ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.B. 825841/81.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act 1909-1981 it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works, and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and the plan in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned has been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

City of Stirling.

300 mm Feeder Main across the Mitchell Freeway and in Hertha Road and Cedric Street—Osborne Park.

The construction of a three hundred millimetre nominal diameter water main below ground approximately nine hundred and twenty metres in length complete with valves and all necessary apparatus. Commencing at the intersection of King Edward Road, Hector Street and Mitchell Freeway and along Hertha Road to the junction of Hertha Road and Cedric Street and proceeding thence in a northeasterly direction along Cedric Street to the junction of Cedric Street and George Street and terminating thereat, as shown on plan M.W.B. 17730.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 4th day of June, 1982.

SECURITIES INDUSTRY (APPLICATION OF LAWS) ACT 1981.

SECURITIES INDUSTRY (APPLICATION OF LAWS) REGULATIONS 1982.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 15 of the *Securities Industry (Application of Laws) Act 1981* that where, under the Agreement made on 22 December 1978 between the Commonwealth and the States, the Ministerial Council approves proposed regulations to be made under that Act for certain purposes, the Governor may make those regulations: And whereas the making of the following regulations is in accordance with that section: His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting under the *Securities Industry (Application of Laws) Act 1981* has made the regulations following—

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Securities Industry (Application of Laws) Regulations 1982*.
2. These regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day after the day on which the *Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Act (No. 1) 1982* of the Commonwealth receives the Royal Assent.
3. In these regulations "the Act" means the *Securities Industry (Application of Laws) Act 1981*.
4. Schedule 1 of the Act is amended—
 - (a) by inserting after Clause 2 (1) the following subclause—

" (1A) In subsection (1A) of section 4 of the Commonwealth Act for the passage "Act 1980" there were substituted the passage "*(Western Australia) Code*". " ; and
 - (b) in Clause 5, by inserting after the passage "subsection (3A)" the passage "and in paragraph (b) of subsection (7)".

ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES ACT 1979.

Lombadina Community Incorporated By-laws.

MADE by the Council of the Lombadina Community Incorporated under the Aboriginal Communities Act 1979.

Part 1—Preliminary.

- Citation. 1. These by-laws may be called the Lombadina Community Incorporated By-laws 1982.
- Definitions. 2. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise—
 “by-law” means one of these by-laws;
 “community land” means that land declared by the Governor under section 6 of the Act to be the community lands of the community;
 “member of the community” means any person who is accepted as a member of the community for the time being;
 “sub-by-law” means sub-by-law of the by-law in which the term is used;
 “the Act” means the Aboriginal Communities Act 1979;
 “the administrative area” means that part of community land described in Department of Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan No. 1096;
 “the Administrator” means the person who is and is acknowledged by the Council to be the Administrator for the time being of the community or a delegate of that person appointed by him orally or in writing;
 “the community” means the Lombadina Aboriginal community;
 “the Council” means the council constituted by the constitution of the Lombadina Community Incorporated.

Part 2—Land.

- Permission required to enter and remain on community land. 3. (1) Except as provided to the contrary in any Act or regulations, a person who is not a member of the community shall not enter or remain on community land without the prior permission of the Council.
 (2) The permission mentioned in sub-by-law (1)—
 (a) may be given or refused orally or in writing;
 (b) may be given subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as the Council thinks fit; and
 (c) may be revoked by the Council at any time orally or in writing.
 (3) A person who enters or remains on community land contrary to sub-by-law (1) or who, having been given the permission mentioned in sub-by-law (1) subject to any term, condition or restriction, does not comply with that term condition or restriction commits an offence.
 (4) In this by-law “community land” does not include the administrative area and nothing in this by-law prevents a person who has a *bona fide* reason for being on the administrative area, and is authorised by the Administrator to be there, from entering or being on another part of community land for the purpose of passing to or from the administrative area.
- Restriction of entry to areas. 4. (1) The Council may cause signs to be placed on community land for the purpose of prohibiting entry to the part of community land on which the sign is placed or to the part of community land indicated by the inscription on the sign.
 (2) Except as provided to the contrary in any Act or regulations an inscription on a sign erected under sub-by-law (1) operates and has effect according to its tenor and any person who does not obey a direction in the inscription commits an offence.
- Homes. 5. A person who is in a home other than his own shall leave that home if and when he is directed to do so by an occupier of that home.

Part 3—Traffic.

- Traffic signs. 6. (1) The Council may cause signs called “traffic signs” to be placed on community land for the purpose of prohibiting, regulating or guiding vehicle traffic.
 (2) The inscription on a traffic sign operates and has effect according to its tenor and, subject to sub-by-law (3), any person who does not obey a direction in the inscription on a traffic sign commits an offence.
- Careless and dangerous driving. 7. (1) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land at a speed, or in any other manner, that is, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, dangerous to the public or to any person.
 (2) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land without due care and attention.

Part 4—The Regulation of Other Matters.

- Wilful damage. 8. No person shall wilfully damage any tree, bush, flower, lawn, building, structure, vehicle or other thing.

- Litter. 9. (1) No person shall leave any rubbish or litter in a home, or in an enclosure around a home, without the permission of an occupier of that home.
(2) In places or areas other than those mentioned in sub-bylaw (1) no person shall leave any rubbish or litter except in a rubbish bin or area set aside by the Council for leaving rubbish and litter.
- Offensive behaviour. 10. No person shall cause a disturbance or annoyance to other persons by using abusive language, fighting, or otherwise behaving in an offensive or disorderly manner.
- Disruption of meetings. 11. No person shall interrupt any meeting of the Council or the community, or any customary meeting, by noise or any other offensive or disorderly behaviour.
- Alcohol. 12. (1) No person shall bring alcohol onto community land, or possess, use or supply alcohol on community land, without prior permission given under this by-law.
(2) The permission mentioned in sub-bylaw (1)—
(a) may be given by the Council in relation to community land other than the administrative area and by the Administrator in relation to the administrative area;
(b) may be given or refused orally or in writing;
(c) may be given subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as the giver thinks fit;
(d) may be revoked by the giver at any time orally or in writing.
(3) In determining whether or not to give the permission mentioned in sub-bylaw (1), the welfare of the community shall be the paramount consideration.
(4) A person who brings alcohol onto community land, or possesses, uses or supplies alcohol on community land, contrary to sub-bylaw (1) or who, having been given the permission mentioned in sub-bylaw (1) subject to any term, condition or restriction, does not comply with that term, condition or restriction commits an offence.
(5) A person who has the permission of the Administrator to bring alcohol onto the administrative area shall be deemed to have permission under this by-law to bring that alcohol onto another part of community land for the purpose of taking it to the administrative area.
- Fires. 13. (1) A person shall not without the permission of the Council kindle, light, make or use a fire other than in a place set aside by the Council for that purpose.
(2) Sub-bylaw (1) does not apply to a fire for cooking or heating purposes in a fireplace in a home or used in conjunction with a home.
(3) Nothing in this by-law authorises a person to light a fire in an open fireplace in contravention of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

Part 5—Enforcement and Proceedings.

- Powers of police. 14. (1) Where any person has committed or is committing an offence against a by-law and it appears likely that injury to persons or damage to property will be caused by that person, a member of the police force may apprehend and remove that person from community land.
(2) A person shall not be removed from community land under sub-bylaw (1) for a period longer than 24 hours and shall, in any event, be returned to community land if a Court is convened to deal with him according to law.
(3) A member of the police force may request the name and address of any person who he believes on reasonable grounds—
(a) to be on community land in breach of by-law 3; or
(b) to have, while on community land, committed a breach of any by-law.
(4) A member of the police force may take proceedings for any breach of a by-law.
- Offences. 15. A person who breaks or fails to comply with by-law 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 13 commits an offence.
- Penalties. 16. (1) A person who is convicted of an offence against a by-law is liable to a fine of not more than \$100, or to imprisonment for a term of not more than 3 months, or to both the fine and the term of imprisonment.
(2) In addition to any penalty imposed under sub-bylaw (1), the Court may order any person convicted of an offence against a by-law to pay compensation of not more than \$250 to the community or another person where, in the course of committing the offence, the person convicted has caused damage to the property of the community or of that other person.

17. It is a defence to a complaint of an offence against a by-law to show that the defendant was acting under, and excused by, any custom of the community.

ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES ACT 1979.

The Beagle Bay Aboriginal Council Inc.

By-laws.

MADE by the Council of the Beagle Bay Aboriginal Community under the Aboriginal Communities Act 1979.

Part 1—Preliminary.

Citation. 1. These by-laws may be called the Beagle Bay Aboriginal Council Inc. By-laws 1982.

Definitions. 2. In these by-laws, unless the context requires otherwise—
 “by-law” means one of these by-laws;
 “community land” means that land declared by the Governor under section 6 of the Act to be the community lands of the community;
 “member of the community” means any person who is accepted as a member of the community for the time being;
 “sub-by-law” means sub-by-law of the by-law in which the term is used;
 “the Act” means the Aboriginal Communities Act 1979;
 “the administrative area” means that part of community land described in Department of Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan No. 1097;
 “the Administrator” means the person who is and acknowledged by the Council to be the Administrator for the time being of the community or a delegate of that person appointed by him orally or in writing;
 “the community” means the Beagle Bay Aboriginal Community;
 “the Council” means the council constituted by the constitution of the Beagle Bay Aboriginal Council Inc.

Part 2—Land.

Permission required to enter and remain on community land. 3. (1) Except as provided to the contrary in any Act or regulations, a person who is not a member of the community shall not enter or remain on community land without the prior permission of the Council.

(2) The permission mentioned in sub-by-law (1)—

- (a) may be given or refused orally or in writing;
- (b) may be given subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as the Council thinks fit; and
- (c) may be revoked by the Council at any time orally or in writing.

(3) A person who enters or remains on community land contrary to sub-by-law (1) or who, having been given the permission mentioned in sub-by-law (1) subject to any term, condition or restriction, does not comply with that term, condition or restriction commits an offence.

(4) In this by-law "community land" does not include the administrative area and nothing in this by-law prevents a person who has a *bona fide* reason for being on the administrative area, and is authorised by the Administrator to be there, from entering or being on another part of community land for the purpose of passing to or from the administrative area.

Part 3—Traffic.

6. (1) The Council may cause signs called "traffic signs" to be placed on community land for the purpose of prohibiting, regulating or guiding vehicle traffic.

(2) The inscription on a traffic sign operates and has effect according to its tenor and, subject to sub-by-law (3), any person who does not obey a direction in the inscription on a traffic sign commits an offence.

7. (1) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land at a speed, or in any other manner, that is, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, dangerous to the public or to any person.

(2) No person shall drive a vehicle on community land without due care and attention.

Part 4—The Regulation of Other Matters.

Wilful
damage.

8. No person shall wilfully damage any tree, bush, flower, lawn, building, structure, vehicle or other thing.

Litter.

9. (1) No person shall leave any rubbish or litter in a home, or in an enclosure around a home, without the permission of an occupier of that home.

(2) In places or areas other than those mentioned in sub-by-law (1) no person shall leave any rubbish or litter except in a rubbish bin or area set aside by the Council for leaving rubbish and litter.

Offensive
behaviour.

10. No person shall cause a disturbance or annoyance to other persons by using abusive language, fighting, or otherwise behaving in an offensive or disorderly manner.

Disruption of
meetings.

11. No person shall interrupt any meeting of the Council or the community, or any customary meeting, by noise or any other offensive or disorderly behaviour.

Alcohol.

12. (1) No person shall bring alcohol onto community land, or possess, use or supply alcohol on community land, without prior permission given under this by-law.

(2) The permission mentioned in sub-by-law (1)—

(a) may be given by the Council in relation to community land other than the administrative area and by the Administrator in relation to the administrative area;

(b) may be given or refused orally or in writing;

(c) may be given subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as the giver thinks fit;

(d) may be revoked by the giver at any time orally or in writing.

(3) In determining whether or not to give the permission mentioned in sub-by-law (1), the welfare of the community shall be the paramount consideration.

(4) A person who brings alcohol onto community land, or possesses, uses or supplies alcohol on community land, contrary to sub-by-law (1) or who, having been given the permission mentioned in sub-by-law (1) subject to any term, condition or restriction, does not comply with that term, condition or restriction commits an offence.

(5) A person who has the permission of the Administrator to bring alcohol onto the administrative area shall be deemed to have permission under this by-law to bring that alcohol onto another part of community land for the purpose of taking it to the administrative area.

Fires.

13. (1) A person shall not without the permission of the Council kindle, light, make or use a fire other than in a place set aside by the Council for that purpose.

(2) Sub-by-law (1) does not apply to a fire for cooking or heating purposes in a fireplace in a home or used in conjunction with a home.

(3) Nothing in this by-law authorises a person to light a fire in an open fireplace in contravention of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

Part 5—Enforcement and Proceedings.

Powers
of police.

14. (1) Where any person has committed or is committing an offence against a by-law and it appears likely that injury to persons or damage to property will be caused by that person, a member of the police force may apprehend and remove that person from community land.

(2) A person shall not be removed from community land under sub-by-law (1) for a period longer than 24 hours and shall, in any event, be returned to community land if a Court is convened to deal with him according to law.

(3) A member of the police force may request the name and address of any person who he believes on reasonable grounds—

(a) to be on community land in breach of by-law 3; or

(b) to have, while on community land, committed a breach of any by-law.

(4) A member of the police force may take proceedings for any breach of a by-law.

Offences.

15. A person who breaks or fails to comply with by-law 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 13 commits an offence.

Penalties.

16. (1) A person who is convicted of an offence against a by-law is liable to a fine of not more than \$100, or to imprisonment for a term of not more than 3 months, or to both the fine and the term of imprisonment.

(2) In addition to any penalty imposed under sub-by-law (1), the Court may order any person convicted of an offence against a by-law to pay compensation of not more than \$250 to the community or another person where, in the course of committing the offence, the person convicted has caused damage to the property of the community or of that other person.

17. It is a defence to a complaint of an offence against a by-law to show that the defendant was acting under, and excused by, any custom of the community.

GENERAL INSURANCE BROKERS AND AGENTS ACT 1981.

INSURANCE BROKERS LICENSING BOARD (ELECTION) REGULATIONS 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Insurance Brokers Licensing Board (Election) Regulations 1982.
- Interpretation. 2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
“Appendix” means the Appendix to these regulations;
“qualified person” means a person who is a qualified person for the purposes of section 10 (2) of the Act;
“regulation” means one of these regulations;
“the Act” means the General Insurance Brokers and Agents Act 1981.

Elections.

3. (1) Subject to subregulation (2) of this regulation an election for a person to hold office as an elective member, or elective deputy member, of the Board shall be held as and whenever necessary.

(2) Prior to or upon a member or deputy member ceasing to hold office, the chairman of the Board shall direct the Returning Officer to issue a notice in the form of Form 1 in the Appendix, to be published in the *Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating generally in the State, appointing a date and time for lodging nominations and a date and time for the closing of the poll to be taken at the election.

