ORDER 2.

Jurisdiction of the Registrar

Powers of the Registrar.

1. Subject to this Order, the Registrar may transact all such business, and exercise all such authority and jurisdiction in respect of the same as under the District Court of Western Australia Act 1969 or the rules applicable to the Court may be transacted or exercised by a Judge at chambers, except in respect of the following proceedings and matters, that is to say:—

- (a) proceedings on the Crown side of the Court, and all matters relating to criminal proceedings or to the liberty of the subject;
- (b) injunctions and other orders under paragraph (9) of section 25 of the Supreme Court Act 1935 other than orders for the appointment of receivers by way of equitable execution and injunctions so far, and so far only, as the same are ancillary or incidental to equitable execution and charging orders;

- (c) reviewing taxation of costs;
- (d) proceedings in which an originating summons raises for the determination of the Court a question as to the construction of a statute or document or a question of law or a question arising out of or connected with a contract between a vendor or purchaser of land or an interest in land;
- (e) such business, authority, and jurisdiction as the Chairman of Judges may from time to time direct to be transacted or exercised by a Judge in person or as may by the rules applicable to the Court be expressly directed to be transacted or exercised by a Judge in person.
- Registrar may take accounts and make inquiries.
2. (1) Without prejudice to the power, authority and jurisdiction conferred on the Registrar by rule 1, the Court may, in any proceedings pending before it, order that an account be taken or that an inquiry be made by the Registrar or other proper officer; and the Court shall give such aid and directions in every such account or inquiry as it may think fit.
- Adjournment to Judge in certain cases.
- (2) On the taking of any accounts or the making of any inquiries, any party shall have the right to have an adjournment from the Registrar to a Judge in person without any further summons for that purpose.
- When matters within Registrar's jurisdiction may be brought before Judge.
3. A matter or proceeding that is authorised by or under these rules to be heard and determined by the Registrar shall not be brought before a Judge except—
- (a) on a reference by the Registrar under rule 4; or
- (b) on an appeal under rules 9 or 10; or
- (c) by leave of a Judge.
- Reference by Registrar to a Judge.
4. (1) The Registrar may refer any application or matter to a Judge and the Judge may either dispose of the application or matter or refer it back to the Registrar with such directions as he may think fit.
- (2) Pending the final disposal of the application or matter the Registrar may make such interim order as he shall think fit.
- Office of Registrar deemed Judge's chambers.
5. The office of the Registrar shall be deemed to be Judge's chambers for the purpose of any matter which is authorised by or under these rules to be dealt with by the Registrar, and in respect of such matters references in this Order to the Court shall be deemed to be references also to the Registrar.
- Power to issue advertisements and summon witnesses.
6. The Registrar shall, for the purpose of any proceedings directed to be taken before him, have full power to issue advertisements, to summon parties and witnesses, to administer oaths, to require the production of documents, to take affidavits and acknowledgments, and to examine parties and witnesses either upon interrogatories or *viva voce*.
- Duty of persons summoned to attend.
7. Parties and witnesses summoned to attend before the Registrar shall be bound to attend in pursuance of the summons, and shall be liable to process of contempt in like manner as parties or witnesses are liable thereto in case of disobedience to any order of the Court, or in case of default in attendance, in pursuance of any order of the Court or of any writ of *subpoena ad testificandum*, and all persons swearing or affirming before the Registrar shall be liable to all such penalties, punishments, and consequences for any wilful and corrupt false swearing or affirming before him as if the matter sworn or affirmed had been sworn or affirmed before any other person by law authorised to administer oaths, to take affidavits, and to receive affirmations.
- Interest and apportionment.
8. The Court may direct any computation of interest, or the apportionment of any fund, to be certified by the Registrar and to be acted upon by the Accountant or any other person without further order.
- Appeal from the Registrar.
9. (1) Any person affected by any order or decision of the Registrar may, except in cases provided for in Rule 10, appeal therefrom to a Judge in chambers.
- (2) Such appeal shall be by notice in writing to attend before a Judge without a fresh summons, such notice to be given within 5 days after the decision complained of or such further time as may be allowed by a Judge or by the Registrar.
- (3) Unless otherwise ordered there shall be at least 2 clear days between service of the notice of appeal and the day of hearing.
- (4) An appeal from the decision of the Registrar shall not operate as a stay of proceedings unless so ordered by a Judge or the Registrar.

