SUPREME COURT ACT 1935-1982.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act 1935-1982, and all other powers hereunto enabling, the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia hereby make the following rules.

AMENDMENT OF THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT 1971.

Principal
 rules.

1. In these rules, the Rules of the Supreme Court 1971, reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 11 June 1981 pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954, and amended by rules published in the *Government Gazette* on 20 November 1981, 2 and 30 July 1982 and 31 March 1983, are referred to as the principal rules.

2. Order 20 of the principal rules is amended by adding after rule 13 the following rule—

Particulars
 in defamation
 actions.
 Cf. E.O.82 r.3.

13A. (1) Where in an action for libel or slander the plaintiff alleges that the words or matters complained of were used in a defamatory sense other than their ordinary meaning, he must give particulars of the facts and matters on which he relies in support of that sense.

(2) Where in an action for libel or slander the defendant alleges that, in so far as the words complained of consist of statements of fact, they are true in substance and in fact, and in so far as they consist of expressions of opinion, they are fair comment on a matter of public interest, or pleads to the like effect, he must give particulars stating which of the words complained of he alleges are statements of fact and of the facts and matters he relies on in support of the allegation that the words are true.

(3) Where in an action for libel or slander the plaintiff alleges that the defendant maliciously published the words or matters complained of, he need not in his statement of claim give parti-

culars of the facts on which he relies in support of the allegation of malice; but where the defendant pleads that any of those words or matters are fair comment on a matter of public interest or were published upon a privileged occasion and the plaintiff intends to allege that the defendant was actuated by express malice, he must serve a reply giving particulars of the facts and matters from which the malice is to be inferred.

(4) This rule applies in relation to a counterclaim for libel or slander as if the party making the counterclaim were the plaintiff and the party against whom it is made were the defendant.

(1) Where a person named in a subpoena for production of any document or thing is not a party to the proceedings and he incurs substantial expense or loss in complying with the subpoena, the Court hearing the proceedings may order that the party who requested the issue of the subpoena pay to that person, in addition to any amount that the person served with the subpoena is entitled to be paid pursuant to the Fourth Schedule, an amount that is sufficient to compensate him for any expense or loss that is reasonably incurred or lost by that person in complying with the subpoena.

(2) Where an order is made under paragraph (1), the Court may fix the amount or direct that the amount be assessed by the Taxing Officer.

(3) The provisions of Order 66 shall apply, with the necessary modifications, in relation to a taxation under this rule.

- (i) the name and address of the person to or for whom the drug of addiction was dispensed;
- (ii) the date of dispensing;
- (iii) the descriptions and quantity of the drugs of addiction dispensed;
- (iv) the directions for use as written in the prescription;
- (v) the name and address of the person who wrote the prescription; and

(vi) the distinguishing number allotted by him to the prescription,

and shall be signed by the person who actually dispensed the drug of addiction.

- (j) in the case of a repeat prescription, an entry in the Prescription Book of the fact of the repeat and the repeat number signed and dated shall be sufficient compliance with this regulation;
- (k) the label on the bottle or package containing the drug of addiction shall be marked with the identifying letter or number of the prescription as appearing in the Prescription Book;
- (l) the Prescription Book shall be kept for a period of one year from the date of the last dispensing recorded therein at the place at which the drug of addiction was dispensed and shall be produced on demand to any person authorized in that behalf under the Act; and
- (m) the drug of addiction so dispensed shall conform in quantity, description, composition, strength, form and every other material particular to the directions of the prescriber,

and in respect of a prescription prescribing a drug of addiction issued under the National Health Act 1953 or the Repatriation Act 1920 of the Commonwealth a copy of such a prescription is deemed to be a prescription for the purposes of this regulation. ”; and

(b) by repealing subregulation (6) and substituting the following—

“ (6) A pharmaceutical chemist shall retain possession of any prescription prescribing a drug of addiction presented to him for dispensing and which he suspects of being false in any particular and hold the prescription for such reasonable period as will enable him to satisfy himself as to its genuineness and make enquiries concerning the *bona fides* of the person by whom it is presented or the identity of the individual by whom such prescription purports to have been written.

(6a) When a pharmaceutical chemist to whom a prescription is submitted for dispensing is satisfied that the prescription is not in accordance with the requirements of the Act or regulations, he shall cancel it and endorse upon its face in ink in his own handwriting the date and his usual signature, together with the address of the dispensary either stamped or written and forward it to the Commissioner and inform the Commissioner of the relevant circumstances and the reasons for his refusal to dispense the prescription. ”.

HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

The Municipality of the Town of Northam.

Health By-laws—Eating Houses.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, the Council of the abovementioned Local Authority hereby records having resolved on 27 October 1982, to make and submit for the approval of the Governor, the following by-laws:—

PART I.

Repeal.

The by-law relating to Eating Houses adopted by the Council of the Municipality of Northam and published in the *Government Gazette* on 24 February 1950 and all amendments thereto is hereby repealed.

The by-law relating to Snack Bars adopted by the Council of the Municipality of Northam and published in the *Government Gazette* on 12 October 1962 and all amendments thereto is hereby repealed.

PART II.

Interpretation.

1. In the construction of this by-law unless the context otherwise requires.

“Act” means the Health Act 1911 (as amended).

“Eating House” as defined in section 160 of the Health Act 1911 (as amended).