(3) The nomination day appointed by any notice published pursuant to subregulation (2) of this regulation shall not be less than 30 days after the date upon which the notice is published in the *Gazette*, and the day appointed for the holding of the election and the closing of the poll at such election shall not be less than 14 nor more than 30 days after the nomination day.

Nominations.

4. (1) Nominations of candidates shall be lodged with the Returning Officer in the form of Form 2 in the Appendix, not later than the day and the time appointed for the receipt of nominations by the notice published pursuant to regulation 3.

(2) Every nomination shall—

- (a) set out the full name of the candidate for election, and the office for which he is nominated;
- (b) be signed by not less than two persons eligible to vote.

(3) If no nominations are received for all or any of the offices in respect of which there is a vacancy, the Returning Officer may extend the time for the receipt of nominations and for the holding of an election in respect of such vacancy or vacancies and, where that time is so extended, the period of time between the date for the receipt of nominations and the date of the election shall be as provided in subregulation (3) of regulation 3.

(4) Where a person is nominated as a candidate for election both as a member and as a deputy member at elections to be held on the same day, the nomination for deputy member shall be rejected by the Returning Officer.

The Voters List.

5. (1) The Secretary to the Board shall prepare and transmit to the Returning Officer, so as to reach him not later than noon on the day appointed for the receipt of nominations, a list of such of the persons licensed under the Act as it were, 14 days prior to that day, eligible to exercise a vote.

(2) The list prepared and transmitted pursuant to subregulation (1) of this regulation shall—

- (a) set out the full names and registered address of each voter included therein, and where that voter is the representative for the purposes of these regulations of a firm or body corporate licensed under the Act, that firm or body corporate; and
- (b) be certified as being true and correct by the Secretary to the Board.

(3) Any natural person licensed pursuant to section 10 is eligible to exercise a vote under these regulations, and shall be included on the list of voters.

(4) Where a firm licensed pursuant to section 11 or a body corporate licensed pursuant to section 12 is desirous of exercising a vote under these regulations that firm or body corporate shall from time to time—

- (a) in the case of a firm, by writing under the hand of the natural persons and the seal of the bodies corporate together comprising a majority of the persons constituting that firm;
- (b) in the case of a body corporate, by writing under the seal of that body corporate,

appoint a representative being a natural person licensed under the Act who is a qualified person, and on the Secretary to the Board being notified accordingly, the Secretary shall include the name of that representative on the list of voters as the representative for the time being of the firm or body corporate by which he is appointed and that person shall thereupon be eligible to exercise a vote under these regulations in that capacity.

(5) The exercise of a right to vote under these regulations is not compulsory.

Proceedings after nomination.

6. (1) Where one candidate only is nominated in relation to any vacancy he shall be declared elected as the person to be nominated for appointment by the Governor, but if more than one candidate is nominated for the same vacancy, the Returning Officer shall proceed to take a poll.

(2) Where more than one candidate is nominated for the same vacancy, the Returning Officer shall as soon as practicable after the date fixed for receipt of nominations, send to each person whose name appears on the list furnished to the Returning Officer in accordance with regulation 5 of these regulations—

- (a) one ballot paper in the form of Form 3 in the Appendix in respect of the election for a member and one ballot paper in respect of the election for a deputy member, initialled or signed by the Returning Officer or by a person authorized in that behalf by the Returning Officer;

- (b) one counterfoil in the form of Form 4 in the Appendix;
- (c) one ballot paper envelope in the form approved by the Returning Officer; and
- (d) one envelope addressed to the Returning Officer.
- (3) Each ballot paper, counterfoil, ballot paper envelope and addressed envelope shall be enclosed by the Returning Officer in a covering envelope, which shall be fastened and addressed and forwarded by post or otherwise to the person for whom it is intended.
- Dual voting capacity.** 7. A person who is eligible to vote as a natural person licensed under the Act may also exercise the right to vote as a duly appointed representative of a firm or body corporate where his name appears on the voters list in that capacity.
- Replacement ballot paper.** 8. If on written application made before the close of the poll the Returning Officer is satisfied by a person who is entitled to vote at an election that—
- (a) a ballot paper has not been received by that person; or
- (b) a ballot paper has been received by that person but the ballot paper has been spoilt, lost, damaged or destroyed,
- the Returning Officer shall forward to the applicant a fresh ballot paper together with the other items referred to in regulation 6.
- Preferential ballot.** 9. (1) Voting at an election shall be by a preferential ballot.
- (2) An elector who wishes to record his vote—
- (a) where only two persons are candidates in an election—
- (i) shall mark his ballot paper by writing the numeral "1" opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes; and
- (ii) may mark his ballot paper by writing the numeral "2" opposite the name of the other candidate on the ballot paper;
- (b) where more than two persons are candidates in an election, shall mark his ballot paper—
- (i) by writing the numeral "1" opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes; and
- (ii) by writing the numerals "2", "3", and so on (as the case requires) opposite the names of the other candidates on the ballot paper,
- so as to indicate, the order of his preference,
- and after having marked his ballot paper in the manner prescribed in paragraph (a) or (b), as the case requires, of this subregulation the elector shall—
- (c) enclose the ballot paper alone in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" and seal the envelope;
- (d) write his name in block letters and sign his name on the counterfoil and have it witnessed;
- (e) enclose the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" together with the counterfoil in the envelope marked with the address of the Returning Officer; and
- (f) forward the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer to the address of the Returning Officer on the envelope so as to reach that address not later than the day, and the hour thereof, fixed in the notice published pursuant to regulation 3.
- Receipt of ballot papers.** 10. (1) The Returning Officer shall place and keep in a locked and sealed ballot box all envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers received by him up to the close of the poll.
- (2) An envelope containing a ballot paper received after the close of the poll shall not be admitted to the count.
- Scrutineers.** 11. (1) A candidate may by notice in writing given to the Returning Officer at any time before the close of the poll appoint a person, other than himself, as a scrutineer.
- (2) The Returning Officer shall give to every person appointed to be scrutineer reasonable notice of the place at which the count of the ballot papers will be undertaken and the date and hour thereof so as to enable the scrutineer to be present during the count.
- (3) A person who is appointed as scrutineer under subregulation (1) of this regulation may—
- (a) be present while the Returning Officer carries out his functions under regulation 12 and regulation 13; and
- (b) direct the attention of the Returning Officer to any irregularity concerning the issue of ballot papers, the admission of any envelope to scrutiny and the admission or rejection of a ballot paper to the count.
- The count.** 12. (1) As soon as practicable after the poll has closed and not before, in the presence of such of the scrutineers as may attend—
- (a) each envelope addressed to the Returning Officer shall be checked against the electoral roll;
- (b) each counterfoil shall be checked against the electoral roll;
- (c) each envelope addressed to the Returning Officer shall be checked to ensure that it contains the full name and signature of the voter;

- (d) the name of each voter who has forwarded an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer and ballot paper shall be marked on the electoral roll;
- (e) if the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer is in order, the ballot paper envelope enclosed therein shall be placed unopened into a separate sealed ballot box;
- (f) if the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer has been found not to be in order the envelope containing the ballot paper shall be marked "Not in Order";
- (g) the ballot box containing the unopened ballot paper envelopes shall be opened and the ballot papers removed from the envelopes.

(2) For the purposes of the count each ballot paper shall be sorted according to the candidate receiving the first preference on the ballot paper but where a ballot paper—

- (a) does not bear the initials of the Returning Officer or a facsimile thereof;
 - (b) has upon it a mark or any writing by means of which the elector can be identified; or
 - (c) is not marked in accordance with such of the requirements set out in regulation 9 as apply to the election being conducted,
- the ballot paper shall be rejected as informal.

(3) A person who is appointed as scrutineer for an election may make submissions on the rejection of a ballot paper from, or the admission of a ballot paper to, the count to the Returning Officer.

(4) The Returning Officer shall consider any submissions made to him under subregulation (3) of this regulation before rejecting a ballot paper from, or admitting a ballot paper to the count.

(5) Where the Returning Officer rejects a ballot paper from the count or admits a ballot paper to the count after submissions have been made to him under subregulation (3) of this regulation the Returning Officer shall endorse on the ballot paper the word "REJECTED" or the word "ADMITTED" as the case requires and initial such endorsement.

Legislative
Assembly
election
procedure.

13. (1) Where—

- (a) an election is held for only one office; or
- (b) an election is held for the offices of member and deputy member simultaneously,

the successful candidate shall be ascertained in accordance with the laws for the time being in force regulating the elections for the Legislative Assembly of the Parliament of the State.

(2) Where an election is held for the offices of member and deputy member simultaneously, the count for both offices may proceed simultaneously.

Recount.

14. The Returning Officer may, at any time before the declaration of the poll, if he thinks fit, on his own motion or on the written request of a candidate or a scrutineer for a candidate in an election, order a recount of the votes cast in the election.

Result of
election.

15. (1) The Returning Officer shall declare the result of an election as soon as practicable and shall, immediately thereafter forward to the Board the name of the successful candidate in the election.

(2) The Board upon receiving the names of the successful candidate in an election shall forthwith submit the name to the Minister for the appointment of that person to the office to be filled in accordance with section 6 of the Act.

Secret ballot.

16. The Returning Officer shall take such steps as are necessary for the purpose of ensuring the secrecy of the ballot, the safe custody of ballot papers and for the prevention of any irregularity in the conduct of the election.

Conduct and
costs of
election.

17. (1) The Returning Officer may appoint such persons as are necessary to conduct an election.

(2) All costs, charges and expenses incurred by the Returning Officer or by officers employed by him, in connection with the conduct of any election under these regulations or in connection with any matters incidental thereto, as certified in writing by the Returning Officer under his hand and communicated by him to the Board, shall be paid in accordance with clause 2 (3) of the Schedule to the Act and the Board may have the accounts of the Returning Officer audited by the Auditor General whose decision thereon shall be final.

(3) The Returning Officer shall be paid, for the conduct of the poll and the scrutiny thereof an amount equal to 20% of the fee prescribed from time to time in the regulations made under the Electoral Act 1907 for a Returning Officer for a contested election for the Legislative Assembly at a State parliamentary election, and an officer appointed under subregulation (1) of this regulation, shall, while engaged on the scrutiny and count of votes, be paid for his services at the rate of the fees prescribed from time to time in those regulations, for similar duties for Presiding Officers.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 as amended, a Local Authority may make or adopt By-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any By-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the City of Melville being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as published in the *Government Gazette* of 17 July 1963 doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted By-laws shall be amended as follows:—

PART I—General Sanitary Provisions.

1. By adding after By-law 1B, a By-law as follows:—

1BB. (1) In every office the occupier shall provide sanitary conveniences for the use of the persons employed or engaged therein in accordance with the following scale and conditions:—

Water Closets	Proportion of Pans to Female Employees	Proportion of Pans to Male Employees	Hand Basins
When the number of employees does not exceed 100 	1 to 20	1 to 25	1 to 20
When such number exceeds 100 but does not exceed 200 	1 to 25	1 to 30	1 to 20
When such number exceeds 200 	1 to 25	1 to 40	1 to 20

(2) Subject to sub-Bylaw (3) separate closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons of different sexes and the entrance to each closet shall bear a sign to indicate for which sex its use is intended.

(3) In an office in which the majority of those employed or engaged are of the other sex, separate closet accommodation for the persons of different sexes is not required if separate accommodation is provided or available in adjoining or adjacent premises at all times.

(4) Closets for different sexes shall not adjoin each other unless the closets are separated by a wall of brick, stone or concrete not less than 100 mm in thickness.

(5) The door of every external closet shall be properly screened from the ground to a height of at least 1.8 m and screening shall also be provided to prevent the closet being visible from overlooking windows.

(6) Any closet for females shall have a separate entrance behind the screen and that entrance shall not be within 3.6 m horizontally of the entrance of any closet intended for the use of males.

(7) In every office in which more than twelve males are employed, urinal accommodation shall be provided in the proportion of one stall or 610 mm of urinal for each thirty male employees.

(8) The distance between a person's workplace and the closet shall be not greater than height of one storey, or more than 100 m horizontally.

(9) The occupier shall cause sanitary conveniences to be cleaned each day.

(10) All sanitary conveniences required to be provided by this By-law shall be connected to an approved system of sewerage and the fittings and installation shall be of a standard that conforms to the By-laws made under the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act 1909.

(11) Where there is more than one office located in a building or part of a building, the occupiers of those offices may jointly provide the sanitary conveniences required by this By-law as if those offices were one office.

(12) In this By-law—

“office” means any building or other premises or part thereof in which one or more persons are employed or engaged, directly or indirectly, to perform work of a professional or clerical nature in connection with any profession or business.

(13) The provisions of this By-law do not apply to, or in relation to any premises which, on the date of the coming into operation of this By-law in the municipal district, are an office within the meaning of sub-Bylaw (12) of this By-law, so long as those premises continue to be used as an office and are not altered, extended, modified or converted in any way.

2. By adding after By-law 3, By-laws as follows:—

3A. The provisions of By-laws 4A, 4AA, 4AB, 4AC, 4AD and 4AF do not apply to any building, flat or house to which the Health Act (Laundries and Bathrooms) Regulations apply.

3B. The owner of a dwelling of Class I, IA, II or IV Occupancy as classified in the Uniform Building By-laws 1965, shall provide on the premises, for the use of the occupants thereof, a bathroom, having a floor area and minimum width in accordance with the requirements of the Uniform Building By-laws 1965, which shall be equipped with a wash basin and shower bath or plunge bath.

3. Delete By-law 4A and insert a new By-law 4A as follows:—

4A. (1) In this By-law—

“flat” means that portion of a building used or intended, or adapted or designed for use as a separate tenement in a building containing two or more such tenements, but shall not include any building or place established wholly or partly by contributions from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Commonwealth or the Consolidated Revenue of the State and used for the purpose of housing aged persons;

“laundry unit” means a unit consisting of one washing machine, one wash trough of not less than 36 litres capacity provided with hot and cold water, and one drying cabinet or a minimum of 30 m of clothes line.

(2) A person shall not erect, rebuild, maintain or use any house intended for occupation unless it has provided in it a laundry properly enclosed and roofed, with either a concrete floor not less than 75 mm in thickness, properly surfaced, or other material of similar strength and impermeable qualities, with an even fall to a floor waste outlet, and having a floor area in accordance with the requirements of the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965, not being a room in which food is stored, prepared, served or consumed, and which is fitted with the following facilities—

(a) in the case of a house which is a “private dwelling” within the meaning of By-law 301 of the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965—

(i) one pair of wash troughs and one copper; or

(ii) a mechanical washing machine and one wash trough or sink having a capacity of not less than 36 litres and where the washing machine is not fitted with apparatus for heating water, a hot water system shall be provided;

(b) in the case of a residential flat building—

(i) communal facilities in accordance with the following scale—

No. of Bedrooms	Laundry Units
0-10	1
11-30	2
31-70	3
71-100	4
101-140	5
141-180	6
181-200	7

plus one additional laundry unit for each 50 bedrooms in excess of 200;

(ii) where any flat is serviced by an individual laundry unit, the number of bedrooms in that flat may be deducted from the total number of bedrooms referred to in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph prior to application of the scale to the requirement for communal facilities;

(iii) notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraphs (i) and (ii) of this paragraph a flat comprising two or more bedrooms shall be so constructed as to provide space in accordance with the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965, for a washing machine and space for a drying cabinet, each space being provided with a power point connected to an electricity supply and the flat shall also be provided with a wash trough of not less than 36 litre capacity connected to an adequate supply of both hot and cold water.