Appeal to be
to Full Court
in certain
matters.

10. (1) An appeal shall lie to the Full Court from any judgment, order or other decision of the Registrar given or made—

- (a) on the hearing or determination of any cause, matter, question or issue tried by or referred to him, whether by consent or otherwise;
- (b) on an assessment of damages; or
- (c) on the hearing or determination of any interpleader or garnishee matter or issue, whether by consent or otherwise, and whether by way or summary decision or adjournment of the interpleader or garnishee summons or order *nisi* or on an issue directed or otherwise.

(2) the provisions of Order 63 of the Rules of the Supreme Court 1971 apply *mutatis mutandis* to appeals under this rule.

(b) If a prepaid parking voucher for 5 hour periods on 6 days is validated twice on the one day that voucher entitles a person to park a vehicle in Parking Stations 1, 2, 3, 3A, 8 and 24 for a total period of 10 hours on that day. The number of days on which such a voucher may be validated shall be reduced by one on each occasion the voucher is validated twice on the one day. ”

2. That the First Schedule be amended by adding to Clause 2 a new Sub-clause (e) as follows:—

“ (e) Nelson Crescent on both sides between Plain Street and Hale Street. From 8.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive—30c per 2 hour period. ”

1. The description of Parking Station 23 and substituting therefor the following:—



4. That Clause 45B be deleted and the following be substituted therefor:—

- “ 45B (i) For the purpose of this Clause the terms “pedestrian mall”, “emergency vehicle” and “special purpose” have the same meanings as are respectively given to them in the Road Traffic Code, 1975.
- (ii) A person shall not stand or park a commercial vehicle in a pedestrian mall for more than fifteen (15) minutes during a period when such vehicles are permitted to enter the pedestrian mall as designated by signs at the entrance thereto.
- (iii) Subject to sub-clause (ii) of the clause a person shall not stand or park a vehicle in a pedestrian mall unless that vehicle is:—
- (a) an emergency vehicle;
 - (b) a special purpose vehicle;
 - (c) being used by a medical practitioner in the practice of his profession;
 - (d) a taxi conveying a lodger to or from premises to which access is ordinarily gained from the pedestrian mall and in respect of which a hotel licence is in force under the Liquor Act 1970;
 - (e) a vehicle in respect of which the Council has issued its approval in writing authorising the use of the vehicle in the pedestrian mall.

5. That Clause 30 be deleted and the following be substituted therefor:—

- “ 30 (i) No person shall permit a vehicle to stand in a parking stall which is at the time set aside for use by commercial vehicles unless such vehicle is a commercial vehicle and unless some person is actively engaged in loading or unloading goods to or from such vehicle, nor in any case for more than a period of twenty (20) minutes.
- (ii) No person shall permit a vehicle to stand in a parking stall in a pedestrian mall which is at the time set aside for use by commercial vehicles unless such vehicle is a commercial vehicle and unless some person is actively engaged in loading or unloading goods to or from such vehicle, nor in any case for more than a period of fifteen (15) minutes.
- (iii) In this clause “goods” means an article or collection of articles weighing at least 14 kgs or of which the content is at least .17 cubic metres.
- (iv) A parking stall is set aside for use by commercial vehicles if there is a sign thereon or adjacent thereto marked “Loading Zone”. ”

6. That Clause 60 be amended by deleting sub-clause (i) and substituting therefor the following:

- “ (i) in the case of an offence under Clause 13, 30 (1), 30 (2), 32, 33 (i), 33 (iii), 34 (i), 34 (ii), 34 (iii), 36, 37, 39 (i), 39 (iii) 39 (v), 40, and 41—Fifteen dollars (\$15.00). ”

7. That the First Schedule be amended by:—

(a) Deleting Clause 1 and substituting therefor:—

“1. Metered Spaces (Clause 6)

For a meter on the face of which is specified the time limit shown in the first column of this clause the prescribed fee for that meter is that shown in the second column of this clause:—

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950.

