Constitution Act 1889-1980.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

LEGAL AID COMMISSION (COSTS) RULES 1982.

MADE by the Legal Aid Commission of Western Australia.

- Citation. 1. These rules may be cited as the Legal Aid Commission (Costs) Rules 1982.
- Commencement. 2. These rules shall come into operation on the first day of August 1982.
- Repeal. 3. The Legal Aid Commission (Costs) Rules 1979 are hereby repealed.
- Definitions. 4. In these rules unless the contrary intention appears:
- "Approved" has the meaning assigned to it in section 14 of the Act;
- "authorized officer" means a member of the staff of the Commission authorized by the Director of Legal Aid pursuant to section 36 (2) to decide applications for legal aid;
- "committee" means a legal aid committee or review committee established under section 24 or section 50 respectively, as the context may require;
- "rule" means one of these rules;
- "the Act" means the Legal Aid Commission Act 1976 (as amended);
- "the Regulations" means the Family Law Regulations made under the Family Law Act 1975 (as amended) of the Commonwealth;
- "the 1979 Rules" means the Legal Aid Commission (Costs) Rules 1979;
- "the Schedule" means the Schedule to these Rules.

- Operation. 5. Costs payable to private practitioners in respect of legal services provided by way of legal assistance under the Act—
- (a) where or to the extent that such services have been provided prior to 1 August 1982, shall be calculated and paid in accordance with the percentage of ordinary fees or the fees or scales of fees prescribed in the 1979 Rules, and
 - (b) where or to the extent that such services have been provided on or after 1 August 1982, shall be calculated and paid in accordance with these rules.
- Percentage of fees. 6. (1) Subject to rule 18, and for the purposes of section 14 (1) (a) (ii) of the Act, 80% is prescribed as the percentage of the fees that would be payable to a private practitioner in the ordinary course of practice, and which shall be payable to him under that subparagraph in respect of any service with respect to which no fee or scale of fees is or are specified pursuant to section 14 (1) (a) (i) of the Act.
- (2) For the purposes of subrule (1) of this rule a private practitioner shall be deemed to be entitled to be paid in the ordinary course of practice in accordance with the rules relating to costs (if any) in force in the relevant court or tribunal.
- Scales of fees. 7. Subject to rule 18, and for the purposes of section 14 (1) (a) (i) of the Act, the scale of fees set out in the Schedule is hereby prescribed for the services in the jurisdictions therein specified provided that in a family law matter an assigned practitioner shall have the option of accepting payment in accordance with the fees prescribed in the Schedule or alternatively, of submitting an itemized account and being paid at 80% of his approved account under the Family Law Regulations.
- Actual Fee Payable to assigned Practitioner. 8. (1) Where the fees set out in the Schedule designate a range between a minimum and a maximum fee, the fee payable to the assigned practitioner shall be such sum within that range as is approved by the Director, authorized officer or committee.
- Daily rate. (2) Where fees set out in the Schedule are expressed as being for a day or as a daily rate the full fee shall be payable only for a full 5 hours or more and payment for time less than 5 hours per day shall be calculated *pro rata*.
- Separate but related matters in family law. 9. (1) Where in a family law case a grant of aid covers two separate but related matters (other than contempt) payment will be at the rate of a 10% loading on the higher fee; where three matters are covered the loading will be 20% of the highest fee, and higher loadings for four or more matters shall be calculated on a similar progression.
- Aid for services in respect of multiple charges or offences. (2) Where, in a criminal law case, a grant of aid authorizes the provision of legal services in respect of more than one charge or offence (which are not alternatives) payment will be on the highest fee and such additional payment in respect of each other charge or offence as the Director, authorized officer or Committee considers reasonable, and in determining the amount of the additional payment—
- (a) regard shall be had to all relevant factors including in particular, the jurisdiction, or jurisdictions, the number and nature of the charges or offences, the complexity of the issues, and the experience and seniority of the assigned practitioner; and
 - (b) in no case shall the additional amount payable in respect of any one charge or offence be more than 50% of the amount payable in respect of the highest fee.
- Travelling and waiting time. 10. (1) Except where otherwise expressly provided in these rules no allowance is to be made for travelling or court waiting time.
- (2) An assigned practitioner acting for a respondent, or for an applicant (after the first return date) in a family law matter, or in a civil or criminal case, may be paid for waiting time necessarily spent at court up to a maximum of two hours on any one day.
- Counsel Fees. 11. (1) Where the Director, authorized officer or a Committee gives express approval for counsel to be briefed and counsel fees to be incurred the fee payable to Counsel shall be the fee set out in the Schedule to these rules in respect of the work done by counsel or, if no such fee is prescribed then 80% of the fee that would have been payable to him in the ordinary course of practice and is approved.
- (2) Where separate counsel is briefed in the absence of express approval under subrule (1) of this rule no additional amount shall be payable in respect of counsel fees but the amount otherwise payable under these rules shall be apportioned between the assigned solicitor and counsel.
- (3) Fees paid to counsel shall not be treated as disbursements or out-of-pocket expenses unless the Director, an authorized officer or a Committee gives express approval for counsel fees to be incurred.
- Queens Counsel fee. 12. Where approval is given for the appearance of Queen's Counsel the fee payable to such senior counsel shall be 50% higher than the fee payable to junior counsel on the higher scale.