4. Delete By-law 4AA and insert a new By-law 4AA as follows:—

4AA. Where laundry facilities provided in accordance with these By-laws consist of wash troughs and copper, and are situated in the same building as and adjacent to a kitchen or room where food is stored or consumed, those facilities shall be separated from the kitchen or room by a wall extending from the floor to the roof or the ceiling and where an opening permitting communication between the laundry and the kitchen or room where food is stored or consumed is provided, the opening shall be not more than 815 mm wide, and it shall be provided with a door which when closed, shall completely fill the opening.

5. Delete By-law 4AB and insert a Sub-by-law 4AB as follows:—

4AB. Where laundry facilities provided in accordance with these By-laws consist of mechanical washing machines and wash troughs or sinks, and are situated in the same building as and adjacent to a kitchen, those facilities shall be separated from the kitchen by a wall or other approved partition which shall be at least 1.8 m high and where an opening permitting communication between the laundry and kitchen is provided, the opening shall not extend for more than half the width of the room and it shall not be more than 1.3 m wide.

6. Delete By-law 4AC and insert a new By-law 4AC as follows:—

4AC. Waste water from any washing machine shall be discharged to a properly trapped drain inlet and disposed of in a manner permitted by the Bacteriolytic Treatment of Sewerage and Disposal of Effluent and Liquid Waste Regulations made under the Health Act 1911, the By-laws made under the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act 1909 or the By-laws made under the Country Towns Sewerage Act 1948.

7. Delete By-law 4AD and insert a new By-law 4AD as follows:—

4AD. A hot water system referred to in By-law 4A of these By-laws shall—

(a) where it is of the storage type, have a capacity of not less than twice the capacity of the washing machine; or

(b) where it is of the continuous flow type, deliver hot water to the washing machine at a rate of not less than 0.04 litre per second

and shall be capable of delivering an adequate supply of water at a temperature of not less than 77° Celsius.

8. Delete By-law 4AF and insert a new By-law 4AF as follows:—

4AF. Every copper, wash trough and sink, required to be provided by these By-laws shall be properly supported and be provided with an adequate supply of water.

9. By adding after By-law 4AF, a By-law 4B as follows:—

4B. A person shall not—

(a) wash or permit to be washed;

(b) keep or permit to be kept,

any soiled clothing or bedding in a kitchen or other place where food is stored, prepared, served or consumed.

10. By adding after By-law 11 the following heading and By-law:—

Removal and Disposal of Nightsoil and Liquid Wastes.

11A. (1) No person shall carry out or undertake the collection, removal or disposal of nightsoil, urine or liquid wastes or the contents of any apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewerage or of any soak well, leach drain, french

drain, grease trap, petrol and oil waste trap, or other liquid trade waste from or on any premises, unless he has first obtained the approval in writing of the local authority, to do so.

(2) The local authority may specify in any approval granted to a person pursuant to this By-law conditions to be observed or performed by such person in the collection, removal or disposal of any matter referred to in Sub-bylaw (1) and the place where that disposal is to be carried out.

(3) A person who carries out or undertakes the collection, removal, or disposal of any matter referred to in Sub-bylaw (1) without the approval of the local authority or having obtained such approval, fails to observe or perform any condition specified therein, or to dispose of the said matter at the place specified for that purpose therein, commits an offence.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of Sub-bylaw (1) of this By-law, where a local authority has undertaken or contracted for the efficient execution within its district or part of its district of any work referred to in that Sub-bylaw, a person shall not execute or undertake the execution of that work undertaken or contracted for within such district or the part thereof, so long as the local authority or its contractor executes or continues the execution of that work or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of that work.

11. (a) By adding immediately after paragraph (a) of By-law 12, the following paragraph:—

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) of this By-law, the occupier may provide as an alternative rubbish receptacle, a rustproofed metal holder incorporating a tight fitting lid and having fastened to such holder a two-ply moisture resistant or other approved type of disposable refuse container; and

(b) By substituting for the paragraph designation, "(b)" in line one of paragraph (b), the paragraph designation, "(c)".

Prescribed Area—Section 112A.

12. By adding after By-law 14 the following By-law:—

14A. The area described in the Schedule hereto is prescribed as the area within which the provisions of Section 112A of the Act shall operate and have effect.

Schedule.

The whole of the District of the City of Melville.

13. Delete By-law 19 and insert a new By-law 19 as follows:—

19. (1) (a) No person other than an authorised employee of the Council or a person authorised in writing by the Council shall enter or be on any land or premises used by the Council for the depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish except for the purpose of depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish.

(b) No person shall deposit any refuse, garbage or rubbish other than at a position on the land designated by an employee of the Council or as indicated by signs.

(c) No person other than an authorised employee of the Council or a person authorised in writing by the Council shall interfere with or remove any material or thing whatsoever at any time from any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage or rubbish.

(d) No person shall light or cause to be burnt any refuse, garbage or rubbish on any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage and rubbish except on a specified site as designated by the Council and under such conditions as the Council may impose.

(e) No person shall deposit any car body or other material not easily compressible on any land under the control of the local authority except at a place which is set aside for the purpose, and in accordance with such conditions as the Council may from time to time impose.

(f) A person using a vehicle for disposing of material on land set aside by the Council for the depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish shall cause the vehicle to be removed from the land immediately such vehicle has been emptied of material.

(g) No person shall park a vehicle except for the purpose of unloading the vehicle on land set aside by the Council for the depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish unless authorised in writing by the Council to do so.

(2) The deposit of refuse, garbage or rubbish on land set aside by Council for the purpose shall be subject to the payment of a fee as follows:

(a) Per car, utility or trailer arising from domestic or residential premises within the Town of East Fremantle and the City of Melville provided that persons who are ratepayers and occupiers produce the rubbish disposal entitlement card issued by the City of Melville	No Charge
(b) Per car or utility	\$2.00
(c) Trailer not exceeding 1.8 m x 1.2 m x 0.61 m	\$2.00
(d) Trailer exceeding 1.8 m x 1.2 m x 0.61 m	\$8.00
(e) Trucks not exceeding 4 tonnes aggregate weight	\$8.00
(f) Trucks exceeding 4 tonnes aggregate weight single axle	\$12.00

- (g) Trucks exceeding 8 tonnes aggregate weight dual axle \$20.00
 - (h) Compactor vehicles—load capacity not exceeding 10 cubic metres \$30.00
 - (i) Compactor vehicles—load capacity exceeding 10 cubic metres \$40.00
 - (j) Bulk bins not exceeding 6 cubic metres \$15.00
 - (k) Bulk bins exceeding 6 cubic metres \$24.00
 - (l) Articulated vehicles \$36.00
 - (m) Motor vehicle bodies acceptable only when cut into at least four sections of approximately equal size—
 - (i) for commercial or industrial premises \$10.00
 - (ii) from residential premises \$5.00
 - (3) Every person entering on any land used by the Council for the depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish shall obey all reasonable directions and instructions issued by authorised employees of the Council or persons authorised in writing by the Council.
 - (4) A person who deposits or disposes of any refuse, garbage or rubbish at a place other than a place set aside by the Council for the purpose, commits an offence.
 - (5) At all times the Council may refuse acceptance of all refuse, garbage or rubbish or other matters arising from premises outside the City of Melville and the Town of East Fremantle.
14. Delete By-law 28 and insert a new By-law 28 (a) and (b) as follows:—
- 28. (a) The occupier of any premises shall not keep or allow to be kept thereon any horse, cow, sheep or goat unless the area thereof is 2023 m² or more.
 - (b) The occupier of any premises shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep or goat to be loose in any yard, paddock or place being portion of such premises and the owner of any yard, paddock or other place shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep or goat to be loose in any such yard, paddock or other place unless and until due provision is made to prevent such horse, cow, sheep or goat from approaching within 15 m of any dwelling-house, shop (or any other place) where food is manufactured, stored or exposed for sale.
15. Delete By-law 32 and insert new By-law 32 as follows:—
- 32. (1) The owner of a building erected after the coming into operation of this By-law shall, unless otherwise authorised by the local authority, and the owner of a building erected before the coming into operation of this By-law shall, when directed in writing by the local authority to do so, cause the building to be provided with—
 - (a) spouting and downpipes fixed to the eaves of the roof of the building, so as to receive, without overflowing, all rainwater flowing from the roof; and
 - (b) drains laid with sufficient fall to carry off all storm or rainwater falling on the building.
 - (2) The owner of a building shall properly maintain any spouting, downpipes and drains provided in compliance with Sub-bylaw (1) of this By-law.
16. Delete By-law 35 and insert new By-law 35 as follows:—
- 35. (1) Subject to Sub-bylaw (3) of this By-law, a person shall not erect, occupy or permit to be occupied a house or part thereof unless each room and corridor of the house is provided with fixed open ventilation to each room and corridor at the minimum ratio of 0.16 m² to each 10 m² of floor area of the room or corridor.
 - (2) The ventilators required under Sub-bylaw (1) of this By-law shall be so installed as to provide outlet ventilation and may be provided in the form of ceiling ventilators where the roof space is itself adequately ventilated.
 - (3) (a) Where a habitable room of a dwelling house is provided with a window or windows which, when opened, either singly or in the aggregate, provide an open space—
 - (i) that is of a minimum area of 0.5 m² for each 10 m² of the floor area of the room;
 - (ii) the highest part of which is within 460 mm of the ceiling line; and
 - (iii) that provides direct uncontrolled ventilation to the external air,
 it shall not be necessary to provide the ventilation in the room as required by Sub-bylaw (1) of this By-law.
 - (b) In this Sub-bylaw—

“habitable room” means a room in which a person sleeps, eats or carries out his usual domestic or social activities, but does not include a room that is used as a laundry, bathroom, water closet compartment, serving and storage pantry, closet, boiler room, cellar or other room used infrequently or for short periods only.

17. By-law 35A is amended by substituting for the passage "Fire Underwriters' Association of W.A." in lines three and four of paragraph (1), the passage "Australian Standard CCI, Part I SAA Wiring Rules".

PART V—Lodging Houses.

Schedule "C".

(By-law 2).

18. Delete the whole of Schedule "C" and insert a new Schedule "C" as follows:—

Scale of Fees to be paid on registration and annually thereafter by Keepers of Lodging Houses—

When the maximum number of lodgers to be accommodated does not exceed 20	\$15.00
When the maximum number of lodgers to be accommodated exceeds 20	\$20.00

20. By-law 3 is amended by deleting the words "Schedule 'D'" following the passage "and with such application he shall tender to the local authority a fee as prescribed in" and insert the words "Offensive Trades (Fees) Regulations 1976" in lieu thereof.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911, as amended, a Local Authority may make by-laws with respect to the matters specified in section 172 of the said Act: Now therefore, the Shire of Exmouth, being the Local Authority for the Exmouth Shire Health District doth hereby make the following by-laws.

Eating House By-Laws.

- These by-laws will have effect from 1 July 1982.
- On and after 1 July 1982, no person shall establish or carry on the business of an eating house within the Shire of Exmouth unless:
 - the eating house is registered with the Local Authority, and
 - the proprietor holds a licence from the Local Authority, authorising him to conduct the business of an eating house.
- All registrations and licences shall expire on 30 June next ensuing after the date of issue.
- The fees to be paid under these by-laws shall be as follows:—

Registration of premises	\$10.00
Proprietors licence	\$ 2.00
- The proprietor of every eating house shall apply for renewal of registration of the premises, and of his licence, within one month of the expiry of that registration and licence.
- (a) Before any eating house is registered the proprietor shall make application to the Local Authority in the form prescribed in the First Schedule.

(b) If the application is approved, the Local Authority shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, issue to the applicant a certificate of registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule.

7. (a) Before any licence to conduct the business of an eating house is issued, the proprietor shall make application to the Local Authority in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule.

(b) If the application is approved, the Local Authority shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, issue to the applicant a licence in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.

8. If there are two or more joint proprietors:—

- (a) each proprietor shall lodge a separate application form;
- (b) the issue of a licence or registration shall be in the joint names of the applicants but no licence shall be issued unless the Local Authority approves all the applicants.
- (c) each proprietor named in the licence or registration shall be severally responsible for compliance with all the obligations of the proprietor.

9. Every person failing to do any act directed to be done, or doing any act forbidden to be done by these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of \$100 plus a daily penalty of \$4 for every day or part of a day which the breach is continued after the complaint of such breach has been made.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

The Municipality of the City of Belmont.

By-laws Relating to Fences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 22 February 1982, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws.

1. The Fencing By-laws of the City of Belmont published in the *Government Gazette* on 26 July 1972 and subsequently amended by notices in the *Government Gazette* on 9 September 1977 and 11 November 1977, are hereby revoked.

2. In these by-laws unless the context requires otherwise—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the City of Belmont.

“Surveyor” means the Building Surveyor of the Municipal District of the City of Belmont or an officer appointed by the Council as surveyor for the purposes of these by-laws.

“Dangerous” in respect of a fence means a fence which is likely to collapse or fall, or part of which is likely to collapse or fall, by reason of its faulty design, location or construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground levels or other cause whatsoever.

“District” means the Municipal District of the City of Belmont.

“Dividing Fence” means a fence which separates the land of different owners whether the fence is on the common boundary of adjoining lands or on a line other than the common boundary.

“Fence” means any fence or wall and includes a retaining wall.

“Frontage” means the boundary line between an allotment of land and the street upon which that allotment abuts and when the allotment abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between the allotment and the street on which any building which may be erected on the land fronts or, in case of doubt, a boundary line which the Council shall designate for that purpose.

“Reserve” means any road, footway, open space or other land designated for public or community purposes.

“Zone” means a zone or area designated under the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme in force for the time being under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) within the Municipal District of the City of Belmont.

3. No person shall commence to erect or proceed with the erection of a fence or with the amendment, alteration, extension or enlargement of an existing fence on land within the District unless and until he has obtained a building permit from the Council to do so. The applicant shall submit plans and specifications of the proposed fence or the amendment, alteration, extension or enlargement thereof.

4. Subject to By-law 13 (1) (i) if any person shall desire to erect a new fence or to amend, alter, extend or enlarge an existing fence within a residential zone in such a way that the finished height of the fence will exceed 1.8 metres he shall in applying for a building permit from the Council submit special reasons in writing with respect to the desirability of the fence exceeding 1.8 metres in height and the Council may in its absolute discretion approve the application or refuse approval to any portion of the fence exceeding 1.8 metres in height.

5. No person shall erect, amend, alter, extend or enlarge a fence otherwise than in accordance with a building permit.

6. A person desiring to erect a retaining wall exceeding 900 mm in height shall, when required by the Council, submit engineering calculations in respect thereof.