F & W 49/48.

THE Minister for Fisheries and Wildlife, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 14 and 17B of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950, does hereby declare as follows:

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the forenoon of Sunday, 9 January 1983 until one minute before midnight in the afternoon of Sunday, 20 February 1983, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild duck in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South West Division and Eucla Division, as defined in section 28 of the Land Act 1933 with the exception of those areas defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) That the species of wild duck in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto are game species in all parts of the State in respect of which an open season on those species is declared by paragraph (1) of this notice.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck of a species declared to be a game species under the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto unless he has been granted a license under Regulation 21 of the Wildlife Conservation Regulations.
- (4) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture or for the purpose of sale.
- (5) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (6) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun licensed pursuant to the Firearms Act 1973, and having a calibre of less than thirty-one fortieths of an inch of internal diameter (ten gauge).
- (7) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks from any boat, raft, launch or other type of boat which is powered by any type of motor or engine or which is propelled or towed by any means other than by hand.
- (8) That a person shall not take or attempt to take more than five wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto in any one day of the open season.
- (9) That a person shall not have under his control or in his possession or keep in any cold store or any freezing chambers or other premises at any one time—
 - (a) on opening day of the open season, more than five wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto;
 - (b) on any day other than opening day of the open season, more than ten wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (10) That a person shall not possess or transport a wild duck unless at least one fully feathered wing is attached to the bird, and that the wing and plumage may be removed from the duck—
 - (a) when the duck is prepared for immediate cooking, and
 - (b) after the duck is taken to the residence of its owner for preservation.
- (11) That a person shall not take or attempt to take wild ducks of a species in the Second Schedule and the Third Schedule hereto between the hours of—
 - (a) 7.00 p.m. and 5.00 a.m. on any day other than opening day of the open season, and
 - (b) midnight and 6.00 a.m., and 7.00 p.m. and midnight on opening day of the open season,
 in those areas defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto.



LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960-1982.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT AUDITORS REGULATIONS 1982.

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

PART I—PRELIMINARY.

- Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government Auditors Regulations 1982.
- Definitions. 2. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
 “chairman” means the chairman of the Board;
 “member” means a member of the Board and includes the chairman;
 “registration” means registration as a local government auditor for the purposes of the Act and “register” and “registered”, when used as verbs, have corresponding meanings;
 “regulation” means one of these regulations;
 “Secretary for Local Government” means the person holding or acting in the office of that title;
 “subregulation” means a subregulation of the regulation in which the term is used;
 “the Act” means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended);
 “the Board” means the Local Government Auditors Board referred to in section 635B of the Act;
 “the Department” means the Department of Local Government of the State.

PART II—THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AUDITORS BOARD.

- Constitution of the Board. 3. (1) The Board shall consist of 5 members appointed by the Minister by instrument, notice of which shall be published in the *Gazette*.
- (2) Subject to regulation 5 the members shall be—
- (a) an officer of the Department who is nominated by the Secretary for Local Government;
 - (b) a person nominated by the person holding the office of or duly acting as Auditor General;
 - (c) a person nominated jointly by the bodies known as The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia and the Australian Society of Accountants;
 - (d) a person nominated jointly by the bodies known as the Local Government Association of Western Australia and the Country Shire Councils' Association of W.A.; and
 - (e) a person nominated by the body known as the Institute of Municipal Administration.

