a.m. and 11.30 p.m.;
  - (b) deposit any box, basket or receptacle (except a receptacle for litter) outside his stall;
  - (c) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on a street, way, footpath or other public place;
  - (d) act in an offensive manner;
  - (e) engage in any dishonest practice in or in respect of the sale of things at his stall;
  - (f) use false or defective weights, weighing machines, scales or measures;
  - (g) call his wares; or
  - (h) make any noise or disturbance that causes a nuisance.
10. A stallholder shall:—
- (a) maintain his stall in good order and condition;
  - (b) carry his licence with him and produce it upon demand to an officer or employee of the Council or to a member of the police force;
  - (c) have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.
11. The Council may revoke a licence on any of the following grounds:—
- (a) that the stallholder has committed a breach of these by-laws;
  - (b) that the stallholder has committed a breach of any condition on which the licence held by him was issued;
  - (c) that the stallholder has engaged in dishonest practices in or in respect of the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services;
  - (d) that the stallholder is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
  - (e) that the stallholder has transferred the licence issued to him or does not himself carry on the business.
12. A person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws is guilty of an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) and to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per day.

- a. To control the management and use of Halls and Community Centres owned or controlled by the Council.
  - b. To control the management and use of Reserves and Recreation areas owned, vested or controlled by the Council.
  - c. To control the management and use of Libraries, Aquatic Centres and other public facilities owned or controlled by the Council.
  - d. To have control and administer the Acts of Parliament relating to Bush Fires and Bush Fire Brigades.
  - e. To have control and administer all matters appertaining to Dog Control and Impounding of animals.
  - f. To receive and deal with reports from the Recreation Officer.
  - g. To carry out preliminary planning for development of reserves and recreation areas owned, vested or controlled by the Council including buildings thereon.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960 (AS AMENDED).**

The Municipality of the Town of Claremont.

By-laws Relating to Parking of Commercial and Other Vehicles on Street Verges.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 16 March 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws:

1. This by-law may be cited as Town of Claremont by-law relating to parking of commercial and other vehicles on street verges.
2. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—“commercial vehicle” means a vehicle designed for or used for commercial purposes, exceeding a load capacity of one tonne and a vehicle designed for or used for industrial purposes;
  - “Caravan” means a vehicle that is fitted or designed for habitation for a person in the course of a journey and to be drawn by another vehicle;
  - “Trailer” means a vehicle drawn by another vehicle;
  - “Park” means to permit a vehicle, whether attended or not, to remain stationary and “parking” has a correlative meaning;
  - “Street Verge” means that portion of a street which lies between the portion of a street that is improved, paved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic and the nearest street boundary.

- 3. No person shall—
  - (a) park a commercial vehicle, a caravan, or a trailer on a street verge for more than eight hours consecutively;
  - (b) park a commercial vehicle, a caravan, or a trailer on a street verge within 6 metres of where that street meets or intersects any other street; or
  - (c) on a street verge repair, service or clean a commercial vehicle, a caravan, or a trailer.
- 4. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provisions of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars with a daily penalty during the breach of ten dollars per day.
- 5. (1) A notice served under subsection (2) of section 669C of the Act in respect of an offence against these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 in the Schedule to these by-laws.
  - (2) Subject to sub-by-law (3) of this by-law an infringement notice served under section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence against these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 in the Schedule to these by-laws.
  - (3) An infringement notice served under subsection (2) of section 669D of the Act in respect of an offence against these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 in the Schedule in these by-laws.
  - (4) A notice sent under subsection (5) of section 669D of the Act withdrawing an infringement notice served under that section in respect of an offence against these by-laws shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 in the Schedule to these by-laws.
- 6. The modified penalty for an offence against these by-laws if dealt with under section 669D of the Act is Ten Dollars.
- 7. A penalty for an offence against these by-laws (not being a modified penalty) may be received by the Council by taking proceedings against the alleged offender in a Court of Petty Sessions.
- 8. The Council shall cause adequate records to be kept of all infringement notices served, and modified penalties received, under section 669D of the Act in respect of offences against these by-laws.
- 9. The Town of Claremont by-law relating to Parking of Commercial Vehicles on Street Verges published in the *Government Gazette* on 30 June 1971 and amended in the *Government Gazette* dated 30 May 1975, is hereby repealed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 16th day of February, 1981, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following amendment to its by-law relating to Standing Orders published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of February, 1965.