13. Where an assigned practitioner shows to the satisfaction of the Director, authorized officer or committee, that such an exceptional amount of work has been or will necessarily be done in a particular case that application of the fees or scales of fees prescribed by rule 7 would be unjust, the Director, authorized officer or committee as the case may be, may so certify and upon such certification the scales of fees prescribed by that rule shall not apply to that case but the fees payable shall be assessed at 80% of the fees that would be payable to the practitioner in the ordinary course of practice and are approved.
14. In a case to which rule 7 applies and where an assigned practitioner necessarily employs as his agent another practitioner whose office is not less than 100 kilometres from that of the assigned practitioner, an additional fee being an amount up to 25% of the fee otherwise payable under these rules may be allowed as agents fee.
15. An assigned practitioner who is required in the proper conduct of an assignment to travel more than five kilometres may claim—
- (a) travelling expenses actually paid or incurred and an amount for maintenance or sustenance, and such travelling expenses or amount for maintenance or sustenance (or such part thereof as may be reasonable) may be approved as a disbursement or travel allowance, as the case may be; and
 - (b) an amount by way of special country allowance which may be approved in whole or in part by the Director, authorized officer or committee in his or its absolute discretion.
16. Where an assigned practitioner or counsel necessarily attends at a prison, lock-up or police station in the course of an assignment, the Director, authorized officer or committee may approve payment of a prison conference fee between \$40 and \$50 per hour, including travel time.
17. In a case to which rule 6 (1) applies or in respect of which advance certification has been given under rule 13, the Director, authorized officer or a Committee may specify a fee or rate of fee on a daily or other basis, as being the fee or rate of fee that would be payable to a practitioner in the ordinary course of practice for the work to be done, and to which the prescribed percentage shall be applied when determining the amount actually payable to the assigned practitioner in respect of that matter.
18. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Rules, where, as the result of the legal services provided to him by the assigned practitioner, an assisted person obtains an order for costs in his favour or agreement that some or all of his legal costs in respect of the matter the subject of the grant of legal aid be paid by the other party or parties, and actually receives monies pursuant to that order or agreement, which monies exceed 80% of the fees which would be payable to the assigned practitioner in the ordinary course of practice, then the Director, an authorized officer or a Committee may fix for the purposes of section 14 (1) (a) (ii) of the Act a percentage in excess of 80% (but not exceeding 100%) as the percentage of the fees payable to the assigned practitioner in the ordinary course of practice, which shall be paid in that matter.

Appointment of authorized officers. 6. The Commissioner may, in writing, appoint officers to have the powers and carry out the duties conferred on authorized officers in these regulations.

Conditions of licensing and registration. 7. Any condition attached by the Commissioner to a taxi-car licence or driver's registration shall be endorsed thereon.

PART II.—LICENSING OF TAXI-CARS.

Application for licence. 8. (1) An application for the issue of a taxi-car licence shall be made to the Commissioner in an approved form.