- (3) The Secretary for Local Government may nominate himself for appointment as a member under subregulation (2) (a).
- Chairman. 4. The member holding office under regulation 3 (2) (a) shall be the chairman of the Board.
- Nomination for appointment. 5. (1) Whenever a nomination is required for the purpose of filling an office of member the Minister shall cause the person, body or bodies mentioned in the relevant paragraph of regulation 3 (2) to be requested, in writing, to nominate, in accordance with the request, a person willing to be appointed to that office.
- (2) Where a request is made pursuant to subregulation (1) the Minister may, if no nomination is made in accordance with the request, appoint to the office of member such person, being a person willing to be appointed to that office, as he thinks fit.
- Deputies. 6. (1) The Minister may, by instrument, notice of which shall be published in the *Gazette*, appoint a person as the deputy of a member.
- (2) Provisions of regulations 3 (2) and 5 that apply to and in relation to the appointment of a member apply, with any necessary modifications, to and in relation to the appointment of the deputy of that member.
- (3) A person appointed pursuant to this regulation is, in the event of the absence from a meeting of the Board of the member of whom he is the deputy, entitled to attend that meeting and, when so attending, is deemed to be a member for the purposes of regulation 8 (3) and (4) and has all the powers, functions and duties of a member.
- Terms and conditions. 7. (1) Subject to these regulations each member shall hold office for such period, not exceeding 3 years, as is specified in the instrument of his appointment and is eligible for re-appointment.
- (2) The Minister may, on such terms and conditions as he thinks fit, grant to a member leave to be absent from 2 or more consecutive meetings of the Board.
- (3) The office of a member becomes vacant if—
- (a) his term of office expires;
 - (b) his appointment is terminated by the Minister for non-attendance at 2 or more consecutive meetings of the Board without leave of absence duly granted by the Minister or for any other cause that appears to the Minister to be sufficient;
 - (c) he becomes permanently incapable of performing his duties as a member;
 - (d) he resigns his office by written notice addressed to the Minister and the resignation is accepted; or
 - (e) in the case of the member holding office under regulation 3 (2) (a), he ceases to be an officer of the Department.
- Meetings. 8. (1) The first meeting of the Board shall be held at a time and place appointed by the chairman and thereafter the Board shall hold such meetings, at such times and places, as it considers necessary for the performance of its functions.
- (2) The chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board at which he is present and the deputy of the chairman shall preside at all meetings at which the chairman is not present.
- (3) At a meeting of the Board, 5 members constitute a quorum.
- (4) A question arising at a meeting of the Board shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting and if there is an equality of votes the question shall be deemed to have been decided in the negative.
- (5) The Board shall cause minutes to be kept of its proceedings at its meetings.
- (6) The Board may inform itself in any manner it thinks fit and, to the extent that the procedure of the Board is not prescribed by these regulations, the Board shall determine its own procedure.
- Secretary. 9. There shall be a secretary of the Board who shall be an officer of the Department appointed by the Minister on the recommendation of the Secretary for Local Government.
- Validity of acts. 10. No act, proceeding or determination of the Board shall be invalid on the ground only of any defect in the appointment of any member or deputy of a member.
- Immunity. 11. No liability shall attach to a member or the deputy of a member or the secretary of the Board for any act or omission by him or by the Board, in good faith and in the performance or purported performance of his or its functions.

PART III—REGISTRATION OF LOCAL
GOVERNMENT AUDITORS.