Clause 87 of the By-law Powers and Duties of Committees is amended as follows:—

## 1. Works and Reserves Committee

(a) Delete subclause (2) and substitute the following:—

(2) To have the management and general direction of sweeping and watering of streets.

(1) To supervise the carrying out of the provisions of any Act of Parliament or Municipal By-laws affecting public health including noise abatement and Signs and Hoardings By-laws.

(c) Delete subclause (6) and substitute the following:—

(6) To deal with matters referred from the Local Government Association.

(d) Add new subclause (7) as follows:—

(7) To have control of the operations of such of the staff of the Council as are engaged on health and sanitary services.

3. Town Planning Committee
- (a) Delete title and substitute the following:—  
Town Planning and Building Committee.
- (b) Delete subclause (1) and substitute the following:—  
(1) To supervise the carrying out of the provisions of any Act of Parliament or Municipal By-laws affecting Town Planning and the drawing up and reviewing of Council's Town Planning Scheme.
- (c) Add new subclauses (2) and (3) as follows:—  
(2) To supervise the issue of Building Permits and to deal with all matters relating to building in the district, in accordance with the provisions of any Act of Parliament or Municipal By-laws.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960 (AS AMENDED).

The Municipality of the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River.

By-laws Relating to the Prevention of Damage to Footpaths, Road Kerbing and Road Verges.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 25th day of September, 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise the following terms have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—  
“applicant” means a person who makes an application;  
“application” means an application for a permit;  
“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River;  
“Engineer” means the officer appointed as Shire Engineer of the Municipality of the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River;  
“notice of termination” means a notice referred to in by-law 13 of these by-laws;  
“permit” means permission in writing of the Council to cross a footpath or road kerbing or to trench through or under a road verge;  
“permit-holder” means a person to whom a permit has been granted;  
“repair” includes re-instate;  
“road verge” means that portion of a street which is between the edge of the portion of the street paved or surfaced for the use of vehicular traffic and the boundary of the street and includes any footpath and any road kerbing;  
“vehicle” includes—  
(a) every conveyance, and  
(b) every object which is propelled or drawn on wheels or tracks by any means,  
but does not include a train, vessel or aircraft.
2. These by-laws apply in the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River.
3. (1) Subject to these by-laws, a person shall not damage or remove any part of a street.  
(2) A person who damages or removes any part of a street shall forthwith repair the street at his own expense to the satisfaction of the Council.

(3) Where a person damages or removes part of a street and does not repair it forthwith to the satisfaction of the Council, the Council may repair the street and recover the cost of so doing from the person who damaged the street by action in a court of competent jurisdiction.

4. (1) Subject to sub-by-law (2) of this by-law, a person shall not cross a footpath or road kerbing with a vehicle, except at a constructed crossing or pursuant to a permit to do so granted under by-law 6.

(2) Notwithstanding sub-by-law (1) of this by-law, a person may cross a footpath or road kerbing with a vehicle without a permit if that vehicle is not being used in the course of building or development operations or works and is unlikely to cause damage to the footpath or road kerbing.

5. A person shall not trench through or under a footpath, road kerbing or road verge except pursuant to a permit to do so granted under by-law 6.

6. The Council may grant a permit to cross a footpath or road kerbing or both with a vehicle, or to trench through or under a footpath, road kerbing or road verge, or any of them, and may impose conditions as to—

- (a) the type, number and weight of vehicles which may cross the footpath or road kerbing;
- (b) the type, number and weight of vehicles or machines which may be used in trenching through or under the footpath, road kerbing or road verge;
- (c) the days of the week and the times of the day at which the crossing or trenching may take place;
- (d) such other matters as the Council considers to be necessary.

7. If the Council grants a permit subject to conditions, the person to whom the permit is granted shall comply with those conditions.

8. A permit is valid for the period stated therein but if no period is stated it is valid for a period of twelve months after the issue thereof.

9. An application for a permit shall—

- (a) be in writing;
- (b) relate to one crossing or trenching place only;
- (c) specify the crossing or trenching place and state whether it is to be crossed or trenched;
- (d) state whether or not there is road kerbing at the crossing or trenching place;
- (e) be accompanied by a fee of \$5.00;
- (f) be accompanied by an amount by way of deposit which, when added to the amounts (if any) held by the Council by way of deposit in respect of other applications by the applicant, will have the result that upon the granting of the permit the total amount held by the Council by way of deposit in respect of applications by that applicant will be in accordance with the First Schedule.