(2) The Commissioner, where satisfied—

(a) that a vehicle licence is in force under the Road Traffic Act 1974 in respect of the taxi-car and that the taxi-car conforms to the requirements of the Act and these regulations relating to taxi-cars; and

(b) that the applicant is a fit and proper person to operate a taxi-car and has complied with such reasonable requirements as the Commissioner may impose,

may upon payment of the appropriate fee set out in the Schedule issue a taxi-car licence for operation of the taxi-car in the district or districts specified therein.

Licences valid for 12 months. 9. (1) Subject to any conditions attached thereto and to subregulation (2), a taxi-car licence shall be valid for a period of 12 months from the date of issue or renewal.

(2) A taxi-car licence remains valid so long, only, as a vehicle licence remains in force under the Road Traffic Act 1974 in respect of the taxi-car.

Renewal of licence. 10. (1) Subject to subregulation (2) and regulation 44 a taxi-car licence may be renewed not earlier than one month before it expires on payment to the Commissioner of the appropriate fee set out in the Schedule.

(2) The Commissioner may cancel, suspend or refuse to renew a taxi-car licence if he is satisfied that the taxi-car does not comply with regulation 8 (2) (a).

Change of owner and transfer of licence. 11. (1) Where a person to whom a taxi-car licence has been granted ceases to be the owner of the taxi-car he shall—

(a) forthwith notify the Commissioner in writing that he has ceased to be the owner of the taxi-car and of the name and address of the new owner of the taxi-car; and

(b) unless the Commissioner has approved the transfer of the taxi-car licence to the new owner, return the taxi-car licence and the appropriate number plates to the Commissioner.

(2) A taxi-car licence may be transferred by application to the Commissioner in an approved form.

(3) The Commissioner if satisfied—

(a) that the taxi-car continues to comply with regulation 8 (2) (a); and

(b) that the applicant complies with regulation 8 (2) (b),

may upon payment of the appropriate fee set out in the Schedule transfer the licence.

Vehicle to be approved. 12. (1) A vehicle shall not be licensed as a taxi-car unless the vehicle in its construction, design, and seating accommodation and in relation to all internal and external fittings and equipment has been approved by the Commissioner.

(2) The Commissioner or an authorized officer may by written notice to an owner or operator of a taxi-car, require the production of that taxi-car at a time and place stipulated in the notice for the purpose of ascertaining whether the taxi-car conforms with these regulations.

Label. 13. The Commissioner shall issue to the owner of every taxi-car licensed under this Part, a label bearing the numerals corresponding with those of the month of expiry of the licence which the owner shall affix and keep affixed to the lower left hand side of the windshield of that vehicle.

Number plates. 14. (1) The Commissioner shall issue number plates for every vehicle licensed as a taxi-car and a person shall not operate a taxi-car unless the number plates so issued are affixed in a conspicuous horizontal position at the front and rear of that vehicle.

(2) Any person having custody of a number plate issued in respect of a taxi-car shall return it to the Commissioner within 14 days after the taxi-car licence to which it relates ceases to be valid or is surrendered, suspended or cancelled.

(3) Where number plates have not been returned to the Commissioner as required by these regulations, the person having custody thereof shall, on demand made by an authorized officer in writing, deliver those number plates to him.

- Replacement of taxi-car. 15. An owner may apply to the Commissioner in an approved form, to replace a vehicle licensed as a taxi-car and where that approval is given the replacement vehicle is subject to all the provisions of the Act and these regulations affecting the licensing and operation of a taxi-car and to any conditions imposed on the licence.
- Removal of vehicle from district. 16. The owner or operator of a taxi-car shall not remove the vehicle from the district specified in the taxi-car licence except on a hiring unless—
- (a) the taxi-car is being removed for repairs and a permit to substitute another vehicle has been obtained in accordance with regulation 15; or
 - (b) the written consent of the Commissioner has been obtained.
- Substitution of taxi-car under repair. 17. (1) Where a vehicle licensed as a taxi-car is under repair and cannot be operated, the Commissioner or an authorized officer may by permit in the form approved, authorize the owner of that vehicle to operate another vehicle in substitution for that vehicle so licensed and all the provisions of the Act and these regulations affecting the licensing and operation of a taxi-car and any conditions imposed on the licence shall apply to that vehicle.
- (2) A permit issued under subregulation (1) may be revoked by the Commissioner or the issuing officer, in writing, at any time.

