to exercise, perform, and execute for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

HEALTH ACT 1911-1979.

HEALTH (NOTIFICATION OF CANCER) REGULATIONS 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Health (Notification of Cancer) Regulations 1981.

Commence-
ment. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on 1 August 1981.

Interpretation. 3. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
"cancer" means any malignant growth of human tissue which if unchecked is likely to spread to adjacent tissue and beyond its site of origin and which has a tendency to recur but does not include any type of neoplasm of the skin other than melanoma.

Cancer
prescribed as
a condition
of health. 4. Cancer is prescribed as a condition of health to which Part IXA of the Health Act 1911 applies.

Notification
by pathologist. 5. (1) A medical practitioner who undertakes pathological examinations of specimens of human origin shall, within 30 days of becoming aware that any human tissue indicates that the person from whom the tissue is taken suffers from cancer, forward to the Commissioner a copy of any report that he may make upon the examination.

(2) A report made under subregulation (1) of this regulation in respect of any person shall include—

- (a) the full name of the person;
- (b) the name of the medical practitioner by whom the person is referred for examination; and
- (c) if the person is a patient in a hospital, the name and address of the hospital.

- Notification by radiologist. 6. A person who is in charge of any place in which cancer is treated by ionising radiation or accelerated atomic particles shall, within 30 days of the first occasion on which any person is so treated, furnish the Commissioner with the following information in relation to that person, namely—
- full name and address of the person;
 - sex and date of birth of the person; and
 - the type of cancer for which that person is being treated.
- Fee for notification. 7. A fee of \$2 is payable in respect of a person whose name is notified to the Commissioner pursuant to regulation 5 or regulation 6 of these regulations.
- Commissioner may require further particulars. 8. (1) Where the Commissioner is notified of the name of a person who suffers from cancer or who is treated for cancer the Commissioner may request any medical practitioner or person in charge of a hospital to provide him with any information of the kind set out in the Schedule to these regulations that is known to the medical practitioner in relation to that person.
- (2) A person to whom a request is made pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall comply with that request within 30 days of the receipt of the request.

INTERPRETATION ACT 1918-1975.

FIREARMS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1981.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Police.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Firearms Amendment Regulations 1981.
- Commencement. 2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which the Firearms Amendment Act 1980 comes into operation.
- Principal regulations. 3. In these regulations the Firearms Regulations 1974*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.

 - (c) is semi-automatic;

 - (e) is in the opinion of the Commissioner of a kind requiring the exercise of special precautions,
- shall not be issued, granted or given.
- (2) Subregulation (1) of this regulation does not affect, or prevent any renewal of, a licence, permit or approval which—
- (a) was in force immediately before the coming into operation of the Firearms Amendment Regulations 1981; and
 - (b) relates to a firearm referred to in that subregulation. ”

- Regulation 27 amended. 5. Regulation 27 of the principal regulations is amended—
- (a) by repealing subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation—
 - “ (1) For the purposes of section 19A of the Firearms Act 1973—
 - (a) the amount prescribed by way of penalty referred to in subsection (1) (c), and subsection (2) (a), of that section is \$24.00; and
 - (b) the notice to be served pursuant to subsection (2) of that section shall be in Form 9A, and is referred to as an infringement notice. ” ;
 - and
 - (b) in subregulation (2) by deleting “being a modified completed copy of Form 9” and substituting the following—
 - “ in Form 9B (being a modified completed copy of Form 9) ” .



- Principal by-law. 2. In this by-law the Local Government Model By-law (Standing Orders) No. 4*, as amended, is referred to as the principal by-law.
- Clause 12 substituted. 3. Clause 12 and the heading thereto of the principal by-law is repealed and the following heading and clauses are substituted—
- “ Minutes.
12. The pasting or otherwise permanent affixing of the minutes to the leaves of a book shall be sufficient recording of the minutes in the Minute Book and the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting at the next ordinary meeting may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of those minutes at least 3 days before that next meeting.
- 12A. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether of an ordinary or a special meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at a meeting of the Council in order to proceed to their confirmation, and discussion, other than discussion as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings shall not be permitted, and when confirmed, the minutes shall thereupon be signed by the Mayor in accordance with section 188 of the Act. ”