10. Any amount held by the Council by way of deposit pursuant to these by-laws is—

- (a) a deposit against damage to any footpath, road kerbing or road verge by the permit-holder from whom the amount was received or by a person under the permit-holder's supervision, control or authority and is not referable only to damage to a footpath, road kerbing or road verge at a place to which a permit granted to that permit-holder relates; and
- (b) a deposit against the cost of removing or replacing road kerbing in accordance with by-law 12 of these by-laws;

and may be applied by the Council in accordance with these by-laws.

11. (1) Except where the Engineer has in writing granted exemption, as he is hereby authorised to do, before a permit-holder crosses with a vehicle or trenches through or under a footpath at a place to which a permit issued to him relates—

- (a) if the footpath is constructed of concrete slabs, he shall carefully remove those slabs for a width of not less than 4.7 metres nor more than 5.2 metres at that place and shall neatly stack them on the adjoining land;
- (b) unless he is trenching through or under the footpath, whether the footpath is constructed of concrete slabs or of bitumen, gravel, limestone, crushed metal or other similar material, he shall place at that place a temporary crossing constructed in accordance with the Second Schedule.

(2) Until the temporary crossing has been removed in accordance with these by-laws, the permit-holder shall keep it in good repair and condition and free from obstruction to pedestrians.

12. Where there is road kerbing at the place to which a permit relates—

- (a) the permit-holder shall not cross or trench through or under the road kerbing except with the permission in writing of the Engineer;
- (b) the Engineer may—
  - (i) give permission in writing to cross the road kerbing without having it removed; or
  - (ii) cause the road kerbing to be removed at the place to which the permit relates or, if he does not approve of that place, at a place approved by him;
- (c) the permit-holder shall pay to the Council upon demand the cost of removing the road kerbing and if not so paid—
  - (i) the Council may apply towards the cost any deposit paid by the permit-holder and held by the Council;

- (ii) the Council may recover the cost, less the amount of the deposit which has been applied by it pursuant to paragraph (i) of this sub-by-law, by action in a court of competent jurisdiction;
  - (d) when a notice of termination is received by the Council in respect of a permit which relates to a place at which road kerbing has been removed pursuant to this by-law or that permit expires or the Council considers that the road kerbing ought to be replaced forthwith whether or not the permit has been terminated or has expired, the Engineer may cause the road kerbing to be replaced;
  - (e) the permit-holder shall pay to the Council upon demand the cost of replacing the road kerbing and if not so paid—
    - (i) the Council may apply towards the cost any deposit paid by the permit-holder and held by the Council;
    - (ii) the Council may recover the cost, less the amount of the deposit which has been applied by it pursuant to sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph, by action in a court of competent jurisdiction.
13. (1) A permit is terminated upon the receipt by the Council of written notice from the permit-holder (in these by-laws called a "notice of termination") that he wishes the permit specified or otherwise identified therein to be terminated.
- (2) A notice of termination may relate to more than one permit.
14. (1) Where a permit-holder or a person under his supervision, control or authority has trenched through or under a footpath, road kerbing or road verge or has damaged a footpath, road kerbing or a road verge and the footpath, road kerbing or road verge has not been repaired to the satisfaction of the Council and—
- (a) a notice of termination is received in respect of a permit issued to him which relates to the place at which the trenching or damage has occurred; or
  - (b) a permit issued to him which relates to the place at which the trenching or damage has occurred has expired; or
  - (c) the Council considers that the footpath, road kerbing or road verge ought to be repaired forthwith whether or not a permit has been issued to him which relates to the place at which the trenching or damage has occurred and, if a permit has been issued, whether or not the permit has been terminated or has expired
- the Council may—
- (d) repair the footpath, road kerbing or road verge and may apply towards the cost of the repairs any deposit paid by the permit-holder and held by the Council; or
  - (e) give notice in writing to the permit-holder that it requires him to repair the footpath, road kerbing or road verge at his own expense to the satisfaction of the Council within the time specified in the notice but the giving of a notice pursuant to this sub-paragraph does not prevent the Council from exercising the powers conferred by sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph if and in so far as the permit-holder fails to comply with the notice.
- (2) The permit-holder shall pay to the Council on demand the cost of any repairs made by the Council less the amount of the deposit which has been applied by the Council towards the cost of the repairs, and if not so paid the Council may recover it by action in a court of competent jurisdiction.
15. (1) The Council may apply a deposit paid by a permit-holder and held by the Council in or towards payment of any amount payable by the permit-holder under these by-laws.
- (2) Subject to these by-laws, the Council shall refund the deposit paid by a permit-holder or the balance thereof or portion of the deposit or balance so that the amount held by the Council by way of deposit is in accordance with the First Schedule, as the case requires, within twenty-eight days after receipt of a notice of termination.
- (3) Notwithstanding the receipt of a notice of termination, the Council may retain the whole or any part of the deposit paid by the permit-holder—
- (a) until each footpath, road kerbing or road verge which was damaged or trenched by the permit-holder or by any person under his supervision, control or authority on or before the receipt of the notice of termination or within fourteen days thereafter has been repaired, whether or not the damage or trenching occurred at a place to which a permit granted to the permit-holder related; and
  - (b) where pursuant to by-law 12 of these by-laws road kerbing has been removed at a place to which a permit granted to the permit-holder relates, whether or not the road kerbing was removed at a place to which a permit subject to the notice of termination relates, until the cost of removing and replacing the road kerbing has been paid;
- and the Council may apply the deposit in accordance with sub-by-law (1) hereof.
- (4) If as a result of applying a deposit pursuant to sub-by-law (1) thereof the deposit held by the Council is less than the amount required by the First Schedule, the Council may give notice in writing to the permit-holder that it requires him to pay a further amount to the Council so that the deposit held by the Council is in accordance with the First Schedule, and the permit-holder shall within seven days after the service of the notice pay the required amount to the Council.
16. A person who commits a breach of or fails to comply with any of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of \$200.00 and in addition a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20.00 per day.

