Local Government Act 1960-1981.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

JURIES ACT 1957-1981.

INTERPRETATION ACT 1918.

JURY POOLS REGULATIONS 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation.	1. These regulations may be cited as the Jury Pools Regulations 1982.
Commencement.	2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which Part VB of the Juries Act 1957 comes into operation.
Interpretation.	3. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears— “Act” means the Juries Act 1957.
Summons.	4. A summons issued under section 32D of the Act shall be in the form of Form 1 in the Schedule to these regulations.
Pool precept.	5. A pool precept issued under section 32G of the Act shall be in the form of Form 2 in the Schedule to these regulations.
Indication of presence.	6. The jury pool supervisor shall in the jury assembly room at or as soon as practicable after the time specified in a summons issued under section 32D of the Act call the name of each person summoned and the person whose name is called shall answer to his or her name.
Failure to indicate presence.	7. If a person who has been summoned under section 32D of the Act fails to answer to his or her name as required by regulation 6 the jury pool supervisor shall call his or her name again and if he or she does not answer the jury pool supervisor shall cause that name to be called 3 times in the immediate precincts of the jury assembly room.
Failure to attend.	8. The jury pool supervisor shall report to the sheriff as soon as practicable the name of every person who has failed to attend in pursuance of a summons issued under section 32D of the Act.
Selection of jurors.	9. The selection of jurors by ballot pursuant to section 32H(1) of the Act shall take place prior to the time specified in the pool precept and in sufficient time to ensure compliance with section 32H(2) of the Act.

- Citation. 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Port of Dampier Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1982.
- (2) In these regulations the Port of Dampier Regulations*, as amended, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 2 amended. 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting after the definition "coasting vessel" the following definition—
 " "construction work vessel" means a vessel that is for the time being used exclusively for construction work within port limits and offshore in connection with that construction work; "

 (a) by deleting "or" after paragraph (b); and
 (b) by deleting "port," in paragraph (c) and substituting the following—
 " port; or
 (d) any construction work vessel the master of which holds a special Exemption Certificate issued under regulation 14A of these regulations, "
- Reg. 14A inserted. 4. The principal regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 14 the following regulation—
 " 14A. (1) The master of a construction work vessel who wishes to obtain a Special Exemption Certificate issued under this regulation shall apply to the Harbour Master.
 (2) A master who intends to apply for a Special Exemption Certificate under this regulation shall give at least 24 hours notice to the Harbour Master that he will apply for the certificate.
 (3) The Harbour Master shall not issue a Special Exemption Certificate under this regulation unless he is satisfied that the applicant therefor—
 (a) has sufficient knowledge to enable him to navigate a construction work vessel into, about and out of the port without the services of a pilot; and
 (b) is a fit person to hold a Special Exemption Certificate.
 (4) Subject to subregulation (6) of this regulation, a Special Exemption Certificate issued under this regulation remains in force only while the holder thereof submits to and passes once in each year an eyesight test conducted in the manner determined by the Harbour Master.
 (5) Where a test is conducted for the purposes of subregulation (4) of this regulation the result thereof shall be endorsed on the certificate and where the person in respect of whom the certificate is issued fails the test, the fact of such failure shall be notified to the Harbour Master.
 (6) Where the Harbour Master is of the opinion that dredging or construction work in or about the port or outside the limits of the port has been carried out or any event has occurred that will affect or is likely to affect the safe navigation of a vessel without a pilot the Harbour Master may terminate a Special Exemption Certificate issued to a particular master and require the master to apply for a further certificate. "

on the second occurrence in any quota year—for that day and for the two closest days within the same test period;

on the third or succeeding occasion in any quota year—for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk or special products milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk or special products milk apply—

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises.

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority.

PROVIDED THAT nothing in the Dairy Industry Act 1973–1980, requires the Authority to accept all or any milk delivered to it by any person; and milk delivered to and accepted by the Authority may be disposed of by the Authority to milk vendors or other persons.

The Maximum Prices—

to be charged by milk vendors to milk vendors and milk distributors;

to be charged by milk distributors to milk shops;

to be charged consumers;

shall be at the undermentioned rates and shall apply in the dairy areas and districts mentioned for market milk which is sold in:—

Ten- or Twenty-litre Bags-in-Crate;

Six Hundred Millilitre Bottles;

Six Hundred Millilitre Containers Other than Bottles;

One-litre Containers Other than Bottles;

Two-litre Containers Other than Bottles;

Three Hundred Millilitre Containers.
