PURSUANT to section 5A of the Money Lenders Act 1912-1982, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby grant Partnership Pacific Securities Limited, a body corporate whose registered office in Western Australia is situated at 77 Saint George's Terrace, Perth, hereinafter referred to as "the company", exemption from registration under that Act for the period specified in the Schedule to this proclamation and upon the conditions specified in that Schedule.

## Period of Exemption.

For a period of 3 years commencing on and from 6 June 1984.

## Conditions of Exemption.

1. While this exemption has effect the company shall—

- (a) comply with; and
- (b) ensure that persons acting for it or on its behalf comply with,

the restrictions and requirements imposed by section 20 of the Money Lenders Act 1912-1982 as if the company were a money lender within the meaning of that Act.

2. The company shall not make a loan within Western Australia pursuant to this exemption other than a loan of not less than \$50 000 made to a body corporate.

3. The company shall, if and when requested to do so by the Attorney General, provide a statement of all loans made by it while this exemption has effect showing the amount of each loan, the interest charged, and the reason advanced by the borrower for seeking the loan.

## NOISE ABATEMENT ACT 1972-1981.

## NOISE ABATEMENT (CENTENARY AVENUE CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMME) EXEMPTION ORDER 1984.

MADE by the Minister for Health, with the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Noise Abatement (Centenary Avenue Construction Programme) Exemption Order 1984.
- Construction of Centenary Avenue Exempted. 2. All of the provisions of the Noise Abatement Act 1972-1981 and Regulations made under that Act are declared not to apply for the period commencing at the date of gazettal of this notice and ending 30 December 1984, in respect of the construction of Centenary Avenue, Wilson by or on behalf of the City of Canning.
- Condition. 3. The exemption granted in Clause 2 of this Order is subject to the condition set out in the Schedule to this Order.

## Schedule.

1. The Council of the City of Canning, or any of its officers, receiving a complaint arising from the Centenary Avenue Construction Programme, relating to noise or vibration, shall cause notice of the complaint to be lodged with the Noise Abatement Section, Public Health Department, specifying details of the complaint, as soon as is practicable.
2. The Council of the City of Canning shall cause, and report to the Noise Abatement Section, Public Health Department on the results of, monitoring to be conducted of the levels of noise and vibration associated with the Centenary Avenue Construction Programme.
3. The level of noise from plant and equipment shall not exceed 75 dB(A), when assessed in accordance with the Act, at the boundary of any residential premises.
4. The level of ground borne vibration, when measured adjacent to any residence shall not exceed a peak particle velocity of 10  $\text{mms}^{-1}$ .
5. At the direction of a State Noise Inspector all practicable steps shall be taken to reduce excessive levels of noise and/or vibration.
6. The City of Canning shall cause the provisions of the Noise Abatement (Hearing Conservation in Workplaces) Regulations 1983, to be observed after these come into force.
7. All work associated with the Centenary Avenue Construction Programme shall not commence before 0700 hours nor be extended beyond 1900 hours on Monday to Friday.
8. No work associated with the Centenary Avenue Construction Programme shall be undertaken on Saturdays and Sundays.

## NOISE ABATEMENT ACT 1972-1981.

## NOISE ABATEMENT (TREE CHIPPING) EXEMPTION ORDER 1984.

MADE by the Minister for Health, with the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

- Citation. 1. This Order may be cited as the Noise Abatement (Tree Chipping) Exemption Order 1984.
- City of Canning Tree Chipping Machine exempted. 2. All of the provisions of the Noise Abatement Act 1972-1981 and regulations made under that Act are declared not to apply for a period of 12 months from the date of gazettal of this notice, in respect of the operation by or on behalf of the City of Canning of a tree chipping machine.
- Condition. 3. The exemption granted in Clause 2 of this Order is subject to the condition set out in the schedule to this Order.

## Schedule.

1. At no time during the chipping process shall the level of sound emanating from the tree chipping machine exceed 90 dB(A) when measured at 7 metres from the closest part of the machine.
2. The tree chipping machine shall not be operated pursuant to the exemption—
  - (a) on a Saturday, a Sunday or a day that is appointed a public holiday by or under the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1972, as amended; or
  - (b) on any other day, before 8.00 a.m. or after 4.00 p.m.
3. The tree chipping machine shall not be operated in any place pursuant to the exemption for more than 1 hour within 800 metres of the same place.