- Applications. 12. (1) An application for registration shall be made in writing and, where a form is approved by the Board for that purpose, shall be made in that form.
- (2) The Board shall receive and consider all applications for registration.
- (3) In respect of any particular application for registration the applicant shall furnish to the Board such further information (if any) as the Board requires.
- (4) The Board may require any applicant for registration to attend personally before the Board and may refuse the application if such a requirement is not complied with.
- Registration. 13. (1) Where a person applies for registration in accordance with regulation 12 and complies with any requirement made under that regulation the Board shall register that person if the Board is satisfied—
- (a) that he—
- (i) is a member in good standing and holds a current practising certificate of The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia; or
- (ii) is a member in good standing and has the membership status of a Principal in Public Practice of the Australian Society of Accountants; and
- (b) that he—
- (i) is registered as an auditor under the Companies (Western Australia) Code;
- (ii) holds such qualification by way of experience or otherwise as is approved by the Board; or
- (iii) has complied with requirements for registration determined by the Board.
- (2) The Board shall serve on a person who makes an application for registration a written notice setting out its decision on the application.
- (3) The registration of a person shall remain in force until—
- (a) the registration is cancelled under regulation 14; or
- (b) the person dies.
- Cancellation of registration. 14. (1) The Board shall cancel the registration of a person if—
- (a) he voluntarily relinquishes his registration;
- (b) his membership of The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia or the Australian Society of Accountants, as the case may be, ceases; or
- (c) in the case of a person registered pursuant to regulation 13 (b) (i), his registration as an auditor under the Companies (Western Australia) Code is cancelled under that Code.
- (2) The Board may, of its own motion or on receipt of representations made to it by a council, regional council, Government Inspector of Municipalities or other person, cancel the Registration of a person if the Board is satisfied by reason of—
- (a) its own inquiries or observations;
- (b) any representations so made; or
- (c) its own inquiries or observations and any representations so made, that the person has not satisfactorily exercised and performed his powers, functions and duties as the auditor of a council or regional council.
- (3) The Board shall not cancel the registration of a person under subregulation (2), unless the Board has afforded the person an opportunity to appear at a hearing before the Board and to make submissions and give evidence to the Board in relation to the matter.
- (4) Where the Board cancels the registration of a person under this regulation the Board shall, not later than 14 days after the cancellation, serve on the person a written notice informing him of the cancellation and of the reason for the cancellation and, where the cancellation was made under subregulation (2), setting out the findings on material questions of fact and referring to the evidence or other material on which those findings were based.
- Appeal against cancellation. 15. An appeal against the cancellation of the registration of a person shall be made in writing and shall be served on the Minister within 14 days after notice of the cancellation is served on the person.
- Register. 16. The secretary of the Board shall maintain a register containing the names and addresses of persons who are for the time being registered and such other details as the Board directs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 27 October 1981 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following By-Laws:—

1. These By-Laws may be cited as the City of Melville By-Laws relating to Pest Plants.
2. In these By-Laws unless the content otherwise requires the following definitions shall apply—
 - “Council” shall mean Council of the municipality of the City of Melville.
 - “District” shall mean the district of the City of Melville.
 - “Pest Plant” shall mean a plant described as a pest plant in By-Law 4 of these By-Laws.
3. These By-Laws shall apply in respect to the District.
4. Every plant described in the first schedule to these By-Laws is a Pest Plant.

5. (1) The Council may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the District upon which there is a Pest Plant notice in the form of the second schedule to these By-Laws requiring him to destroy eradicate or otherwise control any Pest Plant on that land.

(2) A person served with a notice under Sub-ByLaw (1) of this By-Law shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.

6. Where a person fails to comply with a notice under By-Law 5 of these By-Laws served upon him the Council may—

- (1) Without payment of any compensation in respect thereof destroy eradicate or control as the case may be any Pest Plant, the destruction eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and
- (2) Recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed the amount of the expense of such destruction eradication or control.

The Municipality of the Shire of Donnybrook/Balingup.

By-laws Relating to Fencing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 16 June 1982 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

1. The following by-laws apply within the boundaries of the Shire of Donnybrook/Balingup.
2. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meanings set against them hereunder respectively:—
 - “Council” means the Council of the Shire of Donnybrook/Balingup.
 - “Dangerous” in relation to any fence or wall, means a fence that is likely to collapse or fall or part of which is likely to fall by reason of faulty design, location, construction, deterioration of materials, damage by termites, decay, changes in ground level or any other cause.
 - “Fence” includes a wall.
 - “Dividing Fence” has the meaning given to it by the Dividing Fences Act.
 - “Cattle” includes horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, camels, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, lambs, goats and swine.
3. Notwithstanding any other provision in these by-laws, Council may give approval in writing to erect a security wire mesh fence on land within the Shire. Such a fence shall not exceed 1.8 metres in height at any point along its length unless so authorised by the Council approval.