##### Municipality of the Shire of Boyup Brook.

##### By-laws for the Management and Use of the Boyup Brook Town Hall and Community Centre.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 10th day of April, 1981, to make and submit for the confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws—

1. In these by-laws—

“building” means and includes any hall, room, corridor, stair-way or annexe, and the furniture, fittings and equipment therein.

“Clerk” means the person for the time being employed by the Council as Shire Clerk or any Acting Shire Clerk, his deputy or any officer authorised by the Council.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Boyup Brook.

2. Application for the hire of the buildings or any portion thereof shall be made in the form prescribed in the First Schedule to these by-laws to the Clerk at the office of the Council not less than 24 hours before the time that such buildings are required, and shall state the purpose for which the buildings are required. No tentative bookings are permitted.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any building shall be given in the application for hiring.

4. The hours for which any building may be hired shall be: Day, 9 a.m.-7 p.m.; Night, 7 p.m.-4 a.m. Hire of the buildings for use for public entertainment after midnight on Saturday nights shall be subject to the hirer obtaining written approval from the Department of Chief Secretary of the Western Australian Government to continue the entertainment after midnight.

5. The Council may demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit with the Shire Clerk an amount estimated to cover excessive cleaning expenses. Such a deposit to be refunded after the hiring provided the hall or building is left in a clean and tidy condition and that all electric lights, and/or gas stove burners have been turned off. If the hall or building is not left in a satisfactory condition, portion or all of the deposit may be retained by the Council.

Cleaning of the hall or building shall be completed not later than 11.00 a.m. on the day following the hiring; however, the Council retains the right to require the cleaning to be completed earlier than 11.00 a.m. if the building is required by other hirers. Should the cleaning not be completed by 11.00 a.m. or by earlier time stated by the Council a portion or all of the deposit may be retained by the Council.

6. The Council reserves the right by an absolute majority to refuse to let any building to any applicant for the hiring of the same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

7. The Council by an absolute majority may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building, and in such case all charges paid shall be refunded.

8. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building for the same date and hour, the Clerk may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building shall be granted.

9. Nothing in these by-laws shall be construed to prevent the long-term leasing of any building if the Council so deems expedient on whatever terms the Council decides, subject to the provisions of section 267 of the Local Government Act.

10. If, in the opinion of the Council, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the above and all other relevant Acts, the Council may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building. The hirer is responsible in the event of any dispute arising in connection with the compliance of the provisions necessary under this by-law.