PART III.—REGISTRATION OF TAXI-CAR DRIVERS.

- Application for registration. 18. An application by a person to be registered as a taxi-car driver shall be made to the Commissioner in the approved form and shall be accompanied by the appropriate fee set out in the Schedule.
- Qualifications of applicant. 19. (1) An application by a person to be registered as a taxi-car driver or for the renewal of his registration shall not be approved by the Commissioner unless he is satisfied that the driver—
- (a) is the holder of a valid "A" Class driver's licence issued under the Road Traffic Act 1974;
 - (b) is medically and otherwise a fit and proper person to drive a taxi-car;
 - (c) possesses sufficient knowledge of streets, places, routes and conditions;
 - (d) is able to speak, read and write the English language to an adequate standard;
 - (e) understands the provisions of the Act and these regulations,
- and the Commissioner may require an applicant to undergo a medical examination, or an examination in any of the matters referred to in paragraphs (c), (d) or (e) of this subregulation.
- (2) In determining, for the purposes of subregulation (1) or regulation 44 (2), whether or not a person is a fit and proper person to drive a taxi-car, the Commissioner may have regard to any matters he considers relevant including information, complaints or allegations given or made in relation to that person by members of the public.
- Certificate of registration. 20. (1) The Commissioner shall on payment of the appropriate fee set out in the Schedule, issue to each person registered as a taxi-driver a certificate of registration valid for the districts specified therein.
- (2) Subject to subregulation (3) the registration of a taxi-car driver shall be valid for such period, not exceeding 12 months from the date of issue or renewal of the certificate of registration, as is specified in the certificate.
- (3) If a registered taxi-car driver ceases to hold an "A" Class Driver's licence under the Road Traffic Act 1974 his registration thereupon ceases to be valid and he shall within 7 days of that event return his certificate of registration to the Commissioner.
- Renewal of registration. 21. Subject to regulation 44 the registration of a taxi-car driver may be renewed not earlier than one month before its expiry on payment to the Commissioner of the appropriate fee set out in the Schedule.
- Commissioner to be advised in certain circumstances. 22. (1) A registered taxi-driver shall advise the Commissioner at least 7 days in advance—
- (a) of any change of address; or
 - (b) of his departure from the district in relation to which he is licensed for any period exceeding one month.
- (2) It is a defence to a charge of an offence under this regulation to prove that the taxi-driver has advised the Commissioner of any change of address or departure from the district but that it was impracticable to require the taxi-driver to advise the Commissioner 7 days in advance.
- Endorsement of additional districts. 23. A registered taxi-car driver shall not commence employment as a taxi-car driver in a district that is not specified on the certificate of registration issued to him by the Commissioner until he has received the approval of the Commissioner to do so and had the name of that district endorsed on his certificate.

PART IV.—CONDUCT OF DRIVERS.

- Driver to be clean and neat. 24. A registered taxi-car driver shall whilst driving a taxi-car be clean and neat as to clothing, person and general appearance.
- Conduct of driver. 25. A registered taxi-car driver shall while operating that taxi-car—
- (a) conduct himself in an orderly manner and with civility and propriety, at all times, and comply with any reasonable requirement of a hirer, or passenger or intending hirer or passenger;
 - (b) afford reasonable assistance to a passenger or intending passenger—
 - (i) by opening the doors, where practicable; and
 - (ii) by loading or unloading that person's luggage into and from the taxi-car;
 - (c) carry, and produce at the request of an authorized officer, a hirer or a passenger, his certificate of registration;
 - (d) carry, and produce at the request of an authorized officer his "A" Class driver's licence issued under the Road Traffic Act 1974; and
 - (e) be constantly in attendance on the taxi-car at any time that it is standing for hire.
- Obligation on driver. 26. The driver of a taxi-car shall not fail to carry out any hiring accepted, or refuse a hiring where it is lawful for him to accept it, but a driver is not obliged to accept or continue with a hiring where the hirer is intoxicated, unclean, abusive or violent.
- Shortest route. 27. Unless the hirer of a taxi-car directs that it be driven by some other route, the driver shall drive it by the shortest practicable route to the place specified by the hirer.