7. Corrugated galvanized iron and flat iron shall not be used in the construction of any fence or in any gate comprising part of a fence.

8. Secondhand materials shall not be used in the construction of any fence unless they have been inspected and approved in writing by the Surveyor.

9. Subject to By-laws 10 and 11 of those by-laws, no person shall place or permit to remain on any fence on land owned or occupied by him barbed or other wire with spikes or jagged projections, provided, however, that the owner or occupier of land in an Industrial Area may place or fix barbed wire on a fence thereon if that wire is not less than 2 metres above the ground level throughout the length of the fence.

10. The owner or occupier of land within a non-urban area may affix barbed wire to a fence thereon provided that where the fence is adjacent to a street or other public place, the barbed wire shall be placed on the side of the fence posts furthest from such road or other public place.

11. The Council may at its discretion permit the use of barbed wire in a fence on Recreation Areas and Reserves provided, however, that no barbed wire may be placed or fixed less than 1.8 metres above the ground level throughout the length of the fence.

12. No person shall use iron spikes, broken glass or any other material which, in the opinion of the Council, is or is likely to be dangerous in or on fences, gates or other structures erected or placed on a site within the district adjacent to a street, way, path or other public place or in a residential area.

13. (1) Subject to sub-by-laws (2) and (3) hereof:—

(i) (a) Within a residential zone a front boundary fence which extends the full width of the frontage must be constructed of brick or masonry or any other material approved by Council and must not exceed 1.1 m in height except where Council gives its prior approval, which approval shall in any event only be given if the fence does not exceed 1.8 metres in height.

(b) Where a fence along a front boundary—

(i) does not exceed 10 metres in total length along the front boundary;

(ii) is on both sides of every driveway angled into the allotment of land for a distance of not less than 3 metres from the frontage and to a distance of not less than 3 metres along the frontage to provide splayed lines of sight,

then for each 1 metre the remainder of such fence is set back behind the front boundary, the fence may exceed 1.1 metres in height by 500 mm.

(ii) No person shall erect along any side boundary of any allotment of land for a distance of 7.5 metres from the frontage or the distance that a dwelling is sited forward of the building line any fence exceeding 1.1 metres in height without the prior written approval of the Council which approval shall in any event only be given if the side fence is the same height as the fence along the frontage of the said land, or that particular side boundary abuts a public recreation reserve or other area set aside for public recreation.

13 (2) Where a lot abuts a road reserve on two or more sides a fence in excess of 1.1 metres in height may only be erected with the prior written approval of the Council along any property line which is common on two lots.

(3) No person shall erect or have or permit to be erected on any land owned by him any wall, fence, hedge, tree, shrub or other obstruction of a greater height than 750 mm measured from the level of the footpath, road, or right-of-way immediately adjoining the same within the area enclosed by the boundaries of the streets, roads or right-of-way and a line adjoining the points located at a distance of 6 metres measured horizontally along each street, road or right-of-way boundary from the point of intersection of the streets, roads or right-of-way or from the point of the intersection of a prolongation of the said boundaries except that this by-law shall not apply to intersections or junctions having the standard truncation of 8.5 metres or more.

14. The owner or the occupier of land on which a fence is erected shall maintain the fence in good condition and in such manner as to prevent it becoming dangerous, falling into a bad state of repair or becoming dilapidated, unsightly or prejudicial to the property or the value of neighbouring properties.

15. A link mesh fence of not more than 2 metres in height may be erected subject to the provisions of the schedule to these by-laws.

16. Subject to by-law 15 a fence constructed in accordance with the specifications set out in the schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sufficient fence for the provisions of the Dividing Fences Act, 1961 (as amended) and shall be the minimum specification for fences erected under these by-laws.

17. (1) The Council may by written notice to any owner of land within the district require him within 28 days after service of such notice to maintain or take down and remove any fence thereon erected or maintained otherwise than in accordance with these by-laws.

(2) In the case of a boundary fence the owners of the land adjoining such fence shall be jointly and severally liable to comply with the provisions of this by-law.

18. Where any owner upon being served with a notice by the Council requiring him to maintain a fence erected on his land or on any boundary thereof fails to comply with the notice within the time therein specified, the Council may carry out and provide or may authorise any person to carry out and provide any work or materials which in the opinion of the Council is or are required properly to maintain the fence and may recover the amount of the cost thereby incurred from the owner in any court of competent jurisdiction.

19. The whole of the district is hereby prescribed as the area in which section 340 (1) of the Local Government Act 1960, shall apply.

20. Any person who does anything in contravention of any of the provisions of these by-laws or fails to carry out any duty or requirement imposed upon him by these by-laws, commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of \$200.00 with a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20.00 per day. The minimum penalty shall not exceed one tenth of the maximum penalty and the maximum daily penalty and shall increase in severity by not less than one-tenth of the maximum for each successive breach of the same by-law by the same offender.

Schedule.

Zones Other than Industrial.

A dividing fence along a side boundary shall for a minimum distance equivalent to the distance of any building erected on the allotment from the street frontage be constructed of brick concrete or galvanised link mesh wire or any other material approved by Council in writing of a height not more than 1.1 metres.

Save as aforesaid a sufficient fence shall be constructed as follows—

- (a) Front corner posts shall be 125 millimetres x 125 millimetres x 1.5 metres.

Rear corner posts shall be 125 millimetres x 125 millimetres x 1.8 metres for 1.5 metre fences or 125 millimetres x 125 millimetres x 2.1 metres for 1.8 metre fences.

Intermediate posts within 7.5 metres of the frontage shall be 125 millimetres x 75 millimetres x 1.5 metres.

Other intermediate posts shall be 125 millimetres x 75 millimetres x 1.8 metres for 1.5 metre fences or 125 millimetres x 75 millimetres x 2.1 metres for 1.8 metre fences.

All posts shall be spaced at not more than 2.4 metre centres.

All posts shall have tops with 12 millimetres weathering and shall be sunk at least 600 mm in the ground.

Corner posts shall be struted two ways with 100 millimetres x 50 millimetres soles and 75 millimetres x 50 millimetres struts.

Intermediate posts shall be double yankee struted with 150 millimetres x 25 millimetres x 450 millimetre struts.

All posts and struts below ground level shall be coated with tar or creosote or other approved termite treatment.

Rails shall be housed into posts.

Rails shall be a minimum 75 millimetres x 50 millimetres double nailed to each post and each rail shall span two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

A fence other than of brick or concrete shall be constructed with posts and rails to which galvanized wire link mesh or other material approved by the Surveyor shall be fixed, such construction extending for a distance from the frontage equivalent to the distance of any building erected on the allotment from such frontage and for the next 2.4 metres it shall be of sawn 1 metre x 18 millimetre pickets or palings of graduated lengths rising from 1.1 metre minimum to 1.8 metre maximum. Thereafter the fence shall be covered with 75 millimetre x 18 millimetre x 1.8 metre maximum sawn pickets or palings or corrugated or contoured asbestos cement sheets.

- (b) Alternatively a Supersix corrugated asbestos sheet fence constructed as follows—

(i) Sheets under 1.8 metres high to be trenched 450 millimetres in soil.

(ii) Sheets over 1.8 metres high to be trenched 600 mm in soil.

Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanized 6 millimetre gutter bolts, nuts and washers.

Sheets may be capped with an approved capping mould.

- (c) A dividing fence along a rear boundary shall be constructed as follows—

Corner posts shall be 125 millimetres x 125 millimetres x 2.1 metres minimum for 1.8 metre fences or 1.8 metres for 1.5 metre fences and intermediate posts shall be 125 millimetres x 75 millimetres x 2.1 metres for 1.8 metre fences or 1.8 metres for 1.5 metre fences spaced at not more than 2.4 metre centres.

All posts shall have tops with 12 millimetre weathering and shall be sunk at least 600 mm in the ground.

All posts shall be double yankee struted with 150 millimetres x 25 millimetres x 450 millimetre struts.

All posts below ground and all struts below ground first shall be coated with tar, creosote or other approved termite treatment.

Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.

Rails shall be a minimum of 75 millimetres x 50 millimetres double nailed to each post and each rail shall span two bays of fencing with joints staggered.

The fence shall be covered with material acceptable to the Council and approved by the Surveyor.

- (d) Brick fencing 110 mm thick shall be provided with a concrete or brick footing not less than 300 mm x 250 mm, the base being not less than 300 mm below ground level, and be provided with 230 mm x 110 mm minimum fully bonded piers at a maximum of 2.7 centres.

- (e) Ranch type fencing where approved of by Council shall be constructed as follows—

(i) Posts shall be not less than 125 mm x 75 mm set 600 mm to the ground and struted with 150 mm x 25 mm x 450 mm struts spaced at a maximum of 1800 centres having weathered tops or be provided with cappings.

Schedule—*continued*.

- (ii) Horizontal boarding shall be not less than 150 mm x 25 mm double nailed with galvanized nails. Boarding shall cover at least two spans with joints staggered.
- (iii) All timber posts and rails to be treated with an approved wood preservative immediately on completion of fence.
- (f) Fences on land used for rural purposes shall be erected from sawn, split or round wooden posts set not less than 600 mm in the ground and not less than 1.2 metres out of the ground and spaced not more than 3.6 metres apart with strainer posts set 1 metre in the ground and suitably and securely strutted at all corners, gateways and fence line angles but not exceeding 200 metres apart. Each fence post shall be bored with not less than five 12 millimetre suitably placed holes, to be threaded with not less than five plain galvanized wires. Wire shall be wrapped around strainer and strained tight.

The following material shall be used:—

- (i) Wire which shall be not less than 2.7 millimetres.
- (ii) Posts which if of paperbark, jam, white gum, jarrah or other indigenous timber shall be cut not less than 1.8 metres long x 100 millimetres diameter at small end if round, or 125 millimetres x 60 millimetres if split or sawn.
- (iii) Strainer posts which shall be not less than 2.3 metres long and 150 millimetres diameter at small end shall be cut from indigenous timbers.

Industrial Zone.

- (a) Fences abutting a street or within 3 metres of any public place:—

End and gate posts shall be constructed of galvanized iron piping having an internal diameter of not less than 50 millimetres and shall be fastened on top with caps and set into concrete blocks having a depth of not less than 600 mm and sides of a width of not less than 230 millimetres.

Struts shall be constructed of galvanized iron piping having an internal diameter of not less than 30 millimetres set into concrete bases.

Corner posts shall have not less than two struts at right-angles to each other, and gate posts not less than one strut.

Intermediate posts shall be constructed of galvanized iron piping having an internal diameter of not less than 40 millimetres and shall be fastened on top with caps and set into concrete blocks having a depth of not less than 450 millimetres and sides of a width of not less than 230 millimetres spaced at not more than 3.6 metre centres.

Cables shall be affixed to the top centre and bottom of all posts and shall consist of two or more 2.5 millimetre wires twisted together.

Chain wire shall be not less than 1.8 metres high and constructed of 50 millimetre mesh 2.7 millimetre galvanized iron wire barked selvedged at the top and shall be strained neatly secured and laced to the corner posts and affixed to the cables with clips.

Gates shall provide an opening of not less than 3.6 metres and shall be constructed of 25 millimetre tubular framework with one horizontal and one vertical stay constructed of 18 millimetre piping, and shall be covered with 50 millimetre mesh 2.7 millimetre chain wire, strained and laced to framework. Gates shall be fitted with a drop bolt and locking attachment.

- (b) Dividing fences along side and rear boundaries:—

All such fences shall be constructed in accordance with the specifications laid down by paragraph (a) except that they shall not be less than 2.3 metres high with chain wire not less than 1.8 metres high surmounted by three rows of plain or barbed wire and all posts shall have either a straight extension or a cranked top at an angle of 45 degrees for the wire, angled away from boundary alignments, towards the land being enclosed.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

The Municipality of the Shire of Exmouth.

By-law Relating to Standing Orders.

IN Pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 27 August 1979, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law:—

Standing Orders.

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to the following by-law which shall be called the Standing Orders.

Chairman.

2. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word President shall include the "Deputy President" or any Councillor chosen to preside by the Council at any meeting of the Council.

3. The President if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and, in his absence or if, after being present, he retires, the "Deputy President" or in his absence a Councillor chosen by the Councillors present, shall preside.

Quorum.

4. At any meeting of the Council a quorum shall consist of not less than three Councillors in addition to the President. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Adjournment in Absence of Quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within a half of an hour after the time appointed for such meeting the majority of Councillors present, or any one Councillor, if only one be present, or the Shire Clerk, if no Councillor be present, may adjourn such meeting to any date not later than seven (7) days from the date of such adjournment.

Count Out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a Councillor shall call the attention of the President to the fact that a quorum is not present, the President shall adjourn the meeting for five minutes, and if after that time a quorum is still not present, the President shall adjourn the meeting to some future date.

Record of Councillors Present.

7. At all meetings at which there is not a quorum present at which the Council is counted out for want of a Quorum, the names of the Councillors then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Open Doors.

8. The business of ordinary meetings of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Council shall, by resolution which may be moved without notice, decide otherwise.

9. At all ordinary meetings media reporters shall be permitted to attend in such part of the Council Chamber as may be appropriated for their accommodation, but they shall withdraw upon a vote of the Council so requiring during any portion of the whole of the meeting.

Disturbance by Visitors.

10. The admission of citizens, reporters and visitors to the Council Chamber shall be under and subject to the condition that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation or interruption to the proceedings of the Council shall take place, and in the event of any breach of this condition, the President may at his discretion, and without taking a vote of the Council, require the person or persons so offending to withdraw, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the Council Chamber.

Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Council, who interrupts the orderly conduct of the business of the Council, who does not immediately upon being called upon by the President so to do, withdraw from the Council Chamber, may by order of the President be removed from the Council Chamber forthwith.

Business at Council Meetings.

Order of Business at Ordinary Meetings.

12. The order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect.

- (i) Confirmation of Minutes.
- (ii) Announcements by the President without discussion.
- (iii) Questions of which due notice has been given without discussion.
- (iv) Correspondence.
- (v) Petitions and memorials.

- (vi) Notice of intention to move the suspension of Standing Orders at the close of the meeting.
- (vii) Reports of Committees.
- (viii) Orders of the day, including considering and ordering upon any business left over from the previous meeting and any business the President may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (ix) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x) Notices of motions for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Order of Business at Special Meetings.

13. The order of business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Minutes.

14. The reading of the minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, as provided by section 188 of the Local Government Act, may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of them at least three days before the holding of the next ordinary meeting, and such minutes not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of Council in order that they be confirmed; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the President as required by section 188 (1) of the Local Government Act.

Questions.

15. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council shall give notice thereof in writing to the Shire Clerk at least four hours, during which time the Council office is normally open for business, before the hour fixed for the meeting.

16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Correspondence.

17. No discussion shall be permitted on any motion that any correspondence be received or not received or that any correspondence or any part thereof be referred to any special committee of the council.

Notices of Motion.

18. (1) Any Councillor may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the Shire Clerk, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than seven clear days before such lastmentioned meeting.

