PURSUANT to section 5A of the Money Lenders Act 1912-1982, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby grant AMP-Amex Leasing Limited and AMP-Amex Securities Pty Limited, bodies corporate, whose registered offices in Western Australia are situated at C/o Parker and Parker, 23rd Floor, AMP Building, 140 St. George's Terrace, Perth, hereinafter referred to as "the companies", exemption from registration under that Act for the period specified in the Schedule to this proclamation and upon the conditions specified in that Schedule.

3. The companies shall, if and when requested to do so by the Attorney General, provide a statement of all loans made by them while this exemption has effect showing the amount of each loan, the interest charged, and the reason advanced by the borrower for seeking the loan.

## FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS DUTY REGULATIONS 1984.

MADE by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

Citation. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Financial Institutions Duty Regulations 1984.

Interpretation. 2. In these regulations, "the Act" means the Financial Institutions Duty Act 1983.

When return or application deemed to be furnished. 3. A return or an application for registration or certification shall not be deemed to have been furnished to the Commissioner unless and until the appropriate form, duly signed and containing a full, true and complete statement of all matters and things required to be stated in that form, has been lodged at the office of the Commissioner.

Prescription for purposes of section 10 (4) (o). 4. The Government of this State is prescribed for the purposes of section 10 (4) (o) of the Act.

Prescription under section 10 (4) (r). 5. A receipt that is a credit to an income account of a registered financial institution where an offsetting debit is made to a mortgage loan account with that financial institution is prescribed under section 10 (4) (r) of the Act as a receipt to which the Act does not apply.

Prescription under section 13 (14) (h). 6. Every person being a certified short term dealer who is not a prescribed short term dealer and who—  
(a) is a registered financial institution by reason only that he is a credit provider; or  
(b) is not a registered financial institution,  
is prescribed as constituting a class of persons for the purposes of section 13 (14) of the Act.



- Prescription under section 13 (10). 7. Every amount paid by a certified short term dealer who is not a prescribed short term dealer and who—
- (a) is a registered financial institution by reason only that he is a credit provider; or
  - (b) is not a registered financial institution,
- other than an amount relating to short term dealings which are taken into consideration for the purposes of ascertaining the short term liabilities of the certified short term dealer during the relevant month in respect of which financial institutions duty is paid under section 11 of the Act, is prescribed as constituting a class of amounts for the purposes of section 13 (10) of the Act.
- Allowance of expenses. 8. Where a person is required under section 70 of the Act to attend and give evidence before the Commissioner there may be allowed to that person the sum, not exceeding in any case the minimum wage payable in the metropolitan area from time to time *per diem*, actually and necessarily lost by him by reason of his attendance, and, in addition, if he resides more than 7 kilometres from the place at which he is required to attend, such sum for travelling expenses, not exceeding the sum actually paid as the Commissioner thinks reasonable.
- How duty to be paid etc. 9. (1) A person may pay duty by delivery of cash, banknotes, bank draft, postal order or cheque at the office of the Commissioner.
- (2) Where a remittance in payment of duty is posted by or on behalf of a person to the Commissioner, the payment shall not be deemed to have been made until the remittance has been received by the Commissioner.
- (3) Where a cheque has been delivered or remitted to the Commissioner in payment of the duty, the duty shall, notwithstanding any receipt given therefor, not be deemed to have been paid until the amount for which the cheque is drawn has been collected.
- (4) The Commissioner shall issue a receipt for every amount of duty paid in person at the office of the Commissioner and upon request for any amount of duty paid by any other means, and, the receipt may be issued by such persons as the Commissioner authorizes.
- Order under section 51 (8) of Act. 10. An order issued under section 51 (8) of the Act shall be in the form set out in Schedule 1 to these regulations.
- Signatures. 11. (1) Every application, statement, return, certificate, notice or other communication required by or under the Act to be made or furnished to the Commissioner, shall be signed—
- (a) in the case of an individual so required—in the name of that individual;
  - (b) in the case of trustees so required—in the name of any one or more of the trustees resident in Australia, or where there is no trustee resident in Australia—of the agent in Australia for the trustee;
  - (c) in the case of a company—in the name of an authorized officer or the public officer of the company;
  - (d) in the case of any municipality or any Department, authority, agency or instrumentality of the Crown in right of a State—by the officer or officers appointed.
- (2) Subject to subregulation (3) of this regulation, the documents specified in subregulation (1) of this regulation shall be signed personally by the person in whose name they are required to be signed.
- (3) Where it is not possible or practicable for the person specified in subregulation (2) of this regulation personally to sign documents required to be signed in his name, or where, on account of special circumstances, the Commissioner so permits, the person who is required to make or furnish those documents, or the directors of a company which is so required, may authorize, in writing another person to sign the documents in the name of the person so specified, before his own signature as a person so authorized.
- (4) An authority under subregulation (3) of this regulation is not effective in relation to a return, notice or other documents required to be made, given or furnished at the office of the Commissioner unless and until notice of the authority, accompanied by a specimen signature of the authorized person and a statement of the capacity in which the authorized person acts in the business of the person giving the authority, has been given to the Commissioner at that office by the person giving the authority.
- (5) The Commissioner may, at any time, if he thinks fit, disapprove of the authorization of a person to sign documents in pursuance of subregulation (3) of this regulation and direct that document signed by that person under the authorization shall not be accepted.
- (6) Every document signed in accordance with these regulations in the name of the person in whose name it is required by this regulation to be signed shall be deemed to have been signed by that person.
- (7) Notice of the cancellation of the authorization of any person under this regulation shall be given to the Commissioner.