PART V.—CONDITION AND APPEARANCE OF TAXI-CARS.

- Condition of vehicle. 28. A driver shall not stand a taxi-car for hire, or drive it on a public road for reward unless the vehicle—
- (a) conforms to the requirements of the Road Traffic Act 1974 and the regulations thereunder; and
 - (b) is clean and fit for public use.
- Signs on taxi-cars. 29. (1) The owner of a taxi-car shall not cause or permit any sign to be displayed on it or fitted to it unless the sign is an approved sign.
- (2) The Commissioner may in accordance with subregulation (3) direct—
- (a) that the owner of a taxi-car shall cause it to be fitted with a for hire sign in a position specified in the direction and that a person shall not operate the taxi-car unless it is so fitted with a for hire sign; or
 - (b) that the owner of a taxi-car shall cause it to be fitted with a taxi sign in a position specified in the direction and that a person shall not operate the taxi-car unless it is so fitted with a taxi sign; or
 - (c) that the owner of a taxi-car shall cause it to be fitted with a "taxi for hire" sign in a position specified in the direction and that person shall not operate the taxi-car unless it is so fitted with a taxi for hire sign,
- and where the Commissioner has so directed the owner and operator shall comply with that direction.
- (3) A direction under subregulation (2) may be given—
- (a) in respect of a particular taxi-car—by notice in writing served on the owner of the taxi-car;
 - (b) in respect of taxi-cars of a particular class—by notice published in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating in the district or districts in respect of which taxi-cars of that class are licensed.
- (4) In subregulation (2)—
- "for hire sign" means an approved sign indicating whether or not the taxi-car is for hire;
- "taxi for hire sign" means an approved sign carrying the word "TAXI" and indicating whether or not the taxi-car is for hire;
- "taxi sign" means an approved sign carrying the word "TAXI".

PART VI.—FARES AND CHARGES.

- Rates of fares and charges. 30. (1) Subject to subregulation (2), where a taxi-car is hired in a portion of the State specified in the Table to this regulation the fares and charges to be taken or made for the hire of the taxi-car shall be those set out in that Table in respect of that portion of the State and no greater or lesser fare or charge shall be taken or made.
- (2) Subject to subregulation (3), where a taxi-car is hired in any district in which by-laws are in force under section 47ZG of the Act (including a district in or comprising a portion of the State specified in the Table to this regulation) the fares and charges to be taken or made for the hire of the taxi-car shall be those prescribed by those by-laws and no greater or lesser fare or charge shall be taken or made.

(3) Notwithstanding subregulation (2) where in a district in or comprising a portion of the State specified in the Table to this regulation by-laws in force under section 47ZG of the Act prescribe fares that are less than the fares set out in the Table to this regulation in respect of that portion of the State, the fares payable are the fares set out in that Table and no greater or lesser fare shall be taken.

(4) In the case of taxi-cars that are not fitted with taximeters, the distance rates provided by the Table to this regulation are for distances travelled by the taxi-car from the point of engagement to the destination and for the return journey to the point of engagement whether or not the taxi-car is occupied by a passenger during the whole of that journey.

(5) The hirer of a taxi-car shall pay any tolls and parking fees incurred during the hiring at the hirer's request.

(6) In the Table to this regulation "private taxi-car" means a taxi-car which, under the conditions attached to its licence, may be operated as a private taxi-car.

Where during the course of a special hiring a taxi-car travels more than 16 kilometres, a charge of 46 cents per kilometre shall be paid for each additional kilometre or part thereof.

Luggage:

Where the aggregate weight of all packages does not exceed 25 kilograms—Nil.

Where the aggregate weight of all packages exceed 25 kilograms—5 cents per package.

2. For a journey in the district of the Shire of Port Hedland the charge payable in respect of a service shall be calculated by increasing the relevant charge prescribed in item 1 by 17½ per centum but the increase does not apply to the surcharges referred to in that item.

3. For a journey in the district of the Shire of Carnarvon the charge payable in respect of a service shall be calculated by increasing the relevant charge prescribed in item 1 by 25 per centum but the increase does not apply to the surcharges referred to in that item.