(2) Every notice of motion shall relate to some question affecting the constitution, administration, or condition of the Municipality.

(3) The President shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with the last preceding subclause.

Motion to Lapse.

19. Every such motion shall lapse, unless the Councillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called upon.

Deputation.

Reception of Deputations.

20. Deputations wishing to be received by the Council shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the Shire Clerk shall bring the memorial before the Committee concerned which shall be authorized, if it sees fit, to receive the deputation and to report to the Council. If the Committee is of the opinion that the memorial is one which should be brought before the Council the Committee shall so report and, if the Council shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

Number of Deputation.

21. A deputation shall not exceed 10 in number, and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee, and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

Conduct of Debate.

Councillors to Address the Chair—Point of Order.

22. (1) Any Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the President and shall not be interrupted unless upon a point of order, in which event he shall resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon, and the question or order has been disposed of, whereupon the Councillor so interrupted may if permitted proceed.

(2) Rising to express a difference of opinion with or to contradict a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order.

(3) The following action shall be deemed breaches of order, namely:

- (a) Discussion of a question not before the Council.
- (b) The use of offensive or insulting language.
- (c) The violation of any by-law or standing order of the Council.

Nature of Motion to be Stated.

23. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment, shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon, and, if so required by the President shall put the same in writing.

Motions to be Seconded—Enforcement of Standing Orders.

24. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by directing the President's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of Titles.

25. At meetings of the Council, speakers in referring to others present thereat shall designate them by their respective titles of President or Councillor as the case may be.

Priority of Speakers.

26. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time the President shall decide which is entitled to priority.

President to Speak.

27. Whenever the President rises during a debate any Councillor then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Council is to be silent so that the President may be heard without interruption.

Councillor Not To Speak Twice.

Personal Explanation.

28. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he was the mover or as the mover, of an amendment last carried. And no Councillor shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply. No Councillor shall speak otherwise than upon the question before the Council except to make a personal explanation. Any Councillor making a personal explanation must confine himself to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood, and to explanation itself, and he must not advert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose, nor to endeavour to strengthen his former argument by introducing new argument or matter or by replying to other Councillors.

Calling to Order for Speaking Twice.

29. The President shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any Councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover or Seconder to be Held to Have Spoken.

30. A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

No Speaking After Notice Put.

31. No Councillor may speak to any question after the same has been put from the Chair.

Time Limit.

32. No Councillor shall speak or address the Council upon any motion or amendment before the Council, or in reply, for a longer period than 10 minutes without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate.

Speaking in Reply.

33. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of Complicated Motions.

34. The President, at his discretion, may, or the Council may by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of two or more motions.

Withdrawal of Motion.

35. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Production of Documents.

36. Any Councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

Reflection Upon Resolution of Council.

37. No Councillor shall reflect upon any resolution of the Council except for the purpose of moving that such resolution be rescinded.

All Councillors to Vote.

38. At all meetings of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides, all the Councillors present shall vote, and if any councillor fails to vote the President shall call upon him to vote.

Digression from Subject—Personal Reflections.

39. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion nor impute improper motives to any other Councillor, and all personal reflections upon any Councillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

Record of Words Used by a Councillor.

40. Any Councillor may require the Shire Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Councillor immediately upon the same being used.

President's Ruling.

41. The President when called upon to decide a point of order or practice shall give his decision and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particular case, unless a majority of the members of the Council then present shall, upon motion made forthwith without discussion by the mover or seconder or other person, dissent therefrom.

Withdrawal of Offensive Expression.

42. Any Councillor who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the President reflects offensively on any member of the Council, shall, when required by the President unreservedly withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the Chair, and if he declines, or neglects, to do so, the President may refuse to hear such Councillor further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Council.

Disturbance—Conversing Aloud.

43. No Councillor shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud whilst any other Councillor is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

Continued Irrelevance.

44. The President may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Councillor, and may direct such Councillor, if speaking to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such Councillor shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

Crossing Council Chamber.

45. When the President is putting any question, no Councillor shall walk out of or across the Chamber, nor shall any Councillor, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the chair.

President May Call to Order.

46. The President shall preserve order, and may, on his own motion call any Councillor to order whenever, in his opinion, there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

47. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the President to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Councillor.

Decision of President on Point of Order—Councillor
To Apologise When Called Upon.

48. Whenever it shall have been decided by the President that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Council, is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the President to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as the case may require.

Disorder.

49. If disorder should arise at any meeting of the Council, the President acting in his discretion, may as a matter of right, quit the chair, and announce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of 15 minutes, when the Council shall reassemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceeded with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the Chair and decided without debate by a majority of the members present.

Order in Debate.

Motions and Amendments.

50. When a motion is under debate at any meeting of the Council, no further motion shall be received, except the following:—

- (1) That the motion be amended.
- (2) That the Council do now adjourn.
- (3) That the debate be adjourned.
- (4) That the question be now put.
- (5) That the Council do proceed with the next business.
- (6) That the Council sit behind closed doors.
- (7) That the meeting be now closed.

That the Motion be Amended.

Relevance of Amendment.

51. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

To Be Read.

52. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.

53. Only one amendment at a time shall be discussed, but as often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved before the original question is put to the vote: Provided that, when an amendment is carried one amendment thereto and no more may be moved.

Substantive Motion.

54. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as the original motion.

That the Council Do Now Adjourn.

Time to Move.

55. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn provided that the mover may speak for not more than a few minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally seconding, and the mover to the question under debate (if any), on the motion for the adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for five minutes but no further debate shall be allowed. No Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council shall be permitted to move the adjournment of the Council.

No Discussion—Procedure Before Further Motion.

56. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

Question Adjourned to Next Meeting.

57. On a resolution for adjournment the question (if any) under debate when the motion for adjournment was made shall stand adjourned to the next meeting.

One Motion Only.

58. At the same sitting no Councillor may move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

Speaking at Resumption of Council.

59. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject provided that this clause shall not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

That the Debate be Adjourned.

Time to Move.

60. Any Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, move without previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same meeting or to any other meeting.

No Discussion—Definition of Adjournment.

61. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate, the Councillor moving the motion may speak for not more than five minutes in explanation of his reason for so moving; but the seconder shall not be permitted to speak beyond formally seconding it, and no argument or discussion shall be permitted thereon; Provided that, if the original motion has been submitted by a Committee, the chairman of such committee, or, in his absence, a member thereof, may speak for not exceeding five minutes in explanation of any objection he may have to the adjournment.

Any motion having for its object the deferring of a final decision on any subject to a later meeting of the Council shall be deemed to be a motion for the adjournment of the debate.

Mover to Speak First.

62. On resuming an adjourned debate, the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

One Motion Only.

63. At the same sitting no member shall move or second more than one motion for adjournment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate After Count Out.

64. If the debate on any motion, moved and seconded, be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

Speaking at Subsequent Debate.

65. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate, and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent debate on the same subject, provided that this clause shall not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

That the Question be Now Put.

Time to Move—Put Without Debate.

66. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of another Councillor, move without notice and without comment that the question under consideration be now put, and upon such motion being formally seconded the same shall be immediately put without debate.

Two Thirds Majority.

67. A motion that the question under consideration be now put shall not be moved by a Councillor who has already spoken on the question, and such a motion shall not be carried without the consent of a two thirds majority of the Councillors present.

Speaking in Reply.

68. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if the debate has ensured, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put.

Motion To Be Put At Once.

69. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under debate shall be at once put.

Question Includes Amendment.

70. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the Chair shall be construed and taken to mean and include the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

That the Council do Proceed to the Next Business.

Time to Move.

71. It shall be competent for any Councillor at the close of the speech or any other Councillor to move, without notice, that the Council do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be Dropped.

72. When a motion has been carried that the Council do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shall be considered dropped.

Further Motion.

73. During the same debate a second motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour of the original motion.

That the Council Resolve to Sit Behind Closed Doors.

Decision of Council.

74. The Council may determine that any question shall be considered behind closed doors and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous motion.

Conduct of Business Behind Closed Doors.

75. The Standing Orders of the Council, when sitting behind closed doors, shall apply except that Councillors may speak more than once to the same question.

Adoption of Resolutions Behind Closed Doors.

76. The President shall report the resolutions arrived at behind closed doors, at its next ordinary meeting, or upon resumption of the council, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Council may think fit.

Confidential Business.

77. All matters dealt with or brought before the Council sitting behind closed doors or before any Committee of the Council shall be treated as strictly confidential and unless and until the Council or a Committee appointed by the Council otherwise determines, no information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be disclosed to any person outside the Council prior to the issue of the business paper containing the items to be submitted to Council for confirmation.

Motion to Increase Expenditure.

78. No motion or amendment shall be moved at any meeting of the Council otherwise than in the form of a reference to the Finance Committee for consideration and report, if it would have the effect of incurring expenditure not provided for in the estimates.

Rescission of Resolutions.

Rescission.

79. No Resolution of any meeting of Council shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered except as provided by section 177 (1) and (2) of the Local Government Act.

Repetition of Negatived Motion.

80. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained within a period of three months of the motion that was negatived, unless with the consent of an absolute majority of members of the Councillors then present.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

How Moved:

81. In cases of urgent necessity any standing order or standing orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded, provided that—

- (a) no such motion shall be made until all business appearing in the Notice Paper has been disposed of;
- (b) no such motion shall be carried unless the number of Councillors voting in the affirmative shall exceed those voting in the negative by at least two.
- (c) no such motion shall be permitted unless notice thereof in writing shall have been given at the time prescribed by Clause 18 of these Standing Orders, unless the President shall be satisfied that this requirement could not reasonably have been complied with.

Objects of Suspension to be Stated.

82. Any Councillor moving the suspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

Voting.

Method of Taking Votes.

83. The President shall, in taking the vote on any motion or an amendment put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion as to which party has the majority by a show of hands, or on the voices.

Voting—Division.

84. (1) The Council shall vote by a show of hands, or on the voices, as may in each case be directed by the President but any Councillor may call for a division on any question.

(2) Upon a division being called for the division bell shall be rung for one minute, and after the lapse of one-half of a minute from the bell ceasing to ring no Councillor shall be permitted to enter or leave the Chamber until after the division has been taken.

(3) When a division is being taken and until the vote is recorded, all Councillors voting in the affirmative shall pass to the right of the chair and all those voting in the negative to the left of the chair.

Committees.

Standing Committees.

85. (1) In addition to such special committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be two standing committees appointed from among the Councillors, namely:—

- (a) Finance and trading concerns committee.
- (b) A works and general purposes committee.

(2) Each of the committees shall consist of three members of the Council.

Election of Committees.

86. (1) Subject to sub-by-law (2) of this by-law, the members of each standing committee shall be appointed for each year at the first ordinary meeting of the Council held after the annual election and shall hold office until the first Sunday after the first Saturday in May in any year.

(2) The Council may, by resolution carried pursuant to a notice of motion by a simple majority, or on a motion moved without notice, by an absolute majority, change the membership of any committee or appoint substitutes for Councillors absent pursuant to leave granted by the Council.

Powers and Duties of Committees.

87. The Standing Committees of the Council shall have the oversight of the following matters:—

(1) Finance and Trading Concerns Committee:

- (i) Finances of Council.
- (ii) Items of Expenditure recommended by the Spending Committees.
- (iii) Preparation of Budgets for each financial year.
- (iv) Loans.
- (v) The Council's Executive Staff.
- (vi) Boundaries.
- (vii) Any matters not specifically the oversight responsibility of the other committee.

(2) Works and General Purpose Committee:

- (i) Effecting of construction and maintenance of streets, ways, drains, bridges, parks and reserves, parking areas and other public places.
- (ii) Sweeping and clearing of streets, trees and street lawns.
- (iii) Resumption of land for new streets and widening of existing streets.
- (iv) Fencing vacant lands.
- (v) Construction of crossings over footpaths and any constructional matter in relation to streets.
- (vi) The Council's plant and machinery.
- (vii) Oversight through the appointed officers, of Council's outside workforce.
- (viii) Street names, directional signs and all other signs.
- (ix) Vehicular parking bays and areas.
- (x) Stands for licenced vehicles and all matters relating to the control of traffic.
- (xi) Lighting of streets and lighting of reserves and public places and matters relating thereto.
- (xii) Construction and maintenance and other works effected to parks, reserves, enclosed oval, children's playgrounds, baths, Council owned buildings and street trees by Council staff.
- (xiii) Matters affecting or relating to the health of the citizens.
- (xiv) House to house inspections.
- (xv) Noxious trades, abattoirs, private hospitals, lodging houses, morgues, etc.
- (xvi) Places of public amusement and conveniences.
- (xvii) Sale and distribution of food and drugs.
- (xviii) The garbage removal and disposal services of the Municipality.
- (xix) Dogs, goats and all other animals, birds, bees, etc. and matters pertaining to the operation and maintenance of Municipal pounds.
- (xx) Hawkers and Itinerant Food Vendors.
- (xxi) Resumption of land for public open space.
- (xxii) Town Planning.
- (xxiii) Industrial Development.
- (xxiv) Control of buildings and related matters.
- (xxv) Control and oversight of parks, reserves, enclosed ovals, recreation areas and children's playground areas in respect of their use and improvements.
- (xxvi) Swimming pools, caravan parks, town halls, office buildings, Infant Health Centres, Pre-School Centres, Senior Citizen Centres and all other Council owned buildings (other than Works Depot) in respect of their use and improvement.
- (xxvii) Libraries.
- (xxviii) Cemeteries.
- (xxix) Civic functions (with power to act).
- (xxx) Tourism.
- (xxxi) Museums and Historic Buildings and matters relating thereto.

Special Committees.

88. Special committees may consist of up to three members and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a Committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Council, a special committee ought to be appointed. No standing committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any special committee. The appointment of a special committee shall be made by resolution of the Council which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such special committee, and may either state the number of Councillors to be elected or shall name the Councillors who it is proposed shall constitute such Committee.

Convening Committee Meetings.

89. The Shire Clerk shall call a meeting of any committee when requested to do so by the President, the Chairman, or any two members of such Committee.

Standing Orders.

90. The standing orders of the Council shall be observed and apply in committees, except—

- (1) the order limiting the number of times of speaking shall not apply,
- (2) committees shall meet behind closed doors unless the Council determines otherwise.

Quorum.

91. At a meeting of a Committee a quorum shall consist of not less than two members. Every meeting shall proceed to business as soon after the time states as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Minutes.

92. Each committee shall keep a book, to be called the minute-book, in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the following meeting and signed by the chairman thereof.

Penalty.

93. Any Councillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law shall be liable, on conviction before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, to a penalty, not exceeding \$40.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1981.

The Municipality of the Shire of Pingelly.

By-laws Relating to Public Reserves.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality, hereby records having resolved on 17 April 1980, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires:—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Pingelly.

“Building” means any permanent or temporary structure including tents, marquees and stalls.

“Function” means and includes a carnival show exhibition gymkhana sport party or picnic or a match or contest between opposing teams in any game.