11. In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under by-law 10 the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Council shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

12. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider or other alcoholic liquor shall be brought into or consumed in any buildings except when permitted by the Council in writing, and then only in the terms of the permit. If it is intended to sell liquor, a permit to do so must be obtained from the Clerk of Courts.

13. No furniture, crockery or equipment shall be removed, except with the permission of the Clerk and under the supervision of the caretaker or other persons appointed by the Council.

14. No person shall take photographs for profit without the permission of the hirer.

15. No person shall, in any part of the building—

- (a) remain, enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) use profane or improper language;
- (c) commit any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building;
- (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the entrance halls, exits, or passageways of any buildings;
- (f) interfere with any electrical or gas fittings, equipment or appliances.

16. Any persons committing any of the items under by-law 15, so shall immediately desist, on being requested to do so by the Clerk or Member of the Police Force, whether in uniform or otherwise.

17. No person shall remove the piano from the floor of the Town Hall to the stage or vice versa, without the permission of the Clerk, and when such permission is granted a charge of \$5.00 shall be payable. On any occasion when the piano is removed from the stage the hirer is responsible for its replacement on the stage.

18. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot or breach of peace, shall be permitted in any building.

19. The hirer of any hall or room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these by-laws, and for any damage done to the buildings, fixtures, fittings, furniture or crockeryware and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Council. The hirer shall be responsible for the cost of replacing any article of crockery not accounted for, or in a broken or cracked condition.

20. The setting up of tables, trestles and chairs, and the removing and storage of same, shall be the responsibility of the hirer.

21. The hirer shall be responsible for opening and securing the building. Keys may be collected from the Council office during normal office hours, 24 hours prior to the function, so long as there are no other bookings, and keys must be returned on the first day the Council office is open for business following the hiring.

22. The driving of nails, tacks, screws or pins etc. into, and the use of adhesive tape or other adhesive materials of any description on any walls, woodwork, furniture, fixtures, fittings, or furnishings of the building is strictly forbidden.

23. No internal or external decorations are permitted, however flowers may be used, provided they are placed in suitable receptacles, either on the floor or stage floor.

24. All crockery, cutlery, etc. used at any function shall be washed up and the kitchen left in a clean state by the close of or immediately after any function. Any expense incurred in this connection shall be recoverable from the hirer on demand.

25. No kerosene operated appliance shall be brought into the buildings.

26. The Clerk or Member of the Police Force shall be permitted free ingress to the building or any part thereof, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these by-laws.

27. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$200 for every such offence.

Local Government Model By-laws (Parking Facilities) No. 19 with the following alterations:—

- (1) By-law 2. Delete the passage "Section 4" in the definition "bus" and substitute the passage "Section 5" in lieu thereof.
(2) By-law 2. Delete the passage "Second Schedule" in the definition "commercial vehicle" and substitute the passage "First Schedule" in lieu thereof.
(3) By-law 2 is amended by inserting the words "the Shire of Boyup Brook" after the words "Municipality of" in line one of the definition "Council".
(4) By-law 2 is amended by inserting the words "the Shire of Boyup Brook" after the word "of" in line one of the definition "Municipality".

The Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda.

By-laws Relating to Animals.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 24th November 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-Laws:—

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Shire of Kalamunda By-laws Relating to Animals.

2. The By-laws Relating to Animals published in the *Government Gazette* of 17 October 1975, are hereby revoked.

3. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—

“Animals” means and includes horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, and any other hooved animals.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Kalamunda.

“District” means the Municipal District of the Shire of Kalamunda.

“Rural land” means those portions of the District classified from time to time as being within a Rural Zone by any town Planning Scheme or By-laws for the time being in force, but shall not include portions of the District classified from time to time as being within a Special Rural Zone.

4. These by-laws shall apply to and have effect in respect of all land within the District, save and except that By-law 6 shall not apply to Rural land.

5. The Council is of the opinion that the animals hereinbefore defined are offensive within the meaning of section 204 of the Local Government Act 1960-1980.

6. (a) Subject to sub-by-law (b) and sub-by-law (c) of this by-law no person shall keep or permit to be kept any animal on any land having an area of less than four-tenths of a hectare.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-by-law (a) of this by-law a person shall be permitted to keep not more than one sheep on land having an area of less than four-tenths of a hectare.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-by-law (a) of this by-law, if the Council is satisfied that it is necessary for medical reasons or other sufficient cause for a person to keep a goat or goats the Council may upon the written application of such person containing a statement of his reasons authorise that person to keep not more than one goat on land having an area of less than four-tenths of a hectare.