1. By-law 2—Insert before “bus” the following definition—“built-up area” has the meaning as shown at section 103 (1) of the Road Traffic Code 1975.
2. By-law 36 (5) line 1—delete “street:” and insert “street or a street verge.”.
3. By-law 39 (1) (b)—before the word “adjacent” insert the words “on or”.
4. By-law 39—following By-law 39 (6) insert new By-law 39 (7):
 - 39 (7) A person shall not stand in the parking region a vehicle or any combination of vehicles that, together with any projection on or load carried by the vehicle or combination of vehicles, is more than eight metres in length:
 - (a) on a carriageway in a built-up area for any period exceeding one hour during any twenty-four hour period; or
 - (b) on a carriageway outside a built-up area, except in a truck bay or other area set aside for the parking of vehicles of that type.
5. Delete By-laws 43, 43A, 43B, 43C and 43D and substitute the following in lieu thereof:
 - 43 (1) The Council may:
 - (a) permit a person who requires the use of a metered space or other space, in order to carry out urgent or essential work, for a longer period or periods than that prescribed as the maximum period for which the space may ordinarily be used, to use that space for such a longer period or periods upon payment of the normal fee or fees, if any, for that longer period or periods plus a service charge of twenty-five cents in each case; and
 - (b) prohibit the standing of any other vehicle in that space during the period or periods in which the space is set aside pursuant to sub-sub-by-law (a) of this sub-by-law.
 - (2) (a) A person shall not stand or park or permit a vehicle to stand or be parked on land which is not a road or parking facility without the consent of the owner or occupier of that land.
 - (b) Where the owner or occupier of the land, which is not a road or parking facility, by a sign referable to that land or otherwise consents to vehicles of a specified class or classes being stood or parked thereon or to vehicles being stood or parked thereon for a limited period, a person shall not stand or park or permit a vehicle to stand or be parked thereon if it is not of the specified class or for more than the time so limited as the case may be.
 - (3) (a) A person shall not stand or park, or permit to stand or be parked, a bus or commercial vehicle so that any portion of the bus or commercial vehicle is on a street verge.
 - (b) A person shall not stand a vehicle so that any portion of that vehicle is on the street verge:
 - (i) during any period when the standing or parking of a vehicle on the road adjacent to such verge is prohibited, or is prohibited for more than a specified time;
 - (ii) during any period when the standing or parking of vehicles on that verge is prohibited by sign adjacent or referral to that verge.
 - (c) Subject to By-law 43 (3) (a) and (b) a person shall not stand a vehicle so that all or any portion of that vehicle is on the street verge, unless he or she is the occupier of the premises adjacent to that verge or a person authorised by the occupier of those premises.

By-law Relating to Street Entertainers.

By-law No. 16.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on the 13th day of April, 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law No. 16:

1. In this By-law:

- "Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the City of Perth;
 "Council" means the Council of the City of Perth;
 "Entertain" means to play a musical instrument or to sing in a street or to do both and cognate expressions have cognate meanings;
 "Licence" means a licence issued pursuant to this By-law;
 "Licence holder" means a person who holds a current licence issued to him pursuant to this By-law;
 "Street" means any street way footpath or other public place in the municipal district of the City of Perth.

2. Subject to clause 3 of this By-law a person other than a licence holder shall not entertain in a street.

3. (1) The provisions of this By-law do not apply to persons who entertain in a street pursuant to and in accordance with a special permit issued by the Clerk.

(2) The Clerk may issue a special permit only to a group or groups of persons who propose to entertain in a street as a group:

- (a) in connection with or as part of a lawful parade, lawful procession or other lawful gathering or
- (b) whose entertainment, in the opinion of the Clerk, having regard to the day, time, place and nature of the proposed entertainment will not give rise to any undue obstruction of the street or any undue annoyance to pedestrians or traffic in the street or the occupiers of premises adjoining the street.

(3) The Clerk may only issue a special permit with respect to a specified day or days and with respect to a specified period or periods of time on that day or those days.