“Public Reserve” means any reserve other than a road reserve under the care, control or management of the Council situated within the Townsite of Pingelly.

“Caretaker” means any person or body of persons employed or appointed by Council to take care of, manage or control a public reserve.

2. No person shall on any public reserve within the townsite of Pingelly—

- (a) throw stones or other missiles;
- (b) cause a nuisance;
- (c) be in a state of intoxication;
- (d) behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use any foul or indecent language or commit any act of indecency;
- (e) drive a vehicle on or over grounds prepared for a playing field or an established park or garden;
- (f) park a vehicle except in an area set aside for that purpose;
- (g) ride a horse over grounds prepared for a playing field or an established garden;
- (h) damage or injure any plant lawn flower or tree;
- (i) cut or damage any soil or turf;
- (j) light a fire unless in a fireplace provided for the purpose;
- (k) use or operate a device causing a loud noise or any siren or starting gun in such a manner as to cause a nuisance or annoyance;
- (l) use or operate any musical instrument radio or loud speaker in such manner as to create excessive noise or as to cause a nuisance or annoyance;
- (m) bet gamble or call the odds or offer to bet or gamble;
- (n) climb over or upon any fence or gate;
- (o) unlock or unfasten any gate unless duly authorised by an officer of the Council to do so;
- (p) enter any dressing or training room or use any of the lockers unless duly authorised by an officer of the Council to do so;
- (q) destroy damage injure or cause harm to any bird or animal;
- (r) climb any tree;
- (s) play any games likely to cause damage to property and endanger or inconvenience the public.

3. No person shall without the consent of the Council, on any public reserve within the townsite of Pingelly—

- (a) park a caravan;
- (b) camp lodge or tarry overnight or frequent for the purpose of camping lodging and tarrying overnight;
- (c) consume alcoholic liquor;
- (d) remove tamper with or re-locate any structure or goal post;
- (e) damage or deface any building;
- (f) discharge a firearm;
- (g) organise, conduct or address a gathering or meeting of persons;
- (h) take part in a procession or demonstration;
- (i) erect or place any signboard hoarding notice or placard or stamp stencil affix or distribute any handbill notice or advertisement or any documents or papers;
- (j) carry a placard or notice;
- (k) use or install a loud speaker or amplifier;
- (l) sell or expose for sale any goods wares merchandise or things.

4. Any person found in a state of intoxication in any public reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any foul or indecent language, or committing any act of indecency therein, may be forthwith removed from such public reserve by the caretaker or by any officer of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force.

5. Any person found betting, gambling or calling the odds or offering to bet or gamble within any public reserve, may be forthwith removed from such public reserve by the caretaker or by any officer of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force.

6. No person shall organise, arrange or take part in a function on a public reserve unless a licence to hold or organise a function shall have been granted by the Council.

7. The Council may grant a licence to a person to hold or organise a function on a public reserve, subject to such conditions, if any, as it may deem fit, and may authorise a charge to be made for admission to the function.

8. A licence to hold a function on a public reserve shall specify—

- (a) the purpose for which such licence is granted;
- (b) the dates and times during which the function may be held; and
- (c) the charge if any which has been authorised by the Council for admission to the function.

9. No licence shall be granted pursuant to the provisions of By-law (7) for a continuous period of more than 14 days.

10. Subject as hereinafter provided no person to whom a licence has been granted shall exclude any member of the general public from attending the function if such person pays the authorised charge for admission.

11. No person to whom a licence has been granted shall make a charge for admission to the function unless authorised to do so by the Council or shall make a charge for admission in excess of the amount of the charge authorised by the Council.

12. No person under the influence of alcohol or acting in a riotous or disorderly manner shall attend a function.

13. A person to whom a licence has been granted shall prevent persons under the influence of alcohol or persons acting in a riotous or disorderly manner from attending a function.

14. Any person to whom a licence has been granted who commits or permits the commission of a breach of any of the terms or conditions of the licence commits an offence.

15. The Council if satisfied that the person to whom a licence has been granted has committed or permitted or authorised the commission of a breach of any of the terms or conditions of the licence or has committed a breach of any of these by-laws may by a notice in writing to such person cancel the licence and thereupon the licence shall be cancelled.

16. No person shall erect or permit or authorise the erection of a building on a public reserve without the consent of the Council.

17. Any person desirous of erecting a building on a public reserve shall make application to the Council for its consent thereto.

18. The consent of the Council to the erection of a building in a public reserve shall specify—

- (a) the purpose for which such building may be used;
- (b) the nature of the building which may be erected;
- (c) the time during which such building may be permitted to remain on the public reserve;
- (d) the times when such building may be used; and
- (e) the position in which such building may be erected.

19. Any person who shall erect or use or permit or authorise the erection or use of any building on a public reserve without the written consent of the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the written consent of the Council commits an offence.

20. Any person who is convicted of an offence against these by-laws shall be liable to—

- (a) a maximum penalty of one hundred dollars; and
- (b) a maximum daily penalty during the breach of ten dollars per day.

COLLEGES ACT 1978-1980.

Western Australian College of Advanced Education.

Statute No. 7.

Membership of the College Council.

1. This Statute applies to members of the College Council whether elected, appointed by the Minister on the recommendation of the Council or appointed by the Governor.
2. In this Statute unless contrary intention appears—
 - "Chairman" means Chairman of the College Council;
 - "Deputy Chairman" means Deputy Chairman of the College Council;
 - "Returning Officer" means an appropriate person appointed by the College Council;
 - "The Act" means the Colleges Act 1978-1980.
3. In accordance with section 13 of the Act, the Council of the College shall consist of—
 - 3.1 Members appointed by the Governor—
 - (a) There shall be seven (7) persons appointed by the Governor.
 - (b) The Chairman shall notify the Minister of the occurrence of a casual vacancy or of the impending expiry of the term of office of an appointed member.
 - 3.2 Members appointed by the Minister on the recommendation of other Members of the Council—
 - (a) The Council shall from time to time recommend for appointment by the Minister as members of the Council, two (2) persons who are not members of the staff or enrolled students of the College.
 - (b) Any member of the Council may nominate a person for membership and such nomination shall be in writing and shall include a brief statement regarding the nominee.
 - (c) The Chairman shall, not more than ten (10) weeks and not less than six (6) weeks before the expiration of the term of office of a member referred to under this subsection or within two (2) weeks of a vacancy occurring other than by effluxion of time, give notice to the Council of any such vacancy which will occur or has occurred.
 - (d) The closing date for nominations shall be not less than ten (10) days prior to the Council meeting immediately preceding the expiration of the term of office of a member referred to in this subsection or prior to the date of the next meeting of the Council following publication of the notice in the case of a vacancy occurring otherwise than by effluxion of time.
 - (e) A ballot of the other Council members, to fill a vacancy resulting from the expiration of the term of an elected member, shall be held at a Council meeting preceding the expiration of the term of a member referred to in this subsection and such ballot shall be conducted by secret ballot using the optional preferential system.
 - (f) Where a vacancy occurs with respect to a member elected under this subsection other than by the effluxion of time, a ballot of the other Council members shall be held prior to the next Council meeting following publication of the notice of a vacancy occurring and such ballot shall be conducted by secret ballot using the optional preferential system.
 - (g) If a vacancy occurs in the office of an elected member and such vacancy is not filled by election, at the expiration of three months of the vacancy occurring the vacancy may be filled in accordance with subsection 4 (a) of section 14 of the Act and that person shall hold office in accordance with subsection 4 (b) of section 14 of the Act.
 - 3.3 Members Elected from the Academic Staff of the College—
 - (a) There shall be two (2) persons who are members of the full-time academic staff of the College who are elected by members of that staff.
 - (b) The manner of election shall be in accordance with Statute No. 8.
 - 3.4 Member Elected from the Salaried Staff Other Than the Academic Staff of the College—
 - (a) There shall be one (1) person who is a member of the full-time salaried staff, other than academic staff, of the College who is elected by members of that staff.
 - (b) The manner of election shall be in accordance with Statute No. 9.
 - 3.5 Member Elected from the Enrolled Students—
 - (a) There shall be one (1) person who is for the time being an enrolled student of the College, and who is elected by the enrolled students of the College.
 - (b) The manner of election shall be in accordance with Statute No. 10.
4. Election of Chairman—Subject to subsection 6 of section 16 of the Act—
 - 4.1 When the office of Chairman becomes vacant in accordance with subsection (4) of section 16 of the Act, the Council shall elect a person, whether a member or not, to be the Chairman for a term not exceeding three (3) years.

4.2 Nomination of Chairman—

- (a) Any member of the Council may nominate in writing a person as Chairman.
- (b) In the case of a vacancy arising under paragraph (a) of subsection (4) of section 16 of the Act, the Director shall, three (3) months prior to the completion of the existing term of office, call for nominations to fill the forthcoming vacancy.
- (c) In the case of a vacancy arising under paragraphs (b)-(d) of subsection (4) of section 16 of the Act (but subject to subsection (6) of section 16 of the Act) the Director shall within fourteen (14) days of the vacancy occurring call for nominations to fill the vacancy.
- (d) The closing date for nominations shall be not less than ten (10) days prior to the Council meeting at which the election is to take place.

4.3 A ballot of Council members shall be held at a Council meeting preceding the expiration of the term of office of the Chairman, or if a vacancy occurs other than by the effluxion of time within three months of the vacancy occurring, and such ballot shall be conducted as nearly as possible in accordance with Statute No. 9.

5. Election of Deputy Chairman.

5.1 When the office of Deputy Chairman is vacant or becomes vacant in accordance with subsection (5) of section 16 of the Act, the Council shall elect a member to be Deputy Chairman for a term not exceeding three (3) years.

5.2 Nomination of Deputy Chairman—

- (a) Any member of the Council may nominate in writing a member as Deputy Chairman.
- (b) In the case of a vacancy arising under paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 16 of the Act, the Director shall, three (3) months prior to the completion of the existing term of office call for nominations to fill the forthcoming vacancy.
- (c) In the case of a vacancy arising under paragraphs (b)-(e) of subsection (5) of section 16 of the Act, the Director shall, forthwith call for nominations to fill the vacancy.

5.3 A ballot of Council members shall be held at a Council meeting preceding the expiration of the term of office of the Deputy Chairman, or if a vacancy occurs other than by the effluxion of time within three months of the vacancy occurring and such ballot shall be conducted as nearly as possible in accordance with Statute No. 9.

COLLEGES ACT 1978-1980.

Western Australian College of Advanced Education.

Statute No. 8.

Election of Academic Staff to Council.

1. Election: This Statute applies to election of members of academic staff to the Council pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 13 of the Act.

2. Definitions: In this Statute unless the contrary intention appears—

“candidate” means a member of the full-time academic staff seeking election to the Council;

“elector” means a member of the full-time academic staff at the time of closing of nominations;

“Returning Officer” means the Chief Electoral Officer appointed under the Electoral Act 1907 (as amended) or such other person as is appointed by him from time to time by notice to the Chairman of the Council.

3. Returning Officer—

(a) The Returning Officer shall not be a candidate in any election in which he is to act.

(b) The Returning Officer may appoint such officers (not being candidates) as he considers necessary to assist him in the conduct of an election and the scrutiny thereof.

- (c) The Returning Officer shall be paid twenty per centum of the fees prescribed by Regulations made under the Electoral Act 1907 (as amended), for the Returning Officers at Parliamentary Elections and the officers employed by him shall, while engaged in the preparation and distribution of voting material and on the scrutiny and count of votes, be paid for their services the fees prescribed for similar duties by those Regulations for Presiding Officers at Parliamentary Elections.

4. Notice of Election—

- (a) Not less than 12 weeks prior to a vacancy occurring due to effluxion of time, the Chairman of the Council shall advise the Returning Officer of such impending vacancy and request the conduct of an election.
- (b) The Chairman of the Council shall, within two weeks of a vacancy occurring other than by effluxion of time, give notice to the Returning Officer requiring him to hold an election for the unexpired portion of the term.

5. Publication of Notice of Election: The Returning Officer shall, within 14 days of receiving notification from the Chairman of the Council requiring him to conduct an election, cause a notice to be published on a notice board of each campus of the College, as directed by the Chairman of the Council, and in a Staff Notice setting out—

- (i) The intention to hold an election;
- (ii) The title of office;
- (iii) The number of members to be elected;
- (iv) The form in which nominations are to be made;
- (v) The place of lodging nominations;
- (vi) The time and date of the close of nominations;
- (vii) The time and date of the ballot.

6. Date for Election: The date fixed for the closing of the poll shall be not less than 21 days nor more than 42 days after the closing of nominations. The date for the close of nominations shall be not less than 7 days nor more than 14 days from the date of publication of the notice of election issued in accordance with the preceding clause 5.

7. Electoral Roll—

- (a) In the event of an election being required the Director or his nominee shall, within four days after the close of nominations, supply to the Returning Officer a true and correct list of the names and addresses for service or posting of voting papers of all electors and the list shall constitute the electoral roll for use at the election.
- (b) The Director or his nominee shall endorse and sign on the roll so prepared a certificate as to the correctness thereof and that roll shall be conclusive evidence of the right of each person enrolled thereon to vote at the election.
- (c) The Director or his nominee may cause a supplementary roll or rolls to be prepared and endorsed in conformity with, and having the same effect as, the preceding paragraph so as to include the names of eligible persons incorrectly omitted from the roll. Such supplementary roll or rolls shall be forwarded to the Returning Officer forthwith after endorsement.
- (d) The Returning Officer shall, at the place where he carries out his functions as Returning Officer, make the electoral roll, including any supplementary rolls, applicable to an election for an office available for inspection by any elector, or by any person authorised by the Returning Officer, during the ordinary hours of business until the day on which the result of the election is declared.

8. Nominations—

- (a) Nominations of candidates shall be lodged with the Returning Officer in the form of Form No. 1 in the Appendix to this Statute, not later than the day and time appointed for the receipt of nominations by the notice published under clause 5 of this Statute.
- (b) A nomination shall be signed by the candidate himself, if the candidate is not the proposer, and by a proposer, each of whom must be a member of the full-time academic staff at the time the nomination form is signed.
- (c) A proposer shall not nominate a number of candidates greater than the number of positions to be filled.
- (d) The Returning Officer shall reject any nomination form which, in his opinion, is not in order as required by this Statute, and any such rejection shall be final and conclusive as against that nomination. Nothing in this paragraph shall prevent a further nomination submitted in respect of a candidate being accepted by the Returning Officer before the close of nominations.
- (e) Where the number of candidates nominated does not exceed the number of candidates to be elected, the Returning Officer shall forthwith certify that fact, together with the names and addresses of the candidates nominated to the Director, and such certificate, when received by the Director, shall be the final and conclusive evidence of the election of those candidates as members of the Council.
- (f) When the number of candidates nominated exceeds the number to be elected, the Returning Officer shall hold an election in accordance with this Statute, as hereinafter provided.

- (g) Any candidate may by notice in writing signed by him, addressed to the Returning Officer and lodged with him not later than the time fixed for the close of nominations withdraw his consent to his nomination and thereupon that candidate shall be considered as not having been nominated and the Returning Officer shall omit the name of that candidate from the ballot paper.