7. Any person who keeps an animal or animals pursuant to these by-laws or who uses any land in the District for the exercise or training of an animal or animals shall be responsible for appropriate measures to prevent dust pollution and soil erosion to the satisfaction of the Council. These measures may include:

- (a) Seeding, cultivating, top dressing, and/or stocking so as to maintain vegetative ground cover;
- (b) Installing sprinkler or ground water irrigation where necessary to maintain soil moisture at a level that will prevent wind blown dust;
- (c) Constructing feed lot facilities;
- (d) Adopting any other management system that prevents dust arising or soil erosion.

8. Where in the opinion of the Council the continued presence of animals on any portion of land in the District is likely to contribute or is contributing to dust pollution or soil erosion, notice may be served on the owner of the said portion of land requiring the immediate removal of those animals specified in the notice for a period specified in the notice.

9. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). If a continuing offence of these by-laws is created after conviction by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the person is guilty of a further offence and is liable to a further penalty not exceeding Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) in respect of each day on which that further offence so continues.

By-laws Relating to Extractive Industries.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of November, 1980 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960;

“applicant” means an applicant for a licence;

“by-law” means one of these by-laws;

“carry on an extractive industry” means quarrying and excavating for stone, gravel, sand and other material;

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Mundaring;

“district” means the district of the Shire of Mundaring;

“licence” means a licence to carry on an extractive industry issued pursuant to these by-laws;

“licensee” means the holder of a licence;

“Schedule” means the Schedule to these by-laws;

“Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk of the Municipality of the Shire of Mundaring;

“sub-by-law” means a sub-by-law of the by-law in which the term is used;

expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them in and for the purposes of the Act.

2. A person shall not carry on an extractive industry on any land within the district—
- (a) without first having obtained a licence; and
  - (b) unless he complies with any conditions imposed by the Council pursuant to by-law 8.
3. A person who wishes to obtain a licence shall—
- (a) make application to the Council in writing;
  - (b) state in the application the purpose of the proposed excavation;
  - (c) lodge with the application three copies of a plan showing—
    - (i) the location and limits of the area proposed to be excavated;
    - (ii) the name and address of the owner of the land;
    - (iii) the location of any existing or proposed building, improvements or machinery;
    - (iv) the location of all drains, watercourses, roads and footpaths on the area proposed to be excavated and on the land adjoining that area;
    - (v) the nature of the vegetation on the area to be excavated;
    - (vi) the means of access to the area proposed to be excavated and the type of roadway constructed thereon;
    - (vii) the existing levels of the area proposed to be excavated based on the Australian Weight Datum;
    - (viii) the depth and extent of the proposed excavation;
    - (ix) the proposed means of drainage and details of the sides and slopes of the proposed excavation;
    - (x) the amount of filling that will be carried out for the purpose of restoring and re-instating the area excavated showing the proposed final contours and the slopes and batters of the sides of filled areas;
    - (xi) the estimated depth of the over-burden present;
  - (d) state in the application the estimated number of trucks that will enter and leave the area proposed to be excavated each day and the route each will take;
  - (e) state in the application any proposals there are for the future subdivision or development of the land upon the completion of the excavation and the manner in which it is proposed to restore and re-instate the area excavated;
  - (f) lodge with the application, the written consent of the owner of the land to the application;
  - (g) give to the Council any additional information concerning the proposed excavation that it reasonably requires.
4. (1) An applicant shall within seven (7) days after submitting the application to the Council—
- (a) give written notice of the proposal in a form approved by the Shire Clerk to all owners and occupiers of property within a radius of one kilometre from the area proposed to be excavated;
  - (b) place an advertisement giving details of the proposal in a form approved by the Shire Clerk in a newspaper circulating in the district;
  - (c) erect at least one notice specifying particulars of the proposed excavation in a prominent position on the land so as to be clearly readable from each street to which the land abuts.
- (2) The notice referred to in paragraph (a) of sub-by-law (1) and the advertisement referred to in paragraph (b) of that sub-by-law shall both contain a statement that any person may within fourteen days (14) make a written submission to the Council supporting or objecting to the grant of a licence to the applicant.
5. (1) A licence shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Schedule.
- (2) A licence expires on the 31st day of December next after the granting thereof.
- (3) The Council may on written application renew a licence for a period expiring on the 31st day of December next following.
- (4) The fee payable for a licence or the renewal of a licence is—
- (a) \$100.00 if the licence is issued on or prior to the 30th day of June in any year, or
  - (b) \$50.00 if the licence is issued on or after the 1st day of July in any year.
- (5) A person who applies to the Council for a licence and whose application is not granted within twenty-eight (28) days of service of the application on the Council has a right of appeal to the Minister for Local Government under section 235 of the Act.
6. (1) It is a condition of a licence that the person carrying on an extractive industry (in this by-law called "the person") shall pay into a fund established for the purpose of restoring and re-instating any area excavated under the authority of the licence the sum prescribed in the licence at the time or times prescribed therein.
- (2) The Council may apply the money in the fund to or towards the restoration and re-instatement of the area excavated under the authority of the licence if the person does not carry out the restoration and re-instatement at his own cost on the completion of the excavation or the expiration of the licence, as the case may be.
- (3) When the restoration and re-instatement has been carried out to the satisfaction of the Council, the Council shall refund to the person the money so paid by him to the fund.