4. (a) The use of corrugated galvanised iron or flat iron is prohibited in the construction of any new fence or in the repair, alteration or addition to any existing fence.

(b) The use of iron spikes or broken glass on a fence, gate or any part of the premises or on anything erected on property adjoining a street way, footpath or other public place is prohibited.

(c) No person shall erect a dangerous fence on or within three metres of the boundary of a public place.

5. (a) The owner or occupier of land which a fence is erected upon shall maintain the fence in good condition and in such a manner as to prevent it from becoming dangerous, or in a state of disrepair.

(b) Where the fence is a dividing fence each of the owners or occupiers of the adjoining land is liable to maintain it as required by sub-by-law (a) hereof.

6. The Council may give notice in writing to the owner or to the occupier of any land upon which there exists a fence that has not been maintained in accordance with by-law 5 requiring such owner or occupier to pull down, repair, remove, paint or maintain such fence within twenty eight (28) days of such notice.

7. If any owner or occupier of land who has been given notice pursuant to by-law 6 fails to comply therewith the Council may enter upon such land and maintain the fence and recover the amount of expenses thereof from the owner in a Court of competent jurisdiction and may prosecute the owner for committing a breach of by-law 5.

8. A person who fails to comply with a notice given to him pursuant to by-law 6 or who does anything which he is prohibited from doing by these by-laws or who fails to do a thing which he is required or directed to do by these by-laws commits an offence.

9. A person who is guilty of an offence against these by-laws is liable to:—

A maximum penalty of \$200 for a breach of the by-laws, and in addition a daily penalty of \$20 for a continuing breach.

10. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications of the first schedule to these by-laws shall be a sufficient fence for the purpose of defining a "sufficient fence" pursuant to section 5 of the Dividing Fences Act, for any area within a townsite.

11. By-law 12 (a) and (b) applies to areas of 2 000 m² or less.

12. (a) The following materials may be used in construction of a fence, namely:

Brick, concrete, masonry, link mesh, timber or asbestos. The use of any other materials other than the above, whether in the construction of a new fence or in the repair, alteration or the addition to an existing fence is prohibited unless approval is obtained from the Council.

(b) Notwithstanding by-law 12 (a) barbed wire may be used on a Council approved security wire mesh fence provided that such barbed wire is no less than 1.8 metres from the ground at any point along the length of such fence.

13. The use of secondhand materials is prohibited in the construction of a new fence or in the repair, alteration or addition to any existing fence, unless Council approves otherwise.

14. A fence constructed in accordance with the specifications contained in Schedule 2 of these by-laws shall be a sufficient fence for the purpose of the definition of a sufficient fence pursuant to section 5 of the Dividing Fences Act, within all areas of the Shire where the First Schedule is not applicable.

15. The previous by-laws relating to Fencing as published in the *Government Gazette* on 3 December 1963 by the former Donnybrook Shire and By-laws relating to sufficient fence as published in the *Government Gazette* on 4 October 1962 by the former Balingup Shire are hereby revoked.

First Schedule.

If it is not practical to comply with any specifications laid down for the First Schedule, Council may consider an alternative standard on written request.

Within the area of all Townsites within the Shire a sufficient fence shall be as follows:—

Allotments of 2 000 m² and less.

1 (i) Any fence fronting a street shall not exceed a height of 750 mm at any point along the whole length of such frontage.

(ii) Any dividing fence which abuts a street shall not exceed a height of 750 mm at any point for a distance of 7.5 metres from such street.

(iii) That length of dividing fence more than 7.5 metres distance from a street and any other fence around an allotment at a greater distance than 7.5 metres from a street shall not exceed 1.8 metres in height at any point along its length.

