WHEREAS by section 13 of the Main Roads Act 1930-1982, it is provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, by proclamation declare that any section or part of a road shall cease to be a Highway or shall cease to be a Main Road; and whereas the Commissioner has recommended that the road section delineated on the plans specified in Schedule 1 hereto shall cease to be Main Roads.

Therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13 of the Main Roads Act 1930-1982, and pursuant to the said recommendations do hereby declare the road sections delineated on the plans and as generally described in Schedule 1 hereto shall cease to be Main Roads but the footpaths, if any, of such roads are excluded from this proclamation.

5. The lessee shall indemnify the Minister against all claims for damage to property or persons arising from the use of the land.
6. Compensation shall not be payable to the lessee in respect of any improvements effected by him on the demised land and remaining thereon at the expiration or earlier determination of the lease.
7. On determination of the lease, the lessee shall fill in, consolidate and level off any unevenness, excavation or hole caused by him during the term of the lease or by removal of his improvements and shall leave the demised land in a clean, neat and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Minister and shall remove any or all waste matter as required by the Minister.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the abovementioned reserve shall be leased for a term of twenty-one (21) years to the Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Club for the purpose of "Recreation" subject however to the rental and conditions aforesaid.

PETROLEUM PRODUCTS PRICING ACT 1983.

PETROLEUM PRODUCTS PRICING (MAXIMUM PRICES FOR MOTOR FUEL) ORDER 1984.

MADE by the Prices Commissioner under section 12.

Citation. 1. This order may be cited as the Petroleum Products Pricing (Maximum Prices for Motor Fuel) Order 1984.

Commencement. 2. This order shall take effect on 3 February 1984.

Interpretation. 3. (1) In this order—
 "fixed" means fixed under section 12 of the State Act;
 "motor fuel" means motor fuel which is standard grade petrol or super grade petrol;
 "resellers" means persons who sell motor fuel by retail to persons within the State at premises at which motor fuel is usually dispensed through dispensing equipment;
 "standard grade petrol" means standard grade petrol supplied for use in the State;
 "super grade petrol" means super grade petrol supplied for use in the State;

“the Commonwealth Act” means—

- (a) before the coming into operation of the Prices Surveillance Act 1983 of the Commonwealth, the Petroleum Products Pricing Act 1981 of the Commonwealth; and
- (b) after the coming into operation of the Prices Surveillance Act 1983 of the Commonwealth, that Act;

“the Commonwealth Authority” means—

- (a) before the coming into operation of the Prices Surveillance Act 1983 of the Commonwealth, the Petroleum Products Pricing Authority established by the Petroleum Products Pricing Act 1981 of the Commonwealth; and
- (b) after the coming into operation of the Prices Surveillance Act 1983, the Prices Surveillance Authority established by that Act;

“the free delivery area” means those places within the State—

- (a) to which a vendor of motor fuel delivers motor fuel without making any charge for that delivery; and
- (b) in respect of which no freight differential is approved by the Commonwealth Authority under the Commonwealth Act;

“the State Act” means the Petroleum Products Pricing Act 1983 of the State;

(2) A reference in this order to an Act of the Commonwealth is a reference to that Act as amended from time to time.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1918 (except for sections 36 and 37 thereof) applies to this order as if this order were regulations made under the State Act.

4. (1) The maximum bulk wholesale price at which—

- (a) standard grade petrol may be sold in the free delivery area to resellers is hereby fixed at 41.6c per litre; and
- (b) super grade petrol may be sold in the free delivery area to resellers is hereby fixed at 42.5c per litre.

(2) Subject to subclause (5) of this clause, the maximum retail price at which—

- (a) standard grade petrol may be sold in the free delivery area to persons who are not resellers is hereby fixed at 45.1c per litre; and
- (b) super grade petrol may be sold in the free delivery area to persons who are not resellers is hereby fixed at 46.0c per litre.

(3) The maximum bulk wholesale price at which—

- (a) standard grade petrol may be sold in the State outside the free delivery area to resellers is hereby fixed at 41.6c per litre; and
- (b) super grade petrol may be sold in the State outside the free delivery area to resellers is hereby fixed at 42.5c per litre,

increased by an amount equivalent to the amount (if any) that, at the time when the relevant sale is made, is the freight differential approved by the Commonwealth Authority under the Commonwealth Act in respect of deliveries of motor fuel by the vendor to the place where the motor fuel is delivered, less any subsidy payable under the States Grants (Petroleum Products) Act 1965 of the Commonwealth.

(4) Subject to subclause (5) of this clause, the maximum retail price at which—

- (a) standard grade petrol may be sold in a district or area specified in the second column of the Schedule to this order to persons who are not resellers is hereby fixed at the price specified opposite to that district or area in the third column of that Schedule; or
- (b) super grade petrol may be sold in a district or area specified in the second column of the Schedule to this order to persons who are not resellers is hereby fixed at the price specified opposite to that district or area in the fourth column of that Schedule.

(5) A person who, being the shopkeeper of a zoned filling station, is required by section 92 of the Factories and Shops Act 1963 to sell motor fuel at the zoned filling station at any time between the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. may in respect of motor fuel sold at the zoned filling station at that time increase the maximum retail price fixed by subclause (2) or (4) as the case requires, of this clause by such amount not exceeding 2.0c per litre as he thinks fit.