## Schedule—continued.

4. The tree chipping machine shall not be operated pursuant to the exemption within 200 metres of a hospital, nursing home, or like institution.

5. Each person operating or attending to the operation of the tree chipping machine pursuant to the exemption shall, when so operating the machine, wear hearing protection rated at a minimum SLC<sub>80</sub> of 20.

6. Not less than 1 week before the tree chipping machine is operated pursuant to the exemption within 800 metres of a residence, written notice shall be given at the residence of the time at which the machine will be so operated within 800 metres of the residence, with such particularity as is reasonably practicable.

7. The Council of the City of Canning shall, within 14 days of it, or any of its officers receiving a complaint arising from the operation of a tree chipping machine, cause notice in writing of the complaint to be sent to the Director, Noise Abatement Section, Public Health Department, specifying the details of the complaint.

8. The best practicable means shall be taken to reduce the noise level of the tree chipping machine and written report of such from an independent consultant on noise control shall be provided three months prior to their application for exemption, by the City of Canning in support.

#### HEALTH ACT 1911 (AS AMENDED).

##### Town of Armadale.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 (as amended) a Local Authority may make by-laws, now, therefore, the Town of Armadale being the Local Authority for the Health District of Armadale, do hereby make the following by-laws:—

##### By-Laws—Eating Houses.

##### Commencement.

1. These by-laws shall come into operation on 1 July 1984.

##### Interpretation.

2. In the construction of these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires:—
  - “Act” means the Health Act 1911 (as amended) including any amendments thereof and any regulations made thereunder.
  - “Certificate of Registration” means a certificate issued in the form prescribed in the second schedule.
  - “Eating House” means an eating house as defined in Division 3, section 160, of the Health Act 1911 (as amended).
  - “Health Surveyor” means a health surveyor appointed under this Act.
  - “Licence” means a licence to conduct an eating house granted pursuant to the provisions of these by-laws in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.
  - “Local Authority” means the Council of the Town of Armadale.
  - “Proprietor” means the person having the management or control of premises.
  - “Registered premises” means any premises which are registered as an eating house under these by-laws.
  - “Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk of the Town of Armadale.
3. No person shall occupy or use any premises as an eating house unless:—
  - (a) The premises are registered under these by-laws as an eating house; and
  - (b) The proprietor of the said premises is the holder of a licence issued by the local authority authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of an eating house.

##### Registration of an Eating House.

4. Before any premises are registered under these by-laws as an eating house the proprietor thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward the application together with a plan of the premises in respect of which such application is made, and the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk and, if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a certificate of registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The local authority may attach such conditions as are deemed necessary to the registration of an eating house, and these conditions shall be set out in the certificate of registration.

##### Licence to Conduct an Eating House.

6. Before any licence to any proprietor to conduct an eating house is issued by the local authority under these by-laws, the proprietor shall complete an application in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto and shall forward same, together with the prescribed fee to the Town Clerk, and if the application is approved, the local authority shall issue to the proprietor a licence in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

Register of Registrations and Licences.

7. Every certificate of registration of premises registered as an eating house and every licence issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Town Clerk and shall be entered in a register maintained by the local authority for that purpose.

Certificates of Registration and Licences.

8. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the certificates of registration and the licence on the registered premises in a position visible to the general public and shall, when requested to do so by a Health Surveyor, produce the certificate of registration and the licence issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

9. Every certificate of registration and every licence shall be in force from the day of issue to the next 30th day of June, inclusive, unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws.

10. Applications for renewal of certificates of registration and licences shall be made annually during the month of June.

11. The fees payable to the local authority on the registration of premises or the issue of a licence and on the renewal of any registration or licence shall be the maximum fee prescribed in section 172, subsection 1, paragraph 3 of the Act.