2. Save as aforesaid a sufficient fence shall be constructed as follows:—
- (a) Corner posts shall be 125 mm x 125 mm x 2 150 mm and intermediate posts shall be 125 mm x 75 mm x 2 150 mm spaced at not more than three (3) metre centres.
- Corner posts shall be strutted two ways with 100 mm x 50 mm sole plates and 75 mm x 50 mm struts.
- Posts shall be checked for two rows of rails.
- Fences shall be covered with 75 mm x 20 mm x 1 800 mm sawn pickets placed close together so as to form a complete screen and shall be double nailed to each rail.
- (b) Corrugated asbestos sheet fences shall be erected as follows:—
- (i) Sheets under 1 800 mm in height to be trenched 450 mm into the ground.
- (ii) Sheets 1 800 mm and over in height to be trenched 600 mm into the ground.
- Sheets to be lapped and fixed with three galvanised 6 mm gutter bolts, nuts and washers or to manufacturers specifications.
- Allotments of over 2 000 m².
1. For fences of six plain wires, posts not more than 6.0 metre intervals with at least 1 dropper.
2. (a) Fences of meshed wire to have posts at not more than 20.0 metre intervals.
- (b) To consist of not less than one wire above the mesh. To be a support wire for the mesh.
- (c) Ties from mesh, to be not more than 7.0 metre intervals.
3. All posts, supports, droppers and wire spacers to have tops properly aligned; such fence to be cattle proof.
4. Barbed wire may be used subject to the written approval of Council.
5. All posts to be not less than 1.2 metre above the ground.

Second Schedule.

Within all areas of the Shire where the First Schedule is not applicable, a sufficient fence shall be constructed as follows:—

1. Not less than six wires with posts at 6 metre intervals with one dropper.
2. For fences of one barb and five plain wires, posts, droppers or wire spacers at not more than 6.0 metre intervals.
3. For electrified fences, posts at not more than 10 metre intervals, and not less than four wires.
4. For suspended fences, at least six wires of which two shall be barbed, with posts at not more than 22 metres and droppers or wire spacers at 4 metre intervals.
5. (a) Fences of meshed wire to have posts at not more than 20.0 metre intervals.
- (b) To consist of not less than one wire above the mesh. To be a support wire for the mesh.
- (c) Ties from mesh, to be not more than 7.0 metre intervals.
6. All posts to be not less than 1.2 metres above the ground.
7. All posts, supports, droppers and wire spacers to have tops properly aligned; such fence to be cattle proof.
8. If it is not practical to comply to these specifications Council may consider an alternative standard on written request.

DOG ACT 1976-1977.

The Municipality of the Shire of Gingin.

By-Laws Relating to Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Gingin hereby records having resolved on 24 June 1982 to revoke the resolution made on 16 February 1962 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 13 June 1962 in which Council adopted by-laws for the Control of Dogs; and to revoke the resolution made on 16 October 1980 in which Council adopted by-laws relating to Dog Kennels, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

PART I—PRELIMINARY.

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

"Act" means the Dog Act 1976 (as amended);

"By-law" means one of these by-laws;

"Clerk" means the Shire Clerk for the time being of the Shire of Gingin or other person acting for the time being in that capacity;

"Commercial Area" means any land situated within a commercial zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Gingin;

"Industrial Area" means any land situated within an industrial zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

"Regulations" means Dog Act Regulations 1976 as amended;

"Residential Area" means any land situated within a residential area zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

"Rural Area" means any land situated within a rural zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

"Special Rural Zone" means any land situated within a Special Rural Zone as classified by the Town Planning Scheme;

"Town Planning Scheme" means Shire of Gingin Town Planning Scheme Nos. 1 and 2, published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 June 1970, and 12 February 1971, and amended from time to time (including amendments made after the date of coming into operation of these by-laws) or any other town planning scheme or by-laws made by the Council for the time being in force.

Expressions used in these by-laws have the meanings given to them by the Act.

2. These by-laws apply throughout the whole of the district of the Shire of Gingin.

PART II—IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

3. The charges in relation to the seizure and impounding of a dog and maintenance thereof in a pound payable under section 29 (4) of the Act are as specified in the First Schedule.

4. (1) The pound keeper shall be in attendance at a pound for the release of dogs at the times and on the days of the week the Clerk determines from time to time.

(2) In the absence of the pound keeper a claim for a dog seized or impounded may be made to the Clerk or to an authorised person.