4. (1) A person may apply to the Council in accordance with this By-law for the issue of a licence.

(2) An application for a licence shall be in the form of Form No. 1 in the Schedule to this By-law.

(3) An application for a licence shall be accompanied by two (2) character references in respect of the applicant.

5. (a) The Clerk may, in his discretion, grant or refuse an application made in accordance with this By-law or grant such an application on such conditions as the Council may, from time to time, determine as the conditions on which licences generally may be granted or as the conditions on which a particular licence may be granted.

(b) Where the Clerk refuses an application made in accordance with this By-law for the issue or renewal of a licence, the applicant may appeal against that refusal by notice in writing lodged with the Council within fourteen days after the date of refusal.

6. Where the Clerk grants an application for a licence the Clerk shall not issue the licence until the prescribed fee has been paid.

7. A licence granted under this By-law shall be in the form of Form No. 2 in the Schedule to this By-law.

8. A licence granted under this By-law is personal to the licence holder and shall not be transferred or given by him to any other person.

9. The fee payable for the issue of a licence is \$20 and the fee payable for the renewal of a licence is \$10.

10. A licence shall be valid and a current licence for such period not exceeding six months from the date of issue of the licence as the Clerk determines or until the licence is revoked pursuant to this By-law whichever is the earlier.

11. A licence holder may apply for the renewal of his licence in accordance with this By-law for a period not exceeding six months.

12. An application for the renewal of a licence shall:

(a) be in writing;

(b) be lodged at the office of the Council not later than one (1) week prior to the expiration of the then current licence;

(c) be accompanied by a fee of \$10 for the renewal of the licence.

13. The Clerk may in his discretion grant or refuse an application made in accordance with this By-law for the renewal of a licence or grant the application subject to such further, other or varied conditions as the Council may from time to time determine as the conditions on which licences generally may be granted or renewed or as the conditions on which a particular licence may be granted or renewed.

14. If the Clerk refuses to grant an application for the renewal of a licence the Clerk shall forthwith refund to the applicant the fee paid by him for the renewal of the licence.

15. Where the Clerk grants an application for the renewal of a licence:

(a) the Clerk shall forthwith notify the applicant who shall forthwith produce his licence at the office of the Council;

(b) the Clerk shall endorse on the licence notification of the renewal, the duration of the renewed licence and particulars of any further, other or varied conditions imposed on the granting of the application for renewal of the licence.

16. Where an application for the renewal of a licence has been granted that renewal shall not be valid unless and until the licence has been endorsed by the Clerk in accordance with Clause 15 hereof.

17. A licence holder shall not entertain in any part of a street:

(a) unless that part of the street is specified in the licence issued to that licence holder;

(b) unless the nature of the entertainment being given is that specified in the licence issued to that licence holder and, in the case of a musical instrument, the instrument being used is that specified in the licence;

(c) on any day or at any time other than a day and during a time period specified in the licence issued to that licence holder;

(d) unless he is carrying on his person the licence issued to him;

(e) unless that licence holder observes the conditions, if any, on which the licence has been issued.

18. A licence holder shall produce his licence forthwith upon being required to do so by an officer or member of the Council authorised in writing by the Council to require its production to that officer or member.

19. Subject to Clause 20, a licence holder may entertain in concert with other licence holders if the licence of each licence holder relates to the place where and the day and time on and at which the entertainment takes place.

20. A licence holder shall not entertain in concert with more than two (2) other licence holders.

21. The Council may at any time revoke a licence issued under this By-law.

22. Where a licence is revoked under Clause 21 of this By-law the right to entertain in a street thereupon ceases and the licence holder shall not be entitled to a refund of any fees paid to the Council.

23. A person who fails to comply with any provision of this By-law or the conditions on which a licence has been issued commits an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$200.

By-Laws Relating to the Removal of Refuse, Rubbish, Litter and Disused Materials.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 4th day of May, 1981, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:

1. In these by-laws—

“Council” means the Armadale Town Council.

“District” means the District of the Town of Armadale.