12. So often as any person holding the licence issued pursuant to these by-laws changes his place of abode he shall, within seven days of such a change, give notice in writing to the Town Clerk, specifying his new place of abode and he shall, at the same time, produce such licence to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

13. Any licence issued to any proprietor under the provisions of this by-law to conduct an eating house shall not be transferable to any other person except as specified in section 168 subsection 2 of the Act.

14. If the licensed proprietor of any premises registered as an eating house ceases to be the proprietor, as defined under these by-laws then any person wishing to become the proprietor of such premises must make application to the Town Clerk for a licence to conduct an eating house as required by by-law No. 6 of these by-laws.

15. Where application is made to the local authority either for:—

- (i) an eating house to be registered; or
- (ii) a licence to be issued to conduct the business of an eating house, then—
  - (i) such application may be issued or refused subject to section 165 subsection 1 and section 166 subsection 1 of the Act.
  - (ii) any such registration or licence, if allowed and issued, may be cancelled at any time if any conditions or term of issue, be broken or if any of the provisions of the Act, are not complied with.

16. Before any premises are registered as an eating house, the site intended to be used for such purpose shall be subject to the approval of the local authority.

17. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to the maximum penalty prescribed in section 172 (2) of the Act.

RESOLVED that the Council in pursuance of section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) amend the above Town Planning Scheme by:

A. Adding to Clause 1.7,

“Canal or Canal Waterway”: Means any artificial channel, lake, harbour or embayment for use or intended for use for navigational, ornamental and recreational purposes, or any of those purposes. The term includes any access channel, any addition to or alteration of any canal within the meaning of this definition and any system of canals within the meaning of this definition provided in any development of land.

“Canal Estate”: Means a development or subdivision proximate to a canal. For planning purposes any development within 100 m of a canal or proposed canal shall be deemed to be part of a canal estate unless the Minister for Urban Development and Town Planning shall determine some other distance for that estate.

“Stabilised Surface Level”: Means the land surface level established by the development of a canal estate.

“Canal Wall”: Means a retaining wall constructed in a canal estate to retain a stabilised surface level at or near the canal frontage.

B. Adding to Clause 2.0,

9. Canal Zone.

C. Deleting from Clause 2.6.1 Tourist Zone the words,

(3) Canals and dwellings associated therewith may be permitted at the discretion of the Council after consultation with the Town Planning Department.

D. Renumber 2.6.1 (4) to 2.6.1 (3).

E. Adding a new Clause 5.11,

5.11.1 Canal Zone: General Aims and Objectives. Council's intention in controlling development within the Canal Zone is to;

- (a) encourage a high standard of development within the zone;
- (b) promote and safeguard health, safety, convenience and the general welfare and amenity of the locality;
- (c) promote a high standard of maintenance of canals and other waterways through co-operation with the Peel Inlet Management Authority.

5.11.2 Those portions of the Scheme Area specified in the Third Schedule—Canal Zone, and shown on the Scheme Map are classified Canal Zone. A Canal Estate is permitted within this zone. 5.11.4 Where development is proposed in on or over a canal or canal waterway subsequent to the development of a canal estate the Peel Inlet Management Authority shall, before determining such application obtain the comments of the Local Authority.

5.11.5 All dwellings shall be set back a minimum of 9.0 m from a canal frontage and 6.0 m from a road frontage.

5.11.6 All existing retaining walls along a canal frontage shall be kept in a structurally sound condition to the satisfaction of Council and shall not be altered, extended or removed without the prior written approval of Council and of the Peel Inlet Management Authority as required by law.

5.11.7 No retaining wall or fencing shall be erected along the canal frontage or within 1.0 m of the top of a canal wall or canal frontage whichever is the greater setback as determined by Council and the Peel Inlet Management Authority as required by law.

5.11.8 No retaining wall situated more than 1.0 m but less than 7.5 m from a canal frontage shall exceed 1.0 m above the stabilised surface level.

5.11.9 No retaining wall situated more than 7.5 m but less than 9.0 m from a canal frontage shall exceed 1.5 m above the stabilised surface level.

5.11.10 No fence situated within 7.5 m of a canal frontage shall exceed 1.0 m above the original stabilised surface.

5.11.11 No fence situated more than 7.5 m from a canal frontage shall exceed 2.0 m above the original stabilised surface.