9. Polling: When after the receipt of nominations of candidates an election is necessary to elect an elective member or elective members of the Council, the Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the time fixed for the close of such nominations, cause ballot papers to be printed in accordance with Form No. 2 in the Appendix to this Statute containing the full names of all the candidates. The candidates' names shall appear on the ballot paper in the order determined by the Returning Officer by lot.

10. Despatch of Voting Material—

- (a) When the ballot papers have been printed, the Returning Officer shall send by prepaid letter post or otherwise to each person whose name appears as an elector on the electoral roll, to his address as shown on the roll—
- (i) one ballot paper, with the initials of the Returning Officer, or of some other person authorised in that behalf by the Returning Officer, endorsed on the front thereof;
 - (ii) one envelope marked "Ballot Paper";
 - (iii) one envelope addressed to the Returning Officer; and
 - (iv) one counterfoil in the form of Form No. 3 in the Appendix to this Statute, to be completed and signed by the elector.
- (b) For the purpose of casting his vote at the election, the elector—
- (i) shall mark his vote on the ballot paper in the manner set out in clause 12 of this Statute and shall then place the same in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" and seal the envelope; and
 - (ii) shall then sign and complete the counterfoil in accordance with directions stated therein and then place the sealed envelope with the ballot paper enclosed therein and the counterfoil signed and completed in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, and seal such last mentioned envelope.
- (c) The elector may then send by post or other means or may deliver the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, with its enclosures, to the Returning Officer at his address shown on the envelope, but so that the envelope shall be in the hands of the Returning Officer not later than the time fixed for the closing of the poll.
- (d) Voting shall not be compulsory.

11. Replacement of Voting Material: If, prior to the closing of the poll, an elector satisfies the Returning Officer that he has not received a ballot paper and is entitled to vote at the election, or that the ballot paper or envelopes received by him have been lost or destroyed, and that he has not already voted at the poll, the Returning Officer may post or give personally to such elector a ballot paper and envelopes or a further ballot paper and envelopes, as the case may be.

12. Marking of Ballot Paper—

- (a) When only one vacancy is to be filled and there are not more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.
- (b) When only one vacancy is to be filled and there are more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.
- (c) When two vacancies are to be filled, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and the numeral 2 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his second preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 3, 4 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

Provided that in the case of paragraphs 12 (b) and (c) of this clause, if numerals in arithmetical sequence are placed opposite the names of all the candidates but one, the next following numeral shall be deemed to be placed opposite the name of the remaining candidate.

13. Ballot Box: The Returning Officer shall place and keep in a locked and sealed ballot box, until the scrutiny, all envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers received by him up to the close of the poll.

14. Scrutineers—

- (a) Each candidate at an election and the College shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the envelopes containing ballot papers relating to the election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny and to remain during the scrutiny.
- (b) Every scrutineer shall, before he acts, make and sign, before the Returning Officer, a declaration in accordance with Form No. 4 in the Appendix to this Statute.
- (c) Any candidate may attend and be present at the counting of the votes.

15. The Scrutiny—

- (a) As soon as practicable after the close of the poll, the Returning Officer, in the presence of any scrutineer permitted by him, shall—
 - (i) produce and open all sealed and locked ballot boxes in which the envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers and counterfoils have been placed; and
 - (ii) open each outer envelope, compare the enclosed counterfoil with the roll and if satisfied that the person named in the counterfoil is entitled to vote and that the counterfoil has been completed and signed by the elector, strike out the name on the roll and, without opening the envelope marked "Ballot Paper", deposit it in a locked and sealed ballot box and set aside the counterfoil for safe keeping.
- (b) If the right of the person to vote is not established or if the counterfoil is not signed by the elector, the ballot paper shall not be admitted to the scrutiny and the Returning Officer shall replace the counterfoil and the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" in the outer envelope, and set the outer envelope and its contents aside for safe keeping.
- (c) When all the outer envelopes have been opened in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause, the Returning Officer shall proceed with the scrutiny and count of the votes.

16. Method of Count: The method of conducting the count shall be as follows—

- (i) When one vacancy is to be filled and there are more candidates than one, the procedure at the count of votes shall be in the manner provided by the Electoral Act, 1907 (as amended).
- (ii) When two vacancies are to be filled the procedure at the count of votes shall be in the form provided by the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918 (as amended) relating to Senate elections.

17. Informality of Ballot Paper—

- (a) A ballot paper shall be informal—
 - (i) if it is not initialled by the Returning Officer or the other officer authorised in that behalf;
 - (ii) if, subject to paragraph (b) of this clause, it is marked in any other manner than prescribed in clause 12 of this Statute;
 - (iii) if it has upon it any mark or writing not authorised by this Statute, which in the opinion of the Returning Officer will enable any person to identify the elector;
 - (iv) if it does not indicate the elector's vote or, if when there are more than two candidates it is not marked so as effectively to indicate the elector's preference as regards all candidates; or
 - (v) if no mark is indicated on it.
- (b) A ballot paper shall not be informal for any reason other than the reasons stated in paragraph (a) of this clause but shall be given effect according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear, and, in particular when only one candidate is to be elected and there are only two candidates, a ballot paper shall not be informal by reason only of the elector having indicated his vote or first preference by a cross instead of the numeral 1.
- (c) The Returning Officer shall be the sole and final judge as to whether a ballot paper is informal.

18. Declaration of Poll: When the Returning Officer has completed the counting of the votes he shall declare the result of the election in the presence of the scrutineers and of any candidates who may be present at the time.

19. Preservation of Papers: On completion of the scrutiny and count of votes, the Returning Officer shall—

- (a) enclose in one packet all the used and counted ballot papers; in another packet all counterfoils admitted; and in a third packet all outer envelopes and their contents referred to in paragraph (b) of clause 15 of this Statute;
- (b) seal up the several packets and endorse on each packet a description and the number of the contents respectively, the date of the election and sign the endorsement; and
- (c) retain the sealed packets.

20. Certification of Result: When the result of an election has been ascertained and declared the Returning Officer shall forthwith furnish to the Chairman of the Council a certificate of the result and state therein the names of the candidates who have been elected, and such a certificate, when received by the Chairman of the Council shall be final and conclusive evidence of the election of those candidates as members of the Council, subject however to a determination of any appeal under clause 23 of this Statute.

21. Destruction of Papers: Upon the expiration of three months after the date of the certification to the Chairman of the Council of the result of an election, the Returning Officer may authorise the destruction of the packets referred to in clause 19 of this Statute.

22. Costs of Election: All costs, charges and expenses as incurred by the Returning Officer and any officers employed by him in connection with the publication of notices, the receipt of nominations of candidates for election, and the conduct of elections or in connection with any other matters incidental thereto and as certified in writing by

the Returning Officer under his hand, and communicated by the Returning Officer to the Council, shall be borne and paid by the Council or reimbursed to the Returning Officer, or the other officers employed by him as the case may be, by the Council out of moneys from time to time in its hands but the Council may at its own expense have the accounts of the Returning Officer audited.

23. Right of Appeal: A candidate shall have the right of appeal to the Chairman within seven (7) days of the declaration of the poll should he feel the conduct of the election was in any way contrary to this Statute. The Chairman shall have power to make such enquiry as he deems necessary into the matter complained of and after such enquiry may confirm the election or annul the election and direct that a fresh election be held.

Statute No. 9.

Election of Salaried Staff Member to Council.

1. Election: This Statute applies to election of a member of the salaried staff to the Council pursuant to paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 13 of the Act.

2. Definitions: In this Statute unless the contrary intention appears—

“candidate” means a member of the full-time salaried staff seeking election to the Council;

“elector” means a member of the full-time salaried staff at the time of closing of nominations;

“Returning Officer” means the Chief Electoral Officer appointed under the Electoral Act 1970 (as amended) or such other person as is appointed by him from time to time by notice to the Chairman of the Council.

3. Returning Officer—

(a) The Returning Officer shall not be a candidate in any election in which he is to act.

(b) The Returning Officer may appoint such officers (not being candidates) as he considers necessary to assist him in the conduct of an election and the scrutiny thereof.

(c) The Returning Officer shall be paid twenty per centum of the fees prescribed by Regulations made under the Electoral Act 1907 (as amended), for the Returning Officers at Parliamentary Elections and the officers employed by him shall, while engaged in the preparation and distribution of voting material and on the scrutiny and count of votes, be paid for their services the fees prescribed for similar duties by those Regulations for Presiding Officers at Parliamentary Elections.

4. Notice of Election—

(a) Not less than twelve weeks prior to a vacancy occurring due to effluxion of time, the Chairman of the Council shall advise the Returning Officer of such impending vacancy and request the conduct of an election.

(b) The Chairman of the Council shall, within two weeks of a vacancy occurring other than by effluxion of time, give notice to the Returning Officer requiring him to hold an election for the unexpired portion of the term.

5. Publication of Notice of Election: The Returning Officer shall, within 14 days of receiving notification from the Chairman of the Council requiring him to conduct an election, cause a notice to be published on a notice board of each campus of the College, as directed by the Chairman of the Council, and in a Staff Notice setting out—

(i) The intention to hold an election;

(ii) The title of office;

(iii) The number of members to be elected;

(iv) The form in which nominations are to be made;

(v) The place of lodging nominations;

(vi) The time and date of the close of nominations;

(vii) The time and date of the ballot.

6. Date for Election: The date fixed for the closing of the poll shall be not less than 21 days nor more than 42 days after the closing of nominations. The date for the close of nominations shall be not less than 7 days nor more than 14 days from the date of publication of the notice of election issued in accordance with the preceding clause 5.

7. Electoral Roll—

(a) In the event of an election being required the Director or his nominee shall, within four days after the close of nominations, supply to the Returning Officer a true and correct list of the names and addresses for service or posting of voting papers of all electors and the list shall constitute the electoral roll for use at the election.

(b) The Director or his nominee shall endorse and sign on the roll so prepared a certificate as to the correctness thereof and that roll shall be conclusive evidence of the right of each person enrolled thereon to vote at the election.

(c) The Director or his nominee may cause a supplementary roll or rolls to be prepared and endorsed in conformity with, and having the same effect as, the preceding paragraph so as to include the names of eligible persons incorrectly omitted from the roll. Such supplementary roll or rolls shall be forwarded to the Returning Officer forthwith after endorsement.

(d) The Returning Officer shall, at the place where he carries out his functions as Returning Officer, make the electoral roll, including any supplementary rolls, applicable to an election for an office available for inspection by any elector, or by any person authorised by the Returning Officer, during the ordinary hours of business until the day on which the result of the election is declared.

8. Nominations—

- (a) Nominations of candidates shall be lodged with the Returning Officer in the form of Form No. 1 in the Appendix to this Statute, not later than the day and time appointed for the receipt of nominations by the notice published under clause 5 of this Statute.
- (b) A nomination shall be signed by the candidate himself, if the candidate is not the proposer, and by a proposer, each of whom must be a member of the full-time salaried staff at the time the nomination form is signed.
- (c) A proposer shall not nominate more than one candidate.
- (d) The Returning Officer shall reject any nomination form which, in his opinion, is not in order as required by this Statute, and any such rejection shall be final and conclusive as against that nomination. Nothing in this paragraph shall prevent a further nomination submitted in respect of a candidate being accepted by the Returning Officer before the close of nominations.
- (e) Where the number of candidates nominated does not exceed one, the Returning Officer shall forthwith certify that fact, together with the name and address of the candidate nominated to the Director, and such certificate, when received by the Director, shall be the final and conclusive evidence of the election of that candidate as a member of the Council.
- (f) When the number of candidates nominated exceeds one, the Returning Officer shall hold an election in accordance with this Statute, as hereinafter provided.
- (g) Any candidate may by notice in writing signed by him, addressed to the Returning Officer and lodged with him not later than the time fixed for the close of nominations withdraw his consent to his nomination and thereupon that candidate shall be considered as not having been nominated and the Returning Officer shall omit the name of that candidate from the ballot paper.

9. Polling: When after the receipt of nominations of candidates an election is necessary to elect an elective member of the Council, the Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the time fixed for the close of such nominations, cause ballot papers to be printed in accordance with Form No. 2 in the Appendix to this Statute containing the full names of all the candidates. The candidates' names shall appear on the ballot paper in the order determined by the Returning Officer by lot.

10. Despatch of Voting Material—

- (a) When the ballot papers have been printed, the Returning Officer shall send by prepaid letter post or otherwise to each person whose name appears as an elector on the electoral roll, to his address as shown on the roll—
 - (i) one ballot paper, with the initials of the Returning Officer, or of some other person authorised in that behalf by the Returning Officer, endorsed on the front thereof;
 - (ii) one envelope marked "Ballot Paper";
 - (iii) one envelope addressed to the Returning Officer; and
 - (iv) one counterfoil in the form of Form No. 3 in the Appendix to this Statute, to be completed and signed by the elector.
- (b) For the purpose of casting his vote at the election, the elector—
 - (i) shall mark his vote on the ballot paper in the manner set out in clause 12 of this Statute and shall then place the same in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" and seal the envelope; and
 - (ii) shall then sign and complete the counterfoil in accordance with directions stated therein and then place the sealed envelope with the ballot paper enclosed therein and the counterfoil signed and completed in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, and seal such lastmentioned envelope.
- (c) The elector may then send by post or other means or may deliver the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, with its enclosures, to the Returning Officer at his address shown on the envelope, but so that the envelope shall be in the hands of the Returning Officer not later than the time fixed for the closing of the poll.
- (d) Voting shall not be compulsory.

11. Replacement of Voting Material: If, prior to the closing of the poll, an elector satisfies the Returning Officer that he has not received a ballot paper and is entitled to vote at the election, or that the ballot paper or envelopes received by him have been lost or destroyed, and that he has not already voted at the poll, the Returning Officer may post or give personally to such elector a ballot paper and envelopes or a further ballot paper and envelopes, as the case may be.

12. Marking of Ballot Paper—

- (a) When there are not more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.
- (b) When there are more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

Provided that in the case of paragraph 12 (b), if numerals in arithmetical sequence are placed opposite the names of all the candidates but one, the next following numeral shall be deemed to be placed opposite the name of the remaining candidate.

13. Ballot Box: The Returning Officer shall place and keep in a locked and sealed ballot box, until the scrutiny, all envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers received by him up to the close of the poll.

14. Scrutineers—

- (a) Each candidate at an election and the College shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the envelopes containing ballot papers relating to the election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny and to remain during the scrutiny.
- (b) Every scrutineer shall, before he acts, make and sign, before the Returning Officer, a declaration in accordance with Form No. 4 in the Appendix to this Statute.
- (c) Any candidate may attend and be present at the counting of the votes.