4. For a journey in the district of the Shire of Roebourne the charge payable in respect of a service shall be calculated by increasing the relevant charge prescribed in item 1 by 33½ per centum but the increase does not apply to the surcharges referred to in that item.

- Separate fares. 31. (1) An operator of a taxi-car shall not directly or indirectly tender for or enter into any arrangement for the carrying of passengers for separate fares unless required or authorized to do so by an authorized officer.
- (2) When the number of persons requiring the use of a taxi-car at any location exceeds the number of taxi-cars available, or in any other circumstances in which service to the public so warrants, an authorized officer may require or authorize the operator of any taxi-car to carry passengers at separate fares on the conditions that, in respect of any journey,—
- (a) the original hirer has no objection to the operator of the taxi-car accepting in respect of that journey other passengers by way of separate hirings; and
 - (b) the hirers are travelling to destinations that are in the same locality or in the same direction.
- (3) When passengers are carried in a taxi-car for separate fares each separate hirer may, at his destination, be charged 75 per centum of the amount of the fare then recorded on the taximeter, or if the taxi-car is not fitted with a taximeter, 75 per centum of the amount of the fare that would be payable at that time if the taxi-car were being used for the carriage of a hirer or hirers for a single fare.
- Fare Schedule card. 32. (1) The owner of a taxi-car shall have in the vehicle a schedule issued by the Commissioner detailing the rates and charges to be paid by the hirer and the driver shall make the schedule available to the hirer at his request.
- (2) A person shall not drive a taxi-car in which the schedule referred to in subregulation (1) of this is not carried.

PART VII.—TAXIMETERS.

- Requirements in relation to taximeters. 33. The owner of a taxi-car shall not cause or permit a taximeter to be fitted to that taxi-car unless—
- (a) he has the prior permission of the Commissioner to do so or has been directed by the Commissioner to do so pursuant to regulation 34;
 - (b) it is of an approved type; and
 - (c) it is so installed and illuminated that the fact that the taximeter is operating, and the amount of fare being registered, is readily visible to any passenger and to the driver, each from his sitting position, including during the hours of darkness.
- Commissioner may direct fitting of taximeter. 34. (1) The Commissioner may direct that the owner of a taxi-car shall cause it to be fitted with a taximeter and that a person shall not operate the taxi-car unless it is fitted with a taximeter, and where the Commissioner has so directed the owner and operator shall comply with that direction.
- (2) The provisions of regulation 29 (3) apply to a direction given under subregulation (1).
- Inspection before use. 35. (1) The operator of a taxi-car to which a taximeter has been fitted shall before using that vehicle as a taxi-car—
- (a) cause the meter to be regulated to record the charges prescribed in the table to regulation 30;
 - (b) submit the vehicle to an authorized officer for inspection, testing and sealing; and
 - (c) pay the appropriate fee set out in the Schedule for that inspection.
- (2) The authorized officer referred to in subregulation (1) shall test the taximeter for—
- (a) distance, over a distance of not less than 2 kilometres; and
 - (b) time, over a period of not less than 10 minutes,
- and a taximeter tested under this regulation shall not be approved for use on any taxi-car if there is an error—
- (c) of 50 metres, or more, over a distance of 2 kilometres; or
 - (d) of 3 per centum, or more, over the space of 10 minutes.
- Obligations upon the owner of a taximeter. 36. The owner of a taxi-car to which a taximeter is fitted—
- (a) shall cause the taximeter to be maintained in good order and condition and to be re-adjusted and tested by an authorized officer, as may be required, and in any event once in every 12 months after last being tested;
 - (b) on becoming aware that the taximeter is not registering correctly or has become in any way unserviceable or no longer sealed, shall forthwith notify the Commissioner or an authorized officer of that fact;
 - (c) shall not affix or permit to be affixed to the taxi-car any wheels, tyres or gear ratio of a kind other than that which was affixed when the taximeter was last tested, unless the taximeter is then re-tested before use;
 - (d) shall not make any alteration or permit any alteration to be made to the taxi-car that would in any way affect the correct operation of the taximeter; and
 - (e) shall not alter or render indistinguishable or illegible the numbers or other markings on the taximeter by which it is identifiable as that previously tested and approved, or cause or suffer it to be done by any person.