7. (1) As an alternative to payment into a fund as provided in the preceding by-law, an applicant for a licence may with the consent of the Council give to the Council a bond, with or without sureties, in a sum the Council considers sufficient to ensure that the person carrying on an extractive industry will himself carry out, or cause to be carried out, the restoration and re-instatement work agreed upon between the Council and the applicant on the granting of the licence.

(2) If the applicant makes default in carrying out the restoration and re-instatement work, or causing it to be carried out, the bond is thereupon forfeited to the Council which may apply the amount thereof, or so much of that amount as is required, to carry out the work.

8. The Council may, in addition to the condition referred to in by-law 6, impose conditions on which a licence is issued in respect of the following matters—

- (a) the hours during which excavation work may be carried out;
- (b) the hours during which blasting may be carried out, if those hours are to be less than the hours specified in paragraph (c) of by-law 12;
- (c) the depth below which a person shall not excavate;
- (d) the distance from adjoining lands or streets within which a person shall not excavate;
- (e) the safety of persons employed at the excavation;
- (f) requiring the licensee to plant and maintain trees or shrubs of a type and in a manner approved by the Council and specified in the licence during the carrying on of the extractive industry in order to screen the area excavated;
- (g) the drainage of the excavation and the disposal of water therein;
- (h) the restoration and re-instatement of the area excavated;
- (i) the provision of retaining walls to prevent subsidence of any portion of the excavation or land adjoining it;
- (j) requiring the licensee to enter into an agreement with the Council in respect of any condition imposed by it;
- (k) generally regulating the carrying on of the extractive industry.

9. The licensee shall erect and keep exhibited continuously during blasting in a prominent position on the land so as to be clearly readable from each street to which the land abuts a notice containing the words "Danger—Blasting in Progress" in letters not less than 50 mm in depth.

10. The licensee shall securely fence the excavation and keep the gateways locked when not actually in use in order that unauthorised persons will not enter the excavation.

11. (1) Subject to any condition imposed by the Council pursuant to by-law 8 a person shall not, without the written approval of the Council, excavate or quarry within a distance of forty (40) metres from a road or twenty (20) from the boundary of any other land or from a watercourse.

(2) For the purposes of this by-law any subsidence caused by excavation is deemed to be part of the excavation.

12. The licensee shall—

- (a) drain and keep drained the excavation so as to prevent the accumulation of any water therein;
- (b) not dump or stockpile any material that is likely to escape into any stream, watercourse or drain that is not wholly situated within the land owned or occupied by him unless he erects a wall of a height that is capable of retaining the material;
- (c) subject to any condition imposed by the Council pursuant to by-law 8, not carry out blasting operations in or about an excavation except between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays;
- (d) not carry out blasting operations in or about an excavation on Saturday, Sunday or a public holiday within the meaning of the Public and Bank Holidays Act, 1972;
- (e) take all necessary steps to prevent the emission of dust;
- (f) not excavate other than in accordance with the terms of his application and accompanying plans without the prior written consent of the Council;
- (g) restore and re-instate the area excavated in accordance with the proposals approved by the Council;
- (h) ensure that any face permitted to remain in the excavation is left in a safe condition;
- (i) construct any retaining walls necessary in order to prevent subsidence of adjoining land;
- (j) on completion of the carrying on of the extractive industry cause the floor of the excavated area to be levelled to an even surface and the sides sloped to a batter sufficient to prevent subsidence of the adjoining land.