(8) A person shall not, except in accordance with these regulations—

- (a) authorize, permit, suffer or procure to be signed otherwise than in his own name and by himself personally, or to be used unsigned; or
- (b) be party or privy to, or be directly or indirectly concerned in, the signing otherwise than in his own name and by himself personally, or the use unsigned, of,

a document required by these regulations to be signed either in his own name and by himself personally, or in this own name before the signature of some other person.

Penalty: \$1 000.

(9) A person shall not, except in accordance with these regulations, sign, or purport to sign either in his own name, or in any other name, or use unsigned, a document required by these regulations to be signed personally by, or in the name of, some other person.

Penalty: \$1 000.

## HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

Shire of Chittering.

By-laws Relating to Intensive Piggeries.

WHEREAS under the Health Act 1911 as amended, a local authority may make by-laws, now therefore, the Shire of Chittering being the local authority for the health district of Chittering, has resolved to make the following by-laws.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the "Shire of Chittering Intensive Housing of Pigs By-laws" and shall apply within the whole of the Shire of Chittering.

2. For the purpose of these by-laws, the following definitions shall apply:—

"Authorised Officer" means a person lawfully appointed by Council for the purpose of these by-laws.

"Bore" means a well or shaft sunk in the earth for the purpose of production of ground water, whether for human or animal consumption.

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Chittering.

"District" means the Municipal District of the Shire of Chittering.

"Intensive Piggery" means those premises where pigs are kept in buildings or yards at a stocking density of less than 2 square metres per 45 kilograms of total live pig body weight and includes any effluent disposal or drainage system connected thereto.

"Water Course" has the same meaning as that contained in section 2 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act 1914, as amended.

3. No person shall establish an Intensive piggery within the Shire of Chittering without approval of the Council.

The Intensive housing of pigs may be permitted in all areas of the local authority, with the exception of the following:—

(a) The townsites of Muchea and Bindoon and all that land within three kilometres outside the boundaries of those townsites.

(b) The townsite of Wannamal and all that land within one kilometre outside the boundary of that townsite.

4. Any person intending to establish an Intensive piggery within the district shall submit to the Council,

(a) Plans and specifications in duplicate of the proposed Intensive piggery including:—

(i) Details of the approximate number of pigs to be kept.

(ii) Details of the drainage and effluent disposal system to be installed.

(iii) Details of the method by which cleaning down of the premises shall be maintained.

5. No person shall establish or maintain an Intensive piggery unless every portion of such piggery is:—

- (a) At least 100 metres from any house or other place of human habitation or any place whatsoever where food for human consumption is prepared or stored.
- (b) At least 200 metres from the boundary of the lot upon which the intensive piggery is to be situated.

6. (a) All buildings and yards shall be maintained in a structurally sound and clean condition free of fly and vermin infestation.

(b) Drainage and treatment of effluent waste shall be carried out and maintained so as to prevent a nuisance.

7. Every person who establishes an Intensive piggery in contravention of these by-laws shall commit an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$200.

8. Every person who carries on an Intensive piggery established in breach of these by-laws shall commit an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$4 for every day on which he carried it on whether there has or has not been a conviction in respect of the establishing of the Intensive piggery.

9. (a) Where there is a default by an owner or occupier of an Intensive piggery in complying with the provisions of these by-laws the Council or its authorised officer may by notice in writing served on that owner or occupier order that the default be rectified and in the event of noncompliance with that notice the Council or its authorised officer may effect such work as is necessary to comply with requirements of the order.

(b) The cost of effecting the work referred to in paragraph (a) hereof shall be a debt due and owing by the owner or occupier of that Intensive piggery to the Council and may be recovered by the Council in a court of competent jurisdiction.