- Fare chart. 37. The operator of a taxi-car shall, whenever directed by the Commissioner, but not otherwise, exhibit near the taximeter a fare conversion chart or fare schedule issued, and approved by the Commissioner.
- Taximeter not to be manipulated. 38. The operator of a taxi-car shall not manipulate a taximeter in a manner likely to defraud any person.
- Meter to operate from entry of passenger. 39. (1) Subject to subregulation (2) where a taxi-car is fitted with a taximeter the driver engaged on a hiring shall set the taximeter in operation upon the entry into the vehicle of the passenger.
(2) Where a taxi-car fitted with a taximeter is engaged to commence a hiring at a specified place the driver shall inform the hirer or the passenger to be carried of his presence, as soon as practicable after arrival at that place, and may thereupon, or if the taxi-car is engaged to be at that place at a specified time, on arrival, set the taximeter in operation.

PART VIII.—POWERS OF AUTHORIZED OFFICERS
AND THE COMMISSIONER.

- Directions of an authorized officer to be obeyed. 40. Where an authorized officer has reason to believe that any vehicle is being operated as a taxi-car he may—
(a) stop any car purporting to be a taxi-car to ascertain whether or not the Act and these regulations are being observed;
(b) direct an operator, hirer or passenger to answer any question relating to the operation of the vehicle;
(c) direct a hirer or passenger to alight from or forbid his entering a taxi-car; or
(d) direct an owner or driver to produce a taxi-car licence, his certificate of registration, his "A" Class driver's licence and passenger vehicle licence issued under the Road Traffic Act 1974, and any person so directed by an authorized officer shall comply with those directions.
- Notice on inspection. 41. (1) Where an authorized officer is of the opinion that a taxi-car licensed under the Act is—
(a) so unclean as to be likely to mark or damage the clothing or luggage of or to be otherwise objectionable to a passenger he may by notice in writing prohibit the continued operation of the taxi-car and direct the owner or operator of the taxi-car to have the taxi-car cleaned and re-examined, within such time as is specified in the notice;
(b) mechanically defective or does not comply with the requirements of these regulations or regulations under the Road Traffic Act 1974, or does not comply with conditions imposed on the licence, he may by notice in writing prohibit the continued operation of the taxi-car and direct the owner or operator to submit the taxi-car within such time as is specified in the notice to a nominated place for inspection.
(2) An owner or operator who receives a notice under subregulation (1) shall comply with the terms of the notice.
- Operator may be directed to attend. 42. The Commissioner may by notice in writing direct any owner or operator of a taxi-car to attend at a place and time nominated in the notice and the person who receives the notice shall not, without reasonable excuse, fail to comply with the terms of the notice.
- Statistics may be required. 43. The Commissioner may require the operator of a taxi-car to maintain and produce on request statistics relating to the operation of the taxi-car in an approved form.

PART IX.—DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE.

- Powers of Commissioner. 44. (1) Subject to regulation 45 where the Commissioner has reason to believe—
(a) that the taxi-car to which a taxi-car licence relates is not being operated at all, or is being operated in a manner that is not in the public interest;
(b) that the conditions attached to any taxi-car licence have been contravened or have not been observed; or
(c) that the holder of any taxi-car licence—
(i) has been guilty of any act or omission in contravention of these regulations and that the service that is or ought to be provided to the public is thereby prejudiced; or
(ii) is not a fit and proper person to operate a taxi-car,
the Commissioner may—
(d) cancel, suspend or refuse to renew the taxi-car licence;
(e) reprimand the holder of the taxi-car licence;
(f) attach any condition to the taxi-car licence or vary any condition already attached thereto; or
(g) reprimand the holder of the taxi-car licence and attach any condition thereto or vary any condition already attached thereto.

(2) Subject to regulation 45 where the Commissioner has reason to believe—

- (a) that the conditions attached to the registration of a taxi-car driver have been contravened or have not been observed;
- (b) that a registered taxi-car driver has been guilty of any act or omission in contravention of these regulations and that the service that is or ought to be provided to the public is thereby prejudiced; or
- (c) that, for medical or other reasons, a registered taxi-car driver is not a fit and proper person to drive a taxi-car,

the Commissioner may—

- (d) cancel, suspend or refuse to renew the registration of the driver;
- (e) reprimand the driver;
- (f) attach any condition to the registration of the driver or vary any condition already attached thereto; or
- (g) reprimand the driver and attach any condition to his registration or vary any condition already attached to his registration.