15. The Scrutiny—

- (a) As soon as practicable after the close of the poll, the Returning Officer, in the presence of any scrutineer permitted by him, shall—
 - (i) produce and open all sealed and locked ballot boxes in which the envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers and counterfoils have been placed; and
 - (ii) open each outer envelope, compare the enclosed counterfoil with the roll and if satisfied that the person named in the counterfoil is entitled to vote and that the counterfoil has been completed and signed by the elector, strike out the name on the roll and, without opening the envelope marked "Ballot Paper", deposit it in a locked and sealed ballot box and set aside the counterfoil for safe keeping.
- (b) If the right of the person to vote is not established or if the counterfoil is not signed by the elector, the ballot paper shall not be admitted to the scrutiny and the Returning Officer shall replace the counterfoil and the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" in the outer envelope, and set the outer envelope and its contents aside for safe keeping.
- (c) When all the outer envelopes have been opened in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause, the Returning Officer shall proceed with the scrutiny and count of the votes.

16. Method of Count: The method of conducting the count shall be as follows—

When there are more candidates than one, the procedure at the count of votes shall be in the manner provided by the Electoral Act 1907 (as amended).

17. Informality of Ballot Paper—

- (a) A ballot paper shall be informal—
 - (i) if it is not initialled by the Returning Officer or the other officer authorised in that behalf;
 - (ii) if, subject to paragraph (b) of this clause, it is marked in any other manner than prescribed in clause 12 of this Statute;
 - (iii) if it has upon it any mark or writing not authorised by this Statute, which in the opinion of the Returning Officer will enable any person to identify the elector;
 - (iv) if it does not indicate the elector's vote or, if when there are more than two candidates it is not marked so as effectively to indicate the elector's preference as regards all candidates; or
 - (v) if no mark is indicated on it.
- (b) A ballot paper shall not be informal for any reason other than the reasons stated in paragraph (a) of this clause but shall be given effect according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear, and, in particular when there are only two candidates, a ballot paper shall not be informal by reason only of the elector having indicated his vote or first preference by a cross instead of the numeral 1.
- (c) The Returning Officer shall be the sole and final judge as to whether a ballot paper is informal.

18. Declaration of Poll: When the Returning Officer has completed the counting of the votes he shall declare the result of the election in the presence of the scrutineers and of any candidates who may be present at the time.

19. Preservation of Papers: On completion of the scrutiny and count of votes, the Returning Officer shall—

- (a) enclose in one packet all the used and counted ballot papers; in another packet all counterfoils admitted; and in a third packet all outer envelopes and their contents referred to in paragraph (b) of clause 15 of this Statute;
- (b) seal up the several packets and endorse on each packet a description and the number of the contents respectively, the date of the election and sign the endorsement; and
- (c) retain the sealed packets.

20. Certification of Result: When the result of an election has been ascertained and declared the Returning Officer shall forthwith furnish to the Chairman of the Council a certificate of the result and state therein the names of the candidates who have been elected, and such a certificate, when received by the Chairman of the Council shall be final and conclusive evidence of the election of those candidates as members of the Council, subject however to a determination of any appeal under clause 23 of this Statute.

21. Destruction of Papers: Upon the expiration of three months after the date of the certification to the Chairman of the Council of the result of an election, the Returning Officer may authorise the destruction of the packets referred to in clause 19 of this Statute.

22. Costs of Election: All costs, charges and expenses as incurred by the Returning Officer and any officers employed by him in connection with the publication of notices, the receipt of nominations of candidates for election, and the conduct of elections or in connection with any other matters incidental thereto and as certified in writing by the Returning Officer under his hand, and communicated by the Returning Officer to the Council, shall be borne and paid by the Council or reimbursed to the Returning Officer, or the other officers employed by him as the case may be, by the Council out of moneys from time to time in its hands but the Council may at its own expense have the accounts of the Returning Officer audited.

23. Right of Appeal: A candidate shall have the right of appeal to the Chairman within seven (7) days of the declaration of the poll should he feel the conduct of the election was in any way contrary to this Statute. The Chairman shall have power to make such enquiry as he deems necessary into the matter complained of and after such enquiry may confirm the election or annul the election and direct that a fresh election be held.

"Returning Officer" means the Chief Electoral Officer appointed under the Electoral Act 1907 (as amended) or such other person as is appointed by him from time to time by notice to the Chairman of the Council.

3. Returning Officer—

- (a) The Returning Officer shall not be a candidate in any election in which he is to act.
- (b) The Returning Officer may appoint such officers (not being candidates) as he considers necessary to assist him in the conduct of an election and the scrutiny thereof.
- (c) The Returning Officer shall be paid twenty per centum of the fees prescribed by Regulations made under the Electoral Act 1907 (as amended), for the Returning Officers at Parliamentary Elections and the officers employed by him shall, while engaged in the preparation and distribution of voting material and on the scrutiny and count of votes, be paid for their services the fees prescribed for similar duties by those Regulations for Presiding Officers at Parliamentary Elections. Such supplementary roll or rolls shall be forwarded to the Returning Officer forthwith after endorsement.
- (d) The Returning Officer shall, at the place where he carries out his functions as Returning Officer, make the electoral roll, including any supplementary rolls, applicable to an election for an office available for inspection by any elector, or by any person authorised by the Returning Officer, during the ordinary hours of business until the day on which the result of the election is declared.

- (d) The Returning Officer shall reject any nomination form which, in his opinion, is not in order as required by this Statute, and any such rejection shall be final and conclusive as against that nomination. Nothing in this paragraph shall prevent a further nomination submitted in respect of a candidate being accepted by the Returning Officer before the close of nominations.
- (e) Where the number of candidates nominated does not exceed one, the Returning Officer shall forthwith certify that fact, together with the name and address of the candidate nominated to the Director, and such certificate, when received by the Director, shall be the final and conclusive evidence of the election of that candidate as a member of the Council.
- (f) When the number of candidates nominated exceeds one, the Returning Officer shall hold an election in accordance with this Statute, as hereinafter provided.
- (g) Any candidate may by notice in writing signed by him, addressed to the Returning Officer and lodged with him not later than the time fixed for the close of nominations withdraw his consent to his nomination and thereupon that candidate shall be considered as not having been nominated and the Returning Officer shall omit the name of that candidate from the ballot paper.

9. Polling: When after the receipt of nominations of candidates an election is necessary to elect an elective member of the Council, the Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the time fixed for the close of such nominations, cause ballot papers to be printed in accordance with Forms No. 2 and No. 3 in the Appendix to this Statute containing the full names of all the candidates. The candidates' names shall appear on the ballot paper in the order determined by the Returning Officer by lot.

10. Voting—

- (a) The Returning Officer shall appoint a polling place at each campus.
- (b) The Returning Officer shall appoint not less than two members of the staff of the College as presiding officers at each campus. No candidate or proposer shall act as a presiding officer.
- (c)
 - (i) Any elector desiring to vote at an election under this Statute shall, in order to vote, personally attend at the appointed polling place at the campus on which roll his name appears between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 8.00 p.m. on the day appointed for the poll. No elector shall cast more than one vote at an election.
 - (ii) The elector shall state his full name to the Presiding Officer.
 - (iii) The Presiding Officer shall enquire whether the elector has voted before at the election and if the answer is in the negative and the elector's name is on the roll the Presiding Officer shall mark the name off the roll and hand the elector a ballot paper in the form of Form No. 2 in the Appendix to this Statute. The Presiding Officer shall initial the ballot paper before handing it to the elector.
 - (iv) The elector shall mark his ballot paper in accordance with the directions contained therein and deposit it in a locked and sealed ballot box provided by the Presiding Officer for that purpose.
 - (v) Any elector who spoils a ballot paper may return it to the Presiding Officer who shall there and then destroy it and hand the elector a further ballot paper. However this paragraph does not apply to any spoilt ballot paper once it is deposited in a ballot box.
 - (vi) The Presiding Officer shall keep a tally of the number of electors issued with a ballot paper.
 - (vii) As soon as practicable after the close of the poll the Presiding officer shall forward all ballot boxes containing ballot papers to the Returning Officer. The Presiding Officer shall also forward to the Returning Officer rolls used at the election, all unused ballot papers issued to him, and a record of the number of ballot papers issued.
- (d)
 - (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Statute any elector whose name appears on the roll of external students for a campus and who has reason to believe that he will not be at the campus during the hours of polling may make written application to the Returning Officer for a postal ballot paper.
 - (ii) The Returning Officer shall send by prepaid letter post or otherwise to such person, to his address as shown in the application, or shall hand to the elector personally—
 - (a) one ballot paper in the form of Form 3 in the Appendix to this Statute, with the initials of the Returning Officer, or of some other person authorised in that behalf by the Returning Officer, endorsed on the front thereof;
 - (b) one envelope marked "Ballot Paper";
 - (c) one envelope addressed to the Returning Officer; and
 - (d) one counterfoil in the form of Form No. 4 in the Appendix to this Statute, to be completed and signed by the elector.
 - (iii) For the purpose of casting his vote at the election, the elector—
 - (a) shall mark his vote on the ballot paper in the manner set out in clause 11 of this Statute and shall then place the same in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" and seal the envelope; and

- (b) shall then sign and complete the counterfoil in accordance with directions stated therein and then place the sealed envelope with the ballot paper enclosed therein and the counterfoil signed and completed in the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, and seal such lastmentioned envelope.
 - (iv) The elector may then send by post or other means or may deliver the envelope addressed to the Returning Officer, with its enclosures, to the Returning Officer at his address shown on the envelope, but so that the envelope shall be in the hands of the Returning Officer not later than the time fixed for the closing of the poll or may cause it to be delivered to a Presiding Officer during the hours of polling, in which case the Presiding Officer shall deposit the envelope unopened in the locked and sealed ballot box used for ordinary votes.
 - (v) If, prior to the closing of the poll, an elector making application under this paragraph satisfies the Returning Officer that he has not received a ballot paper and is entitled to vote at the election, or that the ballot paper or envelopes received by him have been lost or destroyed, and that he has not already voted at the poll, the Returning Officer may post or give personally to such elector a ballot paper and envelopes or a further ballot paper and envelopes, as the case may be.
 - (vi) Voting shall not be compulsory.
 - (vii) The Returning Officer shall place and keep in a locked and sealed ballot box, until the scrutiny, all envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers received by him up to the close of the poll.
11. Marking of Ballot Paper—
- (a) When there are not more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.
 - (b) When there are more than two candidates, the elector shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference. Provided that if numerals in arithmetical sequence are placed opposite the names of all the candidates but one, the next following numeral shall be deemed to be placed opposite the name of the remaining candidate.
12. Scrutineers—
- (a) Each candidate at an election and the College shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present at each or any polling place during the hours of polling and one scrutineer to be present during the scrutiny of postal votes and votes cast under paragraph (c) of clause 10 of this Statute.
 - (b) Every scrutineer shall, before he acts, make and sign, before the Returning Officer, a declaration in accordance with Form No. 5 in the Appendix to this Statute.
 - (c) Any candidate may attend and be present at the counting of the votes.
13. The Scrutiny—
- (a) As soon as practicable after the close of the poll, the Returning Officer, in the presence of any scrutineer permitted by him, shall—
 - (i) produce and open all sealed and locked ballot boxes in which the envelopes purporting to contain ballot papers and counterfoils have been placed; and
 - (ii) open each outer envelope, compare the enclosed counterfoil with the roll and if satisfied that the person named in the counterfoil is entitled to vote and that the counterfoil has been completed and signed by the elector, strike out the name on the roll and, without opening the envelope marked "Ballot Paper", deposit it in a locked and sealed ballot box and set aside the counterfoil for safe keeping.
 - (b) If the right of the person to vote is not established or if the counterfoil is not signed by the elector, the ballot paper shall not be admitted to the scrutiny and the Returning Officer shall replace the counterfoil and the envelope marked "Ballot Paper" in the outer envelope, and set the outer envelope and its contents aside for safe keeping.
 - (c) When all the outer envelopes have been opened in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause, the Returning Officer shall proceed with the scrutiny and count of the votes.
 - (d) The Returning Officer shall include in the scrutiny and count all votes contained in the ballot boxes referred to in clauses 10 (c) (vii) and 13 (a) (ii) of this Statute.

14. Method of Count: The method of conducting the count shall be as provided by the Electoral Act 1907 (as amended).

15. Informality of Ballot Paper—

- (a) A ballot paper shall be informal—
- (i) if it is not initialled by the Returning Officer or the other officer authorised in that behalf;
 - (ii) if, subject to paragraph (b) of this clause, it is marked in any other manner than prescribed in clause 11 of this Statute;
 - (iii) if it has upon it any mark or writing not authorised by this Statute, which in the opinion of the Returning Officer will enable any person to identify the elector;
 - (iv) if it does not indicate the elector's vote or, if when there are more than two candidates it is not marked so as effectively to indicate the elector's preference as regards all candidates; or
 - (v) if no mark is indicated on it.
- (b) A ballot paper shall not be informal for any reason other than the reasons stated in paragraph (a) of this clause but shall be given effect according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear, and, in particular when there are only two candidates, a ballot paper shall not be informal by reason only of the elector having indicated his vote or first preference by a cross instead of the numeral 1.
- (c) The Returning Officer shall be the sole and final judge as to whether a ballot paper is informal.

16. Declaration of Poll: When the Returning Officer has completed the counting of the votes he shall declare the result of the election in the presence of the scrutineers and of any candidates who may be present at the time.

17. Preservation of Papers: On completion of the scrutiny and count of votes, the Returning Officer shall—

- (a) enclose in one packet all the used and counted ballot papers; in another packet all counterfoils admitted; and in a third packet all outer envelopes and their contents referred to in paragraph (b) of Clause 13 of this Statute;
 - (b) seal up the several packets and endorse on each packet a description and the number of the contents respectively, the date of the election and sign the endorsements;
- and
- (c) retain the sealed packets.

18. Certification of Results: When the result of an election has been ascertained and declared the Returning Officer shall forthwith furnish to the Chairman of the Council a certificate of the result and state therein the name of the candidate who has been elected, and such a certificate, when received by the Chairman of the Council shall be final and conclusive evidence of the election of that candidate as a member of the Council, subject however to a determination of any appeal under Clause 21 of this Statute.

19. Destruction of Papers: Upon the expiration of three months after the date of the certification to the Chairman of the Council of the result of an election, the Returning Officer may authorise the destruction of the packets referred to in Clause 17 of this Statute.

20. Costs of Election: All costs, charges and expenses as incurred by the Returning Officer in connection with the publication of notices, the receipt of nominations of candidates for election, and the conduct of elections or in connection with any other matters incidental thereto and as certified in writing by the Returning Officer under his hand, and communicated by the Returning Officer to the Council, shall be borne and paid by the Council or reimbursed to the Returning Officer by the Council out of moneys from time to time in its hands but the Council may at its own expense have the accounts of the Returning Officer audited. This clause does not apply to members of the staff of the College who are appointed as presiding officers under Clause 10 (b) of this Statute.

21. Right of Appeal: A candidate shall have the right of appeal to the Chairman within seven (7) days of the declaration of the poll should he feel the conduct of the election was in any way contrary to this Statute. The Chairman shall have power to make such enquiry as he deems necessary into the matter complained of and after such enquiry may confirm the election or annul the election and direct that a fresh election be held.