2. If there is—

(a) on any vacant land within the district any trees, scrub, undergrowth or rubbish;

or

(b) on any land within the district any refuse, rubbish or disused material, whether of the same kind or a different kind from that here specified, which in the opinion of the Council is likely to affect adversely the value of adjoining property or the health, comfort or convenience of the inhabitants thereof;

the Council may cause a notice under the hand of the Town Clerk to be served on the owner or occupier of such land requiring him, within the time specified in such notice to clear land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove such refuse, rubbish or disused material from such land.

3. Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice is served under by-law 2 of these by-laws shall comply with such notice within the time therein specified and any owner or occupier of land who fails to comply with the terms of the notice so served commits an offence.

4. Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land of such trees, scrub, undergrowth, or remove the refuse, rubbish or disused material as required by a notice given by the Council, the Council is authorised without payment of any compensation in respect thereof to remove it and dispose of it at the expense of and recover in a Court of competent jurisdiction, the amount of the expenses from the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

5. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of these by-laws shall be liable to:

(a) a maximum penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200.00); and

(b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per day.

6. Previous By-Law Requiring Removal of Refuse, etc. published in the *Government Gazette* dated 17 August 1960 is hereby repealed.

By-laws Relating to Stalls.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 24th day of February, 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by His Excellency the Governor, the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings set out against them hereunder respectively—

“Council” means the Council of the Town of Northam.

“District” means the municipal district of the Town of Northam.

“Clerk” means the Town Clerk or the person acting for the time being in that position.

“Licence” means a stall holder’s Licence issued pursuant to these By-laws.

“Licensee” means a person to whom a Licence is granted under these By-laws.

“Stall” means a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services including motor vehicles fitted out for such purpose.

“Stall Holder” means a person in charge of a stall.

“Voluntary Organisation” means a charitable benevolent religious literary cultural recreational sporting or other voluntary institution association club society or body whether incorporated or not whose members are not entitled nor permitted to receive any pecuniary or profit from the transactions thereof.

2. A person shall not set up or conduct a stall in on or near any street or way within the District unless he is the holder of a current licence issued to him by the Council in accordance with these By-laws.

3. A person who desires to obtain a licence to set up and conduct business at a stall shall make application in writing to Council in the form of Form I as set out in the First Schedule to these By-laws.

4. A licence shall:

- (a) state the type of goods or services which are authorised to be sold at the stall
- (b) specify the size of the stall
- (c) specify the date and times the stall may be set up
- (d) specify the place in which the stall may be set up
- (e) specify the conditions (if any) on which the licence is issued
- (f) be in the form of Form II as set out in the First Schedule to these By-laws.

5. Unless otherwise specified, a licence granted by the Council shall remain valid until the 31st day of December next after the issue thereof unless previously revoked.

6. A licence shall not be transferable.

7. A stall licence fee shall be as prescribed in the Second Schedule to these By-laws and shall be paid by the Licensee prior to the issue to him of a licence.

8. The Council may revoke a licence on any of the following grounds:—

- (a) that the stall holder has committed a breach of these By-laws;
- (b) that the stall holder has committed a breach of any condition on which the licence held by him was issued;
- (c) that the stall holder has engaged in dishonest practices in or on respect of the sale of goods at the stall;
- (d) that the stall holder is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
- (e) that the stall holder has transferred the licence issued to him or does not himself carry on the business.

9. No person shall set up or conduct a business at a stall—

- (a) except at the place specified in the licence issued to him, or
- (b) in a street way footpath or other public place or within 20 metres thereof at a distance nearer than 5 metres to another stall set up in the street way or footpath or other public place.

10. A stall holder shall not—

- (a) conduct business at a stall except between the hours specified in the licence;
- (b) deposit any box basket or receptacle (except a receptacle for litter) outside his stall;
- (c) make any noise or disturbance to the annoyance of neighbouring residents or passers by;
- (d) obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles on any footpath or roadway;
- (e) act in an offensive manner.

11. A stall holder shall carry his licence with him and produce it upon demand to an Officer or employee of the Council.

12. A stall holder shall have his name legibly displayed on every stall operated by him.

13. A person who commits an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a maximum penalty of \$200 and to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day.