(3) Subject to regulation 45 where the Commissioner has reason to believe that a taxi-car licence or the registration of a taxi-car driver has been obtained by fraud or misrepresentation the Commissioner may cancel, suspend or refuse to renew the licence or registration.

(4) A decision of the Commissioner under this regulation may be expressed to be conditional upon terms therein specified, but otherwise has immediate effect.

(5) Notice in writing of a decision of the Commissioner under this regulation shall be served on the licensee or driver, as the case may be, as soon as practicable after it is made.

(6) The Commissioner may, by notice in writing served on the person affected, revoke any decision made under this regulation, either generally or to a specified extent, and may direct in the notice that the revocation have effect from a date specified in the notice.

Commissioner to give notice before exercising certain powers.

45. The Commissioner shall not cancel, suspend or refuse to renew a taxi-car licence or the registration of a taxi-car driver on any one or more of the relevant grounds specified in regulation 44 unless the Commissioner has, by notice in writing served on the person who is the holder of the licence or who is so registered, as the case may be, called on him to show cause within such reasonable period as is specified in the notice why the Commissioner should not cancel, suspend or refuse to renew the licence or registration on that ground or those grounds, as the case may require, and the person has, in the opinion of the Commissioner, failed to show such cause within that period or such further period as the Commissioner may allow.

Appeals.

46. (1) A person who feels aggrieved by a decision of the Commissioner under regulation 44 cancelling, suspending or refusing to renew a taxi-car licence or the registration of a taxi-car driver may, within one month of the decision, appeal against the decision to the Local Court held nearest to the place where the person resides.

(2) The Local Court may, on the hearing of the appeal, do one or more of the following, according to the nature of the case—

- (a) affirm, vary or quash the decision of the Commissioner, or substitute, and make in addition, any decision or order that should have been made in the first instance;
- (b) remit the subject matter of the appeal to the Commissioner for further hearing or consideration or for re-hearing;
- (c) make any order as to costs or any other matter that the case requires.

(3) In this regulation "Local Court" means a Local Court established under the Local Courts Act 1904.

PART X.—OFFENCE AND PENALTY.

Offence and penalty.

47. Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of these regulations is guilty of an offence and is liable—

- (a) for a first offence, to a fine not exceeding \$100; and
- (b) for a second or subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding \$200.

That the processing establishment—

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land.

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Boyup Brook are hereby required on or before 30 November 1982, to establish firebreaks clear of all flammable materials and thereafter maintain such firebreaks clear of all flammable materials until 15 April 1983, in the following positions on land owned or occupied by them:—

Rural Lands—

- (a) A firebreak not less than 2.5 metres wide must be constructed within 100 metres of the boundary of each property, i.e. cleared or part cleared land, where the boundary is adjacent to or adjoins a constructed or used surveyed/

- (b) Firebreaks are to be installed within 100 metres of the crop perimeter, by using either of the following three methods, when crops are to be harvested for grain:—

- (2) A 2 metre firebreak plus a 2 metre mown strip inside the crop paddock.
- (3) A 2 metre firebreak in the adjoining paddock.

Persons not intending to harvest crops must notify the Council Office in writing, by 30 November 1982.

- (c) A firebreak 3 metres wide shall be cleared not less than 20 metres and not more than 100 metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks, homesteads and fuel storage areas by 30 November 1982, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or haystack cleared of all flammable material by 15 December 1982.

Private Pine Plantations—Any pines planted for commercial purposes constitutes a pine plantation and you are hereby required to clear of all flammable materials, firebreaks not less than 50 metres wide around the perimeter of each plantation, and any plantation exceeding 50 hectares will also require a subdivisional firebreak of 50 metres in width for each 50 hectares.

Townsites—On or before 15 December 1982, all town lots under 4 000 square metres in area and all fuel depots within the Shire are required to be cleared of all debris or flammable material. A break of not less than one metre is to be cleared around the boundaries of all occupied and unoccupied lots.