(3) The additional fee specified in the First Schedule is payable where arrangements are made for the release of a dog at a time or on a day other than those determined by the Clerk under sub-bylaw (1).

5. The fee payable where a dog is destroyed at the request of the owner thereof pursuant to section 29 (14) of the Act is that specified in the First Schedule.

6. The payment of fees or charges in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog does not relieve the owner of the dog of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of the Act, the Dog Act Regulations 1976 or these by-laws.

PART III—KEEPING OF DOGS.

7. The occupier of premises shall not unless the premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment or have been granted exemption pursuant to section 20 (3) of the Act keep or permit to be kept on those premises more than:—

- (a) two dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated within a residential area, a commercial area or an industrial area, or within a special rural zone; or
- (b) Six dogs over the age of three months and the young of those dogs under that age if the premises are situated within a rural area.

8. The occupier of premises on which a dog is kept shall:—

- (a) cause the premises or portion thereof on which the dog is kept to be fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog;
- (b) ensure that every gate or door in the fence has a proper latch or other means of fastening it;
- (c) maintain the fence and all gates and doors in good order and condition.

9. (1) An application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in writing and shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Second Schedule and shall be supported by evidence that due notice of the proposed use of the land has been given to persons in the locality.

(2) Unless the Council otherwise decides an applicant for a licence shall give notice of the proposed use of the land by—

- (a) not less than one advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district; and
- (b) giving written notice to the owners and occupiers of all adjoining premises and those within 400 metres of the boundaries of the proposed kennel establishment;

at least thirty days before the application is made to the Council.

10. The fee payable for the issue of a licence and the annual renewal fee to keep an approved kennel establishment is that specified in the First Schedule of these by-laws.

11. A licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be in or substantially in the form contained in the Third Schedule of these by-laws.

12. A person shall not erect a kennel unless it complies with the provisions of these by-laws and until plans and specifications and a location plan showing the proposed site for the kennel and of the yard appurtenant thereto have been approved by the Council and the fee for a licence prescribed in the First Schedule of these by-laws has been paid.

13. The owner or occupier of premises for which an approved kennel establishment licence has been granted shall provide a kennel or kennels which comply with the following specifications:—

- (a) each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto;
- (b) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 30 metres from the boundaries of the land in the occupation of the occupier;
- (c) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 30 metres from any road or street;
- (d) each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 20 metres from any dwelling house, church, schoolroom, hall or factory;
- (e) the wall shall be rigid, impervious and structurally sound;
- (f) the roof shall be constructed of impervious material or other material approved by Council;

- (g) all untreated external surfaces of material shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint;
 - (h) the lowest internal height shall be at least 2 metres from the floor;
 - (i) each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 2 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, wood, galvanised link mesh or netting;
 - (j) all gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening;
 - (k) the upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface, and shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100; the entire yard shall be surrounded by a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped; all floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
 - (l) the floor of a yard shall be constructed in the same matter as the floor of a kennel;
 - (m) for each dog kept therein every kennel shall have not less than 2 m² of floor space and every yard not less than 2.5 m²;
 - (n) each kennel shall be constructed so far as is practicable with materials which prevent or minimise the emission of noise therefrom.
14. A person who keeps or permits dogs to be kept in an approved kennel establishment shall:—
- (a) keep dogs in kennels and yards appropriate to the breed or kind in question, sited and maintained in accordance with the requirements of public health and sufficiently secured;
 - (b) not permit any dog to escape from the kennel or yard in which it is kept nor wander at large except for the purpose of reasonable exercise; and
 - (c) maintain all kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels used by dogs therein in a clean condition and cleanse and disinfect them when required so to do by an authorised person.

PART IV—GENERAL.

15. The person liable for the control of a dog shall prevent the dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless restrained on a chain, cord, leash or harness:—

- (a) a sports ground;
- (b) a car park within a townsite.

16. A person who fails to comply with or contravenes any of the provisions of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of \$100.00.

(b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.