“Health Surveyor” means any person appointed by the Local Authority to be a Health Surveyor pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

“Licence” means a licence to conduct an eating house pursuant to the provisions of these by-laws.

“Local Authority” means the Council of the Town of Northam.

“Proprietor” means the person having the management or control of the premises including “owner” as defined under section 6 of The Local Government Act 1960 as amended.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk or Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of the Town of Northam.

PART II.

Licence and Registration.

2. No person shall occupy or use premises as an eating house unless:—

(a) The premises are registered under these by-laws as an eating house as the case may be; and

(b) The proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a licence issued by the Local Authority under these by-laws authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an eating house as the case may be.

3. Before any premises are registered under these by-laws as an eating house the proprietor thereof shall make application in the appropriate form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward his application together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made and the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk and if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a certificate of registration, in the appropriate form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. Before any licence to any proprietor to conduct an eating house is granted by the Local Authority under these by-laws, the proprietor shall sign an application for same in the appropriate form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall forward same together with the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk and, if the application is approved, the Local Authority shall issue to the proprietor a licence in the appropriate form prescribed in the Sixth Schedule hereto.

5. Any person who makes a false statement in connection with any application under Clauses 3, 4, 8 or 11 hereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Every Certificate of Registration of premises under Clause 3 hereof and every licence issued under Clause 4 hereof shall be signed by the Town Clerk, and shall be duly entered in a book to be provided by the Local Authority for that purpose. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the certificate of registration and the licence on the registered premises in a position visible to the general public and shall, when requested to do so by a Health Surveyor produce to him the certificate of registration and also the licence issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

7. Every certificate of registration under Clause 3 hereof and every licence under Clause 4 hereof shall be in force from the day of the date of the issue thereof until and inclusive of the 31st day of December then next ensuing, unless same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

8. Applications for the renewal of the certificate of registration under Clause 3 hereof and licence under Clause 4 hereof shall be made annually in the month of December. Such applications shall be in the appropriate form prescribed in the Third and Fifth Schedules hereto respectively and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

9. The fees to be paid to the Local Authority on the registration of premises under Clause 3 hereof and the issuing of a licence under Clause 4 hereof and on the renewal of any such registration or licence shall be as set out in the Eighth Schedule hereto.

10. So often as any person holding a licence issued pursuant to these by-laws changes his place of abode he shall, within seven days next after such a change, give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk specifying in such notice his new place of abode and he shall at the time produce such licence to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

11. If the proprietor of any registered premises sells or transfers or parts with possession of the said premises then the new proprietor shall apply in the appropriate form prescribed in the Seventh Schedule for a transfer of the existing licence and if such transfer is approved, the Town Clerk shall endorse on the existing licence the transfer of the licence.

12. Any application for registration of an Eating House under Clause 3 hereof which is lodged with Council on or after the gazettal of these by-laws shall be accompanied by plans and specifications of the proposed Eating House.

13. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and, upon conviction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred (100) dollars, and where such breach is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding four (4) dollars.

The By-laws of the Town of Bassendean published in the *Government Gazette* on 15 April 1983, be amended as follows:—

By-law 11 (2) is amended by deleting the complete passage and substituting in lieu thereof—

- (2) (a) No part of any stable shall be at any less distance than 15 metres from any dwelling house or milking shed or milk room of any dairy.
- (b) (i) Any paddock or yard used for the keeping of any horse shall have a fence or railing at a distance of not less than 1.2 metres from the boundary of any land and not less than 15 metres from any dwelling house.
- (ii) Any paddock or yard used for keeping of any horse shall not be any less distance than 15 metres from any water course.

4. Fuel and/or Gas Depots: In respect of land owned by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquids or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or support is constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable materials.

- Interpretation. 4. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
“Form” means a form in the Schedule to these regulations;
“regulation” means one of these regulations;
“the Act” means the Agricultural Products Act 1929 and includes a code formulated by the Minister under the Act.
- Detention notice. 5. A detention notice issued under section 4 (4) of the Act shall be in the form of Form 1.

Order to make agricultural products conform to Act.

6. Where, under section 4 (4c) of the Act, an inspector orders the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the agricultural products to take such measures as the inspector determines necessary to make the agricultural products conform to the requirements of the Act he shall issue to the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the agricultural products an order in the form of Form 2.

Order for destruction.

7. (1) Where an inspector is satisfied that any agricultural products or any package of agricultural products cannot be made to conform to the requirements of the Act and is of the opinion that the agricultural products should be destroyed, he shall make a report in accordance with Part A of Form 3 and, subject to approval by the Minister or a person authorized by the Minister in that behalf, shall issue an order for destruction in accordance with Part B of Form 3.

(2) An order for destruction shall require the agricultural products or package of agricultural products to be destroyed by burning, boiling, burying, dumping in a municipal tip or any other method of disposal that effectually destroys the products.

Disposal order.

8. Where the owner of any agricultural products or any package of agricultural products that do not conform to the requirements of the Act informs the inspector, prior to the execution of an order issued under regulations 6 or 7, that he desires to dispose of the agricultural products other than by sale or destruction, the inspector may, if satisfied that the method of disposal specified by the owner does not contravene the requirements of the Act, issue to the owner an order in the form of Form 4.

Evidence of destruction or disposal.

9. Where an order for destruction or disposal is made under section 4 (4d), the inspector making the order may require the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the agricultural products described in the order to provide documentary evidence that the agricultural products were destroyed or disposed of as required by the order.