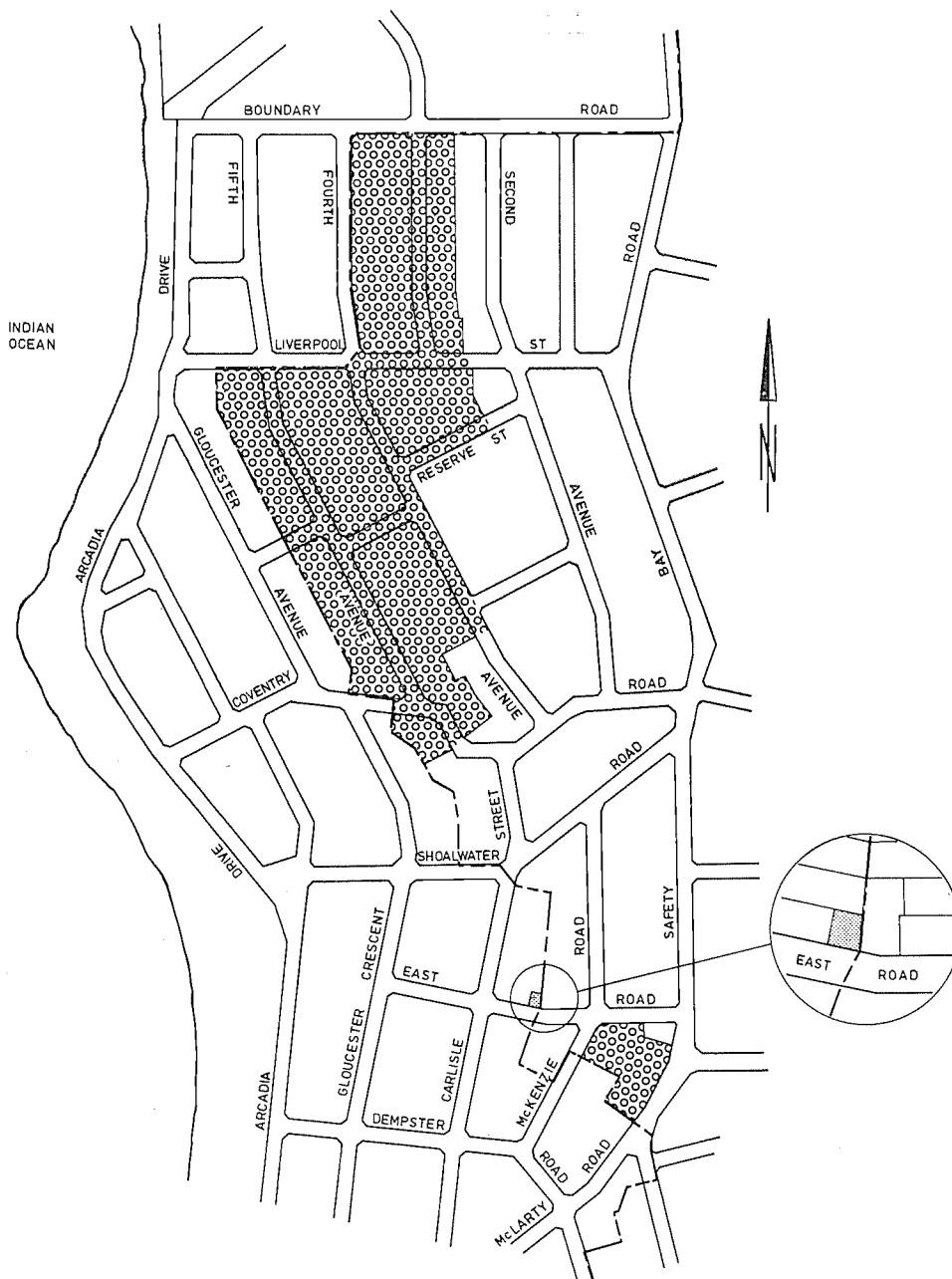

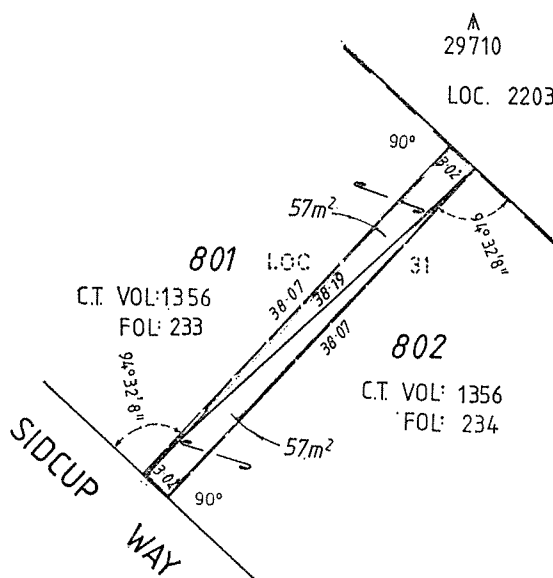

A person shall not bring, or cause to be brought into the State, from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth the unprocessed fruit of mangoes (*Mangifera* spp.), unless the fruit is accompanied by a certificate issued by the Department of Agriculture of the State or Territory from which the fruit originated, certifying that the fruit was produced in a State or Territory where the pest of mangoes (*Mangifera* spp.) known as mango seed weevil (*Cryptorhynchus mangiferae* F.) is not known to occur.
- Entry of fruit prohibited. 4. Except in accordance with these regulations, the entry into the State of the unprocessed fruit of mangoes (*Mangifera* spp.) from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth, is prohibited.
- Offence and penalty. 5. Any person acting in contravention of these regulations commits an offence.