13. The licensee shall give the Council not less than seven (7) days' written notice of his intention to cease to carry on the extractive industry other than temporarily.

14. A person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws or of any condition imposed by the Council commits an offence and is liable upon conviction to—

- (a) a maximum penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200.00); and
- (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per day.

15. The by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7 August 1963 and amended on the 24 December 1975, 29 July 1977 and 12 August 1977, are hereby revoked.

## CEMETERIES ACT 1897-1980.

## Meekatharra Shire Council.

## Meekatharra Cemetery By-laws.

BY virtue of the Cemeteries Act 1897-1980, and all other Acts and powers in that behalf thereunto enabling, the Trustees of the Meekatharra Cemetery make the following by-laws—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Council as set forth in Schedule "A" shall be paid at the times and manner mentioned unless otherwise ordered.

2. The "Secretary" as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Council as the secretary of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the Council, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Council.

3. The "Superintendent" as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being, employed by the Council, as the superintendent of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the Council, have charge of the general care of the cemetery and supervision of the erection or placement of interments, the opening, closing and dressings of graves, and such other duties as mentioned in these by-laws or ordered by the Council.

4. A plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situations and numbers of graves, and a register of all Applications for "Order of Burial" shall be kept at the office of the Council.

5. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule "B".

6. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Council in such time as to allow at least 24 working hours' notice being given to the superintendent of the cemetery prior to the time for burial otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

7. The Council shall cause all graves to be dug.

8. Every grave shall be at least 1.8 m deep and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than 1.2 m from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

9. (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this by-law, a person shall not bring a dead body into the cemetery unless he, or his representative, has first handed to the secretary for inspection and return a medical certificate of death or a Coroner's order for burial in respect of the body.

(ii) Where an undertaker or his representative for a valid reason is unable to produce a medical certificate or Coroner's order for burial, as required by paragraph (i) of this by-law and he has given to the secretary a written guarantee to produce the certificate or order within three days, he may bring the body into the cemetery.

(iii) A burial shall not be permitted in the cemetery unless the provisions of one of the foregoing paragraphs of this by-law have been complied with.

10. No interment shall be allowed on a Sunday, or public holiday except when it is certified in writing by a medical officer of health, or by a magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.

11. If application be made to the Council to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or of his family, an order from the Governor or the warrant of a Coroner or of a Justice of the Peace issued in accordance with the law authorising the Council to permit the exhumation must be attached to the application.

12. Children under the age of 10 years entering the cemetery must be in the charge of some responsible person.

13. (a) A person shall not bring an animal into or permit an animal to enter the Cemetery.

(b) Any animal found in the Cemetery may be seized and removed therefrom.

14. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Council for same) or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Council or its representatives.

15. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub or flower growing in any portion of the cemetery.

16. No person shall remove or carry out or attempt to carry out of the cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, flower, earth or other material without the written authority of the Council or its representatives.

17. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertising whatsoever without the written consent of the Council, and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the cemetery.

18. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the consent and approval of the Council.

19. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Council or its officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

20. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the superintendent or other officer appointed by the Council and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse or other rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

21. If any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

22. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery. No sand, earth or other material shall be taken from any part of the cemetery for use in the erection of any monument or other work except with the written approval of the Council.

23. No catacomb shall be allowed.

24. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erections shall be allowed on or around any grave.

25. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the superintendent.

26. All workmen, whether employed by the Council or by any other person, shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give; and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said secretary, shall be removed from the cemetery.

27. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, grave or any erection, or in any way infringing these by-laws shall be expelled from the cemetery.

28. Any person committing any breach of any by-laws or regulations or any other rules, regulations or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding two dollars for every day during which the breach continues.

29. Any person committing a breach of any by-law in the cemetery shall in addition to being liable to a penalty under any by-law, be liable to be forthwith removed from the cemetery by the Council or the Superintendent or other employee of the Council, or by a member of the Western Australian Police Force. If such person resists removal, or if and as often as such person so removed shall, unless with the consent of the superintendent, again enter the cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were presented to a meeting of the Meekatharra Shire Council held at Meekatharra on the 17th day of October, 1980 and adopted, and the previous by-laws, together with amendments, were repealed.
